

Cable TV Installer: This reminder is provided to call your attention to Article 820-40 of the National Electrical Code (Section 54 of the Canadian Electrical Code, Part 1) which provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground should be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

Important: This television is a table model and is designed to sit on a firm, flat surface. Don't place the TV on soft carpeting or similar surface because the ventilation slots on the bottom of the unit will be blocked, resulting in reduced lifetime from overheating. To assure adequate ventilation for this product, maintain a spacing of 4 inches from the top and side of the TV receiver and 2 inches from the rear of the TV receiver and other surfaces.

Also, make sure the stand or base you use is of adequate size and strength to prevent the TV from being accidentally tipped over, pushed off, or pulled off. This could cause personal injury and/or damage to the TV. Refer to the Important Safety Instructions on the next page.

The Power button (followed by the power symbol) on this TV and your remote control puts the TV into a very low-power standby mode but will not completely turn the power off. In order to completely shut the power off, you will need to disconnect the power cord from the outlet. The mains plug/appliance coupler is used as disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable. Therefore, you should ensure that the TV is installed in a manner that allows you to disconnect the power cord when desired.




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Precautions

Read all of the instructions before operating the set. Keep these instructions well for future use.

- Do not block or cover the ventilation openings on the back cover.
- Do not push objects of any kind into this unit through the cabinet slots as they could touch the current carrying parts or short-circuit parts, resulting in fire, electric shock, or damage to the unit.
- Do not attempt to open the cabinet as this may cause damage. There are no parts inside you can service by yourself. Refer all servicing to qualified personnel.
- Do not touch the screen surface with fingers as this may scratch or mar the TV screen.

Use Environment

- Do not place the set on an unstable cart, stand, or table.
- Place the set on a place that allows good ventilation.

Buttons on the TV

Take a certain model for an example:

1. U/MENU button

Turns the TV on or standby. The TV is on,press it,brings up the main menu or press to return to the previous menu.Before enter menu, long press $\Dot{O}/MENU$ button for 2 seconds to display Source Select. Long press it for 5 seconds to go to Standby.

2. VOL. +/- button

Increases/decreases the volume. In the menu system, they act like the right/left direction buttons on the remote and adjust menu controls. (Note: In some menus, VOL.+ also acts like the OK button on the remote.)

CH. +/- buttor

Scans up/down through the channel list. In the menu system, they act like the up/down direction buttons on the remote and adjust menu controls.

Note: Under USB condition, CH.+ button acts like INPUT button in remote to select different sources and CH.+/- button can't work act like up/down direction buttons . Press CH.- button to display or cancel the menu at bottom. O/Menu button can act like the OK button on the remote.

Sockets

Note: The location and names of the sockets on the TV may vary according to TV model, and not all sockets available on all models.

USB socket (input)


This socket can be used to connect an USB device.

HDMI 1 → or HDMI 2 →

HDMI1 and HDMI2 socket (input)

The HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) socket can be used to connect a PC with a compatible video card installed, certain DVD players or a high-definition compatible digital satellite decoder. This socket provides an uncompressed digital connection that carries both video and audio data by way of an integrated mini-plug cable.



AV(VIDEO)/YPbPr component sockets (input)

These AV(VIDEO)/Y sockets can be used to connect a device that has component video sockets, such as a DVD player. The component sockets can recognize if the device you're connecting to is Y Pb Pr compatible. The component sockets provide excellent picture quality because the video is separated into three separate parts.



AV & PC & COMPONENT AUDIO IN

These AUDIO IN L & R sockets can be used to connect a range of equipment, including video recorders, camcorders, satellite receivers, DVD players, or games consoles. AUDIO IN sockets are shared by AV,VGA and YPbPr sockets.

SPDIF → SPDIF/AUDIO sockets (output)

PC IN -

PC socket (input)

This socket can be used to connect a computer.

FIN - RF IN socket (input)

This socket can be used to connect the outside aerial.(including the analog signal and the digital signal)

Remote Control Functions

Most of your television's functions are available via the menus that appear on the screen. The remote control supplied with your set can be used to navigate through the menus and to configure all the general settings.



INPUT – Press the **INPUT** button to open the **Input** list; press the up and down arrows ($\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$) to highlight options, and press **OK** to select the desired option.

Alphanumeric Buttons -In TV source, use these buttons to enter channel numbers. To enter a channel, press the number buttons and press **ΟΚ** (or let the entry timeout).

