


Charging the battery




Connect the battery charger

- The charging may take about 20 minutes to start if the battery is flat.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). You are advised to fully charge the battery (🔋).



The charge is complete when the animation stops. Only use Alcatel chargers.

2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  key until the telephone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm with the  key. The main screen is displayed.



If you don't know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code near your telephone and store your card in a safe place when not in use.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the  key to browse through them in full or press the right softkey to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, **“Searching/Emergency”** will be displayed.

In the power on screen, you also have access to the functions of **“Radio”**, **“Camera”**, **“Music player”**, etc. even if no SIM card inside.

2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the  key from the main screen.

3 Calls.....

3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the  key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the right softkey or  key.

To hang up the call, press the  key.

Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial emergency number and press the  key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unlocking the keypad.

3.2 Calling your voicemail ⁽¹⁾

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down the  key.

If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "**My numbers**" (see page 39).



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  key to talk and then hang up using the  key.


If the  icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and there is no ringtone. If the  icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.



The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

Muting the ringtone

To mute ringtone of current incoming call, press the right softkey once, or turn your phone in 180° when it is activated as "**On**" (see page 70). Answer the call by pressing the  key.



Turn in 180°

Rejecting a call

Press the  key once or the right softkey twice, or even you may reject it by SMS (**Options\Reject by SMS\Templates**).

3.4 During the call

Available functions

During a call, you can use your directory, your diary, short messages, etc. without losing your correspondent by pressing the  key.

-  Call on hold
-  Ongoing call
-  Handsfree

WARNING: move the handset away from your ear while using the “**handsfree**” option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

-  Directory
-  Messages
-  Calendar
-  Services ⁽¹⁾

 Voice memo (record your current call).

Besides, you can switch the audio speech from handset to BT device when connected.

Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the sound level during a call using the  key or Side key.

Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (Ensure that “**Call waiting**” is activated, see page 40).
- To call a second party during a call, dial the number directly.

3.5 Conference calls ⁽¹⁾

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to 5). If you are on a double call, press “**Options**” and select “**Conference**” then confirm with the  key. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the  key and speak with your new correspondent.

This correspondent becomes a member of the conference if you press “**Options**” and select “**Add to conference**”, and then confirm by pressing . Pressing  disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press “**Options**” and select “**End conf.**”.

3.6 Line switching ⁽¹⁾

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under “**Call register**”, choose “**Line switching**” and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use the two lines.



The services programmed on the default line do not impact those selected on the other line.

4 Menu arrange



Main menu is designed to vary to your desire.

Change the order

Press left softkey and select “**Move**” or long keypress Side key/**OK** key till tick “√” is shown, then move the cursor to your favorite destination and confirm with **OK** key.

Show/Hide

Access “**Menu arrange**”, press **OK** to show/hide the main menu. The hidden one will be displayed in grey.

5 Messages



You can create, edit and receive SMS, MMS and email with this cellphone.

MMS is a message whereby you can send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible cellphones and e-mail addresses.



The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, and if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered (see page 32).

5.1 Messages: Text/Multimedia message ⁽¹⁾

5.1.1 Create message

From the main menu select “**Messages**” to create text/multimedia message.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when images, videos, audios, slides, attachments inserted, Subject, CC/BCC/email address added, or more than 8 pages of text edited in message.

You can type a message but you can also modify a predefined message in **Templates** or customize your message by adding pictures, photos, sounds, titles, etc (only available while editing a MMS). While writing a message, select “**Options**” to access all the messaging options.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

You can save your messages that you send often to **Drafts** or **Templates** (**MMS only**).



An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on the languages you writing in) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message.

5.1.2 Inbox

All received messages (read and unread) are stored in the same Inbox.

When viewing your messages, you will find the following status icons, depending on the type of message: unread SMS in phone, unread SMS in SIM card, read SMS in phone, read SMS in SIM card, unread MMS in phone, read MMS in phone, message reception in progress and message sending in progress.

Receiving and reading SMS/MMS

When you receive a new message, a beep sounds and the icon with the number of new messages appear on the screen.

Once you have a message, the following options are given: **View**, **Reply**, **Forward** the message to another person, **Edit**, **Group by sender**, **Delete**, **Delete all**, **Move to archive** and extract number, URL or email address (**Use number/Use URL/Use email address**), etc.

