
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
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### WARNING

To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not expose the unit to rain or moisture

To avoid electrical shock, do not open the cabinet. Refer servicing to qualified personnel only.

Do not install the appliance in a confined space, such as a bookcase or built-in cabinet. To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not place objects filled with liquids, such as vases, on the apparatus.

## **Choosing Power** Source **Installing Batteries (See** fig. A)

- **1** Open the battery compartment at the rear of
- 2 Install two LR6 (size AA) alkaline batteries (not supplied), observing polarity, and then close the lid.

### Knowing when to replace the batteries

When the batteries become weak, the sound becomes weak and distorted.

When the batteries are completely exhausted, "\sqrt{o}" appears on the display and the power is turned off. When "\sqrt{o}" appears, replace both batteries with new ones. After the batteries are replaced, press **POWER** to turn the indication off.

## Notes on replacing the batteries • Do not take more than about 10 minutes to replace

- the batteries, otherwise the clock, any lists of receivable broadcasts for DAB scan, preset favourite stations and all settings will be initialized. Should that happen, set the functions again.
- If the batteries are replaced while the power is on, the unit may revert to the factory setting.

### Notes on batteries

- Do not attempt to recharge dry batteries.
- · Do not carry batteries with coins or other metallic objects. It can generate heat if the positive and negative terminals of the batteries are accidentally contacted by a metallic object.
- If you are not going to use the unit for a long time. ove the batteries to avoid damage from battery
- · Do not use different types of batteries at the same
- When you replace the batteries, replace all with new

## If the battery compartment lid comes off (See fig. B)

The battery compartment lid is designed to come off when opened with excessive force. To put it back on,

- ① Insert the right hinge of the lid into the right hole of the unit.
- ② Insert the left hinge in the left hole of the

### **Using House Current** (See fig. C)

Connect the Sony AC power adaptor (supplied) to the DC IN 4.5 V jack firmly, and plug it into a wall outlet.

## Notes on the AC power adaptor • When operating the unit with the internal batteries,

- remove the AC power adaptor from the wall outlet and the DC IN 4.5 V jack. Make sure that the plug of the external power source is disconnected before operating the unit.
- Use the supplied Sony AC power adaptor only. The polarity of the plugs of other manufacturers may be different. Failure to use the supplied AC power adaptor may cause the unit to malfunction



## **Setting the clock**

"--: --" appears in the display when the batteries are installed or the AC power adaptor is plugged, and then **POWER** (or **MENU**) is pressed in for the first

- **1** Press **MENU** to show the menu display. **2** Press **△** (up) or **▼** (down) to select
- "TIME SET" and press ENTER/SC.



- **3** Press  $\triangle$  (up) or  $\nabla$  (down) to set the hour, and then press **ENTER/SC**.
- The minute indication is highlighted **4** Press  $\triangle$  (up) or  $\nabla$  (down) to set the minute, then press **ENTER/SC**. The clock starts operating, and ":" starts blinking.

- To set the current time rapidly, hold down \( \bigcup \) (up) or ▼ (down).
- To set the current time exactly to the seconds, adjust the minute function in step **4** and then press **ENTER/SC** to synchronize it with a time signal (such as the telephone time signal).
- . The clock system varies depending on the model purchased. For example, in the 24-hour system. "0:00" is indicated as midnight, and "12:00" is indicated as noon.

## If you do not operate within 65 seconds while

- setting the clock, the clock setting mode will be cancelled.
- To cancel the clock setting mode halfway, press MENU.

## **Initial setting for** the DAB

When the DAB band is selected for the first time, the unit will automatically scan and create a list of receivable broadcasts.

If you wish to scan for the DAB broadcasts again, or

- when the unit reset, do the following: **1** Extend the headphone cord with the remote
- control as long as possible. **2** Press **POWER** to turn on the radio.
- **3** Press **DAB/FM** to select the DAB band.
- 4 Press MENU.
- **5** Press **△** (up) or **▼** (down) to select "SCAN" and press ENTER/SC.

No sound will be heard, and "<SCANNING>" appears in the display. DAB scan takes about 30 ~ 90 seconds. When finished, the unit receives the first service of the lowest ensemble stored by the DAB scan.



- If you do not operate within 65 seconds, the menu node will be cancelled.
- If no broadcasts are found by the DAB scan, "< NO ENSEMBLE >" appears in the display.



- To cancel the DAB scan halfway, press MENU. Any services received before you cancel are added to the list of receivable services.
- If the batteries replaced for a while, the receiving history list are deleted. In this case, scan again.

## Improving the Reception (See fig. D)

DAB BAND-III/FM:

The headphones cord serves as the antenna, so extend it as long as possible.

## Operating the Radio


The unit can receive DAB services and FM stations both of which feature FAVOURITE and MANUAL modes - DAB services also features a NORMAL

**FAVOURITE**: To select your favourite stored services/stations. (See "Presetting your favourite services or stations.") MANUAL: To adjust the frequency incrementally

— Manual tuning

- 1 Press **POWER** to turn on the radio. When the unit is turned on again, the last band you listened to is received
- 2 Press **DAB/FM** repeatedly to select the desired band.

