- When transferring the vehicle to another individual, include this user's manual so that the next driver can continue its use.



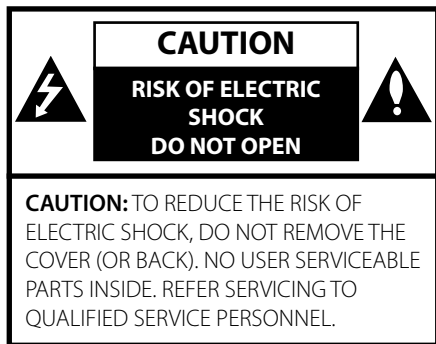
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Precautions for Safety

Safety notes

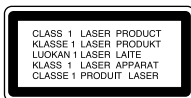

About Disc

Precautions upon Handling Discs

- After using a disc, put the disc back in its original case to prevent disc scratches.
- Do not use abnormally shaped discs (8cm, heart-shaped, octagon-shaped) as such discs could lead to malfunctions.
- Do not clean discs with chemical solutions, such as record sprays, antistatic sprays, antistatic liquids, benzene, or thinners.

Ejecting and Inserting SD Cards

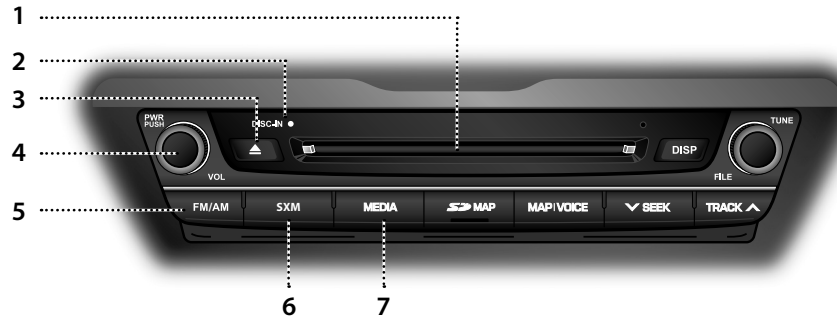
- Ejecting and inserting SD cards while the system is operating may result in SD Card or System errors. To eject or insert the SD card, first turn off the system and the vehicle ignition.
- Eject/insert SD cards only to update the map with a new version.
- When an SD Card with the new version is inserted, then the system will reboot automatically.

Usage of SD Cards

- The SD Card is formatted to include only Map and new Navi S/W.
- The SD Card cannot be used to save and play Music.
- Do not add, delete, or format files within the SD Card.

Name of Each Component

Head unit



1. Disc slot

Insert a disc into the disc slot.

2. DISC IN indicator light (DISC-IN)

When a disc is inserted, the indicator is illuminated.

3. Disc eject (▲) button

Press to insert or eject disc

4. • PWR PUSH button

- Power on
Press this button in power OFF status.

- Power off
Press and hold this button in power ON status.

• Volume control knob (VOL)

Turn left/right to control volume.

• Audio on/off button

Press this button to turn audio on or off in power on status.

5. FM/AM Button

Selects the FM/AM band.

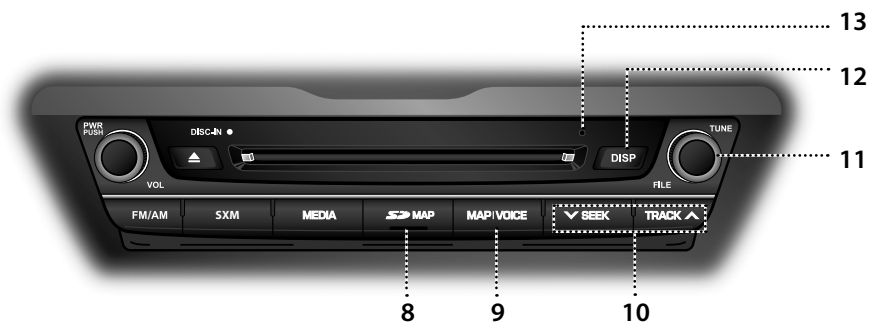
6. SXM Button

Selects the SiriusXM band.

