### WAR DIARY FOR MEDICAL SECTION HEADQUARTERS A.I.F. DEPOTS IN U.K. FOR MONTH OF DECEMBER 1918.

During December the strength of A.I.F. Depots decreased from 39,167 to 34,100

#### (A). MEDICAL OFFICERS:

The strength of Medical Officers in the Command has decreased from 77 to 70 during the month. 2 Reinforcement Officers arrived from Australia and 1 reported from the D.M.S. for duty. 4 marched out to report to the D.M.S. and 6 embarked for return to Australia.

During the first half of the month the Medical Officers had to work at high pressure boarding category men prior to their return to Australia and were just able to do the work in the allotted time. Towards the end of the month however, things became easier and it became possible to grant a considerable amount of leave at Christmas time.

Appendix "A" (attached) shews the weekly distribution and posting of Medical Officers.

#### (B).- HEALTH OF TROOPS:

The number of soldiers in hospital shews a marked decrease during the month. This was due to the decrease in incidence of Influenza, which by the end of the month had practically abated, as the following figures shew:-

For full statistical reports as to health of troops see Appendix "B" which consists of the weekly reports on this subject submitted to the D.M.S. These reports shew that for the four weeks ending 5.12.18., 12.12.18., 19.12.18., and 26.12.18 the total number of soldiers in hospital were respectively 2,594, 2,346., 2,095., and 1,786, the corresponding percentages to the total strength of the Command being 6.48%., 6.23%., 5.8% and 5.49%

The amount of serious disease was very slight compared with the previous month.

There were 11 deaths from all causes, of which only 3 were due to Pneumonia, all of these three occurring ~~during~~ during the first week of the month. There has not been any case of Cerebro Spinal Meningitis.

			<p>During the 4-weekly month of November there were 62 fresh cases of Mumps and 86 of Measles as compared with 133 cases of Mumps and 38 cases of Measles during December. 108 cases of Mumps arrived in "Zealandic" from Australia on December 6th..</p> <p><u>Venereal Disease:</u> The number of soldiers in hospital with Venereal Disease has decreased during the month, the number for the four weeks ending 5.12.18., 12.12.18., 19.12.18., and 26.12.18 being respectively 1000, 1001, 983, and 905. An average of 62.5 per week were admitted from soldiers from British or Australian Auxiliary Hospitals or on Sick Furlough, as compared with 72.75 from these sources last month. Of B.E.F. troops on leave from France, a weekly average of 40.5 were admitted as compared with 63.25 in November. The admissions to Bulford Hospital from within A.I.F. Depots averaged 72.25 per week as compared with 36.5 per week in November. 341 cases of Gonorrhoea were discharged to the C.T.D. during the four weeks ending 26.12.18., of which 36 cases relapsed and were returned to No. 1 A.D.H. for further treatment.</p>

DEPOTS IN U.K. FOR MONTH OF DECEMBER 1918 (CONT'D)</u></p> <p><u>HEALTH OF TROOPS (CONT'D)</u></p> <p><u>Early Treatment:</u> 7722 soldiers attended the Early Treatment Depots during the four weeks ending 26.12.18., of these 195 shewing signs of disease were "sealed up" and 305 such cases were aborted.</p> <p><u>Appendix "C"</u> which consists of the Consolidated Weekly Early Treatment Returns is attached.</p> <p>(C). - <u>A. A. M. C. TRAINING DEPOT:</u></p> <p>During the month the total strength of the A.A.M.C. Training Depot has increased from 176 to 242. 17 other ranks have arrived as reinforcements from Australia and 28 casuals have marched in from the Overseas Training Brigade. In addition 106 General Service Reinforcements Infantry marched in and were transferred to the A.A.M.C. to replace A.A.M.C. Home Service personnel due to return to Australia. No casuals were returned and no General Reinforcements proceeded overseas. 1 "A" class man has during the month been transferred at his own request to a Combatant Arm of the Service.</p> <p>Early in the month it was decided that the Depot should now function as a Collecting Centre for all A.A.M.C. personnel due to return to Australia for any reason, i.e. all "B" and "C" class men or men who left Australia before 30.6.15 and who could be replaced., that these men should form A.A.M.C. staffs for Transports returning to Australia in order of priority.</p> <p>It was decided that A.A.M.C. Staffs for all Transports returning to Australia should be supplied by the A.A.M.C. Training Depot with the exception of those boats which were being filled from No. 2 Command Depot, Weymouth, in which case the A.A.M.C. staff could also be supplied from that Depot.</p> <p><u>Appendix "B"</u> shows War Diary of A.A.M.C. The corresponding figures for the 4-weekly month of November were 6,737. Thus the admissions rate shews a decrease of approximately 25%. The decrease is of course due to the cessation of fighting on a large scale by Australian Troops since early October.</p> <p>For detailed Command Depots statistics see <u>Appendix "D"</u> which consists of the <u>APPENDIX "D"</u></p> <p>Consolidated Weekly Command Depot Returns.</p> <p><u>General:</u></p> <p>The number of returned B.E.F. men discharged for General Service to O.T.B. and elsewhere for the four weeks ending 28.12.18 was 468 as compared with 4,296 in November. This falling off is due to the fact that early in December it was decided that all other than "A" class men should be returned to Australia unless their services were indispensable. The Overseas Training Brigade ceased to function as such, and although it still retained its name was used merely as a Concentration Depot for troops returning to Australia.</p> <p><u>No. 2 Command Depot:</u></p> <p>The strength of this Depot during the month decreased from 6416 to 6200. The number of admissions to hospital has increased from 786 (2.99%) to 797 (2.02%).

