



# **Getting Started**

# **Getting to Know Your Phone**





# **Knowing the Keys**

Key	Function	
Power Key	Press and hold to turn on or off airplane mode, restart, or power off.  Press to turn off or on the screen display.	
Home Key	Touch to return to the home screen from any application or screen.  Touch and hold to use Google search.	


Key	Function	
Recent Apps Key	Touch to see recently used apps.	
Back Key	Touch to go to the previous screen.	
Volume Key	Press or hold either end to turn the volume up or down.	
Camera Key	When the camera app is launched, press or hold to take one or multiple pictures.     In other screens, press twice to launch the camera and take five burst shots.	




The positions of the **Recent Apps Key** and the **Back Key** are interchangeable through **Settings > Navigation key**.

# Installing the nano-SIM Card

 Insert the tip of the tray eject tool into the hole next to the nano-SIM card tray on the left side of the phone.



Pull out the nano-SIM card tray and place the nano-SIM card on the tray, as shown. Then carefully install the tray back.



# **WARNING!**

To avoid damage to the phone, do not use any other kind of SIM card, or any non-standard nano-SIM card cut from a SIM card. You can get a standard nano-SIM card from your service provider.

# Charging the Battery

Your phone's battery should have enough power for the phone to turn on, find a signal, and make a few calls. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen. As you charge your phone, the lock screen will show you the exact battery level on the status bar. See <u>Locking/Unlocking the Screen and Keys</u>.

# WARNING!

Use only ZTE-approved chargers and cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your phone or cause the battery to explode.

# **CAUTION:**

Do not change the built-in rechargeable battery in your phone by yourself. The battery can only be changed by ZTE or ZTE authorized service provider.

 Connect the adapter to the charging jack. Ensure that the adapter is inserted with the correct orientation. Do not force the connector into the charging jack.



- Connect the charger to a standard AC power outlet. If the phone is on, you'll see a charging icon, such as for for appear on the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

# NOTE:

If the battery is extremely low, you may be unable to power on the phone even when it is being charged. In this case, try again after charging the phone for at least 20 minutes. Contact customer service if you still cannot power on the phone after prolonged charging.

# Extending the Battery Life

Active applications, screen brightness levels, Bluetooth and Wi-Fi usage and GPS functionality can drain your battery. You can follow the helpful tips below to conserve your battery power:

- Reduce the screen backlight time.
- Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn auto-sync. Wi-Fi. and Bluetooth off when not in use.
- Disable the GPS function when not in use. Most applications using this function will periodically query the GPS satellites for your current location; each query drains your battery.

# Powering On/Off

- Press and hold the Power Key to turn on your phone.
- To power off, press and hold the Power Key to open the options menu. Touch Power off.

# NOTE:

If the phone freezes or takes too long to respond, you can press and hold the Power Key for about 10 seconds to power the phone off, and then turn it on again.

# Setting Up for the First Time

When you first power on your phone after you purchase it or reset it to factory settings (see Backup and Reset), you need to do some settings before using it.

Flick the language field to select the language and touch -.



Then follow the prompts to set up Wi-Fi, owner name, Google services and other options.

# Locking/Unlocking the Screen and Keys

Your phone allows you to quickly lock the screen and keys (put the phone into sleep mode) when not in use and to turn the screen back on and unlock it when you need it.

### To lock the screen and keys:

To quickly turn the screen off and lock the keys, press the **Power Key**.



To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after some time of inactivity. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone screen is off.

### To unlock the screen and keys:

- 1. Press the Power Key to turn the screen on.
- 2. Touch the screen and swipe up.
  - or -

Swipe right or left to open the Phone app or the Camera app.

# NOTE:

If you have set an unlock pattern, PIN or password for your phone (see <u>Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks</u>), you'll need to draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password to unlock

your screen.

# **Using the Touch Screen**

Your phone's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

### Touch

When you want to type using the onscreen keyboard, select onscreen items such as application and settings icons, or press onscreen buttons, simply touch them with your finger.



### · Touch and Hold

To open the available options for an item (for example, a message or link in a web page), touch and hold the item.



### · Swipe or Slide

To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.



### Drag

To drag, press and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to move your finger. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.



### Pinch

In some apps (such as Maps, Chrome, and Gallery), you can zoom in and out by placing two fingers on the screen at once

and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in).




### Rotate the screen

For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

# Getting to Know the Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more.



### **Extended Home Screen Panels**

Your home screen is extendable, providing more space for shortcuts, widgets, and more. Simply swipe left or right on the home screen to see the extended panels. You can add or remove home screen panels, or adjust their order.

### To add a new home screen panel:

1. Touch the Home Key > , or touch and hold an empty area

- of the home screen and select Widgets.
- Touch and hold an application icon or a widget and drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel and put the icon or widget on it.

### To delete a home screen panel:

- Touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and slide left or right to view the home screen thumbnails.
- 2. Touch on the top right corner of a thumbnail.
- 3. Touch OK. The items on the panel will also be removed.



When there are only three home screen panels, you cannot delete any of them.

### To adjust the order of a home screen panel:

- Touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and slide left or right to view the home screen thumbnails.
- Touch and hold a thumbnail and drag it left or right to the place you need.



Touch at the bottom of a home screen thumbnail to set it as the main home screen.

# **Personalizing**

# **Changing the System Language**

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Language & input > Language.
- 2. Select the language you need.

# **Setting the Date and Time**

- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Set the date, time, time zone, and date/time format.
  - To adjust the date and time automatically, check Automatic date & time.
  - To adjust the date and time manually, uncheck
     Automatic date & time and touch Set date / Set time to change the date and time.
  - To adjust the time zone automatically, check Automatic time zone
  - To adjust the time zone manually, uncheck Automatic time zone and touch Select time zone to set the correct time zone.
  - To adjust the format of time and date, touch Use 24-hour format or Choose date format.

# Changing Ringtone and Notification Sound

You can customize the default incoming call ringtone and the default notification sound.

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Sound & notifications.
- 2. Touch Default notification ringtone or Phone ringtone.
- Scroll through the ringtone list and select the ringtone you want to use.
- 4. Touch OK.



See <u>Set a Ringtone for a Contact</u> for how to assign a special ringtone to an individual contact.

# **Turning On/Off System Sound**

- Touch the Home Key > Settings > Sound & notifications > Other sounds.
- Touch Dial pad tones, Screen locking sounds, Touch sounds, or Vibrate on touch.

# **Adjusting Volume**

Touch the Home Key > 
 Settings > Sound & notifications.

Drag the sliders below Media volume, Alarm volume, Ring volume, and Notification volume to adjust the volume for each type of audio.



You can adjust the media volume when a media application is in use by pressing the **Volume Key**. If no media application is active, press the **Volume Key** to adjust ringtone volume (or the earpiece volume during a call).

# **Switching to Silent or Vibration Mode**

You can set the phone to silent or vibration mode by using one of the following methods.

- Press the Volume Key when no media application is active to show the volume management window. Drag the slider to the left or keep pressing the lower end of the Volume Key to switch the phone to vibration mode.
- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Sound & notifications > Interruptions > When calls and notifications arrive, and touch Don't interrupt to switch the phone to silent mode.
- Swipe down from the top of the screen to open the notification panel and drag the panel downwards. Touch **Sound** when it is highlighted to switch the phone to silent mode.

# NOTE:

The Sound button is not highlighted when the phone is in silent mode or silent with vibration mode.

Touch the Home Key > Settings > Sound & notifications > Notification mode and select Vibrate or Mute to switch to vibration or silent mode.

# NOTE:

In addition to silent mode and vibration, you can also allow priority apps to send out notifications when you switch the phone to priority interruption mode.

# Selecting Headset HiFi Mode

You can select a HiFi mode to enhance the audio quality when using a wired headset with your phone.

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Sound & notifications > Headset HiFi.
- 2. Touch the option you need.
- Touch the play button above the options to try the option out. If you are not satisfied, try another option.

# **Applying New Wallpapers**

You can set the wallpaper for the home screen and lock screen.

- Touch and hold an empty place on the home screen and then touch Wallpapers.
- Slide left or right on the wallpaper tab to select a wallpaper, or touch GALLERY or LIVE WALLPAPER to choose the image or animation you want to use as the wallpaper. Some cropping may be needed for Gallery and Photos images.

### NOTE:

# **Changing Screen Brightness**

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Display > Brightness level.
- 2. Drag the slider to manually adjust the screen brightness.



With the proximity and light sensor, your phone can automatically adjust the screen brightness for available light. Touch **Adaptive brightness** in the **Display** settings screen to turn the feature on or off

# **Setting the Theme**

- Touch and hold an empty place on the home screen.
- 2. In the window that appears at the bottom, touch Theme.
- 3. Select a theme you like.

# Setting the Home Screen Transition Effect

- 1. Touch and hold an empty place on the home screen.
- 2. In the window that appears at the bottom, touch Effect.

Pick an effect and the phone will demonstrate how it works. Touch other effects until you find the favorite one.

# Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks

You can protect your phone by creating a screen lock. When it is enabled, you need to swipe the screen, look at the front camera, draw a pattern or enter a numeric PIN or a password to unlock the phone's screen and keys.

- Touch the Home Key > Settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Touch None, Slide, Pattern, PIN or Password.
  - ▶ Touch None to disable the screen lock.
  - Touch Slide to enable screen lock and allow unlocking with a 'slide' gesture. You can unlock the screen by touching the display and sliding up.
  - Touch Pattern to draw and redraw a pattern that you must draw to unlock the screen.
  - Touch PIN or Password to set a numeric PIN or a password that you must enter to unlock the screen.
- For Pattern, PIN, or Password lock, select how you want notifications and their contents to show when the phone is locked. Then touch **DONE**.

