

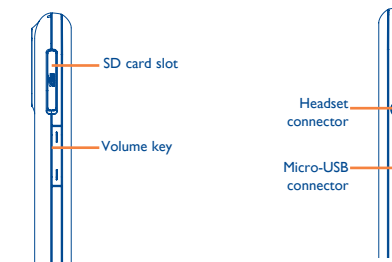
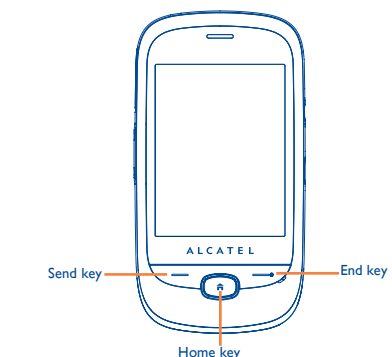

## Your cellphone.....

### 1.1 Keys and connectors



- Answer/Send a call
- Enter Call log
- Press to light up the cellphone screen
- Press: End a call
- Lock the screen
- Return to the previous Home screen
- Press to light up the cellphone screen
- Press and hold: Power on/off
- Press to return to the middle Home screen
- Press to light up the cellphone screen
- Volume up/down
- Zoom in/out
- Scroll up/down
- Press to light up the cellphone screen

### 1.2 Home screen

You can bring all the items (shortcuts and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access.



The Home screen is provided in an extended format to provide you with more space for adding widgets and shortcuts. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. Small dots at the bottom of the screen indicate which screen you are viewing.

### 1.2.1 Status bar icons<sup>(1)</sup>

#### Battery charge level

**Vibrate alert:** your cellphone vibrates, but does not ring or beep with the exception of the alarm.

## 3 Making a call.....

To place a call, you may touch from tool bar.

Enter the desired number on the on-screen keypad directly or select a contact from Call log or Contacts by touching or respectively, then touch or press key to place the call. The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by selecting . If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up the call, press the key.

When making, receiving or during a call, press to return to the middle Home screen, and then touch or press to retrieve the call.

### Muting the ringtone

You may mute ringtone of current incoming call by touching .

Answer the call by pressing the key.

### Rejecting a call

Press the key once to reject the call, or reject call with SMS by touching .

## 4 Message.....

### 4.1 Access

You may access this menu using the following options:

- Touch to enter the main menu screen, and then select .
- Access from tool bar by selecting .

### 4.2 Conversational On (Off) mode

In conversational on mode, you can view chat history in chronological order. In conversational off mode, you can access the following folders: **Inbox, Outbox, Sent, Broadcast SMS, Voicemail, Drafts**, etc. You can switch between these two modes by selecting "Switch view mode" via . Conversational on mode is set as the default mode and the following instructions are based on this mode.

### 4.3 Write message

Touch to create text/multimedia messages. Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when: images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted; Subject, CC/BCC/email address is added; or the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

### Timer send

Schedule an SMS/MMS to be sent out at predefined time (select "Timer send" via .

## 5 Email.....

Your cellphone has an email client with the settings predefined for a few popular email services like - GoogleMail, Yahoo, AOL, etc. Besides this, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

## 6 Palringo<sup>(1)</sup>.....

Palringo Instant message (IM) allows you to chat with other people using Palringo account. You can also connect to other popular IM services through Palringo, like Yahoo, AIM, GG, ICQ, GTalk, iChat, etc. Please note that the services accessible to you will depend on your client version and dynamic Palringo server options.

## 7 Contacts.....

### 7.1 Consulting your Contacts

To access the Contacts, touch from tool bar to enter the main menu, and select "Contacts".

### 7.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact by touching .

### Birthday reminder

You can set a birthday reminder when editing contact information. This will remind you at regular intervals during the day prior to the set date.

### 7.3 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From the cellphone contacts screen, select "More" via and touch "Import from SIM card" or "Export to SIM card".

From the SIM contacts screen, select "More" via and touch "Copy to phone".

From a detailed Contact view screen, you can share the contact information with others by selecting "Share contact" via and then send it by Bluetooth, MMS, Email, etc.

## 8 Call log.....

### 8.1 Access

You may access this function from the main menu "Call log" or by pressing from the Home screen.

### 8.2 Available options

When you touch , you may have access to **Delete, Send message, Save to Contacts, Edit before call**, etc.

#### 8.2.1 Billing<sup>(1)</sup>

You can access different items with this option: **Last call cost, Total cost, Max cost, Reset cost, Price per unit, Duration, GPRS counter, Beep duration**.

#### 8.2.2 Call settings<sup>(1)</sup>

You can access a number of items with this option: **Call waiting, Call forwarding, Call barring, Caller ID, Line switching, Auto redial**, etc.

