4 Menu arrange

It is designed to vary according to your preference.

Change the order

Access the main menu, focus on the main menu item you want to move, select "Options|Move", and tick "Y" will be shown on the item you selected, then release it to your favorite destination.

Show/Hide

Access the main menu, select "Options|Add and remove menu", and select the left check box of the selected menu once to show/hide, and then select "Done" to save the operation.

5 Messaging

5.1 Access
You may access this menu using the following options:

- Access from the main menu by selecting "Messaging".
- Select [M] from widget bar, and then enter the sub-menu you require.

5.2 Conversational On (Off) mode
In conversational mode, you can view chat history in chronological order. In conversational off mode, you may have access to the following folders: **Inbox, Outbox, Sent, Drafts, Voicemail, Broadcast SMS, Empty folder, Templates, Settings**, etc. Conversational view mode is set as default. You may switch to conventional mode by selecting "Options|Switch view mode".

5.3 Write message

You can select "Messaging|Write message" from the main menu or access from widget [M] to write text/multimedia message. One or more recipients can be added from contact list and you can remove a recipient by pressing [C]. Press "Contacts" through [O] key to multi-select recipients from Contacts.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted. Subject, CC/BCC/email address is added; or the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message. Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

6 Email.....

Your phone has an email client with the settings pre-defined for a few popular email services like – GoogleMail, Yahoo, AOL, etc. Besides this, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

7 Pairing (1).....

Pairing Instant messaging (IM) allows you to chat with other people using Pairing account. You can also connect to other popular IM services through Pairing, like Yahoo, AIM, GG, ICQ, GTalk, iChat etc.

Please note that the services accessible to you will depend on your client version and dynamic Pairing server options.

8 Contacts.....

8.1 Consulting your contacts

You can access to this function by selecting "Contacts" from the main menu or widget bar.

8.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact to phone or SIM card by selecting "Create new".

Birthday reminder

You can set a birthday reminder when editing contact information. This will remind you at regular intervals during the day prior to the set date.

9 Call log

9.1 Access

You can access the function using the following options:

- Select [C] from main menu
- Press [C] key from Home screen
- Select [C] from widget bar, and then enter the sub-menu you require.

10 Media applications

10.1 Music.....

You can access this feature from the main menu by selecting "Music" or directly press [M] from the Home screen. You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your mobile and SD card.

11.1 Apps.....

Apps is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your phone. You can access to this function by selecting "Apps" from the main menu.

11.2 Web.....

Web not only gives you the full Web experience where you stay in touch with your friends, obtain information, do your online banking etc., but also saves time by using compressed web pages.

11.3 WAP.....

Access WAP options: **Homepage, Bookmarks, Go to URL, Open file, Last web address, Recent pages, Offline pages, Service inbox, Settings**.

11.4 News.....

It is a huge time saver providing news updates from a website in a simple form. Once subscribed to a channel, it gives you the ability to track and manage all your favorite RSS content on your mobile phone at anytime, anywhere!

11.5 Weather.....

Your phone is equipped with a weather function for consulting up to 3-day forecast of favorite cities.

11.6 Facebook.....

Facebook is a social utility that connects people with friends and others who work, study and live around them. It provides a number of features with which users may interact: Wall, a space on every user's profile page that allows friends to post messages for the user to see; Pokes, which allow users to send a virtual "poke" to each other; Gifts, a feature allowing users to send virtual gifts which appear on the recipient's profile; Market places, which lets users post free classified goods, etc. To open an account online, please go to: <http://www.facebook.com/>.

11.7 mTweet.....

Twitter is a social networking and microblogging service that has gained notability and popularity worldwide. This feature enables phone users to exchange news updates and ideas with a community in the form of messages or posts. 12 Entertainment.....

12.1 Stopwatch.....

The stopwatch is a simple application for measuring time with the possibility to register several results and suspend/resume measurement.

12.2 Ebook.....

A bookshelf contains the electronic books (.txt and .pdb file only). While reading the book, you may add bookmark, or reach the text by searching words, phrases (Options|Find, Options|Jump to).

12.3 Java.....

Your Alcatel phone may include ⁽¹⁾ some Java™ applications and games. You can also download new applications and games to your phone.

13 Camera.....

Your mobile phone is fitted with a camera for taking photos and shooting videos that you can use in different ways:

- store them as your creations in SD card.
- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a mobile phone or an email address.
- send them directly by Email or Bluetooth.
- customize your Home screen.
- select them as incoming call image to a contact in your Contacts.
- transfer them by data cable or microSD card to your computer.

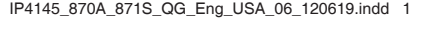
14 Profiles.....

18 Charging the battery

Connect the battery charger to your phone and outlet respectively. To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

19 Power on your phone

Hold down the [P] key until the telephone powers on.

20 Power off your phone

Hold down the [P] key from the Home screen.

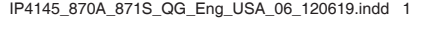
21 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the [C] key to place the call. The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by selecting "Save". If you make a mistake, you may press Right softkey to delete the incorrect digits one by one, or you may press and hold Right softkey to delete all. To hang up the call, press the [P] key.

17.2 Calculator

17.6 Alarm

Your mobile phone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature.

17.7 World clock

The World clock shows current local time and the time zone in different cities.

17.8 Converter

You can use the Weight and Length conversion by selecting the unit you wish to convert, then press to input the digits. Finally confirm with "OK".

17.9 Currency converter

You can easily calculate foreign values by setting the currency rate you wish to convert, then inputting the local value. Finally confirm with "OK".

17.10 Torch

Access the feature by selecting "Torch" from the main menu. Torch provides a handy light source which you can turn on/off as needed.

17.11 Zakat calculator

It may be requested by the police or your operator if your mobile phone is stolen.

Safety and use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your mobile phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile phone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless mobile phones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your mobile phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your mobile phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your mobile phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems: Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the mobile phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile phone.

Before a mobile phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown. The highest SAR value for this model mobile phone when tested is 1.19 W/Kg (one touch 870A), 0.935 W/Kg (one touch 871S) for use at the ear and 1.03 W/Kg (one touch 870A), 0.925 W/Kg (one touch 871S) for use close to the body. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure.

For body-worn operation, the mobile phone meets FCC RF exposure guidelines provided that it is used with a non-metallic accessory with the handset at least 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.
