This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6W/kg. *Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. THIS MOBILE DEVICE MEETS GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES. Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. 



1.1 Your Device





Headset jack Power:


- Press and hold for 5 seconds to turn the device on or off.

1.3 Installing SIM Cards, Battery and Memory Card

Remove the back cover

- 1. Turn the device off.
- 2. Lift to open the back cover.



SIM card


The device has two SIM card slots. This dual-SIM technology allows you to switch between two network operators simultaneously.

Install the SIM cards

With the gold contacts facing down, insert the SIM cards into the card slots as shown.

Remove the SIM cards

Slide to remove the SIM cards from the card slots.



Memory card


You need a microSD[®] card to store photos, music, videos and other data.

Install the memory card

Insert the memory card with the gold contacts facing down.

Remove the memory card

- 1. For safe removal, tap > Settings > Storage > Unmount SD card.
- 2. Slide the memory card out from the slot.




Battery

Your device comes with a rechargeable Li-bn battery. Battery life varies depending on the network, opened applications, and the type of connections used by the device.

Install the battery

Insert the battery. Make sure the contacts of the battery are aligned with the connectors on the battery slot.



Remove battery

Use your fingertip to lift and remove the battery.



Replace the back cover

Secure the hooks on the back cover with the designated holes on the device, then close the back cover.



NOTE: To ensure battery performance and avoid the risk of fire:

- Use only original batteries designated for the device.
- Do not store the battery in temperatures below -10°C or higher than 45°C.

1.4 Charging the Battery

The battery that came with the device is only partially charged.

Charge the battery


- 1. Connect one end of the AC adaptor to the micro USB connector of the device.
- 2. Plug the other end of the AC adaptor to the wall outlet to start charging.

When the battery is charging and the device is

turned on, the icon is displayed on the status bar.

When the battery is fully charged and the

device is turned on, the icon is displayed on the status bar.



NOTE:

- The battery can also be charged by connecting the device to a computer using a USB cable.
- Battery life varies depending on network, applications, and ambient temperature.

1.5 Turning the Device On or Off

After installing the SIM cards and charging the battery, the device is ready to be turned on.

Turn Device On or Off

Turn on the device

Press and hold the **Power** button until the device vibrates.

Turn off the device

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** button for 5 seconds.
- 2. A pop-up window appears, tap **Power off**.
- 3. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Set Device to Airplane Mode

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** button for 5 seconds.
- 2. On the options menu, tap **Airplane mode**.



Set Device to Silent Mode

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** button for 5 seconds.
- 2. On the options menu, tap **Silent mode**.

Set Device to Sleep Mode

To set the device to sleep mode, press the **Power** button. This turns the display off. To turn the display on, press the **Power** button again.

1.6 Locking and Unlocking the Screen

Lock the screen to prevent it from accidentally being touched. By default, the screen locks after being idle for a period of time (see "Display Settings" on page 76).

Lock the screen

To manually lock the screen and turn off the display, press the **Power** button.

Unlock the screen

- 1. If the display is turned off, press the **Power** button.
- 2. Slide to the center of the screen to unlock the screen.



1.7 Using the Headset

For hands-free conversation or listening to music, plug a headset to the headset jack. **NOTE:**

- When using a headset, your ability to hear outside sounds may be limited.
 Do not use a headset if it will endanger you.
- Do not set the headset volume to its maximum as it may damage your hearing.

1.8 Adjusting the Volume

The device features four types of volume which can be adjusted separately:

- Ringer volume: Set the volume for incoming calls and notifications.
- In-call volume: Set the volume during a call.
- Media volume: Set the volume for music and videos.
- Alarm volume: Set the volume for alarms.

Adjust ringer volume

- 1. Tap


 > Settings > Sound.
- 2. Tap Volume.
- 3. To adjust the ringtone volume, do either of the following:
 - a. Drag the volume slider to adjust the volume.
 - b. Press the volume button to adjust the volume.

NOTE: If you want to use the same incoming call volume level for notification, tap **Use**

incoming call volume for notifications check box and the "Notification" volume bar will be disabled.

