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Declaration

We, ZTE Corporation, declared that:

- The product is installed with battery separately in the box. The FCC ID label is placed on the mobile phone clearly visible to all persons at the time of purchase.
- The user is cautioned that changes or modifications not expressly approved by the manufacturer could void the user's authority to operate the equipment.
- This device complies with part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions:
 - (1) This device may not cause harmful interference, and
 - (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.
- Do not attempt to disassemble the mobile phone and battery by yourself. Non-expert handling of the devices may damage them.
- Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications
- Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific

organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health. The exposure standard for wireless fixed phoned employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limits set by the FCC are 1.6W/kg. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting as its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the output power.

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1 General Information

1.1 Welcome

Thank you for choosing ZTE-C F285 CDMA 1X Digital Mobile Phone.

To guarantee the mobile phone always in its best condition, please read this manual carefully and keep it for future use.

The pictures, symbols and contents in this manual are just for your reference. They might not be completely identical with your phone. Please subject to the real object. ZTE operates a policy of continuous development and reserves the right to update and modify the technical specifications in this document at any time without prior notice.

1.2 Security

- If your mobile phone is lost or stolen, please report to your service provider or agencies of block your lost UIM card and phone, which will protect you from economic losses resulted from unauthorized use.
 - You need to provide the phone's ESN number labeled. You can see ESN number after removing the battery. Please keep ESN number for future use.
- To protect your mobile phone from illegal use, please take the

security measures as follows:

- Set PIN code of the UIM card.
- Take it with you as you can.

1.3 Safety Warnings



To the Owner

- Some electronic devices are susceptible to electromagnetic interference sent by mobile phone if inadequately shielded, such as electronic system of vehicles. Please consult the manufacturer on the device before using the phone if necessary.
- Operating of mobile phone may interfere with medical devices like hearing aides and pacemakers. Please always keep the mobile phone more than 20 centimeters away from such medical devices when the phone is powered on. Consult a physician or the manufacturer on the medical device before using the phone.
- Beware of the usage limitation when using a mobile phone at places such as oil warehouses or chemical factories, where there are explosive gases or explosive products being processed, because even if your phone is in standby mode, it still transmits radio frequency (RF) energy. Therefore, power off your phone if required.
- Pay attention to traffic safety. Do not use your mobile phone while driving. Park before making or answering a call.
- Store the phone out of the reach of little children. The phone may

cause injury if used as a toy.

Mobile Phone

- Please use original accessories or accessories that are authorized by the manufacturer. Using any unauthorized accessories may affect your mobile phone's performance, or even endanger your body
- If you want to clean your phone, please use clean fabric that is a bit wet or anti-static. Do not use harsh chemical cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean it. Turn off your phone before you clean it.
- As your mobile phone can produce electromagnetic field, do not place it near magnetic items such as computer disks.
- Using the phone near electrical appliances such as TV, telephone, radio and personal computer can cause interference, which affects the function of the phone.
- Do not expose your mobile phone to direct sunlight or store it in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices.

Battery



2.4 Battery


The attached Li-ion battery along with the phone can be used after unpacking. For the first three times, please use up the power and charge it fully for a new battery to perform well.

2.4.1 Remove and Install the Battery

Remove: (1) Press and push the back-cover of the phone down to release and remove it off the phone. (2) Put outward from the bottom to remove the battery as indicated in the figure.



◆ Install: (1) Replace the battery into the battery slot, to be noted that the upper end of the battery firstly inserted. (2) Slide the cover back as shown below.



2.4.2 Charge the Battery



- As shown in the picture, connect the lead of the charger to the socket at the side of the handset. (Note: The side with arrow should be upright while connecting).
- ♦ Connect the charger to a standard wall AC socket.
- The charging indicator lights up after connecting. In power-off mode while charging, the display only shows the charge indicator. If the battery is completely used up, it may take for a

- while before the charging indicator appears on the display.
- ♦ When the charging animation on the screen stops, the charging is completed. The charging takes usually up to 2~3 hours. During charging, it is a normal phenomenon that the battery, phone and charger may get hot.
- ♦ After the completion of charging, disconnect the charger from the phone and AC socket.

Note:

- When it is in charge, place the phone on condition of good ventilation and temperature between -30°C∼+60°C. Ensure to use the charger offered by the manufacturer. Using unauthorized charger may cause danger and violate the authorization of the phone and the guarantee article.
- When the phone is automatically switched off or indicates the alarm for low battery, please recharge the battery soon.
- Talk time or standby time of the phone is based on ideal working environment. In practice, the talk time and standby time of battery varies with network condition, working environment and application methods.

2.5 Connect to the Network

2.5.1 UIM Card

Before using the phone, please insert effective UIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card into the phone.

All the information related to the network connection is recorded in the metal plane area of UIM card together with the information you stored in your Contacts in the UIM card. The UIM card can be inserted into any CDMA phone to use (new phone automatically reads UIM card).

Please do not touch the metal plane area of the card to avoid missing and damaging information in the card and put UIM card in place far away from electricity and magnetism.

Warning: Please power off the phone before taking out UIM card. It is prohibited to insert or taking out UIM card in the condition of connecting with external power.

