# **SETUP**

Setup allows the Primary User to control features of all household user accounts. This includes:

- Parental Control is activated on all user accounts using well-known SurfW ttch software. It assures parents that children will not accidently view adult material while surfing the Web.
- Password is activated on all user accounts. Accounts established in 1997 have a pre-set password of 1111. When this default password is changed or a new user account is established, it is extremely important to write down the password. If a password is forgotten only the Primary User can e-mail reachus@wgate.com to ask for the password. The password will be e-mailed to the Primary User.
- User Setup permits the addition of a new user, changes to account features such as password or Parental Control of a current user, or deletion of a user account. WorldGate permits up to six users including the Primary User.






#### Adding a New User (continued)

4. Type the desired user name (see User Setup Screen 3).


Remember to use at least 4 characters, but not more than 14 characters (lower case letters or numbers). This User Name will become part of the e-mail address.

- 5. User Name confirmation screen appears (see User Setup Screen 4).
- 6. Select continue
- 7. Type a desired password. Use 4 digits between 1-7. Press to select the text box beside "retype" and retype your desired password (see User Setup Screen 5).
- 8. Select continue
- 9. Select yes or no to activate Parental Control (see User Setup Screen 6).
- 10. Account information now appears. Your name, e-mail address with your chosen user name, and Parental Control status are listed.


  Select confirm to acknowledge that the user information is correct. Select concel if user information is wrong, and retrace the above steps to add new user (see User Setup Screen 7).











- 8. The last screen will confirm the new password. Select return to setup or home on the browser bar (see Password Screen 4).





# 2.0 Connecting to WorldGate


1. Turn on TV and cable converter.

See Chapters 3 and 4 for details on the wireless keyboard and remote control.




Select your Internet user name on the Log-on screen. (See Log-on screen.)

Using the keyboard or remote control, enter your four digit password, 1111.







# Moving the On-Screen

Rest your right thumb on the Arrow Pad. Move your thumb around the Arrow Pad and watch the on-screen move. Notice that when your thumb moves on the Arrow Pad the on-screen moves in the same direction.


## Selecting a Link



assigned to your WorldGate account in the area provided inside the front cover of this guide.

# 5.0 Handling Messages

#### Displaying the E-Mail Menu

- 1. Log-on.
- 2. Select "e-mail."

## Reading and Replying to E-Mail Messages

- 1. From the E-Mail Menu, select "read mail."
- 2. Select desired message in the list box (see Select E-Mail Screen).
- 3. Select read.
- 4. Select continue to read your message (see Read E-Mail Screen 1).
- 5. To read the message in its entirety, select the lower end of the scroll bar (see Read E-mail Screen 2).


To reply to the message after reading it:

- Select reply
- 2. Compose your message.
- 3. Select send to mail your reply.

## Deleting E-Mail Messages

- 1. From the E-Mail Menu, select "read mail."
- 2. Select desired message in the list box.
- 3. Select delete.

The option to delete is also offered after reading a message.





# 5.0 Handling Messages (continued)

#### Composing E-Mail Messages

From the E-Mail Menu, select "compose e-mail."

You have two options:

#### A. Select an Existing E-Mail Address


- 1. Select the name in the list box, select continue (see Address E-Mail Screen).
- 2. Type subject.
- 3. Select continue.
- 4. Compose your message.
- 5. Select send to mail. A sent mail confirmation screen appears after your e-mail is sent.
- 6. Select return to e-mail main menu or home

#### B. Enter a New E-Mail Address

- 1. Select new addressee (see Address E-Mail Screen).
- 2. Type the person's e-mail address in the "to" text box (see New Addressee E-Mail Screen).
- 3. Select "subject" text box and type in subject.
- 4. Select continue.
- 5. Compose your message.
- 6. Select send to mail your message.

The option to save this new e-mail address is offered:


- 1. Select yes to save the address.
- 2. Type first name (see Add Address Screen).
- 3. Select "last name" text box and type last name.
- 4. Select add to save address.
- 5. Select **yes** to confirm saving new address (see Address Confirmation Screen).











- 2. Select a category (see Web Directory Screen).



#### Using Go to Site


Going directly to a Web site when you know its address.

#### Saving Web Site URLs


When on the Web, select save on the browser bar (or the shortcut key on your wireless keyboard) and the site's URL (address) will be saved in Saved Sites.