4. Tap $\stackrel{\frown}{\longrightarrow}$ to exit the menu.

NOTE: When the device is set to silent mode, the "Volume" settings will be disabled.



Adjust in-call volume

During a phone call, press the volume button to adjust the volume.

Adjust media/alarm volume

- 1. Tap



Chapter 2: The Basics

2.1 Home Screen

From the Home screen, you can quickly access common features and view notifications of missed calls, received messages, check battery, and connection status.



Extended Home Screen

Swipe your finger to the left or to the right across the Home screen.


The two extensions to the left and to the right of the Home screen provide more space for widgets, shortcuts, and other items.



Status Bar

Status bar icons indicate different types of information.

Notifications Panel

The notifications panel displays the device activities, details of status or other notifications.


Open the notifications panel

Tap and slide the status bar downwards.

To open related applications, touch a notification.

Close the notifications panel

Tap and hold the bottom of the panel, then slide upwards to close the notifications panel.



2.2 Customizing Home Screen


Home screen is an extended panel user interface that gives you up-to-date information at a glance, such as time, weather, calendar, upcoming appointments, next alarm, new messages, missed calls, newemails, and new voicemail. It also has a fully customizable layout where you can add your own favorite apps, folders, and widgets for one-tap access.

The Home key () is the only way to launch ViewScene 3D. There is no app icon of ViewScene 3D in the apps list. In case you had to close ViewScene TM 3D and go back to your stock launcher for any reason, you can relaunch Shell 3D from Settings >

Applications > Manage applications > All >

ViewScene 3D > Clear defaults. Then tap to view the launcher selecting menu. In the launcher selecting menu, check the "use by default for this action" check box and select ViewScene 3D.

From the Home screen, tap , to view the available options.




Adding Widgets

Widgets put at-a-glance important information and media content on your Home screen. Some of ViewScene 3D widgets are already added to your Home screen for your convenience. A wide selection of ViewScene 3D and Androidwidgets is available for you to choose from, such as wireless switcher, weather, world time, sound profile, call log, and more.

Add a widget

You may add and customize the Widgets on the Home screen as you like.

- Tap and hold a blank area on the Home screen.
 Or, tap > Add to display the options menu.
- Tap ViewScene 3D Widget or Android Widget.
 A list of available widgets is displayed.
- 3. Tap to select the widget you want to appear on the Home screen.



Move a widget

- 1. Tap and hold the widget until it enlarges.
- 2. Drag the widget to the desired area on the Home screen.
 - Pause at the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item into another Home screen panel.
- 3. When you are done, tap the icon to exit the editing mode.

Remove a widget

- 1. Tap and hold the widget until it enlarges. The icon appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the widget to **t** o delete.
- 3. When you are done, tap the icon to exit the editing mode.

NOTE: Most ViewScene 3D Widgets are available in a variety of designs and sizes to suit your needs. Tap the icon at the top right of the widget to view the different styles, and then tap the icon to exit the editing mode.



Shortcut Icons

Shortcut icons allow you to access an application directly from the Home screen.

Add a shortcut icon

- Tap and hold a blank area on the Home screen.
 Or, tap > Add to display the options menu.
- 2. Tap **Application** or **Android Shortcut** to display the list of applications.
- 3. Tap to add the items that you want to appear on the Home screen.



Move a shortcut icon

- 1. Tap and hold the shortcut icon until it enlarges.
- 2. Drag the shortcut icon to the desired area on the Home screen.
 - Pause at the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item into another Home screen panel.
- 3. When you are done, tap the icon to exit the editing mode.

Remove a shortcut icon

- 1. Tap and hold the desired shortcut icon until the icon enlarges. The icon appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the icon to ito delete.
- 3. When you are done, tap the vicon to exit the editing mode.



Adding Folders

Use folders to group related applications and other shortcuts to keep your Home screen tidy and organized.

