Thank you for purchasing the F160 UMTS/GSM/GPRS Mobile Phone.

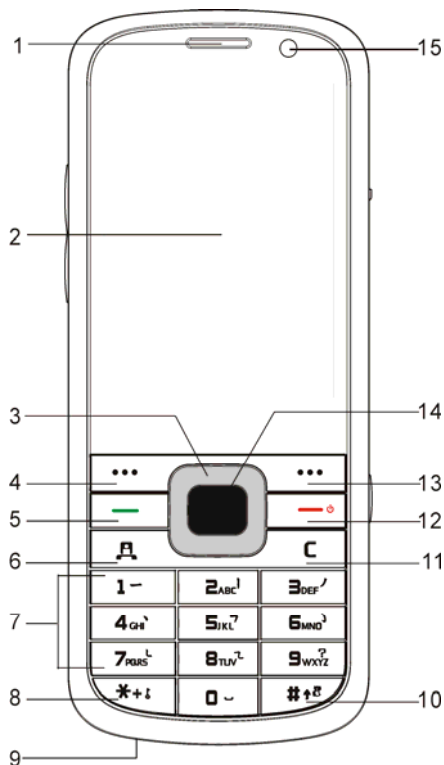

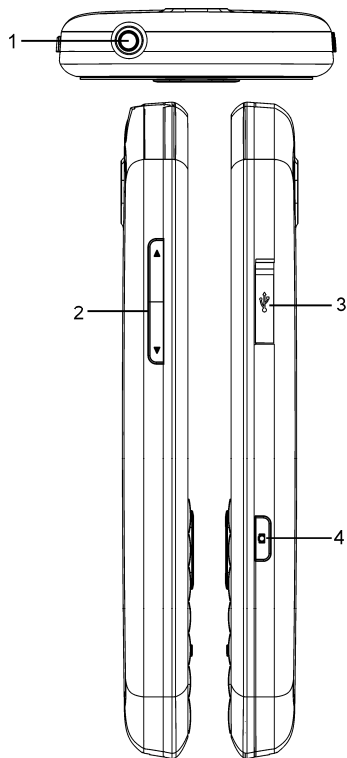

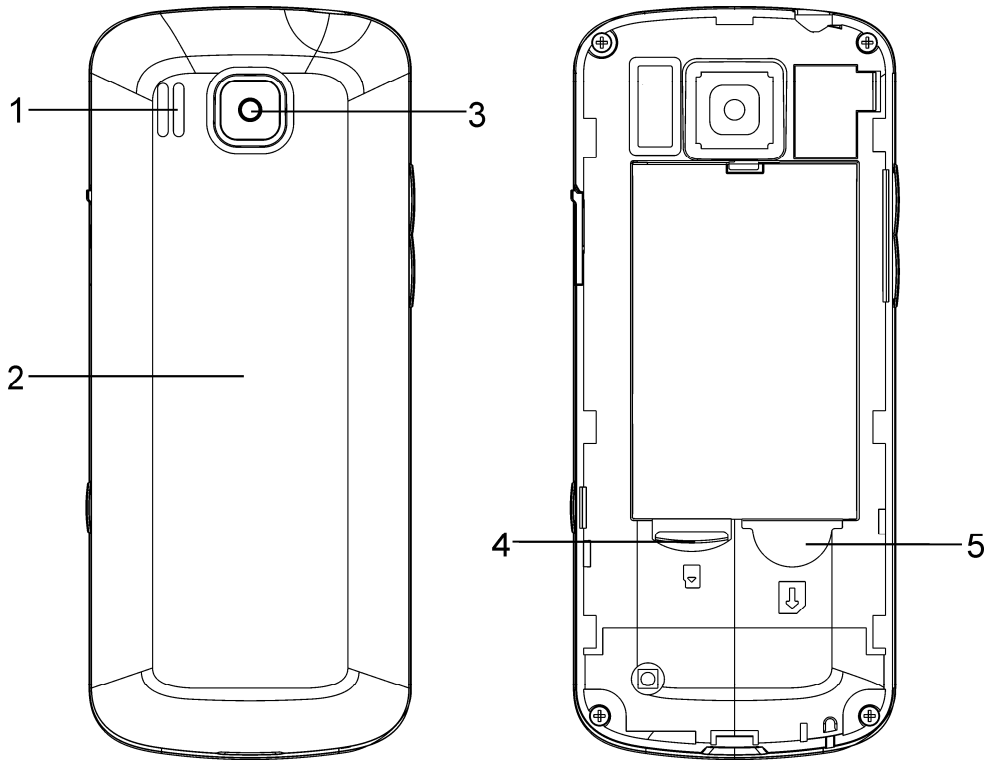

Top view and Sides view



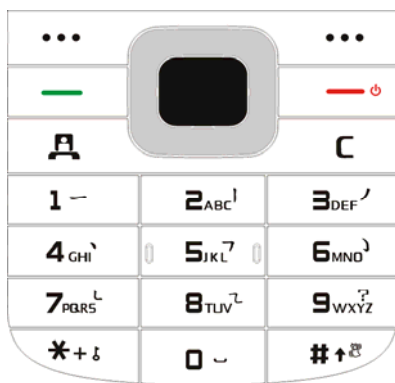

	<p>Navigation Keys (Up/Down/Left/Right Key)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In standby mode: Used as hot keys to activate pre-set functions. • In lists, messages and menus: scroll up, down, left and right.

	<p>Left Soft Key</p> <p>The bottom line of the display shows the options that can be selected using the Left and Right Soft Keys. The options change depending on the application/function being used.</p>
	<p>Voice Call Key</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Press the Voice Call Key to dial or answer the voice calls. • In standby mode: Press the Voice Call Key to show a list of all calls.
	<p>Video Call Key</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Press the Video Call Key to dial or answer the video calls. • In standby mode: Press the Video Call Key to show a list of all calls.
	<p>Number Keys</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Press the number keys to enter a phone number. • Press and hold keys 2 to 9 dial the associated speed dial contact.
	<p>* Key</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Press to enter "*". • In an editing screen: Press the * Key to enter punctuation and symbols.

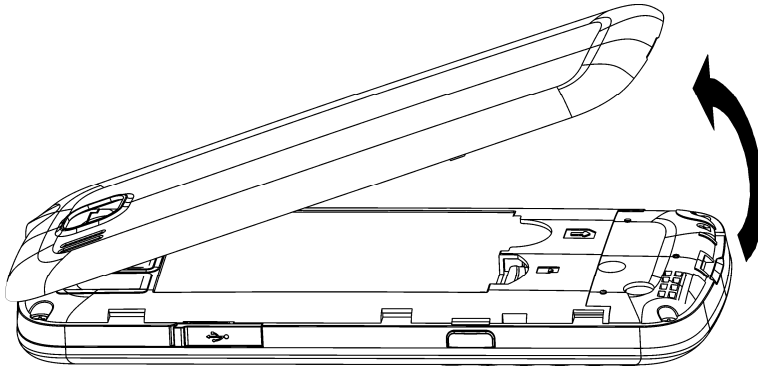

Chapter 2

Getting started

Removing back cover

1. Press and hold **End Key** to turn off the phone.
2. Lift the bottom of back cover from the notch and remove the back cover as shown below.



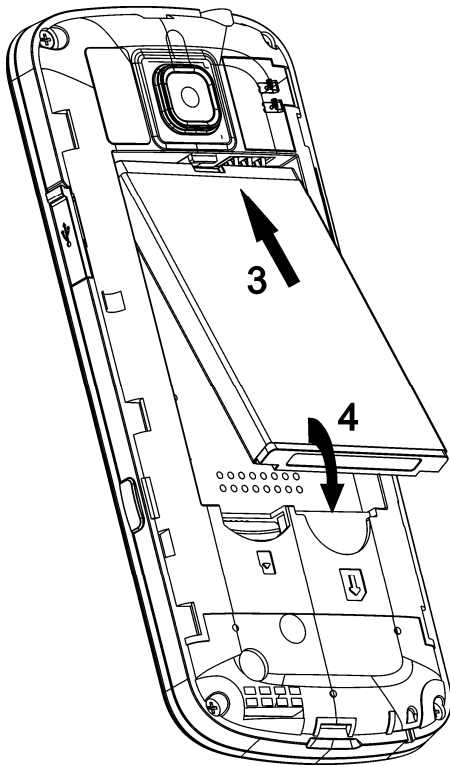
Installing battery



Notes:

- The phone automatically switches off if the battery power is too low.
- If you are not going to use the battery for a long time, remove it from the phone and store it in a cool dry place.

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to turn off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover.
3. Carefully insert the battery making sure the contacts are located against the gold springs.
4. Push down the battery until it clicks into place.



5. Place the back cover on the back of the phone.



Caution:

Do not force the cover into place by pressing on it. Doing so will damage the back cover.

Removing battery

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to power off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover.
3. Lift the end of the battery near the bottom of the phone and remove the battery from the phone.

Inserting (U)SIM card

You can obtain a (U)SIM card from your service provider when you sign on as a subscriber.

