Security

- To protect your mobile phone from illegal use, take the security measures as follows:
- Set PIN codes of the SIM card.
- Set handset lock code.
- Set call restrictions.

Safety Precautions

This section includes some important information on safe and efficient operation. Please read this information before using the phone.

Operational Precautions

- Please use your phone properly. When making or receiving a call, please hold your phone as holding a wire telephone. Make sure that the phone is at least one inch (about two point five centimeters) from your body when transmitting.
- Do not touch the antenna when the phone is in use. Touching the antenna area affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than needed.
- Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, such as when watching television or playing video games. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult your doctor before playing video games on your phone or enabling a flashing-light feature on your phone. (The flashing-light feature is not available on all products.)
- Keep the phone out of the reach of small children. The phone may cause injury if used as a toy.
- Driving
- Please pay attention to the traffic safety. Check the laws and regulations on the use of your phone in the area where you drive. Always obey them.
- Medical equipment and hospital

Mobile Phone

Precautions for Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

- Switch off your phone prior to entering any area with potentially explosive atmospheres, such as fueling areas, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Do not remove, install, or charge batteries in such areas. Spark in a potentially explosive atmosphere can cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.
- To avoid possible interference with blasting operations, switch off your phone when you are near electrical blasting caps, in a blasting area, or in areas posted "Turn off electronic devices." Obey all signs and instructions.

Precautions for Electronic Devices

Battery use

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

This model phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government: The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6W/kg. *Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

The highest SAR value for the model phone as reported to the FCC when tested for use at the ear is 1.01 W/kg and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.16 W/kg (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available enhancements and FCC requirements.)

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement.

For body worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets the FCC RF exposure guidelines for use with an accessory that contains no metal and the positions the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other enhancements may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. If you do not use a body-worn accessory and are not holding the phone at the ear, position the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from your body when the phone is switched on.

Starting up

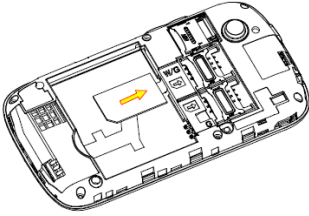
SIM card:

If you sign with the mobile phone carrier, you will get a new SIM card. It is a micro-chip that holds your personal information such as the phone number, contacts, text message and service message of carrier. The above function is valid just in inserting SD card. The mobile phone can only make emergency calls without SIM card inserted.

Memory card: Micro SD card has a great memory, so you can store all kinds of multimedia data, including video, photos, MP3 music files and ring tones .Besides, it is also used to store other files.

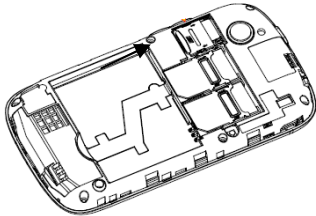
Installing SIM card

1. Make sure that the phone is switched off and the charger is disconnected from the phone
2. Inserting SIM card: Remove the back cover and then insert the SIM card as follows

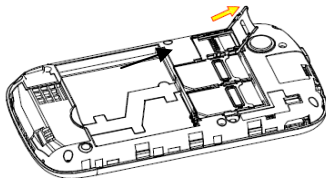


Installing memory card

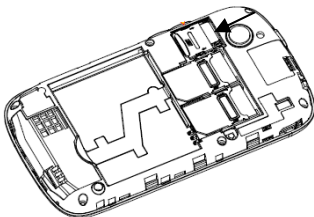
1. You need to push the cover to the top of the phone



2. Open the battery cover. Insert the card with the metal contacts facing down until it clicks to the right position.



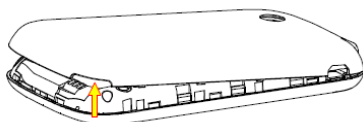

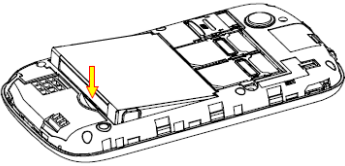

Install the battery

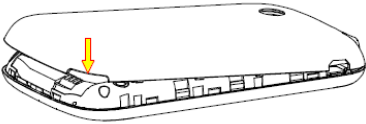
1. Pull the battery cover from the notch on the bottom and remove the cover.