# NOTE:

Remember the pattern, PIN or password you set. Otherwise, you

will have to upgrade the phone software to use the phone. See Upgrading the Phone Software.

# **Protecting Your Phone With Encryption**

You can encrypt all the data on your phone: your accounts, application data, music and other media, downloaded information, and so on. If you do, you must enter a numeric PIN or a password each time you power on your phone.



Encryption is irreversible. The only way to revert to an unencrypted phone is to perform a factory data reset which erases all your data.

Encryption provides additional protection in case your phone is stolen and may be required or recommended in some organizations. Consult your system administrator before turning it on. In many cases the PIN or password you set for encryption is controlled by the system administrator.

Before turning on encryption, prepare as follows:

- Set a lock screen PIN or password.
- · Charge the battery.
- · Keep the phone connected to the charger.
- Schedule an hour or more for the encryption process. You must not interrupt it or you will lose some or all of your data.

When you're ready to turn on encryption:

Touch the Home Key > 
 Settings > Security > Encrypt phone.

2. Read the information about encryption carefully.

The **ENCRYPT PHONE** button is dimmed if your battery is not charged or your phone is not plugged in.

If you change your mind about encrypting your phone, touch the **Back Key**.

WARNING!

If you interrupt the encryption process, you will lose data.

- Touch ENCRYPT PHONE.
- 4. Enter your lock screen PIN or password and touch NEXT.
- Touch ENCRYPT PHONE.

The encryption process starts. Encryption can take an hour or more, during which time your phone may restart several times.

When encryption is completed, you're prompted to enter your PIN or password.

Subsequently you must enter your PIN or password each time you power on your phone in order to decrypt it.

# Protecting Your Phone With Screen Pinning

You can use the screen pinning feature to keep an app in view, so others cannot switch to other apps or access your personal information.

# **Turn On Screen Pinning**

1. Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Security > Screen

### pinning.

Touch the On/Off switch.

### Pin a Screen

- 1. Ensure that screen pinning is turned on.
- 2. Open the app you want to keep in view.
- Touch the Recent Apps Key.
- If there are many app tabs, swipe up to find on the front-most tab.
- 5. Touch
- If you have set a screen lock, check Ask for unlock pattern / PIN / password before unpinning. You will need to draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password to unpin the screen.
- Touch START.

# **Unpin the Screen**

To unpin the screen and return to normal use, touch and hold the **Recent Apps Key**.

If you have checked **Ask for unlock pattern / PIN / password before unpinning** when pinning the screen, swipe up on the lock screen and draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password.

# **Knowing the Basics**

# **Monitoring the Phone Status**

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status icons on the right side. Below are some of the icons you may see.

# **Managing Notifications**

### Notification Icons

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides notification icons on the left. Below are some of the icons you may see.

# Open/Close the Notification Panel

Notifications report the arrival of new messages, calendar events, and alarms, as well as ongoing events, such as when you've configured your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot. You can open the notification panel to view the details of notifications.

 To open the notification panel, swipe your finger down on the home screen or from the top of the screen.  To close the notification panel, swipe your finger up on the screen or touch the Back Key.

# Respond to or Remove a Notification

In the notification panel, you can respond to a notification or remove the notifications. The notification panel also supports expandable notifications that let you perform additional actions right from the notification itself.

- · To respond to a notification, just touch it.
- To remove a notification, swipe it left or right.
- Slide down with one finger to expand certain notifications.
   You can also swipe two fingers vertically or pinch-zoom to expand or collapse certain notifications.
- To remove all notifications, touch = below all the notifications.
- To manage notifications you have received, touch and hold a
  notification to identify the application that created it. You can
  then touch and select Block to hide future notifications
  from this app, or touch Priority to show them in priority mode.

# NOTE:

If you block notifications for an app, you may miss its important alerts and updates. The notifications of some apps cannot be blocked.

# Use Quick Settings

The Quick Settings make it convenient to view or change the most common settings for your phone.

Open the notification panel and drag the panel downwards to find the following Quick Settings on the screen.

- Sync: Touch to turn on or off auto-sync of accounts data.
   Touch and hold to open the Accounts menu in Settings. See <u>Accounts</u> and <u>Web Accounts</u>.
- . Sound: Touch to switch between mute and sound.
- · Vibrate: Touch to turn on or off vibration.
- PowerSaver: Touch to turn on or off power saver. Touch and hold to open the Power manager menu in Settings. See <u>Power Manager</u>.
- Location: Touch to turn on or off location services. Touch and hold to open the Location menu in Settings. See Location.
- Airplane: Touch to turn on or off the airplane mode.
- . Flashlight: Touch to turn on or off the flash.
- Hotspot: Touch to turn on or off the Wi-Fi hotspot feature.
   Touch and hold to open the Wi-Fi hotspot menu in Settings.
   See <u>Share Your Mobile Data Connection as a Wi-Fi Hotspot</u>.
- Auto Rotate: Touch to turn on or off the auto-rotate screen feature.
- Wi-Fi: Touch to turn on or off Wi-Fi. Touch and hold to open the Wi-Fi menu in Settings. See <u>Connecting to Wi-Fi</u>.
- Data: Touch to enable or disable data access over the mobile network. Touch and hold to open the Data usage menu in Settings. See <u>Data Usage</u>.
- Bluetooth: Touch to turn on or off Bluetooth. Touch and hold to open the Bluetooth menu in Settings. See Connecting to

#### Bluetooth Devices.

 Brightness: Uncheck Auto and drag the brightness slider to adjust the screen brightness.

## NOTE:

In the Quick Settings screen, touch at the top to get to the Settings menu; touch the battery icon to open the battery settings screen; touch to manage users or switch between them; touch EDIT at the bottom to change control switch position.

## Managing Shortcuts and Widgets

### Add Shortcuts and Widgets

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > .
  - or -

To add widgets, touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and select **Widgets**.

- Slide left or right to browse the available applications or widgets.
- Touch and hold a widget or an application icon and drag it to a home screen panel.

### NOTE:

While holding the item, you can drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel and put the item on it.

## Move Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a widget or shortcut on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to the place you need.

### Remove Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a widget or shortcut on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to **(Delete)** to remove it.

### **Adjust Widget Size**

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen and then release it.
- An outline appears around the widget. Drag the outline to resize the widget.



Not all widgets can be resized.

## **Organizing With Folders**

You can create folders on the home screen and add several shortcuts to a folder.

You can move or remove folders the same way as moving or removing shortcuts.

- Touch and hold the shortcut on the home screen you want to add into a folder until (Folder) appears.
- 2. Drag the shortcut to (Folder) and release it. A new folder

will be created and the shortcut is added into the folder.

To add more shortcuts into the folder, touch and hold each shortcut and drag it over the folder before releasing it.

#### NOTES:

- Touch the folder and then touch the name field to rename the folder.
- Drag the folder to (Extract) to delete the folder and replace its shortcuts on the home screen.

## **Rearranging the Primary Shortcuts**

The home screen includes a customizable primary shortcuts area at the bottom visible from all home screen panels. You can keep at most four items in the area. Drag icons or folders in or out of the area to rearrange it.



## **Entering Text**


You can enter text using the onscreen keyboard. Some apps open it automatically. In others, you open it by touching where you want to type. Touch the **Back Key** to hide the onscreen keyboard. You can also enter text by speaking with the Google voice typing feature.

### **Change Input Methods**

- When you use the onscreen keyboard to enter text, the icon appears on the status bar.
- Open the notification panel and touch Change keyboard.
- 3. Select an input method you need.

### Google Keyboard

The Google Keyboard provides a layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. When screen auto-rotation is enabled, turn the phone sideways and the keyboard will change from portrait to landscape. The landscape keyboard is not supported in all applications.



 Touch the alphabetic keys to enter letters. Touch and hold some specific keys to enter associated accented letters or numbers. For example, to enter È, touch and hold E<sup>3</sup> and the available accented letters and number 3 appear. Then slide to choose È.

- As you enter a word, candidates appear above the keyboard.
   Touch to select the correct one; touch and hold to see more possible options.
- Touch to use uppercase. Double-tap to lock uppercase. This key also changes to indicate the current case you are using: for lowercase, for uppercase, and when locked in uppercase.
- Touch to delete the text before the cursor.
- Touch ?123 to select numbers and symbols. You can then touch = \ < to find more.</li>
- Touch to enter miniature icons, such as expressions, horoscopes, and animals.
- Touch to use Google voice typing.
- Touch and hold i to change the input languages or set up the Google keyboard.

#### **Gesture Typing**

The Google keyboard supports the gesture typing feature. You use this feature to input a word by sliding through the letters.

To enable and use gesture typing:

- Touch and hold on the Google keyboard and then touch Google Keyboard Settings.
- 2. Touch Gesture Typing and then touch Enable gesture

#### typing if this feature is turned off.

Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word



#### NOTES:

- Touch when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and touch.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to input the next word.

### TouchPal X Keyboard

TouchPal X Keyboard offers three layouts: **T26**, **T12** and **T+**. You can touch to select a layout or an input language.

You can also use TouchPal Curve<sup>®</sup> to speed up text input by replacing the key tapping operation with a tracing gesture where you move your finger from letter to letter without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

#### The T26 Layout



The T26 layout offers an input experience similar to a computer keyboard.

- The alphabetic keys: Touch the keys to enter letters. You can also touch and hold a key and slide to choose more characters.
- The capital key: Touch to use uppercase or lowercase.
   This key also changes to indicate the current case you are using: for lowercase, for uppercase, and when locked in uppercase.
- Word prediction: Slide left or right on the space key to turn on or off prediction, as indicated by

- Languages: Touch or to select input language.
- Pre-defined texts: Touch 12# to enter digits, symbols, emoticons and other pre-defined texts. You can touch 1/2 or 2/2 to turn pages, or touch abc to go back to the alphabetic keys.
- The delete key: Touch to delete text before the cursor.
   You can also touch the key and slide left to delete an entire word.
- Voice input: Touch and speak through the microphone.
- Edit text: Touch to open text editing options. You can move the cursor, select, cut, copy, paste, or delete text.
- More options: Touch to access the quick settings of TouchPal X keyboard, change keyboard theme and more.
- Close the keyboard: Touch M. You can touch the text field again to show the keyboard.

