Safety Instructions



Please always follow these instructions to help ensure against injury to yourself and damage to the system.

- Read all safety and operating instructions before you operate the receiver.
- Retain all safety and operating instructions for future reference.
- Heed all warnings on the receiver and in the safety and operating instructions.
- Follow all installation, operating, and use instructions.
- Unplug the receiver from the AC power outlet before cleaning. Use only a damp cloth for cleaning the exterior of the receiver.
- Do not use accessories or attachments not recommended by the receiver manufacturer, as they may cause hazards and void the warranty.
- Do not operate the receiver in high humidity areas or expose it to water or moisture.
- Do not place the receiver on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The receiver may fall, causing serious personal injury and damage to the receiver.


- Do not block or cover slots and openings in the receiver. These are provided for ventilation and protection from overheating. Never place the receiver near or over a radiator or heat register.
 Do not place the receiver in an enclosure such as a cabinet without proper ventilation.
- Do not stack the receiver on top of or below other electronic devices.
- Operate the receiver using only the type of power source indicated on the marking label.
 Unplug the receiver power cord by gripping the power plug, not the cord.
- Insert the plug properly. The receiver is equipped with a polarized AC line plug (one blade is wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug still fails to fit, contact an electrician to replace the obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- Route power supply cords so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items place upon or against them. Pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.
- Do not overload wall outlets or extension cords, as this can result in a risk of fire or electrical shock.

- Never insert objects of any kind into the receiver through openings, as the objects may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts.
 This could cause fire or electrical shock.
- Make sure that the outdoor parts of the antenna system are grounded in accordance with local, state, federal, and National Electrical Code (NEC) requirements.

Note to CATV System Installer: This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

- Do not locate the antenna near overhead light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing the antenna, take extreme care to avoid touching such power lines or circuits, as contact with them can be fatal.
- Do not attempt to service the receiver yourself, as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage, and will void the warranty. Refer all servicing to authorized service personnel.

- Make sure that the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the receiver manufacturer. Unauthorized substitutions may damage the receiver or cause electrical shock or fire, and will void the warranty.
- Upon completion of any service or repair to the receiver, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to ensure that the receiver is in proper operating condition.
- Use an outlet that contains surge suppression or ground fault protection. For added protection during a lightning storm, or when the receiver is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the lines between the receiver and the antenna. This will provide some protection against damage caused by lightning or power line surges.



SATELLITE TELEVISION

Satellite television uses a satellite in a geosynchronous orbit over the Earth to deliver television and audio programming. This type of orbit enables the satellite to stay aligned over one place on the surface of the Earth. Once the satellite dish is aimed at the satellite, the dish does not have to move to follow it.

The programming signal is transmitted to the satellite from a facility on the ground called the "Uplink Center." The satellite then transmits the signal to the dish. The signal the receiver processes is customized based on the programming or information services ordered.

To receive DISH Network satellite television services, you must have a satellite dish and receiver installed that are compatible with the DISH Network. To order pay per view programs, you must connect the receiver to an active telephone-connection.



SATELLITE SIGNAL QUALITY

RAIN AND SNOW FADE

Heavy rain, snow, or cloud cover can block the satellite signal, which can interrupt your programming service. By aiming the satellite dish to get the strongest signal, you can help prevent rain and snow from interrupting the signal.

SOLAR INTERFERENCE

Twice a year, the sun is in a position behind the satellite, in orbit around the Earth. The exact time of the year that this occurs varies, depending on the location, but it will be around the beginning of spring and again around the beginning of autumn. When the sun is directly behind the satellite, solar energy overpowers the satellite signal for just a few minutes. This is an unavoidable natural event for all satellite television program providers. During this period, you will not be able to see programs. Once the sun has moved from behind the satellite, the programs will reappear.

AVAILABLE SERVICES

The DISH Network provides a wide range of exciting and entertaining services covering a variety of interests, including movies, sports, news, education, hobbies, music, shopping, comedy, and more.

- Subscription Services are programs or services that you purchase for extended periods. They are billed at regular intervals, and remain activated until you call the Service Center to cancel them.
- Package Services are groups of services offered to you at a discount. They provide the greatest value to you because they combine the services that you want to activate at a reduced rate.
- One-Time Services are special broadcast events and other purchases you use once.
 They include pay per view programs, and special programming.

ABOUT THE DVD PLAYER

The DVD Player will allow you to watch your favorite DVD movies and listen to your favorite audio CDs. The DISH DVD player uses the NTSC color recording system. It uses DolbyTM Digital (AC-3TM) and PCM audio recording systems.

DVD DISCS AND AUDIO CDs

The DVD player is compatible with 5" (12 cm) and 3" (8 cm) DVD VideoTM Discs, and with 5" and 3" (CD single) Compact Digital AudioTM discs. It is designed for playback of Region 1 (United States of America, and Canada) encoded DVD software. Use of software not intended for Region 1 playback may result in undesirable performance. Do not try to play Photo CD or CD-R. Data on the disc may be damaged.