## 9 Media applications.....

### 9.1 Music player.....

To access this function, touch to enter the main menu and select . You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your cellphone and SD card.

## 9.2 Image viewer.....

A library links to the images in "My creations" in cellphone to be shown in list, slide, or thumbnail, set as Wallpaper, Power on/off display, and Contact ID, or sent by MMS, Email, Bluetooth.

### 9.3 Video player.....

"My videos" album contains video clips recorded, received or downloaded. All video clips in this folder can be played, set as Power on/off display, sent, deleted, renamed, sorted.

### 9.4 Radio.....

Your cellphone is equipped with a radio<sup>(1)</sup> with RDS<sup>(2)</sup> functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.

## 10 Internet<sup>(3)</sup>.....

### 10.1 Opera.....

Not only does Opera Mini give you the full Web experience where you stay in touch with your friends, obtain information, do your online banking etc., but it is also designed to save time by using compressed web pages.

## 10.2 Wap.....

Access Wap options: **Homepage, Bookmarks, Go to URL, Last web address, Recent pages, Offline pages, Service inbox, Settings**.

### 10.3 News.....

It is a huge time saver providing news updates from a website in a simple form. Once subscribed to a channel, it gives you the ability to track and manage all your favorite RSS content on your cellphone at anytime, anywhere!

### 10.4 Weather.....

Your cellphone is equipped with a weather function for consulting up to 3-day forecasts of favorite cities.

### 10.5 Facebook.....

Facebook is a social utility that connects people with friends and others who work, study and live around them. It provides a number of features with which users may interact: Wall, a space on every user's profile page that allows friends to post messages for the user to see; Pokes, which allow users to send a virtual "poke" to each other; Gifts, a feature allowing users to send virtual gifts which appear on the recipient's profile; Market places, which lets users post free classified goods, etc. To open an account online, please go to: <http://www.facebook.com/>.

### 10.6 mTweet.....

Twitter is a social networking and microblogging service that has gained notability and popularity worldwide. This feature enables cellphone users to exchange news updates and ideas with a community in the form of messages or posts. Posts are displayed on the author's profile page and delivered to the author's subscribers or followers. To open an account online, please go to: <http://twitter.com/>.

### 1.2.2 Status list

Touch the status bar and drag down to open, drag up to close.

To open an application, touch it from the list.

### 1.2.3 Toolbar

Toolbar with 4 fixed shortcuts to access **Main menu, Calls, Message, Edit Home screen**.

### 1.2.4 Personalize your home screen

#### Adding items

To add an item, touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen or select from the toolbar.

**Add shortcuts** To add a shortcut to the Home screen, such as Alarm, Bookmarks, Contacts, etc.

**Add widgets** To add a widget to the Home screen, such as the World clock, Music player, etc.

#### Editing/Removing/Re-organizing items

Press and hold the application on the Home screen to edit/remove/re-organize it, touch to edit (only for my favorites), touch to remove. Touch and hold the application and drag it to the location you desire, and then confirm by touching "Done".

#### Customizing wallpaper

To personalize your wallpaper, you can select one of the following two ways:

• Touch and hold an empty area from the Home screen, select "Wallpaper", then touch a folder to select an image as your wallpaper.

• Touch from the tool bar, select "Wallpaper", then touch a folder to select an image as your wallpaper.

## 2 Getting started.....

### 2.1 Set-up

#### Removing or installing the back cover



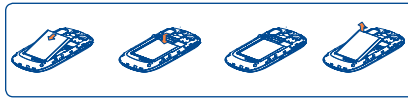
#### Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your cellphone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.



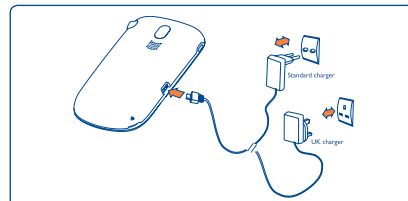
Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.

#### Installing or removing the battery



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the cellphone cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

### Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your cellphone and outlet respectively.

To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

### 2.2 Power on your cellphone

Hold down the key until the cellphone powers on.

### 2.3 Power off your cellphone

Hold down the key from the Home screen.

### 2.4 Using the touchscreen

**Touch** To access an application, touch it with your finger.

**Drag** Place your finger on the screen to drag the object to the destination.

**Scroll** Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.

### Inserting the SD card:



- Unclip the cover and insert the MicroSD card into the slot.
- Unclip the cover and gently push the SD card until unlocked. Take out your MicroSD card and clip the cover closed.

## 15 Bluetooth™.....

Access this feature by touching to enter the main menu, then selecting "Bluetooth".

