EQUIPMENT APPROVAL INFORMATION

Your telephone equipment is approved for connecting to the Public Switched Telephone Network and is in compliance with parts 15 and 68, FCC Rules and Regulations, and the Technical Requirements for Telephone Terminal Equipment published by ACTA.

1. Notification to the Local Telephone Company

On the bottom of this equipment is a label indicating, among other information, the US Number and Ringer Equivalence Number (REN) for the equipment. You must, upon request, provide this information to your telephone company.

The REN is useful in determining the number of devices you may connect to your telephone line and still have all these devices ring when your telephone number is called. In most (but not all) areas, the sum of the RENs of all devices connected to one line should not exceed 5. To be certain of the number of devices you may connect to your line determined by the REN, you should contact your local telephone company.

Notes

This equipment may not be used on coin service provided by the telephone company.

Introduction

This 2.4 GHz two-line multiple handset telephone has been designed to be simple to use, however, you can reach its full potential more quickly by taking a few minutes to read this User's Guide. This telephone is a multifunction product for use with the Call Waiting and Caller ID services available from your local telephone company.

- Know who called while you were away.

WARNING: For compliance with the RF exposure requirements regulated by the FCC (Federal Communications Commission), the transmitter's antennas are contained within the base enclosure, and an additional separation distance of more than eight inches (20cm) shall be maintained between the transmitter base enclosure and any part of the user's body.

NOTE: This warning does not apply to the handset or optional headset.


IMPORTANT: In order to use all of the features of this telephone, you must subscribe to two separate services available from your local telephone company: the standard Name/Number Caller ID Service to know who is calling when the phone rings and Caller ID with Call Waiting Service to know who is calling while you are on the phone.

IMPORTANT: Because cordless phones operate on electricity, you should install five "AA" batteries in the base unit for the corded phone, in case you experience a power outage.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

PARTS CHECKLIST

Make sure your package includes the items shown here.



MODULAR JACK REQUIREMENTS

To properly connect your phone to your telephone lines, you should identify the type of wall jack(s) you have. You will need an RJ11C (for a single line) or a RJ14C (for two lines) type modular phone jack, which might look like the one pictured here. If you don't have either modular jack, call your local phone company to find out how to get one installed.



DIGITAL SECURITY SYSTEM

Your cordless phone uses a digital security system to provide protection against false ringing, unauthorized access, and charges to your phone. When you place the handset in the base, the unit verifies its security code. After a power outage or battery replacement, you should place the handset in the base for about 20 seconds to reset the code. This phone's digital security code was set at the factory.

INSTALLATION AND SET UP



CAUTION: Always disconnect the phone cords from the wall outlets before battery installation or replacement.


INSTALLATION NOTE: Some cordless telephones operate at frequencies that may cause interference to nearby TVs, microwave ovens, and VCRs. To minimize or prevent such interference, the base of the cordless telephone should not be placed near or on top of a TV, microwave oven, or VCR. If interference continues, moving the cordless telephone farther away from these appliances will often reduce or eliminate the interference.

Certain other communications devices may also use the 2.4 GHz frequency for communication, and, if not properly set, these devices may interfere with each other and/or your new telephone. If you are concerned with interference, please refer to the owner's manual for these devices on how to properly set channels to avoid interference. Typical devices that may use the 2.4 GHz frequency for communication include wireless audio/video senders, wireless computer networks, multi-handset cordless telephone systems, and some long-range cordless telephone systems.

IMPORTANT INSTALLATION INFORMATION

- Never install telephone wiring during a lightning storm.
- Never touch non-insulated telephone wires or terminals, unless the telephone line has been disconnected.
- Use caution when installing or modifying telephone lines.
- Never install telephone jacks in wet locations unless the jack is specifically designed for wet locations.
- Temporarily disconnect any equipment connected to the phone such as faxes, other phones, or modems.

INSTALLING AND REPLACING THE BASE BACKUP BATTERY



If batteries are not installed or battery power is low, the low battery icon blinks in the display. You need to install or replace the batteries.