- 1. From the Web Menu, select "saved sites."

You have three options:

- A. "go to site" To go directly to the Web site select go to.
- B. Here" To delete the Web site select delete
- C. "URL" To find the Web site's address select show URL

# 6.2 Searching the Web for Information

There are two main types of search tools: Web directories and search engines. The Web is so vast that no single search tool has an index of the entire contents.

#### Web Directories


Web directories are organized lists of broad topics—such as art or business—that may be helpful when you are looking for general information about a topic. The most commonly used directories are Infoseek, Lycos, Excite, and Yahoo. Try using different directories when searching for information until you find the one you prefer.

## Search Engines

A search engine is a powerful computer program that provides a searchable index of Web pages. Popular search engines include WebCrawler, AltaVista, and Hotbot.

## Going Directly to Search Engines and Directories

- 1. From the WorldGate Home Page, select "web."
- 2. Type in a keyword or simple phrase.
- 3. Select a search engine or directory.
- 4. To erase a keyword or phrase, select clear form

# 8 GLOSSARY

#### Browser

A software program that provides a way to look at the information on World Wide Web pages.

#### **Browsing**

Browsing the Web means following hyperlinks to new Web pages.

#### Browser Bar

The WorldGate browser appears at the top of each screen. It varies depending on where you are located. The browser bar is intended to easily guide you through pages.

#### Domain Name

A domain name is a means of identifying the server of a Web or e-mail address. Some examples are: www.wgate.com or www.upenn.edu

#### E-Mail

Electronic mail is a fast form of communication. You can easily send a message to anyone who has an e-mail address. In most cases it will be received in seconds or minutes.

#### Frames

Sites may contain frames to present their data. Frames are a part of a Web design. Some contain image maps or linked documents and others remain unchanging.

#### Home Page

This is a universal term used for the first page of a Web site. Almost every site has an initial page or starting point. This page will be in either a Table of Contents format or simply provide links to various areas within the site. If you are out surfing and come to a page and are lost, look for Home at the top or bottom of a screen or frame to find where you are and what the site contains.

#### Hyperlink

When you hyperlink, you are following a link to access more information. Hyperlinking will take you within the same Web site or to a different Web site relevant to your interest.

#### Hypertext

Any text, words or phrases that contain links that take you to other docume.its.

#### HTTP://

Stands for HyperText Transport Protocol. This protocol transports hypertext files across the Internet. You see this displayed as http://www.wgate.com

#### Image Map

This feature enables you to select graphic images that link to more information. Instead of the colored underlined words, the links are graphics. This is a Web design.

#### Internet

The Internet supports traffic, meaning e-mail, FTP, network news document transfers and telnet sessions.

#### Internet User Name

This name will identify you on the World Wide Web. It will act as part of your e-mail address.

#### Link

A link is a connection to information found on the same site, a different site or another resource that pertains to the information you are seeking. A link is usually colored and/or underlined to easily identify that it will lead you further. A link can also appear as a picture or image map.

#### Search Directory

A search directory is a subject locator. It provides content information and acts as a directory to search for your topic of interest.

#### Search Engine

A search engine is simply a computer program that indexes Web pages and then enables the user to search its index for relevant information.

# GLOSSARY (continued)

#### Surfing

Surfing the Web means following hyperlinks to new Web pages.

#### URL

Uniform Resource Locator is a Web page's address. Each Web page has a unique address.

#### Web Site

Documents consisting of a home page and related pages.

#### Wehmaster

A Webmaster is the person who updates the information on a Web site. Usually the Webmaster provides an e-mail address for any comments or suggestions regarding their site.

#### World Wide Web

The World Wide Web was invented by an Englishman, Timothy Berners-Lee. The Web provides a consistent collection of data that reaches a global market.