2.5.2 Insert and Remove UIM Card

- Power off the phone, remove the battery and other external power.
- Insert UIM card into UIM card slot in the phone.
- Pull out UIM card out of slot, as shown in picture hereinafter.



2.5.3 Power on/off Phone

Press and hold **End key** to power on/off the phone.The phone will check whether UIM card inserted or not. And then follow the indication on the display:

Enter PIN——Key in PIN code of UIM card if it is set.

Searching—Search appropriate network connected.

2.5.4 PIN Code

To set PIN code (personal identification number) is to avoid the illegal usage of UIM card.

To input PIN code of UIM card and press **OK key** to confirm to start on using phone. If wrong PIN is entered several times continuously, then UIM card will be locked by network.

Note: The network provider offers you PIN code (four to eight digits). You should change PIN code as soon as possible for security.

Different UIM card has different limits for wrong PIN code times

To set PIN code, see "9.4 Security Settings".

2.5.5 Connect the Network

After powering on and inputting PIN code, the phone automatically searches the network available and in state of standby mode.



Besides sending and receiving calls, you can also do:

- Press Left select key to enter main Menu.
- Press Right select key to enter Contacts menu.

- Press OK key to enter Voice Services.
- ♦ Hold # key to enable/disable vibration.
- ♦ Hold **Up key** to enter **General** menu.
- ◆ Press **Up key** to enter **Profile** menu.
- Press Down key to active Radio function.
- ♦ Press **Left key** to enter **Schedule** menu.
- Press Right key to enter Messages menu.
- ◆ Press **Send key** to view All recent calls.

3 Basic Operations

3.1 Make a Call

Please ensure that you are in good service coverage area. Examine network signal strength icon in the screen.



More bars indicate good signalr or network coverage. If there is no bar, please move to good network coverage. Sometimes, you only need to change the direction.

♦ Make a National Call

Press **Number key** to key in phone number, and add area code when making a long distance call (no need to add area code when dialing local number in some area). Press **Send key** to call out. Press **End key** to end the call.

♦ Make an International Call

Enter the country code, area code (without the leading 0) and the complete telephone number you want to dial, press **Send key** to call out.

Before the country code, key in international prefix e.g. "00" of

international call directly.

♦ Make Recent Calls

All calls you recently dialed, received or missed are saved in your phone. All numbers are grouped as Missed Calls, Received Calls and Dialled Calls. When the list is full, the oldest number will be erased automatically replaced by a new record.

You can check the list as follows:

- ♦ In standby mode, press Send key to view All recent calls.
- The number listed in can be directly dialed by pressing Send key.

♦ Make Pause Calls

You can make use of pause call to dial an extention or voice service call.

E.g. Key in phone number, press **OK key** to select "**P**" on the display (character "P" added accordingly), and then key in number afterwards. Press **Send key** to dial the first number, when connected, press **Send key** again to dial the second number automatically.

3.2 Answer a Call

For incoming in standby mode, the phone will offer corresponding

ringer or vibration to prompt according to your settings. With the number already saved in Names, the phone also shows the name of caller.

Press Send key
 to answer an incoming call.

• Press **End key** to end a call and the call duration is temporarily displayed.

See "7 Profiles", "9 Settings" or refer to other ways of answering calls for your option as follows.

3.2.1 Headset Autoanswer

You can set headset to answer an incoming call automatically.

- Select Menu \rightarrow Profiles \rightarrow Headset \rightarrow Profile Edit \rightarrow Auto Answer.
 - · Select option and press Left select key or OK key.
 - Off: No headset autoanswer.
- **After 5 Seconds:** The headset of the phone can be connected in 5 senconds automatically.
- After 10 Seconds: The headset of the phone can be connected in 10 senconds automatically.

3.2.2 Set Any Key Answer

- Select Menu→ Settings→ Call→ Anykey Answer.
- · Select On/Off, and press OK key.

An incoming call can be answered by pressing any key except **End key**, **Left /Right select key**.

3.2.3 Incoming Call Silence

- For an incoming call, press **Right select key** to make the ringer tone in Mute/Umute.
- This function silences the current incoming call only. The phone will ring normally for next incoming call.

3.3 In Conversation

3.3.1 Silence in Conversation

During conversation, you can select **Option** (**Contacts** or **Messages**) or **Mute** displayed. Select **Mute** to let the other party temporarily not hear your voice; Select **Unmute** back to normal. You can also enter **Contacts** or **Messages** during a conversation.

3.3.2 Adjust Volume in Conversation

Press Left/Right key to adjust volume of Earpiece during a call.

3.3.3 Select Options in Conversation

During a call, press Left/Right select key and OK key to select options like Mute/Unmute, Option (Contacts or Messages), etc.

- Select Mute/Unmute to temporarily mute\unmute my conversation.
- Select Option for selection in Menu, such as Contacts or

Messages, with no worry about ending the conversation.

