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1 General Information

1.1 Welcome

Thank you for choosing ZTE-C C366 CDMA 1X Digital Mobile Phone.

To guarantee the mobile phone always in its best condition, please read this manual carefully and keep it for future use.

The pictures, symbols and contents in this manual are just for your reference. They might not be completely identical with your phone. Please subject to the real object. ZTE operates a policy of continuous development and reserves the right to update and modify the technical specifications in this document at any time without prior notice.

1.2 Security

If your mobile phone is lost or stolen, please report to your service provider or agencies of banning the use of your phone, which will protect you from economic losses resulted from unauthorized use.

You need to provide the phone's ESN/MEID number labeled. You can see ESN/MEID number after removing the battery. Please keep ESN/MEID number for future use.

To protect your mobile phone from illegal use, please take it with you as you can. 1.3 Safety Warnings



To the Owner

- Some electronic devices are susceptible to electromagnetic interference sent by mobile phone if inadequately shielded, such as electronic system of vehicles. Please consult the manufacturer on the device before using the phone if necessary.
- Operating of mobile phone may interfere with medical devices like hearing aides and pacemakers. Please always keep the mobile phone more than 20 centimeters away from such medical devices when the phone is powered on. Do not carry the mobile phone in the breast pocket. Power the mobile phone off if necessary. Consult a physician or the manufacturer on the medical device before using the phone.
- Be aware of the usage limitation when using a mobile phone at places such as oil warehouses or chemical factories, where there are explosive gases or explosive products being processed, because even if your phone is in standby mode, it still transmits radio frequency (RF) energy. Therefore, power off your phone if required.
- Pay attention to traffic safety. Do not use your mobile phone while driving. Park before making or answering a call.
- Store the phone out of the reach of little children. The phone may 2

cause injury if used as a toy.

Mobile Phone

- Please use original accessories or accessories that are authorized by the manufacturer. Using any unauthorized accessories may affect your mobile phone's performance, and violate related national regulations about telecom terminals, or even endanger your body
- If you want to clean your phone, please use clean fabric that is a bit wet or anti-static. Do not use harsh chemical cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean it. Turn off your phone before you clean it.
- As your mobile phone can produce electromagnetic field, do not place it near magnetic items such as computer disks.
- Using the phone near electrical appliances such as TV, telephone, radio and personal computer can cause interference, which affects the function of the phone.
- Do not expose your mobile phone to direct sunlight or store it in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices.
- Prevent liquid from leaking into your phone.
- Do not drop, knock or harshly treat your phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.
- Do not connect the phone with other unauthorized peripheral equipments.

- Do not attempt to disassemble the mobile phone and battery by yourself. Non-expert handling of the devices may damage them.

- On occasion of emergent calling, keep your phone in status of power on and in area of service. On the condition of standby, press the key to enter emergency phone number, and then press

Send key to make a phone call.

- This device complies with part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions:

(1) This device may not cause harmful interference, and(2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health. The exposure standard for wireless fixed phoned employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limits set by the FCC are 1.6W/kg. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting as its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the output power. The Highest SAR Values for this model phone when tested for use on the Left cheek were 0.996 mW/g.

- Some electronic devices are susceptible to electromagnetic interference sent by phone if inadequately shielded. Please use phone at least 20cm or as far as you can from TV set, radio and other automated office equipment so as to avoid interference.
- For body-worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines when the handset is positioned a minimum of 15 mm from the body without any metal parts in the vicinity of the handset.
- NOTE: This equipment has been tested and found to comply with the limits for a Class B digital device, pursuant to part 15 of the FCC Rules. These limits are designed to provide reasonable protection against harmful interference in a residential installation. This equipment generates uses and can radiate radio frequency energy and, if not installed and used in accordance with the instructions, may cause harmful interference to radio communications. However, there is no guarantee that interference will not occur in a particular installation. If this equipment does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, which can be determined by turning the equipment off and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures:
 - Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.
 - Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
 - Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from

that to which the receiver is connected.