Number of admissions to hospital has decreased from 797 (2.02%) to 683 (1.74%).

Number of General Cases in hospital has decreased from 1474 (3.68%) to 1246 (3.31%).

The average number attending Daily Sick Parade has decreased from 586 (1.48%) to 449 (1.14%).

RESPIRATORY DISEASE: The number of cases admitted to hospital has decreased from 317 to 153. Of these Influenza accounted for 106 as compared with 233 last week.

3 cases were sent to hospital diagnosed as Pneumonia, and there have been 2 deaths from this disease during the week.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE: Number of cases in hospital, excluding scabies has decreased from 93 to 71.

Number of contacts in the lines has increased from 648 to 1530. This increase being due to the arrival of reinforcements ex "Zealandic" on 5th December, 1918. They were isolated for mumps.

Measles: Number of cases admitted to hospital has increased from 10 to 17, of whom 14 had already been segregated.

Mumps: Number of cases admitted to hospital has increased from 8 to 108, of which 106 cases occurred amongst troops in segregation.

Number of cases in Hospital has increased from 18 to 32.

Diphtheria: There has been *one* case.

The number of men boarded indicates the work done under the demobilization scheme.

It was attempted to make these boards finalize the man's state of health on leaving the army. The soldier was encouraged to state any disability he was aware of. The entries in the Medical History Sheet were investigated one by one and attention was directed to the detection of the particular sequelae suggested by the medical history. This medical investigation was facilitated by the frankness of the soldier, and no instance occurred of a soldier exaggerating infirmities but quite the opposite impression was produced by his eagerness to convince one that he was "as fit as a fiddle".

The introduction of A.A.M.C. Form 8 produced an excellent and simple summary of the statements of the final medical board. No instance occurred of a soldier refusing to witness his agreement. The attachment of this form to the Bl78 was a great improvement on the entry in the Bl78, as this form was always over-written and sometimes the worse of wear and often no place could be found to conspicuously display the position of the final medical board.

The difficulty in carrying out these numerous boards did not arise when you had got your man, but in getting your man. The first parades were alright, but then came men who were on leave, absent without leave, those wishing to be discharged in England, those wishing to delay their departure from England. For a time it needed some propaganda amongst the Combatant Staff before they realised that the man must be finalised medically as well as financially and otherwise. However, they soon realised the need of collecting these men and the necessity and value of medical inspections before embarkation. They used every means to collect the men and parade them, and publish nominal rolls in accordance with medical results.

The health of the men in the Area is excellent, and sick parades have fallen to negligible numbers.

The staff of medical officers has undergone some changes, but the completion of the work of boarding has enabled the reduced number to carry on and permit of the special Xmas leave.

During the past month the Medical organization of the depot has been carried out without interruption of any kind. Since the last ~~report~~ report the Demobilization of the A.I.F. troops has commenced and over 5000 men have been boarded for return to Australia and three boats have ~~already~~ already left with troops from this depot. The influenza epidemic has completely died out and it is only on rare occasions that a case is reported. One noticeable feature during the month was the greatly reduced number on sick parades and also the few number of men admitted to hospital with general diseases. One case of measles occurred during the ~~month~~ month the usual precautions were taken in each case (also one case of mumps) and there was no spread of the disease among the contacts.

The Early Treatment Department has continued with good results and for the three months ending 31/12/18, 584 cases have been treated of which 326 were cured, 241 were transferred to 1st A.D. Hospital and 17 are still under treatment.