2. Insert the battery by aligning the gold-colored contacts with the contacts in the battery slot.



3. Push down the upper section of the battery until it clicks into place.

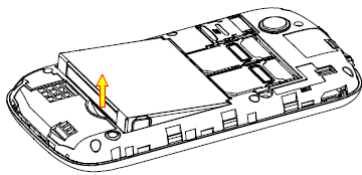
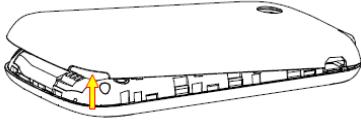


4. Replace the battery cover and close it gently until you hear a click.

Remove the battery

1. Make sure that your mobile phone is switched off.

2. Remove the back cover



3. Pull the battery up and remove it from the mobile phone

Charging the battery

For maximum battery performance, it is recommended that you first use up the battery power and then charge it completely. A new battery's full performance is achieved only after three complete charge and discharge cycles.

You can charge the battery by travel adapter:

1. Connect the adapter to the charger jack as shown in the following illustration



2. Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet. .
3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged. .

Note:

Using USB is another way to charge battery.

It need to connect mobile phone with USB jack of computer.

Charging temperature is between 0°C and 45°C.

Powering your phone on/off

1. Hold Power Key to switch on your phone
2. Please input your PIN or password if it's essential.
3. To switch it off, hold Power Key to get the phone options. Select Power off, and then tap OK

Note: PIN is provided by your operator. The phone will automatically search for the network. It will cost a few seconds

Switch to sleep mode


To save battery power, Sleep Mode suspends your device to a low-power-consumption state while the display is off. Your device also goes into Sleep Mode by itself when the display is automatically turned off after a certain period of time

Press Power Key to switch to Sleep Mode.

Waking up Your Phone

After the phone switches to sleep mode, the display will turn off and be locked. If you need to use the phone now, wake up and unlock screen .

Tap Power Key to activate your screen display

Drag the icon  to the right as follows to unlock screen



NOTE:

If you set an unlock pattern, you'll need to draw the pattern

Touch Control

You can use finger gestures to control your phone.

Tap: Tap the buttons, icons, or applications to select items or to open applications.

Slide: Flick the screen to scroll up, down, left or right

long press : You are able to get the menu by long pressing the icon and add the useful icons to the home screen.

Drag: You can point, drag and drop to move particular items across the screen.

You can view the phone screen in portrait or landscape orientation simply by holding it upright or turning it on its side. Not all screens are viewable in landscape

Calling from a Text Message

3. Tap the message, the phone will list the numbers.

4. Tap the number you want to dial  .


Dialing an emergency numbers

You also can hold an item you want to delete from contact screen until the shortcut menu pops up and Tap “delete contact”

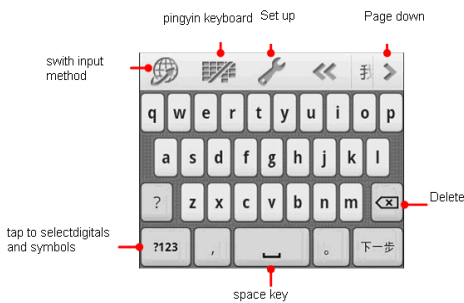

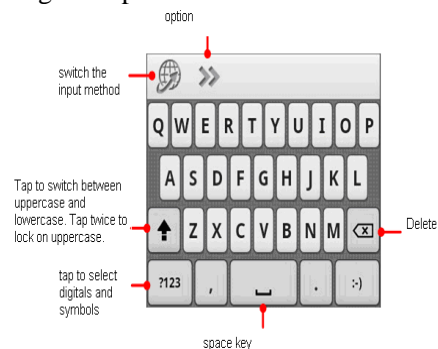

Sending a new multimedia message

1. Tap icon >  writing new message from message screen,
2. Enter the recipient’s number or name. As you type, matching contacts will appear. Tap a suggested contact to add as a recipient.
3. Tap menu key > add subject, write subject and content。

Note:

The SMS will be switched to MMS automatically when insert subject or attachment directly. Likewise if you remove all attachments and the subject from an MMS, it’ll automatically become a text message.

Tap menu key>attachment and insert the picture, video or audio as attachment.

Message Settings

The same contact or number of message will be arranged in one list according to order .You can manage them from the message screen.
