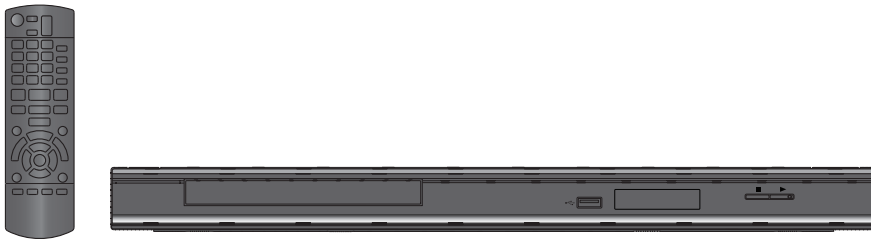

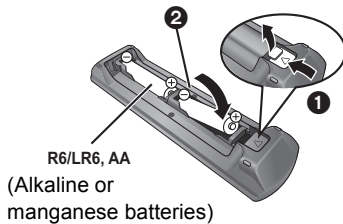

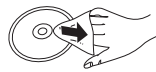

- Clean any dust, water, or foreign matter from the terminals on the rear side of the card.
- Do not use the following discs:
  - Discs with exposed adhesive from removed stickers or labels (rented discs etc).
  - Discs that are badly warped or cracked.
  - Irregularly shaped discs, such as heart shapes.

## ■ Finalize

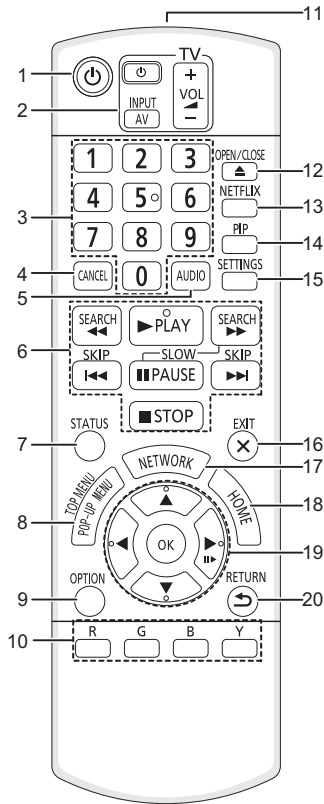

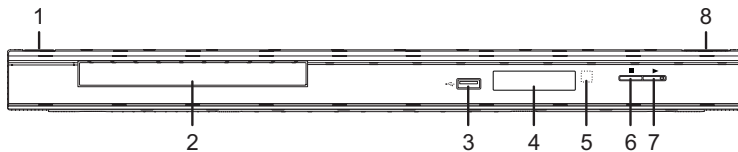

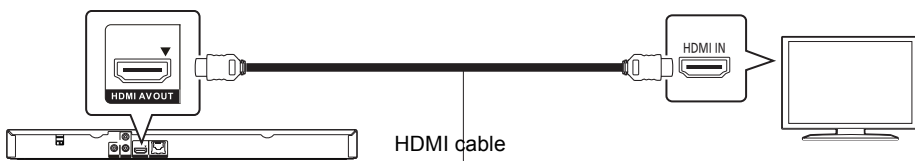

## STEP 1 : Connecting to a TV

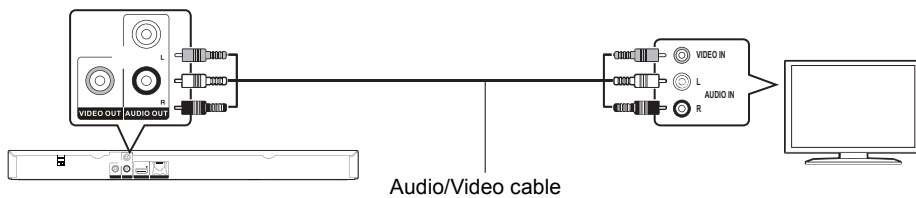
Perform either one of the following connections in accordance with your TV input terminal.