3.4 Menu Functions

- Main Menu Function:
- In standby mode, press Left select key to enter main Menu. Scroll Up/Down or Left/Right key through the menu and select functions according to the prompt on the screen.
- If the menu contains submenus and further submenus, select options and submenu you want according to the prompt on the screen.
- iii. Press Right select key to set or return to the previous menu.Press End key to exit to standby mode.
- ◆ Bottom Menu Function:

If options are displayed on the bottom of the screen, press **Left/Right select key** and then **OK key** to select. Press **OK key** or **Right select key** to set or exit.

The functions of phone are mainly grouped in main Menu: Calls, Contacts, Messages, Radio, Settings, My Services, Tools, Games & Apps, and VBytes.

Please refer to the text hereinafter in this manual in detail.

Note: The picture used in this manual are with small icons.

4 Contacts



You can save contacts in phone and UIM card. Each contact in phone's memory has three phone numbers. Select **Memory Status** to view memory of phone and UIM card.

4.1 Find Records

You can search for a name or number in **Contacts** in pop-up window by choosing:

◆ Contacts

- 1. Select Menu →Contacts.
- 2. Select **All List**. You can key in the first characters of the name you are searching for to view contact directly in All List.
- 3. Press **Up/Down key** to scroll though the corresponding name(s) and records in the list. Scroll to the name you want, and press **OK key** to view the details or select Option.

♦ Find

- 1. Select Menu →Contacts.
- 2. Select Find. You can key in total or any part of the the

name/number/group you are searching for in Find Name/Find Number/Find Group. And then press **Left select key** to find.

3. Press **Up/Down key** to scroll though the corresponding name(s) and records in the list. Scroll to the name you want, and press **OK key** to view the details or select Option.

All the contacts will be list by the letter of the name. If there are no contacts in the list, "No Record" will be displayed.

4.2 Add New Record

- Save to Phone or UIM card:
 - 1. Select Menu→Contacts→ Add Name.
 - 2. Select would-be added information: Name, Existing Name.
 - 3. Press OK key and choose the saving position of Phone or UIM. And then add Name/Group/Home Number/Mobile Number/Office Number/Default Number/Call Alert/Sms Alert and set Call Alert/Sms Alert of the contact. See "13. Text Input" instructions for writing text and character.
- 4. After the completion of writing, press **Left select key** to save the contact.
 - Scroll to the just-added phone number to reedit, press **OK key** or select **Option**. Further operation can be executed, such as:
 - ♦ Edit: Edit the number.
 - Send Message: Send message to this number.

- ♦ Make a call: Make a call to this number.
- Send Name: Send the name and number of the contact as a message.
- ♦ Erase: Delete the number.
- Copy to UIM: Copy the number to UIM card (available for contact saved in phone).
- Move to UIM: Move the number to UIM card (available for contact saved in phone).
- Copy to Phone: Copy the number to the phone's memory (available for contact saved in UIM card).
- Move to Phone: Move the number to the phone's memory (available for contact saved in UIM card).
- Set to Speed Dial: Assign a speed dial number to the phone number (available for contact saved in phone).
- Default Number: View the default number of the contact (available for contact saved in phone).
- Add to Black List/Drop from Black List: Add/remove the number in/from the Black List.

Note: In standby mode, key in phone number, press Left select key to save.

If you save the same name/number again, the phone prompts to remind you this number already exit.

4.3 View Records

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts.
- 2. Select All List to view all records saved in phone and UIM card.

Note: When there is no storage record in Contacts, it will indicate "No Item".

4.4 Erase Records

4.4.1 Erase a Record

- 1. Select Menu →Contacts.
- 2. Select All List or Find to search for would-be erased record.
- 3. Scroll to the record you want to erase and press OK key.
- 4. Select **Option** to **Erase** contact, and press **OK key**. "Confirm to erase?" indicated on the display.
 - 5. Press Left select key to select Ok.

4.4.2 Erase All Contacts

You can Erase All the records in Names.

4.5 Edit Name of the Contacts

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts.
- 2. Select All List or Find to search for the record.
- 3. Scroll to the record you want to edit and press OK key.
- 4. Select Option to Edit name, and press OK key.

- Press Right select key to erase character of the current name, and rewrite the name.
 - 6. Select Save, "Succeed to save" appears on the display.

4.6 Edit Phone Number

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts.
- 2. Select All List or Find to search for would-be edited record.
- 3. Scroll to the number you want to edit and press OK key.
- 4. Select Option to Edit number, and press OK key.
- 5. Press **Right select key** and press the keypad number key to erase and key in digit of phone number.
 - 6. Select Save. "Succeed to save" appears on the display.

4.7 Select Group

You can group the stored records into Names.

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts.
- 2. Select **All List** or **Find** to search the record in phone's memory, and press **OK key**.
- Select Option to Edit and select group of No Group, Family, Relatives, Friends, Business, Colleagues, School, Club or VIP and press OK key to save.

4.8 Edit Group

You can group the stored records into Names.

1. Select Menu→Contacts→ Groups.

- 2. Select any group of No Group, Family, Relatives, Friends, Business, Colleagues, School, Club, VIP or UIM and press **OK key**
 - 3. Select options listed to edit Groups' information.
 - View Members: View the group information and do further edit.
 - Set Ring Tone: Set the ring tone for the contacts in this group.
 - **Set Msg Tone:** Set the message tone for the contacts in this group.
 - Edit Title: Change and edit the name of the group.