Group by sender/Group by receiver ⁽¹⁾

Messages can be grouped by sender/receiver (“**Options/Group by sender**”/“**Options/Group by receiver**”). And you are enabled to quick search the messages by pressing the key associated with the first letter of sender/receiver’s name.

⁽¹⁾ The option of Group by receiver is available in Outbox, Sent, and Draft folders only.

Group unread message

Unread messages will always be floating above the other read messages.

Timer send

Schedule a SMS/MMS to be sent out at predefined time (**Create SMS/MMS**→**Add number**→**Options/Timer send**).

5.1.3 Outbox

All failed to be sent messages.

5.1.4 Sent

All sent messages.

5.1.5 Drafts

All drafts messages.

5.1.6 Archive

A library to store messages.

5.1.7 Empty folder

Delete all messages in “**Inbox/Outbox/Sent/Drafts...**”.

5.1.8 Templates

A list of predefined messages is available. Select one, edit it if required, and then send it. You can also create your own predefined multimedia messages.

5.2 Email

Your phone has an email client with the settings pre-defined for a few popular email services like – GoogleMail, Windows live, Yahoo, AOL, etc. Besides this, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

5.2.1 Access

Press **OK** key to enter main menu, select “**Message\Email**”, then confirm with **OK** key.

5.2.2 Email account set-up

Pre-defined email service

If you own an email account of pre-defined services, you can install it to your phone by selecting the service (GoogleMail, yahoo, etc.), entering the username, password and account name, and then confirming with **OK** key.

New email service

To set up a new email account other than the pre-defined email services, access “**Create Email account**” menu, select “**Other Email accounts**”, then confirm with **OK**/left softkey.

You are required to enter your email address, select protocol ⁽¹⁾ (POP3 or IMAP4) and network, then enter your incoming server address and outgoing server address, and then input your user name, password and account name, select “**Done**”.



After entering or selecting, do not forget to select “**Next**” to come to the next step.

⁽¹⁾ Consult your email service provider for more information about protocol.

5.2.3 Inbox

Folder of all received Emails.

5.2.4 Outbox

Folder of all unsent Emails.

5.2.5 Sent

Folder of all sent Emails.

5.2.6 Drafts

Folder of all draft Emails.

5.2.7 Available options

Select

- Select to enter the menu.

Send and receive

- To connect the email server in order to receive/send mails.

Send and receive all accounts

- To connect all email accounts' server in order to receive/send mails.

Create Email

- To create a new Email.

Templates

- A list of predefined messages.

Edit account

- To edit the detailed configuration information of the selected account.

Delete account

- To delete the current selected account.

New account

- To create a new email account.

Empty folder

- Delete all emails in “**Inbox/Outbox/Sent/Drafts**”.

Delete marked

- To delete the marked mail in the selected folder.

Delete all

- To delete all the mails in the folder which you select.

Delete all marked

- To delete all marked mails in all folders.

5.3 Voice message

Record voice and send as MMS.

5.4 Photo message

Take a photo and send as MMS.

5.5 Video message

Take a video and send as MMS.

5.6 Voicemail

View and edit the voice mail number.

5.7 Broadcast SMS

Store the received Broadcast SMS.

5.8 WAP alerts

Store WAP push messages.

5.9 Settings

5.9.1 Text message

Profile settings • Profiles can be retrieved directly from SIM card. Alternatively, you can create your own profile.

General setting • Delivery report, request for acknowledgement of delivery report On/Off. Reply path ⁽¹⁾ show reply path.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

Alphabet management • It enables you to define SMS data coding for SMS sending.

Memory status • Memory used on the phone.

Preferred storage • Select default message storage, SIM or phone.

Prof. Bearer • Bearer preference.

5.9.2 Multimedia message

Edit • Set edit mode, image size and signature.

Sending • Set the values for validity period, Read report, etc.

Retrieve • Set the values for Home network, Roaming network, etc.

Profiles • Follow the same procedure as for setting your WAP connection.

Memory status • Memory used on the phone.

5.9.3 Broadcast SMS ⁽¹⁾

Receive mode • Enable to receive broadcast SMS.

Languages • Language selection.

