



Getting to Know Your Tablet






Knowing the Keys

Key Func	tion	
Power Key	 Press and hold to turn on or off Airplane mode, enable silent mode, vibration mode or sound, to power off, or to reset the tablet. Press to switch your tablet to Sleep mode. Press to wake up your tablet. 	
Volume Up/ Down	Press or hold to turn the volume up or down.	


Installing the SIM Card, microSD Card, and Battery

Switch off your tablet before installing or replacing the SIM card. The microSD card can be installed and removed while the tablet is turned on. Unmount the microSD card before removing it.

1. Open the cover of the card slot. And hold your SIM card with the metal contacts facing down and slide it in.



Hold your microSD card with the metal contacts facing down and slide it in.



NOTE:

- microSD logo
 Association.
- Please don't remove SIM card and microSD card when your tablet is on.


Charging the Battery

When you first get your new tablet you'll need to charge the battery.

If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen. As you charge your tablet, the screen will tell you the exact battery level each time you wake up your tablet.

WARNING! Use only ZTE-approved chargers and cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your tablet or cause the battery to explode.

 Connect the adapter to the charging jack. Ensure that the adapter is inserted with the correct orientation. Do not force the connector into the charging jack.



- Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet. If the tablet is on, you'll see a charging icon, such as on the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

Powering On/Off

- Press and hold the Power Key to turn on your tablet.
- To turn it off, press and hold the Power Key to open the options menu. Touch Power off and then touch OK.

Locking/Unlocking the Screen and Keys

Your tablet allows you to quickly lock the screen and keys (put the tablet to sleep mode) when not in use and to turn the screen back on and unlock it when you need it.

To lock the screen and keys:

To quickly turn the screen off and lock the keys, press the **Power Key**.

NOTE: To save battery power, the tablet automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages while the tablet screen is off.

- To unlock the screen and keys:
- 1. P ress the Power Key to turn the screen on.
- Touch and hold the icon on the screen.

NOTE: If you have set an unlock pattern, PIN or password for your tablet (see chapter <u>Personalizing – Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Locks</u>), you'll need to draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password to unlock your screen.

Using the Touch Screen

Your tablet's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

Touch

When you want to type using the onscreen keyboard, select items onscreen such as application and settings icons, or press onscreen buttons, simply touch them with your finger.

· Touch and Hold

To open the available options for an item (for example, a message or link in a Web page), touch and hold the item.

· Swipe or Slide

To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

Drag

To drag, press and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to move your finger. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.

Pinch

In some apps (such as Maps, Browser, and Gallery), you can zoom in and out by placing two fingers on the screen at once and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in).


· Rotate the screen

For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the tablet sideways.

Getting to Know the Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your tablet's

applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more. Your home screen extends beyond the initial screen. Swipe the screen left or right to display additional screens.



Extended Home Screens

Your home screen extends beyond the initial screen, providing more space to add icons, widgets, and more. Simply swipe left or right on the screen to see the extended Home Screens.

Personalizing

Changing the System Language

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Language & input > Language.
- 2. Select the language you need.

Setting the Date and Time

- U ncheck Automatic date & time and Automatic time zone if you want to set the date, time and time zone by yourself.
- 3. Set the date, time, time zone, and date/time format.

Changing Notification Sound

You can customize the default ringtone for incoming calls and default notification sound quickly.

- 1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Settings > Sound.
- 2. T ouch Default notification.
- Scroll through the ringtone list and select the ringtone you want to use.
- 4. T ouch OK.

Turning On/Off Touch Sounds

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Sound.
- 2. C heck or uncheck Touch sounds.

Adjusting Volumes

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Sound > Volumes.
- 2. Drag the sliders to adjust the volume for each type of audio.
- 3. T ouch OK to save.

TIP: You can adjust the media volume when a media application is in use by pressing the **Volume Up/Down Key**. If no media application is active, press the **Volume Up/Down Key** to adjust the volume for music, video, games, and other media, the notification volume, and the alarm volume.

Switching to Silent Mode

You can set the tablet to silent mode by using one of the following methods.

- Press and hold the Power Key and then touch to enable silent mode, touch to enable silent mode with vibration, or touch to disable silent mode.
- Keep pressing the Volume Down Key when no media application is active.

Applying New Wallpapers

You can set the wallpaper for the Home Screen or Lock Screen.

- 1. Touch and hold on the home screen.
- Select a wallpaper source from Gallery, Live Wallpapers, or Wallpapers and choose the image or animation you want to use as the wallpaper. Some cropping may be needed for Gallery images.
- T ouch CROP at the top of the screen (for Gallery images) or Set wallpaper.

NOTE: Live Wallpapers are not available for the Lock Screen.

Changing Screen Brightness

- 2. Drag the sliders to adjust the brightness.
- 3. T ouch OK.

Protecting Your Tablet With Screen Locks

You can protect your tablet by creating a screen lock. When enabled, you need to draw a pattern or enter a numeric PIN or password to unlock the tablet's screen and keys.

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Security.
- 2. T ouch Screen lock.

3. T ouch Pattern. PIN or Password.

- If you touch Pattern, you're guided to create a pattern you must draw to unlock the screen. The first time you do this, a short tutorial about creating an unlock pattern appears. Then you're prompted to draw and redraw your own pattern.
- If you touch PIN or Password, you're prompted to set a numeric PIN or a password you must enter to unlock your screen.

The next time you turn on your tablet or wake up the screen, you must draw your unlock pattern or enter your PIN or password to unlock it.

Protecting Your Tablet With Encryption

You can encrypt all the data on your tablet: Google Accounts, application data, music and other media, downloaded information, and so on. If you do, you must enter a numeric PIN or password each time you power on your tablet.

WARNING! Encryption is irreversible. The only way to revert to an unencrypted tablet is to perform a factory data reset, which erases all your data.

Encryption provides additional protection in case your tablet is stolen, and may be required or recommended in some organizations. Consult your system administrator before turning it on. In many cases the PIN or password you set for encryption is controlled by the system administrator.

Before turning on encryption, prepare as follows:

1. Set a lock screen PIN or password.

- C harge the battery.
- 3. Keep the tablet connected to the charger.
- Schedule an hour or more for the encryption process: you
 must not interrupt it or you will lose some or all of your data.

When you're ready to turn on encryption:

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Security > Encrypt
- 2. Read the information about encryption carefully.

The **Encrypt tablet** button is dimmed if your battery's not charged or your tablet's not plugged in.

If you change your mind about encrypting your tablet, touch the **Back Key**.

WARNING! If you interrupt the encryption process, you will lose data.

- 3. T ouch Encrypt tablet.
- 4. Enter your lock screen PIN or password and touch Next.
- 5. T ouch **Encrypt tablet** again.

The encryption process starts and displays its progress. Encryption can take an hour or more, during which time your tablet may restart several times.

When encryption is completed, you're prompted to enter your PIN or password.

Subsequently, you must enter your PIN or password each time you power on your tablet, to decrypt it.

Knowing the Basics

Monitoring the Tablet Status

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides tablet and service status icons on the right side. Below are some of the icons you may see.

Managing Notifications

Notification Icons

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides notification icons on the left. Below are some of the icons you may see.

Open/Close the Notification Panel

Notifications report the arrival of new messages, calendar

events, and alarms, as well as ongoing events, such as when you've configured your tablet as a Wi-Fi hotspot. You can open the notification panel to view the details of notifications.

- To open the notification panel, touch the Status & Notifications area at lower right corner of the screen.
- To close the notification panel, touch

Respond to or Remove a Notification

In the notification panel, you can respond to a notification or remove the notifications.

- To respond to a notification, just touch it.
- · To remove a notification, swipe it left or right.
- To remove all notifications, touch X in the bottom right corner.
- Most apps that send notifications, such as Gmail and Google Talk, have notification settings that you can adjust.

TIP: In the notification panel, touch $\stackrel{4}{=}$ at the top of notifications list to get to the **Settings** menu quickly.