Note: For the contacts listed in No Goup and UIM, to **View Members** is only available.

4.9 Edit Other Information

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts.
- Select All List or Find to search for would-be edited record in phone's memory and press OK key.
- 3. Select Edit, and Other informations of Home Number/Mobile Number/Office Number/Default Number/Call Alert/Sms Alert, and press **OK key** to save.

4.10 Set Speed Dial

In standby state, you can make a **Speed Dial** of stored number (except for number in UIM card) by keying in one digit (2-9).

Method 1:

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts.
- 2. Select All List or Find to search the record you want to set as

speed dial number, press **OK key**, and then move to number in menu, and press **OK key**.

- 3. Select Option to Add to Speed Dial and press OK key.
- 4. Select an Empty slot in list.
- 5. Press **OK key** or **Left select key**. "Succeed to save" appears on the display.

Method 2:

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts
- 2. Select **Speed Dials**. Select an **Empty** slot in list and Assign/Select a number.
 - 3. Press OK key or Left select key to save.

4.11 View and Make Speed Dial

View:

 $\textbf{Select Menu} {\rightarrow} \textbf{Contacts} {\rightarrow} \textbf{Speed Dial} \text{ all Speed Dial list indicated}.$

Dial

You can make a call by entering speed dial number in the standby mode.

- Method 1: Enter speed dial number, press Send Key to dial.
- Method 2: Directly hold the speed dial number digit key.

4.12 Memory Status

- 1. Select Menu→Contacts→ Memory Status.
- 2. View the number of saved entries and maximum number of

entries saved in phone and UIM card.

For example: Phone: 8/500, UIM Card: 4/500, indicating that 500 records entries in Max., out of which eight have be saved in phone. And 500 entries in Max., out of which four have been saved in UIM Card. Please consult with service supplier for storage capacity of UIM card.

4.13 My Profile

- 1. Select Menu→ Contacts→My Profile.
- 2. Set the contacts information of your own.

5 Messages

This is introduction of how to send, receive and erase the messages in your phone.



5.1 Send a New Message

Please consult with the service provider to support the network service of sending message.

- 1. Select Menu→ Messages→ Write.
- 2. Write message text. See "13. Text Input" more instructions for writing text and character.
 - 3. Scroll to and then press **OK key** to select any Option as follows:
 - Send: Send the message.
 - Save: Save the message in Draft.
- **Templates:** Select preformatted phrases and sentences as message text.
 - Contacts: Select phone number from Contacts.
 - Priority: Select the priority as Normal, Urgent, Emergency

for sending message.

- **Delivery Ack:** Select **On** or **Off** for your phone can or can not automatically receive message from network informing you whether you have sent message successfully.
 - Send as Flash: Send a flash SMS.
 - Validity Period: Select the validity period of the message.
 - My Words: Dictionary of your own for message.
- 4. Input the recipients' Phone Number or select phone number from **Names**, and then press **OK key** to go further.

Note: The SMS centers of some cities and regions do not support messages longer than 160 characters.

5.2 Send Messages

You can send messages to grouped mobile phone which can receive message meanwhile.

- To Multireceivers
 - 1. Select Menu→Messages→Write.
 - 2. Write message text.
- 3. Select any receiver in Names/SMS groups or key in the numbers separated with semicolon by pressing **# key**. All the phone numbers displayed in pop-up window can be reedited. The maximum of receivers not exceed 10 persons.
 - 3. Press Left select key or OK key to send the message.
- To Groups

- 1. Select Menu→ Messages→ Msg Groups.
- 2. Select any SMS Groups (1-5), press **OK key** to **View** and **Add** receiver into those groups. All the phone numbers displayed listed in pop-up window can be reedited. The maximum of receivers not exceed 10 persons.
 - 3. Select options to:
 - Send: Send message to the recipient selected.
 - Send To All: Send messages to all the recipients in group.
 - Replace: Reedit the number of group member.
 - Remove Member: Erase the recipients in group.
 - Erase Group: Clear all the recipients' information in group.
 - Add: Add new recipient.

5.3 Receive Incoming Call while Editing Message

- If you do not want to receive the incoming call, press End key.
- If you want to receive the incoming call, press **Send key** to receive the call. After ending the received, call you can continue to edit on the screen and send it.

5.4 Read Message

On receipt of a new message, the phone prompts you by vibration or ringer (up to silence and ringer in **Settings**). The display prompts Press **OK key** or **Left select key** to View. New message is automatically saved in Inbox (of the phone or UIM card). The phone displays the memory status of message. Erase old messages to keep

space for new messages.

- $1.Select~\textbf{Menu} {\rightarrow}~\textbf{Messages} {\rightarrow}~\textbf{Inbox}.$
- 2. Scroll to the message you want to read.
- Press OK key to read message. Display automatically scrolls page by page. You can also press Up/Down key to scroll.
- 4. After reading, press Left/Right key to select:
- -Reply: Reply message to sender.
- -Forward: Forward the message to other recipients.
- -Erase: Erase this message.
- -Voice call: Call back to the sender.
- -Save number: Save the number of this message.
- —Copy to phone: Copy the message to phone (available for message saved in Inbox of UIM card).