On the whole the health of the troops in the Depot is satisfactory and there are no other special features needing comment.

GENERAL REMARKS.

During the month of December the 2nd. Training Brigade moved out of camps 2, 3, 4, and 13, Fovant, and established themselves at Codford, where they thus came under the administration of the newly appointed S.M.O., Codford, Area. The Camps thus evacuated were taken over by the Imperial Authorities as a Demobilisation Camp. This transfer necessitated the removal of the S.M.O's. Office, Hurdcott Area, and it was established at 3rd. Training Brigade Headquarters, Hurdcott.



GENERAL REMARKS (continued)

In accordance with the Repatriation and Demobilisation Scheme, this Area was called upon to provide a number of A.A.M.C. Personnel to relieve Line Casuals and 1915 A.A.M.C. who were doing duty at the various A.I.F. Hospitals. The men required were selected from General Service Reinforcements by the S.M.O.. 160 names were forwarded to A.I.F. Headquarters in U.K. for approval of transfer to A.A.M.C. The men thus released from duty in Hospitals were then concentrated at A.A.M.C. Training Depot, Fovant, and were utilized to staff the outgoing transports to Australia.

During the month No. 4 Command Depot, Hurdcott, received 1465 other ranks, both from various depots in U.K. and France, and a total of 2217 men were evacuated direct to Transports for return to Australia.

The health of the troops in this Area is at present very good, as is shown by the number of admissions to No. 2 Group Clearing Hospital, which give an appreciable decrease on the months of October and November, and also by the fact that it was found possible to release two Medical Officers from the Hospital for duty elsewhere.

REPLACEMENT OF "OTHER THAN A CLASS" EMPLOYED A.A.M.C. PERSONNEL.

In confirmation of telegram AAM.2178 of 10.12.18:-

All A.A.M.C. Other ranks "Other than A class" will be replaced so far as possible by "A" class soldiers, who will be specially selected from Combatant Units. The names of soldiers so selected will be notified to the A.D.M.S. so that the transfers may be effected. All A.A.M.C. personnel replaced in this way will be transferred to the A.A.M.C. Training Depot as soon as they have satisfactorily handed over their duties.

"Other than A" class employed A.A.M.C. soldiers will be liberated in this way and so made available for return to Australia in the following order of priority:-

- (1). Soldiers who left Australia between 1914 and who have not since been back there.
- (2). Soldiers who left Australia between 1st January 1915 and 30th June 1915 and who have not since been back there.
- (3). Soldiers of all Medical categories except "A" and "Ble4" classes with the following exceptions:-
  - (a). N.C.Os. holding substantive rank on the Permanent Cadre.
  - (b). N.C.Os. and Privates whose retention is necessary to carry on the work of units.
- (4). Soldiers of "B" or "C" class holding substantive rank on Permanent Cadre and men necessary to carry on the work of units will not be replaced until the decrease in size of the Command enables them to be spared from their duties. Special cases of this class may be forwarded to the A.D.M.S. for consideration.

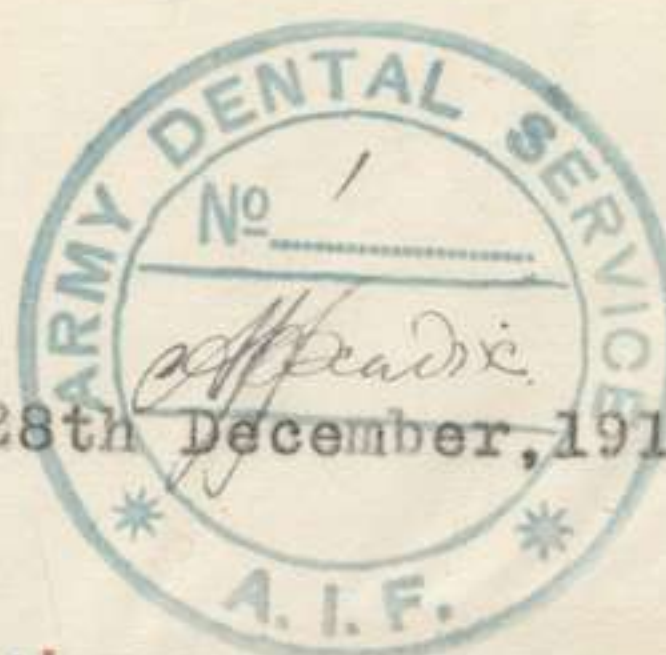