Battery Using

- Do not short-circuit the battery, as this can cause excessive heat and fire.
- Do not store battery in hot areas or dispose of it in a fire to avoid explosion.
- Never use any charger or battery damaged or worn out.
- Return the wear-out battery to the provider or put it in the appointed recycle place. Do not put it in familial rubbish.
- Declared that the product is installed with battery separately in the box. The FCC ID label is placed on the mobile phone clearly visible to all persons at the time of purchase.

Warning: If the battery is broken, keep away from content. If it taints your skin, wash your skin with abundant fresh water and ask doctor for help if necessary.

Safety and General Using in Vehicles

- Before making or answering a call, you should pay attention to the local laws about using wireless mobile phones and take them into account in practical use.
- Safety airbag, brake, speed control system and oil eject system shouldn't be affected by wireless transmitting. If you do meet

problems above, please contact your automobile provider.

Please power off your mobile phone when refueling your automobile, and so do the place where duplex wireless equipments are banned. Don't put your phone together with flammable or explosive items, as inner spark may cause fire.

In Aircraft

- Follow the restrictions in aircraft. Wireless devices can cause interference in aircraft.
- Please power off your mobile phone before taking on till landing. In order to protect airplane's communication system from interference, it is never allowed to use mobile phone when it is in flight. Using mobile phone before the plane taking off should get aircrew's permission according to safety regulations.

The warranty does not apply to defects or errors in the product caused by:

(a) Reasonable abrasion.

(b) Misuse including mishandling, physical damage, improper installation, unauthorized disassembly of the product.

- (e) Power surges, lightning damage, fire, flood or other events

outside ZTE's reasonable control.

(f) Use of the product with any unauthorized third party products such as generic chargers.


(g) Any other cause beyond the range of normal usage for products.



2.4 Battery

The attached Li-ion battery along with the phone can be used after unpacking. For the first three times, please use up the power and charge it fully for a new battery to perform well. \searrow


2.4.1 Remove and Installation of Battery

 Remove: (1) Press and push the back-cover of the phone down to release and remove it off the phone. (2) Put finger on the side finger grips, and then lift up the battery from the finger grips to remove the battery.



Installation: (1) Replace the battery into the battery slot, to be noted that the lower end of the battery firstly inserted. (2) Put the back-cover of the phone flatly upon the body of phone. Direct the back cover towards the locking catches on the both sides of the phone and push the back-cover of the phone upward to lock the cover into its place.





- Plug out rubber away (turn 180° as shown in the picture) from the jack on the top of the handset and connect the lead from the charger to the socket on the top of the phone. (Note: The side with arrow should be upright while connecting).
- Connect the charger to a standard wall AC socket.

- Meanwhile, the charging indicator in up-right corner of the display flops cyclically, indicating the charging is going. In power-off mode while charging, the display only shows the charge indicator. If the battery is completely flat in storage or used up, it may take for a while before the charging indicator appears on the display or any calls can be made.
- When the charging indicator on the screen stops flopping, the charging is completed. The charging takes usually up to 2~3 hours. In the process of charging, it is a normal phenomenon that the battery, phone and charger get into hot accordingly.
- After the completion of charging, disconnect the charger from the phone and AC socket.

Note:

- When it is in charge, place the phone on condition of good ventilation and temperature between -5°C ~ +45°C. Ensure to use the charger offered by the manufacturer. Using unauthorized charger may cause danger and violate the authorization of the phone and the guarantee article.
- When the phone is automatically switched off or indicates the alarm information of power shortage, please charge the battery in time.
- The duration time of the standby status or conversation of the phone is based on ideal working environment. In practice, the working time of battery varies with network condition, working

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environment and application methods.

2.5 Connect to the Network

2.5.1 Power on/off Phone

Press and hold **End key** to power on/off the phone. The phone will check the appropriate network connected. And the following prompt indication on the display:

Searching——Search appropriate network connected.

2.5.2 Connect the Network

After powering on and inputting Handset code, the phone automatically searches the network available and in state of standby mode.

Besides sending and receiving calls, you can also do:

- Press Left select key/OK key to enter Main menu.
- Press Right select key to enter All List in Names.
- Hold * key to lock the keypad.
- Hold **Up key** to power on/off flashlight.
- Hold Down key to enable/disable the phone in Silence.
- Hold **# key** to enable/disable vibration mode.
- Press Up key to enter Camera.
- Press **Down key** to enter **Messages** menu.
- Press Left key to enter MobileShop.
- Press Right key to enter Organiser menu.

