





4 RECORD

4.0 Record Menu








The PowBox V25 provides the variety of recording capabilities. You may record your favorite TV show or VCD/DVD movie using the AV cable. You may record from your audio system such as your Hi-Fi system with the 3.5mm stereo audio cable. You may also use the PowBox V25 as a voice recorder and record your important voice memo and store it either on the internal memory or onto a SD/MMC card.

4.1 Recording Video (AV in)

Accessory contains 4 applications:

5.1 Snake Game

- Press UP/DOWN button to move up/down.

6 SETUP

Set up menu contains all sorts of setting that you can adjust on the PowBox V25, this section will explain briefly each individual function.

6.1 Set Time

The internal clock can be set, simply move the cursor around and input the correct Date (YYYY/MM/DD) and Time(HH:MM:SS) and press OK to confirm.

- Press the UP/DOWN button to increase/decrease.
- Press LEF/RIGHT button to move.
- Press OK to confirm the preset time.



6.2 Speaker

The internal speaker can be switch on/off by this menu, simply move the cursor to ON and confirm, the internal speaker will be turned on.

◄-/-▶ Press the UP / DOWN to move up/down.

-ox- Press OK to select.

6.3 Language

The user interface language can be changed in this menu, simply move the cursor to the language that you wish to read and press OK to confirm.

Press UP/DOWN button to move up/down.

-ox- Press OK to select.

6.4 Storage

By default, if there is no external memory card is inserted, everything will be operated under the internal memory AND if there is an external memory card is inserted, all the operations will be handled i.e. to READ and to WRITE to/from, the external memory card. In this menu option, you may wish to read or write to/from the internal memory even a memory card is inserted.

To activate, simply move the cursor to the memory that you wish to operator and press OK to confirm.

6.5 TV Out

PowBox V25 provides the capability to display on the LCD display as well as to output the content to the TV. Under this TV Out mode, the Powerbox V25 LCD will become blank which is a normal behaviour.

To activate, simply move the cursor to the memory that you wish to operator and press OK to confirm.

6.6 Auto Power OFF








8 BLUETOOTH

8.0 Bluetooth Stereo

PowBox V25 gives you an alternative to enjoy the multi-media with our wireless Bluetooth solution. PowBox V25 empowered the Bluetooth 1.2 A2DP spec which allows you to pair up with our stereo Bluetooth headset.




- Prio dset for the first time, you must fully charge the headset. You can charge the headset with the USB charging cable that is provided in the package. Charging is finished when the red light turns blue (approxi. 3 hours).
- ♦ You must pair the headset with a Bluetooth-enabled mobile handset.

Setp 1> Pairing the Headset with Your Handset

- 1. Place the headset and the mobile handset where they are easily viewable by no more than 1 meter apart.
- 2. Ensure the headset is OFF.
- 3. Press and hold the **MFB** until the headset **LED** alternately flashes blue and red.
- 4. Activate your mobile handset's Bluetooth function by referring to your mobile handset user guide for details.
- 5. Set the mobile handset to search for Bluetooth devices within about 1 meter as instructed in the mobile handset user guide and select "i.Tech stereo headset" from the list.
- 6. Enter the preprogrammed passkey "8888" and press "OK" to pair your headset and mobile handset. When the pairing is complete, the headset **LED** will flash blue rapidly for 5 times followed by a long beep.

Setp 2> Pairing the Headset with the PowBox V25

- 8. Turn off the headset by holding the **MFB** for 3 sec until you hear a short beep.
- 9. Turn the headset back on again by holding the **MFB** until you see the headset **LED** alternately flashes blue and red. In this stage, you headset is in "pairing mode".
- 10. Place the headset and the PMP where they are easily viewable by no more than 1 meter apart, also keep the handset in range as well.
- 11. Go to the Bluetooth Stereo menu on the PMP and select Bluetooth "ON" by pressing OK button. Now, the PMP is also in "pairing mode".
- 12. Observe the LED on the Bluetooth headset, a long flashing blue light indicates the headset has been successfully paired with the PMP. At the same time, the Bluetooth headset is also paired with your mobile handset.

IMPORTANT If the pairing cannot be completed within 2 minutes while the pairing mode is activated, the headset LED flashes purple red with 3 beeps and the headset is turned off. Please repeat Steps 2 to 7 to pair the headset and the mobile handset or Step 8 to 12 to pair the headset and PMP again.

Care and Maintenance

PMP