# 9 Frequently Asked Questions

- Q. What is my e-mail address?
- A. Your address is made up of two parts. The first is the Internet user name that WorldGate assigned you just look on the log-on screen the next time you connect. The second part is @mail.charter-internet.com For example: apeters@mail.charter-internet.com. (This address will change, and you will be notified.)
- Q. What if a Web page does not appear completely?
- A. Sometimes only part of a Web page will be visible. Just select volume on the browser bar (or the shortcut key on your wireless keyboard) and the page will reload. To return to an unmagnified view of the page select volume again.
- Q. What if a Web site doesn't have the most recent information on it?
- A. If a Web site like *The Weather Channel* has outdated information just select **200m** on the browser bar (or the shortcut key on your wireless keyboard). The page will be reloaded, and if more recent information is available it will appear. Select **200m** again to return to an unmagnified view of the page.
- Q. What if 🖁 and 🛱 don't work?
- A. When this happens, simply move your on-screen to an empty portion of the Web page you are currently on, and press the "SELECT key" on your wireless keyboard.
- Q. Can I use Tenter on my wireless keyboard after typing in a Web address in the GO TO SITE text box?
- A. Sure, that's a great time saver instead of selecting go to on the page. You can also use senter after typing a keyword into a search text box.
- Q. Can I connect an Internet video camera so I can make online videophone calls?
- A. Sorry, WorldGate cannot support this feature. This requires a true Internet connection through a PC.
- Q. Where do my e-mail messages go after I've read them?
- A. Messages sent to you are saved automatically, and WorldGate places no limit on the number you can save.
- Q. My favorite sites and addresses are missing and I can't save anything.
- A. Files are updated on a daily basis. Try again the following day.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (continued)

- Q. Sometimes I don't find my e-mail or favorite Saved Sites. Why?
- A. Be sure to log-on using your name on the Log-on screen, otherwise you will not have access to your e-mail or Saved Sites. If you accidentally log-on using someone else's name, first press A on your cable remote or wor on the wireless keyboard, wait until you are watching TV, and press A or wor again to reconnect to WorldGate.
- Q. How do I find e-mail addresses of friends and family?
- A. There are several services on the Web that provide good directory assistance. Log-on and go to the Web, then Go to Site, and enter one of the following Web site addresses (URL): www.four11.com or whowhere.com
- Q If I select something by accident, what do I do?
- A. Select on the browser bar (or the shortcut key on your wireless keyboard) to go to the previous page.
- Q. How can I get back to the WorldGate Home Page if I get lost?
- A. Select home on the browser bar (or the Menu key on your wireless keyboard) to return to the WorldGate Home Page.
- Q. What happens when I go to a Web site and nothing happens?
- A. When you select an item on the WorldGate browser lar and nothing happens (we call that freezing), press on your cable remote or on the wireless keyboard, and go back to TV, then reconnect to WorldGate.
- Q. When do I need to replace the batteries in my wireless keyboard?
- A. The keyboard comes with batteries that normally last up to six months. If the keyboard does not operate correctly, the batteries may be worn out and should be replaced with two new AA batteries.
- Q. When do I need to replace the batteries in my remote control?
- A. The remote comes with batteries that normally last up to six months. If your remote does not operate correctly, the batteries may be worn out and should be replaced with new AA batteries. When the batteries are removed, the preset codes will not be lost.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (continued)

- Q. What do I do if "Sorry Try Again Later" appears?"
- A. Exit out of the WorldGate system and restart from the beginning. If service is not restored, contact WorldGate customer service (888-818-1001) with the channel number tuned on your TV.
- Q. What happens when I get an all blue or black screen when I try to access WorldGate?
- A. Exit out of the WorldGate system (Go Back to TV) and Log-on to WorldGate again. If service is not restored, contact WorldGate customer service (888-818-1001).
- Q. Why can I tune the TV manually but can't use my remote control or keyboard?
- A. First make sure the red indicator on your remote control is illuminated when a key is pressed. If the indicator light on your remote control is not lit, you may need to replace the batteries. Also, check to make sure that you did not disable the remote control from your menu options. If these two options do not restore your system, contact WorldGate customer service (888-818-1001).
- Q. Why can't I get a certain Web site?
- A. Check the Web site URL/address. If it is typed correctly, the computer on that site may be temporarily down or the cable company does not have the URL in its database.
- Q. What is the MIME message on my e-mail?
- A. Check the accuracy of the person's e-mail address. MIME indicates a bad outgoing message.
- Q. How do I find something on the World Wide Web?
- A. From your "Web" screen, select search. Enter a keyword or phrase, then choose a search engine from the bottom of your screen. (See page 12 for details.)
- Q. What can I do if I can't watch cable or TV?
- A. Exit out of the WorldGate system (Go Back to TV) and Log-on to WorldGate again. If the problem persists, check your cable TV connections.