- Before making any connections we suggest you temporarily disconnect all the units from AC power.
- Do not connect video signals through a video recorder. Due to copy guard protection the picture may not be displayed properly.
- Please use High Speed HDMI Cables that have the HDMI logo. It is recommended that you use Panasonic's HDMI cable. When outputting 1080p signal, please use HDMI cables 5.0 meters (16.4 ft.) or less.  
Recommended part number (High Speed HDMI Cable):  
RP-CDHS15 (1.5 m/4.9 ft.), RP-CDHS30 (3.0 m/9.8 ft.), RP-CDHS50 (5.0 m/16.4 ft.), etc.

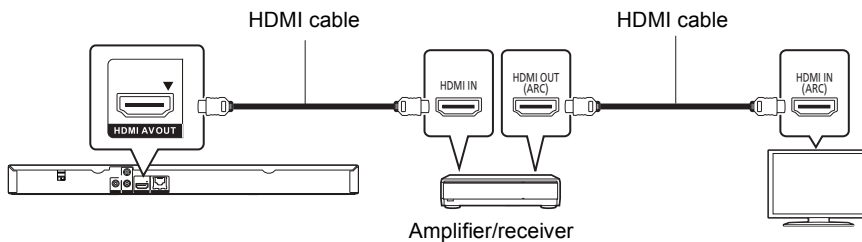

## STEP 2 : Connecting to an amplifier/receiver

Perform either one of the following connections in accordance with your amplifier/receiver input terminal.

### HDMI AV OUT



- Set "Digital Audio Output" (⇒ 23).



- When using the TV or amplifier/receiver that does not have the indication of "(ARC)" (non-ARC-compatible) on the HDMI terminal, in order to enjoy TV's sound by amplifier/receiver it is also required to connect the amplifier/receiver and TV using an optical digital cable.

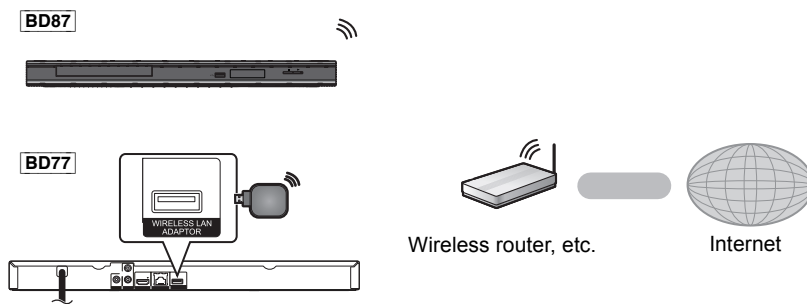

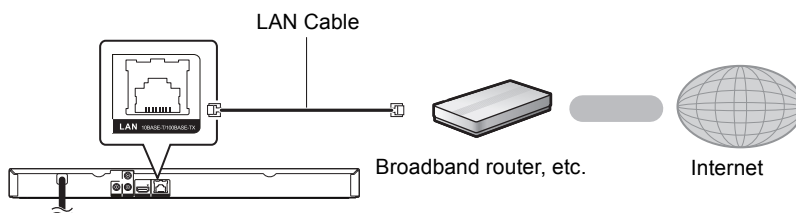

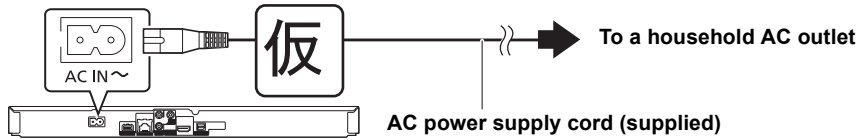

- **BD77**
  - Only the Wireless LAN Adaptor DY-WL5 (optional) can be used.
  - Read the operating instructions for the Wireless LAN Adaptor DY-WL5 (optional) thoroughly when using it.
  - To simultaneously connect the Wireless LAN Adaptor DY-WL5 (optional) and a LAN cable, use the extension cable supplied with the DY-WL5.

### LAN cable connection



- Use category 5 or above straight LAN cables (STP) when connecting to peripheral devices.
- Inserting any cable other than a LAN cable in the LAN terminal can damage the unit.

