1. About Bluetooth Speakerphone

The Bluetooth LCD Speakerphone is compatible with most Bluetooth mobile phones. Fully portable, it is an ideal wireless communication solution for in-car or office use within a maximum range of 10 meters. Built-in with Echo Cancellation and Noise Suppression, the Bluetooth LCD Speakerphone provides you with impeccable sound quality in full duplex mode.

2. Charging

Make sure that your LCD Speakerphone is fully charged before using it. Use only the charger provided- do not use chargers from any other devices as this might damage the device. A full charge is approximately 3 hours.


To Charge Your LCD Speakerphone:

- (1) Connect to a mains charger or a USB charging cable to charge.
- (2) A "Charging" indication is displayed on the LCD when it is charging.
- (3) The LCD indication "Full Charge" comes on when the device is fully charged.

9. Powering Up

(1)To turn ON the Bluetooth Speakerphone

Slide the ON/OFF button to its "ON" position and the LCD Indicator comes on displaying "Welcome".

(2)To turn OFF the Bluetooth Speakerphone

Slide the ON/OFF button to its "OFF" Position and the LCD light indication goes



10. PAIRING

(1) Pairing With Bluetooth Mobile Phone

Pairing is the process of connecting your Speakerphone with your mobile phone. Before using the Speakerphone with your mobile phone, you must pair both devices. If you wish to use your Speakerphone with a different mobile phone, you must reinitiate the pairing process with your intended Bluetooth mobile phone .

(2) Pairing Speakerphone to Mobile Phone

1. Switch to pairing mode by holding onto the "MFB" button for approximately 3 seconds until a long "beep" sound is heard. The LCD Display shows "Pairing" and the Speakerphone is now ready for pairing.

- 2. Turn on your mobile phone and place it within 10 meters to the Bluetooth Speakerphone.
- 3. Initiate the mobile discovery feature on your mobile phone. Refer to your mobile phone's user guide.
- 4. Enter the default pin code "0000", when prompted by your mobile phone system for pin code.
- 5. The LCD shows "Paired" when both devices are successfully paired.





11. Connection Link/Between Speakerphone And Mobile Phone



Your Speakerphone will always indicate a connection icon whenever it is paired to a mobile phone. Your mobile phone will also indicate a connection icon whenever your Speakerphone is paired. If the icon is not present, a reconnection

can be established by manually selecting the Speakerphone from your mobile phone's Bluetooth menu. If your Speakerphone is set as an authorised Bluetooth device on your mobile phone, an automatic reconnection can be established by pressing the Speakerphone's "MFB" button once.

Your Speakerphone will be automatically switched off when it is disconnected from a paired device for more than 10 minutes. This special feature is incorporated to maximise your Speakerphone's standby/talk time. To reinstate the connection, simply repeat the process for turning the Speakerphone on.

12. Using The Speakerphone

(1) Making Calls

You can initiate calls from your mobile phone, or directly from your Speakerphone using voice dialing commands(if this feature is supported by your mobile phone) or from the Speakerphone's phonebook Feature.

(2) Making Calls from your mobile phone

Dial directly from mobile phone. The call is automatically connected to your your Speakerphone.

(3) Receiving Calls

When your mobile phone rings, press the "MFB" button on the Speakerphone to connect the call.

(4) Ending Calls

When you have finished your call, press the "MFB" button on the receiver to disconnect the call.

(5) Rejecting Call

Hold onto the "MFB" button 3 seconds to reject an incoming call.

(6) Redial Last Outgoing Call

Press the "MFB" button twice, the LCD displays "Redial" and the call is connected

(7) View last 10 incoming calls

The Speakerphone automatically captures enties of last 10 incoming calls (received and missed calls). To view them, press the "V+" or "V-" when the Speakerphone is in standby mode. Pressing the "MFB" button on the selected name/number will place the call out.

(8) Making calls using voice dialing (Dependent on mobile phone support) 1. Press the "MFB" button once and the LCD shows "Voice Dial". 2. Call out the name of the person for the call to be place.

(9) Transfering Calls

Speakerphone to Mobile Phone - During a call, simply press both "V+" and "V-" buttons once and the call is routed to your mobile phone. The LCD shows "Transferred to Phone"



Mobile Phone to Speakerphone - Press the "MFB" button once and the call is routed back to your mobile phone. The LCD shows "Transferred to Speakerphone".



(10) Privacy Mode

In the midst of a conversation, press the "Mode" button once and the speaker Volumes are automatically decreased to minimal levels where you can use the Speakerphone in the same mannerism as using any handheld phone.



(11) Adjusting The Volume

1.To increase the volume

Press the "V+" symbol Volume button to increase volume by one level, repeat this procedure until you have reached the desired level.

2. To decrease the volume

Press the "V-" symbol Volume button to decrease the volume by one level, Repeat this procedure until you have reached the desired level.

(12) Transferring Mobile Phone's Phonebook to Speakerphone

Press the "Mode" button in the connecting status for 3 seconds and the LCD will show "Phonebook Retrieve". When the process is completed, the LCD shows "Retrieve Complete".

Note:

The Phonebook function varies from mobile phones and not every mobile phone supports this feature. Please refer to the compatibility list for details. Additionally, every new mobile phone connected will have its previous phonebook automatically deleted in the Speakerphone. Please repeat the process for Phonebook transfer on the intended mobile phone.

(13) Dialling out from the Speakerphone's Phonebook

Press the "Mode" button during standby mode and your contacts will appear on the LCD screen, scroll through your contacts by pressing "V+" or "V-". Press the "MFB" button on the desired contact and the call is connected.

(14) Removing Phonebook Entries

During standby mode, hold on to both "V+" and "V-" buttons for 3 seconds and the LCD will prompt "Phonebook Deleted".



14. Restore to default

To restore your Speakerphone to its original settings, press and hold both "V+" and "V-" for 10 seconds and the LCD shows "Master Reset". Press and hold both "V+" and "V-" for a further 3 seconds and the Speakerphone will power off automatically. This process is complete when 3 beeps are heard when you power on your Speakerphone again.



15. Care and Maintenance

- (1) Do not expose the Speakerphone to liquid, moisture or humidity, as it is not waterproof.
- (2) Do not use abrasive cleaning solvents to clean the Speakerphone.
- (3) Do not place the Speakerphone in high temperature, as it will result in an
- (4) Do not expose the Speakerphone contact with sharp objects as this will cause scratching and damage.
- (5) Do not stick anything inside the Speakerphone, as it does not contain serviceable components.
- (6) Do not attempt to disassemble the Speakerphone, as it does not contain serviceable components.
- (7) If you do not use the Speakerphone for long periods, be sure to store it in a dry place, free from extreme temperature, humidity and dust.

16. Safety Information

- (1) Check local laws regarding use of a mobile handset and while driving. If you use the Speakerphone while diving, ensure your attention and focus remains on your responsibility of driving safety.
- (2) Never allow children to play with the Speakerphone. Small parts may be a choking hazard.
- (3) Observe all signs that require an electrical device or Therefore radio product to be switched off in the designated areas. These could include hospitals, blasting areas, and potentially explosive atmospheres.
- (4) Turn off your Speakerphone prior to boarding an aircraft. Do not use your Speakerphone in the aircraft.
- (5) Never mount or store your Speakerphone over any air bag deployment area serious injury may result when an air bag deploys.
