Rome Master CD supports the Auto-run, that means you just place your CD into the CD Rom drive it will automatically run setup.exe then you will see the below screen. If it doesn't work, you can also install Rome Master manually. To install Rome Master manually, follow these steps.

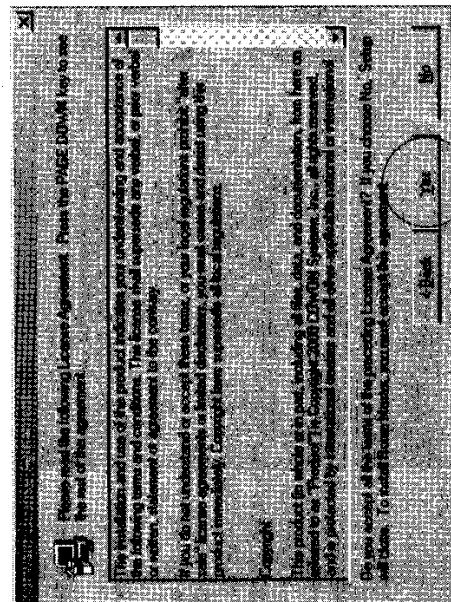
1. Click the "start" button and select run.

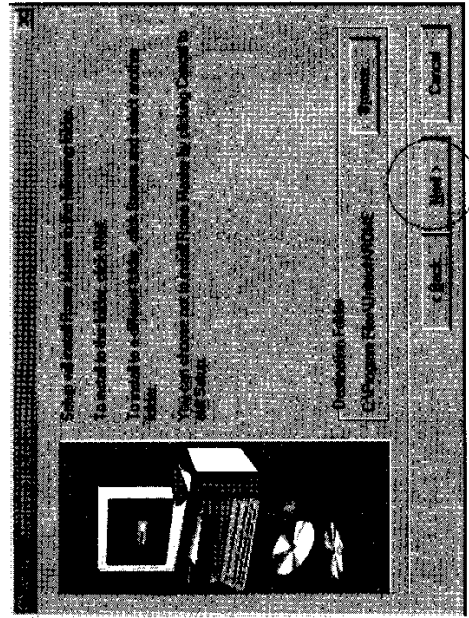
- (1) Click 'Next' if you want to follow the process of the installation



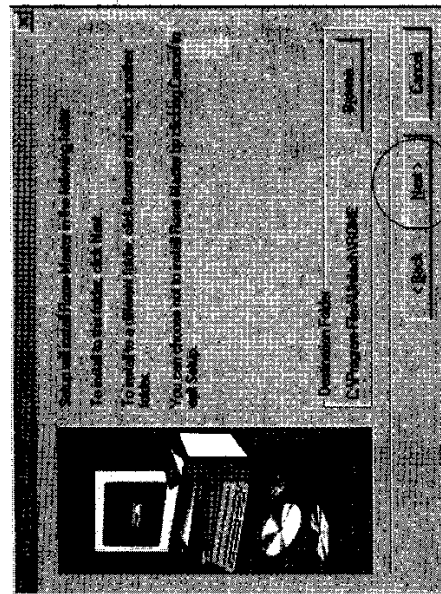

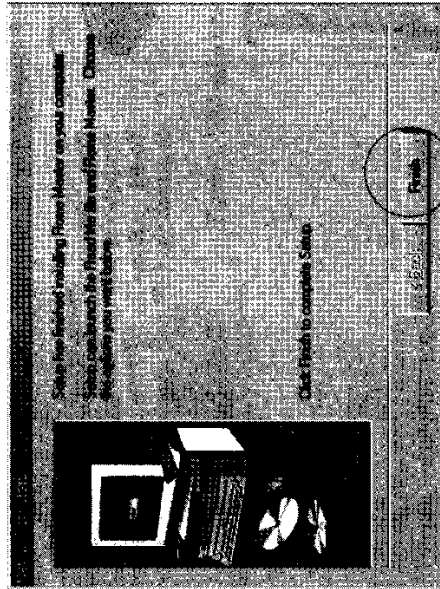

(4) If you intend to take the other folder for installation program, click "Browse", or click "Next"

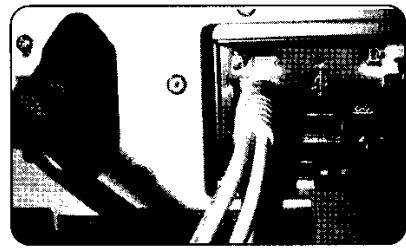

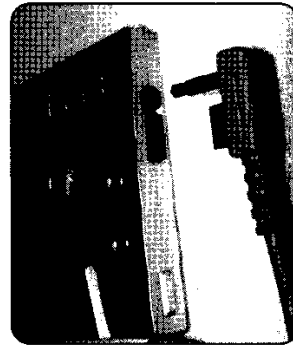
## 2. Hardware installation(USB Drive)

[Figure1, Rome USB port adapter]

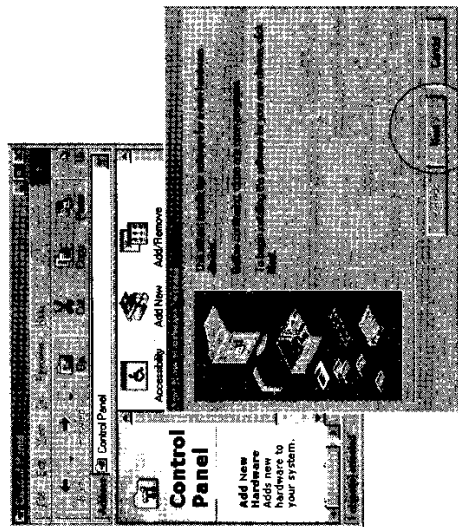


[Figure2, USB data transfer cable]

