8 Ways To Help Kids Understand What They Read

by Melissa Taylor

Now that your child is a reader, you can share your best reading comprehension strategies (that you probably don't even know you use) to help him understand what he reads.



But how?

Think about teaching a child to tie a shoe or ride a bike. You break down what you do unconsciously into teachable steps. The same goes in reading. I'm breaking down eight reading comprehension strategies that you can use at home.

1. Does This Make Sense?

The MOST important thing you can teach your child is to realize when he does and doesn't understand what he's reading. Help him stop frequently and ask himself, "Do I understand what's going on?" This can be hard for some kids. To be sure he's understanding, ask him to retell you what he just read. Teach him that if he doesn't understand, it's best to stop.

NEXT STEPS IF HE DOESN'T UNDERSTAND:

- 1) Reread.
- 2) Pick a book at an easier reading lev-
- <u>el</u>.(http://www.readbrightly.com/just-right-book-reading-levels-explained/)
- 3) Ask for professional help if it's consistent issue.

2. Can I Get a Picture in My Head?

Encourage your child to get a mental picture of what she's reading. You automatically do this as a reader. Beginning readers are just getting the hang of it. So while you're reading, show your child how to use the descriptions to make a movie in her mind. If she can't get a picture in her head, it might be because she isn't understanding or needs more practice with this strategy.

3. I Think That _____ Is Going to Happen Next.

Does your child know how to predict? Help him use the story information to make reasonable predictions about what will happen next. Stop after a short passage and talk about it — share your predictions, too. (You may need to define "reasonable" with some examples — for example, predicting that the wolf gets into a spaceship in the "Three Little Pigs" isn't a reasonable prediction.)

4. What Is That Word?

Prepare for word battle. Kids need word attack strategies. Can your child decode words she doesn't know? Show her your strategies beyond "sound it out." Look for smaller words in bigger words, use the pictures as clues, figure out the beginning and ending sounds, or skip it and keep reading.

5. What Does It Mean?

Help your child stop when he comes to a word he doesn't know and ask, "What do you think that word means?" Tell him that sometimes you can use the context of the sentence to make a good guess at the meaning (also called inference). Show him how to do this and practice together.

6. What Happened Before?

Readers need to remember what they read before — the day before, even five minutes before. Remind kids to think back to what already happened before they continue reading a new chapter.

7. I Can Relate (Connect) To _____.

Part of understanding what we read is being able to fit it into what we already know, our prior knowledge. Help your child make connections to her own life and other books she's read. Model this for your kids: "Oh, that reminds me of

8. Good Stories Are Worth the Work

Sometimes we can forget the forest when we focus on the trees. Remember, the end goal: **that your child loves to read.** If reading is getting tough, stop and find a way to make it fun. Chances are, your child already loves stories thanks to your rich home environment. Now, remind him again that the story itself is the reward. And that you will support him through this amazing journey of growing as a reader.

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Tyrrell Historical Library

enovation work continues on the Tyrrell Historical Library following the damage sustained by Hurricane Harvey. The first phase of mold remediation work is still in progress at the library. Upon its completion, a second phase of restoration work will start soon afterward. All of the necessary work to the library is hoped to be finished sometime after the beginning of this upcoming year.

The library will remain closed to the public during the renovation and restoration. A grand reopening celebration is planned once the repair work has been completed in the library. Announcements of the library's reopening will be publicized widely once a final completion date becomes known.

hile the library is closed for renovations the staff at the library has been kept busy with numerous digital and descriptive projects related to its archival collection holdings. As digital and descriptive work is finished it is added to the library's digital portal site (http://

tyrrellhistoricallibrary.contentdm.oclc.org/cdm/) where the public can have direct access to it through the internet. Over the past several months this site has grown significantly. The site now consists of 81 different digital collections with over 56,139 fully described items found on it. New content is continually being added, so patrons are encouraged to visit this site frequently to learn what new information may be available to them.

lso, prepared finding aids that fully describe the contents of processed archival collections of the library can be accessed directly via the internet. The library has 57 finding aids related to its archival collections available for patrons to search. These finding aids can be reached by going to the following website (http://archivesspace.beaumonttexas.gov).

uring the time of the library's temporary closure a limited amount of research can be performed for a fee in the history collections that remain accessible to staff at the library. A prepayment of \$10.00 is required for staff to search these collections for patrons. The collections available to staff include microfilmed Beaumont newspapers, genealogy books, and archival collections that are housed in the annex building of the library. Staff can devote up to **one**

hour of research time once the necessary \$10.00 fee has been received and processed by the library. Methods of payment include the following: personal check, money order, or major credit card. Patrons wishing staff to conduct research on their behalf for a \$10.00 fee should contact the library at the following telephone number (409)833-2759, ext. -3302.

nyone who may be interested in donating historic materials to the library can still do so. Donations of historic materials can be dropped off either at the Main Library building located at 801 Pearl Street, or by calling for a scheduled appointment time at the following telephone number of (409)833-2759, ext. -3302 or -3307. The Tyrrell Historical Library always welcomes donations that document the unique and important rich history of Beaumont and its surrounding community.
