
Microphones:

Connect a microphone into Mic 1 jack 1 as well as Mic 2 jack 2 (when desired).

NOTE:

Do not drop or tap the Mic as damage to the Mic or speakers may occur. Do not twirl the microphone by the cord as it will cause damage to the encased wiring.

Connecting the Unit to a TV



To output the video, lyrics and audio to your TV, perform the following steps:


Plug the HDMI cable (not included) into the HDMI Jack on the back of the unit. Plug the other end of the HDMI cable into the HDMI input on your TV.

NOTES:

- This unit can be used with or without a TV, but it is highly recommended to use a TV in order
 to utilize all the features.

Connecting to AC Power




Insert the small end of the AC adapter into the DC IN jack on the rear of the unit. Insert the other end into a conveniently located AC outlet having 100-240V AC, 50/60Hz.

NOTE:

Make all connections before connecting to AC power.

Connecting Headphones



For private listening or to monitor singing, use headphones (not included). Insert headphones into the Headphones jack 1. The headphones have a dedicated Volume control so rotate the HEADPHONE VOLUME control 2 as desired.

The Headphones jack can also be used as an audio out to connect to another audio system using a 3.5mm Auxiliary Audio cable (not included).

Changing the Interactive Microphone's Battery



When performance suffers, change the batteries as follows:

- 1 Unscrew the Battery Compartment screw and remove the door.
- $2 \quad \begin{array}{ll} \text{Replace battery with CR2032} \\ \text{button cell battery.} \end{array}$
- Replace Battery Compartment and screw.



Rechargeable Battery

This unit comes with a built-in rechargeable battery pack that will allow the unit to be used without being connected to AC power. The Battery indicator (top of the unit) will show the battery charge remaining, indicated by the amount of bars. The rechargeable battery pack is not user-replaceable.

We recommend to charge the unit once a month so as to keep the battery in the best condition. When the battery icon turns red and flashing, recharge the unit by following below:



- Insert the AC power cord into a conveniently located AC outlet having 100-240V AC, 50/60Hz.
- Allow the unit to charge for approximately twelve hours for a full charge.
- Disconnect the AC cord and the fully charged unit is now ready for use. Battery life can last up to 25 hours depending on playback operations.

Attention: The sound volume will adjust automatically when the battery is not full.

Note: If you experience battery issues, contact customer service.



Microphone Remote Operation


The Microphone is also a remote control that can be used to control the unit. See below for instructions on using the Microphone Remote.




It is very important to point the remote's sensor at the unit's remote sensor (see illustration).

This Microphone Remote's buttons will operate the same way as the main unit's **ENTER, Navigation** and **MENU** buttons. When a step says to press one of these buttons, you can use either the unit or the Microphone Remote.

To turn the Microphone On, slide the **ON/OFF** switch 1 to the ON position.



Light Mode




There are three Light modes. Repeatedly press the LIGHT MODES button to select a mode as follows:

Light Mode 1: The unit will synchronize to the music being played.

Light Mode 2: The unit will light up with random colors and patterns.

Light Mode 3: The light effects will be turned off.

1 The Function indicator (around the USB port) will change colors depending on the mode selected as follows:

Blue: Bluetooth





Connect to WiFi



Connect the unit as described previously and ensure to connect it to a TV. Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to power on the unit. The power indicator will light up.

2 USE YOUR MOBILE DEVICE TO CONNECT THIS UNIT

Use the Navigation ►/►► Right or ◀◀/◀ Left and ENTER/ ►■ button to select the SINGCAST icon on your TV screen. "CAS" will display on the screen. If this unit has not been connected to your WiFi network, a step 1 QR code will pop up on screen. Use your mobile device to scan the QR code allowing it a moment to load. Once your mobile device connects to the unit successfully, the step 2 QR code will pop up on screen.

