


## **VIVOpay Dine**

Quick User Guide for stand-alone demo

Version 1.0

To activate the <u>Stand-Alone Demo</u>, turn-on VP Dine (using on/off button as indicated in green) while keeping the "1" button on the VP Dine keypad pressed.



You should hear 3 consecutive beeps for a successful boot. If only 2 beeps are heard please turn off device and start again.

2) The VP Dine will be ready to use when the screen shown on the right is displayed:




3) Tap the above screen to simulate the initiation of a new transaction; and the screen on the right will then be briefly displayed:




 When the screen on the right is showing, present the VP to the customer.

To add a tip; select "Yes", If not; select "No",



To demo a transaction without signature select "NO".

5) If "Yes" is selected, to add; a tip the VP Dine will display a screen similar to the one shown on the right:



The tip screen will already show a preset tip percentage,

To change the tip,

- Tap the "up" arrow with a "+" sign to increase the tip
- Tap the "down" arrow with a "-" sign to decrease the tip
- Tap OK to accept tip and proceed

6) When a screen similar the one on the right is shown, tap "Yes" to proceed or "No" to re-enter tip



7) When the screen on the right is shown, EITHER

Tap a contactless credit card or NFC mobile phone on the 'VISA" logo above the display.

OR

Swipe a magnetic-stripe credit card at the top of the VP Dine orientated correctly as indicated by the logo on the top left-hand corner of the VP Dine



9) If approved, the VP Dine will display the screen on the right:



8) While obtaining approval the screen on the right will be shown



- 10) If a signature is required the screen on the right will be shown.
- Please use ONLY the stylus provided to sign on the line.



Tap clear to sign again or OK to complete transaction.