7. MEDIA button

Press this button to move to the [Media] menu in media playing screen. Press this button again to display the media playing screen.

8. Cover for protecting SD card (SD card insert slot)

Insert the SD card into the slot.

9. MAP/VOICE button

- Press to display the map screen of the current location when in a different mode.
- Press to repeat the voice guidance on the map screen.

10. VSEEK/TRACK^ button

- When it is pressed shortly (less than 0.8 sec.)
 - FM/AM/SiriusXM mode: plays previous/next station.
 - In MEDIA modes: changes the track, file, or chapter.
- When it is pressed and held (0.8 sec. or longer)
 - FM/AM/SiriusXM mode: changes continuously the station until the button is released
 - In MEDIA modes: rewinds or fast forwards the track, file, or chapter.

11. TUNE/FILE button

- FM/AM/SiriusXM mode: Turn to change the station.
- CD/DVD/VCD/Jukebox/USB/iPod mode: Turn to search for the desired track, file or chapter.

12. DISP button

Press to turn the screen on or off.

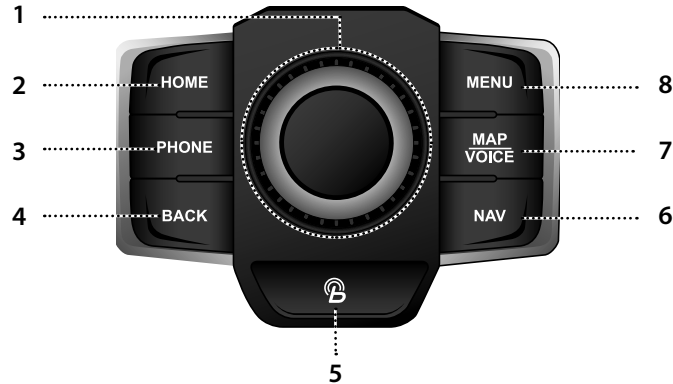
13. RESET hole

Press with thin object to reset the unit when it does not operate normally.

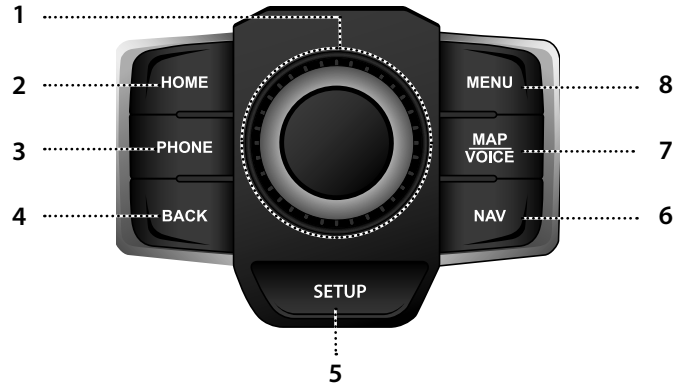

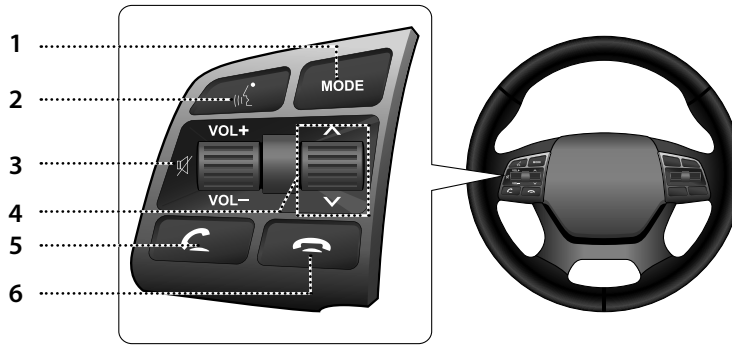

Steering wheel remote control



1. MODE button

- Each time this button is pressed, the mode is changed.
- If the media is not connected or a disc is not inserted, corresponding modes will be disabled.
- Press and hold the button (over 0.8 seconds) to turn the AV on/off.
- When power is off, press the button to turn power back on.