• Press Send key to enter Dialed calls list.



3 Basic Operations

3.1 Make a Call

Please ensure that you are in the place where the signal can be received. Examine network signal strength icon \mathbf{T}_{sub} on the screen.

The more the indication bars, the stronger the intensity of receiving signal is. If there is no bar, please move to the place where the intensity of receiving signal is better. Sometimes, you only need to change the direction.


Make a National Call

Press **Number key** to key in phone number, and add area code when making a long distance call (no need to add area code when dialing local number in some area). Press **Send key** to call out. Press **End key** to end the call and conversation.

Make an International Call

Enter the country code, area code (without the leading 0) and the complete telephone number you want to dial, press **Send key** to call out.

Before the country code, hold **0 key** to enter the international prefix "+" (the character "+" replaces the international access code) or key in international prefix e.g. "00" of international call directly.



Make Recent Calls

All calls you recently dialed, received or missed are saved in your phone. All numbers are grouped as Missed Calls, Received Calls and Dialed Calls. When the list is full, the oldest number will be erased automatically when new record is coming.

You can check the list as follows:

In standby mode, press Send key to view Dialed Calls.

The number listed in can be directly dialed by pressing Send key.

Make Pause Calls

You can make use of pause call to dial an extention or voice service call.

E.g. Key in phone number, press **OK key** to select "**P**" on the display (character "**P**" added accordingly), and then key in number afterwards. Press **Send key** to dial the first number, when connected, press **Send key** again to dial the second number automatically. "**P**" can be used for not once only.

3.2 Answer a Call

When a call is incoming in standby mode, the phone will offer corresponding ringer or vibration to prompt according to your Setting. With the number already saved in Names, the phone also shows the name of caller meanwhile.

Press Send key to answer an incoming call.
Press End key to end a call and the call duration is

temporarily displayed.

See "10.2 Call " or refer to other ways of answering calls for your option as follows.

3.2.1 Set Any Key Answer

• Select Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Anykey Answer.

Select On/Off, and press OK key/Left select key.

An incoming call can be answered by pressing any key except **End key**, **Left /Right select key** when you select **On**.

3.2.2 Incoming Call Silence

• When a call is coming, press **Right select key** to select **Silence** to mute the ringer tone.

• This function silences the current incoming call only. The phone will ring normally as next call coming.

3.3 In Conversation

3.3.1 Adjust Volume in Conversation

Press Left/Right key to adjust volume of Earpiece during a call.

3.3.2 Select Options in Conversation

During a call, press Left/Right select key to select options of

Option (Names, Messages, Record), Mute/Unmute, etc.

- Select Mute to let other party temporarily can not hear your voice, select Unmute back to normal.
- Select Option for selection in Menu, such as Names, Messages, Record with no worry about the ending of conversation.
- Press OK key to open phone speaker, and press OK key again back to normal.

3.4 Menu Functions

- Main Menu Function:
- i. In standby mode, press Left select key/OK key to enter main Menu. Scroll Up/Down or Left/Right key through the menu and select functions according to the prompt on the screen.
- If the menu contains submenus and further submenus, select options and submenu you want according to the prompt on the screen.
- iii. Press **OK key** or **Right select key** to set or return to the previous 23

menu. Press End key to exit to standby mode.

Bottom Menu Function:

If options are displayed on the bottom of the screen, press Left/Right select key to select. Press OK key or Right select key to set or exit.

The functions of phone are mainly grouped in main menu: Call History, Names, Multimedia, Messages, BREW, Games, Settings, Profiles, and Organiser.

Please refer to the text hereinafter in this manual in detail.



4 Call History

4.1 View Recent Calls

Information of All Calls, Missed Calls, Received Calls, and Dialed Calls including name, phone number, call time and conversation duration is saved in the Call History.

1. Select Menu \rightarrow Call History.

2. Select All Calls, Missed Calls, Received Calls or Dialed Calls.

3. Press OK key/Left select key.

4. Select one entry of the records and press Left select key.

5. Select option:

- **Call Information:** Indicate name, number, time and conversation duration information.

