INSTALLATION CONSIDERATIONS

Before you install your TV...



Ventilation — Proper ventilation keeps your TV running cool. Air circulates through perforations in the back and bottom of the cabinet. Do not block these vents or you will shorten the life of your TV.



Power Source — Your TV is designed to operate on normal household current, 120 volt 60 Hertz AC. Do not attempt to operate it on DC current.



Power Cord — Your power cord has a polarized plug as required by Underwriters' Laboratories. It has one regular blade and one wide blade and fits only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the blades will not enter either way, your outlet is very old and non-standard. A new outlet should be installed by a qualified electrician.



Safe Operation — Your TV is manufactured and tested with your safety in mind. However, unusual stress caused by dropping or mishandling, exposure to flood, fire, rain or moisture, or accidental spilling of liquids into the TV, can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. If this happens, have your TV checked by a service technician before using it again.

Please read and observe each safety point in the "Safety Tips" folder when installing and using your TV.

VIDEO GAMES AND OTHER FIXED

PATTERN DISPLAY CAUTION — If you use your TV for video games, teletext or other fixed displays, avoid setting the BRIGHTNESS control for an excessively bright picture. A bright, fixed pattern, if used for long periods of time, can result in a permanent imprint on the TV picture tube. You can reduce this possibility by alternating the use of the fixed pattern display with normal TV picture viewing, by turning down the CONTRAST control for sustained fixed pattern use, and by turning off the fixed pattern display when not in use.

PLUGGING IN YOUR TV — Be sure to plug your TV into an "unswitched" AC power source. The "switched" AC outlets found on some video equipment will not continue supplying power to the TV once the equipment is turned off. If the power to the TV is interrupted, you will have to reset the clock in the TV to the current time.

CONNECTIONS FOR YOUR TV

CONNECTION CENTER

SPEAKER EXT/INT

Select EXT (external) to remove sound from the TV's speakers.

Select INT (internal) to hear sound from the TV's speakers.

ANTENNA/CABLE

Jack for 75-ohm antenna or cable-TV connection to your TV. Attach your antenna, cable-TV line or VCR to this jack.

VIDEO 1 IN OR VIDEO 2 IN

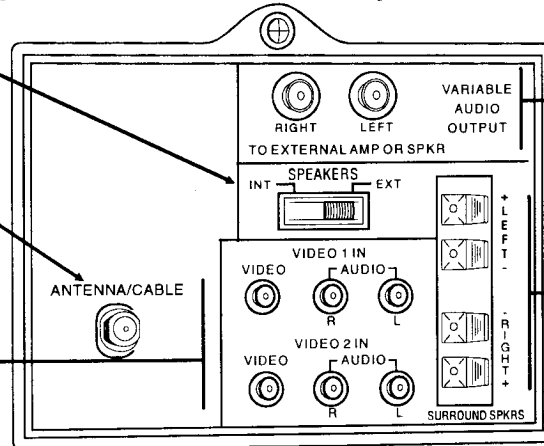
Jacks for audio and video input from a stereo VCR or other A/V component.

You must make A/V connections to these jacks in order to hear stereo sound when playing a stereo tape.

VARIABLE AUDIO OUTPUT

Connect these jacks to the auxiliary input jacks of a stereo amplifier to listen to your TV through your stereo system.

Output audio is always present at these jacks regardless of the position of the SPEAKER switch.



SURROUND SPEAKER TERMINALS

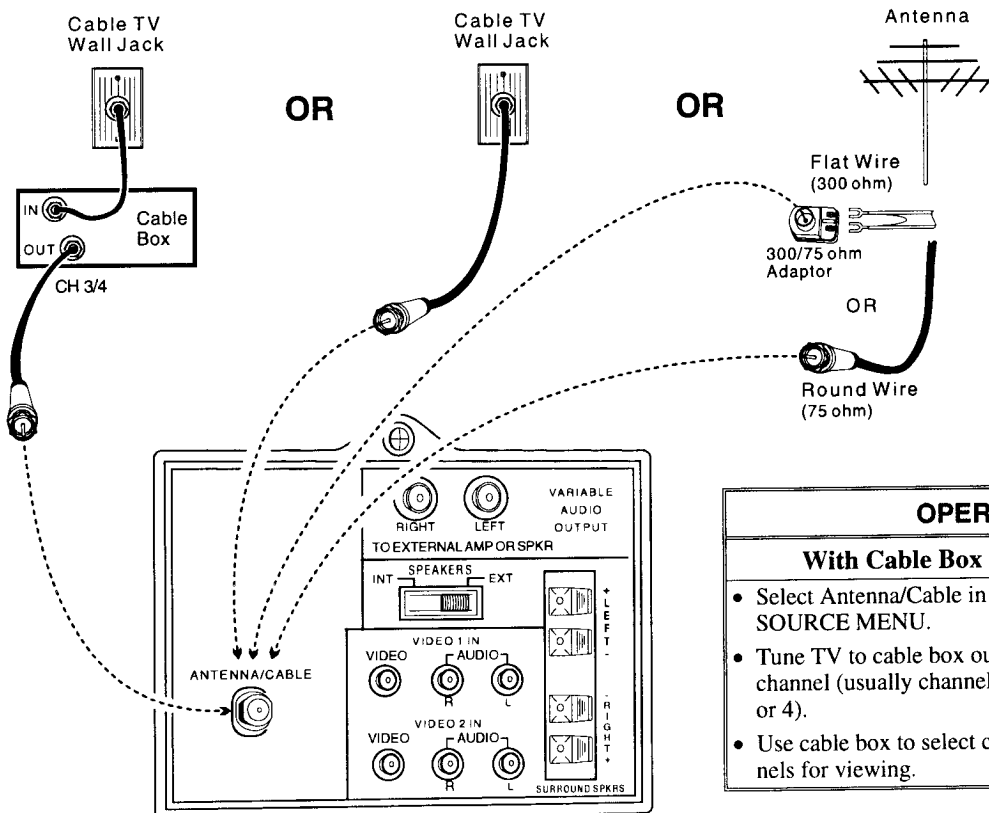
Connections for output to optional surround sound speakers.

- Use cable box to select channels for viewing.