Use Quick Settings

The Quick Settings in the notification panel make it convenient to view or change the most common settings for your tablet.

Open the notification panel and you can find the following Quick Settings on the bottom of the screen.

Airplane mode: Touch to turn on or off flight mode.

- Wi-Fi: Touch to turn on or off Wi-Fi.
- Auto-rotate screen: Touch to turn on or off the Auto-rotate feature.
- Brightness: Touch to adjust the screen brightness.
- Notifications: Touch to turn on or off notifications alert.
- Settings: Touch to configure more options.

Managing Shortcuts and Widgets

Add Shortcuts and Widgets

- T ouch the > .
- T ouch APPS or Widgets to view the available shortcuts of apps and widgets.
- Touch and hold a shortcut or widget and drag it to the Home Screen

Move Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a widget or shortcut on the Home Screen.
- 2. Drag it to the place you need.

Remove Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a widget or shortcut on the Home Screen.
- 2. D rag it to Remove to remove it.

Adjust Widget Size

- 1. Touch and hold a widget on the Home Screen and then release it.
- An outline appears around the widget. Drag the outline to resize the widget.


NOTE: Not all widgets can be resized.

Entering Text

You can enter text using the onscreen keyboard. Some apps open it automatically. In others, you open it by touching where you want to type. You can touch the icon to hide the onscreen keyboard.

Android Keyboard

The Android Keyboard provides a layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. Turn the tablet sideways and the keyboard will change from portrait to landscape. The landscape keyboard is not supported in all applications.



 Touch the alphabetic keys to enter letters. Touch and hold some specific keys to enter associated accented letters. For example, to enter è, touch and hold
 and the available accented letters. Then slide to choose è.

- T ouch to use uppercase. Double-tap to lock uppercase. This key also changes to indicate the current case you are using: for lowercase, for uppercase, and when locked in uppercase.
- T ouch a to delete the text before the cursor.
- T ouch 2123 to select numbers and symbols. You can then touch 211 to find more. Also, often used symbols are displayed above the keyboard.
- T ouch and hold and then swipe to choose the emoticons.
- T ouch **!** to use Google's networked voice input.
- T ouch use Google's networked voice input.

TouchPal Keyboard

TouchPal Keyboard offers three layouts: **Full QWERTY**, **12-Key TabletPad** and **CooTek T+**. You can swipe left or right on the TouchPal keyboard to switch the layout.

You can also use TouchPal CurveTM to speed up text input by replacing the key tapping operation with a tracing gesture where you move your finger from letter to letter without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

- To switch the keyboard layout:
- 1. Touch the > > Settings > Language & input > (TouchPal Keyboard) > Keyboard layout.
- 2. C heck Swipe to switch layout.

- In the TouchPal keyboard screen, touch and clear the TouchPal Curve box, and then touch Close.
- Swipe left or right on the TouchPal keyboard to select the Full QWERTY, 12-Key TabletPad or CooTek T+ layout.

Full QWERTY



- · Touch the alphabetic keys to enter letters.
- T ouch us to change input language.
- T ouch we to enter digits, symbols, emoticons and other pre-defined texts. Touch to go back to enter letters.
- T ouch to start a new line.
- Touch or hold to delete text before the cursor.

- T ouch to access the quick settings of TouchPal keyboard.
- T ouch to set the TouchPal keyboard.
- T ouch to open text editing options. You can select, cut, copy, paste, and delete text, or move the cursor.
- T ouch limit to change the keyboard layout settings.
- T ouch 🗐 to use voice input.
- T ouch to hide the onscreen keyboard. You can touch the text field again to show the keyboard.

12-Key TabletPad



Touch a key repeatedly until the desired letter or symbol appears. If word prediction is enabled (), just touch the keys once and choose the right word.

CooTek T+



Touch to enter the left letter on the key; Double-tap or flick right to enter the right letter/symbol on the key. If word prediction is enabled (), just touch the keys and choose the right word

- To enable and use TouchPal Curve:
- In the TouchPal keyboard screen, touch and check TouchPal Curve, and then touch Close.
- Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

NOTE: TouchPal Curve is only available in the **Full QWERTY** layout.



Tips for using TouchPal Curve:

- Touch when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and touch.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to trace the next word.

Touch Input Settings

Choose the touch input settings by touching the Settings > Language & input from the Home Screen.

In the **KEYBOARD & INPUT METHODS** section, you can set the default input method and choose the settings for input methods.

Editing Text

- Move the insertion point: Touch where you want to type.
 The cursor blinks in the new position, and a tab appears below it. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- Select text: Touch and hold or double-tap within the text.
 The nearest word highlights, with a tab at each end of the

selection. Drag the tabs to change the selection. Touch **SELECT ALL** to select all words.

- Cut or copy: Select the text you want to manipulate. Then touch the Cut or Copy button to cut or copy the text to the clipboard.
- Replace text with the clipboard text: Select the text you want to replace. Then touch or PASTE.



 Insert text from the clipboard: Move cursor to the insertion point and then touch and hold the tab below the cursor.
 Release the finger and touch PASTE.

Opening and Switching apps

Open an App

- 2. Slide left or right on the screen and touch an app to open it.

Switch Between Recently Opened Apps

 2. Touch a thumbnail to open that app.

You can swipe a thumbnail sideways to remove it from the list.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

Connecting to Mobile Networks

Control Mobile Data Use

- To enable or disable data access:
- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > More > Mobile networks
- C heck **Data enabled** to enable data access over the mobile network. Clear the check box to disable data access.
- To get data services when roaming:
- T ouch the > Settings > More > Mobile networks.
- 2. C heck Data roaming.

IMPORTANT: Data roaming may incur significant roaming charges.

Set Access Point Names

To connect to the Internet you can use the default Access Point Names (APN). And if you want to add a new APN, please contact the service provider to get the necessary information.

1. T ouch the > > Settings > More > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.

- 2. T ouch the > New APN.
- Touch each item to enter the information you get from your service provider.
- 4. T ouch the Save to complete.

TIP: To set the APN to default settings, touch the > Reset to default.

Connecting to Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that can provide Internet access at distances of up to 100 meters, depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings.

Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

- 2. S lide the Wi-Fi switch to the ON position to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Touch a network name to connect to it.
- If the network is secured, enter the password and touch Connect.

NOTE: Your tablet automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when they are in range.

Get Notified of Open Networks

- 2. S lide the Wi-Fi switch to the ON position.

- 3. T ouch the > Advanced.
- 4 C heck Network notification

When Wi-Fi is on, you receive notifications in the Status bar when your tablet detects an open Wi-Fi network. Uncheck the option to turn off notifications.

Add a Wi-Fi Network

You can add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID), or to add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secured network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

- 1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. S lide the Wi-Fi switch to the ON position.
- 3. T ouch + icon.
- Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
- 5. T ouch Save.

Forget a Wi-Fi Network

You can make your tablet forget about the details of a Wi-Fi network that you added - for example, if you don't want the tablet to connect to it automatically or if it is a network that you no longer use.

- 1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. S lide the Wi-Fi switch to the ON position.

3. Touch the Wi-Fi network name and then touch Forget.

Adjusting Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

- 2. T ouch the **I** > **Advanced** to adjust the following settings.
 - Network notification: Get notifications in the status bar when Wi-Fi is on and an open network is available.
 - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Set whether to keep Wi-Fi on in sleep mode.
 - Avoid no Internet connections: Only use Wi-Fi network when the Internet connection is good.
 - MAC address: Check the MAC address.
 - IP address: Check the tablet's IP address.

Connecting to Bluetooth Devices

Bluetooth[®] is a short-range wireless communication technology. Tablets or other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information wirelessly within a distance of about 10 meters. The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Turn Bluetooth On/Off

- 2. S lide the Bluetooth switch to the ON or OFF position.

When Bluetooth is on, the licon will appear in the status bar.