1. Carefully turn over the phone. On the bottom is the battery compartment door. Remove the screw on the door with a screwdriver and open the door.

NOTE: If you are replacing the batteries, remove the power supply and telephone line cords.

2. Install five new or replace the old "AA" size batteries in the battery compartment.

NOTE: Do not use rechargeable batteries.

- 3. Close the battery compartment door, and replace the screw. Carefully turn the phone over again.
- 4. Connect the power supply then check the display to see if the low battery icon is off. If the display still shows the low battery icon, be sure the batteries are properly installed and, if necessary, return to step one and repeat the process.

IMPORTANT: If you are not going to use the telephone for more than 30 days, remove the batteries because they may leak and damage the unit.

NOTE: It is important to use a battery backup because if you experience a power outage, you will still be able to use the phone.

Installing and Replacing the Cordless Handset Battery


CAUTION: To reduce the risk of fire or personal injury, use only the battery listed in the Instruction book.

You must install the battery pack prior to first use or you will not be able to use the cordless handset. If a battery pack is not installed or battery power is low, the low battery icon blinks in the display and you need to install or replace the battery pack. Make sure that the cordless handset is in the standby mode before you install or replace the battery.


- 1. Remove the battery compartment door from the cordless handset.
- 2. If you are installing the battery pack for the first time, insert the battery pack into the battery compartment on the back of the cordless handset then plug the battery pack cord into the jack inside the handset battery compartment.
- 3. If you are replacing the battery pack, disconnect the battery pack cord from the jack inside the battery compartment and remove the battery pack from the cordless handset. Insert a new battery pack and reconnect the battery pack cord to the jack inside the handset battery compartment.
- 4. Put the battery compartment door back on.

BATTERY SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Do not burn, disassemble, mutilate, or puncture. Like other batteries of this type, toxic materials could be released which can cause injury.
- Keep batteries out of the reach of children.
- Remove batteries if storing over 30 days.



CHARGING THE CORDLESS HANDSET



1. Plug one end of the power supply into the jack on the back of the charge cradle and the other end into and electrical outlet.

NOTE: The power supply must remain connected to the charge cradle at all times. It is normal for the power supply to feel warm.

2. Place the cordless handset (with the battery pack installed) on the charge cradle and allow the cordless handset to charge for 12 hours. The charge indicator is on while the handset battery is charging.

IMPORTANT: Make sure the cordless handset is facing forward during charging.

Allow the cordless handset to charge for 12 hours. If you don't properly charge the cordless handset, battery performance will be compromised.



CAUTION: Use only the ATLINKS USA, Inc. 5-2550 power supply that came with this unit to charge the cordless handset. Using other power supplies may damage the unit.

Installing the Phone

Your two-line phone should be placed on a level surface such as a desk or tabletop, or you can mount it on a wall. A desktop/wall mounting pedestal is packaged with your phone.

ATTACHING THE DESKTOP PEDESTAL

- 1. Turn the phone over so that the botttom of the base is facing up and the thickest end is pointing away from you.
- 2. Place the deskop pedestal over the bottom of the base so that the flat side is facing upwards and align the four slots on the bottom of the base with the four tabs on the mounting bracket.
- 3. Insert the tabs into the slots and push the pedestal forward until the pedestal snaps securely into place.

ATTACHING THE WALL MOUNTING PEDESTAL

- Turn the base over and align the four slots on the bottom of the base with the four hooktabs on the mounting bracket.
- 2. Insert the hook-tabs into the slots and push upwards until the mounting bracket snaps securely into place.


CONNECTING THE AC (ELECTRICAL) POWER

Plug the power supply cord into the power jack on the back of the base. Then plug the other end into an electrical outlet.

CONNECTING LINES 1+2 TO ONE DUAL-LINE PHONE JACK




- 1. For LINES 1 and 2, connect one end of either straight telephone line cord to the jack marked LINE 1+2 on the back of the base.
- 2. Connect the other end of the straight white telephone line cord to a dual-line wall jack.

