
Location of Controls (Rear)

Connecting the Microphone(s)




Microphones:

Connect a microphone into Mic jack 1 **1** as well as Mic jack 2 **2** (when desired).

Note: Do not drop or tap the Mic as damage to the Mic or speakers may occur. Do not twirl the microphone cord as it will cause damage to the encased wiring.

Connecting the Unit to a TV



To output the video, lyrics and audio to your TV, perform the following steps:

Connect the RCA video cable (Yellow) to the VIDEO OUT jack and the audio cables (White and Red) to the AUDIO OUT jacks located on the back of the Singing Machine.


Connect the opposite end of the RCA video cable (Yellow) to the VIDEO IN jack and the audio cables (White and Red) to the AUDIO IN on your TV.

Notes:

- This unit can be used with or without a TV.
- Also refer to the TV's User Guide.
- To see the lyrics on the screen, you must use a CD+G disc or MP3+G files.
- Audio/Video cables are included.


Connecting to AC Power



Insert the small end of the AC adapter into the DC IN jack on the rear of the unit. Insert the other end (with the 2 blades) into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V AC, 60Hz.

Note: Make all connections before connecting to AC power.


Connecting to Line In Jack



Connect an external device by using an appropriate cable (3.5mm audio cable not included) as shown.

Note: See page E18 to select and use the Line In function.

Light Mode



1 For lighting effects, slide the **LIGHTS** switch from the OFF position to your desired mode.


MODE 1: The unit will synchronize to the music being played or the live singing performance.

MODE 2: Lights will glow but will not pulse with microphone.

OFF: To turn off lights.

Operation

Playing a CD



1 Connect the unit as described previously. Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit on.

2 Lift open the CD door and insert a CD (with standard or MP3+G files) or a CD+G by gently pressing it on the center spindle. Then close the CD door.

Notes:


- **What is a CD+G?**

A CD+G (CD+Graphics) is the standard format for most karaoke discs that will display the words on the screen.

- **What is an MP3+G?**

MP3+G is the newest format for karaoke music utilizing the MP3's small file size. It will display the words on the screen.

- Never place anything other than a CD in the compartment, as foreign objects can damage the unit.
- If no disc is inserted, "NO DISC" will appear on the screen.
- If connected to a TV or other audio source, adjust the volume of the TV using its own volume control.




3 Repeatedly press the **FUNCTION** button to select the CDG/CD mode; "READ" will appear when searching the disc and then the total number of tracks will appear.


4 Press the **PLAY/PAUSE ►|| /ENTER** button to start playback. If listening to a CD+G file, press the **MONITOR ON/OFF** button to view the image and lyrics on the screen.


Playing a CD (Continued)



- 5 Adjust the music to a comfortable level using the **MUSIC VOLUME** control.



- 6 Connect microphone(s) and slide the **ON/OFF** switch on the microphone to the ON position.




- 7 Adjust the **MIC VOLUME** control as desired. Increasing this control will increase the volume of both microphones.

- 8 Rotate the **ECHO** control to add an echo effect to your voice. Rotate towards **MAX** to increase the echo effect.

- 9 Adjust the Key using the **KEY +/▶** and **KEY -/◀** buttons to obtain the best key for the singer.



Playing a CD (Continued)



- 10** **AUTO VOICE CONTROL** can be activated by pressing the **AUTO VOICE CONTROL ON/OFF** button. The vocals on a multiplex recording will be muted as soon as the singer begins singing into the microphone. When the singer stops singing, the recorded vocals on the multiplex recording will resume to normal.

Note: This is only for files recorded with this multiplex feature.




- 11** Rotate the **BALANCE** control clockwise to hear the recorded vocals with some music in the background or counter-clockwise to hear the music only from a multiplex recording.

Note: To use the **BALANCE** control, a CD+G disc must be used, otherwise it will operate as a standard Balance control.

- 12** **SKIP:** Advance or go back one track by pressing the **SKIP** / or **SKIP** / buttons.

SEARCH: When playing any audio CD, press and hold the **SKIP** / or **SKIP** / button. The CD will search at high speed in the forward or backward direction. Normal play will continue when you release the button.


Note: SEARCH function only works with CD not CD+G discs.



- 13** **REPEAT:** To repeat the current track, press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button once during playback, will appear in the display and the current track will be repeated. To repeat all tracks, press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button again, will appear. Press again to cancel the Repeat feature; will appear.


