

### 15 VOL+/VOL-

Increase/decrease the volume level.

### 16 **EQ**

Select the preset equaliser.

### 17 BASS

Turn the bass ON/OFF.

#### 18 SLEEP/TIMER

Set the sleep timer. Set the alarm timer.

#### 19 CLOCK

In standby mode, press and hold to activate clock setup.

Display current clock.

### 20 **PROG**

Programme soundtracks.

Presets radio stations.

Press and hold to scan for radio stations in FM modes.

### **Install Remote Control Batteries**

### **Prepare the Remote Control**

The provided Remote Control allows the unit to be operated from a distance.

- Even if the Remote Control is operated within the effective range (6m), remote control operation may be impossible if there are any obstacles between the unit and the remote control.
- If the Remote Control is operated near other products which generate infrared rays, or if other remote control devices using infra-red rays are used near the unit, it may operate incorrectly. Conversely, the other products may operate incorrectly.

### First-time use:

The unit has a pre-installed lithium CR2025 battery. Remove the protective tab to activate the remote control battery.

### **Replace the Remote Control Battery**

- 1 Pull out the battery tray and remove the old battery.
- 2 Place a new CR2025 battery into the battery tray with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- 3 Insert the battery tray back into the slot.


### **Precautions Concerning Batteries**


- When the Remote Control is not going to be used for a long time (more than a month), remove the battery from the Remote Control to prevent it from leaking.
- If the batteries leak, wipe away the leakage inside the battery compartment and replace the batteries with new ones.
- Do not use any batteries other than those specified.
- Do not heat or disassemble batteries.
- Never throw them in fire or water.
- · Do not carry or store batteries with other metallic objects as this may cause the batteries to short-circuit, leak or explode.
- Never recharge a battery unless it is confirmed to be a rechargeable type.


### Using the AUX Connection

Use a RCA to RCA stereo audio cable (included) to connect the TV's audio output sockets to the AUX(R L) socket on the unit.






Use a RCA to 3.5mm audio cable (not included) to connect the audio player's headphone socket to the AUX(R L) socket on the unit.










### Connect to FM Antenna

- Connect the supplied FM wire antenna to the FM antenna socket on the unit.
- To avoid noise, keep antennas away from the unit's, the connecting cord and the AC power cord.

### **Connecting Power**

#### Caution:

- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the rating label on the back or the underside of the unit.
- Before connecting the AC power cord, ensure you have completed all other connections.
- Connect the power to the AC socket on the unit and a wall outlet.
- Please turn the unit off completely to save energy when not in use.



### **General Operation**

### Power ON/OFF

When you first connect the unit to the mains socket, the unit will be in STANDBY mode.

- Press the  $\bigcirc$  button on the main unit or on the remote control to switch the main unit ON.
- Press the U button on the main unit or on the remote control to switch the main unit back to Standby mode.
- Disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket if you want to switch the unit off completely.

**Note:** When there is no input signal (or weak input signal) in AUX/docking/Bluetooth and when CD is not playing (No disc, Stop or Pause) for over 15 minutes, the unit will automatically switch to Standby mode.

### **Select Modes**

To get to the desired function mode, press the 🖃 button repeatedly on the unit or press the CD, DOCK, FM, AUX/BT(Bluetooth) buttons on the remote control to select the desired mode.

### Turn the Bass ON/OFF

Press the BASS button on the remote control repeatedly to turn the bass on or off.

### Adjust the Volume

Press the **VOL** +/- buttons on the main unit or on the remote control to adjust the volume.

If you wish to turn the sound off, press the **MUTE** button on the remote control. Press the **MUTE** button again or press **VOL+**/- button to resume normal volume.

### Select the Equaliser

Press the **EQ** button on the remote control repeatedly to select: **[POP] - [CLASSIC] - [JAZZ] - [ROCK]**. The default EQ setting is **POP**.

### **Adjust the Brightness**

Press the **DIMMER** button on the remote control to select brightness level.