#### The T12 Layout

The layout is similar to a phone pad in T12 mode.



- Touch an alphabetic key repeatedly until the desired letter appears. You can also touch and hold the key and slide left or right to choose the letter or number you need.
- If word prediction is enabled (abc), just touch the keys once and choose the right word.

The T+ Layout



- Touch to enter the left letter on the key; double-tap or flick right to enter the right letter/symbol on the key. You can also touch and hold a key and slide left or right to choose more letters and symbols.
- If word prediction is enabled ( ), just touch the keys and choose the right word.

#### To enable and use TouchPal Curve:

- In the TouchPal X keyboard screen, touch > Settings and check Curve Word gesture.
- 2. If prompted, touch OK to switch to the T26 layout.
- Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.
- NOTE:

TouchPal Curve is only available in the T26 layout.



Tips for using TouchPal Curve:

- Touch when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and touch.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to trace the next word.

### **Google Voice Typing**

Google Voice typing uses the Google voice recognition service to convert speech to text.

- Flick down the status bar when entering text and touch Change keyboard > Google voice typing.
  - Or touch  $\stackrel{\Psi}{=}$  to access the voice typing when you are using the Google Keyboard.
- When you see the microphone image, speak what you want to type.
- 3. You can continue entering text to keep it or to delete it.
- NOTE:

Say "comma," "period," "question mark," "exclamation mark," or "exclamation point" to enter punctuation.


### Input Settings

Choose input settings by touching > Settings > Language & input from the home screen.

In the **Keyboard & input methods** section, you can set the current input method and choose the settings for input methods.

## **Editing Text**

- Move the insertion point: Touch where you want to type.
   The cursor blinks in the new position, and a tab appears below it. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- Select text: Touch and hold or double-tap within the text. The nearest word highlights, with a tab at each end of the selection. Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- Replace text with the clipboard text: Select the text you want to replace. Then touch no replace.



## **Opening and Switching Apps**

### Open an App

- Touch the Home Key > ==.
- Slide left or right on the screen and touch an app to open it.

### **Switch Between Recently Opened Apps**

- Touch the Recent Apps Key. The apps you've used recently are displayed in a series of tabs. Slide up and down to see all the tabs.
- 2. Touch a tab to open that app.
- NOTE:

You can swipe a tab sideways to remove it from the screen, or touch **Clear all** to remove all tabs.

## Uninstalling or Disabling an App

 Touch the Home Key > to open the application list screen.

- Touch and hold an application icon and drag the icon to (Uninstall) or (Disable) at the top of the screen.
- 3. Touch **OK** to uninstall or disable the app.

#### NOTES:

- · Pre-installed apps cannot be uninstalled.
- To find the disabled applications, touch the Home Key >
   Settings > Apps > DISABLED. You can then touch an application and touch ENABLE to restore it.

# Connecting to Networks and Devices

## **Connecting to Mobile Networks**

### Select Network Operator

- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Mobile networks.
- Touch Network operators to search for all available networks
- 3. Touch a network in the network list to register manually.

You can also touch **Choose automatically** to select preferred network automatically.

#### Control Mobile Data Use

To enable or disable data access:

- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Mobile networks.
- Touch Mobile Data to enable or disable mobile data use.

#### To get data services when roaming:

- 1. Touch the Home Key > = > Settings > Mobile networks.
- 2. Touch the Data roaming switch.

### NOTE:

Data roaming may incur significant roaming charges.

## Select Preferred Network Type

Set the preferred type of network for the nano-SIM card.

- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Mobile networks.
- Touch Preferred network type and select the network type you would prefer the phone to connect with.

#### **Set Access Point Names**

To connect to the Internet you can use the default Access Point Names (APN). And if you want to add a new APN, please contact the service provider to get the necessary information.

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Mobile networks.
- 2. Touch Access Point Names > 1

- Touch each item to enter the information you get from your service provider.
- 4. Touch : > Save to complete.
- NOTE:

To set the APN to default settings, touch : > Reset to default.

## Connecting to Wi-Fi®

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that can provide Internet access at distances of up to 300 feet, depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings.

# Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position to turn on Wi-Fi.
- Touch a network name to connect to it.
- If the network is secured, enter the password and touch CONNECT.
- NOTE:

Your phone automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when they are in range.

### Get Notified of Open Networks

1. Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Wi-Fi.

- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch > Advanced.
- 4. Slide the Network notification switch.

When Wi-Fi is on, you receive notifications in the status bar when your phone detects an open Wi-Fi network. Switch off the option to turn off notifications.

#### Add a Wi-Fi Network

You can add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID) or add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secured network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch > Add network.
- Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
- Touch SAVE.

#### Connect to a WPS Network

WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) is a feature that makes it easy to add your phone to access points which support WPS.

You can use one of the following two methods to connect your phone to a wireless network using WPS.

Method one: WPS button

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch > Advanced > WPS Push Button.
- 4. Press the WPS button on the access point and the access point will recognize your phone and add it to the network.

#### Method two: PIN number

- 1. Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch > Advanced > WPS Pin Entry.
- 4. The WPS PIN number displays on the screen. Enter the PIN number into the access point's setup page.

After entering the PIN number, your phone automatically finds the access point and configures the connection.



For detailed information about the WPS feature of the access point, please refer to its user documents.

## Forget a Wi-Fi Network

You can make your phone forget about the details of a Wi-Fi network that you added - for example, if you don't want the phone to connect to it automatically or if it is a network that you no longer use.

- 1. Touch the Home Key > iii > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.

- 3. Touch : > Saved networks.
- 4. Touch the Wi-Fi network name and then touch FORGET.

## Adjust Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

- Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Touch > Advanced to adjust the following settings.
  - Network notification: Get notifications in the status bar when Wi-Fi is on and an open network is available.
  - Scanning always available: Let Google's location service and other apps scan for networks even when Wi-Fi is off.
  - Avoid poor connections: Only use Wi-Fi network when the Internet connection is good.
  - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Set whether to keep Wi-Fi on in sleep mode.
  - Wi-Fi frequency band: Set the preferred frequency band on the phone and the hotspot to avoid radio interference.
  - Install certificates: Install certificates needed for connecting to certain Wi-Fi networks.
  - Wi-Fi Direct: Use the Wi-Fi Direct feature. See <u>Using</u> Wi-Fi Direct.
  - WPS Push Button: Connect to a WPS network via the push button method.
  - WPS Pin Entry: Connect to a WPS network via the phone PIN method.
  - MAC address: Check the MAC address.

IP address: Check the phone's IP address.

## **Using Wi-Fi Direct®**

Wi-Fi Direct allows Wi-Fi devices to share files and data directly by connecting to each other without the need for wireless access points (hotspots).

## NOTE:

Activating this feature will disconnect your current Wi-Fi network connection.

- 1. Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Touch > Advanced > Wi-Fi Direct. Your phone will search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct connections.
- Touch a device name below Peer devices and select CONNECT to connect with it. The other device will receive a connection prompt and need to accept the request. Both devices may need to enter a common PIN.
- Once connected the device is displayed as "Connected" in the Wi-Fi Direct screen.

## NOTE:

To start sharing files and data via Wi-Fi, you can select **WiFi Direct** when sharing or install third party apps.

## Connecting to Bluetooth® Devices

Bluetooth $^{\otimes}$  is a short-range wireless communication technology. Phones or other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can

exchange information wirelessly within a distance of about 10 meters (32.8 feet). The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

#### Turn Bluetooth On/Off

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 

  Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On or Off position.

When Bluetooth is on, the \* icon appears in the status bar.

### **Change the Device Name**

- Touch the Home Key > = > Settings > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth is off.
- 3. Touch \* > Rename this device.
- 4. Edit the name and touch RENAME.

#### Pair With Another Bluetooth Device

- 1. Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth is off.

Your phone automatically scans for and displays the IDs of all available Bluetooth devices in range. You could touch > Refresh if you want to scan again.

- 3. Touch the device you want to pair with.
- 4. Confirm that the Bluetooth passkeys are the same between

the two devices and touch **PAIR**. Alternately, enter a Bluetooth passkey and touch **PAIR**.

Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered.



The Bluetooth passkey may be fixed for certain devices such as headsets and handsfree car kits. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys) or refer to the documents for that device

### Forget (Unpair With) a Bluetooth Device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the device again, you need to search it and enter or confirm a passkey again.

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Bluetooth and ensure that Bluetooth is turned on.
- In the list of paired devices, touch the icon beside the Bluetooth device you want to forget.
- 3. Touch FORGET.

#### Send Data via Bluetooth

- Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- Select the option for sharing via Bluetooth. The method may vary by application and data type.
- Touch a Bluetooth device the phone has paired with or wait for it to search for new devices and touch one of them.

#### Receive Data via Bluetooth

- Turn Bluetooth on before trying to receive data via Bluetooth.
- 2. Flick down the status bar and touch \*\*:
- 3. Touch ACCEPT to start receiving the data.

Received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (*Bluetooth*, for instance) in the phone. You can access them with the **File Manager** app. Received contacts (vCard files) are automatically imported to your contact list.

## **Exchanging Data via NFC**

Near Field Communication (NFC) allows your phone to exchange data with another NFC-enabled device when they touch each other or in close proximity.