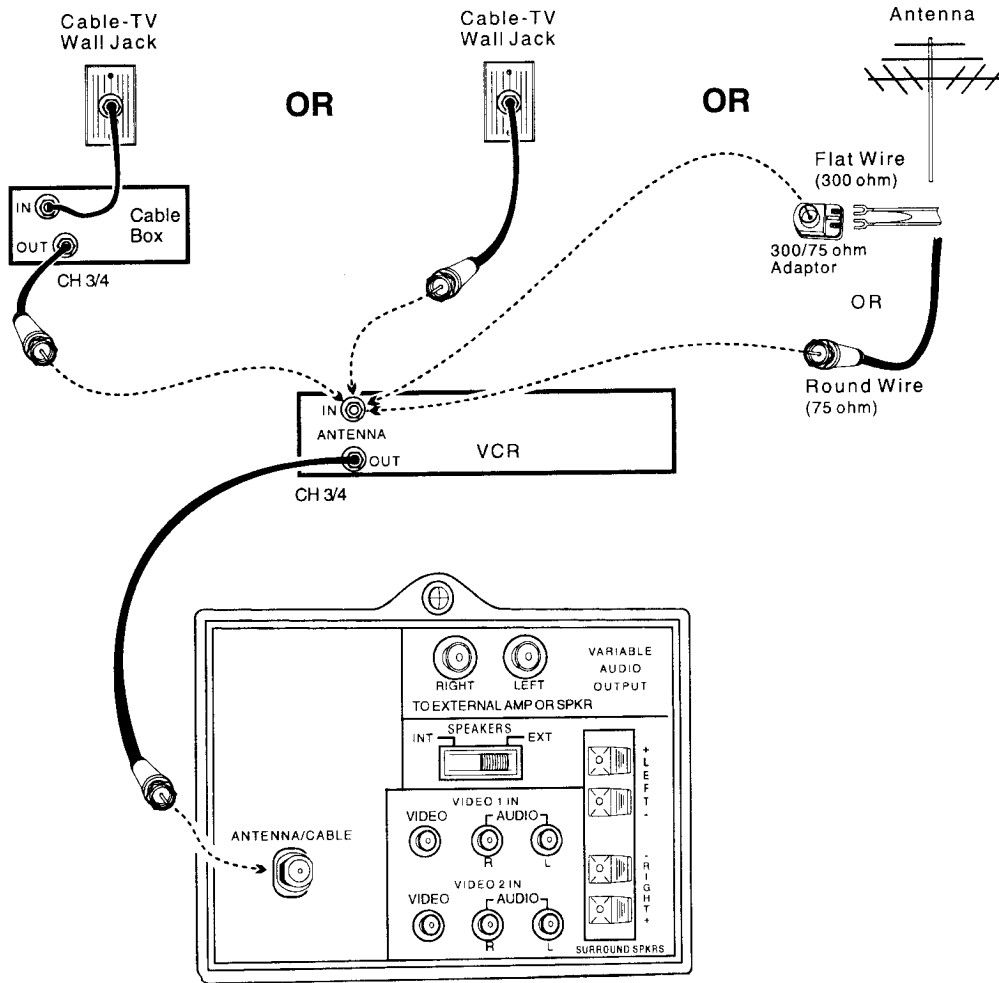
Without Cable Box

If you are connecting a VCR to your TV, you have three basic connection options, as shown.



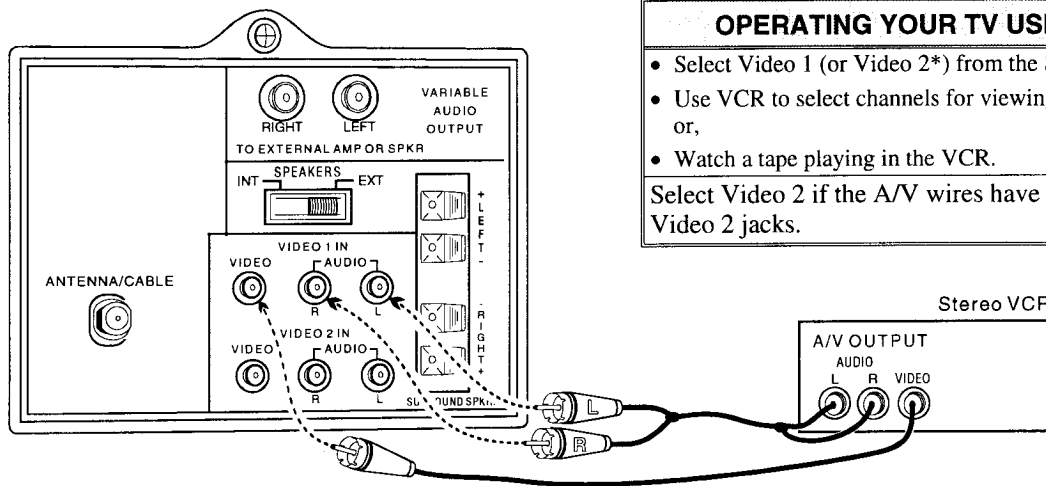

CONNECTIONS FOR YOUR TV

STEREO VCR CONNECTION TO TV

If you have a stereo VCR, you must make the A/V connections shown in order to hear stereo sound while playing a stereo tape.



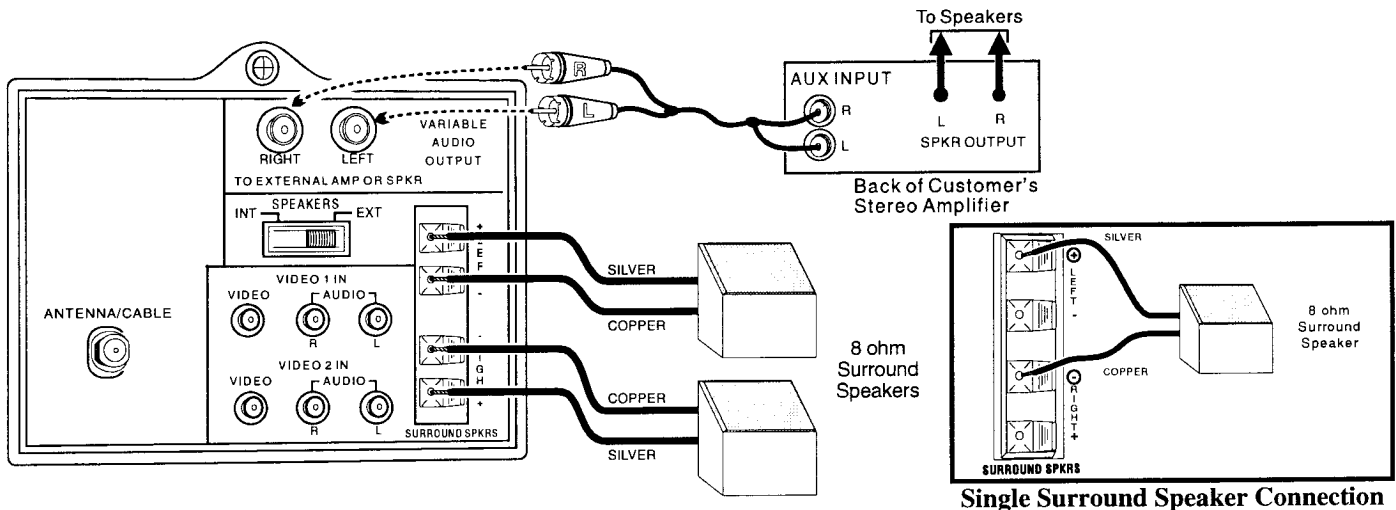
OPERATING YOUR TV USING A/V JACKS

- Select Video 1 (or Video 2*) from the SOURCE MENU.
- Use VCR to select channels for viewing.
- or,
- Watch a tape playing in the VCR.

Select Video 2 if the A/V wires have been connected to the Video 2 jacks.