Channel setting • Add/Edit channels.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

6 Instant messaging



Palringo Instant messaging (IM) allows you to chat with other people using Palringo account. You can also connect to other popular IM services through Palringo, like MSN, Yahoo, AIM, GG, ICQ, Google talk, iChat and etc. Please note that the services may be upgraded upon your client version.

6.1 Access

To access Palringo, press **OK** key to enter main menu, select  and press **OK** to confirm.

6.2 Open a Palringo account online

Before activating this service, you are required to open a Palringo account online.

- Press left softkey to enter **"Menu"**, click **"Sign in"**, then press **▶**, confirm with **OK**, and select **"Create Account"**.
- You can also open account directly on website: <http://www.palringo.com/en/gb/>.

6.3 Sign in/Sign out

To connect to Paringo instant messaging server, please click **"Menu"**, then select **"Sign in"**. You are required to input your Paringo account information, like username (Email address), password, sign in status, etc.

To sign out, click **"Menu"**, then **"Sign out"**.

6.4 Add service

Various of services (MSN, Yahoo, Google, ICQ etc.) can be added by **"Menu\Services\Add Service"**.

For example: To add a service of MSN messenger, you need to enter your MSN ID and password, then confirm with **OK**/left softkey.

6.5 Chat

To start a chat, select one contact online, then **"Menu\Private chat"**. Type a text message, then press **OK**/left softkey to send. In chatting, you can also exchange voice or photo message with your community.

6.6 Contacts

• Add a contact

To add a contact, click **"Menu"**, then select **"Add contact"**.

First, you need to specify which service, MSN or Yahoo for example, you want to add the new contact to. Then please input the contact's email address, then confirm by pressing **OK**/left softkey.



Your request will be sent to the contact for approval, once accepted, the contact's name and status will appear on your contact list.

• Delete a contact

To delete a contact, select one contact, then **"Menu>Delete contact"**. The selected contact will be removed from your contact list.

6.7 Groups

With this menu, you can **"Join a group"** or **"Create a new group"**. You can chatting with all member in the group simultaneously.

7 Directory



7.1 Consulting your directory

To access the **Directory** from the main screen, press the \blacktriangledown key ⁽¹⁾ or press the **OK** key and select the  icon from the menu.

You can also customize a quick access to your contact with the keypad customisation (see page 71).

You have 4 directories:

-  General
-  Most called
-  SIM directory
-  Phone directory
-  Group

In addition to the directories already provided, you can create up to 5 groups (maximum 100 entries per group).

Searching for a contact

You can search for a contact by multi-pressing the keys associated with the first letter and the other ones of his/her name.

Reading a file

Select a name from your directory, then press **OK** to read the file.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

Sending Vcard via Bluetooth

Selecting the Vcard you wish to transfer (“**Options**\Send vCard\By Bluetooth”).

Making the call

Press the \blacktriangleright key once the name is selected. If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Cellphone, Home, Office, etc.) using the \blacktriangledown key. Press the **OK** key to make the call.



Information in the directory and the diary may be sent to and received from a computer using the PC suite.

7.2 Creating a file

Select the directory in which you wish to create a file, press the “**Options**” softkey, select “**Create file**”.

When you create a new contact in the product directory, at least one of the following fields must be filled in:  First name,  Last name,  Group,  Cellphone,  Home,  Ringtone,  Image,  Video,  Work,  Fax,  Email,  Instant messaging,  Birthday,  Company,  URL.

You can move from one field to another using the \blacktriangledown key.



If you use your phone abroad, store the numbers in your directories in international format “+” followed by the country code (see page 21).

7.3 Available options

From the list of names in SIM directory, General directory or Group you can access the following options:

- View**
 - View a complete file: name, numbers, address, e-mail, etc.
- Create file**
 - Create a file (name, numbers, address, e-mail, etc.) in the desired directory.
- Call**
 - Make a call
- Create group**
 - Create a group of files.
- Send message**
 - Send an SMS/MMS/Email to a contact you selected from the directory.
- Edit**
 - Modify the contents of a file: name, number, ringtone, image, etc.
- Delete**
 - Delete the selected file.
- Delete group**
 - The group and its files will be completely deleted.
- Copy to phone/
SIM**
 - Copy a file from SIM directory to Phone directory, vice versa.
- Set as
My favorite**
 - Set the number as your favourite, whose ringtone could be different.
- Set ringtone**
 - Customize the ringtone of incoming call for the contact in **“My favorite”**.
- Send vCard**
 - Exchange data via SMS, MMS, Email, Bluetooth or save to memory card.
- Reset**
 - Reset the contacts in **“Most called”**.
- Associate/
Not associate**
 - If the original one in SIM or General directory is modified, the one in a group will be updated accordingly, otherwise not.