- SMS: Send message to this number.

- Save: Save the number in the Names.

- Delete: Erase the number from the list of Call History.

- Edit: Edit the number and save in the Names.

- Black List: Add this number to the Black List.

If your phone does not support the function of Incoming Call Indication, you can only see part of the above-mentioned options.

4.2 Call Duration

1. Select Menu→ Call History→ Call Duration.

2. Select an option from the list and press OK key.

 $-{\rm Last}$ Dialed Call: Indicate the talk time of the last dialed call. The time can be reset.

-All Dialed Calls: Indicate the talk time of all dialed calls. The time can be reset.

-Incoming Calls: Indicate the talk time of all incoming calls. The time can be reset.

 $-{\rm All}\ {\rm Calls}:$ Indicate the talk time of all dialed and received calls. The time can be reset.

-Reset Call Duration: Reset the call duration.

4.3 Erasing Recent Calls List

1. Select Menu \rightarrow Call History \rightarrow Clear All.

2. Select Erase Missed, Erase Received, Erase Dialed or Clear All.

3. Press OK key/Left select key to delete all the numbers from the

list.

5 Names

You can save Names in phone. Each contact in phone's memory has three phone numbers, home number, mobile number and office number.

5.1 Add Name

5.1.1 Add New Entry

1. Select Menu \rightarrow Names \rightarrow Add Name \rightarrow Name.

2. Press Up/Down key to relative item,

 Name: Add the persons name. See "13 Text Input" more instructions for writing text and character.

Home Number/Mobile Number/Office Number: write the call number by keying the Number key.

Default Number: Press Left/Right key to set the Home Number, Mobile Number or Office Number as default number.

- Group: Press Left/Right key to set the names group as No Group, Family, Relatives, Friends, Business, Colleagues, School, Club, or VIP.
- Photo: Press OK key and you can choose the photo from file Phote, BREW Picture or Received Files.

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- ♦ Call Alert: Press OK key to set specific ring for the calling of the names.
- Sms Alert: Press OK key to set specific ring for the SMS of the names.
- After the completion of writing, press Left select key to save the contact.
- Scroll to just input phone number, press OK key or Left select key,

Further operation can be executed, such as:

- ♦ Edit: Edit the names.
- Send Message: Send message to this number.
- Make a call: Make a call to the default number of this names.
- Send Name: Send SMS of this number information to others.
 - Delete: Delete the number.
- Set to Speed Dial: Assign a speed dial number to the phone number.
- ♦ Default Number: Set the number as the default number.
- ♦ Add to Black List: Add the number to black list.

Note: In standby mode, key in phone number, press Left select key to Save or Send Message.

If you save the same number again, the phone prompts to remind

you this number is already exist.

5.1.2 Edit Existing Name

- 1. Select Menu→ Names→ Add Name→ Existing Name.
- 2. Press Left/Right key to different Groups, press Up/Down key to the record you want edit.
- 3. Press OK key and scroll to the phone number (Home Number, Mobile Number or Office Number) you want edit, press OK key/Left select key. You can enter into the phone number you select. Press Right select key to erase the characters, input the characters you want input (See 13. Text input for more information). And press Up/Down key to move the cursor you can make other changes of the names. Select Save to save the modification.

5.2 Find Records

- In All List
 - 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Names \rightarrow All List.

2. Press **Up/Down key** to scroll though the corresponding name(s) and records in the list, or press the characters of the names.

3. Scroll to the record you are finding,

- Select Option, you can Add New Entry, View, Edit, Send Message, Make a Call, Delete, Delete All, or Send Name.
- ♦ Press OK key, you can see the detail phone numbers.

Search

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Names \rightarrow Find.
- 2. Press Up/Down Key to select Find Name, Find Number or Find Group.
- Input the name or number you want find, or select the group you want find and press OK key.

4. Press **Up/Down key** to scroll though the corresponding name(s) and records in the list. Scroll to the name you want, and press **OK key** to view the details or select **Option**.

All the Names will be list by the letter of the name. If no contact in the list, "No Record" will be displayed.