Depending on the applications that you have installed on your phone, you might be able to use your phone as a transit pass or as an access pass, by tapping the back of your phone against an NFC-enabled access point, subject to applicable terms and conditions from the particular vendor.

To turn on and use NFC:

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 

  > Settings > More.
- 2. Slide the NFC switch to the on position.
- If you want to share web pages, contact information, YouTube videos or other content on your phone to another NFC-capable device, touch Android Beam and slide the switch to the On position.

## **Connecting to Your Computer via USB**

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable and transfer music, pictures, and other files in both directions. Your phone stores these files in its internal storage.

If you are using USB tethering, you must turn that off before you can use USB to transfer files between your phone and computer.

### Connect Your Phone to a Computer via USB

- 1. Connect your phone to the PC with a USB cable.
- Open the notification panel and touch (Connected to/as...).
- 3. Choose one of the following options:
  - ▶ Charge only: Charge your phone via USB.
  - Install driver: Install the driver needed for some USB connection modes (such as MTP).
    - NOTE:

You can also install the driver on PC by running the executable file in the new CD-ROM drive.

 Media device (MTP): Transfer files on Windows<sup>®</sup> PC or Mac<sup>®</sup>

### NOTE:

For Windows XP, please install the drivers and Media Player 11 (or later version) when you use Media device (MTP) for the first time.

Camera (PTP): Transfer photos using camera software.

## NOTE:

To make your phone connect to the computer automatically using the selected connection type, check **Don't ask me again**.

## Connect With Windows Media® Player

You can sync music on your phone and the computer installed with Windows Media Player.

- Connect the phone with your computer via USB and choose Media device (MTP).
- Open Windows Media Player and synchronize music, picture, and video files.

## **Disconnect Your Phone From the Computer**

To disconnect the phone from the computer, simply unplug the USB cable when you're finished.

## **Sharing Your Mobile Data Connection**

You can share your phone's data capabilities through tethering or by activating the Wi-Fi hotspot feature to create a mobile hotspot.

#### Share Your Mobile Data Connection via USB

You can access the Internet on your computer via the USB tethering feature of your phone. The feature needs data connection on a mobile network and may result in data charges.

## NOTE:

You cannot transfer files between your phone and your computer

via USB while the phone is USB tethered.

- 1. Connect your phone to your computer with a USB cable.
- Touch the Home Key > = > Settings > More.
- Touch USB tethering. A new network connection will be created on your computer.

## NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, touch **USB tethering** again or disconnect the USB cable.

### Share Your Mobile Data Connection via Bluetooth

If your computer can obtain an Internet connection via Bluetooth, you can configure your phone to share its mobile data connection with your computer.

- 1. Pair your phone with your computer via Bluetooth.
- Configure your computer to obtain its network connection via Bluetooth. For more information, please see your computer's documents.
- 3. Touch the Home Key > 

  > Settings > More.
- Touch Bluetooth tethering. Your computer is now sharing your phone's data connection.

## NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, touch **Bluetooth tethering** again.

# Share Your Mobile Data Connection as a Wi-Fi Hotspot

You can share your phone's data connection with other devices by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot. The feature needs data connection on a mobile network and may result in data charges.

## NOTE:

When the portable Wi-Fi hotspot feature is enabled, you cannot use your phone's Wi-Fi capability to access the Internet. You still remain connected to the Internet via your mobile data network.

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- Slide the Wi-Fi hotspot switch to the On position. After a moment, the phone starts broadcasting its Wi-Fi network name (SSID).
- On another device, locate your phone via Wi-Fi and connect with it to start using the phone's mobile data.

### NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, touch the **Wi-Fi hotspot** switch to turn the feature off.

## Rename or Secure Your Wi-Fi Hotspot

You can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure your portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

- Touch the Home Key > Settings > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 2. Touch > Configuration.

- 3. Set your name and security options as follows:
  - Network name: Enter or edit a network SSID (name) that other devices see when scanning for Wi-Fi networks.
  - Channel: To avoid interference with other Wi-Fi networks, try using a different channel.
  - Security: Choose a security option, None (not recommended) or WPA2 PSK (other users can access your mobile hotspot only if they enter the correct password). When you select WPA2 PSK, touch the Password field to edit the security password.
  - Broadcast network name (SSID): Check to broadcast or uncheck to hide your network name (SSID). If the broadcast is disabled, other users need to get your network SSID to find the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 4. Touch SAVE to save your settings.

## **Connecting to Virtual Private Networks**

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network.

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

#### Add a VPN

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > More > VPN.
- Touch + at the top right and fill in the information provided by your network administrator.
- Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen.

## NOTE:

You must set a lock screen pattern, PIN or password before using VPN.

#### Connect to a VPN

- Touch the Home Key > = > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Touch the VPN that you want to connect to.
- When prompted, enter any requested credentials, and then touch CONNECT.

## Modify a VPN

- Touch the Home Key > 
   Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Touch and hold the VPN that you want to modify.
- 3. Touch Edit profile and edit the VPN settings you want.
- 4. Touch SAVE.

## **Phone Calls**

You can place calls from the Phone app, the Contacts app, or other apps or widgets that display contact information. Wherever you see a phone number, you can usually touch it to dial.

## **Placing and Ending Calls**

### Place a Call by Dialing

- 1. Touch the Home Key > \sqrt{-.}
- Touch and enter the phone number or the contact name with the dialpad. Touch to delete incorrect digits.
  - NOTE:

As you enter the phone number or the contact name, your phone searches for matching information in your contacts. If you see the number and contact you want to call, touch it to place the call immediately.

Touch below the keypad to dial.

You can also touch the search box at the top of the **Phone** app screen and enter the phone number or contact name you want to call. Touch the matching contact or **Call** [number] to place the call.

## NOTE:

To make an international call, touch and hold the 0 key to enter

the plus (+) symbol. Next, enter the country code, followed by the city/area code and then the phone number.



#### End a Call

During a call, touch on the screen.

## **Answering or Rejecting Calls**

When you receive a phone call, the Incoming Call screen opens, displaying the Caller ID or the information about the caller that you've entered in the **Contacts** app. You can answer or reject the call, or reject it with a text message.

#### Answer a Call

When you receive a phone call, slide down the green bar to answer the call.



To silence the ringer before answering the call, you can press the **Volume Key**, the **Power Key**, the **Camera Key**, the **Home Key**, the **Back Key**, or the **Recent Apps Key**.

### Reject a Call

When you receive a phone call, slide up the red bar to reject the call.

You can also slide up to reject the call and select a preset text message or edit one to send to the caller.



To edit the text response from within the Phone app, touch in the top search field and select **Settings > General settings > Quick responses**.

## Working With the Call Log

The call history is a list of all the calls you've placed, received, or missed. It provides a convenient way to redial a number, return a call, or add a number to your Contacts.

To open the call history, you can touch the **Home Key** > (in the top search field) > **Call History**.

### Place a Call From the Call History

- 1. Open the call history.
- 2. Touch beside a listing to call back.
- NOTE:

You can touch **MISSED**, **OUTGOING**, or **INCOMING** to filter the records by call type.

### Add a Number From Call History as a Contact

- 1. Open the call history.
- 2. Touch the contact icon in front of a listing.
- 3. Touch \* on the contact information tab.

 To add the number to an existing contact, touch a contact in the list. To add a new contact, touch the top right corner.

## Take Other Actions on a Call History Entry

Open the call history and touch a listing to view more call information.

- Touch to delete the entry.
- While viewing the call details, touch > Edit number before call to edit the number in the dialer before calling it.
- Touch the contact icon in front of the entry to open the contact information tab from the bottom, where you can send a message, call back, edit the contact, add the contact to favorites, or add the number to contacts.

### NOTE:

You can touch \* > Clear call log in the call history screen to delete all history records.

## **Calling Your Contacts**

- Touch the Home Key > ... Your favorite contacts and frequently called contacts are displayed in the SPEED DIAL tab.
- Touch a contact to place the call, or touch or swipe to the CONTACTS tab to view all your contacts and touch to make a call.

## **Checking Voicemail**

If you have set the phone to divert calls to voicemail, callers can leave voicemail messages when they cannot reach you. Here's how to check the messages they left.

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > \( \sqrt{-} > \( \blacktriangle \).
- Touch and hold "1" in the dialer. If prompted, enter your voicemail password.
- Follow the voice prompts to listen to and manage your voicemail messages.

## NOTE:

See <u>Set Voicemail</u> for how to set your voicemail service. For detailed information, please contact the service provider.

## **Using Options During a Call**

During a call, you will see a number of onscreen options. Touch an option to select it.

- Touch to view all call options.
- Touch it to switch to the keypad when you need to enter a code (for example, the PIN for your voicemail or bank account) during the call.
- Touch / / / to mute or unmute your microphone.
- Touch 

  / to turn on or off the speakerphone.
- Touch + to make another call separately from the first call,

which is put on hold.

- Touch to open the Contacts app.
- Touch to open the Messaging app.
- Touch II to put the call on hold.
- Touch to put the caller you are speaking to on hold, and switch to the other call that has been put on hold.
- Touch \$\mathbb{\Lambda}\$ to merge the separate calls into a single conference call.

### WARNING!

Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

## **Managing Multi-party Calls**

When the call waiting and three-way call features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call.

## NOTE:

The call waiting and three-way call features need network support and may result in additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information.

#### Switch Between Current Calls

When you're on a call and another call comes in, your phone screen informs you and displays the caller ID.

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Touch (Hold current and answer) to answer the call. (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)
- Touch (End current and answer) to answer the second call and end the first one.
- Touch to reject the second call.
- Touch to reject the second call and select a preset text message or edit one to send to the caller.

#### To switch between two calls:

Touch  $\bigcirc$  >  $\bigcirc$  to switch back to the other call.

## Set Up a Conference Call

With this feature, you can talk to two people at the same time.