2. button

- Press the button (under 0.8 seconds) to activate voice recognition mode.
- Press and hold the button (over 0.8 seconds) to cancel voice recognition.
- Press and hold the button (over 0.8 seconds) to activate or end the Siri function.

3. Volume (VOL+/VOL-) button

Increases or decreases the volume level.

button

Press to mute the sound.

4. Seek up/down (Λ/V) button

- When it is pressed shortly (less than 0.8 sec.)
 - FM/AM/SiriusXM mode: plays previous/next station.
 - In MEDIA modes: changes the track, file, or chapter.
- When it is pressed and held (0.8 sec. or longer)
 - FM/AM/SiriusXM mode: changes continuously the station until the button is released
 - In MEDIA modes: rewinds or fast forwards the track, file, or chapter.

5. button

Press to operate Bluetooth Hands-Free function.

- Press to accept a call.
- Press to make a call from last calls.
- Press and hold for redialing.

6. button

Press to hang up a call.

Basic Operation

Starting the system for the first time

1. Press the engine start button or set the ignition key to On or ACC.

Once the system is turned on, the booting process will start and the safety warning page is displayed.



2. Press [Agree].

If you want to change the system language, press [Language]. For details, refer to "Language" on the page 140.

! Note

- You cannot operate the system while it is booting up. It may take some time for all of features of the system.
- The safety warning page is displayed every time the ignition is turned on. The displayed warnings are related to safety, please closely read and comply with the safety warnings.

Turning the system off

Press and hold "PWR PUSH" on the head unit.

To turn the system on again, press "PWR PUSH" on the head unit.

! Note

Pay attention to the volume setting when turning the system on. A sudden output of extreme volume upon turning the system on could lead to hearing impairment. Adjust the volume to a suitable levels before turning off the system.

AV OFF

Press "PWR PUSH" on the head unit when the AV is on.

AV ON

Press "PWR PUSH" on the head unit when the AV is OFF.

Adjusting the volume

Rotate the volume control knob (VOL) on the head unit.

! Note

When you turn the unit off, the current volume level is automatically memorized. Whenever you turn the system on, it operates at the memorized volume level.

Basic Operation




Resetting the System

This feature is used to reset the system in the occurrence of an unforeseen error or problem. Press "RESET" button. (The use of a clip or pin is recommended when resetting the system.)



Using the controller

This feature is used to move or select a menu through joystick way.

Controller	Description
	Move in the menu by turning the controller left/right.
	Push the controller up/down/left/right/diagonally to move in the menu.
	Press the controller to select menu.

Using the Touch screen

Press the desired menu on the screen to select a menu.

Radio Operation (FM/AM)

Listening to FM/AM radio

1. Press "FM/AM" on the head unit. Or press [HOME] > [FM/AM].
2. Press [FM] or [AM] on the screen.
The FM/AM screen of the most recent listened station is displayed.



3. **Auto tuning:**
Press "VSEEK/TRACK" on the head unit.
 - When a station is received, searching stops.

Manual tuning:

- Turn "TUNE/FILE" on the head unit in clockwise or counter-clockwise direction.
 - The stations move up and down step by step.

Preset tuning:

From the 12 presets, select the station you want to listen to.



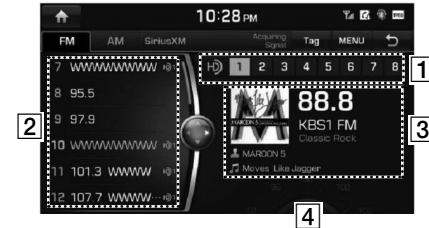
Listening to HD Radio (Only for USA)

The HD Radio function is not supported for vehicles purchased in Canada.

You can select HD radio from the menu and listen to HD Radio Broadcasts.

The HD Radio screen is displayed only when a HD Radio broadcast is being received.

HD radio screen



- 1 HD Radio Reception & Channel buttons
Displays main HD Radio channels and used to directly select the currently available channels.

Radio Operation (FM/AM)

2 HD Channel Number

- HD Channel number saved in preset.
- Preset tuning: From the 18 presets, select the HD Channel you want to listen to.