5.5 View OutBox

- 1. Select Menu→ Messages→ Outbox.
- 2. Scroll Message list.
- 3. Press OK key to read Sent or Unsent messages.
- 4. Select **OK** to return to the list. Select other options to View,

Erase, **Forward**, **ReSend** (available only for unsent message) the message.

5.6 Erase Messages

Delete and erase old messages to release space for phone's SMS memory. You can select erasing messages when sending or reading

messages; erase messages one by one or all in Inbox, Outbox.

5.6.1 Erase a Message

- 1. Select Menu→ Messages.
- 2. Select messages location: Inbox, Outbox, Draft.
- 3. Press Up/down key to select the messages.
- 4. Select Erase to erase messages.
- 5. Select Yes to erase this message.

5.6.2 Erase All Messages

- 1. Select Menu→ Messages→ Erase Msgs.
- 2. Select an option in list:
 - Inbox: Erase all messages in Inbox.
 - Outbox: Erase all messages in Outbox.
 - Draft: Erase all messages in Draft.
 - All Messages: Erase all messages in phone and UIM card.

5.7 Send Template Messages

The phone has a group of some common built-in phrases and sentences, such as, "Sorry, busy at the moment", "Sounds interesting, tell me mor" etc.

- 1. Select $Menu \rightarrow Messages \rightarrow Templates$.
- Press OK key to view and select the message you want to send/edit.
 - 3. Key in phone number or select in Names/SMS Group.

4. Press **Ok key** or **Left select key** to send, save the message, see "5.1 Send a new message" in detail.

5.8 Read Voice Mail

Before using **Voice Mail** box, please consult with network provider to confirm that the function of voice mail box has been activated. After your successful setting, network will automatically transfer divert incoming call(s) to your voice mail box, and send message(s) to your phone.

Select **Call Voicemail** to read the message. Press Ok key or Left select key to dial voice mail box number and listen to the message following guide prompt.

Select Voice Mail Number to set the voice mail number.

To listen to your voice mail, hold "1" key for seconds to dial voice mail box number in standby mode.

Note: The function needs network support.

5.9 Message Settings

You can set your message box before you use it, such as, Text Msg Setting and General.

5.9.1 Msg Priority

- - 2. Select Normal, Urgent, Emergency for sending message.

5.9.2 Delivery Acknowledgment

- $\begin{array}{lll} \hbox{1.} & Select & \textbf{Menu} \rightarrow & \textbf{Messages} \rightarrow \textbf{Msg} & \textbf{Settings} \rightarrow \textbf{Text} & \textbf{Msg} \\ \textbf{Setting} \rightarrow \textbf{Delivery Ack}. & \end{array}$
- 2. Select **On** or **Off** for your phone can or can not automatically receive message from network informing you whether you have sent message successfully.

5.9.3 Save Sent Message

- Select Menu→ Messages→Msg Settings→Text Msg
 Setting→ Save Sent Msg.
- Select On or Off for your phone can or can not automatically save sent message.

5.9.4 Sign the Message

- Select Menu→ Message→Message Settings→Text Msg
 Settings→ Signature.
 - 2. Select On or Off and press OK key to confirm sign or not.
- 3. If select \mathbf{On} , write the signature text, press \mathbf{Left} $\mathbf{select/OK}$ \mathbf{key} to confirm.

5.9.5 Validity Period

- 1. Select Menu→ Message→Message Settings→Text Msg Settings→ Validity Period.
 - 2. Select the Validity Period of holding message.

5.9.6 Automatically Erase Inbox

Set erasing the last read message in Inbox automatically when Inbox is full.

- Select Menu→ Message→Msg Settings→General→ Auto Erase Inbox.
 - 2. Select On or Off and press OK key

5.9.7 Save Position

- Select Menu→ Message→Msg Settings→General→Save Position.
- Select UIM or Phone and press OK key to save message in UIM card or phone.

5.9.8 Edit SMS on Call Reject

- Select Menu→ Messages→Message Settings→General
 →Edit SMS on Call Reject.
 - 2. Edit or save the wording of SMS on call reject.

Note: Select R-SK (Icon of SMS on call to be rejected) to reject the call and send SMS. Meanwhile the rejected call is stored in missed calls list.

5.9.9 Memory Status of Messages

1. Select $Menu \rightarrow Messages \rightarrow Message$ Settings $\rightarrow Memory$ Status.

Press Left select key or Ok key to view the number of saved messages and maximum number of messages saved in phone and UIM card.

For example,

UIM: 2/40, indicating that 40 messages entries in Max., out of which 2 have been saved in UIM card.

Phone Inbox: 5/50, indicating that 100 messages entries in Max., out of which 5 have been saved in Inbox.

Phone Outbox: 8/50, indicating that 100 messages entries in Max., out of which 8 have been saved in Outbox.

Draft: 3/20, indicating that 20 messages entries in Max., out of which 3 have be saved in Outbox.