NOTE: Although you can use two-line cordless telephones with a single phone line, you must have two lines (separate phone numbers) to use a two-line system. If you connect the telephone line cord to a single-line (RJ11C) wall phone jack, you will only be able to use one telephone line (either LINE 1 or LINE 2) but not both lines simultaneously.

3. Connect one end of the coiled handset cord to the jack on the side of the base and connect the other end to the jack at the bottom of the corded handset, then place the handset in the cradle.

NOTE: To mount the phone on the wall, slip the mounting circles on the pedestal over the wall plate posts and firmly slide the unit down into place.

Connecting Lines 1+2 to Two Single-Line Wall Jacks



- 1. To connect LINE 1, plug one end of a straight telephone line to the jack marked LINE 1+2 on the back of the base.
- 2. To connect LINE 2, plug one end of the other straight white telephone line to the jack marked LINE 2 on the back of the base.
- 3. Connect the other end of each straight white telephone line cord to the two single line wall phone jacks.
- 4. Connect one end of the coiled handset cord to the jack on the side of the base and connect the other end to the jack at the bottom of the handset, then place the handset in the cradle.

NOTE: If you connect a telephone line cord from the LINE 2 jack on the back of the base to a dual modular phone jack, you will only be able to use line two.

NOTE: To mount the phone on the wall, slip the mounting circles on the pedestal over the wall plate posts and firmly slide the unit down into place.

DATA PORT

This phone is equipped with a DATA port for you to connect an auxiliary phone device, such as fax machine, computer modem, or even another phone. The DATA SELECT switch on the back of the base controls the DATA port and allows you to choose the line to be used, line 1 or line 2. For example, you may use the DATA port to connect a fax machine, and then set the DATA SELECT switch to L2 to receive faxes from line two. In the event that you are talking to someone on line two and want the caller to fax something to you, change the DATA SELECT switch to L1 and give the caller the phone number for line one. Your fax machine will receive transmissions on line one.

IMPORTANT: Be sure to switch the fax machine back to the normal line when you are done because outside callers who do not know that you have multiple lines will not be able to reach your fax machine if they dial the normal fax line.

REGISTERING OPTIONAL CORDLESS HANDSETS

All cordless handsets used with this unit must be registered at the base. You may register up to eight cordless handsets. The model number of the optional cordless handsets is H1290XXX-X. To order additional cordless handsets, contact your dealer or call 1-800-448-0329 to locate a dealer.

The cordless handset packed with this unit is preregistered by the manufacturer and is assigned as handset number one. The handset number is also used as the extension number. Only one handset may be registered at a time, and the base and cordless handsets must be in standby mode during the registration process. You must complete the handset registration process within one minute.






DISPLAYS BASE

- 3. The time and date displays on the 2 nd line when the base is in standby mode. The display shows the number dialed, call status, programming options and directory items. If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, caller information is also displayed.
- 4. The low battery icon indicates is the battery is low.
- 5. When the ringer level is turned "OFF," the bell icon displays with a slanted line through it and the corresponding line number shows in the display.

CORDLESS HANDSET



- The voice mail icon turns on if there is at least one new message in your mailbox. During message playback, the voice mail icon also displays.
- 2. The line status icons function as follows:

Off (invisible)

The line is free.

On

The line is being used.

Flashing slowly

A call is being received

- 3. The low battery icon turns on when the cordless handset battery pack is low.
- 4. The handset number is displayed in the standby mode. The display shows the dialed telephone number, call status, programming options, and directory items. If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, caller information also displays.
- 5. When the ringer level is turned "OFF," the bell icon displays with a slanted line through it and the corresponding line number shows in the display.


SETTING UP THE TELEPHONE

This unit has various programmable functions. Most of the settings are selected from the menu on the display.

SELECTING A FUNCTION FROM THE MENU

- 1. Press the MENU soft key while in standby mode. The main menu displays.
- 2. Use the up and down arrow buttons to scroll through the menu until you find the desired item.

UNIT CAPABILITIES

This unit may use two external telephone lines (provided by a telephone company), or two internal lines for intercom calls. You can expand the unit's capabilities by registering up to eight cordless handsets at the base.