3 Broadcast Information

Displays detailed information about the current broadcast. (Album Cover Art, Artist name, Song title, HD radio channel, Frequency, PTY, etc...)

4 Frequency controller

When controller is focused, it moves to center of screen. Turn the controller to search for frequency and move the red line.

! Note

As HD Radio reception is included within Radio mode, the methods of reordering between channels, saving presets, searching, or methods of searching frequencies are identical. However, while the HD Radio related icon display will become active when within regions where an HD Radio signal can be received.

HD Radio On/Off

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want.
2. Press [MENU] > [HD Radio] on the screen.
If an HD Radio broadcast is received, the radio mode will switch from analog broadcast to HD Radio broadcast.



Pressing the [HD Radio] again will cancel the function.

! Note

- HD radio Technology is a digital radio technology used by FM and AM radio stations to transmit audio and data via a digital signal in conjunction with their analog signals.
- While listening to the radio, the HD Radio icon will become displayed if receiving an HD radio broadcast.

Tag

If HD radio broadcast includes Tag information, then the tag information is displayed on the screen.

1. Press [Tag] on the HD radio screen.



! Note

When the HD radio is off, the [Tag] button is deactivated.

Radio Operation (FM/AM)

Saving FM/AM preset

12 preset stations each for FM/AM modes can be saved manually.

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want to store a station into.
2. Select the desired station.
3. Press [MENU] > [Save as Preset].
4. Press the desired preset number.



The station is saved.

! Note

When the station is saved on a number of which another station has already been saved, the previously saved station is erased.

Scanning FM/AM broadcast station

Scanning preset stations

This function scans the 12 stations saved as preset numbers in the current band for 10 seconds each.

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want.
2. Press [MENU] > [Presets Scan].



! Note

When the scan is operating, pressing the controller will stop the function and return to the stopped station.

Scanning all stations

This function scans all stations and plays only stations with superior reception for 5 seconds each.

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want.
2. Press [MENU] > [Scan All Channels].



! Note

When the scan is operating, pressing the controller will stop the function and return to the stopped station.

Radio Operation (FM/AM)

Reordering FM/AM preset

This function reorders the station saved to presets.

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want.
2. Press [MENU] > [Reorder Presets].
3. Press the desired preset from the list.



4. Move and press the selected preset up and down. Or Drag it to the desired position.



Autostore

A total of 24 stations with twelve preset stations each for FM/AM modes can be saved.

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want.
2. Press [MENU] > [Autostore] to save automatically receivable stations to Preset list.



! Note

While Autostore is operating, pressing [Autostore] again will cancel the function and play the previous frequency.

Radio Text On/Off

If current broadcast includes Radio Text information, the text information is displayed on the screen.

1. Select the band (FM, AM) you want.
2. Press [MENU] > [Radio Text].



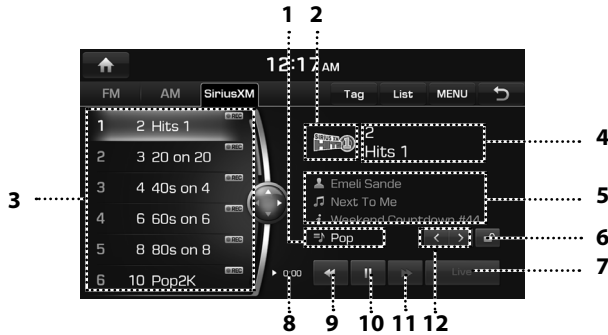
Pressing the [Radio Text] again will cancel the function.

Sound Settings

1. Press [MENU] > [Sound Settings] in the radio screen.
2. For details, refer to "Sound" on the page 132.

Radio Operation (SiriusXM)

SiriusXM screen



1. Category Info

Displays the current playing category.

2. Channel Logo

Displays the current channel logo.

3. Preset list

Displays the channel list saved in Preset list.

4. Channel Info

Displays the current channel number and name.

5. Contents Info

Displays the artist, title and other information about the current playing song.