- 1. Place the first call.
- Once you have established the connection, touch > +
   and dial the second number. (This puts the first caller on
   hold.)
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, touch  $\bigcirc$  >  $\updownarrow$ . If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

To end the conference call, touch

# **Adjusting Your Call Settings**

### Set Contact Display Options

You can set the order of the contacts displayed in the **CONTACTS** tab of the **Phone** app.

- Touch Sort by or Name format to set the order of the contacts and the format of the contact names.

#### Set Sound and Vibration

Set the sound and vibration for incoming calls as well as dialpad sounds.

- Touch the Home Key > (in the top search field) > Settings > General settings.
- In the Sounds and vibrate section, touch the option you want to configure.
  - Touch Phone ringtone to select the ringtone for incoming call notification.
  - Check Dialpad tones to play sounds when you touch the dialpad keys.
  - Check Also vibrate for calls to enable vibration for incoming call notification.

#### NOTE:

You can set the vibration pattern for incoming call notification.

Touch the Home Key > > \* (in the top search field) > Settings > Call settings > Vibrate pattern and select one.

### **Edit Quick Response to Rejected Callers**

- Touch the Home Key > (in the top search field) > Settings > General settings > Quick responses.
- 2. Touch a text message to edit it.

#### Set Voicemail

- Touch the Home Key > (in the top search field) > Settings > Call settings.
- 2. Touch Voicemail to configure voicemail settings.
  - Touch Service to select the voicemail service provider.
     Your carrier is the default.
  - Touch Setup > Voicemail number to edit the voicemail number.
  - Touch Sound to select the notification sound for new voicemails.
  - Check Vibrate to enable vibration for notification.

### **Use Fixed Dialing Numbers**

Fixed Dialing Numbers (FDN) allows you to restrict outgoing calls to a limited set of phone numbers.

- Touch the Home Key > in the top search field) > Settings > Call settings.
- 2. Touch Fixed Dialing Numbers and the following options are

#### available:

- Enable FDN: Input the PIN2 code to enable the FDN feature.
- Change PIN2: Change the PIN2 code for FDN access.
- ▶ FDN list: Manage the FDN list.



The PIN2 code is provided by your carrier. Entering an incorrect PIN2 code more times than allowed can get your nano-SIM card locked. Contact the service provider for assistance.

#### Set TTY Mode

Select a TTY mode for your phone to work with a teletypewriter, or turn TTY off.

- Select one of the following options. Consult your teletypewriter manufacturer's manual if necessary.
  - TTY Off: Users who can hear and talk can disable TTY support.
  - TTY Full: Users who cannot talk or hear may use this mode to send and receive text messages through a TTY device.
  - TTY HCO: Users who can hear, but cannot talk, may use this mode to listen to conversation of the other party and respond via text messages.
  - ► TTY VCO: Users who can talk, but cannot hear, may use

this mode to talk through the phone and receive responses via text messages.

### **Set Hearing Aids**

Your phone supports HAC (Hearing Aid Compatibility) function. When you turn on the hearing aid compatibility and use a hearing aid with a telecoil to answer the phone, it will help you hear more clearly during the phone call.

- Touch the Home Key > i (in the top search field) > Settings > Call settings.
- 2. Check Hearing aids to turn on hearing aid compatibility.

### **L** CAUTION:

Do not turn on the Hearing aids option unless you use a hearing aid with a telecoil. Using this setting without a hearing aid or with a hearing aid without a telecoil may be harmful to your hearing.

### Set Speed Dials

You can touch and hold the 1 ~ 9 keys from the dialer to call the corresponding speed dial number.

The number key 1 is reserved to speed dial your voicemail.

#### To assign a speed dial key:

- 2. Touch a speed dial key.
- 3. Enter a phone number or select one from the contact list.

4. Touch OK.

#### Set DTMF Tones

You can set the length of Dual-tone multi-frequency (DTMF) signal tones.

- 2. Touch Normal or Long.

### **Call Ended Operation Tips**

When this feature is enabled, the phone will prompt you to call back, send a message to the contact, or add the new number to your contacts after you finish a call.

- Touch the Home Key > i (in the top search field) > Settings > Call settings.
- Check Call ended operations tips to enable this feature.

#### Bar Certain Calls

Call barring feature allows you to forbid certain types of calls from your phone.

- Touch the Home Key > (in the top search field) > Settings > Call settings > Call Barring Settings.
- Set the restriction of specific types of calls from your phone.

### Forward Incoming Calls

Call forwarding feature allows you to forward your incoming calls

to another phone number.

- Touch an available option ( Always forward, When busy, When unanswered, or When unreachable) to enable it.

### Internet Call Settings

#### To add an Internet calling account:

- 2. Touch SIP accounts > ADD ACCOUNT.
- Follow the instructions from your Internet calling service provider to configure the settings for your account.
- 4. Touch SAVE.

#### To configure which calls use Internet calling:

You can configure your phone to use Internet calling (via Wi-Fi or mobile data) to place all calls or just calls to Internet calling addresses.

- Touch Make calls with.
- 3. Select the option you need.
  - If you want to use Internet calling for all calls, touch your SIP account.
  - If you only want to use Internet calling for calls to Internet

- call accounts, touch your mobile network.
- If you want to make a choice each time you make a call, touch Ask first.

#### To automatically stop Internet calls:

You can configure the phone to automatically stop Internet calls when the other party does not support Internet calling.

- Touch Use SIP calling > Only for SIP calls.

#### To configure your phone to receive Internet calls:

By default, your phone is configured to make Internet calls, but not to ensure that you will receive them. But you can configure your phone to listen for Internet calls made to an Internet calling account you added to your phone.

- Check Receive incoming calls. Checking this setting will reduce your battery life between charges.

### **Other Options**

- Touch Caller ID to choose whether your number is displayed when someone receives your outgoing call. Or check Call waiting to get notified of incoming calls during a call.



Please contact the service provider to check whether the caller ID and call waiting features are available.

# **Contacts**

You can put contacts on your phone and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

To see your contacts, touch the **Home Key** > . From there, you can touch the tabs on the top of the screen to quickly switch to contact groups or favorite contacts.

# **Checking Contact Details**

- Touch the Home Key > and touch the CONTACTS tab to access your contact list.
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- 3. Touch a contact to view its details.

### NOTE:

If you have a lot of contacts stored, you'll see a slider on the right side of the screen. Drag the slider to the initial letter you need.

# **Adding a New Contact**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **CONTACTS** tab.
- Touch to add a new contact.
- 3. Touch the account field near the top of the screen to choose

where to save the contact. If a sync account is selected, the contacts will be synced automatically with your account online.

- Enter the contact name, phone numbers, email addresses, and other information.
- 5. Touch \( \square\) to save the contact.

# **Setting Up Your Own Profile**

You can create your own name card in your phone.

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **CONTACTS** tab.
- 2. Touch **Set up my profile**.

If a profile has already been set up, touch the listing below **ME** and touch **\( \rightarrow** \).

- Edit your profile information. Touch ADD ANOTHER FIELD to add more information if you want.
- 4. Touch  $\checkmark$ .

# Importing, Exporting, and Sharing Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to your nano-SIM card or the phone storage. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share contacts using Bluetooth, Google Drive, Wi-Fi Direct, Email, Gmail, Android Beam (NFC), or Messaging.

### Import Contacts From the nano-SIM Card

- Touch the Home Key >
- 2. Touch > Import/Export > Manage SIM card contacts.
- If you have added contact accounts other than the phone, select an account in which to save the contacts.
- 4. Touch : > Import SIM Contacts.
- 5. Check the contacts you need and then touch  $\checkmark$ .

### Import Contacts From the Phone Storage

- Touch the Home Key >
- Touch : > Import/Export > Import from storage.
- If you have added contact accounts other than the phone, select an account in which to save the contacts.
- 4. Select the vCard file(s) and touch OK.

### **Export Contacts to the nano-SIM Card**

- Touch the Home Key >
- 2. Touch > Import/Export > Export to SIM card.
- 3. Check the contacts you need and then touch  $\checkmark$ .

### **Export Contacts to the Phone Storage**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > **=**.
- 2. Touch > Import/Export > Export to storage.
- The phone will prompt you with the name of the vCard file and the directory in which the file will be saved. Touch **OK** to create the file.

#### **Share Contacts**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **CONTACTS** tab.
- 2. Touch > Multi-Select.
- 3. Touch the contacts you want to share and then touch <.
- Choose how to share the contacts. Options depend on the applications and services installed.

# **Working With Favorite Contacts**

In the favorite contacts tab, you can find your favorite contacts and frequently contacted contacts.

#### Add a Contact to Favorites

You can add the contacts you use frequently to **FAVORITES** so that you can find them quickly.

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **CONTACTS** tab.
- Touch a contact and then touch \( \frac{1}{2} \) at the top.

#### Remove a Contact From Favorites

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > 2 and touch the **FAVORITES** tab.
- Touch a favorite contact and then touch \* at the top.

# **Working With Groups**

### **View Your Contact Groups**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **GROUPS** tab.
- Scroll through the list to view the preset groups and any groups you have created.
- 3. Touch a group to view its members.

# NOTE:

To send a message or an email to all or some of the group members, you can touch \* > Send Group message / Send Group email after you open the group.

### Set Up a New Group

- Touch the Home Key > and touch the GROUPS tab.
- 2. Touch ( to create a new group.
- If you have added contact accounts other than the phone, select an account for the new group.
- 4. Touch the **Group's name** field and enter the group name.

- Touch Add member and select the contacts you wish to be the group members.
- 6. Touch  $\checkmark$ .
- Touch the field below RINGTONE to select the ringtone for incoming calls from the group members.
- 8. Touch OK.
- 9. Touch \( \square\) to save the group.