Change the Device Name

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Bluetooth.
- S lide the **Bluetooth** switch to the **ON** position if Bluetooth is off.
- 3. T ouch the > Rename tablet.
- Edit the name and touch Rename.

Pair With Another Bluetooth Device

- S lide the Bluetooth switch to the ON position if Bluetooth is off.

Your tablet automatically scans for and displays the IDs of all available Bluetooth devices in range. You could touch **SEARCH FOR DEVICES** if you want to scan again.

- 3. Touch the device you want to pair with.
- Confirm that the Bluetooth passkeys are the same between the two devices and touch Pair. Alternately, enter a Bluetooth passkey and touch Pair.

Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered.

NOTE: The Bluetooth passkey may be fixed for certain devices, such as headsets and hands free car kit. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys), or refer to the documents for that device.

Send Data via Bluetooth

- 1. Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- Select the option for sharing via Bluetooth. The method may vary by application and data type.
- Touch a Bluetooth device the tablet has paired with or wait for it to search for new devices and touch one of them.

Receive Data via Bluetooth

- 1. Turn Bluetooth on before trying to receive data via Bluetooth.
- 2. Flick down the status bar and touch 🗱
- 3. T ouch Accept to start receiving the data.

Received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (*Bluetooth*, for instance). You can access them with the **File Manager** app. Received contacts (vCard files) are automatically imported to your contact list.

Connecting to Your Computer via USB

You can connect your tablet to a computer with a USB cable and transfer music, pictures, and other files in both directions. Your tablet stores these files in internal storage or on a removable microSD card.

If you are using USB tethering, you must turn that off before you can use USB to transfer files between your tablet and computer.

Connect Your Tablet to a Computer via USB

1. Connect your tablet to the PC with a USB cable.

- Open the Notification panel and touch Connected to PC software.
- 3. Choose one of the following options:
 - Media device (MTP): Transfer media files on Windows, or using Android File Transfer on Mac.
 - Camera (PTP): Transfer photos using camera software, and transfer any files on the computers that don't support MTP.

Connect With Windows Media Player

You can sync music on your tablet and the computer installed with Windows Media Player.

- Connect the tablet with your computer via USB and choose Media device (MTP).
- 2. Open Windows Media Player and synchronize music files.

Disconnect Your Tablet From the Computer

To disconnect the tablet from the computer, simply unplug the USB cable when you're finished.

Remove the microSD Card From Your Tablet

If you need to remove the microSD card while the tablet is on, you should unmount it first.

- 1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Settings > Storage.
- 2. Scroll down and touch Unmount SD card > OK.
- 3. T he 📕 icon appears in the status bar and you can now

safely remove the microSD card from the tablet.

Erase microSD Card

- Scroll down the screen and touch Erase SD card > Erase SD card > Erase everything.

CAUTION! The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSD card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

Connecting to Virtual Private Networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network.

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

Add a VPN

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > More > VPN.
- T ouch Add VPN profile and fill in the information provided by your network administrator.
- 3. T ouch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen.

Connect to a VPN

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Touch the VPN that you want to connect to.
- 3. When prompted, enter any requested credentials, and then touch **Connect**.

When you are connected, the VPN connected icon appears in the Status bar.

Modify a VPN

- 1. T ouch the > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Touch and hold the VPN that you want to modify.
- 3. T ouch Edit network and edit the VPN settings you want.
- 4. T ouch Save.

Delete a VPN

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > More > VPN.
- Touch and hold the VPN that you want to delete.
- 3. T ouch Delete network.

People

You can add contacts on your tablet and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

To see your contacts, touch the > People. From there, you can touch on the left top of the screen to select the contact groups or favorite contacts.

Checking Contact Details

- T ouch the > People and touch to select the all contacts to access your contact list.
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- Touch a contact to view its details which will display on the right side of the screen.

TIP: If you have a lot of contacts stored, you'll see a slider when you touch the left side of the screen. To go directly to a letter, touch

and hold the slider and drag it to a letter.

Adding a New Contact

- 1. T ouch the > People and touch to select the all contacts to access your contact list.
- 2. T ouch to add a new contact.
- Touch the account field near the top of the screen to choose where to save the contact. If a sync account is selected, the contacts will be synced automatically with your account online.
- Enter the contact name, tablet numbers, email addresses, and other information.
- T ouch **DONE** to save the contact.

Setting Up Your Own Profile

You can create your own name card in your tablet.

1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > People and touch \checkmark to select the

all contacts to access your contact list.

- T ouch Set up my profile or your name, whichever is at the top of the contact list.
- 3. Edit your profile information and touch DONE.

Importing, Exporting, and Sharing Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to your SIM or microSD card. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share your contacts using Bluetooth, Email or Messages, etc.

Import Contacts From the SIM Card

- 1. T ouch the \triangle > \bigcirc > People.
- 2. T ouch the > Import/export > Manage SIM card contacts.
- 3. Touch and hold the contacts you need and then touch Import.

or you can touch > Import All to import all SIM card contacts to the tablet

Import Contacts From the microSD Card

- 1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > People.
- 2. T ouch the > Import/export > Import from storage.
- 3 Select an account in which to save the contacts.
- 4. Select the vCard file(s) in the microSD card and touch **OK**.

Export Contacts to the SIM Card

- 1 T ouch the > People
- 2. T ouch the > Import/export > Export to SIM card.
- 3. All the contacts in your tablet will be exported to the SIM card automatically and then touch OK.

Export Contacts to the microSD Card

1. T ouch the \bigcirc > \bigcirc > People.

- 2. T ouch the > Import/export > Export to storage.
- The tablet will prompt you with the name of the vCard file.Touch **OK** to create the file on the microSD card.

Share Contacts

- T ouch the > People and touch to select the all contacts to access your contact list.
- 2. Touch the contact you want share and then touch the >
- 3. Choose to share the contacts via Bluetooth. Email. or Gmail.

Working With Favorite Contacts

Add a Contact to Favorites

You can add the contacts used frequently to Favorites, so you can find them quickly.

1. T ouch the > People and touch do select the

all contacts to access your contact list.

2 Touch a contact and then touch * next to the contact name

Remove a Contact From Favorites

- 1. T ouch the > People and touch to select the favorites contacts to access the favorites contact list.
- Double Touch a favorite contact and then touch next to the contact name.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. T ouch the > > People.
- 2. T ouch at the bottom of the screen
- Input the contact name you want to search for. The contacts matched will be listed.

Editing Contacts

Edit Contact Details

- 1. T ouch the > People.
- 2. Touch a contact you need to edit and then touch the 🖊 icon.
- 3. Edit the contact and touch DONE.

Delete a Contact

- 1. T ouch the > People.
- 2. Touch a contact you want to delete and touch the > Delete.
- 3. T ouch OK to confirm.

Accounts

Adding or Removing Accounts

You can add multiple Google Accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync accounts. You may also add other kinds of accounts, depending on the apps installed on your tablet.

Add an Account

- From the Home Screen, touch the > Settings > Add account.
- 2. Touch the type of account you want to add.
- Follow the onscreen steps to enter the information about the
 account. Most accounts require a username and password,
 but the details may vary. You may also need to obtain some
 information from IT support or your system administrator.

Remove an Account

Removing an account will delete it and all information associated

with it from your tablet, such as emails and contacts.

- From the Home Screen, touch the > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. T ouch the account.
- 3. T ouch the > Remove account > Remove account.

Configuring Account Sync

Configure Auto Sync Setting

1. O pen the Accounts settings screen.

Your accounts and sync status are displayed. The \mathcal{S} ic on turns green if automatic sync is enabled for some or all of the account's data, and gray if automatic sync is disabled.

- T ouch Gmail sync is OFF / Gmail sync is ON to turn on or off automatic sync in the accounts settings screen.
 - ▶ When automatic sync is turned on, changes you make to

- information on your tablet or on the web are automatically synced with each other.
- When auto sync is turned off, you need to sync manually to collect emails, updates, or other recent information.