6. (Category Lock)

If the Category Lock is Off, you can change or search all channels but if the Category Lock is On, you can change or search the channels of the current category.

7. Live

Live broadcast will play.

8. 0:00 (Time difference)

Displays the time difference between the song playing and the Live broadcast.

9. ⏮

Repeats the previously broadcasted program.

- When it is pressed shortly (less than 0.8 sec.): Moves to the previous song.
- When it is pressed and held (0.8 sec. or longer): Searches backward the song until the button is released.

10. ▶/⏸ (Play/Pause)

Play/Pauses the currently broadcasting program.

11. ▶▶

- When it is pressed shortly (less than 0.8 sec.): Moves to the previous segment.
- When it is pressed and held (0.8 sec. or longer): Searches forward the song until the button is released.

12. ◀ / ▶ (Category Selection Buttons)

This feature is used to select the Previous/Next category.

Radio Operation (SiriusXM)

Listening to SiriusXM radio

1. Press "SXM" on the head unit. Or press [HOME] > [SiriusXM].

The SiriusXM radio screen of the most recent listened channel will be displayed.

Precautions for safe driving

Please observe and comply with local traffic rules and regulations.

- For your safety, some features cannot be operated while driving for your safety. Features that cannot be operated will be disabled.
- The route displayed for destination guidance is a reference and the route guidance will take you to the vicinity of your destination. The highlighted route is not always; the shortest distance, the least congested, and in some cases might, not be the fastest route.
- Road, name, and POI information may not always been completely updated. Some places may not include up to date information.
- The car position mark does not always indicate your exact location. This system uses GPS information, various sensors, and road map data to display the current position. However, errors in displaying your location may occur if the satellite is transmitting inaccurate signals or two or less satellite signals can be received. Errors that occur in such conditions cannot be corrected.

- The position of the vehicle within the navigation may differ from your actual location depending on various reasons, including the satellite transmission state, vehicle state (driving location and conditions), etc. Additionally, the car position mark may differ from the actual position if the map data is different from the actual road landscape, such as changes due to the construction of new roads. If such differences occur, driving for a short period of time will automatically correct the position of the vehicle through map matching or GPS information.

What is GPS?

The Global Positioning System (GPS) is a satellite-based navigation system made up of a network of 24 satellites placed into orbit by the U.S. Department of Defense.

GPS was originally intended for military applications, but in the 1980s, the government made the system available for civilian use.

GPS works in any weather conditions, anywhere in the world, 24 hours a day.

There are no subscription fees or setup charges to use GPS.

About satellite signals

Your unit must acquire satellite signals to operate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, the unit cannot acquire satellite signal.

Acquiring satellite signals

Before the unit can determine your current position and navigate a route, you must do the following steps:

1. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions.
2. Turn on the unit.

Acquiring satellite signals can take a few minutes.

If the phone number have been already stored in the Favorites, it can be easily called.

First of all, add the phone number in the Favorites. Refer to "Adding as a Favorite" on the page 100.

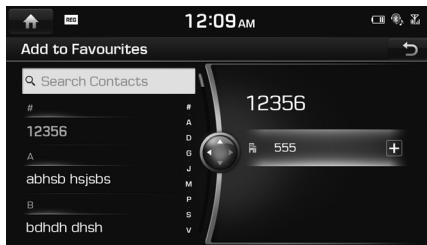

Voice Recognition System

What is voice recognition?

Voice recognition technology runs the system as ordered by recognizing your voice command to ensure the safe operation of multimedia while you are driving the car. Regrettably, not all possible voice commands are recognized by the system due to technological limitations. To make up for these limitations, the system displays the voice commands that are available for you to use.

There are errors in communication between people. Likewise, voice recognition sometimes misunderstands your voice command in some circumstances. If this happens, either check the screen for the available options and say the command again, or manually select and press the button for the corresponding command on the screen.

Voice recognition features by language

Voice recognition support availability varies according to the language set for the system.

Please verify the currently set language before using the voice recognition.

- If you change the language set for the system to Korean, voice recognition will not be supported. Change the system language to other language.


Operating voice command

Condition for voice command system

Most of the functions can be operated by voice. Please follow the following instructions for optimal voice recognition performance.