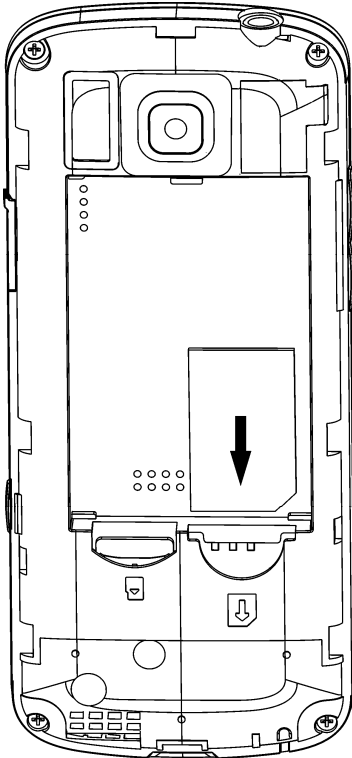


Caution:

- Do not bend or scratch your (U)SIM card. Keep the card away from electricity and magnetism.
- Do not touch the metal surface of the (U)SIM card. Doing so could cause information on the card to be lost or destroyed.
- Disconnect the charger and other accessories from your phone and remove the battery before inserting and removing your (U)SIM card.

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to power off the phone.

2. Remove the back cover and battery.
3. Hold the (U)SIM card with the metal contacts facing downward and the cut corner at the bottom right. Insert the card into the card holder and push it until it clicks into position.



4. Replace the back cover on the back of your phone.



Notes:

- Disconnect the charger and other accessories from your phone before inserting or removing the (U)SIM card.
- When inserting the (U)SIM card, make sure that the metal contacts face downward and the cut corner is at the bottom right.

Removing (U)SIM card

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to power off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover and battery.
3. Gently remove the (U)SIM card from the card holder.

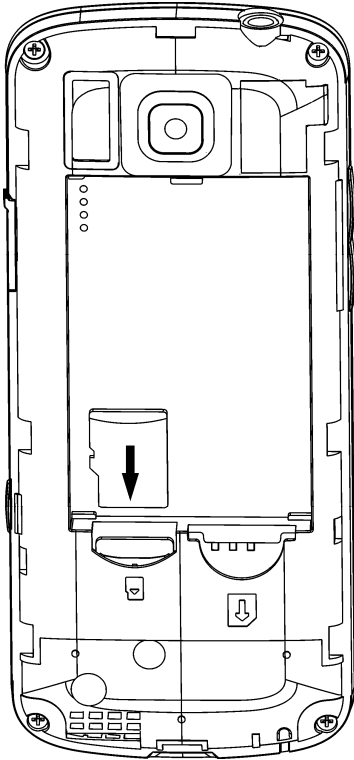
Inserting memory card

The memory card gives your phone a very large memory capacity. This allows you to save multimedia data, including images, photos, MP3 audio files, and ring tones. You can also use this memory card to store other files.

**Tips:**

Your phone can support a memory card with an up to 8GB capacity.

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to power off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover and battery.
3. Carefully insert the memory card into the memory card slot and place the card into position as shown below.
4. Re-insert the battery, close the back cover and switch the handset on.

**Caution:**

Only use approved memory cards for this device. Any use of unapproved memory cards might cause loss of data or damage to your phone.

Removing memory card

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to power off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover and battery.
3. Push the card so it clicks out.
4. Carefully remove the memory card.
5. Re-insert the battery, close the back cover and switch the handset on.

**Tips:**

- Do not remove the memory card while reading or writing to the card. Doing so might corrupt the information on the card or phone. If possible, insert and remove the memory card while the phone is turned off.
- If you want to format the memory card on your PC, make sure you select the FAT Formatting type. If this is not done the memory card might not be identified by your phone.

Connecting accessories

You can connect accessories to your phone. These include a headset for answering calls or listening to music, and a data cable for transferring information to your PC.

Connecting a headset to your phone

Insert the headset to the **Headset port**.

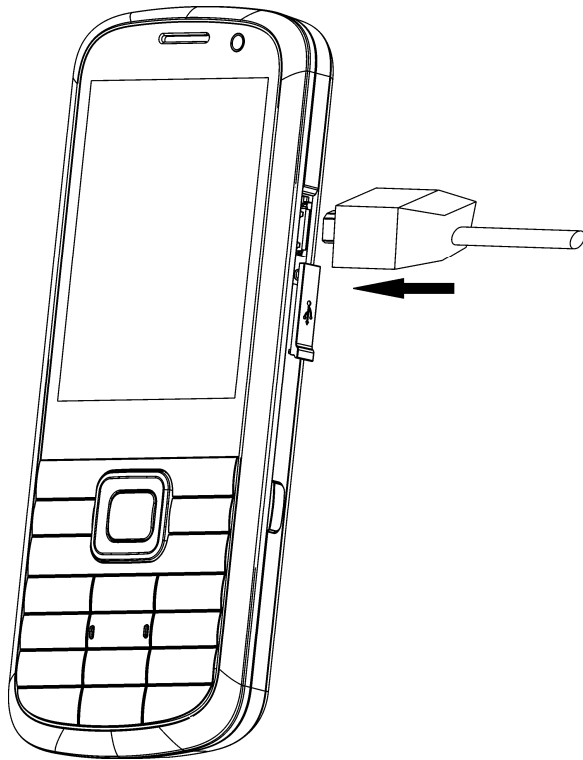
Connecting a data cable to your phone

Plug the smaller end of the cable into the **USB port** on the right side of the phone. Insert the USB connector (the larger end of the cable) into the USB port on your computer.

Charging your phone

Your phone uses a rechargeable battery. When you first unpack the phone, the battery is not fully charged, but there might be enough power to turn on the phone. You should flatten the battery by using all of the available power before charging the battery for the first time.

1. Open the USB port cover.
2. Insert the charger's USB adapter into the USB port.
3. Plug the charger into a standard AC wall outlet.



4. When the battery is fully charged, unplug the charger and disconnect it from the phone.



Notes:

- Make sure the adapter's connector is inserted correctly. Do not force the connector into the port.
- The battery will remain fully charged for 3 to 4 hours.
- Only use the charger provided by the original provider. Using an unapproved charger might be dangerous and violate the authorization and warranty rules of the phone.
- If the phone is used too often when the battery is low or not used for a long time, the screen may not display the charge indicator until the battery has been continuously charged for 10 to 40 minutes.
- To get the maximum performance out of your battery, it is recommended that you completely charge the battery before using the phone for the first time. A new battery's full performance is only reached after three complete charge and discharge cycles have been finished.
- When the battery is fully charged, unplug the charger and disconnect it from the phone.
- You can use the provided charger or the USB data cable to charge the battery.
- Charging is only possible within a temperature range of 0°C to 45°C.

Help information for some applications has been pre-loaded into your phone.

The User Manual contains help for keys, parts information and instructions for setting up and using the phone.

Chapter 3

Quick operation

Power on/off



Notes:

Do not turn your phone on in areas in which wireless phone use is not permitted, or when it could cause interference or danger.

1. Press and hold the **End Key** to turn the phone on



Tips:

- ▶ When prompted, enter your PIN (Personal Identification Number) code or handset code and press the OK Key.
- ▶ The PIN code is the password provided by your network service provider. You cannot use the SIM card without it.
- ▶ When the PIN code or handset code is accepted, the phone automatically searches for the network. After a few seconds, your phone displays standby mode.

2. To power off the phone, press and hold the **End Key** from the standby mode.

Standby mode

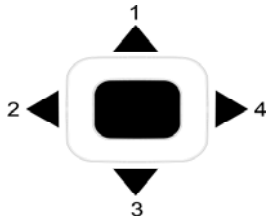
After power on the phone, when the name of the service provider is displayed on the screen, the phone is in the standby mode and ready for use.

Arrow Keys

Use **Arrow Keys** to access menu shortcuts, move around the **Main Menu**, and move the cursor.

Soft keys

The two keys at the top of the keypad are the **Left** and **Right Soft Keys**. They are used to select the options shown at the bottom of the display. The options vary depending on the application/function being used.



Back and Exit Keys

Press the **C Key** to go back one step.

Press the **End Key** to return to the **Main Menu** or standby mode.

Chapter 4

Basic operation

Menu

In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.

Tools

The available Tools include **Alarm, Bluetooth, Calendar, Calculator, GPS**, etc. For example, you can connect your phone to another Bluetooth device using Bluetooth.

Browser

You can use your phone to get the latest information from the Internet. However, internet access might require registration with your service provider.

The browser displays the preset option when it is started. Browser settings might be specified/pre-assigned by the service provider.

Games & apps

You can download the applications or games to your phone.

Contacts

You can store contacts with a variety of phone and fax numbers and additional address details. The phone can store up to 500 entries. The capacity of the phone book on your SIM card depends on the type of SIM card supplied by your service provider.

Messages

The SMS (Short Messaging Service) allow you to send text messages and manage the messages that you send and receive.

You can also send and receive MMS (Multimedia Message Service) messages. MMS enables you to send messages containing images, sounds and texts. Contact your service provider for more information and availability. You might need to register separately for this service.

Calls

You can check the phone numbers of missed, received, and dialed calls.

Profiles

You can select a certain profile depend on the current surrounding.

Multimedia

You can take photos or videos using the camera, record audio, listen to the radio, etc.