## 16 Others.....

### 16.1 Calendar.....

Once you enter this menu from the main menu, there is a monthly-view calendar for you to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc. Days with events entered will be marked in color.

### 16.2 Calculator.....

Access this feature by selecting "Calculator" from the main menu. Enter a number, select the type of operation to be performed, and enter the second number, then press "=" to display the result.

### 16.3 Notes.....

You can create a note in text or voice format by accessing "Notes" from the main menu.

### 16.4 Tasks .....

Enables you to easily manage and track the progress of a task with priorities. All the tasks will be sorted by due date.

### 16.5 Clock .....

#### 16.5.1 Alarm

Your cellphone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature.

#### 16.5.2 World clock

The World clock shows current local time and the time zone in different cities.

#### 16.5.3 Date and time

Allows you to have settings of date and time, including 12/24h format.

### 16.6 Converter .....

You can use the Weight and Length conversion by selecting the unit you wish to convert via <img alt="arrow icon"/>, then touch to input the digits. Finally confirm with "OK".

## 17 Settings .....

From the main menu, select the menu icon <img alt="gear icon"/> and select the function of your choice in order to customize your cellphone: **Phone settings, Call settings, Security, Network, Connectivity.**

#### Touch settings

- **LCD touch calibration** To calibrate the touch screen, touch anywhere on the screen to start calibration.
- **Touch vibration** When "On", the cellphone vibrates when the screen is touched.

#### Screen lock during call

Select "On"/"Off" to activate/deactivate screen lock during call.

#### Service selection <sup>(1)</sup>

- **GSM/GPRS** Only GSM/GPRS network service is available.
- **WCDMA** Only WCDMA network service is available.
- **Dual mode** Both GSM/GPRS and WCDMA network service are available, with priority to WCDMA.

## 18 Making the most of your cellphone.....

#### PC suite

You can download software upgrade for free from the website. The PC suite includes:

- **Backup/restore** You can backup the important data in your cellphone and restore them when needed.
- **3G (WCDMA)/EDGE/GPRS modem** Use your cellphone to connect PC to the internet.
- **Multimedia Personalization** Customize your cellphone with images, animations and melodies.
- **Message**

#### Supported Operating Systems

Windows 2000/XP/Vista/Windows 7.

#### One Touch Upgrade

Using One Touch Upgrade tool you can update your cellphone's software from your PC.

Download One Touch Upgrade from ALCATEL website (www.alcatelonetouch.com) and install it on your PC. Launch the tool and update your cellphone by following the step by step instructions (refer to the User Guide provided together with the tool). Your cellphone's software will now have the latest software.



All personal information will be permanently lost following the update process. We recommend you backup your personal data using PC Suite before upgrading.

You can use your cellphone as a webcam for instant message on your PC.

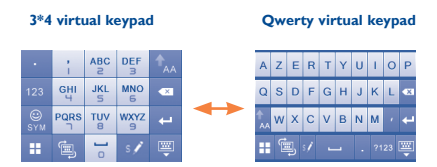
- Connect your cellphone to PC via USB cable.

## 19 Latin input mode .....

There are two text entry methods that can be used to write messages

- Normal: this mode allows you to type a text by choosing a letter or a sequence of characters associated with a key.
- TouchPal mode: This mode can perform predictive input in virtual keypad and supports multi-language input.

My cellphone will not switch on

- Press <img alt="power key icon"/> until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your cellphone back on

My cellphone has not responded for several minutes

- Press <img alt="power key icon"/> key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the cellphone back on

My screen is difficult to read

- Clean your screen
- Use your cellphone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

My cellphone turns off by itself

- Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your cellphone
- Check the battery charge level

My cellphone will not charge properly

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; If the battery is flat, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charger indicator on the screen
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C (32°F) +40°C (104°F))
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger
- Make sure you are using an Alcatel battery and charger in the box
- When abroad, check that the electrical current is compatible

## Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your cellphone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

#### TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a cellphone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their cellphone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless cellphones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your cellphone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas. When switched on, your cellphone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your cellphone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from cellphone RF energy.

#### CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the cellphone from time to time to optimize its performance.

Remember to abide by local authority rules of cellphone use on aircrafts. Operational Warnings: Obey all posted signs when using mobile devices in public areas.

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems: Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

Switch the cellphone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, cellphones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency. Switch the cellphone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C (14°F) to +55°C (131°F) (the max value depends on device, materials and housing paint/texture). Over 55°C (131°F) the legibility of the cellphone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious. Do not open or attempt to repair your cellphone yourself. Do not drop, throw or try to bend your cellphone. Do not paint it.