## STEP 4 : Connecting to an AC power source



- This unit consumes a small amount of AC power (⇒ 33) even when turned off. In the interest of power conservation, if you will not be using this unit for an extended period of time, it can be disconnected.

## STEP 5 : Settings

### Easy Setting

After connecting your new player for the first time and pressing [⏻], a screen for the basic settings will appear.

#### Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television.

- 1 Press [⏻].  
Setup screen appears.
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions and make the settings.



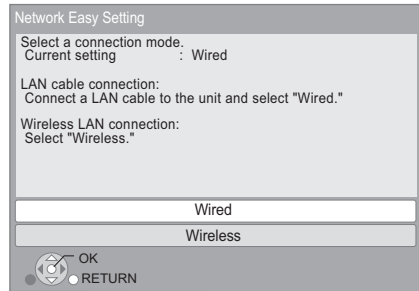
- You can perform this setup anytime by selecting "Easy Setting" in the Setup menu. (⇒ 25)
- If this unit is connected to a Panasonic TV (VIERA) supporting HDAVI Control 2 or later via an HDMI cable, then setting information on the TV such as "On-screen Language" is acquired by this unit.

### Network Easy Setting

After completing "Easy Setting", you can perform "Network Easy Setting".

#### Wired connection

Select "Wired".



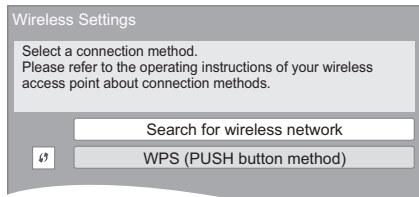
Follow the on-screen instructions to make your connection settings.

#### Wireless connection

##### Preparation

- Obtain your network name (⇒ 12, SSID).
- If your wireless connection is encrypted please be sure that you know your encryption key.
- [BD77] : If "Wireless LAN Adaptor is not connected." is displayed, check that the Wireless LAN Adaptor is fully inserted. Alternatively, disconnect and reconnect it. If there is still no change in the display, consult your dealer for advice.

- 1 Select "Wireless".
- 2 Select "Search for wireless network" or "WPS (PUSH button method)", then follow the on-screen instructions and make the settings.



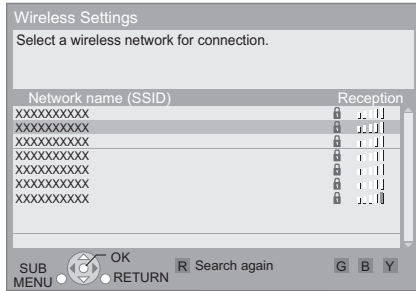
#### ■ "WPS (PUSH button method)"

If you are using a Wireless router that supports WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup), you can easily perform the settings.

### ■ “Search for wireless network”

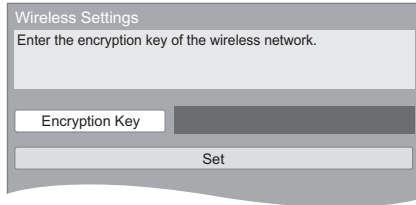
The available wireless networks will be displayed.

- ① Select your network name.
  - If your network name is not displayed search again by pressing the [R] button on the remote control. Stealth SSID will not be displayed, in this case enter manually.



### When your wireless network is encrypted

- ② Select “Encryption Key”.



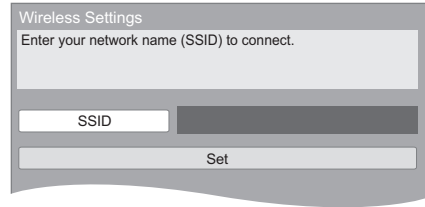
- ③ Enter your encryption key.



### To enter SSID manually

If your SSID is not displayed in step ①, follow these steps.

- 1 To display SSID input screen :  
Press [HOME] ⇒ select “Setup” ⇒ select “Player Settings” ⇒ select “Network” ⇒ select “Network Settings” ⇒ select “Wireless Settings” ⇒ select “Connection Setting” ⇒ select “Manual setting”
- 2 Select “SSID” and enter your SSID.



- If your wireless network is encrypted, go to step ②.