BCBox: 4/20, indicating that 20 messages entries in Max., out of which 4 have been saved in BCBox.

Please consult with service supplier for storage capacity of UIM card.

6 Recent Calls



6.1 View Recent Calls

Information of Missed Calls, Received Calls, Dialed Calls, Call Duration, Erase All including name, phone number, and call time and conversation duration is saved in the recent Calls list.

- 1. Select Menu→Calls.
- 2. Select Missed Calls, Received Calls, Dialled Calls.
- 3. Press OK key.
- 4. Select one entry of the records and press OK key.
- 5. Select option:
- **Call Information**: Indicate number and conversation duration informations.
 - SMS: Send message to this number.
 - Save: Save the number in mobile phone's Names.
 - Delete: Erase the number from the list of Call History.
 - Edit: Edit the number.

- Black List: Add this number to the Black List.

If the UIM Card does not support the function of Incoming Call Indication, you can only see part of the above-mentioned options.

6.2 Call Duration

- 1. Select Menu→ Calls→ Call Duration.
- 2. Select an option from the list and press **OK Key**.
- —Last Dialed Call: Indicate the talk time for the last dialled call.
 The time can be reset.
- **All Dialed Calls:** Indicate the talk time for all dialled calls. The time can be reset.
- —Received Calls: Indicate the talk time for all incoming calls. The time can be reset.
- $-\mbox{\bf All Calls}\colon$ Indicate the talk time for all dialled and received calls. The time can be reset.
 - Reset Call Duration: Reset the call duration.

6.3 Erase Recent Calls List

You can erase the recent calls in the menu of recent Calls.

- 1. Select Menu→Calls→Erase All.
- 2. Select Erase Missed, Erase Received, Erase Dialed, Delete

AII.

3. Press **OK key** to delete all the numbers from the list.

7 Settings

In main Menu pop-up window, select **Settings** to enter into.



Your phone has different functions in **Settings** to meet your requirement. They are: **Profile, Call, Security, Phone, Display, My Menu**.

7.1 Profiles

You can personalise your phone. There are many ways to change the sound and feel of your phone.

7.1.1 Profile Settings

You can **Set**, **Profile Edit**, or **Rename** the current profile and select **Ring Type**, **Ring Tone**, **Ringer Volume**, **Earpiece Volume**, **Key Beep Volume**, **Message Alert** of your phone in submenu of Vibrate, Silent, General, Outdoor, Meeting, Headset to make specific modification in required mode.

7.1.2 Headset Autoanswer

You can set headset to answer an incoming call automatically.

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Profiles \rightarrow Headset \rightarrow Profile Edit \rightarrow Auto Answer.
 - 2. Select option and press Left select key or OK key.
 - Off: No headset autoanswer.
 - After 5 Seconds: Call will be connected after 5 seconds
 - After 10 Seconds: Call will be automatically answer after 10

7.1.3 Alert Type

You can select alert type for an incoming call, earpiece and message.

- 1. Select Menu→ Profiles→Headset→Profile Edit → Alert type.
- 2. Select an option in list:
- -Ring+Vibrate: Set mobile phone in ten-second vibration case, then continuous Ringer later to prompt incoming call.
- Ring Tone: Set the phone in Ringer case to prompt.
- Vibrate: Set the phone in vibration case to prompt.
- Silent: Set the phone in silence case with backlighting to prompt.
- One Beep Mode: Set the phone Beep only once.
- Ascending: The phone rings with an ascending sound.

Note: Type of "Ring +Vibra" for message is as same as type of "Vibrate".

7.2 Call Settings

When network supports **Call** settings, you can use network services of call waiting and call forwarding, etc.

Note: All these functions are network services. Please consult with network service provider to get corresponding service application.

7.2.1 Call Waiting

During a call, use Call Waiting to answer the waiting call prompted by the network; Or dial another call meanwhile putting the first call on hold. These calls can be shifted while you have calls in conversation.

Call Waiting lets you enjoy three-party conversation without missing call.

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Call Waiting.
- 2. Select Option:
- **Enable:** To activate the Call Waiting function. The network will notify you of an incoming call while you have a call in progress. You can press **Send key** to get through the waiting call and switch one call to another.
 - Disable: To cancel the Call Waiting function.
 - Edit Feature Code: To edit the Call Waiting number.

7.2.2 Any Key Answer

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Anykey Answer.
- 2. Select On or Off, press OK key to set or not.

For an incoming call, press any key to answer, except for **End key** and **Left/Right select key**.

7.2.3 Voice Privacy

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→Call →Voice Privacy.
- 2. Set as **Enhanced** to enable voice encryption (need network support). Set as **Standard** to disable this function.

7.2.4 International Call Setting

♦ Auto Setting

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow International Call \rightarrow Auto.
- 2. Select option as:
- **OK:** In standard based area, to activate automatic international prefix "+" function instead of keying in international prefix, e.g. "00". Dial only "Country code + Area code + Telephone number" directly. This function needs network support.
- Cancel: To deactivate international prefix "+" function and dial an international call with prefix in manual way.