Sync Manually

- O pen the Accounts settings screen.
- 2. Touch the account whose data you want to sync.
- 3. T ouch the > Sync now.

Change an Account's Sync Settings

- 1. O pen the Accounts & sync settings screen.
- Touch the account whose sync settings you want to change.The Sync settings screen appears, showing a list of information the account can sync.
- 3. Check or uncheck items as you need. Checked types of

information on the tablet and the web will be kept in sync when auto-sync is turned on.

Email

Touch in the Home Screen and select Email. Use it to read and send emails from services other than Gmail

Set Up the First Email Account

- When you open Email for the first time, enter your email address and password.
- T ouch **Next** to let the tablet retrieve the network parameters automatically.

NOTE: You can also enter these details manually by touching **Manual setup** or when automatic setup fails.

3. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish the setup.

Your tablet will show the inbox of the email account and start to download email messages.

Checking Your Emails

Your tablet can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

You can also check new emails manually by touching \Im in any of the email account's boxes. Touch **Load more messages** at the bottom of the email list to download earlier messages.

Responding to an Email

You can reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

Reply to or Forward an Email

- 1. Open the email you want to reply to or forward from Inbox.
- 2. T ouch in the message header to reply to the sender.
- 3. Edit your message and touch .

Mark an Email as Unread

You can return a read email to the unread state—for example, to remind yourself to read it again later. You can also mark a batch of emails as unread

- While reading a message, touch the > Mark as unread.
- While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), touch the checkboxes before the messages and then touch

Delete an Email

You can delete an email from its folder. You can also delete a batch of emails.

- While reading a message, touch \$\bigle{\mathbb{m}}\$ > OK.
- While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), touch the checkboxes in front of the messages and then touch => OK.

Writing and Sending an Email

Open your email Inbox and touch

NOTE: If you have more than one email account added on the tablet, touch the sender line to select the account you want to use for sending the message.

- Enter a contact name or email address in the 'To' field.
 Separate each recipient with a comma. You can also touch
 to select recipients from your contacts.
- 3. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- T ouch to add audio files, images, videos and other types
 of files as attachments
- 5. T ouch at the top right of the screen to send the message.

Adding Signature to Your Emails

You can set a few lines of plain text as signature for every outgoing email message from an account, such as your name and contact information.

- 1. O pen the Email app.
- 2. T ouch the **Settings** and select the account you want to add signature to.
- 3. T ouch Signature and enter the text.
- 4. T ouch OK.

Adding and Editing Email Accounts

Add an Email Account

After setting up your first email account (see <u>Email – Set Up the</u> <u>First Email Account</u>), you can add more email accounts and manage them separately.

- 1. O pen Email to get the Inbox screen.
- T ouch the Settings and touch ADD ACCOUNT at the top right of the screen.

3. Set up the account as you would with the first one.

Edit an Email Account

You can change a number of settings for an account, including how often you check for email, how you're notified of new mails, and details about the servers the account uses to send and receive mails.

- 1. O pen Email to get the Inbox screen.
- T ouch the > Settings and touch the account whose settings you want to change.
- Make the changes you want and touch the Back Key when you're finished.

Remove an Email Account

- 1. O pen Email to get the Inbox screen.
- 2. T ouch the **Settings** and touch the account you want to remove.
- 3. T ouch Remove account > OK.

Changing General Email Settings

General settings apply to all email accounts you add.

- 1. O pen Email to get the Inbox screen.
- 2. T ouch the > Account settings > General.
- Make the changes you want and touch the Back Key when you're finished.

Gm<u>ail[™]</u>

After you sign in to your Google account on the tablet, you can send and retrieve Gmail messages with the **Gmail** app.

NOTE: This feature may not be available in certain regions or with certain service providers.

Opening Your Gmail Inbox

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Gmail**. The Inbox screen appears.

If you haven't signed in, you will be prompted to do so or create a new account.

Touch \subseteq at the bottom right of the screen to refresh your Inbox and download new messages.

Switching Accounts

Gmail displays conversations, messages, and settings from one

Google account at a time. If you have signed in to more than one Google account on your tablet, you can switch accounts and view information in each account.

- From your Inbox, touch the current account at the top of the screen.
- From the drop-down menu, touch the account you want to see.The account's Inbox will open.

Writing and Sending a Message

- Open your Gmail Inbox and switch to the account you want to use for sending the message.
- 2. T ouch 4.
- Enter a contact name or email address in the 'To' field.Separate each recipient with a comma.
- 4. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- 5. To attach an image, touch the 4 and select a file from the

image gallery.

6. T ouch at the top right of the screen to send the message.

Adding Signature to Your Gmail Messages

You can set a few lines of plain text as signature for every outgoing Gmail message. The signature you set on the tablet is independent of the signature you use for Gmail on the web.

- 1. O pen the Gmail app.
- T ouch the > Settings and select the account you want to add signature to.
- 3. T ouch Signature and enter the text.
- 4. T ouch OK.

Replying to or Forwarding a Message

 Open the Gmail message you want to reply to or forward to another person.

- 2. T ouch sin the message header to reply to the sender
- 3. Edit your message and touch the send icon .



Working With Received Attachments

When a message has an attachment, Gmail displays information about that attachment at the top of the message.

Depending on the attachment type, the applications installed on your tablet as well as your settings, you may preview, view, play. save the attachment, or check information about the attachment.

TIP: For documents with multiple pages, touching the Preview option will only download the pages you view, while touching View. Play, or Save will download the entire file and cost more time and data

Searching for Messages

You can search for messages using words that appear in addresses, subjects, labels, or contents.

NOTE: If you search while the tablet doesn't have an active Internet connection, only messages synchronized onto your tablet can be searched.

- 1. O pen the **Gmail** app and touch Q.
- Enter the words to search for and touch the on the screen keyboard.

As you type, suggestions may appear below the search field. You can touch a suggestion to search for it right away, or touch the arrow next to it to add its text to the search field.

In the search results, touch the message you need and work with it just as you would with any Gmail message.

Working With Labels

Message labels include both labels you create and default labels such as **Sent**, **Starred**, and **Outbox**. You can organize your emails by labeling them or adding stars to them. Labels also help

you sort your messages, just like folders.

- To label or change labels:
- O pen the Gmail app and touch in the message list the checkboxes before the messages you want to label.



- 2. Touch the label icon at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Check or uncheck labels in the new screen and touch **OK**.
- To add stars to messages:
- O pen the Gmail app and touch in the message list the checkboxes before the messages you want to star.
- 2. At the bottom of the screen, touch > Add star.
- To view messages by label:
- 1. O pen the **Gmail** app and touch the label icon at the

bottom of the message list without checking any message.

2. Touch the label to view messages with that label.

TIP: You can also touch the name of your account at the top of the screen. Then touch one of the labels listed in the **RECENT** section, below account names.

Changing Gmail Settings

Touch the Settings in any Gmail screen to change General settings, which apply to all Gmail accounts, or other settings that only apply to specific accounts.

Messaging

You can only use Messaging to exchange multimedia messages (MMS).

Opening the Messaging Screen

Touch in the Home Screen and select Messaging.

The **Messaging** screen opens, where you can create a new message, search for messages, or open an ongoing message thread.

- Touch sto write a new multimedia message.
- Touch to search for a message using keywords.
- Touch an existing message thread to open the conversation you've had with a certain number.

Sending a Multimedia Message

1. O n the **Messages** screen, touch = at the bottom.

- Enter the recipient and the text of the message, as you do when sending a text message. You can also include email addresses as recipients.
- 3. Touch the paper clip icon \infty to attach a file to the message.
- 4. T ouch .

Replying to a Message

Messages you receive are appended to existing threads of the same number. If the new message comes from a new number, a new thread is created.

- O n the Messages screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to reply to.
- Type your reply in the text box at the bottom. You can touch the attach icon if you want to reply with an MMS.
- 3. T ouch >.