To enter a digital channel with a sub-channel, enter the main channel; then, press the dot (•), the sub-channel, and then the **OK** button.

MENU - Press the MENU button to display the Main Menu.

Arrows ($\triangle/\nabla/A/\triangleright$) – Use the four arrows to highlight different items in the TV menu and to adjust the menu controls.

ZOOM -/+ (\triangleleft / \triangleright) - Press to select the desired screen format.

SLEEP +/- ($\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$) — Press to set the TV to turn off after a given amount of time.

PIC – Press to select your desired picture mode.

INFO - If no menus are currently active, press the

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{INFO}}$ button to display the $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Channel}}$ $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Banner}}.$

VOL+/- – Increases or decreases the TV volume.

MUTE – Press to turn the volume on and off.

FAV – Press the **FAV** button to browse the channels in your favorite list. Use the up and down arrows (▲/▼) to highlight options, then press **OK** to select.

MEDIA-Press the MEDIA button to enter the USB menu directly $\,$.

POWER (也) – Press the POWER button to turn the TV on and off.

GUIDE – Press the **GUIDE** button to display the program guide. Program guide details are only available on digital channels.

CLEAR – Press the **CLEAR** button to remove any menu or display from the screen and return to normal viewing.

 \mathbf{OK} – Press to display Channel List menu. When the TV is in the Menu system, press the \mathbf{OK} button to confrim your selection.

GO BACK – Pressing the **GO BACK** button returns you to the previously viewed channel.

CH + or CH - - Press the CH+/- buttons to select channels

TV - Press to access to the TV mode.

MTS – Press to select your desired sound mode.

 ◄ ▶ - These buttons can be used for playing music and photos in the USB menu.

Switching on

Follow the instructions on this page on how to switch on your TV set and the remote control before going on to following pages describing how to use the channel set-up procedure


1. Insert two AAA batteries in the remote control.

Precautions on using batteries:

- Only use the battery types specified.Make sure you use the correct polarity.
- Do not mix new and used batteries.
- Do not use rechargeable batteries.
- Do not expose batteries to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like, throw them in a fire, recharge them or try to open them, as this could cause them to leak or explode.
- Remove the batteries from the remote control if you are not using it for a long period of time.
- 2. Connect the power cable **FIRST** to the television, **THEN** to a mains socket. (Note: If the power cable is connected to the television, please only connect the power cable to the mains socket.)


Your TV set should only be connected to an AC supply. It must not be connected to a DC supply. If the plug is detached from the cable, do not, under any circumstances, connect it to a mains socket, as there is a risk of electric shock.

Note: The figures are for representation only. The location of the power socket at the back of the television might differ depending on the model.



3. Connect an outside aerial to the RF IN socket at the back of the TV set.


The aerial socket (75 OHM - VHF / UHF / cable) can be used for connecting an external aerial or other equipment fitted.



If the power indicator lights up, the TV set is in standby mode. Press the $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{O}}$ button on the remote control or on the TV set to turn on the TV.



- To put the TV set into standby mode, press the [⊕] button on the remote control or long press [⊕]/MENU button for 5 seconds on the TV, the TV set remains powered up, but with low energy consumption.
- To switch off the TV set, unplug the mains socket from the mains outlet.



Setup Wizard

Connect an RF cable from the Tv's input called "RF-In" and to your TV Aerial socket.

Select Language

- 1. Press ◀ / ▶ button on the remote control to select the language to be used for menus and message.
- 2. Press ▲ / ▼ button on the remote control to select go to next step and press OK/ ▶ button to go.



Time

- 1. Press ◀/ ▶ button on the remote control to adjust
- 2. Press ▲ / ▼ button on the remote control to select the time zone, daylight saving time and time format
- 3. Press ▲ / ▼ button on the remote control to select go to next step and press OK/ ▶ button to go.



TV Location

- 1. Press **◄/▶** button on the remote control to select Home Mode or Retail mode.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ button on the remote control to select go to next step and press OK button to go.

Note: Choosing "Home Mode" for the TV assigns the optimal picture settings for most home environments. Choosing "Retail mode", which is not ECO Save compliant, sets the unit up with predefined settings for retail displays. In this setting, the power consumption may exceed the requirements of the ECO Save. When operate forced menu, please don't press "Clear" button.

√> button on the remote control to select Yes/No.

If you select Yes, a screen menu will proceed to select the