- 1. Tap and hold a blank area on the Home screen.
- Tap Folder or ViewScene 3D Widget.
 Favorite contacts and bookmarks folders can be found in ViewScene 3D Widgets menu.
- 3. If you add a folder, tap and hold on the new Folder to activate the editing mode.
- 4. Drag the application icon or shortcut and drop it on top of the folder.
- 5. By default folders will be automatically renamed according to their content.

To change its name manually, tap the open folder button in editing mode and then tap on the folder title bar. Uncheck the "Automatic naming" check box, enter the new folder name, and tap **OK**.



To remove an item from folder, tap the open folder button in editing mode and then drag and drop the item out of the folder area.

Changing Wallpaper

You can customize the wallpaper of your Home screen with a default wallpaper or with pictures taken with the device.

Set wallpaper from My Gallery

You can use pictures taken by the phone camera or pictures saved on the microSD card as the wallpaper

- 1. Tap > Wallpaper to display the options menu.
- 2. On the options menu, tap My Gallery.
- 3. Thumbnails of pictures saved in the microSD card appear. Tap to select a picture.
- 4. Drag your finger to select the crop area.
- 5. Tap **Save** to set the picture as the wallpaper.

Set wallpaper from Wallpaper gallery

- 1. Tap > Wallpaper to display the options menu.
- 2. On the options menu, tap **Wallpapers**.
- 3. All system wallpapers are displayed. Swipe your finger to the left or to the right to view the available wallpapers.
- 4. Tap to preview the wallpaper.
- 5. Tap **Set wallpaper** to apply your selection.



Adding Panel

Tap and then select **Add** > **Empty Panel** if you want to add anextra panel to your Home screen. Please note that the maximum number of panels is 15.

Managing Home Screen Panels

In the Manage panels screen, you can add, remove, and rearrange the panels.

- 1. Tap and then tap Manage panels.
- 2. Drag and drop to add, remove, and rearrange the panels.

NOTE: The preset panels such as weather, time, and calendar cannot be removed permanently, they will stay on the panel's floor

3. Tap the sicon to exit the editing mode.



2.3 3D Carousel

The 3D Carousel shows Home screen panels bundled with all the features in a simple and intuitive 3D model. The carousel brings your entire phone features at one glance.

Tap in Home screen to open 3D carousel.

Use left or right gesture to move panels.

Tap a panel to select.

If you left the carousel idlefor a few seconds, the Magic Animations of panels and widgets will be activated. An overview of installed widgets and apps will be played to explore device features.

Once you tap the screen intending to rotate the carousel or select a panel, the Magic Animation is terminated and your tap is processed immediately.


You can rearrange, add, or remove carousel panels.

Tap the icon in carousel screen to open the 3D panels management screen.



2.4 Applications

The Application Menu contains all the applications installed on the device. On the Home screen, tap **Application Menu** (a) to display all applications.

Tap and hold . The recently-used applications are displayed.



Create Application Shortcuts

To easily access frequently-used applications, add the shortcut icon to the Home screen.



- Alternative symbols: Select to show alternative symbol on buttons.
- Keyboard layout: Select to configure the portrait/ landscape layout and other keyboard layout settings.
- Smart input: Select to enable word prediction, predict new word, correct mistyping, spot-check, adaptive learning, and context prediction.
- Languages: Select to set the keyboard language.
- Chinese Input: Select to set the keyboard settings for Chinese input.
- Handwriting: Select to configure the Chinese handwriting settings.


Select, cut, or copy

To select, cut, or copy an entire text field entry, do the following:

- 1. Touch and hold the text field box.

- 4. Edit the text. To cut or copy the highlighted words, touch and hold the text field box, then touch **Cut** or **Copy**.

To select, cut, or copy a word or a portion of text, do the following:

- 1. Touch the area where you want to place the cursor.
- 2. Touch and hold the text field box.
- 3. On the options menu, tap **Select word**.
- 4. From the cursor, swipe your finger across the text that you want to select.
- 5. Edit the text. To cut or copy the highlighted text, touch and hold the text field box, then touch **Cut** or **Copy**.