♦ Manual Setting

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→Call →International Call→Manual.
- 2. In some area, the network standard based solution is not implemented. Set and edit in manual way certain digit number(s) as the international prefix.
- See "3.1 Making a Call" for detail description of making an international call.

7.2.5 Call Timers

Your phone can record call time of dialing and answering call.

- 1. Select Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Call Timers.
- 2. Select **On** or **Off** the set whether the time of conversation is shown on the display.

7.2.6 Call Connect Alert

The phone prompts alert tone when a call is conected successfully.

- Select Menu→ Settings→ Call → Call Connect Alert.
- · Select On/Off, and press OK key.

7.2.7 Call Restriction

You can set Incoming calls bar in Call Restriction submenu including Friends List, Black List, Current Settings.

♦ Friends List

- 1. Key in phone number to **Add** new contact directly, or select from **Names**.
 - 2. Select options or scroll to one contact listed and select options:
 - ♦ Add: Add new contact in Friends List.
 - ♦ Edit: Edit this contact in Friends List.
 - ♦ Delete: Delete this contact in Friends List.
 - Erase All: Delete all the contacts in Friends List. If there is no contact in the list, "List Empty" will be displayed.

♦ Black List

- 1. Key in phone number to \mathbf{Add} new contact directly, or select from \mathbf{Names} .
 - 2. Select options or scroll to one contact listed and select options:
 - ♦ Add: Add another new contact in Black List.
 - ♦ Edit: Edit this contact in Black List.
 - ♦ Delete: Delete this contact in Black List.
 - Erase All: Delete all the contacts in Black List. If there is no contact in the list, "List Empty" will be displayed

♦ Current Settings

You can set barring applications as follows:

- Bar All: Bar all incoming calls.
- ♦ Bar Black List: Only bar numbers listed in Black List.
- Bar All Except Friends List: Only numbers listed in Friends List are not blocked.
- Cancel All: Cancel barring setting.

7.3 Security Settings

Introduction to phone's security options preventing others to avoid illegal use or acquire your phone's personal information. Please input right phone Password and PIN code to enter.

Note: Entering wrong PIN code for several times can lock your UIM card. Different UIM card has different limits for wrong PIN code times.

To unlock, you need PUK. PIN code and PUK code may be offered together with the UIM Card. If not, please contact with network operator.

The default phone password is 0000, the default PIN code is 1234, please change it to your own PIN code and phone password as soon as possible.

7.3.1 Set Phone Lock

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→ Security.
- 2. Input your phone password, press **OK key**.
- 3. Move to $\mbox{\bf Phone}$ $\mbox{\bf Lock},$ set On,Off or Change Lock, press $\mbox{\bf OK}$ $\mbox{\bf key}.$

7.3.2 Set PIN Code

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→ Security.
- 2. Input your phone password, press OK key.
- 3. Move to PIN Lock, set On,Off or Change Lock, press OK key.

7.3.3 View Emergency Numbers

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→ Security.
- 2. Input your phone password, press OK key.
- 3. Move to **Emergency Numbers** to view. You can also add and edit new numbers. But the origin top three numbers are not editable.

7.3.4 Reset

Your phone offers factory default phone setting. You may modify some options when you use phone. You can also Restore Factory Default to renew some modified options to the origin.

- 1. Select $Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Security$.
- 2. Input your phone password, press **OK key**.
- 3. Move to **Reset**, and select **Erase All Contacts**, **Reset Settings**, or **Reset Phone**.
- 4. Select **OK** to confirm resetting or restoring factory default or select **Cancel** to exit.

Note: Resetting the phone do not influence your phone password, PIN code, recent Call, Contacts, Inbox and Outbox.

7.3.5 Premium Service

Slide up the phone to receive/answer an incoming call automatically.

7.4.3 My Phone Number

7.4.4 Serial Number

 - 2. The phone can display the serial number of the phone.

7.4.5 Version

◆ PRL Version: Shows present PRL (Personal Roaming List)

version of phone.

- ♦ SW Version: Shows present software version of phone.
- ♦ HW Version: Shows present hardware version of phone.

7.5 Display

7.5.1 Set Wallpaper

You can select different wall papers as background in idle state.

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→ Display→Wallpaper.
- 2. Press Up/Down Key to select Preset Wallpaper or Download Wallpaper.
- Press Up/Down Key to scroll the list and press OK key/Left Select Key to confirm.

7.5.2 Set Backlight

During a call or pressing keys, the display lights on. You can set lighting duration and type.

- 1. Select Menu→ Settings→ Display→Backlight.
- 2. Select an option in pop-up window:
- -10 Sec: Keep backlighting for 10 seconds after last pressing.
- ─30 Sec: Keep backlighting for 30 seconds after last pressing.

Note: In conversation, backlighting consumes the power quickly and shortens continues conversation and standby time.

7.5.3 Set Keypad Light

7.5.8 Change Banner

View and edit phone's greeting to which appears on the display to your own.

- 1. Select $Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Display \rightarrow Banner$.
- 2. Press OK key/Left select key to Edit.
- 3. Key in character(s) and press **Right Select key** to erase character(s).
 - 4. Press OK key/Left select key to Save.

