The Monadnock Food Co-op held a month-long Round It Up Donation Drive to benefit Monadnock Understands Childhood Hunger (MUCH) from September 1 to September 31, 2018. Co-op shoppers donated over \$4,837 to MUCH. The money raised will support MUCH's fresh and local food initiatives, including their Vacation Box program.

The Monadnock Food Co-op named **Susan** Ashworth the 2018 Cooperator of the Year during its Annual Meeting & Celebration on October 26 in Keene. The Cooperator of the Year Award is given out annually to recognize a member-owner, vendor, staff member or co-op partner who exemplifies cooperative values, integral to cooperatives throughout the world. The co-op recognized Ashworth for her six years of serving on the Monadnock Food Co-op Board and her four decades of employment at Home Healthcare, Hospice & Community Services in Keene directing Meals on Wheels, the Keene Friendly Bus, and the Friendly Meals Senior Dining Programs.

The Monadnock Food Co-op Farm Fund program, a partnership with the Cheshire County Conservation District, is now accepting applications from local farmers. Currently, in its third year, the fund has supported seven farms in our region.

This year, the Farm Fund will award up to \$18,000 to help farms in Cheshire County and abutting New Hampshire towns develop or expand their production for wholesale markets, including selling to the Monadnock Food Co-op and Food Connects. Funds can be used to support a range of projects including the purchase of equipment and infrastructure, packaging and labeling design needs, and technical assistance. The vision test measures the function of the entire vision system, particularly helpful in testing young children and patients who have lost the ability to speak.

The LipiFlow System treats patients for one of the causes of dry eye, Meibomian gland dysfunction; EyeWorks is the only optometry practice in the region offering this treatment.