Operation

Playing a CD (Continued)



- 14 PROGRAM:** You can program up to 20 tracks for playback in any desired order. While in Stop mode, press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button; PROG SET 01:XX (xx is the total tracks) will appear in the display. Select the first track using the **SKIP ◀/▲** or **SKIP ▶/▼** buttons, then press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button. Repeat to set up to 20 tracks into memory. When done, press the **PLAY/PAUSE ▶||/ENTER** button to start playback.


Note: Press the **STOP ■** button TWICE to stop and clear the program.




- 15 RECORDING YOUR SINGING:** Insert a USB drive first, then press the **RECORD** button; the song will start over and recording will begin. REC with track progress in percentage will appear at the top left of the screen. When done recording, press the **RECORD** button again to stop recording.
- 16 PAUSE:** During playback, if you wish to pause the disc momentarily, press the **PLAY/PAUSE ▶||/ENTER** button. Press again to resume normal playback.
- 17** Press the **STOP ■** button to stop playback.
- 18** Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit off.

Playing Songs from the USB



1 Connect the unit as described previously. Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit on.




2 Insert a USB flash drive into the USB port on the unit so it faces upward. Make sure to download music from the Karaoke store.

3 Repeatedly press the **FUNCTION** button to select the USB mode; “READ USB” will appear when searching the drive and then the total number of files will appear.

4 Press the **PLAY/PAUSE ►|| / ENTER** button to start playback; if listening to an MP3+G file, press the **MONITOR ON/OFF** button to view the image and lyrics on the screen.

Note: On the screen, folders that contain recordings and songs appear to the left and the list of tracks from a selected folder will appear to the right.




5 Adjust the music to a comfortable level using the **MUSIC VOLUME** control.


Note: If connected to a TV or other audio source, adjust the volume of the TV using its own volume control.

- 6** Connect microphone(s) and slide the **ON/OFF** switch on the microphone to the ON position.




- 7** Adjust the **MIC VOLUME** control as desired. Increasing this control will increase the volume of both microphones.

- 8** Rotate the **ECHO** control to add an echo effect to your voice. Rotate towards **MAX** to increase the echo effect.

- 9** Adjust the Key for the song using the **KEY +/▶** and **KEY -/◀** buttons to obtain the best key for the singer.

- 10** **AUTO VOICE CONTROL** can be activated by pressing the **AUTO VOICE CONTROL ON/OFF** button. The vocals on a multiplex recording will be muted as soon as the singer begins singing into the microphone. When the singer stops singing, the vocals are automatically unmuted.



- 11** Rotate the **BALANCE** control clockwise to hear the music and recorded vocals from a multiplex recording or counterclockwise to hear the music only from a multiplex recording.



Playing Songs from the USB (Continued)



12 SKIP: Advance or go back one file by pressing the **SKIP** /▲ or **SKIP** /▼ buttons.


SEARCH: When playing any audio from the USB, press and hold the **SKIP** /▲ or **SKIP** /▼ buttons. The USB will search at high speed in the forward or backward direction. Normal play will continue when you release the button. During Stop mode you can also select a file using the **SKIP** /▲ or **SKIP** /▼ buttons to scroll up/down and/or the **KEY** +/▶ and **KEY** -/◀ buttons to scroll right/left. Recorded music will be in the folder labeled, REC.



13 REPEAT: To repeat the current track, press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button once during playback, will appear in the display and the current track will be repeated. Press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button twice, will appear and all MP3 tracks inside the current folder will be repeated continuously. To repeat all tracks, press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button again, will appear. Press again to cancel the Repeat feature; will appear.






- 14 PROGRAM:** You can program up to 20 tracks for playback in any desired order. While in Stop mode, press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button; PROG SET 01:XX (xx is the total tracks) will appear in the display. Select the first track using the **SKIP** ◀/▶ or **SKIP** ▶▶/◀◀ buttons, then press the **PROGRAM/REPEAT** button. Repeat to set up to 20 tracks into memory. When done, press the **PLAY/PAUSE** ▶▶/◀◀/ENTER button to start playback.

Note: Press the **STOP** ■ button TWICE to stop and clear the program.



- 15 PAUSE:** During playback, if you wish to pause the music momentarily, press the **PLAY/PAUSE** ▶▶/◀◀/ENTER button. Press again to resume normal playback.



- 16** Press the **STOP** ■ button to stop playback.

- 17** Press the **ON/STANDBY** button to turn the unit off.

Note: You cannot record from the USB.
