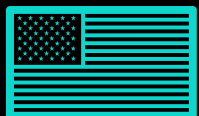
- This poll was fielded from April 2 to April 9, 2021 among a national sample of
 - 1000 Parents of school age children (ages 5 to 18),
 - 500 School Teachers / Administrators,
 - and 100 Nonprofit Professionals who work at nonprofit organizations that support students on digital literacy, education, and / or internet connectivity issues.

QUOTAS AND WEIGHTING

The interviews were conducted online. The Parent data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Parents based on gender, race, and ethnicity. The Teachers / Administrators and Nonprofit Professionals data were unweighted.

- Results from the Parent data have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
- The Teachers / Administrators data have a margin of error of plus or minus 4 percentage points.
- The Nonprofit Professionals data have a margin of error of plus or minus 10 percentage points.

KEY FINDINGS

1. The **homework gap is a major concern** to parents of school age children (76% concerned), schoolteachers / administrators (81%), and nonprofit professionals (92%) who work in the digital literacy and education space.
 - 70% of parents and teachers / administrators (as well as 77% of nonprofit professionals) report that **their children / students are impacted by the homework gap** in some fashion. The **most common means of coping** with the gap are using mobile phones to complete assignments (35% of parents report this) and going over to a friend or family member's house (17% of parents report this).
 - Thinking of **ways for overcoming the homework gap**, parents' top solution is more learning resources, while teachers / administrators and nonprofit professionals believe strategies involving tutors and mentors would be the most helpful.
 - Underscoring the importance of finding a way to bridge the homework gap, parents, teachers / administrators, and nonprofit professionals all believe that the traditional classroom learning environment **is going to rely more heavily on technology** once the pandemic is over (73%, 70%, and 66%, respectively).
2. In terms of **biggest fears for their students' education**, all three audiences share the same top concerns of their children missing out on learning opportunities, as well as social opportunities.
3. Regarding online learning, all three audiences report that the **biggest frustrations** for their children / students are not receiving enough help and online learning is boring.
4. Thinking about the online resources available to their students, majorities of parents (50%), teachers / administrators (55%), and nonprofit professionals (56%) **are at least somewhat overwhelmed** with the number of resources available. Additionally, substantial numbers of parents (48%), teachers / administrators (40%), and nonprofit professionals (48%) **are at least somewhat confused** about where to find online resources for their students.
5. The vast majority of parents, teachers / administrators, and nonprofits (79%, 80%, and 83%, respectively) believe learning tools **which include aspects of popular entertainment** such as superheroes, cartoon characters, and talent from popular movies and shows **would make their students more interested** in using those tools.
6. Nearly everyone in the three audience groups (95% for parents; 96% for teachers / administrators; and 95% for nonprofits) believes that **a single online portal** where their students could access high-quality educational content and learning resources **would be helpful**.
 - Additionally, assuming their students had access to such a portal, strong majorities of the three audiences believe their children and students would be absolutely certain or very likely to use it.

Survey Context

After qualifying for the survey, respondents read the following as context for the survey:

- The following questions focus on education issues that impact parents / guardians of school age children, as well as teachers who teach students grades K-12, school administrators, and non-profit professionals who work on education and digital literacy issues.
- Please answer the questions from the perspective of whichever role best describes your current situation (i.e. from the perspective of a parent who has children OR from the perspective of a teacher who teaches children OR from the perspective of a school administrator OR from the perspective of a nonprofit professional whose organization works to support students).
- If you're both a parent and a teacher / school administrator OR a parent and a nonprofit professional, please consider answering from the perspective of your profession.
- For clarification purposes, in the following questions, the word “children” refers to your child(ren) if you are a parent or to the students you teach if you are a teacher or to the students your organization supports if you are a non-profit professional or school administrator.

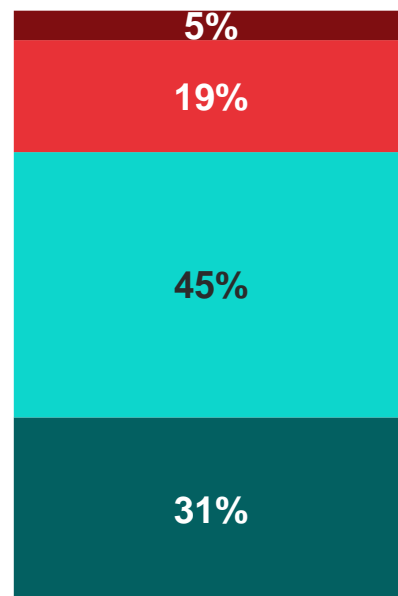
CONCERNS SURROUNDING EDUCATION

The homework gap is the difficulty students experience completing homework or at-home learning when they lack internet access, compared to those who do have access. How concerned are you about the homework gap?

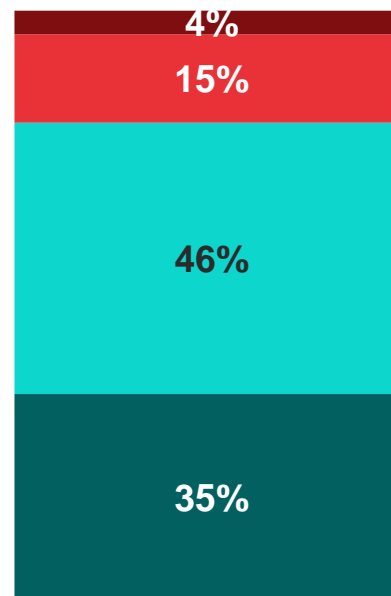

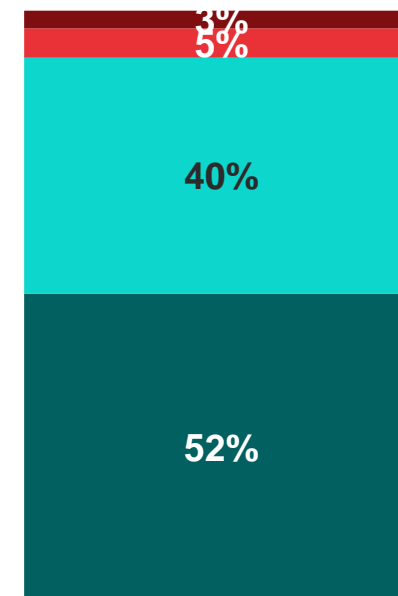

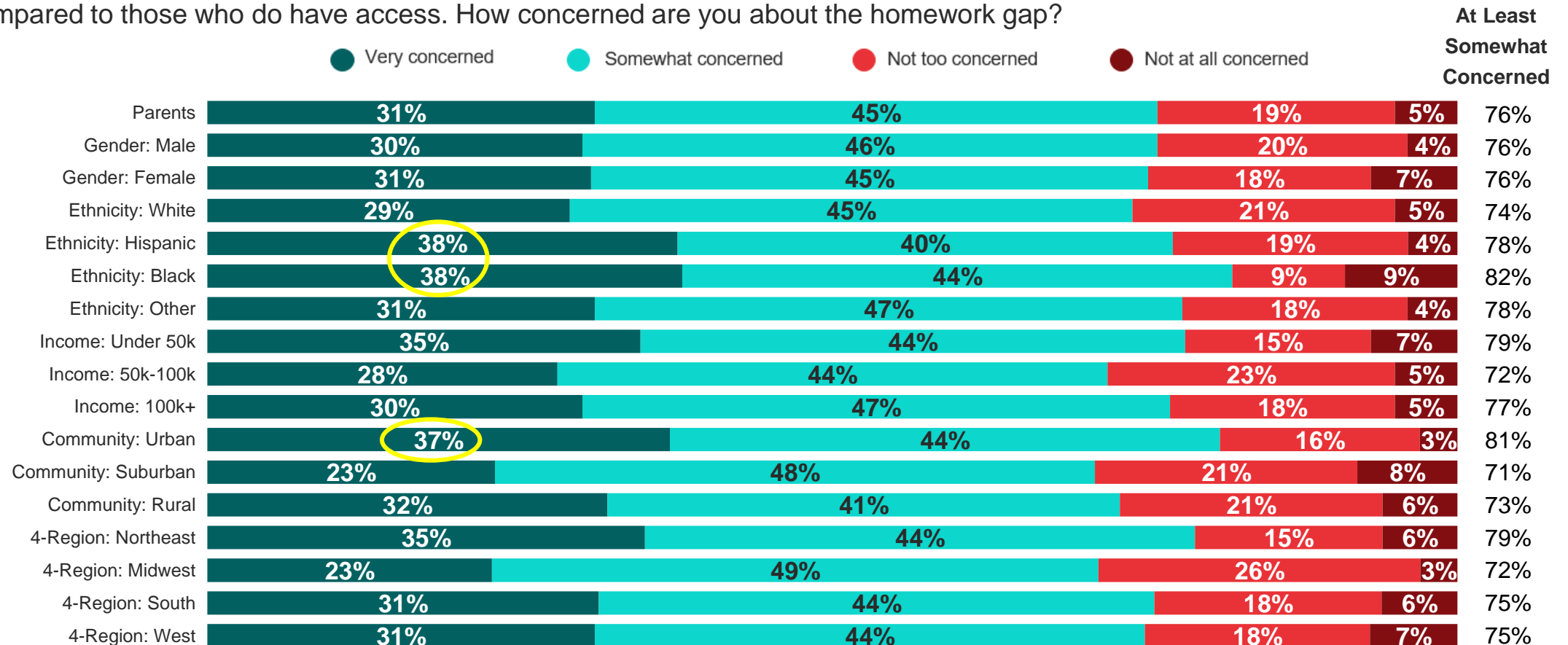

CONCERNS SURROUNDING EDUCATION – PARENTS

Large majorities across all parental demographics have concerns about the homework gap. Hispanic parents, African American parents, and urban dwellers have the highest “very concerned” levels.

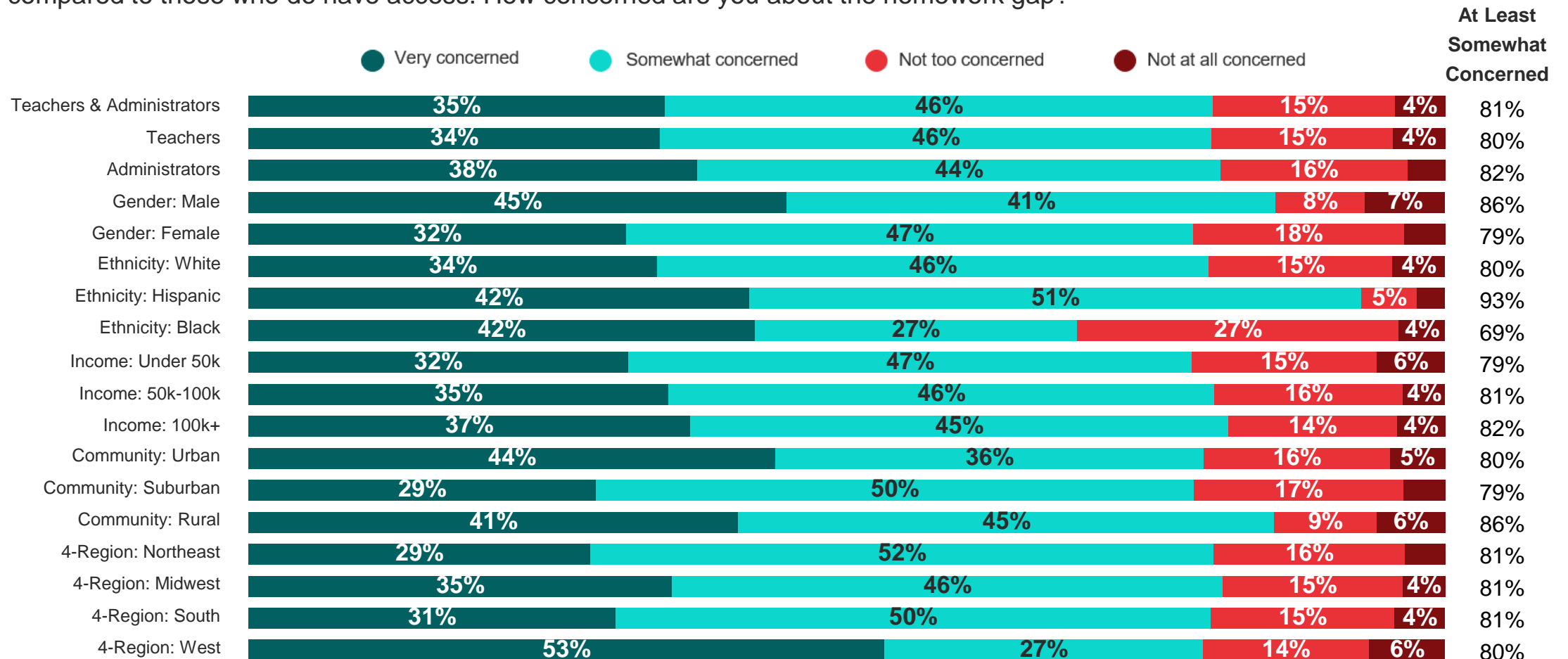
The homework gap is the difficulty students experience completing homework or at-home learning when they lack internet access, compared to those who do have access. How concerned are you about the homework gap?

Substantial proportions of all schoolteacher / administrator demographic groups are concerned by the homework gap.

