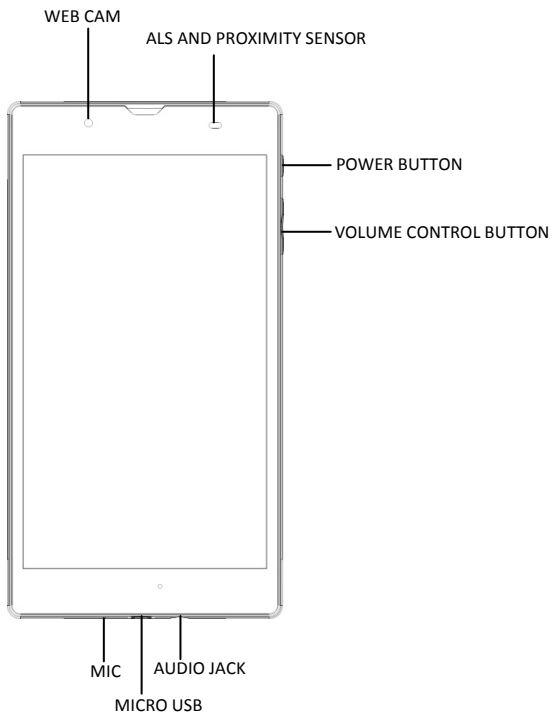
Please do not place the Tablet PC under over cold (below 5°C) or over heat environment (above 35°C), otherwise the Tablet PC may not be normally started and operated.

1.1 Product Overview



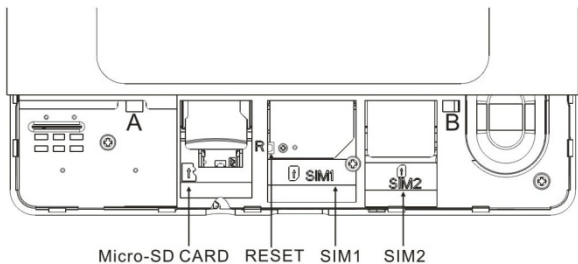
1.2 BACK Overview

➤ **Open cover**



Open cover by slot as picture shows.

➤ **Install cover**



Install the cover in 45 degrees to point A and B as picture shows, press to fasten.

*Please turn off tabletPC , before installation or removal of micro-SD card or SIM card .

➤ **Reset**

Pin and hold the reset button on the side of the device for 3 seconds to start and reset the system.

1.3 Power On and Off

Power on

Press and hold the power button (see Product Overview image) for 2-3 seconds, and the system will begin to boot. While the unit is off and charging, press the power button to see a charging notification.

1.4 Enter and Exit Standby Mode

Enter standby mode

To save power while the unit is on but inactive, tap the power button to enter standby mode.

Exit standby mode

While the unit is in standby mode, tap the power button to resume activity.

1.5 Home Screen

Add application shortcuts: Press and hold an application icon from the Application list and drag the icon to the home screen to add as a shortcut.

• **Remove application shortcuts:** Press and hold an application icon in the homescreen at the top of the screen displays an “X”. Drag the application icon toward the “X” until it turns red, and then release the hold to remove the application shortcut.

1.6 Lock and Unlock Screen

Lock

You may set an idle time frame after which the unit automatically enters standby. The system will sleep and the screen will lock if it is inactive for the set amount of time.




Unlock

Move the  icon to unlock the unit, as shown below.

1.7 Status Bar

The status bar is located at the bottom of the screen and on the upper right corner.



- Back : Tap to return to previous screen.
- Home : Tap to return to home screen.
- History : Tap to view the most-recently accessed applications.

The icons on the right side of status bar display Wi-Fi signal, Wi-Fi connection status, battery power/battery charging status, USB and SD card connection status.

1.8 Text Input

When using the tablet, you may use its virtual keyboard to enter text, numbers and symbols.

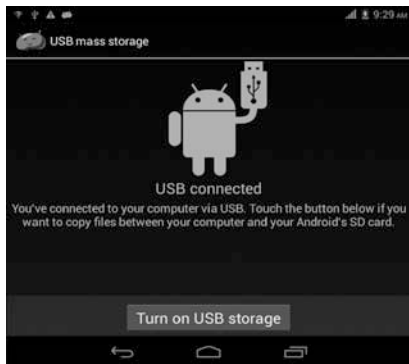

2.1 Wi-Fi and Network

When the **Network notification** option is checked, the system automatically scans


and displays available networks within range. If it is unchecked, you must tap **SCAN** to manually scan for nearby networks and tap **ADD NETWORK** to manually do so.

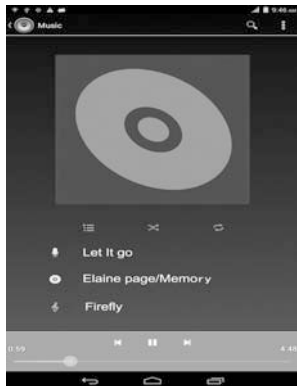
3.4 Music

MonthView: Click on a date, then press and hold to an event to view, edit, or delete it. Press and hold a blank area to add a new event.