OPTIONAL AUDIO AMPLIFIER/SURROUND SOUND CONNECTIONS TO TV

If you wish to listen to the TV audio through an external amplifier or stereo system, or listen to surround sound audio, make the connections to the TV shown in the illustration below. (The Variable Audio Output jacks must not be connected directly to speakers.)



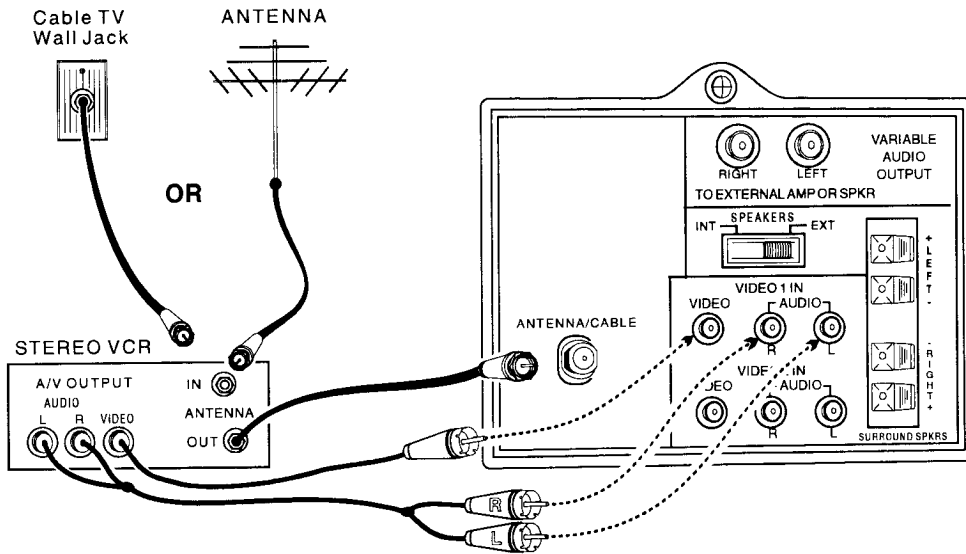

Sound is only heard from the speakers connected to the external amplifier. • Use TV's volume control to raise and lower the level of sound being heard from the amplifier's speakers. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Connect surround sound speakers as shown. 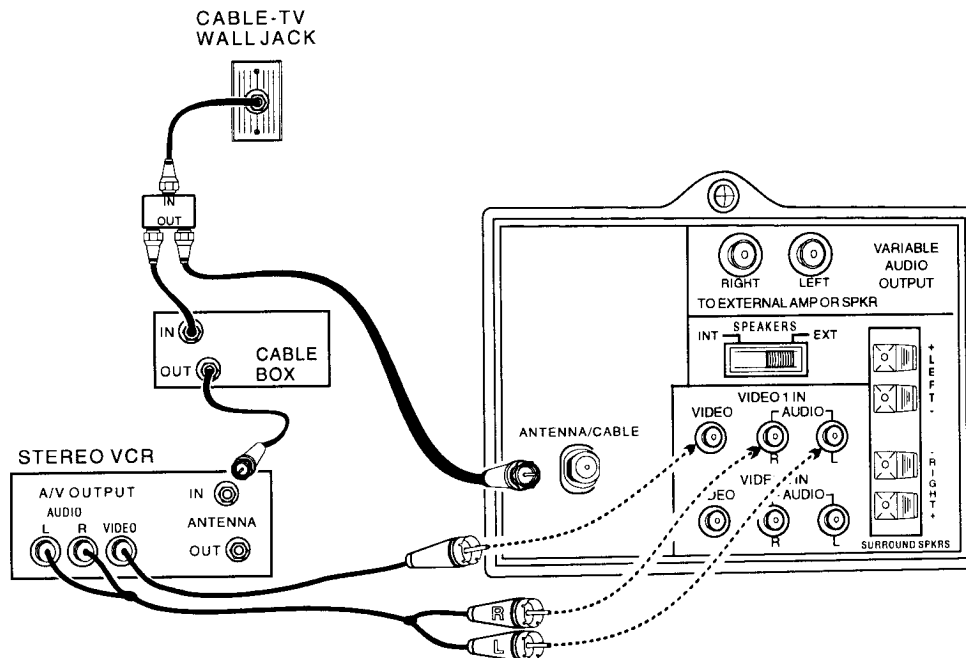

THE FIRST TIME YOU OPERATE YOUR TV

TYPICAL CONTROL PANEL

The control panel on your TV may differ from the one shown but its operation is the same.

ENTER (ENT)

Press to see the Channel/Time display, or to remove any on-screen display or menu.

SELECT (SEL)

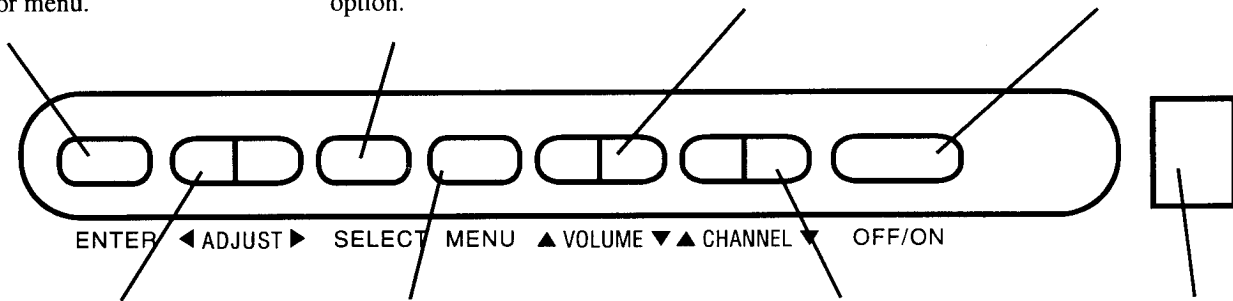
Press during on-screen menu operations to select a menu option.

VOLUME (VOL) Up/Down

Press to increase or decrease the sound level.

OFF-ON

Press to turn TV power ON or OFF.



ADJUST (ADJ) Left/Right

Press during on-screen menu operation to see information/status display for selected option. Press again to adjust the selected menu option.

MENU

Press once to see a menu. Press repeatedly to sequence through other menus.

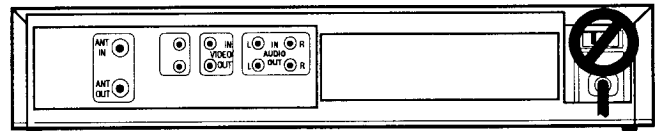
CHANNEL (CH) Up/Down

Press to select channels higher or lower than the current channel being viewed. To add or delete channels stored in the scanning sequence, see CH. ADD/DEL option.

Remote Window
Point the remote control towards this window to operate the TV.