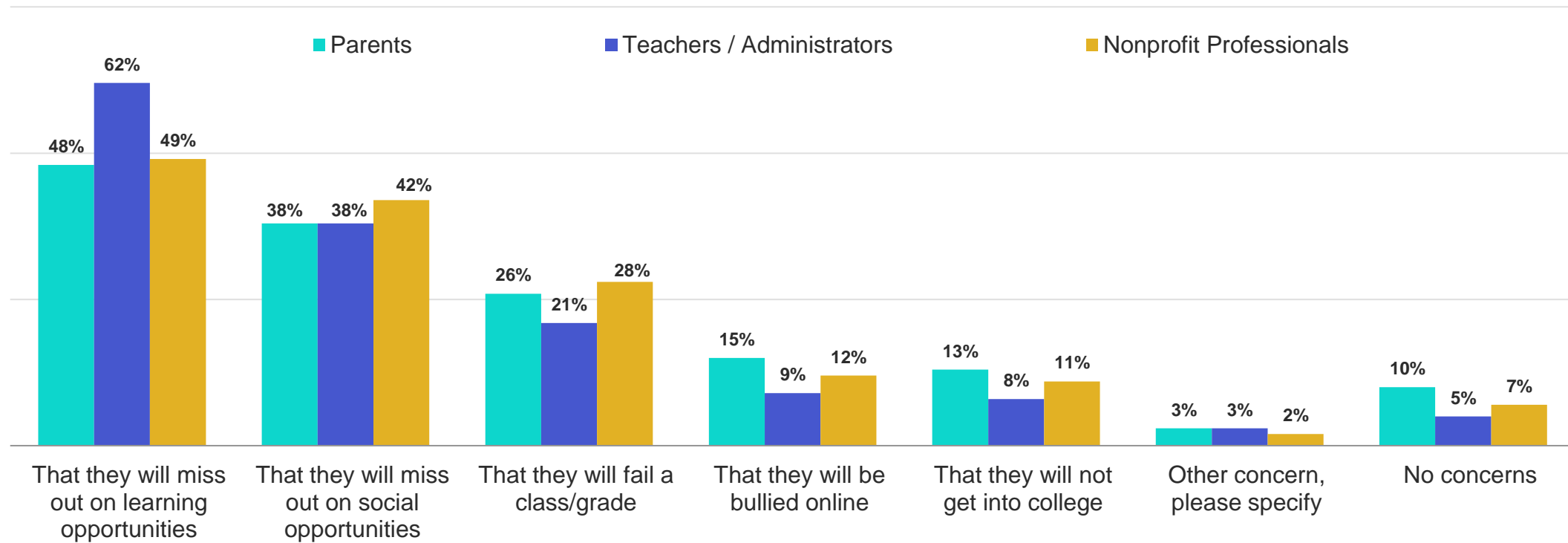
The homework gap is the difficulty students experience completing homework or at-home learning when they lack internet access, compared to those who do have access. How concerned are you about the homework gap?

Parents, teachers / administrators, and nonprofit professionals all have the same top concerns regarding their students' education – namely that they will miss out on both learning and social opportunities.

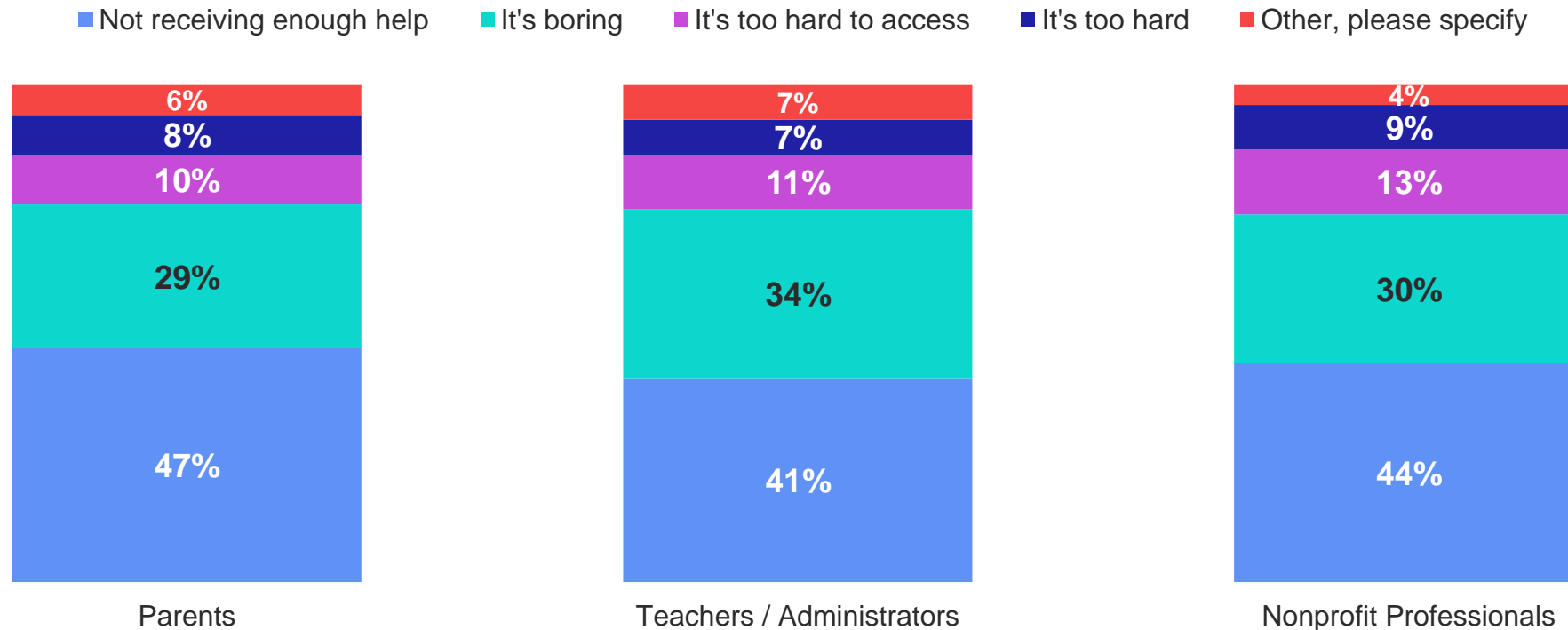
What are your biggest fears or concerns around your children's education?

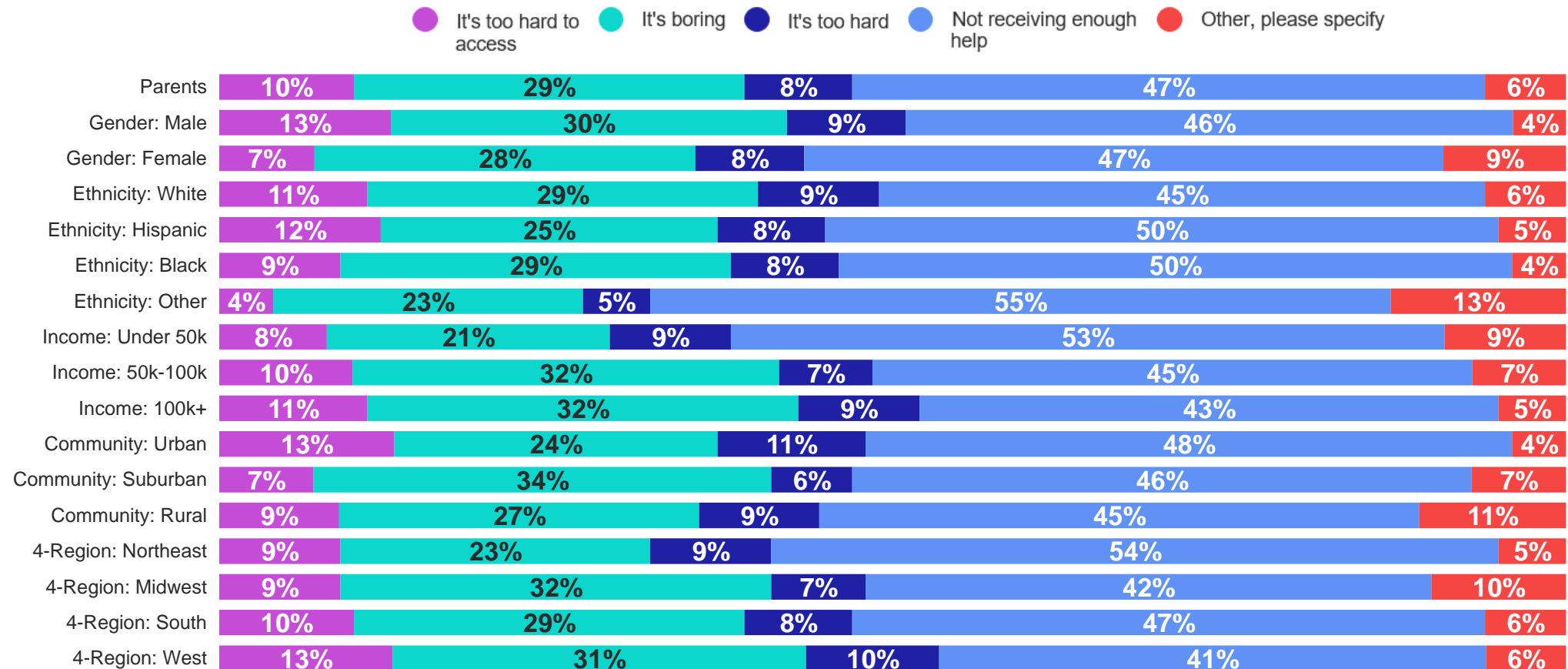
Which of the following items below do your children find the most frustrating about online learning? Select just one.

Not receiving enough help and it's uninteresting are what every parental demographic group believes that their children find most frustrating about online learning.

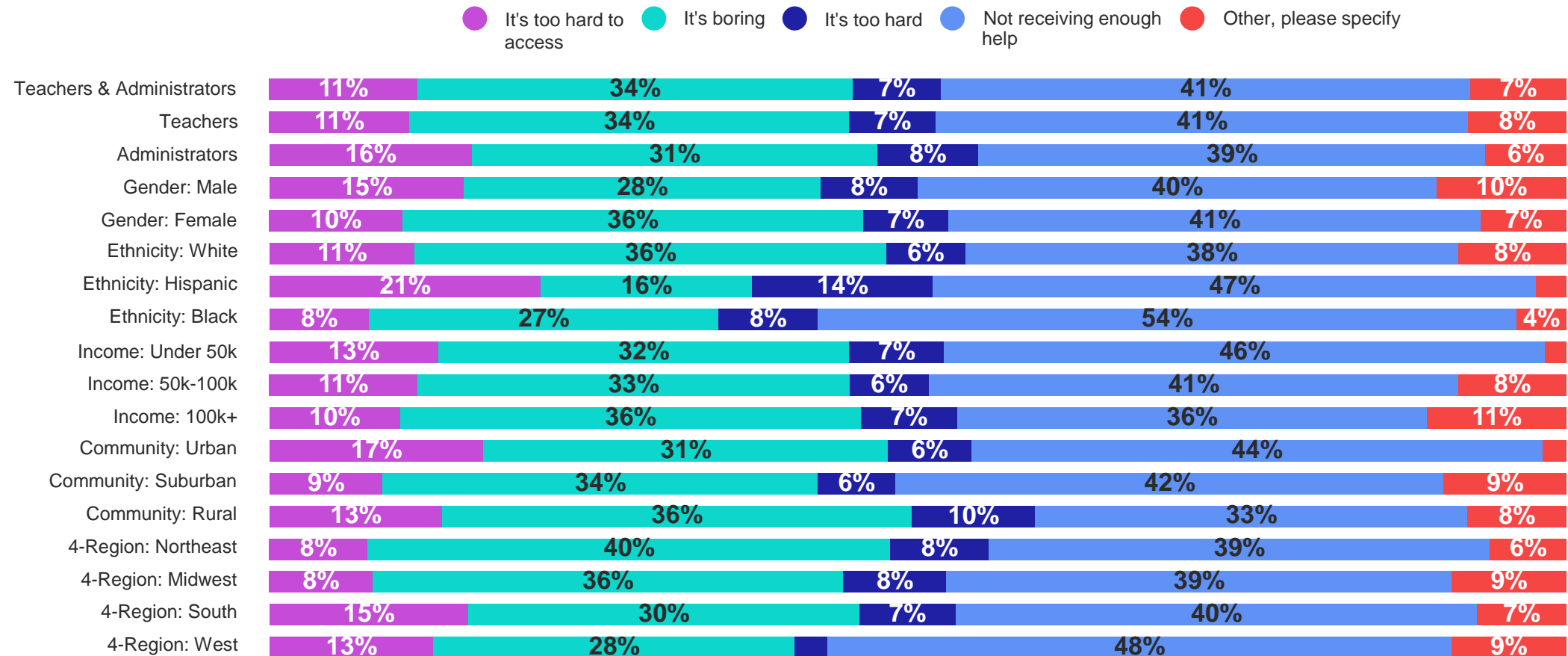
Which of the following items below do your children find the most frustrating about online learning? Select just one.

Which of the following items below do your children find the most frustrating about online learning? Select just one.

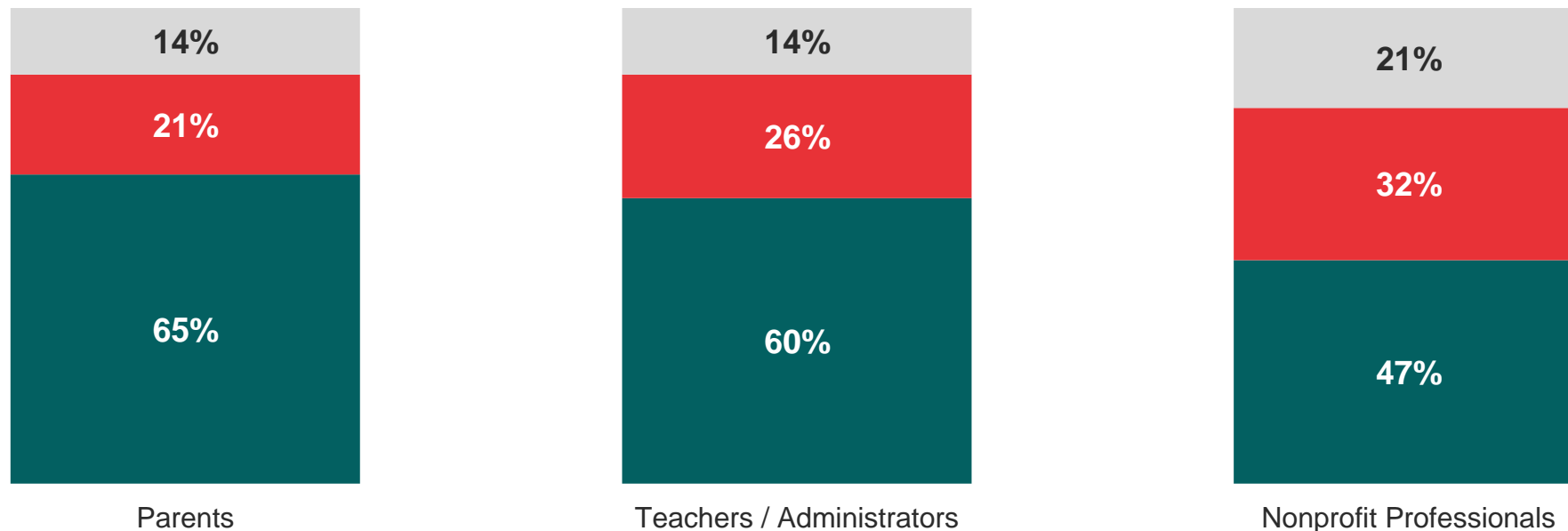


CONCERNS SURROUNDING EDUCATION

A fifth of parents report that their children need to continue learning this summer in order to be ready for the next grade level; 26% of teachers / administrators and 32% of nonprofit professionals indicate the same of the students they teach and support.

Have your children learned enough in the current hybrid-learning environment to progress to the next grade level?