### **Delete a Group**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **GROUPS** tab.
- 2. Touch a group and then touch : > Delete.
- Touch **OK** to disband the group. The contacts in the group will not be deleted

### **Edit a Group**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > and touch the **GROUPS** tab.
- 2. Touch a group and then touch : > Edit.
- Touch the group name to edit it, or touch the field below MEMBER or RINGTONE to add more members or change the ringtone.
- NOTE:

To remove group members, touch a group in the **GROUPS** tab and touch **> Multi-Select** to choose members. Then touch



# **Searching for a Contact**

- 1. Touch the Home Key > <a> </a>
- 2. Touch Q at the top of the screen.
- Input the contact name or any information the contact has to search for it. The contacts matched will be listed.

# **Editing Contacts**

#### **Edit Contact Details**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** >
- Touch a contact you need to edit and then touch .
- Edit the contact and touch

### Set a Ringtone for a Contact

Assign a special ringtone to a contact, so you know who is calling when you hear the ringtone.

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 2.
- Touch a contact you want to set a ringtone for and then touch
   Set ringtone.
- 3. Select a ringtone you like and touch OK.

#### **Delete Contacts**

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** > **=**.
- 2. Touch > Multi-Select.
- Touch to select the contacts you want to remove and then touch .
- 4. Touch OK to confirm.

#### Join Contacts

As your phone synchronizes with multiple online accounts, you may see duplicate entries for the same contact. You can merge all the separate information of a contact into one entry in the Contacts list

- 1. Touch the Home Key > ==.
- Touch a contact entry to display the contact's details and then touch
- Touch > Join.
- Touch the contact whose information you want to join with the first entry.
- 5. Touch  $\checkmark$ .

The information from the second contact is added to the first, and the second contact is no longer displayed in the **CONTACTS** list.

You can repeat these steps to join another contact to the main contact.

### Separate Contact Information

If contact information from different sources was joined in error, you can separate the information back into individual contacts on your phone.

- 1. Touch the **Home Key** >
- Touch a contact entry you have merged and want to separate.
- 3. Touch .
- 4. Touch > Separate.
- 5. Touch **OK** to confirm.

# **Web Accounts**

# **Adding or Removing Accounts**

You can add multiple Google accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync® accounts. You may also add other kinds of accounts depending on the apps installed on your phone.

#### Add an Account

- From the home screen, touch > Settings > Accounts > Add account.
- 2. Touch the type of account you want to add.
- Follow the onscreen steps to enter the information about the account. Most accounts require a username and password, but the details may vary. You may also need to obtain some information from IT support or your system administrator.

When the account is successfully added, it is displayed in the **Accounts** list.

#### Remove an Account

Removing an account will delete it and all information associated with it from your phone, such as emails and contacts.

- 1. From the home screen, touch => Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Touch the account category in the list and then touch the

account.

3. Touch > Remove account > REMOVE ACCOUNT.

# Configuring Account Sync

### **Configure Auto Sync Setting**

- From the home screen, touch > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Touch and check or uncheck Auto-sync data.
  - When automatic sync is turned on, changes you make to information on your phone or on the web are automatically synced with each other.
  - When automatic sync is turned off, you need to sync manually to collect emails, updates, or other recent information.

### NOTE:

You can also turn on or off auto sync in the Quick Settings screen. See <u>Use Quick Settings</u>.

### Sync Manually

- 1. From the home screen, touch => Settings > Accounts.
- Touch the account category and then the account you want to sync.
- 3. Touch > Sync now.

### Change an Account's Sync Settings

- From the home screen, touch > Settings > Accounts.
- Touch the account category and then the account. The Sync screen appears, showing a list of information the account can sync.
- When auto-sync is enabled, check or uncheck items as you need. Checked types of information on the phone and the web will be kept in auto-sync. When auto-sync is disabled, touch a listing to sync that type of information between the phone and the web.

# **Email**

Touch in the home screen and select **Email** to receive and send emails from your webmail or other accounts, using POP3 or IMAP, or access your Exchange ActiveSync account for your corporate email needs.

# Setting Up the First Email Account

- Touch the Home Key > 
   = > Email.
- Select an email server and enter the email address and password.
- Touch Next to let the phone retrieve the network parameters automatically.
  - NOTE:

You can also enter these details manually by touching **Manual setup** or when automatic setup fails.

 Follow the on-screen instructions to finish the setup.
 Your phone will show the inbox of the email account and start to download email messages.

# **Checking Your Emails**

Your phone can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

You can also check new emails manually by dragging down on the message list.

To check earlier emails for your IMAP or POP3 accounts, swipe upwards to the bottom of the message list and touch Load more messages.

# Responding to an Email

You can reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

### Reply to or Forward an Email

- Open the email you want to reply to or forward from Inbox.
- 2. Do the following as you need.
  - To reply to the sender, touch
  - ▶ To reply to the sender and all recipients of the original email\_touch <
  - To forward the email to someone else, touch



3. Edit your message and touch .

#### Mark an Email as Unread

You can return a read email to the unread state - for example, to remind yourself to read it again later. You can also mark a batch of emails as unread.

While reading a message, touch : > Mark as unread.

 While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), touch the checkboxes before the messages and then touch ...

#### Delete an Email

You can delete an email from its folder. You can also delete a batch of emails.

- While reading a message, touch > OK.
- While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), touch the checkboxes before the messages and then touch **> OK**.

# Writing and Sending an Email

Open your email Inbox and touch



### NOTE:

If you have more than one email account added on the phone, touch the sender line to select the account you want to use for sending the message.

2. Enter a contact name or email address in the 'To' field. Separate each recipient with a comma. You can also touch to select recipients from your contacts.

#### NOTE:

Touch : > Add Cc/Bcc to send a carbon copy or blind carbon copy to other recipients.

3. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.

- Touch \* > Attach file to add audio files, images, videos and other types of files as attachments.
- Touch at the top right of the screen to send the message.

# **Adding and Editing Email Accounts**

#### Add an Email Account

After setting up your first email account (see <u>Setting Up the</u> <u>First Email Account</u>), you can add more email accounts and manage them separately.

- 1. Open Email to get the Inbox screen.
- 2. Touch > Settings > ADD ACCOUNT.
- Follow the prompts to set up the account as you did with the first one.

#### **Edit an Email Account**

You can change a number of settings for an account, including how often you check for email, how you're notified of new mails, your email signature, and details about the servers the account uses to send and receive mails.

- 1. Open Email to get the Inbox screen.
- Touch > Settings and touch the account whose settings you want to change.
- 3. Make the changes you want and touch the Back Key when

you finish.

# **Changing General Email Settings**

General settings apply to all email accounts you add.

- 1. Open Email to get the Inbox screen.
- 2. Touch > Settings > General.
- Make the changes and touch the Back Key when you finish.

# Messaging

You can use Messaging to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS).

# **Opening the Messaging Screen**

Touch in the home screen.

The **Messaging** screen opens where you can create a new message, search for messages, or open an ongoing message thread.

- Touch to write a new text or multimedia message.
- Touch Q to search for a message using keywords.
- Touch an existing message thread to open the conversation you've had with a certain number.

# **Sending a Message**

- 1. On the **Messaging** screen, touch at the bottom.
- 2. Add recipients by one of the following ways.
  - Touch the To field and manually enter the recipient's number or the contact name. If the phone presents a few suggestions, touch the one you want to add.
  - Select recipients from your contacts or call log by

touching 🔔.

- Touch the Type message field and enter the content of your message.
- If you want to send a multimedia message, touch > Add subject to add a message subject or touch the paper clip icon to attach a file or a slideshow to the message.
- 5. Touch > or SEND.
- NOTE:

You can also include email addresses as recipients for multimedia messages.

NOTE:

Do not add a message subject or any attachment if you want to send a text message. Otherwise you may be charged for a multimedia message.

# Replying to a Message

Messages you receive are appended to existing threads for the same number. If the new message comes from a new number, a new thread is created

- On the Messaging screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to reply to.
- Type your reply in the text box at the bottom. You can touch if you want to reply with an MMS.

Touch ▶ or SEND.

### Forwarding a Message

- On the Messaging screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to forward.
- 2. Touch the message.
- 3. Touch Forward in the menu that opens.
- Enter a recipient for the message and edit the content if you want
- Touch or SEND.

# Copying a Message

You can copy text messages in the phone storage to the nano-SIM card, or vice versa.

To copy a text message from the phone to the nano-SIM card:

- On the Messaging screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to copy.
- 2. Touch the message and then touch Copy to SIM card.

To copy a text message from the nano-SIM card to the phone:

- On the Messaging screen, touch > Settings > Manage SIM card messages.
- Touch and hold a message and then touch Copy to phone memory.

# **Changing Messaging Settings**

Touch \* > Settings in the Messaging screen to change messaging settings.

# Calendar

Calendar on the phone works with the web-based Google Calendar™ service for creating and managing events, meetings, and appointments. It also works with the Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync calendar once you sign into your Exchange account on the phone.

To open Calendar, touch in the home screen and select Calendar

# **Viewing Your Calendars and Events**

### Select Visible Calendars

- 1. Open the Calendar app.
- 2. Touch > Calendars to display.
- In the new screen, touch the calendars to check the calendars you want to see or uncheck the calendars you'd like to hide.

Events from hidden calendars are not shown in the Calendar app.

### **Change Calendar Views**

You can view your calendars in different forms. The app offers four views: Month, Week, Day, and Agenda.

To change calendar views, touch the current view at the top left and select the view you prefer. Touch a day block in Month view to switch to Day view or Agenda view.

- In Month view, swipe vertically to see previous months and future months.
- In Week or Day view, swipe horizontally to see previous weeks/days and future weeks/days.
- When you are viewing past or future days, weeks, or months, touch at the top right to quickly switch to today.