STEP 1. CONNECT THE POWER

1. Plug your TV into an unswitched AC power source.
2. Turn the TV on by pressing OFF-ON.

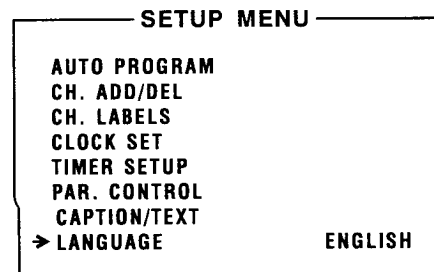


Do not plug TV into switched outlet on a VCR or cable-TV decoder

STEP 2. SELECT YOUR LANGUAGE

Select the language for the on-screen menus. Your options are English (ENGLISH), Spanish (ESPAÑOL) or French (FRANÇAIS). The word LANGUAGE always appears in English regardless of which language is chosen.

1. Press MENU repeatedly until the SETUP MENU is shown.
2. Press SELECT (SEL) Up or Down to highlight LANGUAGE then use ADJUST (ADJ) Left or Right to choose the desired language.
3. Press ENTER (ENT) to remove the menu.



Setup Menu with Language Highlighted

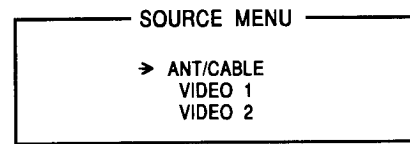
THE FIRST TIME YOU OPERATE YOUR TV

STEP 3. SELECT YOUR VIEWING SOURCE

A TV source refers to the equipment connected to the TV. You select the viewing source that supplies the picture and sound to your TV by means of the SOURCE MENU.

To Access SOURCE MENU

1. Press SOURCE on the remote control to view the SOURCE MENU.
2. Press SOURCE repeatedly until the ANT/CABLE source is highlighted.

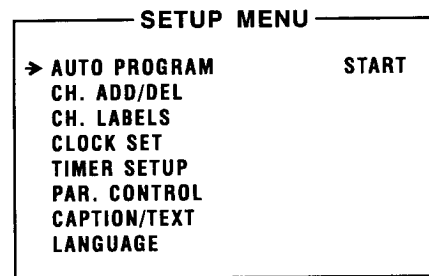


3. Press ENTER (ENT) to return to normal viewing.

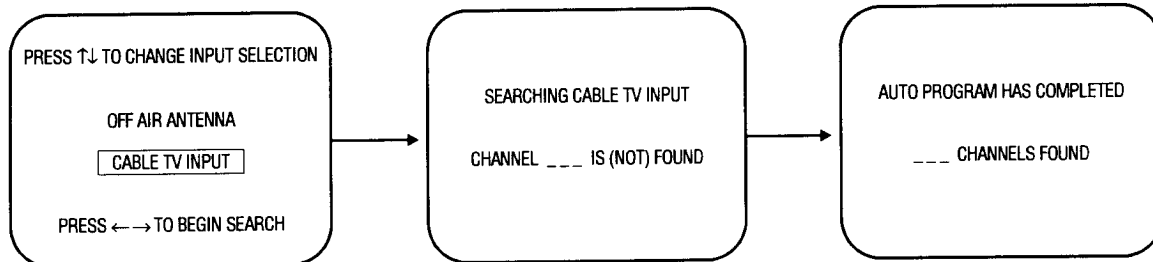
NOTE: ANT/CABLE source must be selected before using AUTO PROGRAM in order to correctly find available channels.

STEP 4. USE AUTO PROGRAM

When your TV is first powered up, AUTO PROGRAM will be selected in the Setup Menu. AUTO PROGRAM finds all available channels and stores them in the memory of the TV. To start the AUTO PROGRAM procedure, press ADJUST Left/Right. Follow the instructions on the TV.



Setup Menu with Auto Program Highlighted



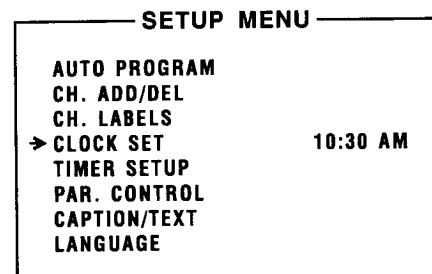
Press ↑↓ to select either OFF AIR ANTENNA or CABLE TV.

Press ← → to begin channel search.

Press ENTER after channel search is completed.

STEP 5. SET THE CLOCK

1. Press MENU repeatedly until the SETUP MENU is shown.
2. Press SELECT to highlight CLOCK SET.
3. Use numbered buttons on remote control to enter correct time and the TIMER button to select AM or PM. You can also use ADJUST Left/Right to advance the 24 hour clock.
4. Press ENTER to start the clock and remove the menu.

STEP 6. USE OTHER OPTIONS

You may want to consider using the following options:

- Delete undesirable channels or add additional channels: Refer to the CH. (Channel) ADD/DEL option for details.
- Label channels (such as ABC) that appear in the Channel/Time display: Refer to the CH. (Channel) LABELS option for details.

- Use the Parental Control feature to block the viewing of undesirable channels: Refer to the PAR. CONTROL option for details.

TIMER OPERATIONS

SLEEP TIMER

The SLEEP TIMER is a feature which allows you to program the TV to automatically turn itself off after a period from 15 minutes up to 4 hours.

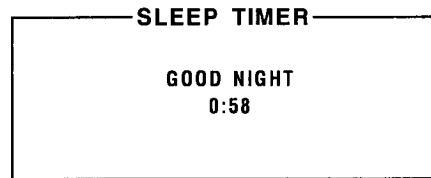
To Set SLEEP TIMER

1. Press MENU until the Setup Menu appears.
2. Select TIMER SETUP to view the Timer Menu.
3. With SLEEP TIMER highlighted, use ADJUST Left/Right to choose the period of time after which the TV will turn itself off.

Timer Set to Turn TV OFF in 30 Minutes

One minute before the TV turns off, the GOOD NIGHT display appears on the screen. At this time you have a choice of the following three actions.



“Good Night” Display Appears 60 Seconds Before Shut-Off

1. Do nothing. The GOOD NIGHT display remains on the screen. The TV will turn off in one minute.
2. Remove the GOOD NIGHT display by pressing ENTER. The TV will still turn off in one minute.
3. Delay the turn-off by resetting the timer with a new time period.

To Cancel the SLEEP TIMER

You can cancel the SLEEP TIMER by returning to the Timer Menu and setting it to OFF or by turning the TV off.

NOTES:

- Before the TIMER MENU can be used, you must set the time on the TV. See “THE FIRST TIME YOU OPERATE YOUR TV” or the “SETUP MENU” sections of the operating guide.
- The SLEEP TIMER can also be accessed directly by pressing the TIMER key on the remote control.

ON/OFF TIMER

The ON/OFF TIMER is a feature which allows you to program the TV to automatically turn itself on at a specific time then turn itself off at another time.

1. Press MENU until the Setup Menu appears.
2. Select TIMER SETUP to view the Timer Menu.
3. Select ON TIME and use the numbered buttons on your remote to enter a time for the TV to turn itself ON. Press TIMER on the remote to select AM or PM. You can also use ADJUST Left/Right to advance the time.
4. Select OFF TIME and use the numbered buttons on your remote to enter a time for the TV to turn itself OFF. Press TIMER on the remote to select AM or PM. You can also use ADJUST Left/Right to advance the time.
5. Select ON/OFF TIMER and use ADJUST on remote to turn TIMER ON or OFF.
6. Press ENTER to start the timer and return to normal viewing.