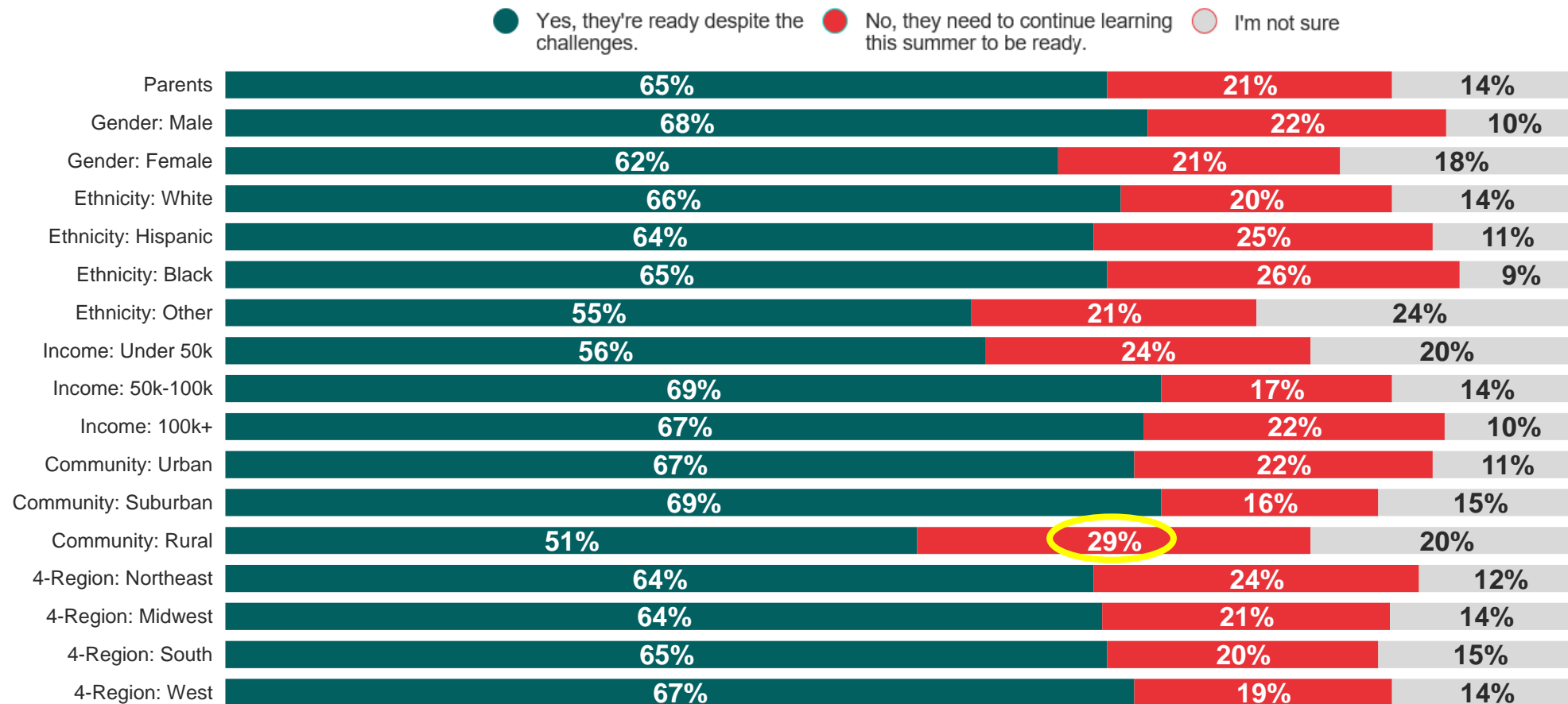

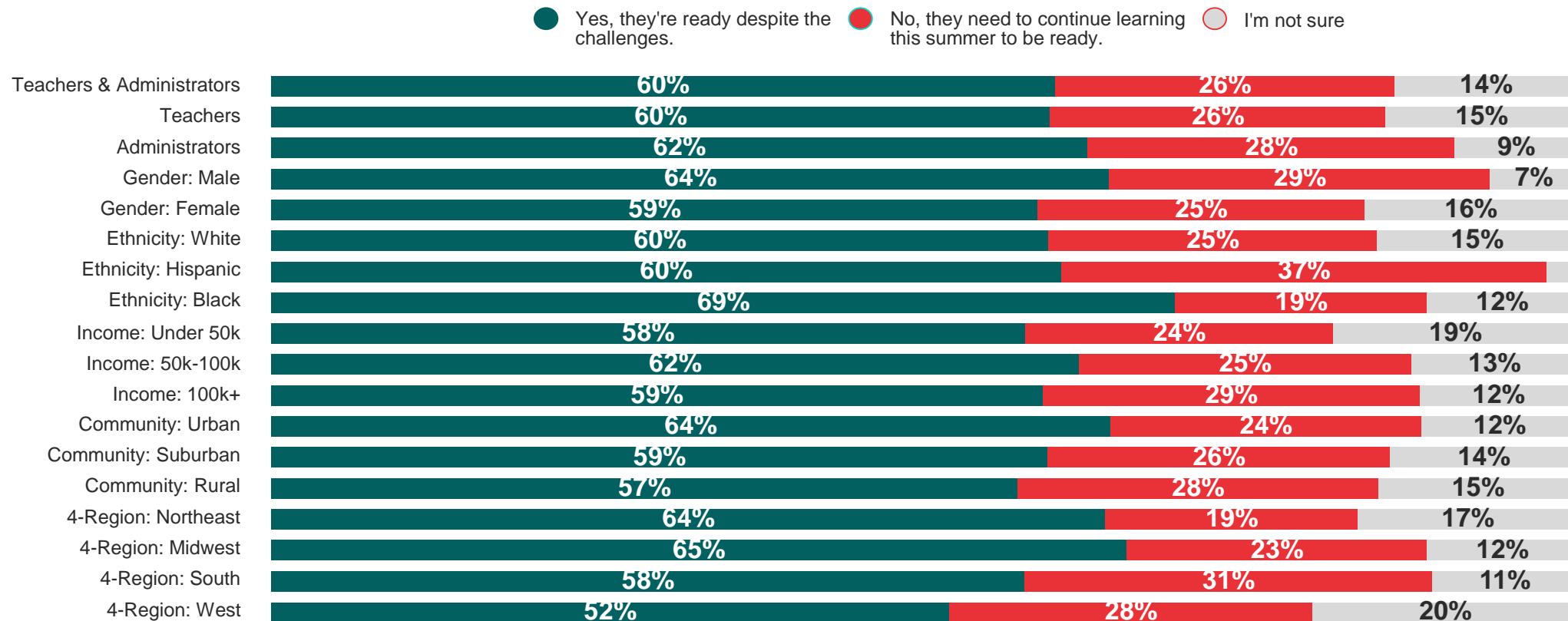
Have your children learned enough in the current hybrid-learning environment to progress to the next grade level?

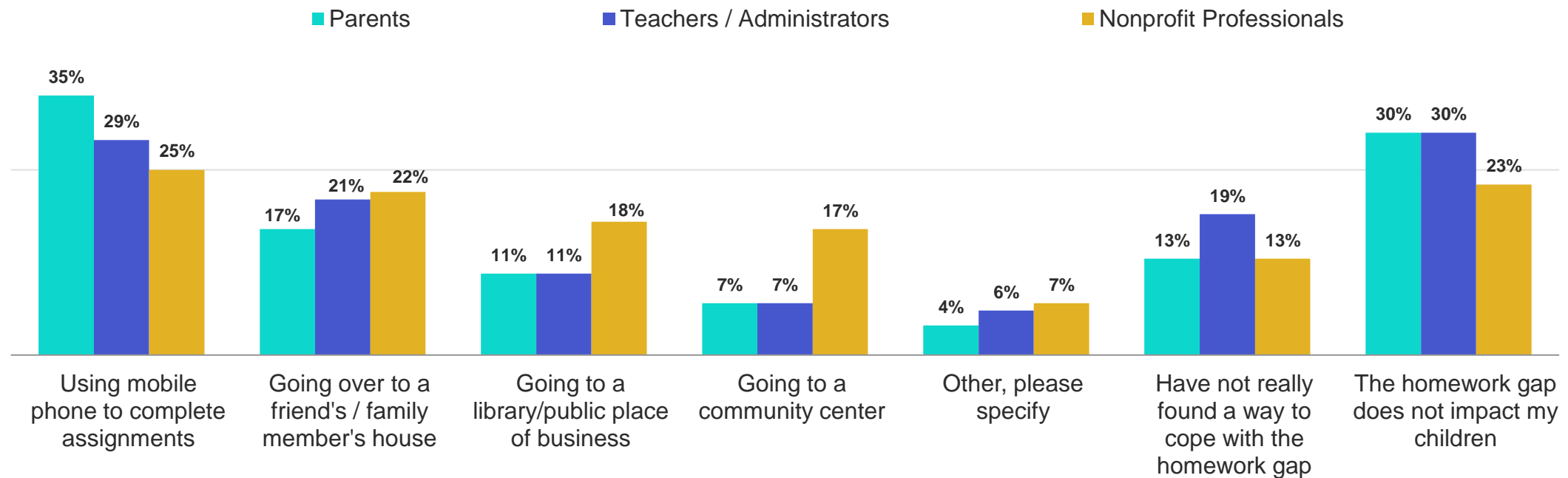

COPING WITH THE HOMEWORK GAP

Thirty percent of parents report that the homework gap does not impact their students, implying that 70% are impacted by it somehow. The most common means of managing the homework gap are using mobile phones to complete assignments and going over to the home of a friend or family member.

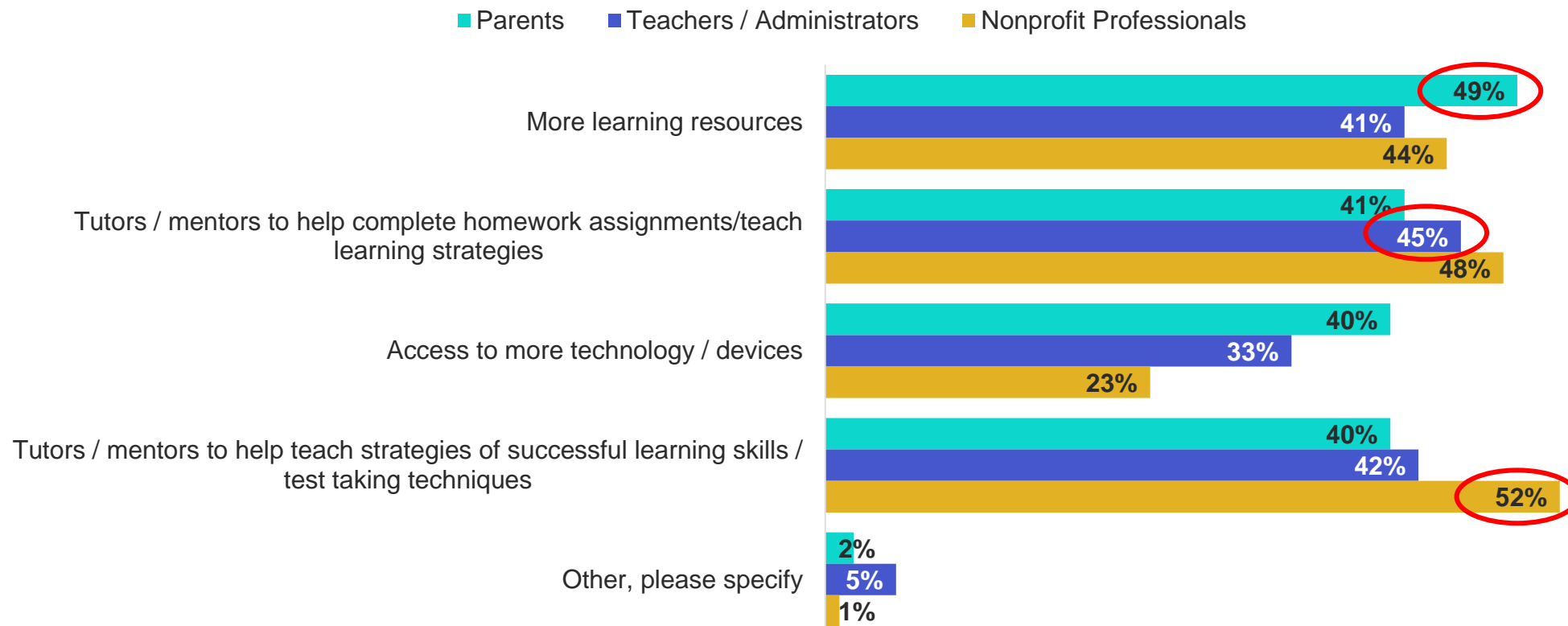
In what ways are your children currently coping with the homework gap (i.e., how is online learning being facilitated / online homework being done)?

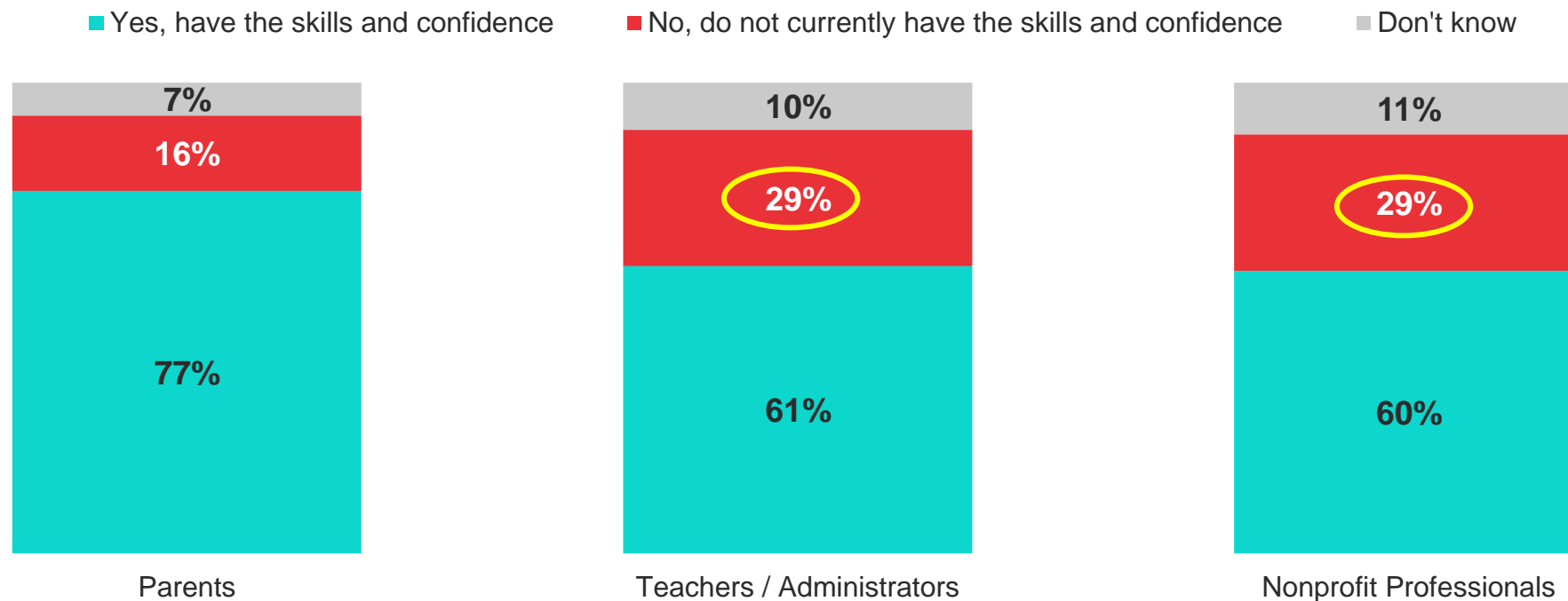
What do you think would most help address the homework gap in your household / the households of the students you teach / support? Select all that apply.