#### View Event Details

In Agenda, Day, or Week view, touch an event to view its details.

In Month view, touch a day to switch to Day view or Agenda view. Then touch an event to view its details.

# Creating an Event

- In any Calendar view, touch + at the top.
   You can also touch a spot in Day or Week view twice to add an event to that time spot.
- If you have more than one calendar account, touch the current account above the Event name box to choose one.
- 3. Enter the event details and touch SAVE.



You can also create a new event by copying the details of an existing event. Just open the event details screen and touch > Copy. Then edit the new event information and touch SAVE

# **Editing, Deleting or Sharing an Event**

- 1. Find the event you want to edit, delete, or share.
- Open its details screen (see <u>View Event Details</u> in this chapter).

3. Do one of the following as you need.

To	do
Edit the event,	Touch at the top of the screen. Touch SAVE to save your changes.
Delete the event,	Touch at the top of the screen and then touch <b>OK</b> .
Share the event,	Touch : > Share and choose how to share.

# **Changing Calendar Settings**

To change Calendar settings, open a Calendar view (Day, Week, Month, or Agenda) and touch > Settings.

You can change General settings, which apply to all accounts, or other settings that only apply to specific accounts.

# Web Browser

Use Chrome to view web pages and search for information.

# **Opening the Browser**

Touch in the home screen and select Chrome. The last web page you were viewing is displayed. If you have not used Chrome recently, your home page opens.

Chrome also opens when you touch a web link - for example, in an email or a text message.

- Open the Chrome app.
- 2. Touch the address box at the top of the web page.
- Enter the address (URL) of a web page or enter terms you want to search for. You can also touch \$\iiiit\\$ to search by voice.
- Touch a URL or search suggestion or touch Go / on the keyboard to open the web page or search results.
- NOTE:

Touch : > X if you want to stop opening the page.

NOTE:

Touch \* > New tab to open a new web page in a new tab.

# **Downloading Files**

Touch and hold an image or a link to a file or to another web page. In the menu that opens, touch **Save image** or **Save link**.

The downloaded files are saved to your phone. You can view or open them in the **Downloads** app.

# **Changing Chrome Settings**

You can configure a number of settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several that you can use to control your privacy.

To open the Chrome settings screen, touch \* > Settings.

# Camera

You can use your phone to take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored on the phone's internal storage. You can copy them to your computer or access them in the **Gallery** app.

### **Capturing a Photo**

- Touch Camera in the home screen.
- Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustment. Auto camera mode is used by default.



Number	Function
1	Switch between the front and back cameras.
2	Set a time delay before the camera takes a picture

Number	Function
	automatically after you touch the shutter icon.
3	Turn on or off the High-Dynamic Range feature, only available for the back camera.
4	Change the flash setting, only available for the back camera.
5	Change the camera settings.
6	View pictures and videos you have taken.
7	Select a color effect or other special effects.
8	Capture a picture.
9	Capture a video clip.
10	Select a camera or camcorder mode for the back camera. In addition to the default AUTO mode, you can touch <b>APER</b> to adjust aperture or touch <b>FUN</b> to switch to other modes.



Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not point the flash towards the eyes of people or animals.

### NOTE:

You can spread or pinch on the screen or press the **Volume Key** to zoom in or out before taking pictures.

- Touch the area where you want the camera to focus, or leave the camera to autofocus on the center of the image.
- 4. Lightly touch .



When you use the front camera, you can also touch  $\circlearrowleft$  or  $\circlearrowleft$ to adjust beauty face or smile detection setting.







You can record a normal-speed or slow motion video clip.

- Touch Camera in the home screen.
- 2. Aim the camera at the subject. You can touch any area on the screen that you want the camcorder to focus on before and during recording.

## NOTE:

You can spread or pinch on the screen or press the Volume **Key** to zoom in or out before and during recording.

- 3. If you want to record a slow motion video, touch FUN > SLOW MOTION.
- 4. Touch to start recording a normal-speed video clip, or touch (x) to record a low motion video.

## NOTE:

While the recording is in progress, you can touch (11) to pause the recording. For normal-speed video recording, you can also touch (a) to save the frame as a separate photo.

5. Touch or to stop recording.

# **Using Other Camera Modes**

Besides capturing photos and videos in the traditional way, your camera app offers other powerful and interesting camera modes. Touch **FUN** in the viewfinder screen to find them all.

- PANORAMA: Capture panorama pictures.
- MULTI-EXPOSURE: Capture two pictures for collage.
- MANUAL: Adjust some professional photographic parameters like exposure, ISO, white balance and more.
- SPORT: Keep the focus on moving objects.
- SLOW MOTION: Capture slow motion video clips.
- INTERVAL: Capture time lapse pictures at the interval you select.

# **Using the Manual Camera**

You can use manual camera mode to adjust more camera options for you photo such as ISO, white balance, exposure, etc.

- 1. Touch Camera in the home screen.
- 2. Touch FUN > MANUAL.
- Aim the camera at the subject and you can make the following adjustments.
  - Drag to any area on the screen that you want to focus on.

## Touch to adjust shutter speed.

- Touch > Picture size to set the image size for your photo.
- Touch Solution > Grid to show the grid or the golden spiral, or hide it.
- ➤ Touch 🔯 > Gradienter to enable or disable the gradienter.
- 4. Touch the shutter icon (a) to take the photo.

# Customizing Camera/Camcorder Settings

Before capturing a photo or a video, you can touch to open the following camera and camcorder setting options.

## NOTE:

Not all options are available for the front camera or the back camera.

#### CAMERA

- Picture size: Available for the front camera. You can set the image size for your photo.
- Full screen: Available for the back camera. Set the viewfinder screen as full screen or not when the back camera is in use.
- Point-and-shoot: Available for the front camera. When this feature is enabled, you can touch the viewfinder screen to take a photo using the front camera.
- Shutter tone: Change the shutter tone.
- Geo-tagging: Select whether to store the GPS location in your captured photos and videos.
- Restore defaults: Restore default camera and video settings.

#### VIDEO

Video quality: Set the quality for your video.

- Time lapse: Set the time interval between each frame when you shot time lapse videos with the back camera.
- Focus lock when recording: Select whether to lock the focus point on the center of the screen during video recording using the back camera.
- Geo-tagging: Select whether to store the GPS location in your captured photos and videos.
- Restore defaults: Restore default camera and camcorder settings.

# **Opening Gallery**

Touch in the home screen to view albums of your pictures and videos.

## **Working With Albums**

When you open Gallery, all pictures and videos on your phone are displayed in a number of albums. Swipe up and down to see them all.

#### To view album contents:

Touch an album to view the pictures and videos it contains.

#### To share albums, pictures, or videos:

- Touch and hold an album to select it or touch and hold an item after you open an album to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Touch more items that you want to share.
- 3. Touch sand select how you want to share the items.

#### To delete albums, pictures, or videos:

- Touch and hold an album to select it or touch and hold an item after you open an album to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Touch more items that you want to delete.
- 3. Touch **i** > OK.

#### To hide albums:

- 1. Touch and hold an album to select it.
- 2. Touch more albums that you want to hide.
- Touch > OK.
- NOTE:

To show the hidden albums again, touch > Settings > Manage hidden albums. Touch the albums you want to restore and touch Show at the bottom.

## **Working With Pictures**

Touch a picture in an album to view the picture in full screen.



When viewing a picture in full screen, the following features are available.

- Swipe horizontally to see more pictures or videos.
- Pinch a picture or video to make it smaller. You'll then see a filmstrip-style view of all your pictures and videos in a row.
   Swipe left or right to scan through them all.

#### NOTE:

You can delete a picture or video by swiping it up or down in the filmstrip view. If you accidentally delete one, touch **UNDO** to retrieve it.

- Double-tap the picture, or pinch two fingers together or spread them apart to zoom out or in.
- Touch \* to share, edit, rename, or print the picture, set it as wallpaper or contact photo, edit its tags, check file details, or browse the album contents in a slideshow.
- Touch to delete the picture.
- Touch to manage picture tags.
- Touch \( \frac{1}{2} \) / \( \frac{1}{2} \) to rotate the picture.

#### NOTE:

Some options may not be available for certain albums or pictures.

# **Retouching Your Pictures**

You can edit any photos you took and some other pictures in

**Gallery**. The changed picture is saved in the same album as the original image, which is not affected.

- Touch > Edit while viewing a picture in full screen to open the Photo Editor interface.
- Touch an edit option along the bottom of the screen and edit the picture.

#### NOTE:

Slide left or right on the bottom of the screen to find all options.

- Apply filters and old photo effects.
- Crop, straighten, rotate, or flip (mirror) the picture.
- Adjust exposure, saturation, hue, sharpness, and other colour options.
- Add a frame to the picture.
- Decorate people in the picture with comical moustaches, eye glasses, hats and more.
- Apply a blur effect to the picture.
- Select a color and draw anything on the picture.
  - Add some text to the picture and adjust its effect.
- 3. Touch to keep the change or to cancel it.
- 4. Touch to save the new picture.
- NOTE:

Touch in the **Photo Editor** screen to see the edits you have

# Making a GIF Picture or a Collage

You can put together a few pictures in the same album to make an animated GIF picture or a collage of pictures.

- Open the Gallery app and touch > Gif maker or Collage maker.
- 2. Touch an album.
- 3. Touch the pictures you need.
  - To make a GIF, touch 2 to 50 pictures in the order or reverse to the order that you want them to appear in the GIF.
  - ▶ To make a collage, touch 2 to 9 pictures.

The pictures you touched are displayed along the bottom.