Paste Text

To paste text, do the following:



Chapter 3: Contacts

Contacts is your phonebook that lets you store names, phone numbers, email addresses and other information. Contacts can be stored in the phone memory or the SIM card memory. You can also add the frequently used contacts to the favorites list. See "Favorite Contacts" on page 23.

3.1 Opening Contacts

From the Home screen, do one of the following to open Contacts.



Indicates contact is saved in phone memory, SIM1 card, or SIM2 card.

3.2 Adding Contacts

- 1. Tap

 > Contacts.
- 2. Tap => New contact.
- 3. Tap one of the following:
 - Phone: To save the contact to phone memory.
 - **SIM1**: To save the contact to the SIM1 card.
 - SIM2: To save the contact to the SIM2 card.

NOTE: If you have added a Google or corporate account on your device, you can store the new contact to Google or corporate account.

4. Enter contact information such as name, phone number, email address etc. To add a contact picture, tap the photo icon.



NOTE: Only the name and phone number can beentered when saving contacts to SIM cards.

5. Tap **Done** to save the contact.

3.3 Copying Contacts

You can copy contacts to and from the SIM cards or the device.

- 1. Tap

 > Contacts.
- 2. Tap > More > Copy to Card/Device.
- 3. Tap one of the following:
 - Device to SIM1: To copy contacts from the device to the SIM1 card.
 - Device to SIM2: To copy contacts from the device to the SIM2 card.
 - SIM1 to Device: To copy contacts from the SIM1 card to the device.
 - SIM2 to Device: To copy contacts from the SIM2 card to the device.
- 4. Select the contacts to copy or tap > Select all to select all contacts.
- 5. Tap **Done** to copy.



3.4 Importing and Exporting Contacts

You can export contacts to the memory card to back up contact information and import it to the device.

Import From Memory Card

- 1. Tap

- 2. Tap > More > Import/Export.
- 3. Tap **Import from SD card** to import contacts from the memory card to the device.



Back Up Contacts

NOTE: Exporting contacts will overwrite the old backup file in the memory card.

4. A warning message pops up, tap **OK** to proceed. All contacts are copied to the memory card.





Divert Calls to Voicemail

- 1. Tap

- 4. Select **Incoming calls** to divert all calls from the contact to voicemail.

3.7 Favorite Contacts

Add the most frequently called contacts to Favorites to access contacts quickly and easily.





 - **SIM1 contacts**: Select to display contacts saved on the SIM1 card.
 - **SIM2 contacts**: Select to display contacts saved on the SIM2 card.
- 4. Tap **Done** to save changes.



3.9 Searching for Contacts

On the Contacts screen, do any of the following to easily search for contacts:

- Flick your finger up or down the screen to scroll the contacts list.
- Tap > Search. In the search box, type the first few letters of the contact to search or enter an alphabetical index to view contact names that start with the letter. For example, to view names that start with "a", tap "a" and the list of contacts will be displayed.



3.10 Synchronizing Contacts

You can synchronize contacts from other applications, such as Exchange server and Google, with the contacts on the device.

The Call Log screen displays the most recent outgoing, received, or missed calls.

- To send a message, add to contacts, and view call details, tap the entry.
- To remove the entry from the list, tap and hold an entry, then tap Remove from call log.
- To clear the call log, tap > Delete > > Select all > Done.

Use **Messaging** to send and receive text and multimedia messages. Use **Email** to send and receive email messages using your internet email accounts.

To open the Phone screen, do any of the following:

5.1 Text Message

A text message can only contain letters, numbers, and symbols.



NOTE: Availability of the SIM card icons depend on the SIM card(s) installed on the device.

Create and Send Text Messages

The device offers several ways to create and send new text messages.

From Messaging screen

- Tap or tap > Messaging.
- 2. Tap New message.
- 3. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
- 4. Tap **Type to compose** then type your message.
- 5. Tap or to send your message.

NOTE: If you close Messaging before sending your message, the unsent message will be automatically saved as a draft.