File Manager

File manager can help you to organize your files in folders.

If the memory card is inserted, folders/files stored in it are organized separately.

Settings

You can adjust settings or personalize your phone.

Calendar

Calendar can help you to organize your work or life.

Camera

You can take photos or videos using the camera.

Navigating your phone

The phone's features, various functions and settings are organized into menus and submenus:

1. In standby mode, press the **OK Key [Menu]** to show the **Main Menu**.
2. Use the **Navigation Keys** to scroll up, down, right or left to select a menu.
For example, you could scroll to **Settings**.
3. Press the **OK Key** to display the menu. In this example the **Screen** tab is displayed.
4. Press the **Up Key** or **Down Key** to scroll to a submenu. For example, you could scroll to **Set backlight duration**.
5. Press the **OK Key** to confirm the selection.
6. Press the **Up Key** or **Down Key** to scroll an option. For example, you could scroll to **Screen halflight**.
7. Press the **Left Key** or **Right Key** to scroll an option. For example, you could scroll to **15 seconds**.
8. Press the **OK Key [Save]** to confirm selection.



Tips:

- If a number is shown next an option in a menu list, you can access that option quickly by pressing the corresponding number key.
- In this user manual, for displaying a menu are shown in a condensed form. For example: **Settings > Set backlight duration > Screen halflight > 15 seconds**.
- Some options are organized into tabs. Press the **Left Key** or **Right Key** to switch to different tabs.

Setting date and time

Please close network time first.

1. In standby mode, press the **OK Key [Menu]** to show the **Main Menu**.
2. Select **Settings > Handset > Time and Date** to set the time and date.

Keypad lock


Use the keypad lock to prevent the keys from being pressed accidentally.

1. To lock keypad manually, press the **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Settings > Handset > Keylock > No autokeylockguard**.
2. To set the keypad to lock automatically, press the **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Settings > Handset > Keylock** and select **10 seconds, 15 seconds, 30 seconds** or **60 seconds**. These indicate the delay before the keypad is locked.
3. To lock the keypad, in standby mode, press and hold *** Key**.

To unlock the keypad, press and hold the *** Key**.



Tips:

- When the keys are locked,  is shown on the display.
- If a call comes in when the keypad is locked, you can press the **Voice Call Key** to answer it. When the call is ended or rejected, the keypad locks automatically.
- When the keypad lock is on, calls might still be possible to the official emergency number.

Making a call

1. If required, quickly press the *** Key** twice to add the international prefix “+”.
 2. Enter the number using keypad and press the **Voice Call Key** to make a call.
- When the call is connected, you can press the **OK Key** for **Speaker** mode.
 - Press **End Key** to end the call.

Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming voice call, the ring tone, illumination and vibrate function will activate (depending on your current profile setting).

Press the **Voice Call Key** or **OK Key [Loudsp.]** to answer.

- When the call is coming, you can press the **OK Key** for **Speaker** mode.
- Press the **End Key** to end the call.

Rejecting a call

When the call is coming, press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Call rejected** or **SMS reject** to reject the call.

Chapter 5

Text input

Text mode

You can input text into your phone using the following input methods: eZiEng, abc, ABC and number.

Currency text mode

When you are in a field that allows characters to be entered, the text input mode indicator is shown in the upper right corner of the display.


Changing mode

Press the **# Key** repeatedly to select an input method.

ABC mode

1. Press a number key (**2 to 9**) repeatedly until the required character is shown on the screen. Press once to input the first letter on the keypad, press twice quickly to input the second letter, etc.
- Press the **0 Key** to add a space.
- Press the **0 Key** twice quickly to enter 0.

Number mode

When the input method icon is shown as , you can input numbers directly using the number keys.



Tips:

When using number input, you need to switch to other text input methods if you want to insert a space by pressing the **0 Key**.

eZiEng - Predictive text mode

The predictive text method is based on a built-in dictionary and generates words from the combination of letters pressed.

1. Press each key once that corresponds to the letter you want to enter. The letters are shown on the display as they are entered. The list of candidate words changes as each key is pressed.
2. When the candidate words are displayed, press the **Up Key** or **Down Key** to highlight a candidate word and press the **OK Key [OK]**.
3. Press the **0 Key** to insert space, or press the *** Key** to select symbols.
4. Press the **Clear Key** to delete the letter to the left of the cursor. Press and hold **Clear Key** to delete all entered text to the left of the cursor.

Special symbols

1. Press the *** Key**.

2. Use the **Navigation Keys** to select symbol.
3. Press the **OK Key [OK]**.

Chapter 6

Calls

Voice calls

You can dial the phone number directly, or make the call using contacts, the call log, or the speed dial numbers.

Making a call

1. In standby mode, enter a phone number.
2. Press the **Voice Call Key** to make a voice call.
3. Press the **End Key** to end the call.

Making a call from contacts

1. In standby mode, press the **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Contacts**.

You can also press the **Right Soft Key** to enter **Contacts** in standby mode.

2. Use the **Navigation Keys** to select a contact.
3. Press the **Voice Call Key** to make a voice call.
4. Press the **End Key** to end the call.

Making a call from call history

1. In standby mode, press the **Voice Call Key** to display all calls in the **Call History**.
2. Use the **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select a number.
3. Press the **Voice Call Key** to call the number.
4. Press the **End Key** to end the call.

Making a speed dial



Notes:

The **1 Key** is reserved for the **Voice mail** phone number.

1. In standby mode, press and hold the corresponding number key (**2 to 9**) in the speed dial list to make the call.
2. Press **End Key** to end the call.

Speed dial setting

1. In standby mode, press the **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Contacts**.

2. Use the **Navigation Keys** to select a contact, press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Set speed dial**.
3. Press the **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select a number.
4. Press the **OK Key [Setup]**.
5. Press the **C Key** to finish the setup and return to the upper menu.

You can also press the **End Key** to return to the idle screen.

Receiving calls

When a voice call comes in, your phone s ring, vibrates or shows an animated cartoon. (See **Personalize your phone > Profiles**). If the caller uses Calling Line Identification (CLI), their phone number shows on the display.

1. Press the **Voice Call Key** or **OK Key [Loudsp.]** to answer the call.



Tips:

If you have connected the headset to the phone, you can press the button on the headset to answer the call.

2. Press the **End Key** to end the call.

Setting the ring for an incoming call

1. In standby mode, press the **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Settings > Profiles**.
2. Use the **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select the profile.
3. Press the **Right Soft Key [Edit]** to edit the selected profile.
4. Select **Voicecall ringtone**.
5. Press the **OK Key [Modify]** to modify the ring tone.
6. Select the audio file in **File Manager**.
7. Press **OK Key [Setting]** to save the setting.

Rejecting a call

Press the **End Key** to reject the call.

Or press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Call rejected** or **SMS reject** to reject.

Call options

During a call, you can press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options. The options vary depending on the function you are currently using.

Adjusting volume

During a call, press the **Volume Keys** to adjust the earphone or speaker volume.

Others

Press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** during a call for more options. The options vary depending on the function you are currently using:

- **Hold/Active:** Put the current call on hold or retrieve the call.
- **End call:** End current call.
- **Record:** Record the current call. You can also press the **OK Key [Stop]** to stop recording.
- **DTMF off/on:** Enable or disable sending the DTMF tone.
- **Message:** Switch to **Message** menu during a call.
- **Contacts:** Switch to **Contacts** menu during a call.
- **Browser:** Browse the internet during a call.

Video calls

You can dial the phone number directly, or make the video call using contacts, the call log.

Setting ring for video call

1. In standby mode, press **Left Soft Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Profiles**.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select the profile.
4. Press **Right Soft Key [Edit]** to edit the selected profile.
5. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select **Videocall ringtone**.
6. Press **OK Key [Modify]** to modify the ring.
7. Select the audio file in **File Manager** and press **OK Key [Setting]** to save the setting.

Making a video call

1. In standby mode, enter a phone number.
2. Press **OK Key [Call]** and select **Video Call** to make a video call.

Press **End Key** to end a call.

Receiving a video call

If you want to answer the video call, you must be covered by 3G network.

When there is incoming video call, your phone will ring or vibrate or show the animated cartoon (Please see **Personalize your phone > Profiles**). If the caller has the Calling Line Identification (CLI) facility, the caller number appears on the screen.

**Tips:**

- If you answer the video call when you are browsing the internet, enjoying music or playing videos, these applications will pause when you answer the video call and resume when you end the call.
- If you active **Any key to answer** function, When the video call is coming, you can answer the call by pressing any key except **End Key, Back Key, Right Soft Key and Left Soft Key**.
- You can press the button on the headset to answer the call when you connect the headset to your phone.
- Please adjust to appropriate volume to avoid injure your ear.

Press **Call Key** or **OK Key [Loudsp.]** to answer the call.

Press **End Key** to end the call.

Video call options

Press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** during a video call for more options. Options vary depending on the current situation:

1. Before you answer the call:

- ▶ **Call rejected:** Reject the current call.
- ▶ **Answer without my picture:** Answer the call without my picture.
- ▶ **SMS reject:** Reject the incoming call and send a default defined SMS to the sender.

