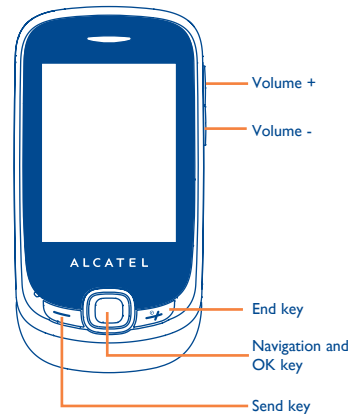


Quick Start Guide

Your cellphone

1.1 Keys

- Send Key**
 - Access call log from idle
 - Accept an incoming call
 - To dial the number focused on the screen
- End Key**
 - Power on/off (press and hold)
 - Return back to idle from any other state
 - Lock the screen (press in idle screen)
- Navigation keys (in idle screen):**
 - Up to Camera
 - Down to Contacts
 - Central key
 - Open Main Menu in idle
 - Confirm/ok/select in other state
- Volume keys (side keys)**
 - Adjust general volume (press)

1.2 Main screen icons ⁽¹⁾

- Battery charge level**
- Vibrate alert:** your cellphone vibrates, but does not ring or beep.
- Bluetooth status (Activated).**
- Bluetooth status (Connected to an audio device).**
- Headset connected.**
- Keypad locked.**
- Call forwarding activated:** your calls are forwarded.

2 Getting started.....

2.1 Set-up

Removing and installing the back cover



Removing and installing the battery

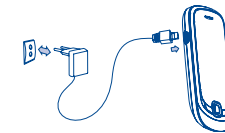


Inserting and removing the SIM card



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your cellphone and mains socket respectively.

- The charging may take about 20 minutes to start if the battery is flat.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the cellphone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your cellphone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). You are advised to fully charge the battery ().
- To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Bluetooth when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

The charge is complete when the animation stops.

2.2 Power on your cellphone

Hold down the key until the cellphone powers on.

2.3 Power off your cellphone

Hold down the key from the main screen.

3 Calls

3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing .

To hang up the call, press the .

Making an emergency call

If your cellphone is covered by the network, dial emergency number and press the key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unlocking the keypad.

3.2 Calling your voicemail ⁽¹⁾

To access your voicemail, hold down the .

3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the key to talk and then hang up using the .

3.4 Available functions during the call

During a call, you can use your directory, your calendar, text messages, etc. without hanging up or dropping the call.

4 Contacts

4.1 Consulting your contacts

To access the **contacts** from the main screen, press the key and select the icon from the menu.

4.2 Adding a contact

Select the directory in which you wish to add contact, tap , add select **"Add contact"**.

5 Messaging

5.1 Create message

From the main menu select **"Messaging"** to create text/multimedia message. You can type a message and you can also modify a predefined message in **Templates** or customize your message by adding pictures, photos, sounds, titles, etc (only available while editing a MMS). While writing a message, select to access all the messaging options. You can save your messages that you send often to **Draft** or **Templates** (MMS only).

Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

6 Dialer

Enter the desired number from keypad directly or select a contact from contacts by tapping , then press key to place the call. The number you entered can be saved to contacts by selecting . If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by tapping .

To hang up the call, press the .

7 Email

Your cellphone has an email client with the settings predefined for a few popular email services like - GoogleMail, Windows live, Yahoo, AOL, etc ⁽¹⁾. Besides this, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

8 Opera Mini

Not only does Opera Mini give you the full Web experience where you stay in touch with your friends, obtain information, do your online banking etc., but it is also designed to save time by using compressed web pages.

9 Facebook

Facebook is a social utility that connects people with friends and others who work, study and live around them. It provides a number of features with which users interact, such as Wall, Pokes, etc.

10 mTweet

Twitter is a social networking and microblogging service that has gained notability and popularity worldwide. This feature enables cellphone users to exchange news updates and ideas with a community in the form of messages or posts. Posts are displayed on the author's profile page and delivered to the author's subscribers or followers.