REMOTE CONTROL MBR3455

INTRODUCTION

This multi-brand remote control operates the common features of most, but not all, models and brands of IR (infrared) controlled TVs, VCRs, cable converters, video disc players, and audio equipment. The remote may provide functions that are not

available on your equipment, e.g., menu operations. Some functions of your particular equipment may not be controlled by this remote. In such cases, use the original remote control for your equipment.

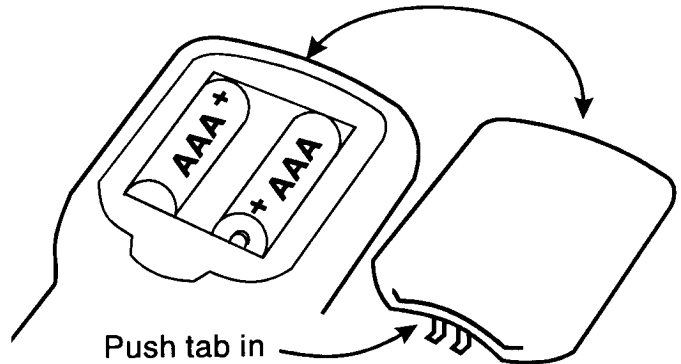
BATTERY INSTALLATION

Batteries are provided, but they must be installed before using the remote control. When it no longer functions normally, or when it loses memory, replace the batteries with two high-quality, alkaline, size AAA batteries. Match plus with plus (+ with +), minus with minus (- with -), as shown in the battery compartment.

Unless your equipment responds to the factory preset codes commonly used for Zenith products, i.e., 101 for TV, 201 for VCR, 353 for CABLE, and 401 for AUX., you will need to program the remote control with the codes for your particular equipment.

NOTES:

- Do not place heavy objects on top of the remote control keys. Prolonged unintentional operation of the remote shortens battery life.
- Remove the batteries if the remote control will not be used for a month or more. **Battery leakage can permanently damage the remote, for which Zenith is not responsible.**



CHOOSING OPERATING MODE

To control your TV, VCR, cable box, or auxiliary equipment with this remote, you must first choose the mode of operation. Press the desired mode key for TV, VCR, CABLE or AUX.

Some keys on the remote will always operate a particular product function. For example, **VOLUME** controls the TV sound level, and **PLAY** controls the VCR play function.

INDICATOR LIGHT

Illuminates whenever remote sends signal.

OPERATING MODE KEYS

Selects equipment to be controlled.

NUMBER KEY PAD

Provides direct channel selection and other functions.

LOWER ARROW KEY PAD

These keys typically perform on-screen menu selection and adjustment.

POWER KEY

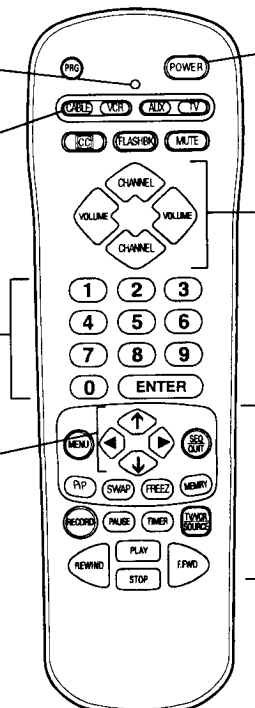
Switches power ON or OFF to selected equipment.

UPPER ARROW KEY PAD

These keys typically control Channel changing and Volume operations.

SPECIAL FUNCTION KEYS

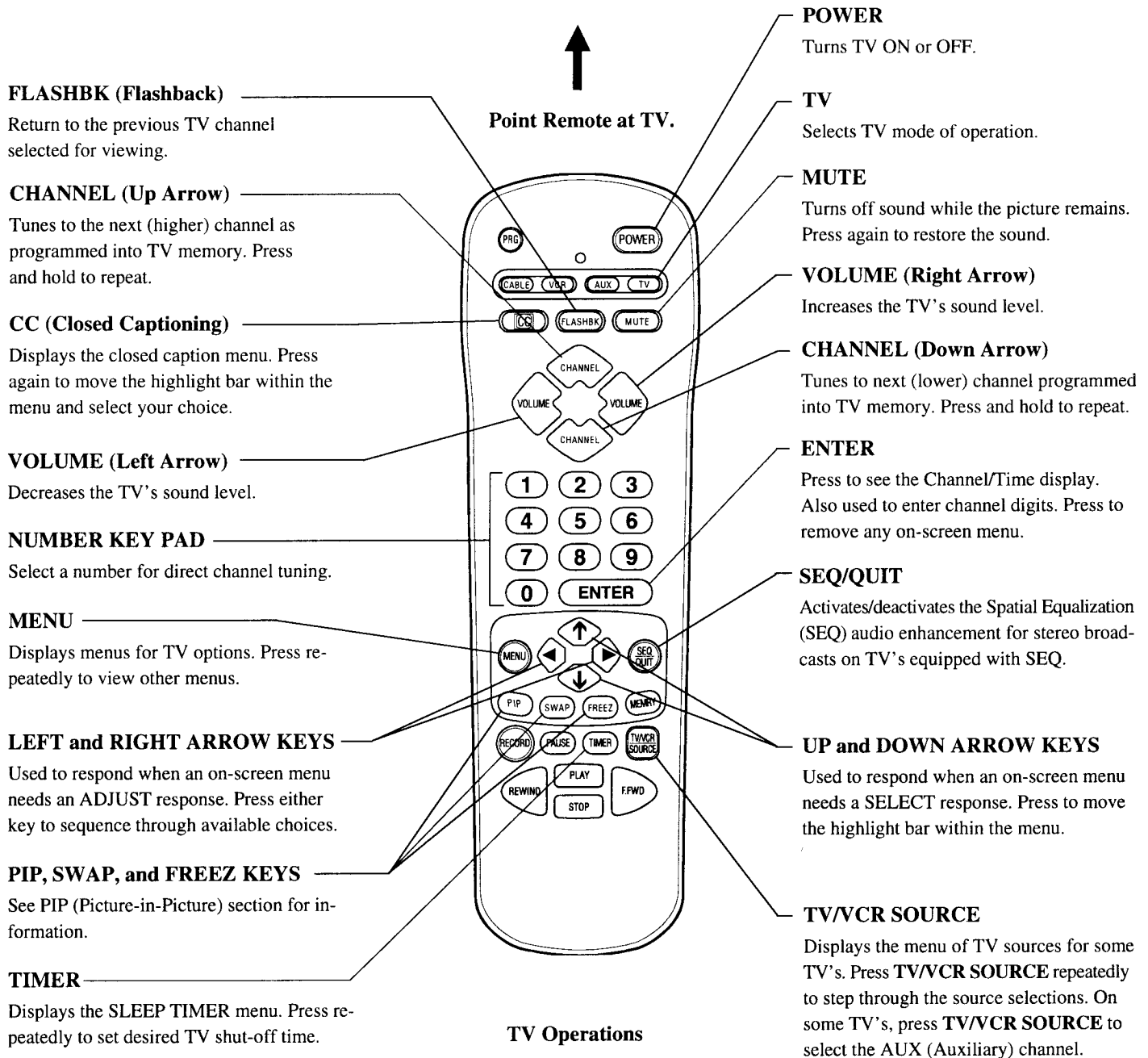
Activates special features on some products.