2. After you answer the call:

- ▶ **Hold/Cancel hold:** Put the current call on hold or retrieve the call.
- ▶ **Start recording video:** Record the current call. You can also press the **OK Key [Stop]** to stop recording.
- ▶ **Block/Activate my image:** Block or send my picture during the call.
- ▶ **Use back/front camera:** Switch between the front and back camera.
- ▶ **Brightness:** Adjust the screen brightness.
- ▶ **Zoom:** Adjust the image size.
- ▶ **PIP off/on:** Close or open the local image.
- ▶ **Exchange PIP:** Switch between the primary and secondary screen.
- ▶ **New text message::** Switch to editing the new message.
- ▶ **Contacts:** Switch to the **Contacts** menu.

Call history

In standby mode, press the **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Calls** to check the calls log and calls duration.

Viewing recent call history

1. Select **All calls** to view all calls' log.

2. Select **Missed calls** to view the missed calls' log.
3. Select **Received calls** to view the received calls' log.
4. Select **Dialed calls** to view the dialed calls' log.

Deleting call history

1. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select the type of calls log in **Call log** tab.
2. Press **OK Key [OK]** to open the log.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select the call log you want to delete.
4. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Delete** to delete the log.

5. Press **OK Key** to confirm to delete.

Call time

Viewing call duration

Press the **OK Key [OK]** to open the **Call duration** in **Calls info.** tab. You can check the Last call duration and All calls duration.

Clean call time

1. In **Call duration**, press **Right Soft Key [Clear]**
2. Enter handset lock code.



Tips:

The default handset lock code is **0000**.

3. Press **OK Key [OK]** to confirm to clear.

Call settings

Starting call divert

Call divert allows you to divert your incoming calls to another phone number. For details, contact your service provider.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Call > Call divert** for more options.
 - ▶ **Always**
 - ▶ **When busy**
 - ▶ **When no reply**

► When unreachable

3. Select one option, press **OK Key [Select]** and select **Activate** to register the corresponding service.
4. Enter phone number you want to divert to.
Or press **Left Soft Key [Contacts]** to select one contact as the number you want to divert to.
5. Press **OK Key [OK]** to confirm and select which service (**All voice calls** or **All video calls**) you want to divert.
6. After few seconds, the result will be shown to you.

Call divert always

Divert all incoming calls unconditionally.

Call divert when busy

Divert incoming calls when the line is busy.

Call divert when no reply

Divert calls when there is no answer.

Call divert when unreachable

Divert calls when the phone is turned off or the phone is not in an area covered by service network.

Cancelling call divert

When your phone has activated the **Call divert** function, if you want cancel it, you should do as follows:

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Call > Call divert > Cancel all call diverts**, and press **OK Key** to confirm.

All settings about divert are cancelled.

Starting call waiting

If there is an incoming call while you are on another call, the phone notifies you with a call waiting tone. It shows the number/name of the waiting call, and this function is a network service.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Call > Call waiting**.
3. Press **OK Key [Select]** and select **Activate** to register the corresponding service.

4. After few seconds, the result will be shown to you.

Starting call barring

Call barring (network service) allows you to restrict the calls that you make or receive with the device. To change the settings, you need the network password from your service provider.

1. In standby mode, press **OK [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Call > Call barring** for following options:
 - ▶ **Bar all outgoing calls**
 - ▶ **Bar outgoing calls (international)**
 - ▶ **Outgoing international calls except for calls to the home country**
 - ▶ **Bar all incoming calls**
 - ▶ **Bar incoming call when international roaming**
3. Select one option, press **OK Key [OK]** and select **Activate** to register the corresponding service.
4. Enter the network password.
5. Press **OK Key [OK]** to confirm and select which service (**All voice calls** or **All video calls**) you want to restrict.
6. After few seconds, the result will be shown to you.

Bar all outgoing calls

Calls can not be made.

Bar outgoing calls (international)

International calls can not be made.

Bar outgoing international calls except for the calls to the home country

When abroad, calls can be made only to numbers within the current country and to your home country, where your home network operator is located.

Bar all incoming calls

Calls cannot be received.

Bar incoming calls when international roaming

Calls cannot be received when you are using your phone outside your home service area.

Canceling all call barring

When your phone has activated the **Call barring** function, if you want cancel it, you should do as follows:

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Call > Call barring**.
3. Select **Cancel all call barring**.
4. Press **OK Key** and enter the net password.
5. Press **OK Key** to confirm.

All settings about barring are canceled.

Change password of call bar

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Call > Call barring**.
3. Select **Change password** and press **OK Key**.
4. Enter the old password and press **OK Key** to confirm.
5. Enter the new password and press **OK Key** to confirm.
6. Enter the new password again and press **OK Key** to confirm.

Send my number

This function allows you to send or hide your number when making calls. You can also select **Set by network**, then the network will make the choice to show/hide the phone number. This function requires network to support.

Chapter 7

Messages

Text messages

SMS (Short Messaging Service) allow you to send text messages and manage the messages that you sent and received.

Setting SMS

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Messages > Message > Settings > Text Msg. Settings**, and press **OK Key [OK]**.
3. Enter **SMS center number**, select **Expiration Time** and **Delivery Report**.

SMS center number	Enter SMS center number, detailed please consult your service provider.
Expiration Time	The length of time in which the message center will attempt to deliver the message until it is received.
Delivery Report	You can select On/Off to receive or reject a popup message to inform you when the message is delivered to the recipient.

4. Press **OK Key [OK]** to save and exit.

Sending new SMS

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Messages > Message > New message > Text message**, and press **OK key**.
3. Enter the recipient(s) party's number.
Or press the **OK Key [Contacts]** to choose the recipient(s).
4. Press **Down Key** twice to the text field.
5. Edit the message.
6. Press **OK Key [Send]** to send your message.

Inserting template

Firstly please move the cursor to the text field.

1. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Templates** to switch to the message template interface.
2. Use **Up/Down key** to choose the item.
3. Press **OK Key [OK]**.

Editing template

The predefined template in your phone will be replaced after you modify the template.

Multimedia message

MMS enables you to send or receive messages with images, sounds and text. Consult your service provider whether this service is available.

2. Select **Messages > Message > Settings > Mul. Msg. Settings**, and press **OK Key** to select.
3. Set the parameters.

Retrieval Settings	Automatic: Retrieve the new multimedia message automatically without selecting the notification message and receiving.
	Manual: Retrieve the new multimedia message manually.
	Manual when roaming: Retrieve the new multimedia message automatically except in roaming state.
Delivery mode:	You can set immediate delivery or defer it for a specified period of time.
Delivery time	You can set a specified period of time to send MMS when you set After sending in Delivery mode. The max delivery time is 99 hours.
Time per page	You can set the playing time of each page.
Delivery report	If you request delivery reports for messages, you will receive a popup message to inform you when the message is delivered to the recipient.
Validity	You can configure the validity period of outgoing messages. Your network will save your messages in this specified period of time.
Anonymous Msg.	You can choose to accept or refuse anonymous message.
Connections	Please consult the service provider for detailed information.

PUSH Message	You can accept or reject PUSH message.
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4. Press **OK key [OK]** to save and exit.

Sending new MMS

2. Select **Messages > Message > New message > Multimedia message**, and press **OK Key** to select.
3. Enter the recipient(s) party's number.

Or press **OK Key [Contacts]** to choose the recipient(s.)

5. Enter the title of your MMS message.
6. Press **Down Key** to the text field.
7. Edit your message and you can do the following operations:

Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options, and the options vary depending on the current situation.

- **Send:** Send the message.
- **My words:** Insert my words to your MMS message.
- **Add page:** Add a new page to your MMS message.
- **Delete page:** Delete the current page of your MMS message.
- **Preview:** Preview the MMS message.
- **Templates:** Insert Templates to your MMS message.
- **Save:** Save the MMS message to Drafts.

Press **OK Key [Insert]** to insert image, audio or video:


- **Image:** Insert the image files from your phone or memory Card.
- **Audio:** Insert the Audio files from your phone or memory Card.
- **Video:** Insert the video files from your phone or memory Card.
- **New image:** Start the camera to take a photo and insert it to the message.
- **New audio:** Start the voice recorder to create an audio file and insert it to the message.
- **New video:** Start the video camera to create a video file and insert it to the message.
- **Attachment(s):** Insert the files from your phone or memory Card.

8. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Send** to send your message.

**Notes:**

- ▶ For the unfinished message, select **Left Soft key [Options]** > **Save** to save it to the **Drafts**.
- ▶ From the **Outbox/Drafts** you can complete and resend the message.

Deleting MMS

This service enables you to send E-mail and manage the E-mail that you sent and received, detailed please consult your service provider.

3. Set the parameters.


Mailbox Settings: Select the mailbox from the list.
Automatic Retrieval: Select to not retrieve the E-mail or retrieve it automatically in a period of time.
Templates Settings: There are 10 templates for E-mail in your phone and you can edit them.

4. Press **OK Key** to save and exit.

Sending E-mail

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Messages > E-mail > New E-mail**, and press **OK Key**.
3. Enter the recipient(s) party's Email address.

 - iii. Use **Up Key** or **Down key** to select the desired E-mail.