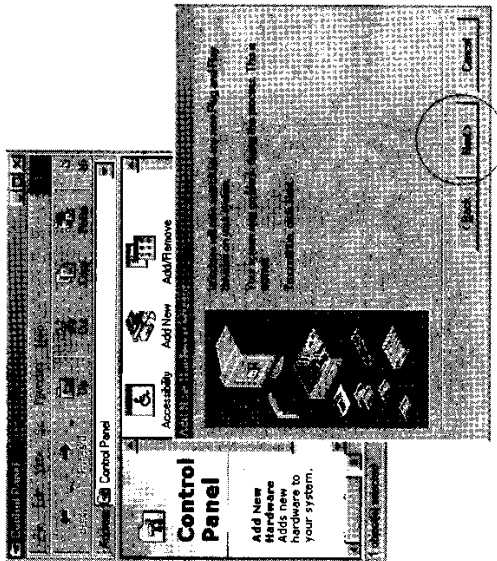
1. Go to "Start" on the background

From the "Add new hardware wizard"

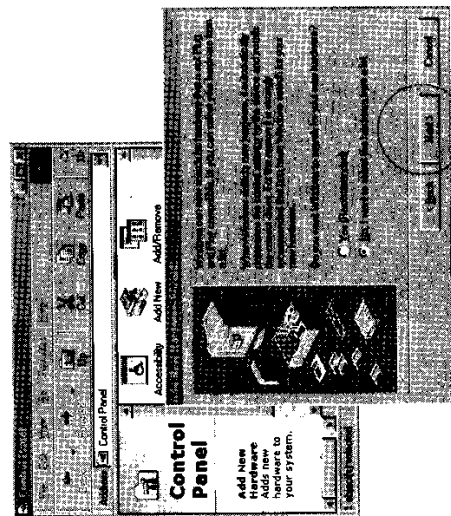

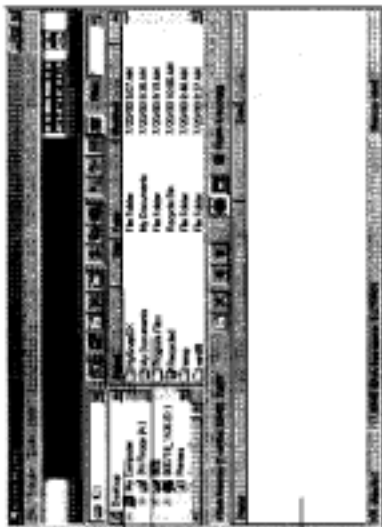

## II. Downloading MP3 files into Rome II

### 1. Explanation of Rome II master Screen

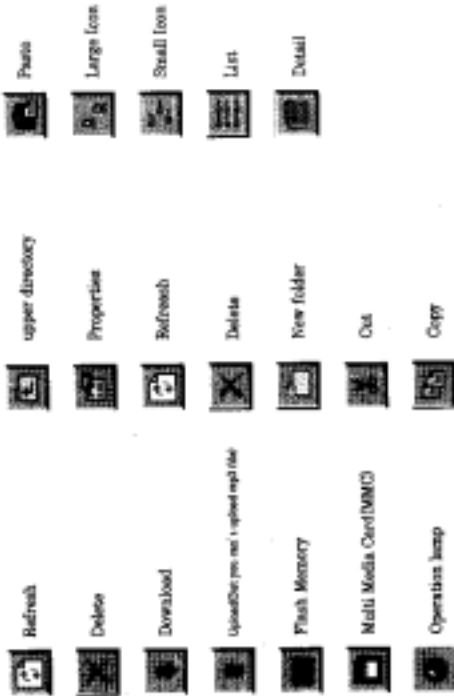


A window explorer. Click the desktop MP3 files

- Warning  
When downloading MP3 files from the PC, you should remove the power adapter from the wall outlet.



To download the files into Rome II, there are two ways of doing that.

#### 1. To download into flash memory

1. Run the Rome II master.
2. Open a folder on your computer that contains MP3 files.
3. To download into flash memory, push the flash memory icon .
4. If there is any MP3 files already loaded into Rome II, it will be displayed in the Rome II memory window.
5. Select the files you want to download.
6. Click the download button, the files you select will start downloading into Rome II.
7. Drag & Drop : Select the files you want using your mouse, and drag the files over to the Rome II.

#### 2. To download into MMC

1. Put MMC into the slot. 
2. To download into MMC, push the MMC icon.  
The rest steps are the same as the above "download into flash memory"

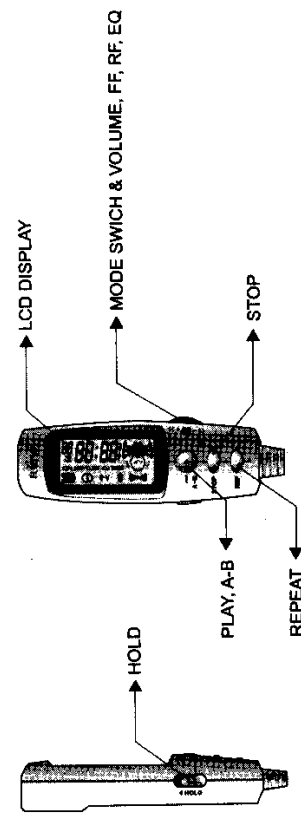
###### Functions of Rome II player Buttons

#### Light indicator on LED

1. Red light on  
As Hold and Battery indicator  
Hold : Red light flashes one by one.  
Low Battery : Red light flashes continually.
2. Green light on  
Power on : green light flashes one by one.  
Play : Green light flashes twice continually.