Forwarding a Message

- O n the Messages screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to forward.
- 2. Touch and hold the message.
- 3. T ouch **Forward** in the menu that opens.
- Enter a recipient for the message and edit the content if you want.
- 5. T ouch >.

Viewing Details About a Message

- Touch and hold a message in a thread.
- T ouch View details to see information about the message, such as message type, sender, recipient, or date.

Deleting Messages or Threads

To delete messages in a thread:

- 1. O n the Messaging screen, touch a thread.
- 2. Touch and hold the message and then touch Delete.
- 3. T ouch Delete to confirm.
- To delete message threads:
- O n the Messages screen, touch and hold one thread you want to delete.
- If there are more threads you want to delete, touch them one by one.
- 3. T ouch at the right top.
- 4. T ouch **Delete** to confirm.

Changing Message Settings

Touch the > **Settings** in the Messages screen to change Messages settings.

Calendar

Calendar on the tablet works with the web-based Google
Calendar service for creating and managing events, meetings,
and appointments. It also works with the Microsoft Exchange
ActiveSync calendar once you sign into your Exchange account
on the tablet.

To open Calendar, touch in the Home Screen and select Calendar.

Viewing Your Calendars and Events Change Calendar Views

You can view your calendars in different forms. The app offers four views: Month, Week, Day, and Agenda.

To change calendar views, touch DAY, WEEK, MONTH, or AGENDA at the top left to select the view you prefer.

- In Month view, swipe vertically to see earlier months and later months.
- In Week or Day view, swipe horizontally to see earlier

weeks/days and later weeks/days.

- When you are viewing earlier or later days, weeks, or months, touch TODAY at the top to quickly switch to today.
- When you are in Day or Week view, touch a date in the monthly calendar on the right to jump to that day or week.

View Event Details

In Agenda, Day, or Week view, touch an event to view its details. In Month view, touch a day to switch to Day, Week, or Agenda view. Then touch an event to view its details.

Creating an Event

- In any Calendar view, touch to open an event details screen for a new event.
 - You can also touch a spot in Day or Week view twice to add an event to that time spot.
- 2. Add details about the event.
 - Enter a name, location, time span, and other additional details about the event.

NOTE: If you have more than one calendar, you can choose the calendar to which to add the event by touching the current calendar above the **Event name** box.

3. T ouch **DONE** at the top of the screen to save the new event.

Editing or Deleting an Event

- Find the event you want to edit or delete.
- Open its details screen (see <u>Viewing Your Calendars and Events View Event Details</u> in this chapter).
- 3. Do one of the following as you need.

To	do
	touch . Touch DONE to save your changes.
Delete the event,	touch 👚 > OK.

Changing Calendar Settings

To change Calendar settings, open a Calendar view (Day, Week, Month, or Agenda). Then touch > Settings.

You can change **General settings**, which apply to all accounts, or other settings that only apply to specific accounts.

Google Talk

Google Talk is Google's instant messaging service. You can use it to communicate in real time with other people who also use Google Talk, on a mobile device, on the web, or with a desktop application.

Signing into See Your Friends

You must sign in to your Google Account before you can use Google Talk.

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Talk**. The first time you launch **Talk**, touch the account you want to sign in with. Your friends list is then displayed.

NOTE: You remain signed in to Google Talk after launching the Talk app even if you switch to other apps, until you explicitly sign out. To sign out, go back to your friends list and touch \$\frac{1}{2} > Sign out.

Adding a Friend

In the friends list, touch at the top right of the screen.

2. Enter your friend's address and touch DONE.

Your friend's address in Google Talk is a Gmail or other email address that is configured to connect to Google Talk.

NOTE: If other people try to add you as a friend, you will receive a notification in the status bar and the invitation appears in your friends list. You can touch the invitation to **Accept**, **Decline**, or **Block**.

Changing Your Online Status

- 1. Touch your own entry at the top of your friends list.
- In the screen that opens, touch your current status to change it (or to sign out of Talk).
- Enter a status message or if you already have one, edit it.
 In addition to the standard status settings, you can also touch Change to a recently-used status to select a message that you've entered previously.

Chatting With Friends

- Touch a friend in your friends list. The chat screen for that friend opens.
- Type in a message and touch . You can also touch or
 to initiate a video chat or voice chat if the friend is online.

Switch Between Active Chats

If you have more than one chat going, you can switch between these chats.

Just touch a friend in the friends list to switch to the session with that friend.

Use Group Chat

When you're chatting, you can invite additional friends to join a group chat.

- 1. On a chat screen, touch > Add to chat.
- 2. Touch the name of the friend to invite.

The friend you invited and the current participants receive an invitation to a group chat. Each one who accepts the invitation joins the group chat. In a group chat, everyone can see everyone else's messages. Group chats appear at the top of your friends list, with a group chat icon.

End the Chat

While on a chat screen, touch > End chat.

You can also touch > End all chats to end all active chats.

Changing Google Talk Settings

Touch Settings to change Google Talk settings for your account.

Google+

Google+ is a social networking service offered by Google. The Google+ application on your tablet enables you to manage your data, chat with online contacts, organize them in different circles, and share your selected information.

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Google+**. The first time you open the Google+ app, select the instant upload and contact sync options.

Organizing Your Contacts

- 5. O pen the Google+ app.
- 6. T ouch W > All Circles.
- Enter the person you want to search for or select a suggested person, and touch Add.
- 8. Check the circles you want the person to be added to,or touch **Create a new circle**.

Getting Updates

- 1. O pen the Google+ app.
- 2. T ouch Phome.
- 3. Swipe up or down in portrait mode, or horizontally in landscape

mode, to see different information shared with you by other users. Touch do to choose what groups of information are shown

- Nearby shows posts shared with you by users near your current location.
- All circles, Acquaintances, Family, Following, and Friends show updates from people you've added to your circles.
- ▶ What's hot shows popular posts on Google+.

Chatting With Contacts

You can chat with your Google+ contacts through instant messaging, similar to sending a text with the Messages app.

- T ouch Messenger in the Google+ app or touch from the Home Screen Messenger.
- 10. Touch to create a new message.
- 11. If you touched at the top, touch to add recipients.
 They can be contacts or circles.
- 12. Enter the message.

13. Touch to send the message.

TIP: Touch Hangouts to hold a video chat with your friends.

Checking Photos

You can see your own photo albums and those shared by other users.

Touch Some > My photos in the Google+ app to see all available albums

Checking and Managing Your Profile

- 14. Touch Profile in the Google+ app.
- 15. Swipe up or down to see your posts and personal info.

Touch on and you can change your profile photo.

Browser

Use Browser to view web pages and search for information.

Opening the Browser

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Browser** to start this function. The last web page you were viewing is displayed. If you have not used **Browser** recently, your home page opens.

Browser also opens when you touch a web link - for example, in an email or a text message.

Open a Web Page or Search the Web

- 1. O pen the Browser app.
- Touch the address box at the top of the web page. If the address box isn't visible, swipe down a little to show it.
- Enter the address (URL) of a web page. Or, enter terms you
 want to search for. You can also touch to search by voice.

Touch a URL or search suggestion or touch Go on the keyboard to open the web page or search results.

TIP: Touch the **X** to the left of the address box if you want to stop opening the page.

Set the Homepage

Your home page opens when you open a new browser tab, and when you start **Browser** after restarting your tablet or after not using the app for a while.

- 1. Open the page you want to set as your home page.
- 2. T ouch the > Settings > General > Set homepage.
- 3. T ouch **Current page** or one of the following options.
 - Blank page: Open browser tab without opening a web page by default. This can make new Browser tabs open more quickly.
 - Default page: Set the factory default URL as the

homepage.

- Most visited sites: Every new browser tab displays a list of your frequently visited sites for you to choose from.
- Other: Type a URL as the homepage.

Get Information About the Current Page

Touch the page icon, to the left of the address box.

Working With an Opened Page

While viewing most web pages, you can do the following operation.