How Many External Calls and Intercom Calls Can Be Conducted Simultaneously and By How Many Users?

The system allows two external calls while simultaneously conducting one intercom call with the base and one handset or two handsets. For example, one pair of handsets is engaged in separate intercom calls while the base or one handset is engaged in an external call and one handset is engaged on external call.



Example: External call on line 1, external call, intercom call on line 2

The system also allows two intercom calls while simultaneously conducting one external call with base unit or one handset and four handsets. For example, two pair of handsets is engaged in separate intercom calls while the base unit or one handset is engaged in an external call



Example: External call on line 1, intercom call, intercom call

In the previous two examples:

- All other handsets are in the standby mode.
- · You may also check the mailboxes for messages instead of receiving external calls.

TELEPHONE BASICS

RECEIVING A CALL

The base can handle two calls simultaneously with one cordless handset (or two cordless handsets). When you receive a call, the unit rings. *RINGING* shows on the display. The line indicator on the base flashes rapidly. The line status icon flashes slowly in the handset display. The line is automatically selected when you answer the call. If you subscribe to Caller ID service from your local telephone company, the calling party's identifying information displays after the first ring. To view all Caller ID information, you must wait until the second ring before answering a call.

SPEAKERPHONE

- 1. Press the SPEAKER or LINE button. The line and speakerphone indicators turn on.
- 2. Talk into the MIC (microphone).
- 3. When finished, press the SPEAKER or LINE button.

CORDED HANDSET

- 1. Lift the corded handset off the cradle. The line indicator turns on.
- 2. Talk into the handset MIC (microphone).
- 3. When finished, place the corded handset in the cradle on the base.

HEADSET

- 1. Insert the headset plug into to the jack on the base.
- 2. Press the HEADSET button. The line and headset indicators turn on.
- 3. Talk into headset MIC (microphone).
- 4. When finished, press the HEADSET button again.

CORDLESS HANDSET

- 1. Press the LINE button. The line indicator on the base and the line status icon in the handset display turns on.
- 2. Talk into handset MIC (microphone).
- 3. When finished, press the TALK button on the handset or place the handset on the charge cradle.

Making a Call

Two calls may be handled simultaneously on the base and with one cordless handset (or two).




Use the mute button during a phone conversation to speak privately with another person in the room. The person on the telephone will not hear your private conversation.

1. To mute the microphone, press the MUTE soft key while in TALK mode. The MUTE soft key flashes in the display and the microphone is deactivated.

2. To reactivate the microphone, press the MUTE soft key again.

Using Another Line During a Conversation Base

 If you are using LINE 1 and you receive a second call on another line, or want to make another call, press the HOLD soft key or the HOLD button to put the first call on LINE 1 on hold. The line indicator for the second call flashes in the base display, and the line status icon on the handset display flashes slowly. 

Press the EXIT soft key to exit the redial list, and then press the HEADSET button.

NOTE: The headset must be properly inserted into the jack on the base otherwise the headset button cannot be pressed.

CORDLESS HANDSET

- 1. Press the REDIAL button. The last number dialed shows in the display.
- 2. Continue pressing the REDIAL button until the telephone number you want to redial shows in the display.

NOTE: Use the up or down arrow button to scroll between telephone numbers.

3. Press the EXIT soft key to exit the redial list, and then press the LINE button.

INTERCOM BASICS

A two-way intercom is possible between the base and a cordless handset or between two cordless handsets. The number assigned to a handset at registration is the extension number. The base extension number is 0.

MAKING INTERCOM CALLS

1. To page all cordless handsets from the base, lift the corded handset from the cradle on the base, and press the INT/TRSF button followed by the nine key.

NOTE: If you page all handsets, you may only speak with the first person to answer the page.



2. To page an individual handset from the base, lift the handset and press the INT/TRSF button followed by a number key (1 to 8) that represents the individual handset (for example: press the number one key to page handset number one).

NOTE: The paged handset rings for two minutes. If the page is not answered, paging is terminated.