Voice mail

This service helps you to get the caller's voice mail messages when your phone is busy or out of service area. This function requires network support, detailed please consult your service provider.

Receiving voice mail

System will give you message to notify you when there is new voice mail.

In standby mode, long press **1 Key** to receive the voice mail.

Message management

In standby mode, select **OK Key [Menu] > Messages** to enter message interface. It includes **Message** and **Email**.

- In **Message** interface, the submenu items include: **New message, Inbox, Outbox, Drafts, Sent, Folders, SIM Inbox, Settings, and Memory info.**
- In **E-mail** interface, the submenu items include: **New E-mail, Inbox, Outbox, Drafts, Sent, Folders, Settings, and Memory info.**

Message boxes

The **Inbox** folder contains all of your received messages. From this folder you can view your received messages, reply or forward messages to another recipient.

The **Outbox** folder contains all messages that were unsuccessfully sent during the last attempt. From this folder you can edit or resend your messages.

The **Drafts** folder contains drafts and unfinished messages. From this folder you can complete or resend your messages.

The **Sent** folder contains messages that were sent successfully. From this folder you can edit or forward messages to another recipient.

Select **(U)SIM Inbox** to check the messages saved in (U)SIM card. (This folder is not available for E-mail.).

You can move your received messages from inbox to **Folders**.

You can check the amount of memory available for messages through **Memory Info.** folder.

**Notes:**

- You can not receive new messages if memory for messages is full.
- Total amount of messages decided by the space of handset and (U)SIM card.

Push messages

Push messages is a formatted SMS that displays a message to the user, giving the option of connecting directly to a particular URL via the mobile's wap browser.

- Use the browser to view push messages
- Set **Reject** to disable push messages.



Chapter 8

Contacts

Adding a contact

You can store contacts with a variety of phone and fax numbers as well as additional address details.

The phone can store up to 500 items. The capacity of a phone book in your (U)SIM card depends on the type of (U)SIM card provided by your service provider. The saved location can be identified by the icon before the contacts.

	Show the contacts that are none of groups are stored in your phone memory.
	Show the contacts that are stored in your (U)SIM card.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Contacts > Left Soft Key [Options] > New contact** and press **OK Key**.
3. Enter the information of contact, such as name, number, and so on.
4. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save the new contact.

Editing contact

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Contacts** and press **OK Key**.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select the desired contact.
4. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Edit contact** and press **OK Key**.
5. Edit the contact.
6. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save and exit.

Deleting contact

You can delete one contact or all contacts from your phone or (U)SIM card.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Contacts**.
3. Select the desired contact.
4. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Delete > Present/Multiple/Delete all(Both)**.
5. Press **Left Soft Key [Yes]** to delete one contact or all contacts.

Assigning a group

Assign group for the contacts

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu, and select **Contacts**.
2. Select the desired contact.

3. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Groups**, and press **OK Key**.
4. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select group.
5. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Add new group**.
6. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save the settings.

Editing group

Set incoming ringtone and image for your contacts group.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu, and select **Contacts**.
2. Select **Contacts > Left Soft Key [Options] > Groups** and press **OK Key**.
3. Select desired group from the default group list.
4. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Edit group**.
5. Select **Modify**, you can select incoming ringtone from **File Manager**. Or select desired image from the image list.
6. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save.

Deleting group

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu, and select **Contacts**.
2. Select **Contacts > Left Soft Key [Options] > Groups** and press **OK Key**.
3. Select desired group from the default group list.
4. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Delete group**.

Others about contacts

Sending bussiness card

You can send the name and numbers of contact through SMS, MMS, E-mail, or Bluetooth.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu, and select **Contacts**.
2. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Send Bus. Card**.
3. Select the sending method from the method list, and press **OK Key**.
4. Send the business card according to the interface prompt.

Chapter 9

Photos and videos

This phone provides following functions for you: camera, video camera, voice recorder and so on. you can take photos, shoot video clips, record a voice memo and so on.

Camera

There is an integrated digital camera in your phone, and this function enables you to take a still picture.

Taking a photo

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
 2. Select **Multimedia > Camera** and press **OK Key**.
 3. Aim the camera lens at the place/object.
 4. Press the **OK Key [Capture]** to take the photo.
- Press the **OK Key [Save]** to save the photo just taken in **My Pictures**. The file will be in *.jpg format.
 - Press the **Right Soft Key [Discard]** to discard the photo just taken.
 - Press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** to send the photo via MMS/E-Mail/Bluetooth or set it as wallpaper.

Setting Camera mode

While in camera mode, press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options.

- **Photo size:** Set the size of your photo.
- **Photo quality:** Set the quality standard of your photo.
- **Brightness:** Set the brightness of your photo.
- **Contrast:** Set the contrast of your photo.
- **Effect:** Set the effect of your photo.
- **Shutter sound:** Select the sound when the shuttle is pressed.
- **Save to:** You can select TFlash card or phone memory for photos to store.
- **Use front/back camera:** Switch the camera between back and front camera.
- **Switch to video camera:** Access the interface to record a video clip.

Viewing photos

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Camera** and press **OK Key** to activate camera.
3. Press **Right Soft Key [My pics]** to open **My Pictures** folder.
4. Select your desired photo and press **OK Key [Open]** to view.

 - Press **Right Soft Key [Discard]** to discard the video just taken.

Setting video mode

While in video mode, press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options.

- **Video size:** Set the recording time. The length of the video recording is restricted by the available space on your memory card.
- **Video quality:** Set the quality standard of your video clip.
- **Brightness:** Set the brightness of your video clip.
- **Contrast:** Set the contrast of your video clip.
- **Effect:** Set the effect of your video clip.
- **Video sound:** Select **Off** to mute the sound during the video record.
- **Video format:** Define the format of the video record.
- **Save to:** You can select TFlash card or phone memory for videos to store.
- **Use front/back camera:** Switch the camera between back and front camera.
- **Switch to camera:** Switch to the camera mode.

Playing a video

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Video camera** and press **OK Key** to activate video camera.
3. Press **Right Soft Key [My vids]** to open **My Videos** folder.
4. Select your desired video and press **OK Key [Open]** to play.

Recorder

This function allows you to record a voice memo, and you can also set the voice memo as ringtone.

4. Press **OK Key [Pause]** to pause, press **OK Key [Contin.]** to resume recording, and press **Right Soft Key [Stop]** to stop recording.
5. After recording a voice memo, you can continue the following operations:
 - i. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save the memo to **My Audios** directory.
 - ii. Press **Right Soft Key [Discard]** to discard the memo.

Playing a sound file

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Voice recorder** and press **OK Key** to activate voice recorder.
3. Press **Right Soft Key [My auds]** to open **My Audios** folder.
4. Select your desired audio file and press **OK Key [Open]** to play.

Setting recorder mode

 - ▶ **Duration:** Set the recording time to **No limit**, **Email size**, or **Set for MMS**.
 - ▶ **Save to:** Select the handset memory or memory card as storage.
2. After recording a voice memo, press **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options:

- ▶ **Send:** Send the voice memo through MMS, Email or Bluetooth.
- ▶ **Replay:** Replay the voice memo.

Chapter 10

Connectivity

Mobile network select

Your mobile phone supports to register on network automatically, detailed please consult your service provider. If the phone fails to register on network, you should attempt to register on network manually.

Registering to mobile network

Firstly please confirm following three items:

- Insert the valid (U)SIM card.
- The network signal can be properly received.
- Power on the phone.

Generally the phone can search for the network automatically after power on. When the phone registered to the network successfully, the name of service provider/logo will be appeared on the screen. If fails to register network, please attempt to following methods:

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Handset > Network settings**, set **Preferred Mode** and **Preferred Selection**, the further description is shown in the table below:

Network		Descriptions
Preferred Mode	Automatic	Search for available network automatically.
	GSM	Registered to 2G network manually.
	UMTS	Registered to 3G network manually.
Preferred Selection	Automatic	The phone will search for available network automatically after power on.
	Manual	The phone will list all networks for you to choose from after power on.

These parameters maybe not completely identical with your phone, please refer to the real object.

3. Press **OK Key [OK]** to save.

Attaching GPRS network

Please confirm following items firstly:

- Insert the valid (U)SIM card.
- The network signal can be properly received.
- Power on the phone.
- Obtain **Access point settings** parameters from your service provider.

With this service you can receive and send MMS after your phone accesses internet successfully, and this service also requires your service provider to active data service. Detailed please consult your service

provider.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Handset > Access point settings**.
3. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **New** to add a new access point.
4. Press **OK Key [OK]** to save the settings.

Managing removable disk

Firstly please insert the available memory card.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **File Manager > TFlash Card**.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to highlight the desired file.
4. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** to do the following operations: Delete, Rename, Send, Move, and Space information and so on.

Bluetooth

Your phone includes Bluetooth used to connect your handset to wireless headsets and hands free car kits. You can also transfer files between your phone and other Bluetooth devices such as another phone or a laptop. Not all applications or devices can be supported as Bluetooth is an open forum and different manufacturers adopt different standards and implementation.

Setting Bluetooth attribute

The default bluetooth function is disabled for the phone. If you enable bluetooth and power off the phone, this function will be disabled. After you restart the phone, this function will be enabled automatically.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Tools > Bluetooth > Bluetooth manager** and press **OK Key [OK]**.
3. Set Bluetooth switch, Bluetooth visible switch, and enter Phone name.