Each press changes the band as follows



### Manual mode:


- Press MENU to show the menu display.
   Press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down) to select "MODE",
- nen press ENTER/SC. 3 Press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down) to select "MANUAL", then press ENTER/SC



"MAN" appears in the display

- Normal mode:

  1 Do steps 1 and 2, as you would for manual
- Press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down) to select "NORMAL", then press ENTER/SC.



- "NOR" appears in the display **3** Press  $\triangle$  (up) or  $\nabla$  (down) to tune to the desired service or station. Two short beeps sound when the lowest ensemble of DAB or the minimum frequency of FM is
- received during tuning. 4 Adjust the volume using **VOL** +/-.

You can adjust the volume in 32 steps. The volume increases as the slider is moved towards the right.



- Notes in FM usage
   When you press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down), the frequency changes one step at a time.
- $\bullet\,$  The channel step is set to 0.05 MHz on FM.

- Notes in DAB usage
   Before receiving DAB broadcasts, one or more ensembles should be stored in the list by the DAB scan. (See "Initial setting for the DAB".)
- "<WAITING>" appears in the display when the unit is tuned in to an ensemble.
- "<NO SERUICE>" appears when the selected service
- "<NO ENSEMBLE>" appears when the ensemble for



· If a selected service finishes broadcasting, sound stops and "<NO SERUICE>" appears. In this case, press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down) to select another services


## About the SC (Secondary Component)

If the selected primary component has a secondary component, "SC" blinks on the display.



Press ENTER/SC to receive the desired secondary component. "SC" appears while the secondary

Pressing  $\blacktriangle$  (up) or  $\blacktriangledown$  (down) or **ENTER/SC** does the



When the selected secondary component is finished, the unit returns automatically to the primary component.

## Other useful **functions**

To obtain Powerful Bass Sound

- **1** Press **MENU** while the power is on. **2** Press **△** (up) or **▼** (down) to select "MEGA BASS" and press **ENTER/SC**. "ON" or "OFF" is highlighted. The factory setting
- **3** Press **A** (up) or **V** (down) to select "ON". then press **ENTER/SC**. "*MB*" appears in the display.

To cancel the MEGA BASS function, select "OFF" in step 3. "MB" disappears

### To improve programme reception Set FM SENS to LOCAL if interference is prevalent

when radio signal strength is too high. Under normal conditions, set to **DX**. **Auto Power Off Function** 

You can use the Auto Power Off function so that the radio turns off automatically after a set time. The factory setting is "OFF."

- 1 Press MENU.
- 2 Press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down) to select "AUTO OFF" and press ENTER/SC.
- The current setting time is highlighted. **3** Press  $\triangle$  (up) or  $\nabla$  (down) to select the desired time, then press ENTER/SC. "AUTO OFF" appears in the display. Each time you press  $\blacktriangle$  (up) or  $\blacktriangledown$  (down), the time

To cancel the Auto Power Off function, select "OFF" in step **3**. "**AUTO OFF**" disappears from

## **HOLD Function**

When you slide **HOLD** of the unit in the direction of the arrow, "O-m" appears in the display. All buttons on the unit will become inoperative. This function prevents the radio from being unintentionally turned on, or the radio frequency from being accidentally changed

**3** Press **△** (up) or **▼** (down) to adjust contrast, and press ENTER/SC.

### To illuminate the LCD

### Press LIGHT.

The backlight will turn off automatically if no operation is performed for 5 seconds.

If you select "SAUE" in step 4 with 20 stations and 20 services already stored, <FAUOURITE FULL> will appear in the display; delete any unnecessary ones





## Changing the display (DAB only)

To change the display mode, press **INFO** during DAB reception. The selected display mode remains even if you turn off and on the unit or switch the band.

The ensemble label (a maximum of 16 characters available) appears in the 1st indication area. The service label (a maximum of 16 characters available) appears in the 2nd, 3rd is PTY and 4th is dynamic label.

### To delete stored text



## To reset the unit

Press this button with a pointed object when the radio fails to function properly. The clock settings, and the services and stations you have preset, etc., will revert to the factory preset.



### **Precautions**

- Operate the unit only on the power sources specified in "Specifications". For battery operation, use two LR6 (size AA) alkaline batteries. For AC operation, use only the supplied AC power adaptor. Do not use any other type of AC power adaptor.
- The unit is not disconnected from the AC power source (mains) as long as it is connected to the wall outlet, even if the unit itself has been turned off.
- Disconnect the AC power adaptor from the wall outlet when the unit is not to be used for a long period of time.
- Use the unit within a temperature range of 0°C to 40°C (32°F to 104°F). If it is used in temperatures higher than this range, numbers may appear in the display which have nothing to do with the frequency being received. If it is used in temperatures lower than this range, the numbers displayed may change very slowly. (These irregularities will disappear and there will be no damage to the unit when the unit is used in the recommended temperature range.)
- The nameplate indicating operating voltage, etc. is located on the rear exterior.
- · Avoid exposure to temperature extremes, direct sunlight, moisture, sand, dust or mechanical shock. Never leave in a car parked in the sun.
- Should any solid object or liquid fall into the unit, disconnect the AC power adaptor and remove the batteries, and have the unit checked by a qualified
- · In vehicles or buildings, radio reception may be difficult or noisy. Try listening near a window.