Teachers / administrators and nonprofits are more likely than the parents themselves to believe that their students' parents do not currently have the skills and confidence needed to navigate the digital world to support their children's online learning.

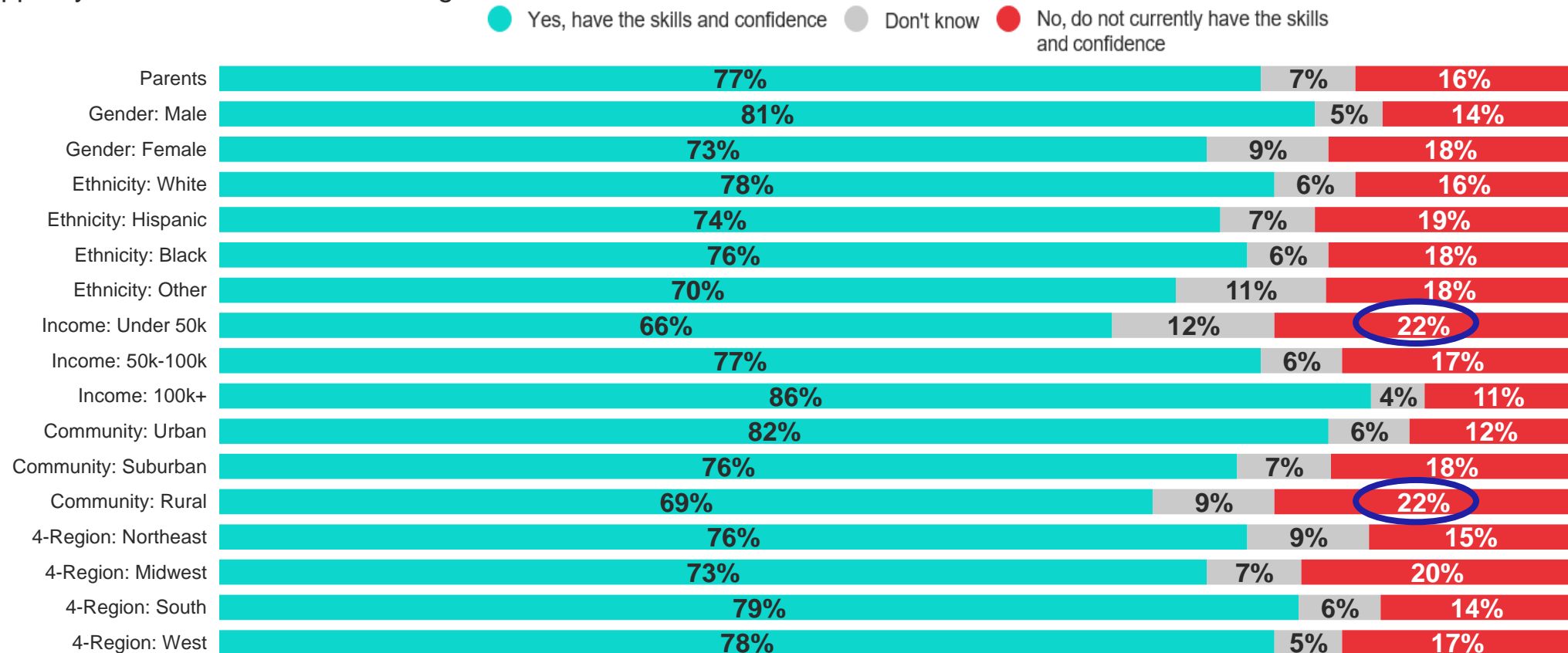
Do you personally / do the parents of your students have the skills and confidence needed to navigate the digital world and help support your children's online learning?



COPING WITH THE HOMEWORK GAP – PARENTS

Majorities of all parental demographics believe they have the skills and confidence needed to navigate the digital world to support their children’s learning. However, lower-income and rural parents are disproportionately more likely to report lacking those skills.

Do you personally / do the parents of your students have the skills and confidence needed to navigate the digital world and help support your children's online learning?

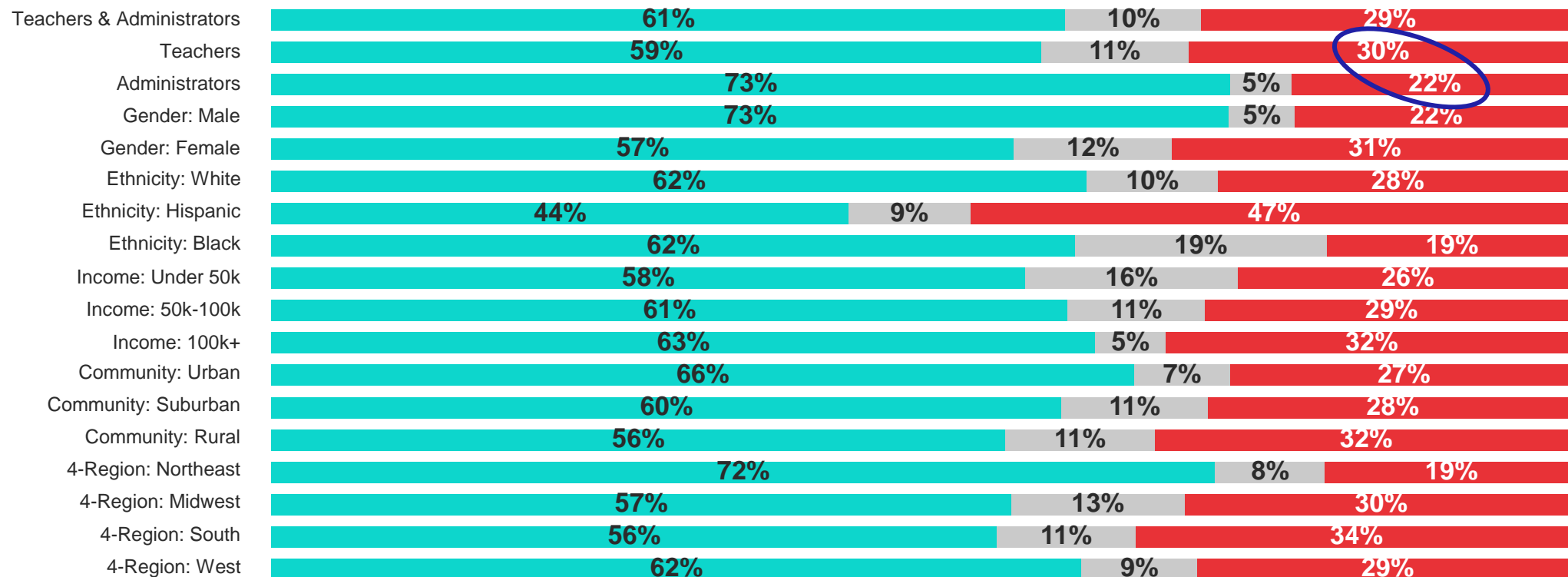


COPING WITH THE HOMEWORK GAP – TEACHERS & ADMINISTRATORS

Do you personally / do the parents of your students have the skills and confidence needed to navigate the digital world and help support your children's online learning?

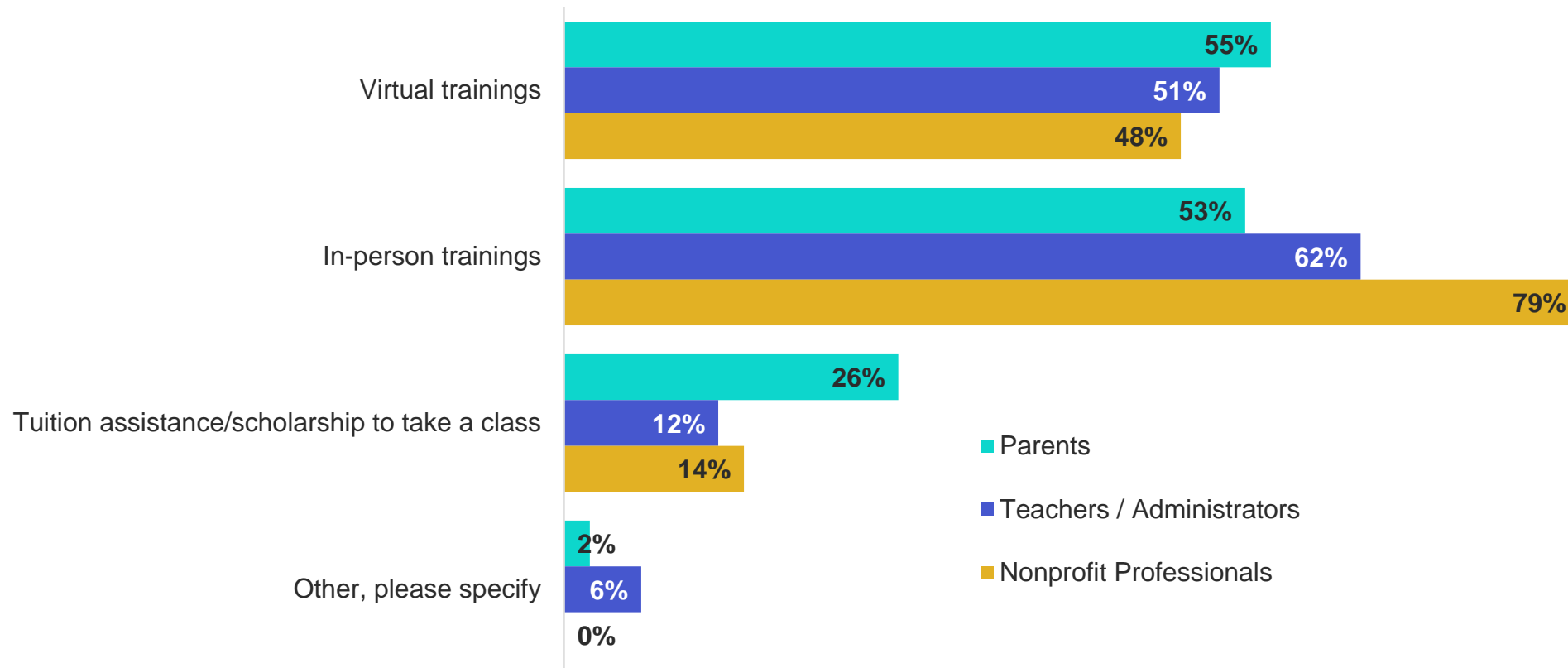

Virtual and in-person trainings are the top two resources believed to be the most effective for increasing parental skills and confidence for navigating the digital world and supporting children's online learning.

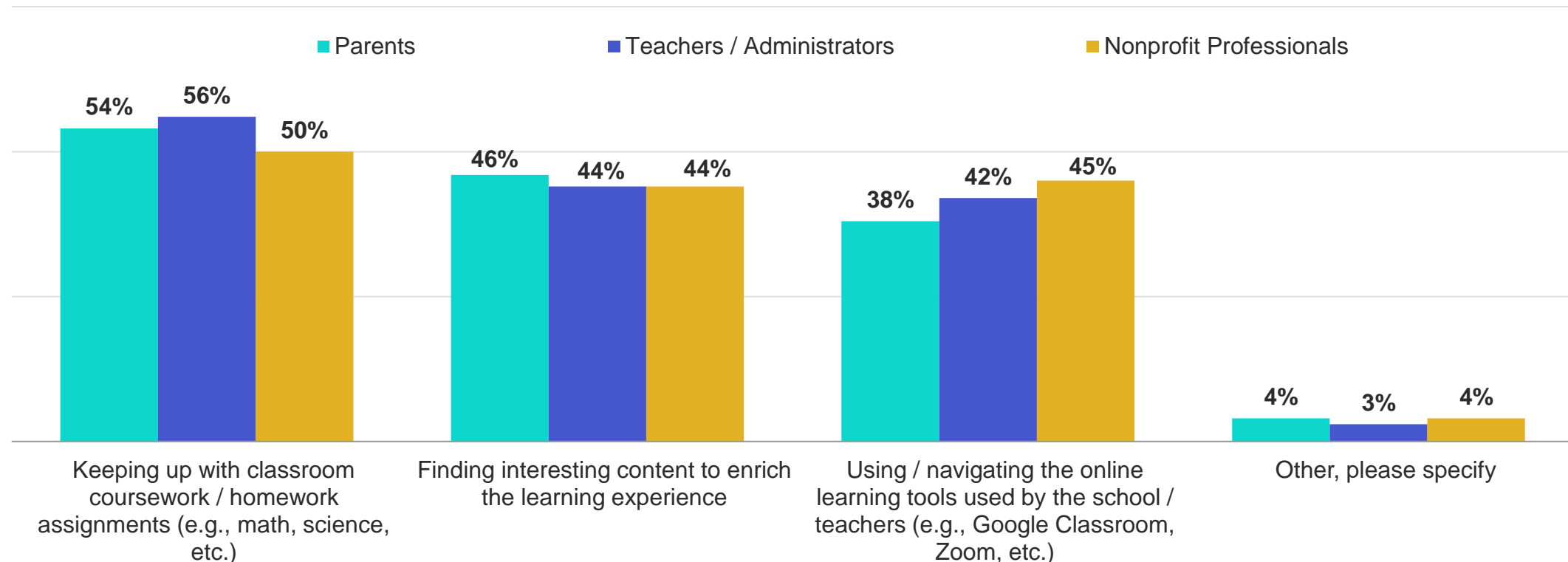
What do you believe would help increase your / the parents of your students' skills and confidence needed to navigate the digital world and help support your children's online learning? Select all that apply.