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REMOTE CONTROL MBR3455

PROGRAMMING YOUR REMOTE

If you are using Zenith products, the remote is programmed for the most commonly used codes. For other brands — or if your remote fails to control your Zenith products — you will have to program the remote.

Follow these steps for each product you are using:

1. Look up the three-digit code for your brand (such as Zenith) and type of equipment (such as VCR) in the code table provided.
2. Press and hold **PRG** with a small blunt object until the indicator lights (about three seconds).
3. Press **TV**, **VCR**, **CABLE**, or **AUX** to select the product you want your remote to control. (Use **CABLE** or **AUX**, to program your remote for a second TV or VCR. Use **AUX**, to program your remote for a video disc player or audio equipment.)

4. Key in the three-digit code for your equipment, then press **ENTER**. The indicator light should flash, then turn off to indicate that the code was accepted. If the indicator stays on, repeat steps 3 and 4 or try using a different code.
5. Write the code that operates your equipment, on the label inside the battery compartment for future reference.

To erase all code programming and return to the factory preset codes, key in code **911** when programming the remote.

NOTES:

- If no key on your remote is pressed within 60 seconds, the programming process stops, and you will have to start again.
- You may cancel programming at any time by pressing **PRG**.

SPECIAL FEATURES

AUX+1, AUX+2 and AUX+3 Capability

Your remote can control up to seven electronic components. If you have programmed the remote for four components using the **TV**, **VCR**, **CABLE** and **AUX** keys, you may also program it for up to three additional components (**AUX+1**, **AUX+2**, **AUX+3**) by **HOLDING** the **AUX** key and pressing the **1**, **2** or **3** key during programming. Once programmed, **HOLD** down the **AUX** key and press **1**, **2** or **3**, to access the additional **AUX +1**, **2** or **3** mode.

Cable/Converter Volume (Code 399)

You may use your remote to control cable/converter volume and muting if available on your equipment. First program your remote with the brand code for your cable device using the **CABLE** or **AUX** key. Then repeat the programming steps, again using the **CABLE** or **AUX** key, **but key in code 399** instead of a brand code.

To restore TV volume/mute to the **CABLE** or **AUX** mode, simply re-enter your cable/converter code number into that mode.

Amplifier Volume Override (Code 499)

You may use your remote to override your TV, VCR or video disk player's volume functions with your amplifier's volume and muting. First, program your remote with the brand code for the component for which you want amplifier volume override, using the key for that product: **TV**, **VCR** or **AUX**. Then, program your remote with the brand code for your amplifier. Finally, repeat the programming steps, using the key for the component you wish to control (**TV**, **VCR**, or **AUX**), **but key in code 499** instead of a brand code.

To restore normal volume and muting control to your TV, VCR or laser disc player, program the remote again for that component.

NOTE:

- CD and tape players will automatically select amplifier volume and mute.

AUTO FIND OPTION

If you have tried all the codes listed for your brand and type of product in the code table, and none of those codes operate your equipment, you can use Auto Find to search for the code you need.

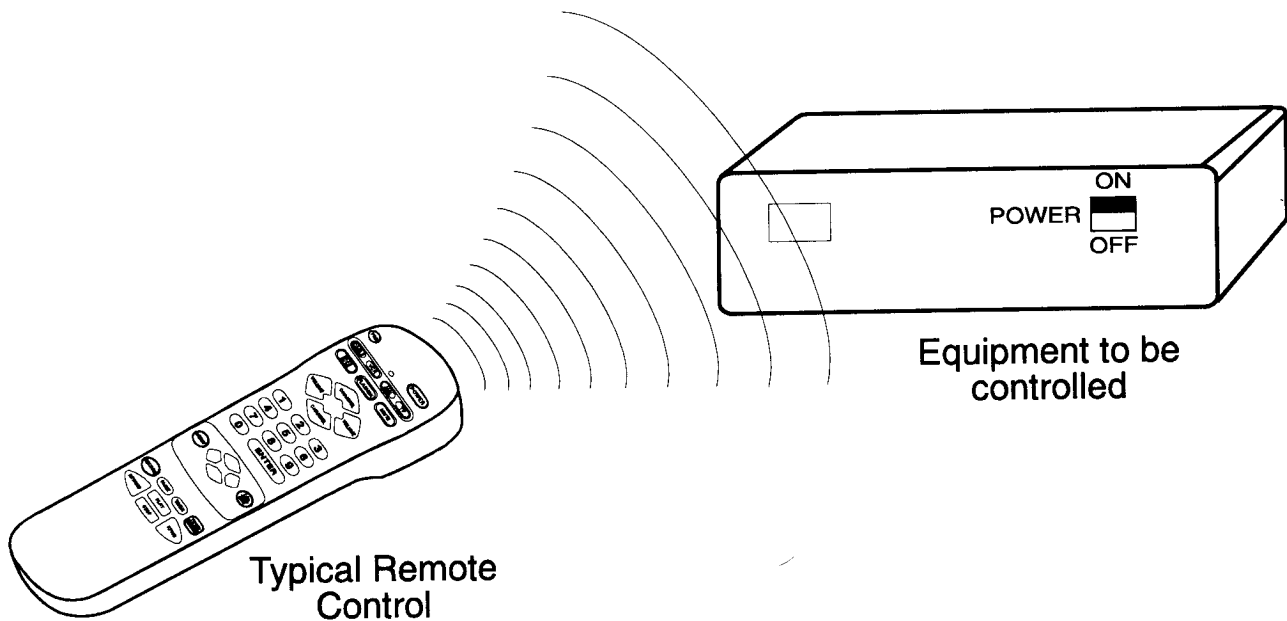
Follow these steps for each product you are using:

1. Turn the product ON and aim the remote toward it.
2. Press and hold **PRG** with a small blunt object until the indicator lights (about three seconds).
3. Press the mode key on the remote for the product you want to control: **TV**, **VCR**, **CABLE**, or **AUX**.
4. Key in "000", then press **ENTER** within two seconds. When the indicator light flashes three times and remains lit, Auto Find is active.

5. Press and hold **POWER**, then release it, repeating this action about once a second until the product turns OFF.
6. Press **ENTER** immediately to save the code. If your remote fails to operate the functions you use most often, you can re-enter Auto Find and search for a better code.

NOTES:

- The indicator light should flash OFF when you press **POWER** and back ON when you release it. If the indicator light stays on when you press **POWER**, Auto Find has tried all available codes. If you finish Auto Find and the product you want to control has not turned off, your remote cannot control that product.
- Pressing **PRG** at any time during the use of Auto Find will cancel Auto Find, and you will have to start again.