Notes:

Select **On** to allow your mobile phone to be found by other compatible devices, and you can also send files between your phone and other bluetooth device.

4. After complete the settings, press **OK Key [OK]** to save.

My device

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Tools > Bluetooth > My devices**.
3. Press **Right Soft Key [Search]** to search the available bluetooth devices.
4. Select one device from the displayed list and press **OK Key** to confirm.
5. Enter the pass code when asked for permission to connect to the device. After the paired device verify the pass code, the device will be added successfully.

Sending data

Firstly please confirm following two items:

- Enable bluetooth function.
 - The paired device is visible.
1. Select your desired file, and select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Send > Via Bluetooth**.
 2. Select the aim device from the device list, and press **OK Key [OK]** to send.

Receiving data

Firstly please enable Bluetooth function.

1. If the paired device tries to send a file to your phone, one popup dialogue will appear in your screen.
2. Press **Left Soft Key [Yes]** to accept the incoming file, or press **Right Soft Key [No]** to reject the incoming file.

Modem function



Notes:

Please confirm :

- Insert valid (U)SIM card.
- GPRS configuration or dialing connection is available.

Use the parameters obtained from your service provider to complete the modem settings, connect your phone to computer with supplied data cable , then your phone can work as one external modem for the computer. Detailed please consult your service provider.

Chapter 11

Internet

Setting Internet connection

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Browser > Settings** to do the following operations:

Connection settings	Sets the APN, preset by your service provider.
Advanced settings	Customize the browser display modes, background music, cache, cookies, and so on.
Clear cache	Clear all cache data.
Clear cookies	Clear all cookie information.
Clear input histories	Delete all input history items.
Certificate	List the root and CA certificates on the handset.

Surfing Internet

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Browser > Home** to access the preset home page.
 - ▶ Or select **New Link** to enter new URL address manually, and press **OK Key [Link]**.
 - ▶ Or use **Up/Down Key** to select the previously saved page and press **Select > Link** to access the page.

Saving a webpage

If the webpage supports saving function, you can save it during visiting.

1. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Save**.
2. Enter the webpage title and press **OK Key [Save]**.

Viewing a saved page

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Browser > Saved Page** to access the page list interface.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to view the webpage title.
 - ▶ Press **OK Key [Link]** to open the webpage.

- ▶ Press **Right Soft Key [Info.]** to view title, address and saved time of the selected webpage.
- ▶ Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** to lock/unlock the webpage, edit webpage title, or delete saved page.

Bookmark

Select **Bookmarks** to display a list of stored bookmarks.

Adding a bookmark

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Browser > Bookmarks**, and press **OK Key**.
3. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > New Bookmark**, and enter the title and address.

When there is no any bookmark, press **OK Key [New]** to add a new bookmark.

4. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save the setting.

When viewing web site, you can select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Add to Bookmark**, the current page will be saved as a bookmark.

Viewing history links

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Browser > History** and press **OK Key [Select]**.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select history link record.
 - ▶ Press **OK Key [OK]** to open the web site corresponding with the selected record.
 - ▶ Press **Right Soft Key [Info.]** to check title and address information of the selected history link.
 - ▶ Press **Left Soft Key [Options]**, the selected history link can be saved as bookmark or deleted.

Emptying history links

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Browser > History**, and press **OK Key**.
Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Delete** to delete the selected history link.
Or select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Delete all** to clear all history links.
3. Press **OK Key [OK]** to confirm deleting.

Downloading

1. When viewing network page, use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select the link, press **OK Key** to open the objective link.
2. Press **OK Key [OK]** to confirm and start downloading. The downloading information will be saved in handset memory or memory card.



Caution:

Do not download and use software and file from an unknown source.

Options for browser

In standby mode, select **Menu > Browser > Settings > Advanced settings** to do more operations.

- **Display picture:** display the figure in network page or not.
- **Display Animation:** display the animation in network page or not.
- **Browser Mode:** select **Simple, Full, Rapid render,** and **Text.**
- **SmartFit Mode:** start intelligent display mode or not.
- **Background Music:** play background music or not.
- **Cache mode:** open or close buffer mode.
- **Cookie mode:** select **Accepted all, Rejected all** or send **Prompt.**
- **Autofill mode:** open or close Auto filling mode.
- **Script:** select network page script or not.
- **Refresh Limit:** select the maximum refreshing number.

Chapter 12

Entertainment

Pictures

Your handset has picture management function. The operation for pictures in handset memory or storage card includes: browsing, transmitting, setting as wall paper, adding to slide, move, rename, copy and delete.



Caution:

The preset pictures in handset can not be transmitted or deleted.

Playing slide show

When you have some image files stored in your phone, you can create a slide show to play your images in the preferred order.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Slide show**, and press **OK Key**.
3. If there is no slide show, press **OK Key [Add]** to create a new slide.
 - i. Enter the slide name and press **OK Key**.
 - ii. Select images from **Photos/Others** folder or memory card.
 - iii. Press **Left Soft Key** and select **Mark** to mark it.
Or press **Left Soft Key [Options] > Mark all** to select all files.
 - iv. Press **OK Key** to save the pictures to the slide.
4. Press **OK Key [Play]** to play the image files in the playlist.

When you create a slide, press **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options:

- **Edit**: Edit the slide show slide files.
- **New slide**: Add a new slide.
- **Rename**: Rename the selected slide.
- **Delete**: Delete the selected slide.
- **Delete all**: Delete all files.
- **Info.**: View the information of the selected slide.

Viewing pictures

You can use following four methods to view the pictures.

- Open **File Manager** to view the photos.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Tools > File Manager > Phone > Photos > My Pictures**.

- ii. Select your desired pictures, press **OK Key [Open]** to view the picture.
- Active **Camera** to view the picture, detailed please refer to the chapter: *Photos and videos > Camera > Viewing photos*.
- Active **Media Player** to view the picture.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Multimedia > Media player** to active media player.
 - ii. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Open**.
 - Select **Files** to open picture in the file manager.
 - Or select **Slide** to play pictures.
- Active **Slide show** to view the picture.
 - i. In standby mode, select **Menu > Multimedia > Slide show** to active slide show.
 - ii. Select desired **Slide show** and press **OK Key [Play]** to view the pictures.

Music

When you have some audio files stored in your phone, you can create a playlist to play your audio files in the preferred order.

Playing a music

You can use following four methods to play a sound file.

- Open **File Manager** to play a sound file.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **File Manager > Audios > My Audios**.
 - ii. Select your desired audio file, press **OK Key [Open]** to play the audio file.
 - Or mark all your desired audios, and create a playlist, then press **OK Key [Open]** to play the audios.
- Active **Voice Recorder** to play the sound file, detailed operations please refer to the chapter: *Photos and videos > Recorder > Playing a sound file*.
- Active **Media Player** to play the sound file.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Multimedia > Media player** to active media player.
 - ii. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Open**.
 - Select **Files** to open audio file in the file manager,
 - Or Select **Playlist** to play audio files.
- Active **Playlist** to play the audio files.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Multimedia > Playlist** to active playlist.
 - ii. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select your desired playlist.
 - iii. Press **OK Key [Play]** to play the audio file.

Setting music mode

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Playlist**, press **OK Key** to select.
3. Press **OK Key [Play]** to play the audio files in the playlist.
4. Stop playing and press **Left Soft Key [Options]**.
5. Select **Play mode > Normal/One-repeat/All-repeate/Shuffle**, to choose your desired mode.

Managing play-list

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Playlist**, and press **OK Key**.
3. If there is no playlist, press **OK Key [Add]** to create a new playlist.
 - i. Select an audio file from **Audios/Others** folder or memory card.
 - ii. Press **Right Soft Key [Mark]** to select it.
 - iii. Or press **Left Soft Key [Options] > Mark all files** to select all files.
 - iv. Press **OK Key** to save the audio files to the playslit.
4. Press **OK Key [Play]** to play the audio files in the playlist.

When you create a playlist, press **Left Soft Key [Options]** for more options:

- **Edit Playlist:** Edit the selected playlist file.
- **New Playlist:** Add a new playlist file.
- **Rename:** Rename the selected playlist file.
- **Delete:** Delete the selected playslist file.
- **Delete all:** Delete all files.
- **Info.:** View the information of the selected playlist.

Video

Your handset support video file recording, storage and play functions.

Playing videos

You can use following three methods to play a video.

- Open **File Manager** to play a video.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Tools > File Manager > Videos > My Videos**.
 - ii. Select your desired videos, press **OK Key [Open]** to play the video.
- Active **Video Camera** to play a video, detailed please refer to the chapter: *Photos and videos > Video > Playing a video*.
- Active **Media Player** to view the videos.
 - i. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Multimedia > Media player** to active media player.

- ii. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Open**.
- iii. Select **Files** to open videos in the file manager.

Streaming URL

TV channels are links to audio or video streaming content available through the browser (like **bookmark**). The streaming content is only available while you are connected to the server, depending on your service provider or suitable content.

Setting Streaming media

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Media player > Options > Network settings**, and enter the related parameters.