3 CONNECT THIS UNIT TO YOUR WIFI NETWORK

Use your mobile device to scan the step 2 QR code and allow it to load. The WiFI list will pop up on your mobile device. Search for and select your home WiFi and input your WiFi password to complete the login process.

If the unit does NOT connect to your home WiFi successfully, check your password and WiFi frequency and repeat above steps.

NOTES:


- Make sure the WiFi network of the mobile device and unit are using the same network.
- WPA3 security settings can cause connection issues. If you have WPA3 security, we recommend lowering to WPA2 or lower. Or contact us for further help.
- If the unit is connected to WiFi, the WiFi indicator will be light solid, otherwise the indicator will flash.


Connect to WiFi (Continued)



When the unit connects to your WiFi successfully, "Success! You are now connected to cast!" will display on-screen. You can download the Singing Machine Karaoke App to listen to your favorite karaoke music and project the HD karaoke video on your TV.



The unit automatically searches and pairs to a previously paired WiFi network. If you want to connect to another WiFi network, you can go to the main menu and select SETTINGS>WiFi setting>DISCONNECT to disconnect from the WiFi network in order to connect to another WiFi network.









- Download the Singing Machine Karaoke App to choose from thousands of HD karaoke videos, project your favorite karaoke videos from your mobile device to your TV (make sure your mobile device and the unit are connected to the same WiFi network).



Pitch Tune

The Pitch Tune feature is shown in a dedicated area at the front (top right) of the unit. This will allow you to Pitch Tune your voice like the professionals.




With the unit on, press the **PITCH TUNE** control button once to activate; the first PITCH TUNE Level indicator will light. This is the Natural PITCH TUNE setting and what is commonly used in the music industry to level out and fix a singer's voice behind the scenes. It's subtle and is meant to provide a natural fix to a singer's voice.

Press the **PITCH TUNE** control button again; the second PITCH TUNE Level indicator will light. This is a medium level, a bit stronger than natural but not full intensity of PITCH TUNE.

Press the **PITCH TUNE** control button again; the third PITCH TUNE Level indicator will light. This is the extreme level which is the iconic sound that has made PITCH TUNE famous in pop and hip-hop.

NOTE: Plug mic into mic 1 jack. PITCH TUNE feature is only available through mic 1 jack.



- A loading "Loading U Disk, Please...." will appear on the TV when the system is loading the songs.
- Unit must be connected to a TV to access the USB song list. Songs will not display on this unit's mini display.
- Unit can only read files in the "karaoke" folder.

Using the AUX IN Jack

- 2 Connect the external unit to the AUX INPUT Jack using a 3.5mm auxiliary audio cable (not included). Connecting an external unit will allow the audio to be played through your Singing Machine.


NOTES:

- It is highly recommended to set the volume on the auxiliary unit to 1/3 or lower to avoid distortion.



Adjust the MIC VOLUME 1 or 2 control as desired. Increasing this will increase the volume of the respective microphone.

PITCH TUNE: See pages E13 to E16 for more details.



To record your singing as well as the music, press the **REC** button; recording will begin and the Record indicator will light.

When done recording, press the **REC** button again; the Record indicator will turn off.


Notes:

- The recorded audio file will record onto the USB drive.
- The recorded audio file will be named with the "LINE_RECORD_X.mp3" prefix.



Press the **STANDBY/ON** button to turn the unit off.

Using the EXTERNAL INPUT Jack



- Connect the unit as described previously. Press the **STANDBY/ON** button to turn the unit on.
- 2 Connect the external unit to the EXTERNAL INPUT jack using a 6.3mm cable (not included). Connecting an external unit will allow the audio to be played through your Singing Machine. Adjust the external input's volume using the EXT INPUT VOLUME control.

Notes:

- It is highly recommended to set the volume on the auxiliary unit to 1/3 and the EXT INPUT VOLUME control on this unit to 1/3 as well to avoid distortion.
- Skipping files/tracks is not possible in this unit when using an external device.