- Refer to the operating instructions of the hub or router.
- WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) is a standard that facilitates settings relating to the connection and security of wireless LAN devices. To see whether your Wireless router supports WPS, check the Wireless router operating instructions.
- You can perform this setup anytime by selecting “Network Easy Setting” in the Setup menu. (⇒ 24)
- You can redo these settings individually using “Network Settings”. (⇒ 24)
- Do not use this unit to connect to any wireless network for which you do not have usage rights.  
During automatic searches in a wireless network environment, wireless networks (SSID\*) for which you do not have usage rights may be displayed; however, using these networks may be regarded as illegal access.
- After performing network settings on this unit, the settings (encryption level, etc.) of the Wireless router might change. When you have trouble getting online on your PC, perform the network settings on your PC in accordance with the settings of Wireless router.
- Please be aware that connecting to a network without encryption may result in the content of the communication being illegitimately viewed by a third party, or the leaking of data such as personal or secret information.

\* An SSID (Service Set IDentification) is a name used by wireless LAN to identify a particular network. Transmission is possible if the SSID matches for both devices.

## Reprogramming the remote control

If you have more than one Panasonic player/recorder and the remote control operates both products at once, you will need to change the remote control code to prevent this occurrence. (⇒ 26, "Remote Control Code")

## Firmware updates

Occasionally, Panasonic may release updated firmware for this unit that may add or improve the way a feature operates. These updates are available free of charge.

This unit is capable of checking the firmware automatically when connected to the Internet via a broadband connection.

When a new firmware version is available, the following message is displayed.

New firmware is available.  
Please update firmware in Setup.

To update the firmware

Press [HOME] ⇒ select "Setup" ⇒ select "Player Settings" ⇒ select "System Settings" ⇒ select "Firmware Update" ⇒ select "Update Now"

DO NOT DISCONNECT the unit from the AC power or perform any operation while the update takes place.

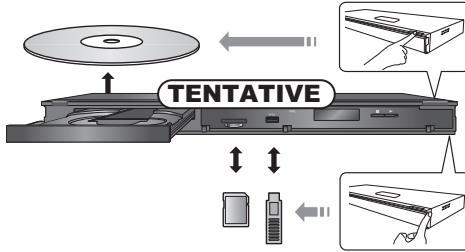

- If you connect a Panasonic product with a USB connection cable, the setup screen may be displayed on the connected equipment. For details, refer to the instructions for the connected equipment.

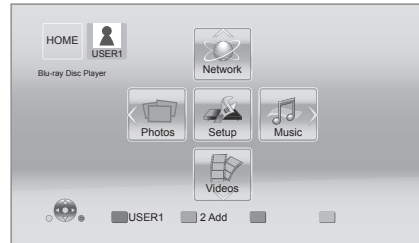

- 2 Press [OK] or [▲, ▼, ◀, ▶] to select the item.

### To show the HOME menu

Press [HOME].

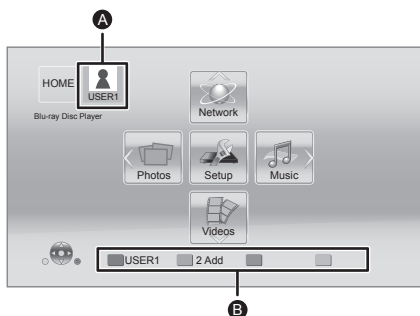


- Items to be displayed may vary with the media.
- Where necessary, set "Mixed Data Disc Option" when using a disc with both data files (MP3, JPEG, MKV) and Video. (⇒ 26)

## Multi-user mode

Up to 4 people can be registered as the users and the settings of wallpaper, and picture and audio quality etc. are saved respectively.

Each member of your family can use the unit with their own settings.



- A** The user name and icon currently selected.
- B** Register a new user and switch the users with color buttons.

## Registering a new user

- 1** Press [HOME].
- 2** Press a color button that indicates new user registration.
- 3** Select an item and change the settings according to the indications.

Following items can be set.

<b>Enter Nickname (TENTATIVE)</b>	Register a user name.
<b>Select Icon (TENTATIVE)</b>	Register a user icon. Images in recording media can be registered.
<b>Select Wallpaper (TENTATIVE)</b>	Register a screen background of the Home menu.