11 Camera

Your cellphone is fitted with a camera for taking photos and shooting videos that you can use in different ways:

- store them in your **"File manager\My photos"**.
- send them directly by MMS, Email or Bluetooth.
- customize your main screen.
- select them as incoming call image to a contact in your directory.

12 Palringo ⁽¹⁾

Palringo Instant messaging (IM) allows you to chat with other people using Palringo account. You can also connect to other popular IM services through Palringo, like Yahoo, AIM, GG, ICQ, Google talk, iChat etc. Please note that the services may be upgraded depending on your client version.

13 Image viewer

A library links to the images in **"My photos"** in cellphone to be shown in list, slide, set as Wallpaper, Power on/off display, and Incoming call image, or sent by MMS, Email, Bluetooth.

14 Music player

Access this feature from the main menu by selecting **"Music"**. You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your cellphone and memory card.

15 Video player

"My videos" album contains video clips recorded, received or downloaded.

16 Radio

Your cellphone is equipped with a radio ⁽¹⁾ with RDS functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.

17 My friends

It migrates self-contained sub-trees of the websites to let you stay in touch with your friends by flicking through Friendster, Hi5, etc.

18 Settings

From the main menu, select the menu icon and select the function of your choice in order to customize your cellphone: **Phone settings, Call settings, Security, Network, Connectivity.**

19 Call log

You can access your call memory by pressing from the idle screen, and you will see **Outgoing call(s), Missed call(s)** and **Answered call(s).**

20 Calendar

Once you enter this menu from the main menu, there is a monthly-view calendar for you to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc. Days with events entered will be marked.

21 Tasks

Enables you to easily manage and track the progress of a task with priorities. All the tasks will be sorted by due date.

22 Notes

You can create a note in text or voice format by accessing **"Notes"** from the main menu.

23 Calculator

Enter a number, select the type of operation to be performed, and enter the second number, then press **"="** to display the result.

24 File manager

You will have access to all audio and visual files stored in cellphone or memory card in File manager. You can access a number of items with this option: **My audios, My images, My photos, My videos, Ebook, Other files, Phone, Memory card and Memory status.**

Installing and removing the memory card:



To release the microSD card holder, slide it in the direction of the arrow and lift it. Then insert the microSD card with the golden contact downward. Finally, turn down the microSD holder and slide it in the opposite direction to lock it.

25 Converter

Unit converter and Currency converter.

26 Stopwatch

The stopwatch is a simple application for measuring time with the possibility to register several results and suspend/resume measurement.

27 Ebook

A bookshelf contains the electronic books (.txt and .pdb file only). While reading the book, you may add bookmarks, or reach the text by searching words, phrases (**Options\Find, Options\Jump to**).

28 Clock

28.1 Alarm

Your cellphone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature.

28.2 World clock

The World clock shows current local time and the time zone in different cities.

28.3 Time and date

Allows you to have settings of time and date, including 12/24h format.

29 Java

Your Alcatel cellphone may include ⁽¹⁾ some Java™ applications and games. You can also download new applications and games to your cellphone.

29.1 Java applications

Select **"Java applications"** to launch applications.

29.2 Download application

With this menu, you can download new applications and games to your cellphone.

29.3 Java settings

This menu allows you to manage Java settings, in which you may set Audio, Backlight, Vibration and Heap size.

29.4 Java network

This menu allows you to select the network for Java.

29.5 Trusted certificates

View detailed information of the trusted certificates supported by your cellphone.

30 WAP

Access Wap options: **Homepage, Bookmarks, Recent pages, Offline pages, Go to URL, Service inbox, Settings.**

31 Bluetooth™

Access this feature by pressing to enter the main menu, then selecting **"Bluetooth"**.

32 News

It is a huge time saver providing news updates from a website in a simple form. Once subscribed to a channel, it gives you the ability to track and manage all your favorite RSS content on your cellphone at anytime, anywhere!