Send number

Directory management

- Send the number to the others by SMS.
- **Default storage** Set default storage to store new contacts.
- **Copy all** Copy the whole directory to the SIM or General directory only if there is sufficient memory.
- **Delete all** Delete all the files in the current directory.
- **My number** Type in, modify or send the user's own number by SMS.
- **Memory status** View used & available space in SIM and Phone directory.
- **Display format** Select the format of name display.

8 Call register.....

8.1 Call memory

You can access your call memory by pressing the  key from the main screen. Choose the option of the desired list:

-  Missed calls
-  Outgoing calls (Redial)
-  Answered calls

Select a number of the call memory and press the “**Options**” softkey to **View** call details, **Create text/multimedia message**, **Save** or **Delete** the selected number or clear the entire list (**Delete all**).

8.2 My numbers

Type in or modify your telephone number or the number to access your voicemail and confirm by pressing **OK**. Your telephone number is usually written on your SIM card.

8.3 Billing

You can access different items with this option:

- Amount**
 - You can view the total cost of charged calls, modify it or reset it and enter the cost of a Telecom Unit in the currency of your choice.
- Duration**
 - You can view the total duration of all outgoing calls or reset it.
- GPRS counter**
 - Management of the volume of data communications charged for (in kilobytes).

- Beep duration**
 - You can activate or cancel the beep emitted during a call with a specified frequency (enter the frequency and confirm by **OK**).

8.4 Call settings ⁽¹⁾

You can access a number of items with this option:

8.4.1 Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

8.4.2 Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of the call forwarding to the voicemail or to a specified number. The following configurations are possible:

- Unconditional: systematic forwarding of all your calls. The  icon is displayed.
- Conditional: if your line is busy, if you don't answer or if you are outside the network range.
- If busy, no reply or unreachable.

8.4.3 Call barring

You can activate or deactivate the call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

- Outgoing calls**
 - The following configurations are possible:
 - All calls
 - All outgoing calls are barred.
 - All calls except SIM directory
 - All outgoing calls except those in SIM directory are barred.

⁽¹⁾ Contact your network operator to check service availability.

- International calls • Outgoing international calls are barred.
- International except home • Outgoing international calls except those to your country of subscription are barred.

- Incoming calls**
- The following configurations are possible:
 - All calls • All incoming calls are barred.
 - All calls except SIM directory • All incoming calls except those in SIM directory are barred.
 - Roaming • Incoming calls are barred when you are abroad.

- Cancel all barring**
- Deactivate all call barring.

- Change barring PW**
- Change the original PW for activating call barring.

8.4.4 Caller ID

Activate/deactivate CLIR.

8.4.5 Line switching ⁽¹⁾

Line switch between line 1 and line 2.

8.4.6 Auto redial

You can activate or deactivate the automatic callback of your party for calls that do not get through the first time.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your SIM card.

9 Media applications.....

9.1 Music player ⁽¹⁾

Access this feature from the main menu by selecting “**Music player**”. You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your cellphone and memory card.

You can have access to your music files through one of the following:

- All songs**
- Contains all songs both on phone memory and memory card.

- My star list**
- You can simply add your favorite songs to “**My star list**” by holding down  during playing music (max 100).

- Folders**
- Category of songs in folder.
- Album/Artist/Genre**
- Music files are categorized by Album, Artist or Genre based on information stored in the tags. Those missing such information will be classified as “**Unknown files**”.

- Update songs**
- Update the information of songs saved in phone or memory card.

Use keys to manage the Music player:

 / Side key: Set the volume level

 : Go to previous/next title (short keypress)
Fast play backward/forward (long keypress)

 : Switch sound between handset and Bluetooth.

⁽¹⁾ Only music files in mp3, m4a, wma and aac format will be visible in Music player.

