## Summary of Voice Controls

The Talkman terminal responds to voice controls that are made by saying the word **Talkman\*** and one of the following words:

<b>Control Word</b>	<b>Action</b>
<i>backup*</i>	delete response and repeat question
<i>continue*</i>	say current question
<i>erase*</i>	delete last word
	say help message
	say previous question, previous response, and current question
	turn off Talkman
<i>volume*</i>	
<i>louder*</i>	increase volume
<i>softer*</i>	decrease volume
<i>continue*</i>	end volume adjustment

\*These control words are the defaults. They may be different for your installation. Please check with your system administrator.
