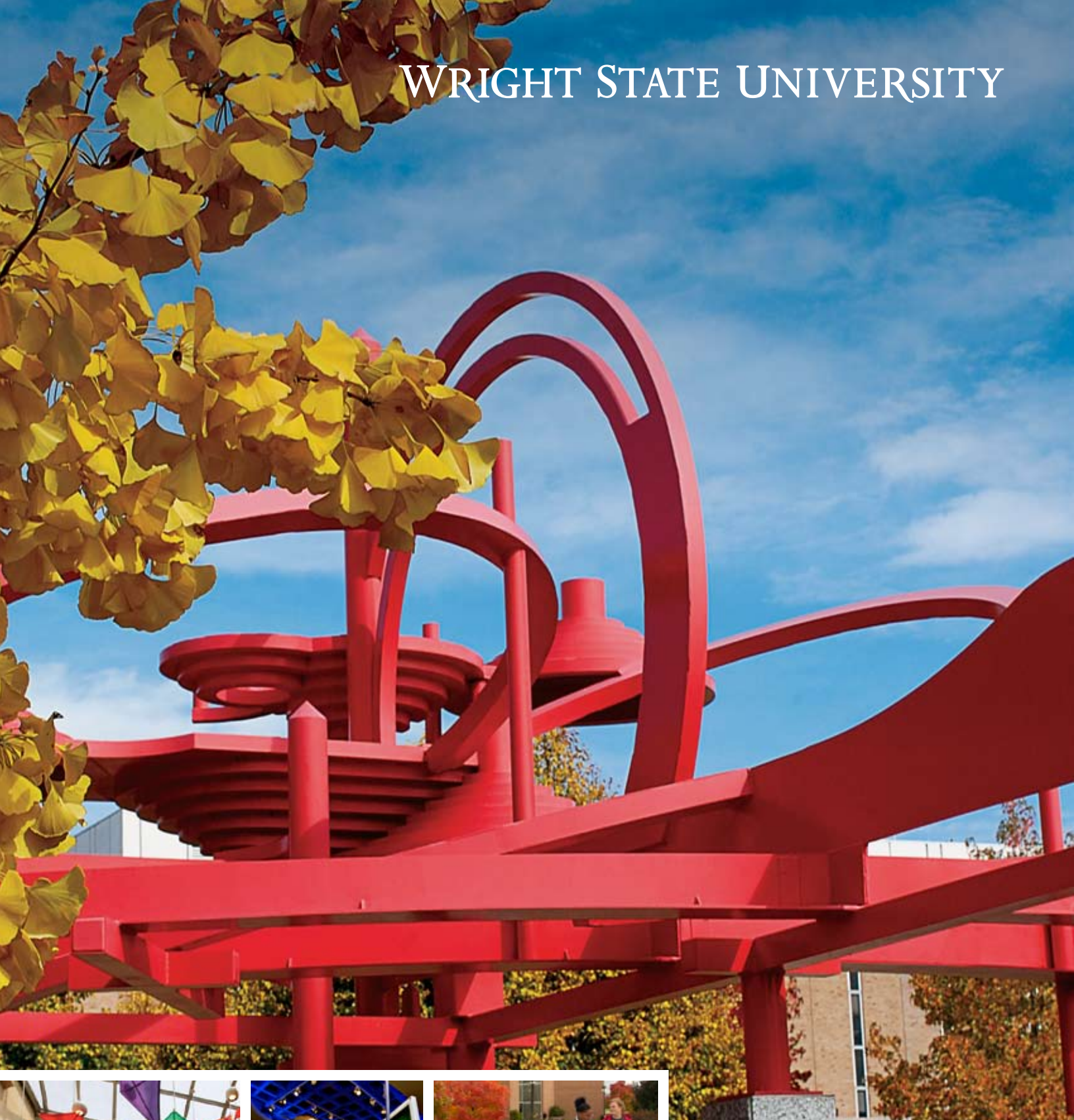

### Scholarship guidelines

- Student may receive only one Academic Performance scholarship.
- The combined totals of Wright State University scholarship assistance may not exceed the total cost of tuition, room and board, and books.
- Scholarships for underrepresented ethnic groups are intended to enhance the diversity of the Wright State community in proportion to the diversity of the Miami Valley region.
- All high school cumulative GPAs are based on a 4.0 grading system.
- Scholarships are awarded on an "as funds are available" basis.
- Appropriate application materials must be postmarked by the application deadline to be eligible for scholarships.

Complete the following by January 15: apply for admission and submit high school academic transcript; submit scholarship application; typed essay; two letters of recommendation; typed list of community service, extracurricular activities, offices held, and awards/honors received; and PSEO transcript if applicable

Renewable—four years

### Trustees Scholarship

Meet two of three criteria: 3.75 cumulative GPA; rank in top 5 percent of graduating class; ACT composite or SAT math and critical reading only (at 90th percentile or above; approx. 27/1310)

Complete the following by January 15: apply for admission and submit high school academic transcript; submit scholarship application; typed essay; two letters of recommendation; typed list of community service, extracurricular activities, offices held, and awards/honors received; and PSEO transcript if applicable

### Xcelsi Group Scholarship

Submit the Raj Soin College of Business Scholarship Application by February 15. RSCOB is able to award this scholarship only for the 2008-09 academic year

## SCHOLARSHIP

### Air Force ROTC High School Scholarship Program (HSSP)

## ELIGIBILITY

2.5 high school cumulative GPA; 24 ACT or 1100 SAT; class standing in the top 40 percent and/or outstanding leadership qualities. Offers are made to high school seniors and graduates who have not had any full-time college experience; must be a U.S. citizen or able to obtain citizenship within one year

## APPLICATION PROCESS

## VALUE

Typical awards cover WSU tuition and fees, \$750/yr book allowance, and a tax-free monthly stipend of \$300–\$500. Scholarship winners may also be eligible for a WSU room/board scholarship

### Army ROTC High School 4-Year Scholarship

Merit-based with a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA, 19 ACT or 920 SAT, and exhibit scholar, athlete, and leader attributes. Must be a U.S. citizen, pass a medical exam, and score at least 60 percent on the Army Physical Fitness Test by November 15 of your college freshman year

100 percent tuition and fees; \$900 book allowance per year; tiered tax-free monthly stipend of \$300–\$500; and a possible WSU room/board incentive. No obligation until sophomore year

### Army ROTC 4-Year Nursing Scholarship

As a National Partnership in Nursing Education (PNE) school, scholarships are available for qualified pre-nursing incoming freshmen. Minimum requirements include a 2.5 cumulative GPA, 19 ACT or 920 SAT, exhibit scholar, athlete, and leader attributes. Must be a U.S. citizen, pass a medical exam, and score at least 60 percent on the Army Physical Fitness Test by November 15 of your college freshman year

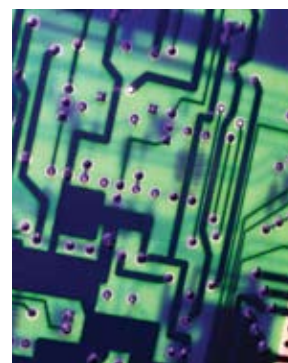
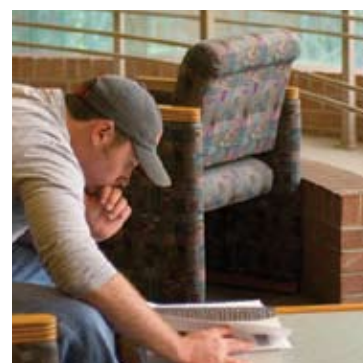