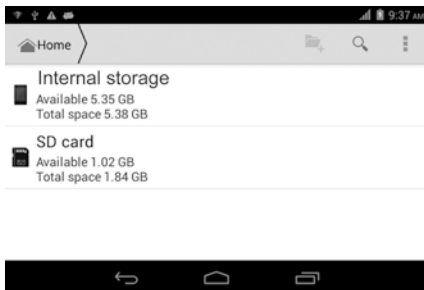
Agenda: Lists all saved events. Click to read details.

From your Application list, click  to view and edit your files. It allows you to manage/edit all your document files within the

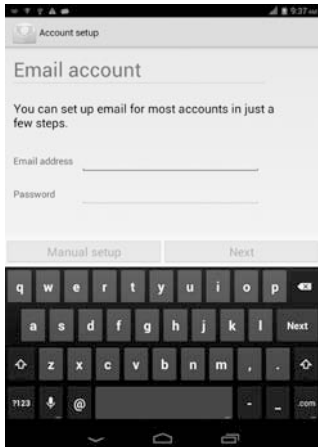

From the inbox, you can click  on the top of the screen to compose an E-mail.

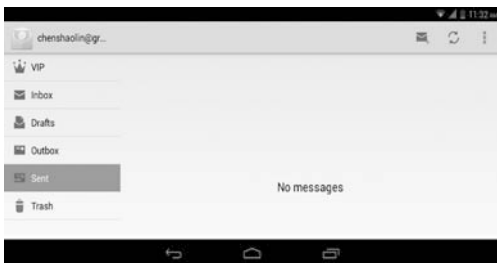
Enter the recipient's E-mail address on the "To" address line, then proceed to fill in the subject and E-mail content.

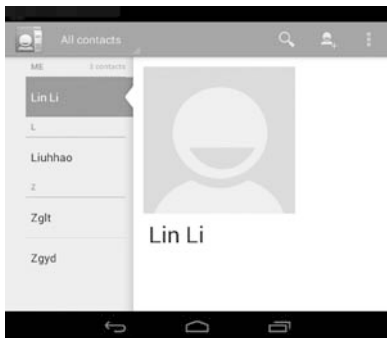

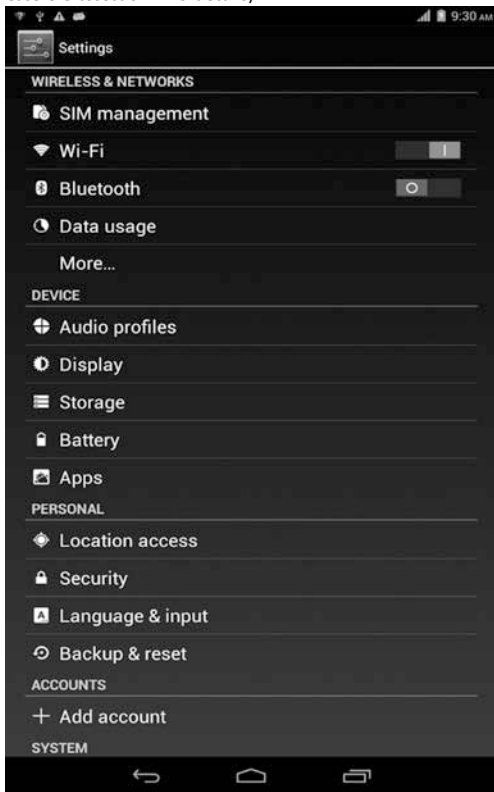

4.2 Sound Settings

In Sound settings, you may adjust the volume of notifications/alarms, choose the default notification ringtone, as well as mute all sounds.

Click , choose  **Audio profiles** and enter setting as below to adjust "Volumes".

4.3 Display Settings

Display settings include: Brightness, Wallpaper, Sleep and Font Size

Brightness

Adjust the brightness of the screen by sliding left or right.

Wallpaper

Change the wallpaper on your home screen by selecting an image from available galleries.

Sleep

Adjust idle time before the screen locks and the tablet enters standby mode.

Font size

Set system font size with four options: Small, Normal, Large, Huge.

4.4 Apps Settings

Application management

The tablet's apps are listed here by category, under **Downloaded**, **Internal storage**, **Running**, and **All**. Click an app to see more details and options, such as **Force Stop**, **Disable**, **Uninstall**, **Clear Data**, and **Clear Cache**.

Running

In this setting, you can force stop some programs that are running on the background to save battery.

4.5 Date & Time Settings

You may select **Automatic Date & Time** while connected to the Internet, or choose to manually input the correct date and time. You may also change the display format.

4.6 Language and Input Settings

Language

Choose the system display language among different options. Select **Spelling Check** to enable the system to correct spelling errors.

Android keyboard

Tap the Settings icon next to “Android keyboard (AOSP)” to configure the Android keyboard settings, such as auto-capitalization, sound, etc.