- Scroll: Swipe the screen in any direction.
- Zoom out: Touch the screen with two fingers and pinch them together.
- Zoom in: Touch the screen with two fingers and spread them apart.

- Go back: Touch the to return to the page you've viewed previously in the same window.
- Go forward: Touch the icon.
- Refresh the page: Touch the C.
- Find text on the page: Touch the > Find on page and type the terms you want to search for.
- Send the page URL to friends: Touch the > Share page and select how you want to send the URL.
- · Follow a link: Touch a link on the web page to open it.
- Save the page for offline reading: Touch the > Save for offline reading. You can touch the > SAVED PAGES to read them.

TIPS:

Besides links, **Browser** also recognizes some tablet numbers, addresses, and similar information for you to act on. Try touching them and see what happens.

Using Multiple Browser Tabs

You can open several web pages at the same time (one page in each tab) and switch between them freely.

- To open a new browser tab:
- 1. Touch the tabs icon + on the top of the address box.
- 2. A new browser window opens and the homepage is loaded.
- To switch between tabs:
- 1. Touch the tabs name on the top of the address box.
- 2. T ouch its X to close the tab.
- To use incognito tab for privacy browsing:

Pages you view in incognito tabs won't appear in your browsing history or search history. No trace will be left on your tablet once you close the tab.

Touch the > New incognito tab.

Using Bookmarks

Save web URLs as bookmarks to open them easily in the future.

To open a bookmark, touch the in a browser tab and then touch the bookmark

Edit a Bookmark

- 1. T ouch the .
- 2. Touch and hold the bookmark to edit.
- 3 T ouch Edit bookmark
- Edit the label, address, account, or location of the bookmark in the dialog that opens.
- 5. T ouch OK.

NOTE: Preinstalled bookmarks may not be edited.

Delete a Bookmark

1. T ouch the .

- 2. Touch and hold the bookmark to delete.
- 3. T ouch Delete bookmark.
- 4. T ouch OK.

NOTE: Preinstalled bookmarks may not be deleted.

Viewing Your Browsing History

- 1. Open the Browser app and touch the ...
- 2. T ouch the HISTORY tab.
- Touch a time span to view the web pages you browsed during then. You can touch an item to reopen the web page.

Changing Browser Settings

You can configure a number of Browser settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several that you can use to control your privacy.

To open the Browser settings screen, touch the **Settings**.

Maps, Navigation, and Local

Activating Location Services

To use **Navigation**, **Local**, **Latitude**, and find your location on Google Maps, you must have location services turned on on your tablet

- 1. T ouch the > > Settings > Location services.
- 2. Select the location options you want to use.

Check **Google's location service** to use Wi-Fi and mobile networks to determine your approximate location; check **GPS satellites** to use GPS satellites to determine your location.

Getting Your Location

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select Maps.
- 2. T ouch at the top right.

The map centers on a blue blinking dot that indicates your

location

Searching for a Location

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select Maps.
- 2. T ouch Q.
- 3. Enter the place you're looking for in the search box at the top. You can enter an address, a city, or a type of business or establishment, for example, "museums in Shanghai." As you enter information, suggestions from your previous searches and from popular searches appear in a list below the search box. You can touch a suggestion to search for it.

TIP: You can also touch beside the search box to use voice search.

- Touch the search icon on the keyboard. Markers with letter labels indicating search results appear on the map.
- 5. Touch a marker to open a balloon that contains a label with

- summary information about the location.
- Touch the balloon to open a screen with more information, as well as options for obtaining directions and more.

Getting Directions to Your Destination

Maps can provide directions for travel by foot, public transportation, or car.

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select Maps.
- 2. T ouch a t the bottom.
- Enter a start and end point and select the mode of transportation (car, public transit, or walking). If you have enabled My Location, this will appear in the start point field by default.
- 4. T ouch GET DIRECTIONS. The directions to your destination are marked on the map. Touch the left or right arrow to see the direction step by step. You can also touch DIRECTIONS LIST

to see your route displayed in a list.

NOTE: Touch > Navigation from the Home Screen to use Google Maps Navigation (beta) and get turn-by-turn voice directions.

Searching for Local Places

Google Places helps you find all kinds of businesses and establishments around you. You can rate these places and get recommendations

- T ouch in the Home Screen and select Local. Or from the Maps app, touch the Maps icon at the top of the screen and select Local.
- Wait while you are being located. Your location, when found, is shown at the top.
- Select a place category and the information for that type of place near you will be displayed.

You can also use the Q button at the top to find the place you need.

NOTE: Touch the > Add a search to add new place categories.

4. Tap a result you are interested in and check out the details and reviews about that place. You can also see the place on Maps, find out how to get there, give that place a call, add your rating and review, and more.

Google Search, Voice Search, and Voice Actions

You can search for information on the web or on your tablet using Google Search. You can also search the web or perform certain tasks by speaking.

Searching With Text

- 1. S tart the **Search** app in one of the following ways.
 - ► Touch in the Home Screen and select Google.
 - Touch the Google Search box at the top of the Home Screen.
 - Touch the in certain apps to search for related information.
- Enter the terms you want to search for and touch Go, or touch a search suggestion.

Searching by Speaking

- 1. Touch the microtablet icon to the right of the search box.
- Speak the terms you want to search for. When you're finished speaking, your speech is analyzed and the search is initiated.
 If Google Search didn't quite understand what you said, you are presented with a list of similar-sounding terms. Touch the correct term to start the search.

Using Voice Actions

- Touch the microtablet icon to the right of the search box.
- Speak the voice action you want to use. For example, say 'send a text'.
 - Your speech is analyzed before the action is initiated.
- Some voice actions need you to complete by speaking or typing more information. For example, a send text window appears after you say 'send a text'. You need to enter the

recipient and message text by typing or speaking.

Changing Search and Voice Search Settings

Open the **Google** app and touch the **Settings** to set Searchable items. or clear shortcuts.

To set Voice Search settings, touch the > > Settings > Language & input > Voice Search in the Home Screen.

Camera

You can take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored to the external memory card or to the tablet's internal storage. You can copy them to your computer or access them in the **Gallery** app.

Capturing a Photo

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select Camera.
- Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustment.

- 4. Slowly move the tablet in any direction.

5. T ouch when you reach the end point of the panoramic photo.

Recording a Video

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select Camera.
- 2. T ouch .
- Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustment.

Gallery

Opening Gallery

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Gallery** to view albums of your pictures and videos.

Working With Albums

When you open Gallery, all pictures and videos on your tablet are displayed in a number of albums.

To view album contents:

Touch an album to view the pictures and videos it contains.

To share albums:

- 1. Touch and hold an album until it is selected.
- 2. Touch more albums that you want to share.
- 3. T ouch at the top of the screen and select how you want to share the albums

To view details of an album:

- Touch and hold an album until it is selected.
- 2. T ouch > Details.

- To delete albums:
- Touch and hold an album until it is selected.
- 2. Touch more albums that you want to delete.
- 3. T ouch Touch Delete.
- To download Picasa web albums:
- 1. T ouch | > Make available offline.
- 2. Touch the Picasa web albums you want.
- 3. T ouch Done.

Working With Pictures

Touch a picture in an album to view the picture in full screen.

Double-touch the picture, or pinch two fingers together or spread them apart to zoom out or in. Slide left or right to view other pictures in the album.



Number	Function
1	Touch to return to the album, where all its contents are displayed in a grid.
2	Share the picture.
3	Delete the picture.

Touch to browse the album contents in a slideshow, rotate the picture, view picture file detail, set it as contact icon or wallpaper,

or edit it.

NOTE: Some of the options may not be available for certain albums or pictures.

Retouch Your Pictures

You can edit any photos you took and some other pictures in **Gallery**. The changed picture is saved in the **Edited** album, while the original image is never affected.

- T ouch > Edit while viewing a picture in full screen to open the Edit interface.
- Touch the icons along the bottom of the screen to edit the picture.
 - Add fill light, emphasize highlight or shadows, or set to auto-fix.