- 4** Select "Confirm Settings (TENTATIVE)".

### To change the registered user information

Select "Edit User Information" from Setup menu.

## Switching the user

### Using color buttons

Press the color buttons in the Home menu to switch to the user corresponding to the button.

## Playback

### 1 Insert the media.

Playback starts depending on the media.

### 2 Select the item to play.

Repeat this procedure if necessary.



- DISCS CONTINUE TO ROTATE WHILE MENUS ARE DISPLAYED. Press [■STOP] when you have finished playback to protect the unit's motor, your television screen and so on.
- MKV : Successive play is not possible.
- It is not possible to playback AVCHD and MPEG2 video which have been dragged and dropped, copied and pasted to the media.
- Still pictures displayed as "☒" cannot be played back with this unit.
- To save on electricity, the power is turned off automatically if there is no button operation for about 30 minutes when not playing back (such as when paused, displaying the menu, displaying still pictures, etc.). (Compatible with ENERGY STAR)

## Operations during playback

These functions may not work depending on the media and contents.

### Stop

Press [■STOP].

The stopped position is memorized.

### Resume play function

Press [▶PLAY] to restart from this position.

- The position is cleared if the tray is opened or you press [■STOP] several times to display "STOP" on the unit's display.
- **On BD-Video discs including BD-J, the resume play function does not work.**

### Pause

Press [⏸PAUSE].

- Press [⏸PAUSE] again or [▶PLAY] to restart play.

### Search/Slow-motion

#### Search

While playing, press [SEARCH◀◀] or [SEARCH▶▶].

- Music and MP3: The speed is fixed to a single step.

#### Slow-motion

While paused, press [SEARCH◀◀] or [SEARCH▶▶].

- BD-Video and AVCHD: [SEARCH▶▶] only.

The speed increases up to 5 steps.

- Press [▶PLAY] to revert to normal playback speed.

### Skip

While playing or paused, press [◀◀] or [▶▶].

Skip to the title, chapter or track.

### Frame-by-frame

While paused, press [◀] (◀◀) or [▶] (▶▶).

- Press and hold to change in succession forward or backward.
- Press [▶PLAY] to revert to normal playback speed.
- BD-Video and AVCHD: [▶] (▶▶) only.

### Changing audio

Press [AUDIO].

You can change the audio channel number or soundtrack language, etc.



## Displaying menus and playback information

### Show top menu/pop-up menu

Press [POP-UP MENU/TOP MENU].

- Press [▲, ▼, ◀, ▶] to select the item and press [OK].

### Show the status messages

While playing, press [STATUS].

The status messages give you information about what is currently being played. Each time you press [STATUS], the display information may change or will disappear from the screen.

- Depending on media and contents, the display may change or may not appear.

e.g. BD-Video



- A** T: Title, C: Chapter, PL: Playlist
- B** B: Elapsed time in the title
- C** C: Current position
- D** D: Total time

e.g. Jpeg



## Enjoying BD-Live

With "BD-Live" featuring discs, you can enjoy bonus contents that use Internet access. For this BD-Live function, insertion of a USB device is necessary along with Internet connection.

- 1 Perform network connection and settings.**  
(⇒ 9, 11)
- 2 Insert a USB memory with 1 GB or more free space.**
  - The USB device is used as the local storage.
- 3 Insert the disc.**

### Deleting data on the USB device

Select "USB Management" in the Home menu (⇒ 14).



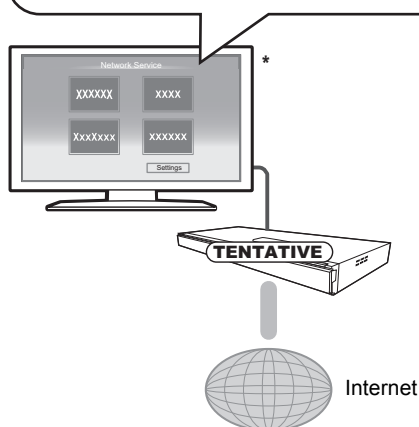
- The usable functions and the operating method may vary with each disc, please refer to the instructions on the disc and/or visit their website.
- "BD-Live Internet Access" may need to be changed for certain discs (⇒ 25).
- During search/slow-motion or frame-by-frame, only the primary video is displayed.