- Touch to remove the pictures you do not need.
- 4. Touch Next. The GIF or collage is displayed.
- Touch the options along the bottom to adjust the final picture.
  - For GIF, you can adjust the speed, order, and size, or touch More to add more pictures to the GIF or change their order
  - For collage, touch Template, Free, or Mosaic and then select a border, shading and style.
- 6. When you are satisfied with the final picture, touch  $\Box$  to

save the GIF or touch to save the collage.

The picture is saved to the *zte\_editor/save* folder in your phone storage.

## **Playing Videos**

- Touch an album in the gallery and then touch the thumbnail of a video.
- Touch at the center and select a player to start playing. Touch the video to view the playback controls.

In the **Video Player**, you can touch  $\Box$  to play the video in a small floating window and continue with other tasks on the phone.

# **Copying Music Files to Your Phone**

Before using Music, you need to copy or download audio files to your phone.

## Copy From a Computer

- Connect your phone and the computer with a USB cable.
- Touch Media device (MTP) as the connection mode. See Connect Your Phone to a Computer via USB.
- Copy the music file from the PC and paste it to the phone storage.

#### Download From the Internet

You can download music files when browsing web pages. See <u>Downloading Files</u>.

#### Receive via Bluetooth

You can receive music files from other devices via Bluetooth.

# **Viewing Your Music Library**

- Touch Playlists to view all music playlists created by you or automatically.
- Touch Artists/Albums to browse music files on your phone organized by the artist or album name.
- Touch Songs to view all music files on your phone.
- Touch Rock My Run to open the RockMyRun app and access your music for running.

## NOTE:

If an audio file is being played, its name and player controls are displayed at the bottom of the screen. Touch the area to open the playback screen.

## NOTE:

Touch ≡ and select **Settings** to configure **Music** app options, or select **Exit** to close the app.

# Setting a Song as the Default Ringtone

The song will be used as the ringtone for all incoming calls, except those from contacts to whom you have assigned special ringtones (see <u>Set a Ringtone for a Contact</u>).



# **Playing Music**

# **Managing Playlists**

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

- Touch \* > Add to next to a song to add it to a playlist or create a new playlist.
- Touch > Delete next to a playlist to delete the playlist.
- Touch > Rename next to a playlist to rename the playlist.
- Touch a playlist to view its content. You can touch and hold a song to select multiple songs for removal from the playlist.

## NOTE:

The above options may not be available for certain automatically created playlists, such as **Recently Added**.

# Video Player

Use the Video Player app to manage your video library and to watch videos.

# Opening the Video Library

Touch in the home screen and select **Video Player** to view your video library, where your video files are displayed in a list. Swipe up or down to find the video you want. You can also touch to search for video files, or touch > **View by** or **Sort by** to change the display mode or sort the list.

# Playing and Controlling Videos

Touch a video in the video library to play it. Touch the video to show the playback controls. You can control the video and audio or carry out other operations.

- Touch the play/pause button at the bottom to pause or resume the playback.
- · Slide horizontally on the video to rewind or fast forward.
- Slide vertically on the right or left part of the screen to adjust volume or brightness.

- Touch y or to change the video ratio.
- Touch \( \frac{1}{2} \) to rotate the video.
- Touch to hide the control panel.
- Touch or to play the video in a small window and continue with other tasks on the phone.
- Touch o to capture a screenshot.
- Touch to manage the Dolby Audio effects.
- Touch to share, trim or delete the video, or configure player settings.

# **Managing Video Files**

## **Delete Video Clips**

- 1. Touch and hold a video in the video library.
- 2. Check other videos you want to delete.
- 3. Touch 👚 > **OK**.

## Share Video Clips

- 1. Touch and hold a video in the video library.
- 2. Touch other videos you want to share.
- 3. Touch sand select how you want to share them.

## Trim a Video Clip

- 1. Touch a video to start playing it.
- 2. Touch > Trim.
- Drag the two tabs on the progress bar to select the portion you want to keep.

If necessary, touch be to preview the selected portion.

4. Touch . The trimmed video is saved as a new video file.

# FM Radio

With the FM radio, you can search for radio channels, listen to them, and save them on your phone. Note that the quality of the radio broadcast depends on the coverage of the radio station in your area. The wired headset that comes with your phone works as an antenna, so always connect the headset when using the radio. When you receive an incoming call while listening to the radio, the radio will be turned off.

# **Scanning and Saving Channels**

Plug in a wired headset and touch the Home Key > 
> 
FM

Radio > 

Scan, you phone scans for all available channels
and saves them to the All channels list



Touch **=** > All channels to view the list of saved channels. Every scan will remove all previously saved channels, but you can keep favorite channels by checking **Keep favorite**.

# Listening to FM Radio

- Touch the Home Key > 
   = > FM Radio while the headset is connected.
- Touch > All channels and select a channel.

You can also touch or both to switch to other channels.



- Touch add the channel to favorites. Favorite channels are put on the FM Radio main screen.
- You can save at most 16 channels to favorites.

## **Editing a Saved Channel**

- Open the FM Radio app and touch > All channels to display the list of saved channels.
- Touch and hold a channel and select Rename or Delete, or touch the box to the right of a channel to add it to favorites.

## Other Options and Settings

To turn off FM radio automatically:

A count-down clock appears above the frequency and the radio is turned off when the clock counts down to 0:00.

To turn off FM radio immediately:

Touch = > Exit.

To set your radio region:

FM radio frequency ranges differ in different regions.

Touch **= > FM frequency range** to select the region you are

in.



If you change the region setting, previously saved channels are not shown until you switch back to the original region setting.

Touch the or at tab in the **Clock** app to use the stopwatch or the countdown timer.

Stopwatch allows you to record lap times (20 laps at most), while countdown allows you to set a time and count down to zero.

The **Downloads** app keeps a record of the files you have downloaded using apps such as **Chrome** or **Email**.

- Touch + to create a new folder in the current directory.

#### **Mi-Moment**

Touch the Home Key > iii > Mi-Moment to create, view and

manage your notes. You can add audios, pictures, videos and other types of files to your notes, and store the notes in different folders.

## NOTE:

Touch : > Settings to set up a lock password. You can lock your notes with the password to protect your personal information.

#### Sound Recorder

**Sound Recorder** enables you to record voice memos and listen to them whenever you like.

#### Record a Voice Memo

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 

  > Sound Recorder.
- 2. Slide the HQ switch to turn on or off high quality recording.
- Touch to start recording. During recording, you can do the following:

  - ► Touch X to cancel the recording.
- Touch to stop recording. The memo is automatically saved.

- Touch the APPS tab to manage all the apps on your phone.
- Touch the RESOURCES tab to view the real-time use of the system resources (CPU, RAM and storage).

# **Google Apps**

Open the Google apps to use Google services. Some apps are put in the **Google** folder on the home screen.

#### NOTE:

Some contents or Google services may not be available in your region.

- Chrome: Use the Chrome app to browse the Internet and get your bookmarks, browsing history, and more synced with your Google account.
- Drive: Store files on Google servers for free after you sign in to your Google account. You can access them on your computers, your phones and other devices, share them, or collaborate with others.

Touch the Home Key > > Settings > More > Bluetooth tethering to share your phone's mobile data with connected Bluetooth devices. See Share Your Mobile Data Connection via Bluetooth.

## Storage

Touch **Used space** to get a detailed breakdown of space usage by type. Touch a data type to see more information or delete the files you do not need.

## **Power Manager**

You can touch an app to adjust its settings in order to save battery life. For example, touch **Screen > DISPLAY** to change screen brightness and sleep.

 MODE: Enable the power saving mode you need. Touch a mode to get its detailed information.

## **Apps**

Touch the **Home Key** > **(a)** > **Settings** > **Apps** to see apps installed on your phone and manage them.

Touch an app in the **DOWNLOADED**, **RUNNING**, or **ALL** tab to see its information. You can stop the app, disable or enable it, uninstall it, or clear its data, cache or defaults.

#### Users

If needed, turn on **Open Voice search when the phone is woken up** to launch Google search when you wake up the phone.

#### Location

Touch the **Home Key > > Settings > Location** to manage location services, which help your phone and apps determine your location. To use location-related applications, such as finding your location on Google Maps, you must have location services turned on on your phone.

- Slide the switch at the top to turn location services on or off.
- When location is enabled, touch **Mode** to select location sources you want to use.
  - High accuracy: Get accurate location using both GPS and Wi-Fi as well as mobile networks.
  - Battery saving: Use only Wi-Fi and mobile networks to get your approximate location. This will drain less power from your battery than using GPS.
  - Device only: Use GPS to pinpoint your location.

option is available when unlock pattern is set.

- Automatically lock: Set the time needed for the lock protection to be activated after the screen turns off. This option is available when unlock pattern, PIN or password is set.
- Power button instantly locks: Lock protection is activated immediately when you press the Power Key. This option is available when unlock pattern, PIN or password is set.
- Owner info: Set the text that you may display on the lock screen.
- Smart Lock: Keep the phone unlocked when connected to trusted devices or in trusted places.

- Automatic restore: Restore previously backed up settings and data when you reinstall an app.
- Factory data reset: Reset your phone to factory default settings. All your data will be erased during the process.

#### Accounts

Touch the Home Key > > Settings > Backup & reset to manage your web accounts and synchronization. Touch Add account to sign in to or create accounts on your phone.

Touch an account type to see that type of accounts you have added and adjust the accounts settings.

## Accessibility

Touch the **Home Key** > **Settings** > **Accessibility** to configure accessibility plug-ins and services on your phone, such as using **Color inversion** or **Large text** for users with sight problems.

Touch the Home Key > Settings > About phone to view important phone information and legal information. You can also touch System updates > Software Update to check for system updates and install them when they become available.

- Use the one-press upgrade package offered by your mobile service provider.

## Gas Stations and Explosive Atmospheres

Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fueling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas posted power off "two-way radios" or "electronic devices" to avoid interfering with blasting operations.
