Instruction

- 1. Unscrew cover and Insert 3 AAA Batteries into Controller.
- 2. Plug the bottom of the Radio Control Car into the top of the Battery Charger making sure the metal connectors are touching. (Bulb on Battery Charger will light)
- 3. When the charge light goes out the charge is complete. Forward/reserve and right/left the joystick on the Controller to move the RC Car.