You can enjoy Network Service.

Network Service provides a variety of selected Internet services such as the followings.

- Online movie rental service
- Video browsing service

### 1 Press [NETWORK].

- NETFLIX can be accessed directly by pressing [NETFLIX] button.

### To exit from Network Service

Press [EXIT], [HOME] or [POP-UP MENU/TOP MENU].

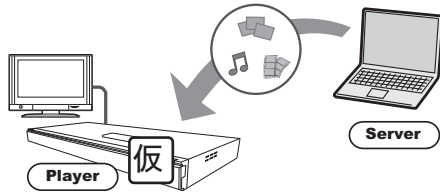


- When playing content in the media, Network Service cannot be accessed by pressing [NETWORK].

  - When restricting the use of Network Service.

### Playing back contents on the DLNA server

#### Preparation

- ① Perform network connection (⇒ 9) and network settings (⇒ 11) of this unit.
- ② Perform Home Network settings of the connected equipment.
- ③ Add the contents and folder to the libraries of the Windows Media® Player or the smartphone, etc.
  - Playlist of Windows Media® Player can play back only the contents that are stored in the libraries.

- 1 Press [HOME].**
- 2 Select “Network”.**
- 3 Select “Home Network”.**
- 4 Select “DLNA Client”.**
  - This list can be updated by pressing [R] on the remote control.
- 5 Select the equipment.**
- 6 Select the item to play.**
  - You may be able to use convenient functions depending on the content by pressing [OPTION].
  - Control Panel is displayed once the playback starts. Press [OK] if the Control Panel is not displayed, and press [RETURN] to hide the Control Panel.

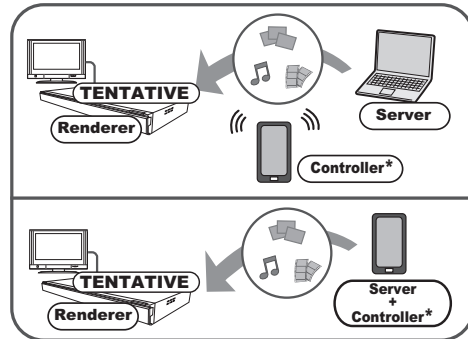
#### To exit from Home Network

### Using the Digital Media Controller

- 5 Operate the DMC compatible equipment.**

#### To exit from Media Renderer screen

Press [HOME].

## VIERA Link™ “HDAVI Control™”

### What is VIERA Link “HDAVI Control”?

VIERA Link™ is a new name for EZ Sync™.

VIERA Link “HDAVI Control” is a convenient function which will link the operations of this unit and a Panasonic TV (VIERA) or amplifier/receiver under “HDAVI Control”.

You can use this function by connecting the equipment with an HDMI cable. See the operating instructions for connected equipment for operational details.

### Preparation

- ① Set “VIERA Link” to “On” (⇒ 26). (The default setting is “On”.)
- ② Set the “HDAVI Control” operations on the connected equipment (e.g., TV).
- ③ Turn on all “HDAVI Control” compatible equipment and select this unit’s input channel on the connected TV so that the “HDAVI Control” function works properly.

**Also when the connection or settings are changed, repeat this procedure.**

## Automatic input switching Power on link

When play starts on the unit, the TV will automatically switch the input channel and display the corresponding action.

Additionally when the TV is off, the TV will automatically turn on.

## Power off link

All connected equipment compatible with “HDAVI Control”, including this unit, automatically turns off when you switch the television off.



- This unit supports “HDAVI Control 1” function. This standard is compatible with Panasonic’s conventional HDAVI equipment.
- VIERA Link “HDAVI Control”, based on the control functions provided by HDMI which is an industry standard known as HDMI CEC (Consumer Electronics Control), is a unique function that we have developed and added. As such, its operation with other manufacturers’ equipment that supports HDMI CEC cannot be guaranteed.