What do your children need the most help with to be successful in online learning from home? Select all that apply.

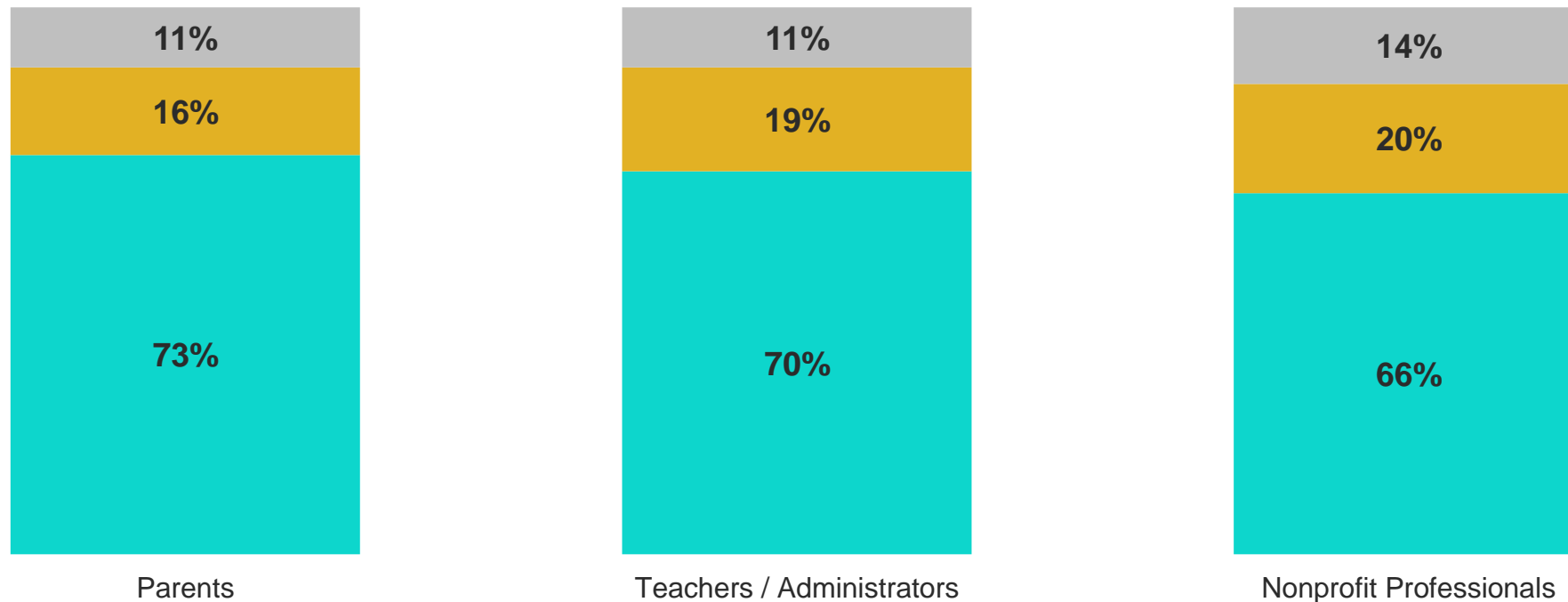


COPING WITH THE HOMEWORK GAP

Do you think the traditional classroom learning environment will rely more heavily on technology after the pandemic?

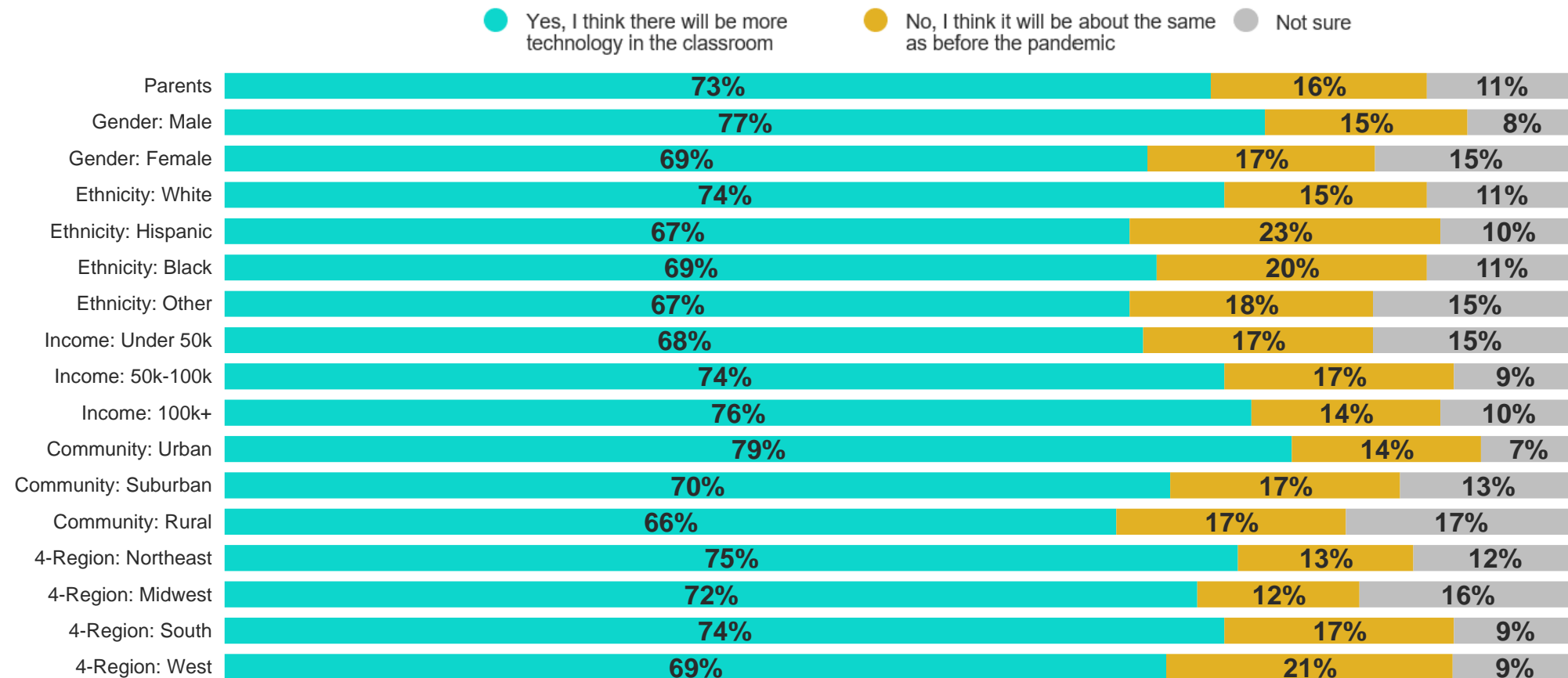

Do you think the traditional classroom learning environment will rely more heavily on technology after the pandemic?

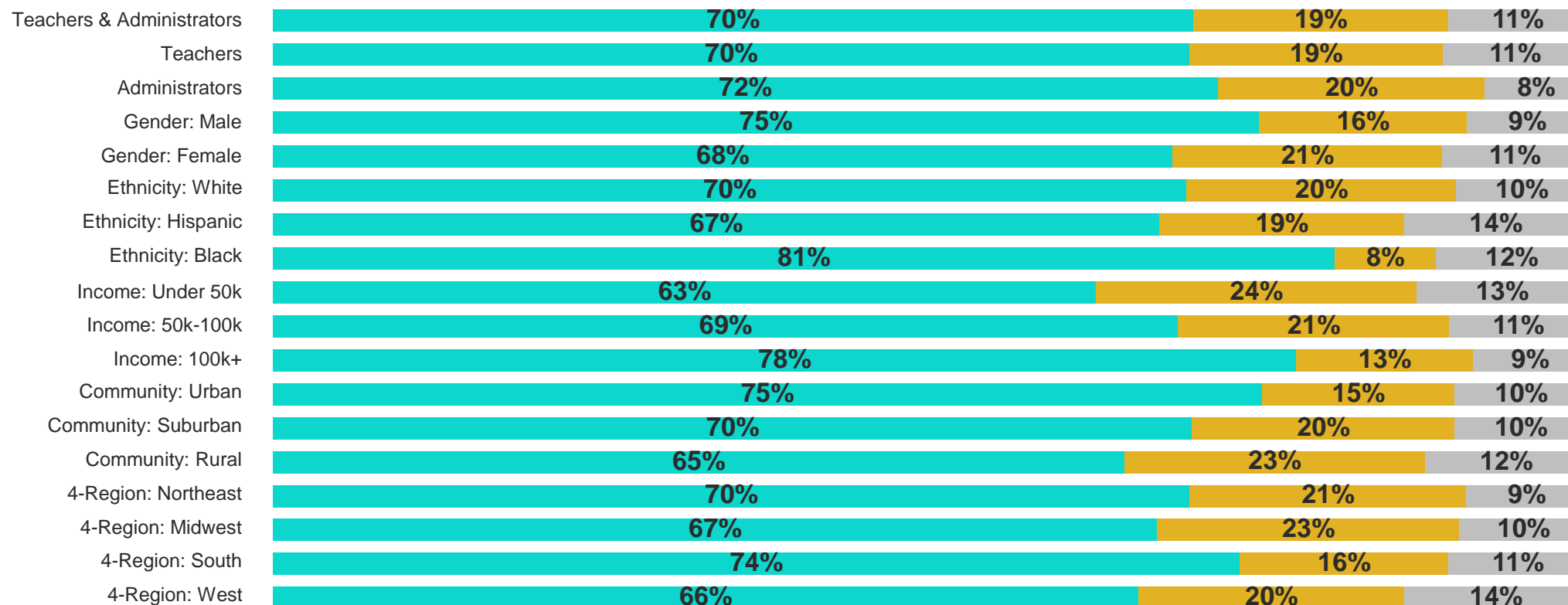


COPING WITH THE HOMEWORK GAP – TEACHERS & ADMINISTRATORS

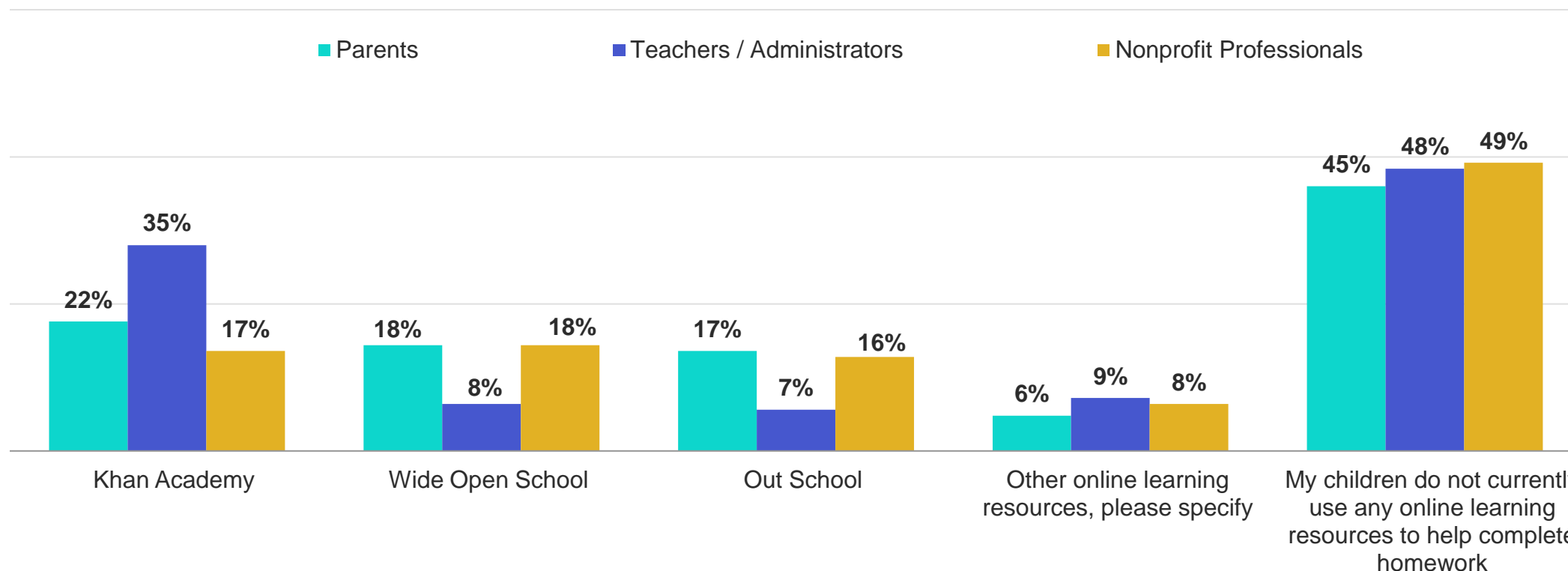

Do your children currently use any online learning resources to help complete homework or support learning in the home? If so, which ones? Select all that apply.



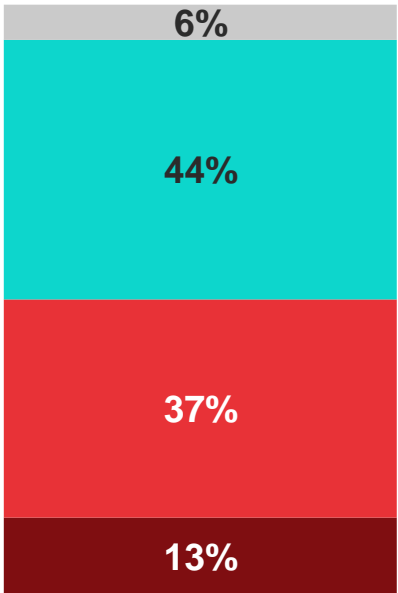
ONLINE LEARNING RESOURCES

Are you overwhelmed by the number of online resources available to your children?