3. To page the base with a cordless handset, press INT/TRSF button followed by the "0" number key.

4. To page another cordless handset, press the INT/TRSF button followed by a number key (1 to 8) that represents an individual handset (for example: press the number two key to page handset number two).

5. When the page is answered, speak into the MIC (microphone). The handset in use icon and the length of the call shows in the display.

NOTE: If you are using the Headset, press the HEADSET button and speak into the MIC (microphone). The headset must be properly inserted into the jack on the base otherwise the headset button cannot be pressed.

6. To stop paging, press the INT/TRSF button, the EXIT soft key, or place the corded handset in the cradle on the base or place the cordless handset in the charge cradle.

NOTE: The paged handset rings for two minutes. If the page is not answered, paging is terminated.

Answering Intercom Calls

USING THE SPEAKERPHONE

1. After the intercom rings, press the SPEAKER button or the INT/TRSF button.

2. When finished, press the SPEAKER or INT/TRSF button.

USING THE CORDED HANDSET

- 1. After the intercom rings, lift the handset.
- 2. When finished, place the handset in the cradle on the base.

USING THE HEADSET

1. After the intercom rings, press the HEADSET button.

NOTE: The headset must be properly inserted into the jack on the base otherwise the headset button cannot be pressed.

2. When finished, press HEADSET button.

Using the Cordless Handset

- 1. After the intercom rings, press the INT/TRSF button.
- 2. When finished, press the INT/TRSF button or the EXIT soft key.

CALL TRANSFER BASICS

You may transfer an external call between the base and a cordless handset, or between two cordless handsets.

Transferring from the Base Unit to an Extension

- 1. During an active call, press the INT/TRSF button (to page an extension) followed by a number key (1 to 8) corresponding to an extension. The transferred call is placed on hold and the line indicator and the hold button lights and the hold soft key flashes in the display.
- 2. If necessary, wait for the extension to answer and announce the transfer.

NOTE: If the paged party does not answer, press the LINE button where the transferred call is holding, or button, or pres the HOLD solg key.

3. To complete the transfer, press the TRNSFR soft key.

Using the Base to Answer a Call Transferred from an Extension

1. Press the SPEAKER button, lift the handset, or press the HEADSET button after the intercom rings.

NOTE: The headset must be properly inserted into the jack on the base otherwise the headset button cannot be pressed.

2. After the paging party hangs up, begin speaking to the transferred caller.

TRANSFERRING A CALL WITH A CORDLESS HANDSET

- 1. During an active call, press the INT/TRSF button followed by a number key (1 to 8) corresponding to an extension. The call is placed on hold and the hold soft key flashes.
- 2. To page the base unit, press the "0" number key.
- 3. If required, wait for the paged party to answer and announce the transfer.

NOTE: If the paged party does not answer, press the relevant LINE button, or HOLD button, or HOLD soft key.

4. To complete the transfer, press the LINE button or TRNSFR soft key and place the cordless handset on the charge cradle.

TO ANSWER A TRANSFERRED CALL WITH THE CORDLESS HANDSET

- 1. Press the INT/TRSF button or the relevant LINE button after the intercom rings.
- 2. After the paging party hangs up, begin speaking to the transferred caller.

NOTE: During an intercom call, if an incoming call is received, the line indicator on the base unit flashes quickly and the handset user hears two tones. To answer the page, press the relevant line button.

NOTE: If the paged party does not answer within two minutes after you disconnect, the transferred call returns to you. Press the relevant line button to answer the call. If you do not answer within two minutes, the transferred call terminates.

CONFERENCE CALL BASICS

You can use the Conference Call feature when you have calls on each line and want to have a three-way conversation. At least one party must be on an external line.

CONDUCTING THREE-WAY CONFERENCE CALLS

From the Base

Scenario 1

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button, or HOLD soft key, to put the first call on hold.
- 3. Press the other line and call the second party, or receive a call on the second line, then press the CONFERENCE button.