Notes:

[About the parameter detail, please consult your service provider.](#)

3. Press **OK Key [OK]** to confirm.
4. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Multimedia > Streaming URL**, and press **OK Key [Add]**.
5. Enter **Title** and **URL** network address information, and press **OK Key [Save]** to save the configuration.

After setting, press **OK Key [Open]** to start streaming media connection.

Playing streaming media

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > Media player > Options > Open > URL**, and press **OK Key [OK]**.
3. Press **OK Key [Open]** to connect the URL. After the successful connection, online streaming media programme can be enjoyed.

Games and applications

In standby mode, select **Menu > Games & apps** to enter **Games & apps** interface.

Installing JAVA program

Handset can connect network and download JAVA program.

1. In standby mode, press **Left Soft Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Games and applications > More games**, and press **OK Key [Go]** to start downloading.
The storage position for downloading is decided by **Download location** setting in your handset.
3. Select desired JAVA program, and press **OK Key [Open]** to start installation.
4. After installation, press **OK Key [Use]** and run the program.

The installed program is saved in **Games and applications** menu.

Uninstalling JAVA program

1. In standby mode, press **Left Soft Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Games and apps > Download applications**, and press **OK Key [Go]**.
3. Select your desired JAVA program.
4. Press **Left Soft Key [Options] > Delete** to delete.
5. After deleting, press **OK Key [Confirm]**.

Starting JAVA program

Your handset has downloaded and installed JAVA program successfully.

1. In standby mode, press **Left Soft Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Games and apps > Download and applications**.
3. Select your desired JAVA program.
4. Press **OK Key** to start running.

Press **End Key** to exit JAVA program.

Radio

You can listen to radio by the handset.

The radio has auto-search and locking channel function.

Compatible earphone or component is necessary for the radio usage.



Tips:

Please select suitable volume in listening.

Continuous high volume may be harmful for your ear.

Starting Radio

1. Insert the ear phone compatible with your handset.
2. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Multimedia > FM radio**, the radio will be started.

Channels

Auto search channels

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > FM radio**, and press **OK Key**.
3. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Auto-search** to search channels automatically.

Setting channel manually

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Multimedia > FM radio**, and press **OK Key**.
3. Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** and select **Set-channel** to input the channels automatically.

Radio options

In standby mode, select playing radio program, press **Left Soft Key [Options]** to display more options as below:

Auto-search, Set-channel, Rename, Delete and Clear.

Chapter 13

Tools

Calendar

You can conveniently access and modify your agenda:

- In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
- Select **Tools > Calendar** and press **OK Key [OK]** to enter **Calendar** interface.
- Press **Navigation Keys** to scroll to different date.
- Press **Right Soft Key [Add]** to add **Meeting, Memo** or **Anniversary**.
- Press **Left Soft Key [Options]** to display more options.
 - **Week view:** check the week arrangement.
 - **Go to date:** input date and enter the date to check.
 - **Delete entry:** you can delete calendar item.
 - **Settings:** you can set calendar alarm clock, default view and week start day.
 - **Memory Info.:** display the current memory usage.

Alarm

You can set the alarm to ring if required. Select your desired alarm to configure in the alarm list. (If there is no alarm, press the **OK Key [Add]** to add a new alarm.)

- In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
- Select **Tools > Alarm** and press **OK Key [OK]** to enter **Alarm** interface.
- Press the **OK Key [View]** to view the selected alarm item.
- Press the **Left Soft Key [Options]** to display the following menu items:
 - **Edit alarm:** This function allows you to set the Alarm type, Alarm time, Snooze, Ringtone (on/off), Ringtone type, Status, and Alarm remark. When completing configuration, press the **OK Key [Save]** to save the alarm configuration.
 - **Set rest days:** The preset Workday Alarm will not ring at the defined rest day.
 - Press the **Up/Down Key** to highlight the days.
 - Press the **Left Soft Key [Select/Cancel]**.
 - Press the **OK Key** to change the rest day.
 -
 - **Delete:** Delete the selected alarm.




Notes:

If you turn the alarm on, the icon  will be displayed in standby mode. The alarm will ring at the set time, even when the phone is powered off.

Calculator

The phone provides simple calculating functions, such as addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

- In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
- Select **Tools > Calculator** and press **OK Key [OK]** to enter **Calculator** interface.
- Press **0 ~ 9**  to enter numbers.
- Press the **Right Soft Key** to enter the decimal point.
- Press the **Up/Down Key** or the **Left/Right Key** to choose +, -, ×, ÷.
- Press the **C Key** to clear the last digit you input or the results.
- Press the **OK Key** to view the result.
- Press the **End Key** to exit the calculator.

World Time

You can check the current local time and date for major cities around the world.

- In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
- Select **Tools > World Time** and press **OK Key [OK]** to enter **World Time** interface.
- Press the **Left/Right Key** to view the time of desired city.
- Press the **OK Key** to save the selected city time as a native display.
- Press the **Back Key** or the **C Key** to quit.



Notes:

Time and date should be set to ensure the World Time function work correctly.

Stopwatch

You can measure time and take split times or lap times, for example, in different sports.

- In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
- Select **Tools > Stopwatch** and press **OK Key [OK]** to enter **Stopwatch** interface.
- Press the **OK Key [Start]** to start timing.
- Press the **OK Key [Stop]** to stop the timing during the operation and view the duration of time.
- Press the **OK Key [Contin.]** to continue timing.
- Press the **Right Soft Key [Reset]** to reset.

Currency conversion

This function allows you to convert foreign currency to domestic currency.

- In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
- Select **Tools > Currency Conversion** and press **OK Key [OK]** to enter **Currency Conversion** interface.

- **Exchange rate:** Enter a currency exchange rate.
- **Foreign amount:** Enter the amount of foreign currency to be converted.
- **Local amount:** The conversion result displays.

While inputting the inquired information, you can also do the following operations:

1. Press the **Left Soft Key [Decimal]** to input the decimal.
2. Press the **OK Key [Reset]** to reset.
3. Press the **End Key** to exit currency conversion function.



Notes:

You can also input the exchange rate and local amount to get the converted value in foreign amount.

Chapter 14

Personalize your phone

Setting display

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Screen**:
 - ▶ Select **Wallpaper**, use the picture saved in **Phone** or **Memory card** as wallpaper, displayed in standby mode.
 - ▶ Select **Set backlight duration** to adjust backlight duration time.
 - ▶ Select **Set brightness** to adjust the screen brightness.
 - ▶ Select **Keypad light** to adjust keypad light time.
 - ▶ Select **Owner name** to input owner name, displayed in standby mode.
 - ▶ Select **Greeting** to input greeting words, displayed in power on screen.

Basic settings

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Handset**:
 - ▶ Select **Language** to set the current display language.
 - ▶ Select **Time and Date** to set time, date and display mode.
 - ▶ Select **Network time** to enable or disable this function.
 - ▶ Select **Missed calls alert** to set the ringtone notification for missed calls.
 - ▶ Select **Shortcut keys** to assign the navigation key as shortcuts to important functions.
 - ▶ Select **Keylock** to set handset keypad auto lock time or disable keypad auto lock.
 - ▶ Select **Own phone number** to set own number to remind you which (U)SIM card is in using.
 - ▶ Select **Download location** to select handset memory or MicroSD card.
 - ▶ Select **Network settings** to select network and band.
 - ▶ Select **Access point settings** to view the access point list.
 - ▶ Select **Modem setting** to set modem parameters, you can use data cable to connect handset and computer and use handset as modem. The detail parameter can refer to your service provider.
 - ▶ Select **Connections** to create or edit connection data for service providers.
 - ▶ Select **PC Connection** to choose the connection method between your computer and phone.
 - ▶ Select **T-mode** to set your hearing aid to T-mode if available and enable T-mode on your handset.
 - ▶ Select **Restore default settings** to reset the handset to the default factory settings.

Profiles

Selecting current profile

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Setings > Profiles > General/Meeting/Outdoor/Silent** according to your current surrounding.
3. Press **OK Key [Activate]** to activate this mode.

Editing a profiles

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Profiles**.
3. Select desired profile and press **Right Soft Key [Edit]**
 - i. Select **Voicecall ringtone** to set voice call ring tone.
 - ii. Select **Videocall ringtone** to set video call ring tone.
 - iii. Select **Ring volume** to set ring volume.
 - iv. Select **Ringing type** to set ringing type.
 - v. Select **Message tone** to set SMS ring.
 - vi. Select **Keytones** to open or close keybeep.
 - vii. Select **Keypad sounds** to set spoken key sounds or tones
 - viii. Select **Warning tone** to open or close warning voice.
 - ix. Select **Power on/off sound** to set power on/off sound.
 - x. Select **Earpiece volume** to adjust earpiece volume.

Chapter 15

Phone Security

Phone password

Handset password can protect your handset efficiently and avoid illegal usage. If handset password protection is activated, you should input the correct password in handset start-up.

- For new bought handset, the protection function is not activated and the default password is 0000.
- In standby mode, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Activate security codes > Handset code** to start or stop password protection.
- In standby mode, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Change security codes > Handset code** to change handset password. It is suggested to change the password according to your requirement.