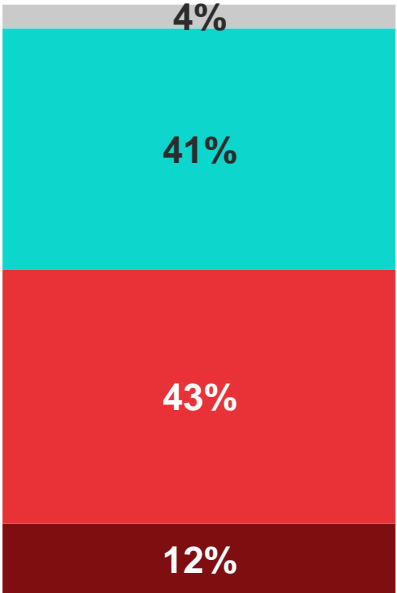

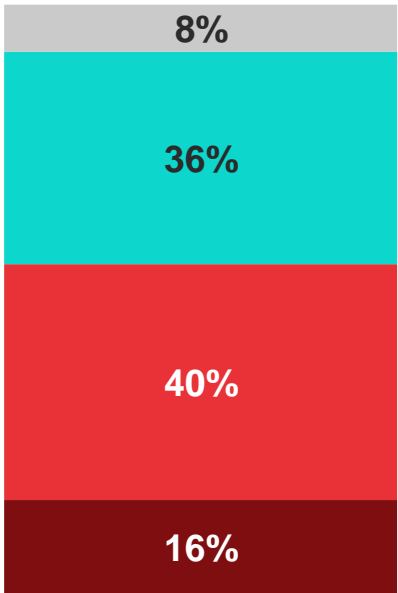

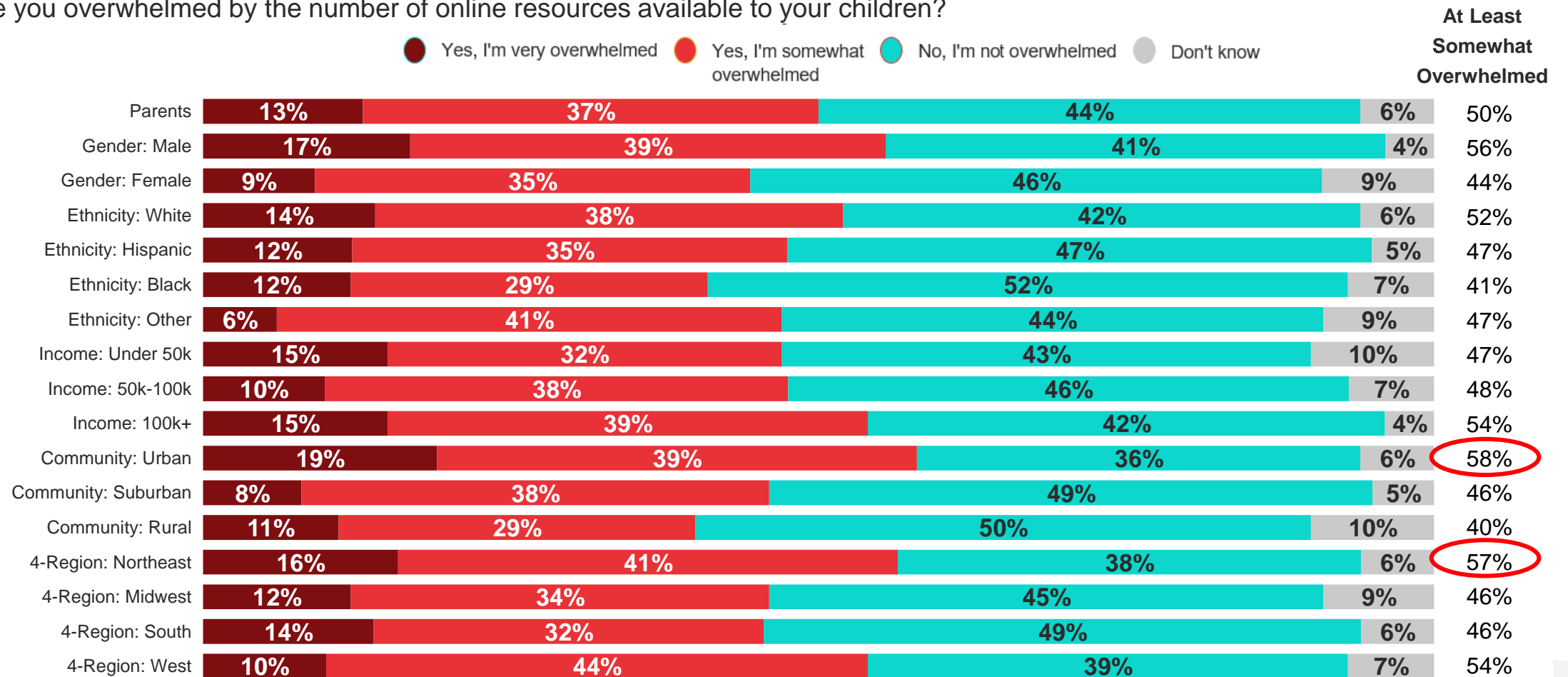

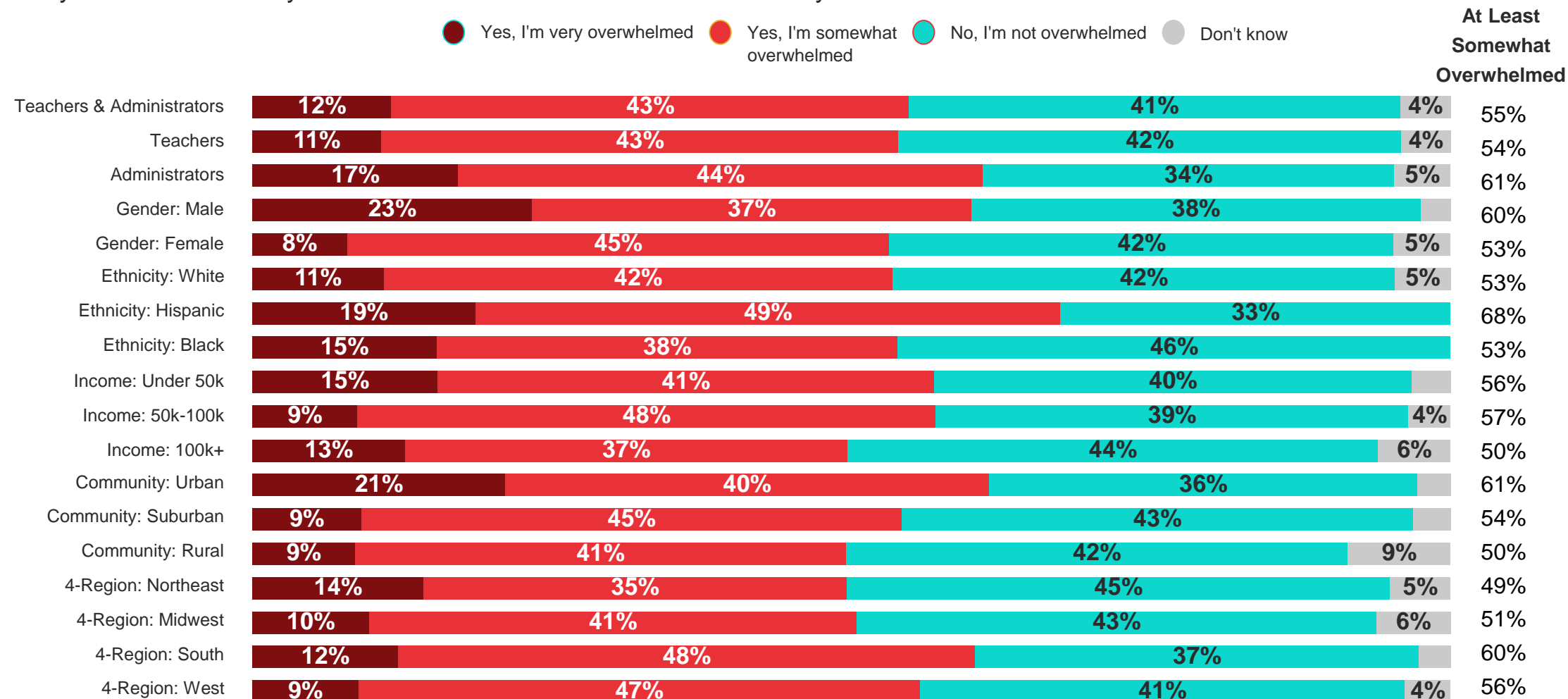
Are you overwhelmed by the number of online resources available to your children?

Are you overwhelmed by the number of online resources available to your children?



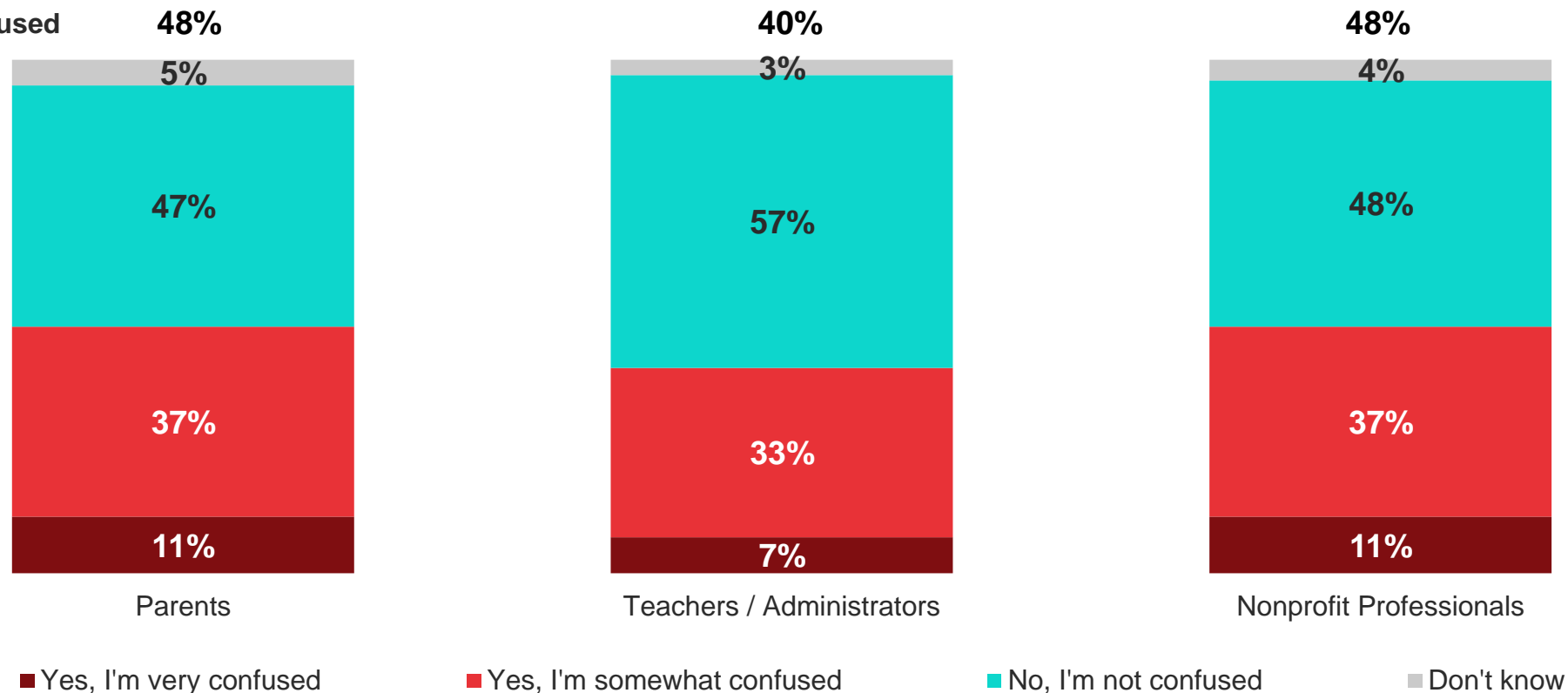
ONLINE LEARNING RESOURCES

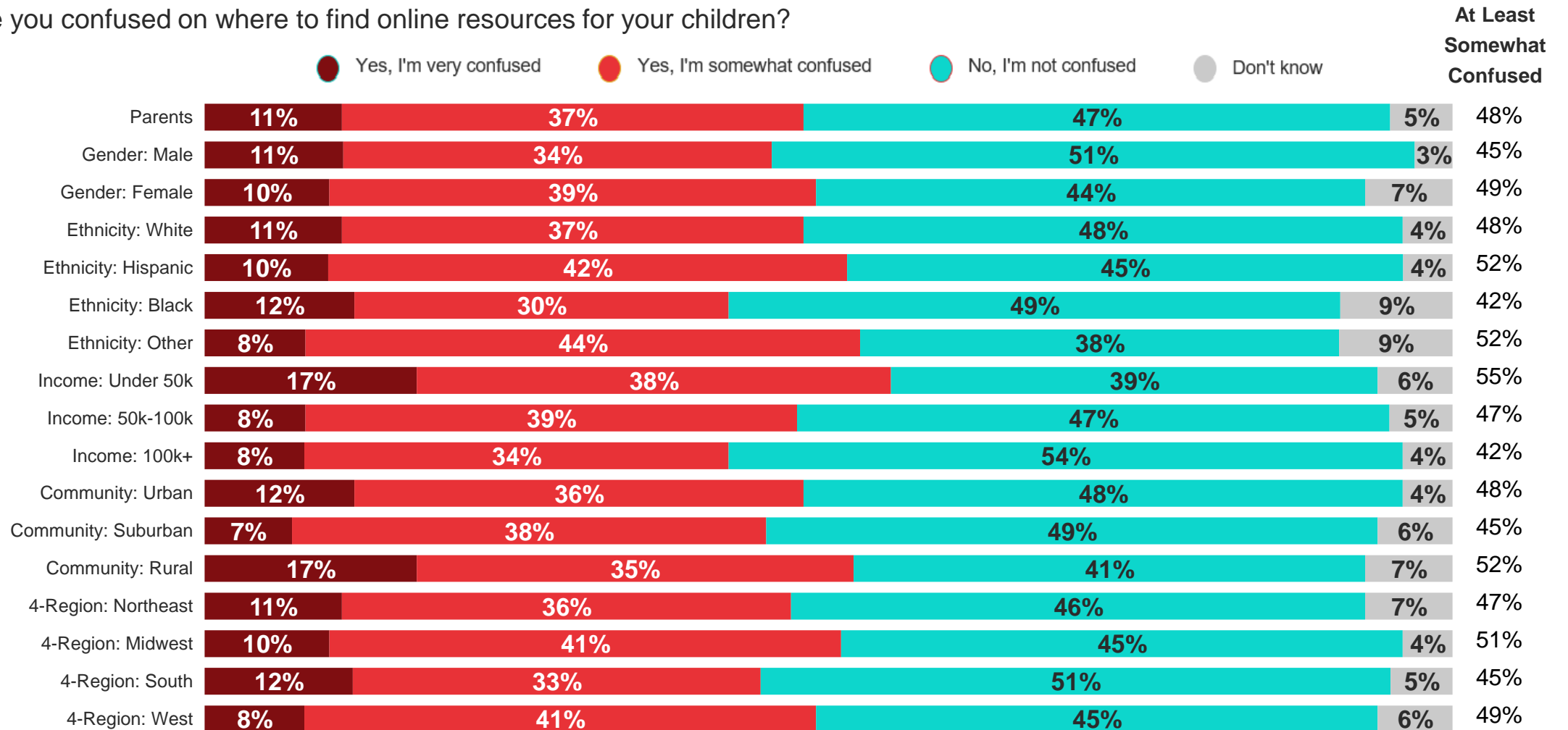

Forty-two percent or more for each parental subgroup are at least somewhat confused on the issue of where they can find online resources for their children.