### Set the Clock

- Manual Setting the clock can only be done in **STANDBY** mode.
- 1 In STANDBY mode, press and hold the CLOCK button on the remote control until the hour digits are flashing.
- 2 Press the ▲,▼ buttons on the remote control to adjust the hour digits while flashing, then press CLOCK button on the remote control to confirm, then the minute digits will flash.
- 3 Press the ▲,▼ buttons on the remote control to adjust the minute digits while flashing, then press the **CLOCK** button on the remote control to confirm.
- Each activated state will be cleared if any buttons are not pressed within 15 seconds.
- During Time Setup press the ► II button to select 12/24 hour format.
- Time Display
- Press the **CLOCK** button to show the current time on the display for a few seconds.

### Set the alarm Timer

- The clock must be correctly set for the timer to operate correctly.
- 1 In STANDBY mode, press and hold the **TIMER/SLEEP** button on the remote control until the hour digits flash on the display.
- 2 Press the ▲,▼ buttons on the remote control to adjust the hour digits, and then press the TIMER/ SLEEP button on the remote control to confirm, the minute digits will flash on the display.
- 3 Press the ▲,▼ buttons on the remote control to adjust the minute digits, and then press the TIMER/
  SLEEP button on the remote control to confirm, the tuner timer will flash on the display
- 4 Press the ▲,▼ buttons on the remote control to select BUZZER, FM, IPOD, DISC mode, and then press the **TIMER/SLEEP** button on the remote control to confirm, the display will show the volume level.
- 5 Press the ▲, ▼ buttons on the remote control to adjust the volume, and then press the **TIMER/SLEEP** button on the remote control to confirm, the display will show the selected timer and "②" will flash on the display.

### **Activate and Deactivate the Alarm Timer**

- Press the TIMER/SLEEP button on the remote control to view the alarm settings or activate the alarm.
- The alarms are active when "\$" both are shown in the display on the front of the unit.
- To deactivate the alarms, press the TIMER/SLEEP. The """ will disappear from the display on the front of the unit.

### **Stop Alarm Ring**

When the alarm rings, press the  $\odot$  button on the remote control. The alarm stops but the alarm settings remain.

### **Set the Sleep Timer**

This unit can switch to standby automatically after a set period of time.


1 Press the TIMER/SLEEP button on the remote control repeatedly to select your desired number of minutes. The number of minutes shown will display in this sequence:

```
\rightarrow SLEEP 90 \rightarrow SLEEP 60 \rightarrow SLEEP 30 \rightarrow SLEEP 15 \rightarrow SLEEP 00
```

- 2 Stop pressing the TIMER/SLEEP button when your desired number of minutes is displayed. The sleep timer is now set.
- Press the **TIMER/SLEEP** button to view the remaining time before switch off.
- To cancel the sleep timer, press the TIMER/SLEEP button repeatedly until "SLEEP 00" shows on the display.


### **PLAY**

### **CD/MP3/WMA Operation**



- Press the button on the main unit or press the CD button on the remote control to select the DISC source.
- 2 The unit will read the disc and play it automatically after you place a disc onto the disc tray and press the ≜ button to close the tray.

### **USB Operation**



- Press the button on the main unit or press the DOCK/USB button on the remote control to select USB mode.
- 2 Insert the USB device.

### **Play Control**

- To stop play, press the button on the remote control. The total tracks of the CD will show on the display.
- To pause or resume play, press the ►II button on the unit or the ►II/PAIR button on the remote control.
- To skip to the previous/next track, press the I◄◄/▶► buttons on the unit or on the remote control.
- Press and hold the I◄◄/►► buttons on the unit or on the remote control to perform fast forward/ reverse playback. Release the button to resume normal playback.

### **Show maturity (Music CD)**

Press the **INFO** button on the remote control while playing a music CD to:

- The remaining term of the title,
- The current time on the CD,
- The remaining term of the CD.

### **Random Playback**

During play, press the **SHUFFLE** button repeatedly to select a repeat option play mode.