9.1.1 Settings

Access by pressing the right navigation key for following options:

- Play mode** • Normal, Repeat current, Repeat all, Shuffle and Repeat shuffle. You may also customize it simply by pressing  during playing music.
- Equalizer** • Different music styles preset in the phone. You may also customize it simply by pressing  during playing music.
- Play in Bluetooth/Play in phone** • In playing screen, press the  key to shift between play in speaker and play in BT stereo headset
- Play in Phone& Bluetooth/Play in Bluetooth** • Play music in Bluetooth, Phone or both in Phone & Bluetooth. In playing screen, press the  key to shift between play in speaker and play in BT stereo headset.
- Display** • Enable your player to display spectrum, song info. or lyric.

9.1.2 Playing with lyrics

Lyrics can be displayed in synchronization with the music.

9.2 Image Viewer.....

A library links to the pictures in “My creations” and “My images” in phone to be shown in list, slide, or thumbnail, set as Wallpaper; Screen saver, Power on/off display, and Contact ID, or sent by MMS, Email, Bluetooth.

9.3 Video player.....

Contains all video clips both in phone and memory card and enables you to **Play, Send (by MMS, Email, or Bluetooth), Delete, Delete all, Rename, Sort (by name, type, time or size)** and **Copy** or **Move** the video/videos, and to **Download/Capture** new video clips.

Streaming URL

This feature enables user to start watching video almost as soon as it begins downloading from internet.

Use keys to manage the Video player:

-  : Set as play/pause
-  : Set the volume level
-  : Fast play backward/forward
-  : Adjust the display screen size via left softkey

9.4 Radio

Your phone is equipped with a Radio ⁽¹⁾ with RDS functionality. You can use the application as a traditional Radio and saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display, if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.

 To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

(1) The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

Available options:

- Channel list** • Open the list of saved stations.
- Save channel** • Save the current tuned station to the “**Channel list**”.
- Auto search** • Start auto search and stations will be automatically saved to “**Channel list**”.
- Enter the frequency** • Enter the frequency manually.
- Turn off** • Stop playing the radio.
- Record** • Record the radio and files will be automatically saved to “**Tools\Voice memoList**”.
- Settings** • Use ◀ ▶ navigation keys to do settings.
- Activate loudspeaker/ Play in headset** • Listen to the radio using loudspeaker or headset.
- Activate mono mode/stereo mode** • Switch between mono and stereo mode.
- Update station name ⁽¹⁾** • Save RDS information as station name in the channel list.
- Excellent audio frequency** • Optimize the audio quality.



Hold down the ▶ key to enter the mode of “**Manual tuning**” and go to the previous/next station by pressing the ◀ ▶ navigation keys in the interface of Radio.

10 Internet.....

10.1 My friends

It migrates a self-contained sub-trees of the websites to let you stay in touch with your friends by flicking through bebo, Friendster, hi5, facebook, myspace, etc.

10.2 Opera

Opera Mini gives you not only the full Web experience, where you stay in touch with your friends, obtain information, do your online banking, but also is built for time saving with compressed web pages.

10.3 Web

10.3.1 Homepage

Launch the Web browser with the preset homepage.

10.3.2 Bookmarks

Access your favorite sites.

10.3.3 Go to URL

Enter the URL of Web site.

10.3.4 Last web address

Last visited URL.

10.3.5 Recent pages

Pages which you recently browsed.

10.3.6 Offline pages

Pages available for offline viewing.

10.3.7 Alert inbox

Store WAP push messages.

10.3.8 Settings

Customize your browser preferences.

10.4 News ⁽¹⁾

It is a huge time saver that provides news updates from a website in a simple form.

Once subscribed to a feed, it gives you the ability to track and manage all your favorite RSS content on your cellphone at anytime, anywhere!

Available options:

View	Message title or message summary of a feed with URL will be shown.
Update	Refresh the content of a feed.
Create channel	Create a new channel with name and URL.
Delete	Delete the feed.
Edit	Edit the name or URL of a feed.
Update all	Refresh all feeds.
Settings	Select a regular interval to retrieve the update automatically as well as a WAP account to connect.

10.5 Weather ⁽¹⁾

Your phone is equipped with a weather function for consulting up to 3-day forecast of favorite cities.

To access the function, you can push the Side key to access shortcuts, then scroll up/down to select the  icon and you can also press the **OK** key to access the main menu and select the .