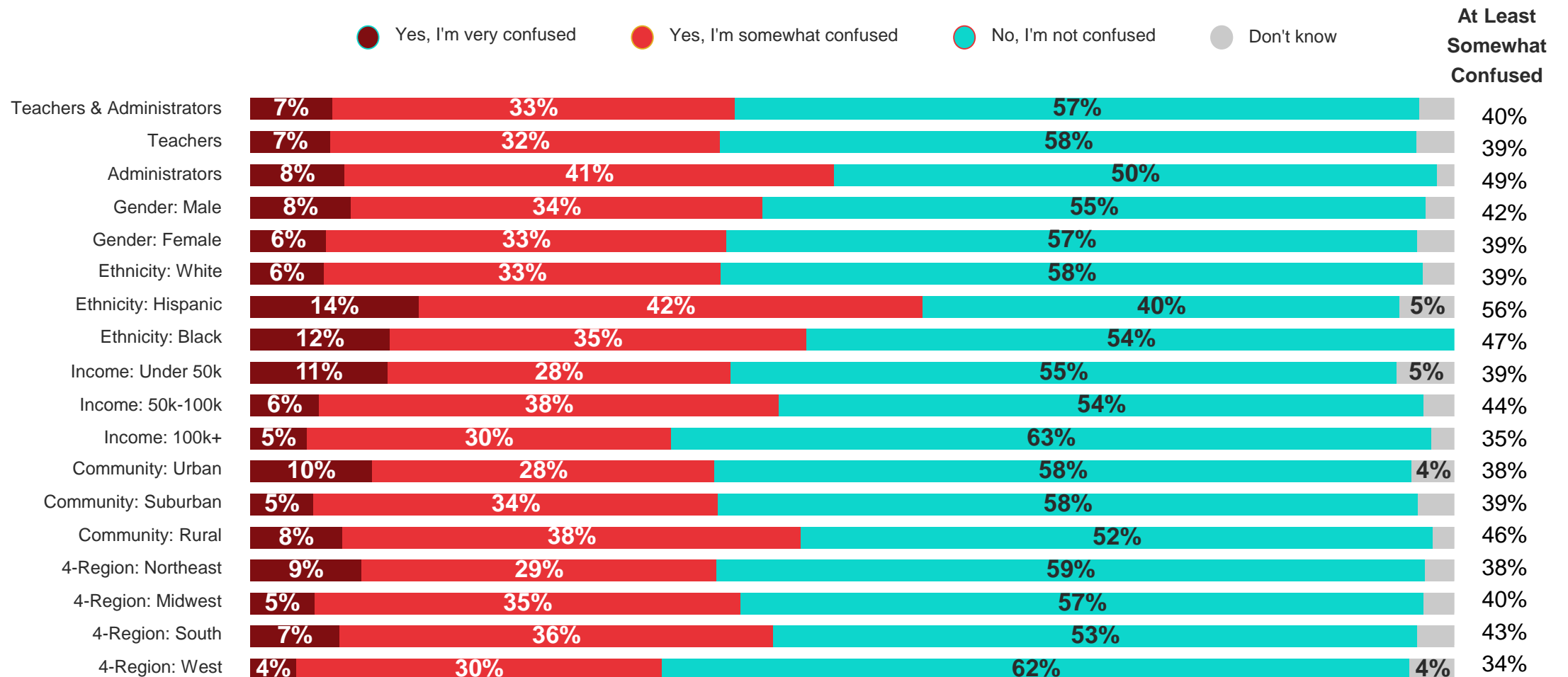
Are you confused on where to find online resources for your children?

Are you confused on where to find online resources for your children?

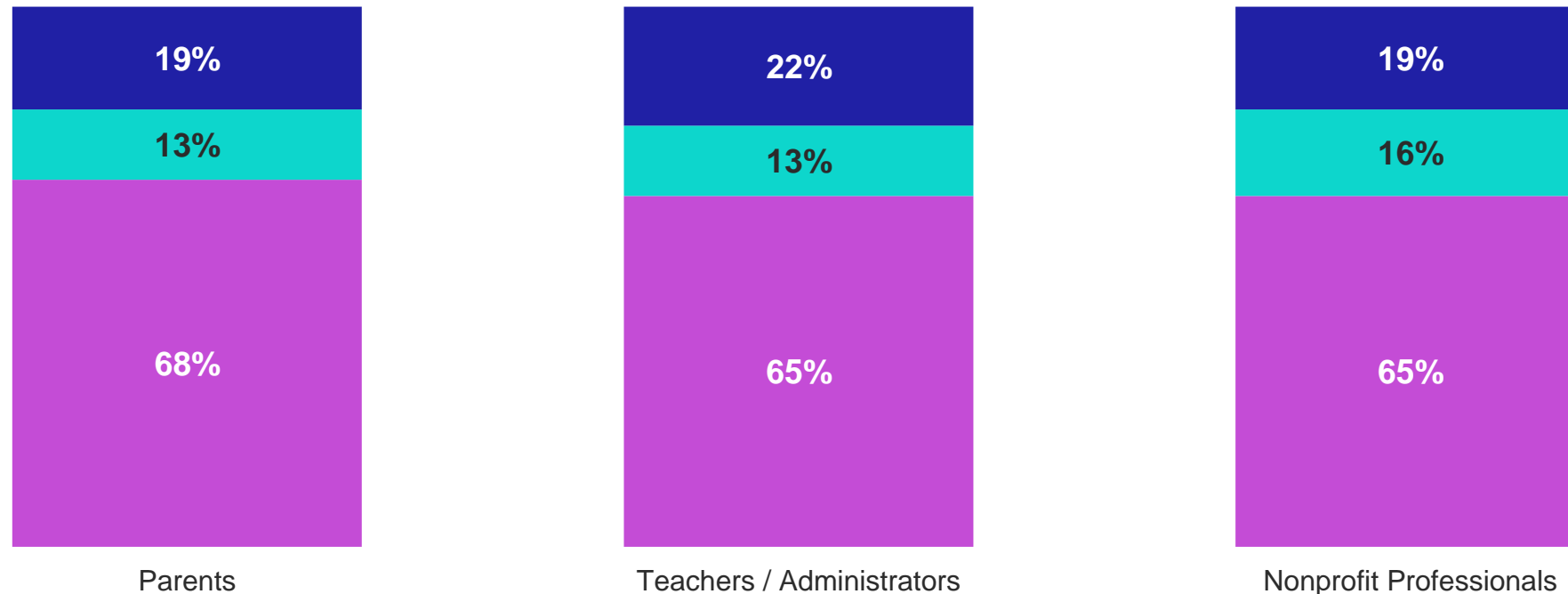


ONLINE LEARNING RESOURCES

Do your children have the online resources they need to continue learning this summer?

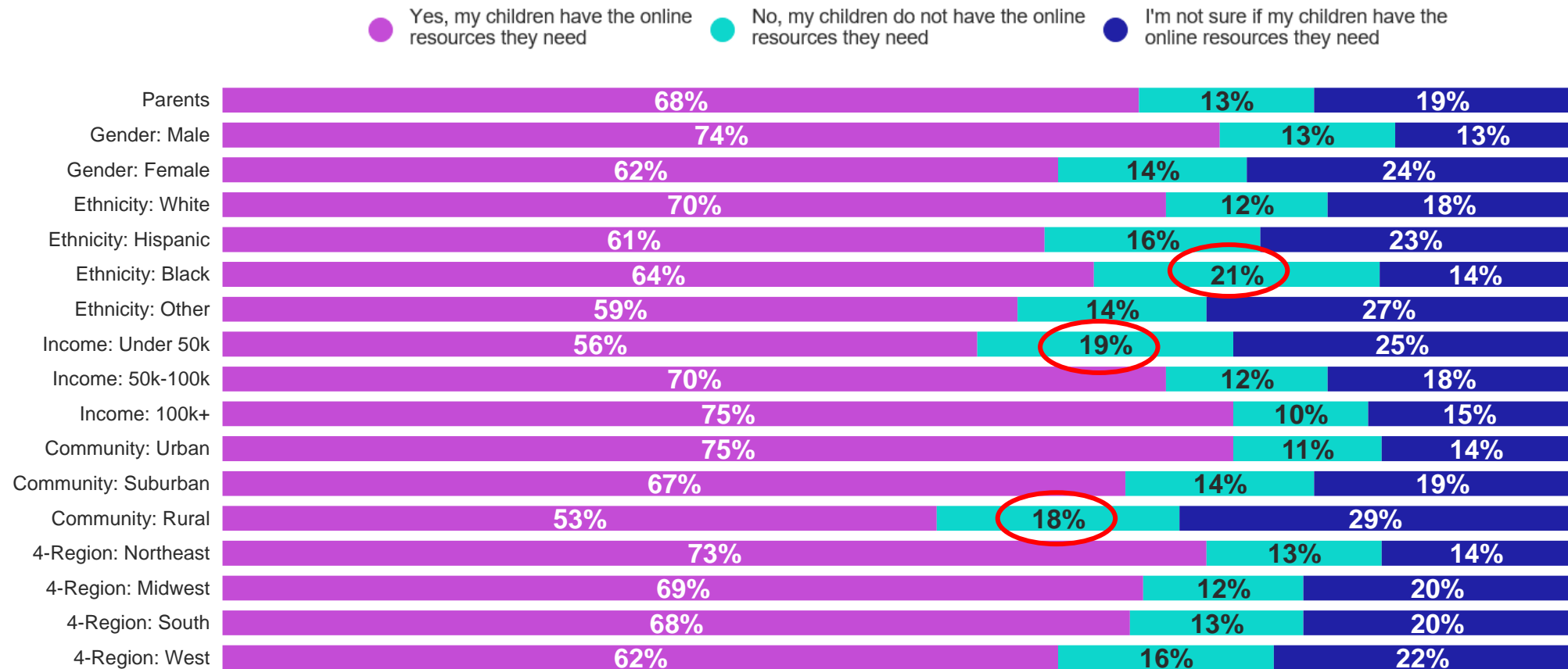

Do your children have the online resources they need to continue learning this summer?

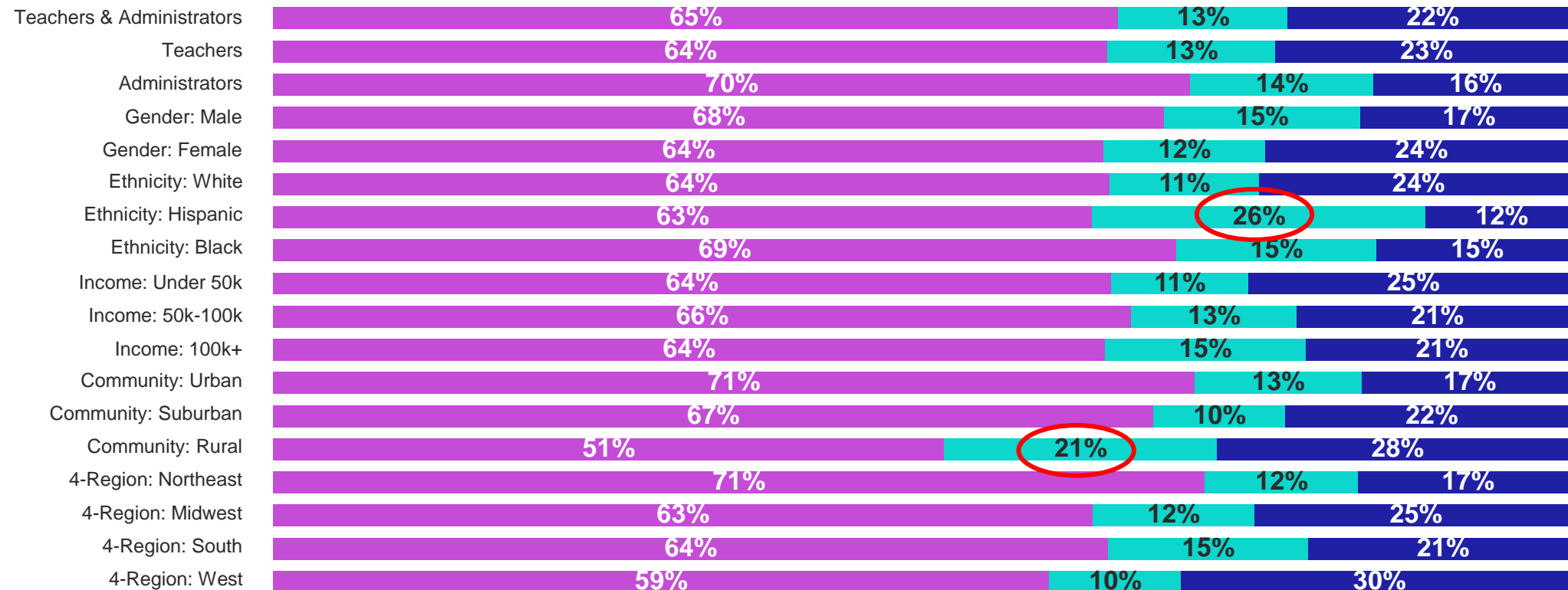


ONLINE LEARNING RESOURCES – TEACHERS & ADMINISTRATORS

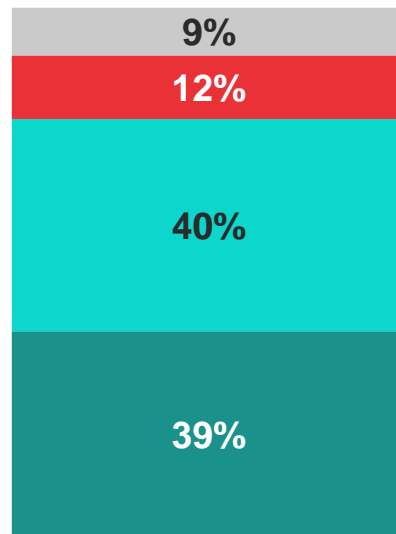


DESIRED TOOLS AND RESOURCES

The vast majority of parents, teachers / administrators, and nonprofit professionals believe that learning tools which include features from popular entertainment would increase student interest in using those tools.