- Close all windows and the sunroof. The performance of the voice recognition can be improved if the environment of the car interior is quiet.
- Press the voice recognition button and say the desired voice command after the sound of the beep.
- The microphone is positioned above the driver. Voice commands should be spoken by driver practicing proper posture.
- Pronounce the voice commands naturally and clearly as if in a normal conversation.
- Special symbols of Phonebook Name are not considered in voice recognition.
Ex) James-Smith : "James Smith"
- House number or digits in Phonebook Name should be spoken discretely.
Ex) S1234 : "South one two three four"
- Depending on the specifications, some commands may not be supported.

Starting voice recognition

1. Shortly press "  " on the steering wheel remote control.
2. Say a command.

Note

- For proper recognition, please say the command after the voice instruction and beep tone.
- When starting voice recognition, the voice command entry window with six representative commands is displayed.
- If voice recognition is in [Beginner], then the system will provide the detailed voice recognition guidance.
If voice recognition is in [Normal], then the system will provide the simple version of voice recognition guidance.
If voice recognition is in [Expert], then you will only hear a beep.
For further details, refer to "Voice recognition" on the page 138.

Voice Recognition System

Skipping prompt messages

While prompt message is being stated, shortly press "Ⓜ" on the steering wheel remote control.

The prompt message immediately ends and the beep tone will sound. After the beep tone, please say the voice command.

Re-starting voice recognition

While system waits, shortly press "Ⓜ" on the steering wheel remote control.

The command waiting condition is ended and the beep tone will make sound. After the "beep", say the voice command.

Ending voice recognition

- While voice recognition is operating, press and hold "Ⓜ" on the steering wheel remote control or say "Exit".
- While using voice recognition, pressing other button except on the steering wheel remote control or a different button on head unit will end voice recognition.

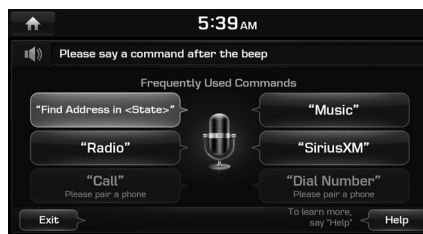
Adjusting voice recognition volume

While voice recognition is operating, turn "VOL" knob on the head unit or press "VOL+/VOL-" on the steering wheel remote control.

Basic operation for voice command (Setting FM)

1. Press the "Ⓜ" on the steering wheel remote control.

The system awaits for your command and displays a list of accessible commands on the screen.



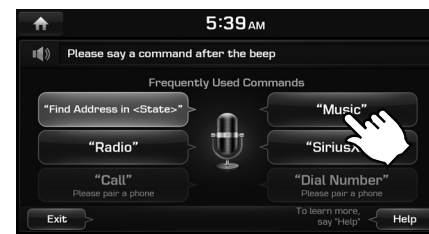
2. Once the speaker icon changes into the microphone icon on the pop-up screen with a beep tone sound, say "FM".

Voice Recognition Quick Start (Manual Control)

The usual way of activating voice recognition is by waiting for the voice guide and then speaking your command for a task. Since this method requires that you wait a while for the voice guide, you can select one of the commands shown on the screen to speed up the process.

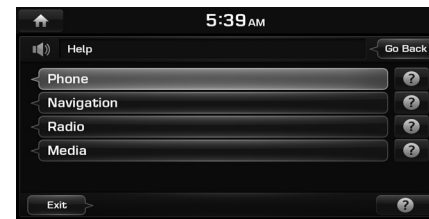
You might find this feature useful when you do

About voice command "Help"

Voice command list

Voice recognition commands are classified as “Global Commands” and “Local Commands.”

- Global commands (●) : Commands that can be used immediately after activating voice recognition.
- Local commands (□) : Commands that can be used in specific multimedia/navigation/Bluetooth mode states.

! Note

Some global and local commands will operate properly only when a USB, iPod, Bluetooth or other device has been connected.