 Apply effects such as posterizing, lomography, documentary, and film grain.



Apply color effects such as warmth, saturation, B&W, sepia, negative, as well as other effects including doodling on the picture.



Crop, fix red eye, straighten, rotate, flip, sharpen the picture, etc.

- To undo or redo the changes you've made to the picture, touch or at the top of the screen.
- 4. T ouch **SAVE** to save the new picture to the **Edited** album.

Share Your Pictures

- 1. Touch an album in the gallery and then touch a picture.
- T ouch at the top of the screen. If the icon is invisible, touch the screen first.
- 3. Select how you want to share the picture.

Working With Videos

Play Videos

1. Touch an album in the gallery and then touch the thumbnail of

a video.

2. T ouch at the center to start playing.

Touch the video to view the playback controls.

Share Videos

- Touch an album in the gallery and then touch the thumbnail of a video.
- 2. T ouch at the top of the screen. If the icon is invisible, touch the screen first.
- 3. Select how you want to share the video.

Music

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Music** to play audio files stored on your tablet. **Music** supports a wide variety of audio formats, so it can play music you purchase from online stores, music you copy from your CD collection, and so on.

Copying Music Files to Your Tablet

Before using Music, you need to copy audio files from your computer to your tablet's memory card or internal storage.

Copy From a Computer

- 1. Connect your tablet and the computer with a USB cable.
- T ouch Media device (MTP) (if supported on the PC) or Camera (PTP) to browse the files on the tablet internal storage and the microSD card.
- Copy the music file from the PC and paste it to the internal storage or microSD card.

Download From the Internet

You can download music files when browsing web pages. See

Downloading Files.

Receive via Bluetooth

You can receive music files from other devices via Bluetooth. See Receive Data via Bluetooth.

Viewing Your Music Library

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Music** and your music library is displayed. All your audio files are cataloged, according the information stored in the files

Touch the tabs at the top of the screen to view your music library organized by Albums, Artists, Songs, Playlists, Folders or Genrelist.

NOTE: If an audio file is being played, touch the **Now playing** tab to open the playback screen.

Deleting a Song

- T ouch Music in the Home Screen and select Songs to see the music library.
- 2. Touch and hold a song in any list.

3. In the menu that opens, touch **Delete > OK**.

Playing Music

Touch a song in the music library to listen to it. The following playback screen appears.



Number	Function
1	The current music name.

2	Touch to toggle repeat mode: repeat all songs in the playlist, repeat the current song, or repeat off.
3	Drag the slider to jump to any part of the song.
4	Touch to open the current playlist.

7	Touch to play the current playlist in shuffle mode, where tracks are played in random order.

Managing Playlists

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

Create a Playlist

1. Touch and hold a song in the music library.

- 2. In the menu that opens, touch Add to playlist.
- 3. T ouch New.
- 4. Type the playlist name and touch Save.

The playlist is created and the song you selected is added to the playlist.

Add a Song to a Playlist

- 1. Touch and hold the song in the music library.
- 2. In the menu that opens, touch Add to playlist.
- 3. Touch the name of the playlist you want the song added to.

TIP: You can rearrange the songs in the playlists you created.

Open the playlist and touch and hold in front of a song. Drag up or down to change its order in the playlist.

Remove a Song From a Playlist

- Open a playlist.
- 2. Touch and hold the song you want to remove.
- 3. T ouch Remove from playlist.

Delete or Rename a Playlist

- T ouch the **Playlists** tab in the music library to see all the playlists.
- Touch and hold a playlist and touch Rename or Delete in the menu that opens.

Play Music

The **Play Music** application () works with Google Music, Google's online music store and streaming service. You can stream via mobile data or Wi-Fi and listen to you favorite songs that you've added to your online Google Music library. You can also play audio files you've copied directly to your tablet from a computer.


NOTE: The availability of Google Music is dependent on your region. If it is not available, or you don't have a mobile data or Wi-Fi connection, you can only play music stored on your tablet.

Playing Your Music

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Play Music**. If you are prompted, select an account to access its online music library.

The app searches your online library and your tablet for music and playlists before displaying your combined music library, organized by **Recent**, **Albums**, **Artists**, **Songs**, **Playlists**, and **Genres**. To changes views of your library, touch the view name at the top left of the screen.

Touch a song to play it. When the song is playing, touch the album artwork to display more options.



Number	Function
1	Album artwork.
2	Playback control. Skip songs, pause and resume playback, use shuffle or repeat. Drag the slider to jump to any part of the song.
3	Rate the song.
4	View the current playlist (queue).
5	Search for music.

You can still control the music when you are not in the playback screen.

 In the Play Music app, touch the Now Playing bar at the bottom left of the screen to restore the playback screen.

- In other apps, open the notification panel. Touch the song title to restore the playback screen, or just pause/ resume playback or skip to the next/previous song.
- When the screen is locked, the song information, album cover as well as playback control is displayed on the screen. You can pause/resume playback or skip songs.

Managing Playlists

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

- To create a playlist or add a song to a playlist:
- Touch next to the song, and select Add to playlist.
- To rearrange songs in a playlist:
- 1. Switch to the Playlists view and open a playlist.
- 2. Touch and hold the small grid in front of a song.
- 3. Drag the grid up or down to change its order in the playlist.
- To remove songs from a playlist:
- 1. Open the playlist in the **Playlists** view of the music library.
- Touch and hold the song or touch next to the song you want to remove.
- 3. S elect Remove from playlist.
- To rename or delete a playlist:
- 1. Switch to the Playlists view in the music library to see all the

playlists.

- 2. Touch and hold a playlist or touch Inext to the playlist.
- 3. T ouch Rename or Delete in the menu that opens.

Video Player

Use the video player to play various kinds of videos.

Opening the Video Library

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Video Player** to view your video library.

Touch the tabs at the top of the screen to view the available videos.

- All: videos on your tablet.
- Recently: recently added videos on your tablet.
- Camera: videos you have recorded with the tablet's camera.

Playing and Controlling Videos

Touch a video in the video library to play it. Rotate the tablet on its side to watch the video in landscape or portrait view.

Touch the video to show the playback controls. You can pause and resume the playback, or jump to any part of the video.

Managing Video Files

To delete videos:

- Touch and hold a video in the video library. The video is highlighted.
- 2. To remove more videos, touch them.
- 3. T ouch **Delete** at the top right of the screen.
- To share videos:
- Touch and hold a video in the video library. The video is highlighted.
- 2. To share more videos, touch them.
- 3. T ouch at the top right of the screen and select how you want to share them.
- To rename a video:
- 1. T ouch next to the video you want to rename.
- 2. T ouch Rename.
- 3. Type the new video name and touch **OK**.
- To view details of a video:
- 1. T ouch next to the video you want to view the details of.
- 2. T ouch Details.

Sound Recorder

Sound Recorder enables you to record voice memos and listen to them whenever you like.

Recording a Voice Memo

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select **Voice Recorder**.
- T ouch to start recording. Touch to cancel recording if you change your mind.
- 3. T ouch to stop recording. The memo is automatically saved.

If you don't want to save the memo after recording it, touch to delete it.

Playing a Voice Memo

To play a memo you just recorded:

Touch at the bottom of the screen.

- To play any saved memo:
- T ouch > My recordings at the top right of the screen to see all recordings.
- 2. Touch the title of a memo to play it.

NOTE: You can also touch next to the memo to share, rename, delete it, or check its file information.

More Apps

Calculator

Touch in the Home Screen and select Calculator.

Chrome

Use Google Chrome to browse the Internet. Chrome on your ZTE device can sync bookmarks, browsing history, and opened tabs from your Google Account.

Clock

Use the tablet as a desk clock and set alarms.

Using Desk Clock

Desk clock displays the current time and the next alarm.

Touch in the Home Screen and select Clock.