USING PARENTAL CONTROL

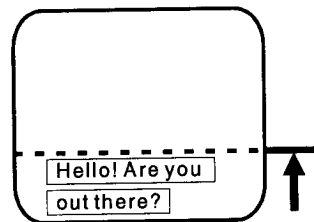

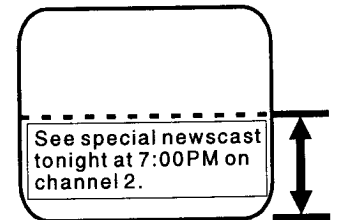
Pressing the CC button on your remote immediately accesses a captions menu that provides the options OFF, CAPTION 1, CAPTION 2, CAPTION 3 and CAPTION 4. Press the CC button repeatedly to choose an option in this menu.

At present, very few TV programs or video tapes offer text captioning for any option other than **CAPTION 1**. Therefore, **CAPTION 1** is the only recommended choice, unless you know that a specific program is providing captioning using one of the other selections.

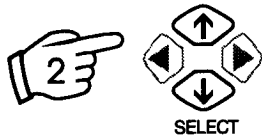

INTRODUCTION

Your TV must be connected to two separate sources in order to view a different picture in the PIP inset from that which is showing in the main picture area of the TV. One source (such as an antenna) must be connected to the ANTENNA/CABLE jack. The other source (such as a VCR) must be connected to the VIDEO 1 jacks.

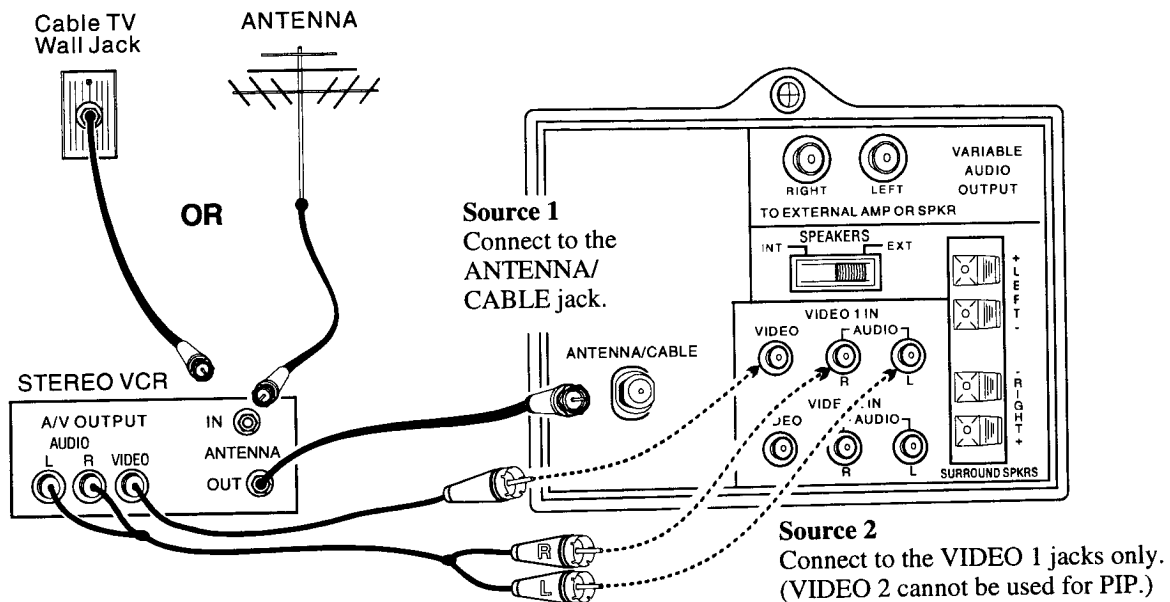
The most common use of PIP is to view two different channels; one from the channel selector of the TV and the other from the channel selector of the VCR. For example, you can view two sporting events or two movies at the same time.

BASIC PICTURE-IN-PICTURE OPERATION

This illustration shows the basic connection of your TV to a stereo VCR. With your equipment setup in this manner, your television has the following PIP capabilities:

- Simultaneously view a video tape playing in the VCR and a channel selected by the TV's tuner.

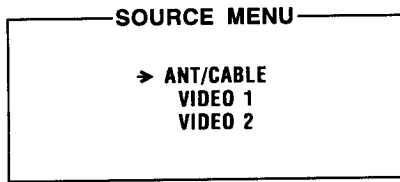

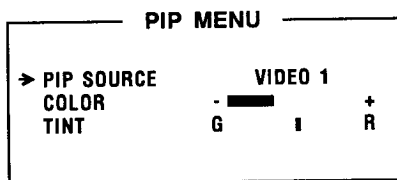

PICTURE-IN-PICTURE FUNCTIONS

PIP

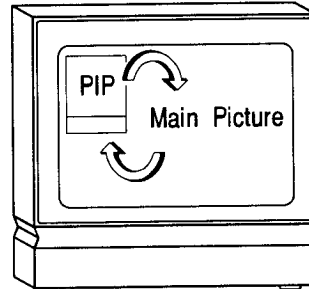
Press the PIP key to display the PIP inset. Press it again to remove the PIP inset.

Moving the PIP Inset Location

Use the Up/Down and Left/Right arrow keys to move the PIP inset to the desired corner of the TV screen.

SWAP

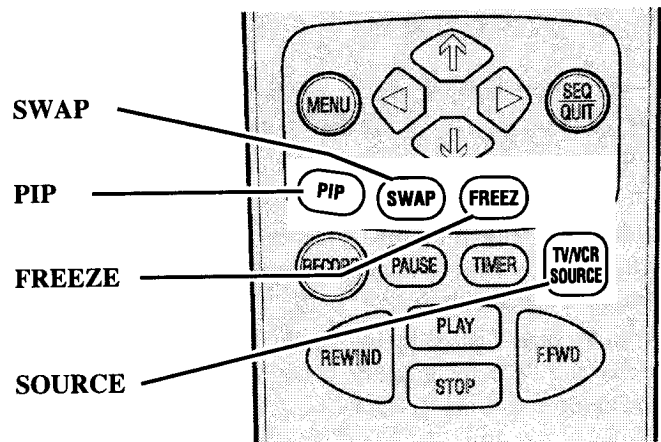
Press SWAP to swap the main picture with the PIP inset. Press SWAP again to return to the original display.



FREEZE

Press FREEZE to freeze motion of the picture shown in the PIP inset. Press FREEZE again to return to a live PIP inset.

When the PIP inset is not currently displayed, pressing FREEZE gives an instant PIP "freeze-frame" of the program you are watching. This function can be used to temporarily retain a phone number or other useful information on the TV. Press PIP to remove the PIP inset and return to normal TV viewing.

MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

CARING FOR YOUR TV

Your TV will look better, have a longer life and perform better if you care for it properly.



First check to see that the TV is off. For added safety, unplug the TV from the power outlet.