- 4. After the second call is connected, press the CONF button to make a conference call.
- 5. To disconnect both lines:
- Press the CONF button or DROP soft key and press the L1 + L2 soft key or SPEAKER button during speakerphone mode.
- Press the CONF button or the DROP soft key and press L1 + L2 soft key or replace the handset on the base during corded phone mode.
- Press the CONF button or DROP soft key and press L1 + L2 soft key or HEADS button during headset mode.
- 6. To disconnect one party, press the DROP soft key and press the desired soft key.

Scenario 2

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button, or the HOLD soft key, to put the first call on hold.
- 3. Press INT/TRSF button and then press the extension number.
- 4. When the intercom call is connected, press the CONF button and begin the conference call.
- 5. To disconnect all parties:
- Press the CONF button or the SPEAKER button during speakerphone mode.
- Press the CONF button or replace the handset in the cradle on the base during corded phone mode.
- Press the CONF button or HEADSET button during headset mode.
- 6. To disconnect one party, press the DROP soft key and press the desired soft key.

From the Cordless Handset

Scenario 1

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button, or the HOLD soft key, to put the first call on hold.
- 3. Press the other LINE button to make or answer a second call.
- 4. When the second call is connected, press the CONF button and begin the conference call.



- 5. To disconnect both lines, press CONF button or the DROP soft key, press the L1 + L2 soft key, or replace the cordless handset on the charge cradle.
- 6. To disconnect one party, press DROP soft key and press the desired soft key.


Scenario 2

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button, or the HOLD soft key, to put the first call on hold.
- 3. Press the INT/TRSF button and then dial the extension number.
- 4. When the intercom call is connected, press the CONF button and begin the conference call.
- 5. To disconnect all parties, press the CONF button or replace the cordless handset on the charge cradle.
- 6. To disconnect one party, press the DROP soft key and press the desired soft key.

CONDUCTING A FOUR-WAY CONFERENCE CALL AFTER A THREE-WAY CONFERENCE CALL FROM THE BASE

Scenario 1

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button to put the other calls on hold.
- 3. Press the other LINE button to make or answer a second call.
- 4. When the third call is connected, press the CONF button and begin the conference call.



- 5. To disconnect all parties:
- Press the CONF button or the DROP soft key and press the ALL soft key or the SPEAKER button during speakerphone mode.
- Press the CONF button or the DROP soft key and press the ALL soft key or replace the cordless handset on the cradle on the base during corded phone mode.
- Press the CONF button or the DROP soft key and press the ALL soft key or the HEADSET button during cordless headset mode.


Scenario 2

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button to put the other two parties on hold.
- 3. Press the INT/TRS button and then press the extension number.
- 4. When the intercom call is connected, press the CONF button to make a conference call.
- 5. To disconnect all parties:
- Press the CONF button or the DROP soft key and press the ALL soft key or the SPEAKER button during speakerphone mode.
- Press the CONF button or the DROP soft key and press the ALL soft key or replace the handset on the base during corded phone mode.
- Press the CONF button, or press the DROP soft key, and press the ALL soft key, or press the HEADSET button during headset mode.

FROM CORDLESS HANDSET

Scenario 1

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press HOLD button, or HOLD soft key, to put other two party calls on hold.
- 3. Press the other LINE button to make or answer a second call.
- 4. When the third call is connected, press CONF button to make a conference call.



5. To disconnect all parties, press the CONF button, or press the DROP soft key, and press the ALL soft key, or replace the handset on the charge cradle.

Scenario 2

- 1. Press the line button for the line you want to use, and then call the first party.
- 2. Press the HOLD button or HOLD soft key to put other two party calls on hold.
- 3. Press INT/TRSF button and then press extension number.
- 4. When the intercom call is connected, press CONF button.
- 5. To disconnect all parties:
- Press CONF button, or press the DROP soft key, and press ALL soft key, or replace the handset on the charger cradle.

CALLER ID FEATURES

This telephone receives and displays information transmitted by your local phone company. The information may include the caller's telephone number, date and time, or the caller's name, telephone number, date and time. The unit also stores up to 99 call records in the Caller List. Caller List information is stored in the order from the most recent to the oldest call. When the call list is full and a new call is received, the oldest call is deleted from the list.