From Call log

- Tap
- 2. Tap the Call log to view the call history.
- 3. Tap and hold a call from the Call log.
- 4. Tap Send text message.
- 5. Compose your message.
- 6. Tap or send your message.

NOTE: If you close Messaging before sending your message, the unsent message will be automatically saved as a draft.

Receive and Manage Messages

When you send and receive messages from a contact, these messages are grouped as a message thread. A message thread looks like an exchanged conversation.

Reply to a text message

- 1. Tap or tap > Messaging.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Tap **Type to compose** then type your message.
- 4. Tap or send your message.


Forward a text message



5.2 Multimedia Message

A multimedia message or MMS can contain letters, images, an audio or video file.





5.4 Customizing Message Settings

 - Storage settings: Use this setting to enable Delete old messages, set Text message limit, and Multimedia message limit.
 - Text-message (SMS) settings: Use this setting to enable Delivery reports, manage SIM1 card and SIM2 card text messages.
 - Multimedia message (MMS) settings: Use this setting to enable Delivery reports, Read reports, Send delivery report, Auto-retrieve, and Roaming auto-retrieve of MMS messages. You can also set the Maximum picture resolution and Maximum message size.
 - Notification settings: Use this setting to enable and set notifications of new messages.




5.5 Email Accounts

The device can send and receive emails just as you do with a computer. It supports Internet emails, email accounts that are provided by anInternet Service Provider (ISP) or web-based emails, such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo! Mail, etc.

10.2 Changing Basic Settings

Date and Time


- Tap > Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Tap **Set date** to set the date.
 - To adjust the date, tap the + or buttons of the month, day, or year fields to increase or decrease the value. Tap Set to apply the values.
 - To change the date format, tap Select date format, and select the date format from the list.
- 3. Tap **Set time zone** to select the time zone from the list.
- 4. Tap **Set time** to set the time.
 - To adjust the time, tap the + or buttons of the hour, minute, second fields to increase or decrease the value. Tap to toggle the AM/PM field. Tap Set to apply the values.
 - To use 24-hour format, tap **Use 24-hour format**.



Alarms

You can set up alarms on the device.

- 1. Tap (> Clock.
- 2. Tap 🚳
- 3. To add an alarm, tap Add alarm.
- 4. Tap the + or buttons to set the alarm time, and tap **Set**.

Display Settings

Ring Settings

You can assign a ringtone and a ringtone type for various events such as an incoming call, new message, and others.

Change the ringtone of an incoming call

Change the ringtone of other events

10.3 Using Wireless & networks

Wireless & networks allows you to manage Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, Tethering, Virtual Private Networks (VPNs), and mobile networks.

- 1. Tap

 > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. If necessary, do any of the following:
 - To enable or disable Wi-Fi or Bluetooth, tap their corresponding boxes.
 - To configure Wi-Fi or Bluetooth settings, tap Wi-Fi settings or Bluetooth settings.
 - To share your device mobile data connection via USB or Wi-Fi, tap **Tethering** & portable hotspot.
 - To set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs), tap VPN settings.
 - To change mobile networks settings, tap **Mobile networks**, then tap the setting to change.

10.4 Protecting Your Phone

You can protect the device from unauthorized users by requiring the PIN code or entering a password.

Enable SIM Card Lock

When PIN code is enabled, you are required to enter the PIN code before making a call.

- Tap > Settings > Location & security.
- 2. Tap Set up cards lock.
- 3. Tap Slot1 card lock setting or Slot2 card lock setting.
- 4. Select **Lock SIM card** to require PIN to use the device.
- 5. Enter the current PIN code.
- 6. To change the PIN code, tap Change SIM PIN.
- 7. Enter the old PIN code.
- 8. Enter the new PIN code and confirm.

Enable Screen Lock Protection

You can increase the device security by locking the screen with a pattern, PIN or password. When enabled, you must draw the correct unlock pattern on the screen to unlock and regain access to the device.

 - Pattern: To draw a pattern to lock and unlock screen.
 - PIN: To enter a PIN code to lock and unlock screen.
