

# Caller ID log

If you subscribe to caller ID service, informatio about each caller appears after the first or second ring. If you answer a call before the caller information appears on the screen, it will not be saved in the caller ID log. The caller ID log stores up to 30 entries. Each entry has up to 24 digits for the phone number and 15 characters for the name and 15 characters for the name.

If the telephone number has more than 15 digits only the last 15 digits appear. If the name has mor than 15 characters, only the first 15 characters are shown and saved in the caller ID log.

When there are calls that have not been reviewed in the caller ID log, the handset displays XX missed calls.