### **Intro Playback**

Press the **INTRO** button on the remote control. The unit will play the first 10 seconds of each track. Press the **INTRO** button on the remote control again to resume normal playback.

### **Repeat Playback**

Press the **REPEAT** button on the remote control repeatedly to select repeat play modes. The selected mode will show on the display.

- : Play the current track repeatedly.
- : Play all tracks repeatedly.

### **Program**

The user can programme up to 20 tracks in CD/USB mode in any desired order. If more than 20 tracks are stored, **FULL** appears in the display..

- 1. Press the ■/MENU button on the remote control.
- 2. Press the **PROG** button on the remote control to enter MEMORY mode.
- Press the numbe (0~9) buttons on the remote control or the I◄◄/►►I buttons to select the track number you wish to play then press the PROG button to confirm.
- 4. Repeat step 2-3 to store the rest of the tracks.
- Press the ► on the unit or the ► /PAIR button on the remote control on the remote control to begin playback.

**Note:** If you want to change the programed files, double press the **I**/MENU button to clear the current program files, then repeat the program steps as above to re-enter the new program files.

### Play iPod/iPhone

You can enjoy audio from an iPod/iPhone through this unit.

- 1 Place the iPod/iPhone into the dock.
- This apparatus does not support Apple 30 pin models.
- 2 Press the button on the main unit or press the **DOCK/USB** button on the remote control to select the **IPOD** mode.
- 3 Start to play the connected iPod/iPhone.
- To pause/resume play, press the ► II button.
- To skip to a track, press the I◄◄/►►I buttons on the unit or on the remote control.
- Press and hold the I◄◄/▶►I buttons on the unit or on the remote control to perform fast forward/reverse playback. Release the button to resume normal playback.





### Charge the iPod/iPhone


- The docked iPod/iPhone begins to charge as soon as the unit is connected to AC power.

### **Bluetooth Operation**

The unit has a Bluetooth function that can receive a signal within 8 metres.

### Pair Bluetooth-enabled Devices

- The operational range between this player and a Bluetooth device is approximately 8 meters (without any object between the Bluetooth device and the unit).
- Before you connect a Bluetooth device to this unit, ensure you know the device's capabilities.
- Compatibility with all Bluetooth devices is not guaranteed.
- Any obstacle between this unit and a Bluetooth device can reduce the operational range.
- If the signal strength is weak, your Bluetooth receiver may disconnect, but it will re-enter pairing mode automatically.
- 1 Press the 🔁 button on the main unit or press the **BT/AUX** button on the remote control to select **BT**(Bluetooth) mode. "**NO BT**" will show on the display if the unit is not paired to any Bluetooth device.
- 2 The system has entered pairing mode.
- Or press and hold the "►II/PAIR" button on the remote control or the "►II" button on the unit to be searchable. The Bluetooth indicator will flash rapidly. The display will show "PAIR".
- 3 Activate your Bluetooth device and select the search mode. "inStudio 8021091" will appear on your Bluetooth device.
- 4 Select "inStudio 8021091" in the pairing list. Display panel shows "BT" while the pairing succeeds.
- 5 To disconnect the Bluetooth function, switch to another function on the unit or disable the function from your Bluetooth device.



#### Tips:

- Enter "0000" for the password if necessary.
- If a connection exist, press and hold "►II/PAIR" button on the unit or "►II" button on remote control to re-activate the pairing mode, the connection will be interrupted. The display will show "PAIR".
- If no other bluetooth device pairs with this player within two minutes, the player will recover its previous connection.
- The player will also be disconnected when your device is moved beyond the operational range.
- If you want to reconnect your device to this player, place it within the operational range.
- If the device is moved beyond the operational range, when it is brought back, please check if the device is still connected to the player.
- If they are connected, display panel shows "BT".
- If the connection is lost, display panel shows "NO BT". Follow the instruction above to pair your device to the player again.

### **NFC (Near Field Communication) Operation**

Pair your NFC-enabled mobile device directly with this unit by just a single tap.