Notes:

Please remember the password you set, otherwise your handset can not be used normally, need to contact ZTE after-sale service center.

PIN codes

PIN code is the personal identification code of (U)SIM card, used to avoid illegal usage for your (U)SIM card. Once PIN code is started, the correct PIN code should be inputted in handset start up, otherwise the handset can only execute emergency call.

- For the new bought card, the default code is supplied by the service provider.
- In standby mode, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Activate security codes > PIN code** to start or stop PIN code.
- In standby mode, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Change security codes > PIN code** to change PIN code.
- If input wrong PIN code continuously for three times, the handset will lock the (U)SIM card and prompt you to input PUK code to unlock.



Notes:

If you change PIN code, please remember it clearly.

PIN2 is needed for some settings. Proceed as with PIN code.

PUK code is the specified unlock code for (U)SIM card, when (U)SIM card is locked, input the correct PUK code and then input the new set PIN code, (U)SIM card then can be used normally.

- PUK code may be supplied with the new bought card, the detail can refer to the service provider.
- PUK code can only be inputted continuously for 10 times, if input wrong PIN code for 10 times, (U)SIM card will be locked indefinitely.



Notes:

If PUK code is supplied with the new bought card, please keep it safely.

Fixed dial numbers

If you active this function, you can not dial the numbers of out of list.

FDN list

This menu shows the list of the fixed dial numbers.

1. In idle screen, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Security > FDN list**, and press **OK Key** to enter FDN list interface.
3. Select desired item, you can do following operations:
 - Press **OK Key [Edit]** to edit the selected item.
 - Press **Right Soft Key [Delete]** to delete the selected item.
 - Press **Left Soft Key [Add]** to add new item.
4. If there is no fixed dial number:
 - i. Press **Left Soft Key [Add]**.
 - ii. Enter **PIN2 code** and press **OK Key [OK]**.
 - iii. Press **Left Soft Key [Add]**.
 - iv. Enter **name** and **phone number** information.
 - v. Press **OK Key [Save]** to save the settings.

Restoring factory settings

Restoring factory settings can recover all the items in **Settings** menu to the default values.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** to enter main menu.
2. Select **Settings > Handset > Restore default settings**.
3. Press **OK Key**.
4. Enter handset lock code, and press **OK Key [OK]**.
5. Press **Left Soft Key [Yes]** to restore factory settings.



Notes:

This function will not affect the passwords you changed in **Settings menu.**

6. Or press **Right Soft Key [No]** to cancel restore.

Chapter 16

File manager

Viewing a file

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Tools > File Manager**.
2. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select your desired folder and press **OK Key**.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select your desired file.
4. Press **OK Key [Open]** to view the file.

Deleting a file

Deleting no useful files can save memory space.

1. In standby mode, press **OK Key [Menu]** and select **Tools > File manager**.
2. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select your desired folder and press **OK Key**.
3. Use **Up Key** or **Down Key** to select your desired file.
4. Select **Left Soft Key [Options] > Delete**.
5. Press **Left Soft Key [Yes]** to delete file, or press **Right Soft Key [No]** to give up.

Managing folders

You can create new folder, rename folder, check folder attribute and delete unnecessary folder.

Chapter 18

Care and maintenance

General care

Your handset contains delicate electronic circuitry, magnets and battery systems. You should treat it with care and give particular attention to the following points:

- Do not allow the handset, battery or accessories to come into contact with liquids or moisture at any time. Do not immerse the handset in any liquid.
- Do not place the handset alongside computer disks, credit cards, travel cards and other magnetic media. The information contained on disks or cards may be affected by the handset.
- Do not place anything in the folded handset.
- Do not paint the handset.
- Do not leave the handset or the battery in places where the temperature could exceed 60 °C, e.g. on a car dashboard or a windowsill, behind glass in direct sunlight, etc.
- Do not remove the handset's battery while the handset is switched on.
- Take care not to allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.
- Do not dispose of battery packs in a fire. The handset's Li-ION batteries may be safely disposed of at a Li-ION recycling point.
- Do not put the handset's battery in your mouth, as battery electrolytes may be toxic if swallowed.
- Do not attempt to dismantle the handset or any of its accessories.
- This equipment is fitted with an internal battery, take it to a qualified service engineer when the replacement of the battery is required.
- There is a risk of explosion if the battery is replaced with an incorrect battery type. Dispose of the used battery in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not put a battery into a microwave oven, dryer, or high-pressure container.
- Do not contact battery directly to an electric outlet or cigarette lighter charger. Use only approved charger units.
- Do not pierce battery with a sharp object such as a needle.
- When the battery is thrown away, be sure it is non-conducting by applying vinyl tape to the (+) and (-) terminals.
- Do not disassemble or modify the battery.
- Do not drop, throw, or subject the handset to rough treatment.
- Stop using the battery if abnormal heat, odor, discoloration, deformation, or abnormal condition is detected during use, charge, or storage.
- In the unlikely event of a battery leak, keep the battery discharge away from your eyes or skin. If the leakage does come into contact with the eyes or skin, please flush thoroughly in clean water and consult with a doctor.
- Do not use a damaged or deformed battery.
- Do not solder a battery directly.
- Remove the battery whose life cycle has expired from equipment immediately.

- The earpiece may become warm during normal use. Also, the handset itself may become warm while the battery is being charged.
- When a handset is in vibration mode, the vibration can sometimes cause the handset to move.
- Be careful not to place the handset near heat sources (such as a heater) or too close to the edge of the table.
- Use a damp or anti-static cloth to clean the handset. Do not use an ordinary dry cloth or electrostatic cloth. Do not use chemical or abrasive cleaners as these could damage the casing.
- Third party equipment: The use of third party equipment, cables or accessories, not made or authorized by manufacturer, may invalidate the warranty of your handset and also adversely affect the phone's safety/operation.
- Remember to make backup copies of all important data on your handset.
- Remember to recycle: the cardboard packing supplied with this handset is ideal for recycling.

**Warning:**

Caution explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions.

Aircraft safety

- Power off your phone before the airplane takes off. In order to protect airplane's communication system from interference, it is prohibited to use mobile phone in flight. If you want to use mobile phone before the airplane takes off, you should get aircrew's permission according to safety regulations.
- If the mobile phone has the function of automatic timing power-on, please check your alarm setting to ensure that your phone will not be automatically powered on during the flight.

Hospital safety

General guidelines

Glossary

4. **MMS (Multimedia Message Service)** - A message service for the handset environment, that allows videos, pictures, audio files and text to be sent between phones and dependent on network provider support, to email addresses
5. **Roaming** - Use of your phone when you are outside your home area, when traveling for example.
6. **(U)SIM** - Universal Subscriber Identity Module. Your (U)SIM is provided by service provider. It carries the authentication and service grade data for the service provider as well as user-specific data such as Contacts and SMS.
7. **Video call** - A communications service that enables users to communicate with video instead of normal voice. Video calling is only supported by 3G network providers
8. **Voice/Video mail** - An answering service that automatically answers your calls when you are not available. Others can leave either voice or video messages for you with this service.

The wireless telephone industry has developed ratings for some of their mobile phones to assist hearing-device users in finding phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that have been rated have a label on the box. Your F160 has been tested for hearing aid device compatibility and has an M[4] and/or T[4] rating.

These ratings are not guaranteed. Results will vary, depending on the level of immunity of your hearing device and the degree of your hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference with hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. **T-Ratings:** Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices contain telecoils.) The more immune your hearing aid device is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from your wireless phone. Hearing aid devices should have ratings similar to those of phones. Ask your hearing health-care professional for the rating of your hearing aid.

Hearing devices may also be measured for immunity to this type of interference. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find results for your hearing device. The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from wireless devices.

Turn on the HAC Setting


When the HAC setting is on, your F160 sends the audio from your phone calls to the telecoil rather than to the microphone of your hearing aid. You are likely to hear calls much better because volume is increased and background noise and feedback are diminished. The HAC setting improves only the calls you listen to through the earpiece. It does not affect calls heard on the speakerphone or with a headset. Turn off the Bluetooth function. HAC requires extra battery power, so watch your battery consumption when it's turned on.

CAUTION: Do not turn on the HAC setting unless you use a hearing aid with a telecoil. Using this setting without a hearing aid or with a hearing aid without a telecoil may be harmful to your hearing.

Chapter 24

Information on products disposal



The symbol  brought back on the equipment indicates that the refusal must be object of “separate collection”.

Therefore, the customer will have to confer (or to make to confer) the refusal to the centers of differentiated collection predisposed from the local administrations, or to deliver it to the retailer in exchange of one new equipment purchased.

The differentiated collection of the refusal and the successive operations of treatment, recovery and waste help the production of equipment with recycle material and limit the hazardous effects on the atmosphere and the health eventually caused from one improper management of the refusal.

The illicit disposal of the product by the customer involves the application of the administrative endorsements of which to article 254 and following of the D.Lgs. 152, April 3rd 2006.

According to the article, the 13, D.Lgs. 25th July 2005, n. 151 “Performance of the Directives 2002/95/CE, 2002/96/CE and 2003/108/CE, relative to the reduction of the use of dangerous substances in the equipment electronic electrical workers and, let alone to the disposal of the refusals”.