Phone commands

- Voice commands related to phone calls can be used after connecting the Bluetooth phone device.
- To call a person, for example “Call <John Smith>” whose name is listed in contacts, you must download firstly the mobile phone contacts. (Up to 5,000 mobile phone contacts can be downloaded.) For details on downloading contacts, see “Downloading mobile phone contacts” on the page 98.
- After downloading the Bluetooth phone contacts, it will take some time to convert the phone contacts into voice data during which time you cannot make a call by name yet. The time takes to convert voice data may vary depending on the number of contacts downloaded.

Operating Siri command

What is Siri?

Apple wants to integrate the Siri to specific voice control system by working with car manufacturers.

You can ask Siri through the "Siri" button on the steering wheel remote control while driving through the road without turning the gaze.

The Apple device (iOS device) screen does not light up to minimize impact on the driving.

If there is "Eyes-free" function, you can operate the Siri feature. (Making phone calls, Playing music, Listening to or writing a text message, Finding the destination by using the map, Looking for calendar information, etc)

Starting Siri

1. Connect your Apple device (iOS device) to AVN system through Bluetooth.
Please check whether your Apple device (iOS device) supports Siri and turning Siri On.

- While using voice recognition, pressing other button except on the steering wheel remote control or a different button on head unit will end voice recognition.
- Press [Exit] on the Siri screen.

Adjusting Siri volume

While voice recognition is operating, turn "VOL" knob on the head unit or press "VOL+/VOL-" on the steering wheel remote control.

- Please see the AVN system only supports "Music" and "Phone" related functions. Other functions will be performed in the your Apple device (iOS device).
- Eyes-Free mode would be activated automatically while you driving. If the car stopped (when the transmission lever is put to P), Eyes-Free mode would be deactivated automatically.

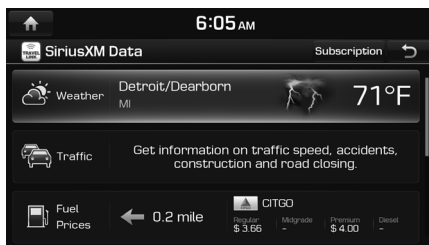

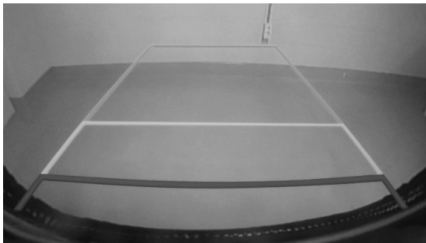

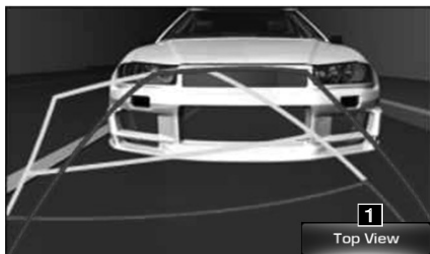

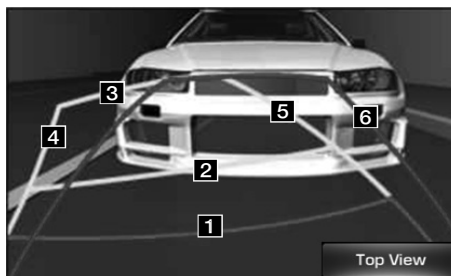

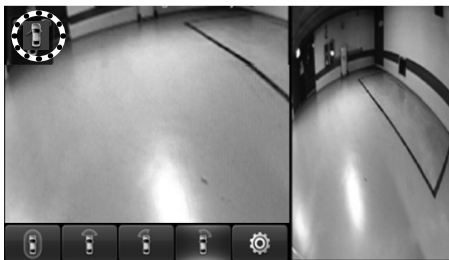

Before Thinking There is a Product Defect

The current position as shown on the navigation may differ from the actual position under the following conditions. The following occurrences are not malfunctions:

- When driving on Y-shaped roads with narrow angles the current position may be displayed in the opposite direction
- Within city streets, the current position may be displayed on the opposite side or on an off-road position
- When changing the zoom level from maximum to a different level, the current position may become displayed on a different road