VERY IMPORTANT: In order to use all of the features of this telephone, you must subscribe to either the standard Name/Number Caller ID Service or Caller ID with Call Waiting Service. To know who is calling while you are on the phone, you must subscribe to Caller ID with Call Waiting

How Caller ID Information is Displayed When a Call is Received

After the first ring, the display shows the caller's name, telephone number, and the telephone line in use.

Base unit

CID L1 TOTAL 20 SMITH, JOHN 1-327-345-4567

Cordless handset

CID L1 TOTAL 35 SMITH, JOHN 1-327-345-4567

NOTE: If both lines receive calls at the same time, each caller record is displayed alternately.

Caller ID information cannot be displayed in the following cases:

- If the caller dialed from an area non-supportive of Caller ID services, the display shows UNKNOWN CALLER.
- If the caller has requested not to display his/her information, the display shows BLOCKED CALL.
- Caller ID information is not displayed on the base when the Automated Attendant System is responding to a call. Caller ID information displays on the handset or the base after the caller enters the extension number.

NOTE: Check with your local phone company regarding name service availability.

CALLER ID WITH CALL WAITING

Provided you subscribe to Caller ID with Call Waiting service from your local telephone company, and you receive another call on the same line, you may see who is calling when you hear the call waiting tone.

- 1. Press the FLASH soft key to answer the second call. The first call is put on hold.
- 2. To return to the first caller, press the FLASH soft key again.
- 3. You may not receive Call Waiting Caller ID records in the following cases:
- The first call on the same line is placed on hold.
- You are having a conference call.
- The Automated Attendant System or Answering System is responding to the first call on the same line.

REVIEWING THE CALLER LIST

As calls are received and stored, the display is updated to let you know how many calls have been received. The Caller ID display on the base turns on when the base receives a new Caller ID record.

Base unit

Cordless handset

Make sure that the telephone is in the standby mode.

- 1. Press the up or down arrow button to review the Caller ID list.
- 2. To search from the most recent call, press the up arrow button.
- 3. To search from the oldest call, press the down arrow button.
- 4. To exit the list, press the EXIT soft key.

DIALING FROM THE CALLER LIST

WITH THE SPEAKERPHONE

Make sure that the base is in the standby mode.

- 1. Press the up or down arrow button to find the desired Caller ID record.
- 2. Press the FORMAT button.
- 3. Press the SPEAKER or LINE button. The number in the display is automatically dialed.

WITH THE CORDED HANDSET

Make sure that the base is in the standby mode.

- 1. Press the up or down arrow button to find the desired Caller ID record.
- 2. Press the FORMAT button.
- 3. Lift the handset. The telephone number in the display is automatically dialed.

WITH THE HEADSET

Make sure that the base is in the standby mode.

- 1. Press the up or down arrow button to find the desired Caller ID record.
- 2. Press the FORMAT button.
- 3. Press the HEADSET button. The telephone number in the display is automatically dialed.

NOTE: The headset must be properly inserted into the jack on the base otherwise the headset button cannot be pressed.

WITH THE CORDLESS HANDSET

Make sure that the cordless handset is in the standby mode.

- 1. Press the up or down arrow button to find the desired Caller ID record.
- 2. Press the FORMAT button.
- 3. Press the LINE button. The telephone number in the display is automatically dialed.

CHANGING THE NUMBER FORMAT

The FORMAT button lets you change the format of the displayed number. The available formats are as follows:

7-digit 7-digit telephone number.

10-digit 3-digit area code + 7-digit telephone number.

11-digit long distance code "1" + 3-digit area code + 7-digit telephone number.

Make sure that the base is in the standby mode.

- 1. Press the up or down arrow button to find the desired Caller ID record.
- 2. If the number in the display does not dial as shown, press the FORMAT button. Repeat if necessary, until the correct number of digits show in the display.

STORING CALLER LIST INFORMATION IN THE DIRECTORY

The same names and numbers stored in the Caller List may also be stored in the Directory. You may use the base and cordless handsets to store the information.