Note: In standby mode, press **Right select key** to enter **All** in **Names** directly.

5.3 Select Group

There are nine groups, no group, family, relatives, friends, business, colleagues, school, club and VIP preset in your phone, you can rename them and set ringer for the different group.

- 1. Select Menu→ Names→ Groups.
- Scroll to the group you want to edit, No group, Family, Relatives, Friends, Business, Colleagues, School, Club, or VIP. Press Left select key or OK key. Further operation

can be executed, such as:

- ♦ View Members: view the all members of the group.
- Set Ring Tone: Set the personal call ringer for the group.
 You can select ring from the list set already in phone or download ring by yourself.
- Set Msg Tone: Set the personal message ringer for the group. Press Up/Down key to select the SMS ring.
- Edit Title: press OK key and you can rename the name of group.

Note: For the group of No Group, you can only View Members.

5.4 Set Speed Dial

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Names \rightarrow Speed Dials.
- 2. Select one Empty slot in list and press Left select key or OK key.

3. Select Delete All to erase all speed dial record. Select Assign to set a phone number to this slot. Press Up/Down key to one contact record listed in phone's memory and scroll to the number you select.

- 4. Press **OK key** twice to set the speed dial.
- 5. Press Right select key back to previous menu.

5.5 View and Make Speed Dial

View:

1. Select Menu \rightarrow Names \rightarrow Speed Dials to see the speed dial.

2. Scroll to one speed dial, and press OK key, you can Replace, Delete, Delete All, or go to Next Empty.

Dialing:

You can also make a call by entering speed dial number in the standby mode.

Method 1: Enter speed dial number, press **Send Key** to dial. Method 2: Directly hold the Speed Dial Numb<mark>er digit key.</mark>

5.6 Memory Status

1. Select Menu→Names→Memory Status.

3. View the number of saved entries and maximum number of entries saved in phone.

For example: 8/500, indicating that 500 records entries in Max., out of which 8 have be saved in phone.

6 Multimedia

6.1 Camera

1. Select Menu \rightarrow Multimedia \rightarrow Camera.

2. Press OK key to take photos.

3. Select **Option**, press **Up/Down key** to select a following option.

Settings: make various setting of taking phones.
 -Resolution: set the resolution as 480x640, 240x320, or 128x160.

-Black/White: Select On or Off to set the phones as black/white or colors.

-Multishot: Set Multishot Off, 3 shots, 6 shots or 9 shots. -Shutter Sound: Select the shutter sound.

Photo Brower: enter the File manager of photos. Select one file,

 press OK key to see the photos. Select Option, you can view Full Screen, make Image Delete, Set As Wallpaper, Set As Contact Image or see Help information.

Select Option you can Browse, Rename, Send via MMS,
 Delete, Delete all the photo, or see the Property of the photo and the Memory Info of your phone.

6.2 File Manager

1. Select $\textbf{Menu} \rightarrow \textbf{Multimedia} \rightarrow \textbf{File Manager.}$

2. Press Up/Down key to select an option from the pop-up windows,

Photo, Record, BREW Picture, BREW Music, or Received Files.

- Preview: View the message you have written.
- ♦ Delete Item: Delete the picture or tunes you have inserted.
- Cc/Bcc/Sub: Press Up/Down key to select Cc, Bcc or Subject of the message. Key in receiver's number or select the receiver number form Contact in Option, press OK key to add new receiver's number that you want Cc or Bcc. Write the Sub of the message. Select Done back to precious step.
- Save To Drafts: Save the message in Drafts.

Quick Text: To select template sentence.

7.2 Album On Line

You can send SMS or MMS to the mail server. This function **is** network services. Please consult with network service provider to get corresponding service application.

7.3 Receive Incoming Call while Editing Message

• If you do not want to receive the incoming call, press End key.

• If you want to receive the incoming call, press **Send key**. After receiving the call, you can continue to edit and send the message.

7.4 Read Message

On receipt of a new message, the phone prompts you by vibration or ringer (up to silence and ringer in **Profiles**). The display indicates "Messages" and "1 Received". Press **View** to view the list in **Inbox**, and press **OK key** to view detail. Please erase old messages to keep space for new messages.
