BATTERY INSTALLATION

Rechargeable unit requires four "AA" (LR6) batteries and its controller require one 9-volt battery.

Alkaline batteries are recommended

Remove four pre-installed "AA" (LR6) batteries inside rechargeable unit with new four "AA" (LR6) batteries in play mode. The pre-installed batteries is good for TRY ME function

WARNINGS:

- Illustrate (WILL HAVE FINAL SKETCH LATER ON) Install batteries correctly. If batteries are installed backwards, this product will not work

To avoid battery leakage:

Follow the toy and battery manufacturer's installation instructions

Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix standard (carbon-zinc), alkaline, or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries. Do not mix different brands of batteries. Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used

Remove dead or exhausted batteries from product

Make sure cover is properly installed to unit at all times

Do not attempt to recharge non-rechargeable batteries

Charging of rechargeable batteries should be done under adult supervision with batteries removed from product

Supply terminals are not to be short circuited

Do not take car or transmitter apart

Change or modifications to this unit not expressly approved by the party responsible for compliance could void the user's authority to operate the equipment

Care & Use