Available options:

More info	Search more weather info online.
Forecast	Display 3-day weather forecast.
Update	Refresh weather information.
My cities	List all my cities, you can add new city, set default city, delete the selected city, etc. via “ My cities \Options”.
Settings	Set unit, update mode and network.

Entertainment

11.1 Fun.....

11.1.1 Pedometer

Used originally by sports and physical fitness enthusiasts, pedometer help you to measure speed, distance, steps and calories burned, even you may set goals, which it could track.

- **Training plans**

There would be a monthly-view calendar for you to set several simultaneous targets.

- **Profiles**

Up to 3 profiles to be varied from people to people for Pedometer's better performance.



An optional position, your pocket or trousers to place your phone or strapping it onto your waist is recommended for its reasonable accuracy when pedometer is activated.

11.1.2 Stopwatch

Stopwatch is simple application for measuring time with possibility to register several results and suspend/resume measurement.

11.1.3 Games



22 Troubleshooting

Before contacting the aftersales department, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimize its performance.
- You are advised to fully charge () the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your telephone as this may affect the performance of your telephone.

and carry out the following checks:

My cellphone will not switch on

- Press  until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

My phone has not responded for several minutes

- Press the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

My screen is difficult to read

- Clean your screen
- Use your cellphone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

My cellphone turns off by itself

- Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your cellphone
- Check the battery charge level

My cellphone has a low level of autonomy

- Make sure you respected the complete charge timing (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication

My cellphone will not charge properly

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; the battery charge indicator can take several minutes and may be accompanied by a quiet whistling sound
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C +40°C)
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger
- Make sure you are using an Alcatel battery and charger
- When abroad, check that the electrical current is compatible

My cellphone will not connect to a network

- Try connecting in another location
- Verify the network coverage with your operator
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is valid
- Try selecting the available network(s) manually (see page 73)
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded

SIM card error

- Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see page 18)
- Verify with your operator that your SIM card is 3V compatible; the old 5V SIM cards cannot be used
- Make sure the chip on your SIM card is not damaged or scratched

Unable to make outgoing calls

- Make sure you have dialled a valid number and press the  key
- For international calls, check the country and area codes
- Make sure your cellphone is connected to a network, and that the network is not overloaded or unavailable
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls (see page 40)

Unable to receive incoming calls

- Make sure your cellphone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls (see page 40)
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls

The caller's name does not appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator
- Your caller has concealed his/her number

The sound quality of the calls is not optimal

- You can adjust the volume during a call by means of the  key
- Check the radio reception icon level 

I am unable to use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an Alcatel accessory

When I select a number from my directory, the number is not dialed

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have selected the country prefix when calling a foreign country

I am unable to create a file in my directory

- Make sure that your SIM card directory is not full; delete some files or save the files in the product directory (i.e. your professional or personal directories)

My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail

- Contact your network operator to check service availability

I cannot access my voicemail

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "My Numbers"
- Try later if the network is busy

I am unable to send and receive messages MMS, Vox MMS

- Check your phone memory available as it might be full
- Contact your network operator to check service availability and check MMS parameters (see page 32)
- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your operator
- The server center may be saturated; try again later

The icon is displayed on my standby screen

- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the product memory

"No service" is displayed

- You are outside of the network coverage area

I have already entered 3 incorrect PIN codes

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

I am unable to connect my telephone to my computer

- Install first of all Alcatel's PC suite
- Use "Install the connection" and perform the installation
- Check that your computer meets the requirements for Alcatel's PC Suite installation

I am unable to download new files

- Check for free space
- Delete some files
- Select the MicroSD Card to store the files you downloaded
- Check your subscription status with your operator

The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your cellphone is visible to other users (see page 63)

My cellphone is dead, can't power on

- Make sure your battery is not completely used up or damaged.
- Remove your battery, **remove your SIM** card then power it on again.
- Hold down # + power on/off key at same time to reset it.



ALL User phone data: contacts, photos, messages and files, downloaded applications like Java games will be **lost permanently**.

How to make your battery last longer

- Switch on the backlight upon request.
- Extend email auto-check interval as longer as possible.
- Update news, weather info. upon demand manually or set its auto-check interval longer.
- Exit Java background-running applications if long time no use.
- Deactivate Bluetooth when not in use.

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