7.6 My Menu

My Menu is a quick menu guide for the subscribers easy to enter in standby mode (press **OK key**) directly.

Select any menu or submenu of Names, Display, Calls, Settings or Organiser herein and **Add** it into My Menu list as you like.

Note: The total 10 numbers of submenus can be listed under My Menu.

8 Tools

Extra Tools offers two games: Hit Rat and Greedy Snake, as well as tools, such as, Scheduler, Voice Memo, Alarm, Stopwatch, and Calculator, Unit Conversion.



8.1 Scheduler

- 1. Select Menu→Tools→Scheduler.
- Press Left/Right key or Up/Down key to scroll date and month.Select exact date to view the events scheduled every day in current month or in different month. Press OK key.
- 3. Select **Add Event** to save a new event by way of pressing Left/Right key, Up/Down key to scroll, inputting event text, and then pressing Left select key or OK key to confirm.
- 4. Select and edit an event in list by the way as follows:
 - ♦ View By Day: View the events on selected date.
 - ♦ View All: View all the events.
 - ♦ Erase Old: Erase the old events.
 - ♦ Erase All: Erase all the events.

- ♦ Erase To Date: Erase the events before the date appointed.
- ♦ Go To Date: Go to the date of schedule appointed.
- ♦ Go To Today: Go to today of schedule.
- ♦ Setting: Set the supposed day of beginning of a week.

8.2 Voice Memo

ZTEF285 supports Voice Memo function not in conversation with a capacity of saving 5 records in max. When there is no space in Voice Memo or Voice Memo is full, the phone prompts.

- 1. Select Menu→Tools→ Voice Memo.
- 2. Scroll Up/Down key to select:
- Record When you are not in conversation, select Start to begin a new Recording, or Stop/ Pause recording.
- Record List –Play (Review), view Info or Erase All the records in Record List named by date and time.
- ♦ Erase All –Erase all the records saved.

Note: The record saved in normal (not in conversation) will be listed in Settings→ Profile→ General→Profile Edit→ Ring Tone→Ring Type→Record Ring as a kind of ringer tone. You can select it as ring of the phone.

The ringer tone will be reset to default when the record is

deleted.

8.3 Alarm

Set alarm alert at a certain time. Alarm alerts either the phone is in power on or off.

- 1. Select Menu→Tools→ Alarm.
- Select Set alarm to set, and press OK key. Select Alarms list to view the settings. Select Set rest day to exclude the week day from alarm alert.

8.4 Stopwatch

- 2. Choose any unit to convert.
- 3. Press Up/Down key to switch between From and To.

Press Left/Right key to select the original unit which is ${\bf From}$ and equals ${\bf To}.$

4. Key in numbers the original unit which is from and press **Ok key** to get the result which equals to.

8.7 Games

8.7.1 Brick attack

In this game, paddle the bar to rebound the ball and attack bricks with skill. And then enter next stage.

1. Select Menu→Tools →Games→ Brick Attack.

- 2. Press **Left select/OK key**, the display shows greeting and play guide.

ZTEF285 supports Radio function.

- 1. Select Menu→ Radio.
- 2. Insert earphone and then the phone notify on the display "Radio On!", so the radio is activated.
 - 3. Select any of the Option as follows:
- $\ensuremath{\diamondsuit}$ Save Channel: Input Channel Name and select one channel from Channel List.
- Auto Tuning: Press Up/Down key to search automatically the channel available.
- ♦ Manual Tuning: Press Up/Down key to search manually the channel available.
- ❖ Set Frequency: Set certain frequency as default for a specific channel. Press Up/Down key to shift between integer and fraction, and press Left/Right key to move the cursor and input digit number of frequency.
 - Rename: Reedit the channel name.

- ♦ Delete: Delete the channel selected.
- ♦ Speaker: Set the speaker of the phone on/off.
- \diamond **Off**: Turn off the radio.



13 Text Input

Your phone offers text input modes: Multitap Input (abc/ABC/Abc), Numbers Input (123), eHiText Input (eng), and Symbol Input (Symbols). Input mode includes capital letter and lowercase mode.

You can key in letters, digits, characters and symbols when writing text or editing contact record information in **Names** or **Messages** etc., following the common instruction in hereinafter table.

13.1 Multitap Input

Select **Multitap** Input (**abc/ABC/Hi**) — Each key stands for multiple letters. Press key till your letter appears. When the cursor moves, enter the next letter.

13.2 Numbers Input

Select **Numbers** Input (123) — Press the corresponding key once to input the number. In Numbers input mode, you can not enter space.

13.3 eHiText Input

Select **eHiText** Input (**eng**) — Predictive word input is based on a built-in dictionary.

One letter asks for pressing only once.

Press the digit key corresponding to the letters once till the word appears on the screen.

If the word displayed is not the word you want, press **Up/Down key** to look for another matching word. Then press **OK key** to confirm.

13.4 Symbols Input

- Press "1" **key** to input till the symbol appears except for **Numbers**Input mode. Most common punctuation marks and special characters
are available.

Or press * key to entert Symbols mode when edit text:

- Press **Up/Down key** to page up/down. And press digit key to enter corresponding symbol.