NOTE: If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

Cabinet Care

Non-Wood Cabinet or Cabinet Components Moisten a soft cloth with a mild soap solution or Ivory dishwashing detergent. Wipe the surface with a damp cloth. Then rinse the cloth in clean water and wipe the surface again. Allow the TV to air-dry before turning it on.

Wood Cabinets or Cabinet Components Use any good furniture cleaner and polish. Regular care will help preserve the finish.

Picture Glass Cleaning

The picture tube face attracts dust particles and should be cleaned regularly. To clean the face, spray a small amount of glass cleaner on a cleaning cloth and wipe the picture tube glass face until clean. Repeat if necessary.

To delay new dust accumulation, wet a soft cloth in lukewarm water in which a little fabric softener or Ivory dishwashing detergent has been mixed. Wring the cloth almost dry. Wipe the glass face. Make sure no drops of moisture are squeezed onto the glass. Do not wipe the glass dry. Allow the glass to air-dry before you turn the TV on again.

EXTENDED ABSENCE

Before an extended absence (such as a vacation) you may want to unplug the power cord from the electrical wall outlet. This will protect the TV from possible damage from lightning or power line surges. If you have an outdoor antenna, you may also want to disconnect the antenna lead-in wires on the back of the TV.

NOTE: If you unplug your TV, you will have to reset the clock to the current time.

TV PICTURE INTERFERENCE

Your TV picture may be affected by interference caused by one or a number of factors. These include:

Speckled or Streaked Picture Can be caused by nearby automobile ignition, electrical appliances, etc. This is most noticeable in weak signal areas.

Snow in Picture Caused by insufficient signal. Usually caused by the TV being located too far from the TV station or by an improper antenna installation.

Ghosts or Reflections Caused by signals being reflected from surrounding buildings, water tanks, or other high structures.

Radio Signal Police, amateur or CB radio transmitters may cause interference.

These interference problems can often be corrected through the use of a better antenna, signal amplifiers, or various filter devices. See your TV dealer for additional information, and available TV accessories.

MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

BEFORE CALLING FOR SERVICE

Check these items and see if you can correct the trouble by changing the adjustment of a control or the setting of a switch. By making these simple checks before calling for service, you may save time and money.

Problem	Try This
Picture OK. Poor sound.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust AUDIO MENU options. Check for local interference. Is antenna/cable connection loose?
Sound OK. Poor picture.	Re-orient antenna. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Adjust VIDEO MENU options. Trouble with cable-TV system? Is antenna/cable connection loose?
No picture or sound.	Is TV on? Is there power in wall outlet? Is TV plugged in? Is antenna hooked up? Is cable hooked up? Is the channel blocked by the PARENTAL CONTROL? Trouble with cable-TV system? Check auxiliary audio/video equipment. Check channel selection.
Picture blurred or distorted. Ghost in picture.	Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Try another channel — possible station trouble. Check for local interference.
No color, or poor color.	Is it a color program? Check antenna or cable hook up for broken wires. Adjust VIDEO MENU options.
No sound.	VOLUME (VOL) setting may be too low. Check MUTE button operation on remote control.
Cannot select certain channels.	Channels may be skipped in CH. ADD/DEL option of SETUP MENU.
No closed captions	Are captions available? Is CAPTION 1, 2, 3 OR 4 selected using the CAPTION/TEXT option on the SETUP MENU?
Black or blue box covers half of screen.	Is text information available? Is TEXT 1, 2, 3 or 4 selected in the CAPTION/TEXT option of the SETUP MENU.
No picture or sound when VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source is selected.	Is audio/video source hooked up properly? Are all wires connected to VIDEO 1 IN or VIDEO 2 IN jacks on connection center?
No stereo sound or weak stereo sound when using a stereo VCR.	Check AUDIO mode. Was stereo sound present before selecting VIDEO 1 or VIDEO 2 source?
PIP inset frame is black or lacks contrast when selecting VIDEO 1 for PIP inset.	Adjust PIP COLOR AND CONTRAST settings in PIP MENU. Are all wires connected to VIDEO 1 IN jacks on connection center?
PIP inset frame is "snowy" when using ANT/CABLE for PIP and VIDEO 1 for main picture.	Is TV/VCR switch on the VCR in the TV position?
Complete picture loss when using VIDEO 1 for PIP insert source and ANT/CABLE for main picture.	Is TV/VCR switch on the VCR in the TV position?
Remote control does not work.	Are batteries okay? Is TV turned ON? Is TV plugged in?

Always request that your technician use only genuine Zenith exact replacement parts for continued Quality and Safety performance. Keep your Zenith ALL Zenith.

NOTES:

- If your TV fails to respond to the PICTURE PREF. selection, or to any other menu selection, you must reset the TV. Simply disconnect the AC power cord from the power outlet. Wait a few minutes, then plug the TV back into the power outlet. You will have to reset the clock to the current time.
- Unplugging the TV does not deactivate the Parental Control.

YOUR ZENITH WARRANTY

Consumer Protection Plan for Zenith TV

Welcome into the Zenith family! We believe that you will be pleased with your new Zenith Color TV. Please read this Consumer Protection Plan carefully. It is a "LIMITED WARRANTY" as defined under Federal Law. This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights that vary from state to state within the U.S.A.

Zenith's Responsibility

Service Labor — During a period of 90 days from effective warranty date, Zenith will pay for service labor by a Zenith authorized service center when needed as a result of manufacturing defects.

Parts — New or remanufactured replacements for factory-defective parts will be supplied by a Zenith authorized service center for one year from effective warranty date (color picture tube — two years). Such replacement parts are warranted for the remaining portion of the original warranty period.

Home Service — Warranty service for 19" diagonal (U.S.A.) or larger screen size models is provided in the home in most cases. (Some repairs may require the unit to be taken by the servicer to the repair facility and returned, at no additional charge.)

Not Covered — This warranty covers manufacturing defects and does not cover installation, adjustment of customer controls in the home, installation or repair of home antenna systems, cable converters or cable company-supplied equipment; it also does not cover damage due to misuse, abuse, negligence, acts of God or other causes beyond the control of Zenith. Any alteration of the product after manufacture voids this warranty in its entirety.

Owner's Responsibility

Effective Warranty Date — Warranty begins on the date of original consumer installation. For your convenience, keep the dealers dated bill of sale or delivery ticket as evidence of the purchase date.

Operating Guide — Read your Operating Guide carefully so that you will understand the operation of your set and how to adjust the customer controls.

Carry-In Service — Models under 19" diagonal (U.S.A.) screen size must be taken to a Zenith authorized service center for warranty service and must be picked up by the owner.

Antenna — Reception problems caused by inadequate home antennas or faulty antenna connections are the owner's responsibility.

Important: Product Registration — Please fill out and mail your Product Registration Card. It is imperative that Zenith know how to reach you promptly if we should discover a safety problem that could affect you.

Warranty Service — For warranty service information, contact your Zenith dealer preferably, or any Zenith authorized service center. Parts and service labor that are Zenith's responsibility (see above) will be provided without charge. Other service is at the owner's expense.