- 1. Activate NFC on your mobile device.
- 2. Tap the mobile device on the "nfc" icon of the unit.
- Operate your mobile device directly for playback features.
- 4. Tap again on the "**nfc**" icon of the unit to disconnect.
- 5. Disable NFC from your mobile device if needed.
- This function only works with mobile devices that support NFC technology.

### Listen to Music from Bluetooth Device

- If the connected Bluetooth device supports Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP), you can listen to the music stored on the device through the player.
- If the device also supports Audio Video Remote Control Profile (AVRCP), you can use the player's remote control to play music stored on the device.
- 1 Pair your device with the player.
- 2 Play music via your device (if it supports A2DP).
- 3 Use supplied remote control to control play (if it supports AVRCP).
- To pause/resume play, press the ► II button.
- To skip to a track, press the I◄◄,▶►I buttons.

### **AUX Operation**

- 1 Press the button on the main unit or press the BT/AUX button on the remote control to select AUX mode.
- 2 Operate your audio device directly for playback features.
- 3 Press the **VOL** +/- button to adjust the volume to your desired level.
- 4 In AUX mode, operate your audio device directly for playback features.



### **FM Operation**

### **Auto Scan and Save Preset Station**

- 1 Press the button on the main unit or press the DAB/FM button on the remote control to select FM mode.
- 2 Press the INTRO button on the to activate automatic programming. All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
- The first programed radio station is played automatically.
- · Tune to a Preset Radio Station
- Press the ▲or▼ buttons to select a preset number that you want.

### **Tuning in a Station**

### Tune in radio stations automatically

- Press and hold the I◄◄/▶▶I buttons, the frequency changes down or up automatically until a station is found.
- The search may not stop at a station with a very weak signal.

### Tune in radio stations manually

- Press the I◄◄/►►I buttons repeatedly until you find the station you want.
- If reception is still poor, try to adjust the position of the aerial or try to move the radio to another location

### **Presetting Stations Manually**

You can preset up to 20 FM stations.

- 1 Tune in the desired station, then press the **PROG** button.
- 2 Press the **△**/**▼** buttons to select the preset number.
- 3 Press the **PROG** button to store the station.
- 4 Repeat above steps 1 to 3 for each station you want to store in memory with a preset number.

### **Troubleshooting**

To keep the warranty valid, never try to repair the system yourself. If you encounter problems when using this unit, check the following points before requesting service.

#### No power

- Ensure that the AC cord of the apparatus is properly connected.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- Press standby button to turn the unit on.

### Remote control does not work

- Before you press any SOURCE button, first select the correct source.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the unit.
- Insert the battery with its polarities (+/-) aligned as indicated.
- Replace the battery.
- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front of the unit.

### No response from the unit

- Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn the unit on again.

### Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the unit and your NFC compatible bluetooth device or the TV and VCR.

### **Clock setting erased**

- Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock.

### No Response From the Unit

- Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the unit again.

### I can not find the Bluetooth name of this unit on my Bluetooth device

- Ensure the Bluetooth function is activated on your Bluetooth device.
- Re-pair the unit with your Bluetooth device.

## Some NFC-enabled mobile devices cannot pair directly with the unit via NFC Please try either one of the solutions below:

- Download and install NFC reader apps into your NFC-enabled mobile device. Please refer to your mobile device's guidebook for more details.
- Pair with the unit via Bluetooth first, then tap again on the icon.
- Simply pair with the unit via Bluetooth.

### The disc does not play

- There is no disc inside the unit ("NO DISC" appears on the display).
- Insert the disc correctly with the label side facing up.
- Clean the disc.
- PAUSE mode may be activated, deactivate it.
- A non-valid disc has been inserted.
- Condensation may have formed inside the unit due to a sudden change in temperature. Wait about an hour for it to clear and try again.

### Using iPhone to play music

 While the iPhone is playing the music throught the docking, there may be a chance that the iPhone may not be under a good receiption mode to get the incoming call signal.