Touch the screen to dim the screen light, for example, when you

prepare to go to bed.

Setting a New Alarm

- 1. T ouch in the Home Screen and select Clock.
- 2. T ouch Set alarm or the existing alarm.
- Touch a default alarm to configure it, or touch ADD ALARM to create a new alarm.
- Swipe the ON/OFF switch and set up the alarm options, such as time, repeat, and ringtone.
- 5 Touch to save and exit

Downloads

The **Downloads** app keeps a record of the files you have downloaded using the **Browser**, **Email**, or **Gmail** app.

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Downloads** to check the record.

- Touch a file to open it with the appropriate applications.
- Touch and hold a file, or check the box in front of it, to delete
 or share it.

File Manager

Quickly access all of your images, videos, audio clips, and other types of files on your tablet and on the memory card.

Touch in the Home Screen and select **File Manager**. Touch the folder name at the top left of the screen to switch between the memory card storage and the internal storage.

Note Pad

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Note pad** to save and view your text notes.

Touch **ADD** to create a new note. Then enter your text and touch to save it.

Touch a note in the list on the left to view its entire content. You can also delete it, share it, or touch \(\big| \) to change its title.

Task Manager

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Task Manager** to view or stop applications.

- Touch a task in the TASK tab to switch to its screen, abort it, or see its detail.
- Touch the APPLICATION tab to manage all the apps on your tablet.
- Touch the RESOURCE tab to view the real-time system resources information.

Timer

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Timer** to use the stopwatch or the timer.

Stopwatch allows you to record lap times, while Timer allows you to set a time and count down to zero.

World Time

Touch in the Home Screen and select **World time** to check local time for cities around the world.

Touch + at the top right to add a new city.

YouTube

Touch in the Home Screen and select YouTube.

You can watch YouTube videos or upload your own.

Settings

Touch in the Home Screen and select **Settings**. The **Settings** app contains most of the tools for customizing and configuring your device.

Wireless and Networks

Wi-Fi

Turn Wi-Fi on or off and configure your Wi-Fi connections. See Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Wi-Fi.

Bluetooth

Turn Bluetooth on or off and configure your Bluetooth connections.

See Connecting to Networks and Devices - Connecting to

Bluetooth Devices

Data Usage

Touch the ON/OFF switch to turn on or off mobile data.

You can check how much data has been used during the time cycle you set, set a mobile data limit and warning, see what apps have been using mobile data, or restrict background data for individual apps.

VPN

Set up and connect to virtual private networks. See <u>Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Virtual Private Networks</u>.

Mobile Networks

Control mobile data use, select mobile network and set access point names. See <u>Connecting to Networks and Devices</u> — <u>Connecting to Mobile Networks</u>.

Device

Sound

Adjust volumes (see Personalizing - Adjusting Volumes), toggle

sound and mute (see <u>Switching to Silent Mode</u>), set up ringtone and notification sound (see <u>Personalizing – Changing Ringtone</u> <u>and Notification Sound</u>), and select system sounds (refer to <u>Turning On/Off Touch Sounds</u>).

Touch **Silent mode** to turn off all sounds except media and alarm, or enable silent mode with vibration.

Display

- Brightness: Set the brightness of the display.
- Wallpaper: Select a background image for the Home Screen.
- Sleep: Set the length of time of inactivity before the screen turns off.
- Font size: Set the font size of the text on the screen.
- Pulse notification light: Flash the LED light to notify you of missed calls, new messages, and other events.

Storage

Check memory information for your memory card and internal storage.

- Unmount SD card: Unmount the memory card from your tablet so that you can safely remove the card while the tablet is on.
- Erase SD card: Erase all data on your memory card and prepare it for use with your tablet.

Touch the > USB computer connection to set the connection type for your tablet.

Battery

Check how much power remains for the battery and what has been using the battery.

Apps

See apps installed on your tablet and manage them.

Touch an app in the **DOWNLOADED**, **ON SD CARD**, **RUNNING**, or **ALL** tab to see its information. You can stop the app, uninstall the app, clear data and cache, or move the app between the internal storage and the memory card.

NOTE: Not all applications can be moved or uninstalled.

Personal

Location Services

Activate location services to determine your location. See <u>Maps</u>, <u>Navigation</u>, <u>Places and Latitude – Activating Location Services</u>.

Security

- Screen lock: Lock the screen with slide, pattern, PIN, or password. See <u>Personalizing – Protecting Your Tablet With</u> <u>Screen Locks</u>.
- . Owner info: Set the text that you may display on the lock

screen.

 Encrypt tablet: Encrypt your data on the tablet to protect your privacy. See <u>Personalizing – Protecting Your Tablet With</u> <u>Encryption</u>.

Set up SIM card lock:

- Lock SIM card: Activate or deactivate the PIN lock to require PIN before accessing the SIM card.
- Change SIM PIN: Change the PIN used to access the SIM card.
- Make passwords visible: Display passwords as you enter them.
- Device administrators: View or deactivate apps you have authorized to be device administrators.
- Unknown sources: Check this option to permit installation of apps from sources other than the Play Store.

- Trusted credentials: Display trusted CA certificates.
- Install from SD card: Install certificates from the memory card
- Clear credentials: Delete all certificates.

Language and Input

- Language: Select a language and region for your system.
- Personal dictionary: Add new words to the tablet's dictionary or remove words from the dictionary. The words you add are used for spelling check and word suggestion.
- KEYBOARD & INPUT METHODS: Configure text input settings. See <u>Knowing the Basics – Entering Text – Touch</u> <u>Input Settings</u>.
- Voice Search:
 - Language: Select the language you use when entering text by speaking or searching by speaking.

- Speech out: set the speech out, always or hands-free only.
- Block offensive words: Replace offensive words with an asterisk (*) when you use Google voice recognition to transcribe your voice into text.
- Hotword Detection: Disable or enable hotword detection.
- Download offline speech recognition: Download offline voice input language.

· Text-to-speech output:

- PREFERRED ENGINE: Select the speech synthesis engine you want to use or change its settings.
- Speech rate: Select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.
- Listen to an example: Play a brief sample of the speech synthesizer, using your current settings.

 Pointer speed: Select how fast the pointer/mouse should scroll when you connect the tablet to a trackpad or mouse accessory.

Backup and Reset

- Back up my data: Back up app data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to Google servers after you sign in to your Google account.
- Automatic restore: Restore previously backed up settings and data when you reinstall an app.
- Factory data reset: Reset your tablet to factory default settings. All your personal data from the tablet's internal storage will be erased. You can also erase the data on the memory card during the process.



Radio Frequency (RF) Exposure

Distraction

Driving

Full attention must be given to driving at all times in order to reduce the risk of an accident. Using a tablet while driving (even with a hands free kit) can cause distraction and lead to an accident. You must comply with local laws and regulations restricting the use of wireless devices while driving.

Operating Machinery

Full attention must be given to operating machinery in order to reduce the risk of an accident.

Product Handling

General Statement on Handling and Use

You alone are responsible for how you use your tablet and any consequences of its use.

You must always turn off your tablet wherever the use of a tablet is prohibited. Use of your tablet is subject to safety measures designed to protect users and their environment.

- Always treat your tablet and its accessories with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.
- Keep the screen and camera lens clean. Unclean screen or camera lens may slow down the tablet's reaction to your operations or lower image quality.
- Clean the device and its accessories with a soft material such as cleaning cloth for eyeglass lenses. Do not use alcohol or other corrosive substances for cleaning or allow them to get inside.
- Do not expose your tablet or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit in the battery terminals.

Never puncture the surface of the battery with sharp objects.

Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a tablet interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the tablet or its accessories.

Only qualified personnel can service or repair the tablet or its accessories

If your tablet (or its accessories) has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

Radio Frequency Interference

General Statement on Interference

Care must be taken when using the tablet in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile tablet and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the tablet on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing Aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby.

The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source. Increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical Devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if operation of your tablet may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Turn off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are
