- · Use only fresh batteries of the required size and recommended type.
- . If you do not plan to use the Crashing Truck for a week or more, remove the batteries from the transmitter and the Crashing Truck. Batteries can leak chemicals that can damage electronic parts.
- · Never leave dead or weak batteries in the Crashing Truck or transmitter.

IN THE TRANSMITTER

- 1. Use a Phillips screwdriver to loosen the screw on the battery compartment cover, then remove the cover. (Fig 1)
- 2. Put the battery in the compartment as indicated by the polarity symbols (+ and -) marked inside. (Fig 2)
- 3. Replace the cover and secure it with the screw. When the transmitter's range decreases, replace its battery.

IN THE CRASHING TRUCK

You need four AA alkaline batteries to power your Crashing Truck.

- 1. Use a Phillips head screw driver to remove the battery compartment located on the back of the Crashing Truck. (Fig 3)
- 2. Insert batteries in the correct position as marked in compartment. Replace compartment cover and secure. (Fig 4)
- 3. Move power switch to the "on" position to operate Crashing Truck. Move switch to the "off" position when not in use. (Fig 5)

When the Crashing Truck moves slowly or not at all, replace the batteries.

TO DRIVE YOUR CRASHING TRUCK

- 1. Slide ON/OFF beneath the Crashing Truck to ON.
- 2. Use the transmitter buttons to drive and steer the Crashing Truck.
- 3. When you finish driving the Crashing Truck slide ON/OFF on the Crashing Truck to OFF.


MAINTENANCE TIPS