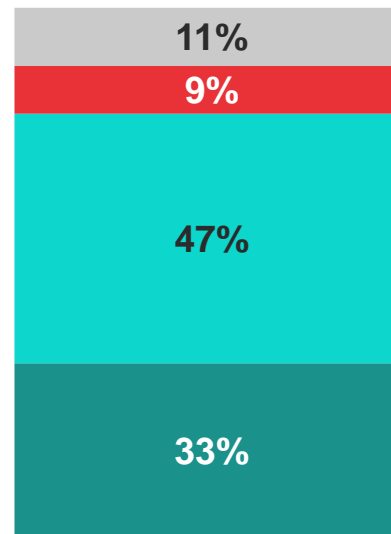
Do you feel that your children would be more interested in learning tools that included popular entertainment? This could include superheroes, cartoon characters, and talent from their favorite movies and shows.

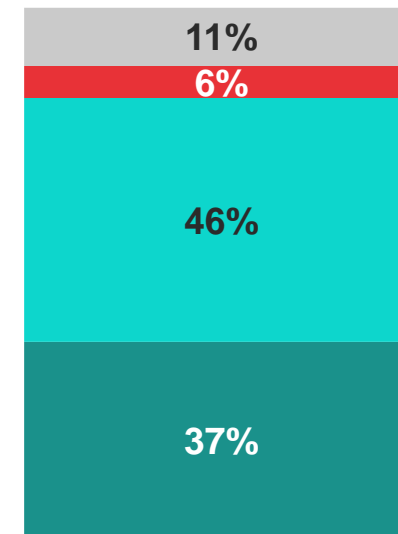

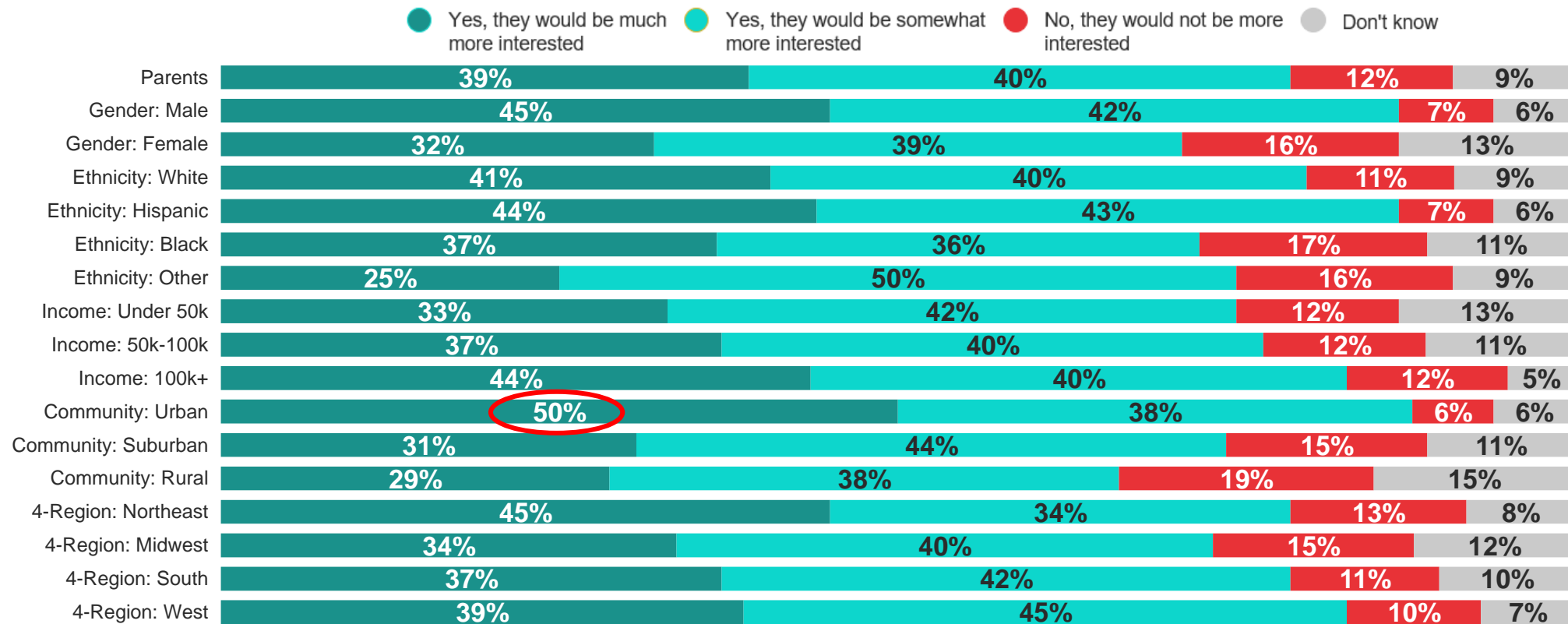

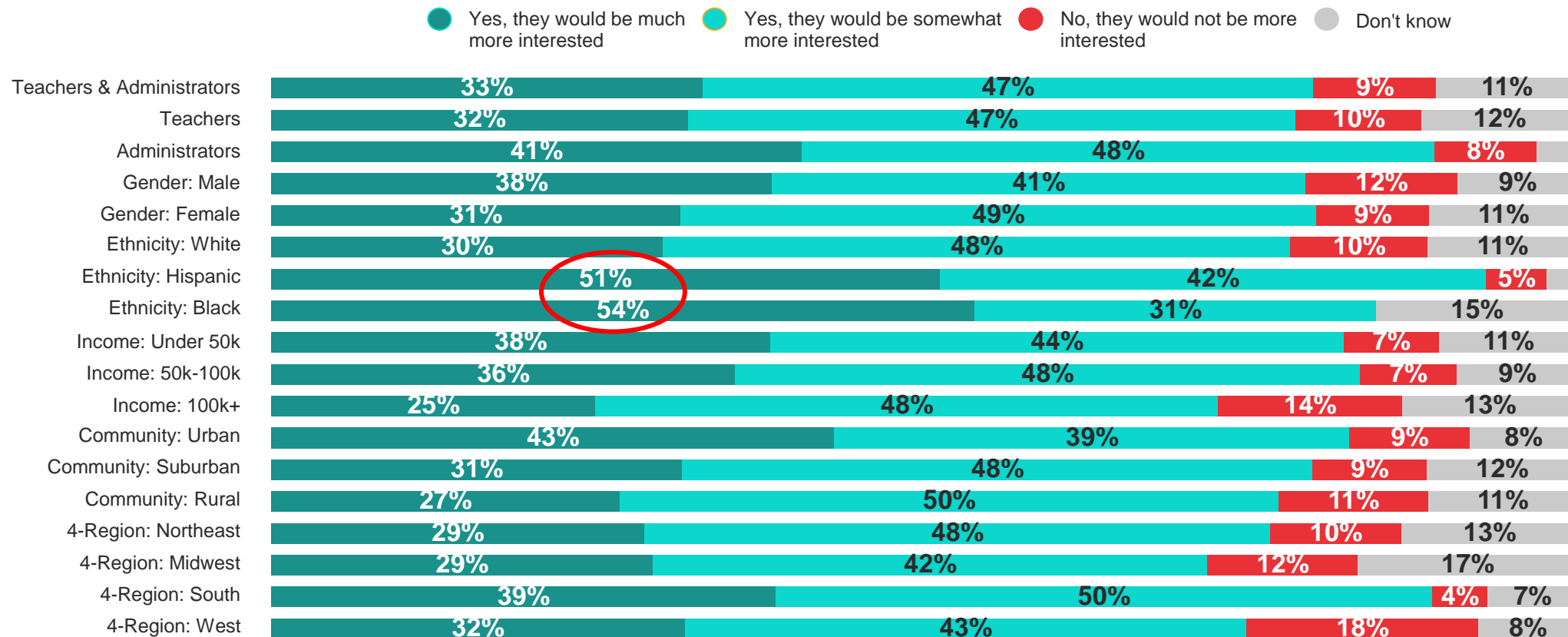
Do you feel that your children would be more interested in learning tools that included popular entertainment? This could include superheroes, cartoon characters, and talent from their favorite movies and shows.

Do you feel that your children would be more interested in learning tools that included popular entertainment? This could include superheroes, cartoon characters, and talent from their favorite movies and shows.

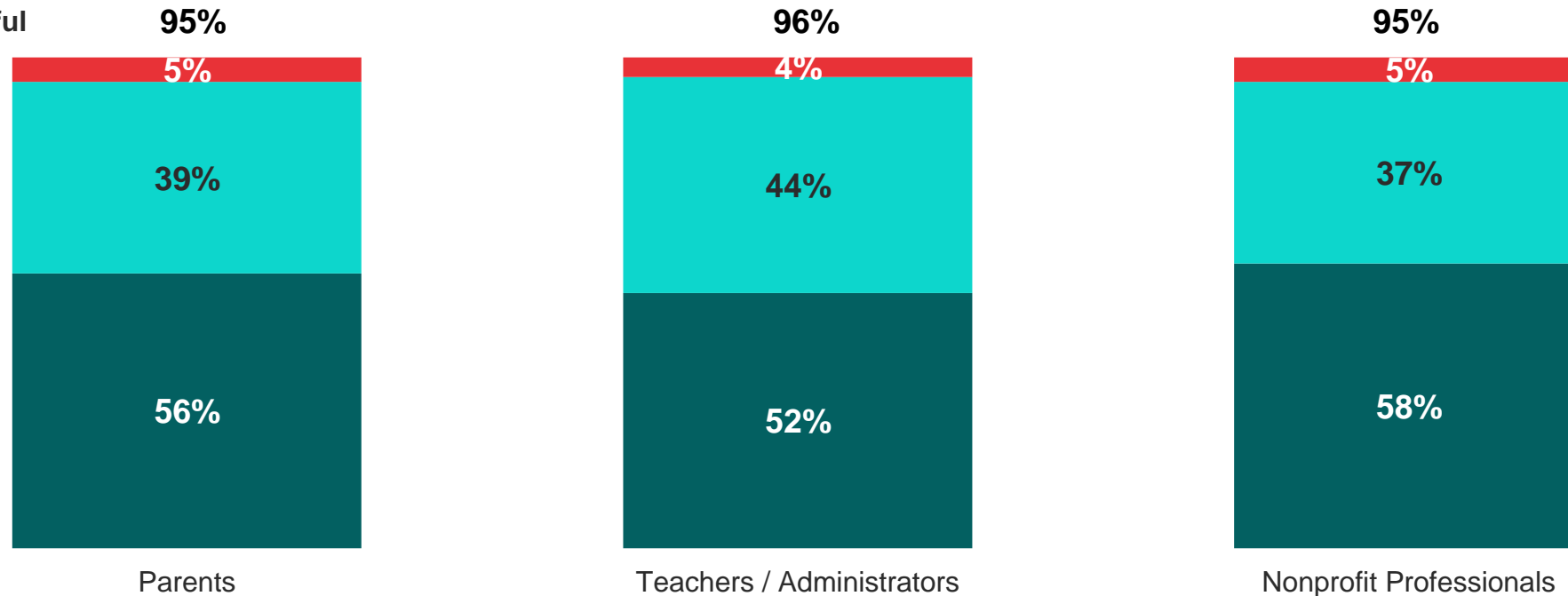


DESIRED TOOLS AND RESOURCES

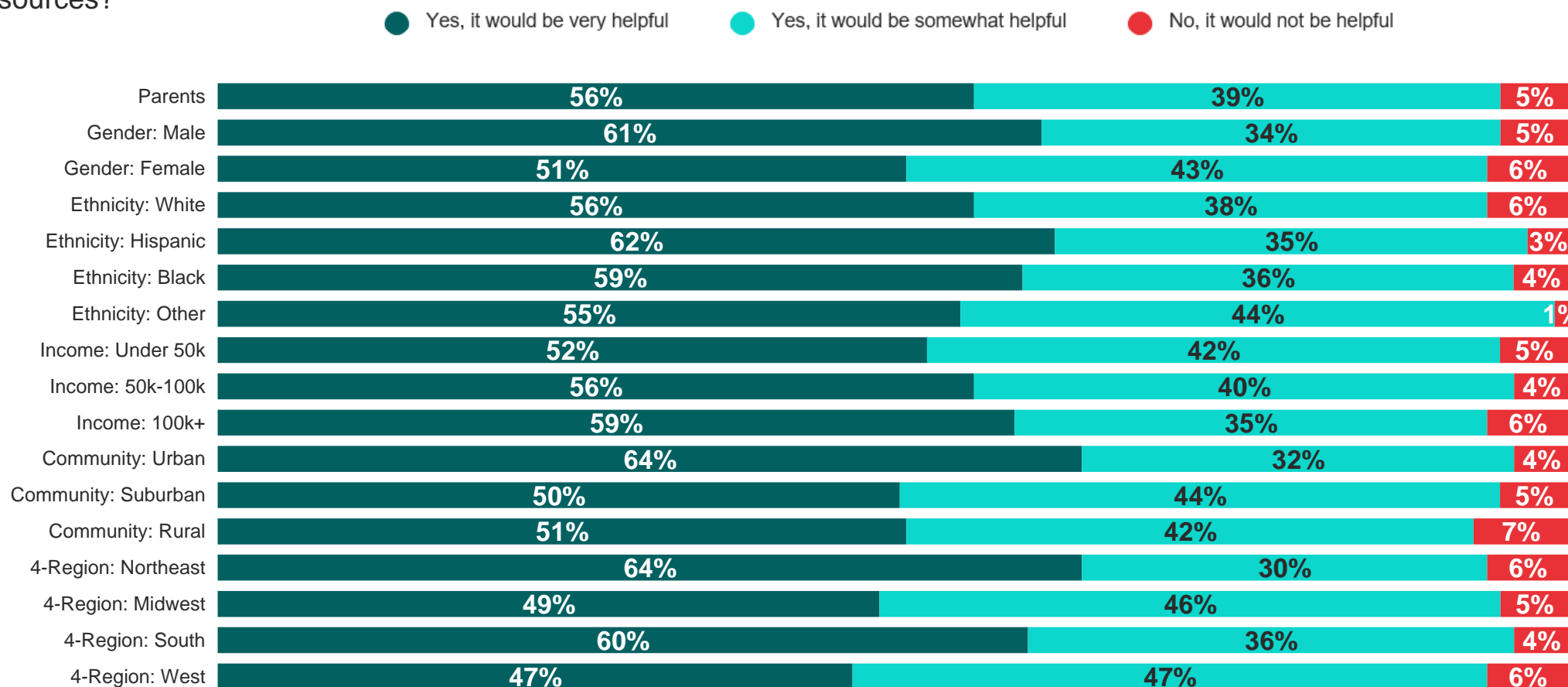

Would it be helpful if there were a single online portal where your children could access high-quality educational content and learning resources?

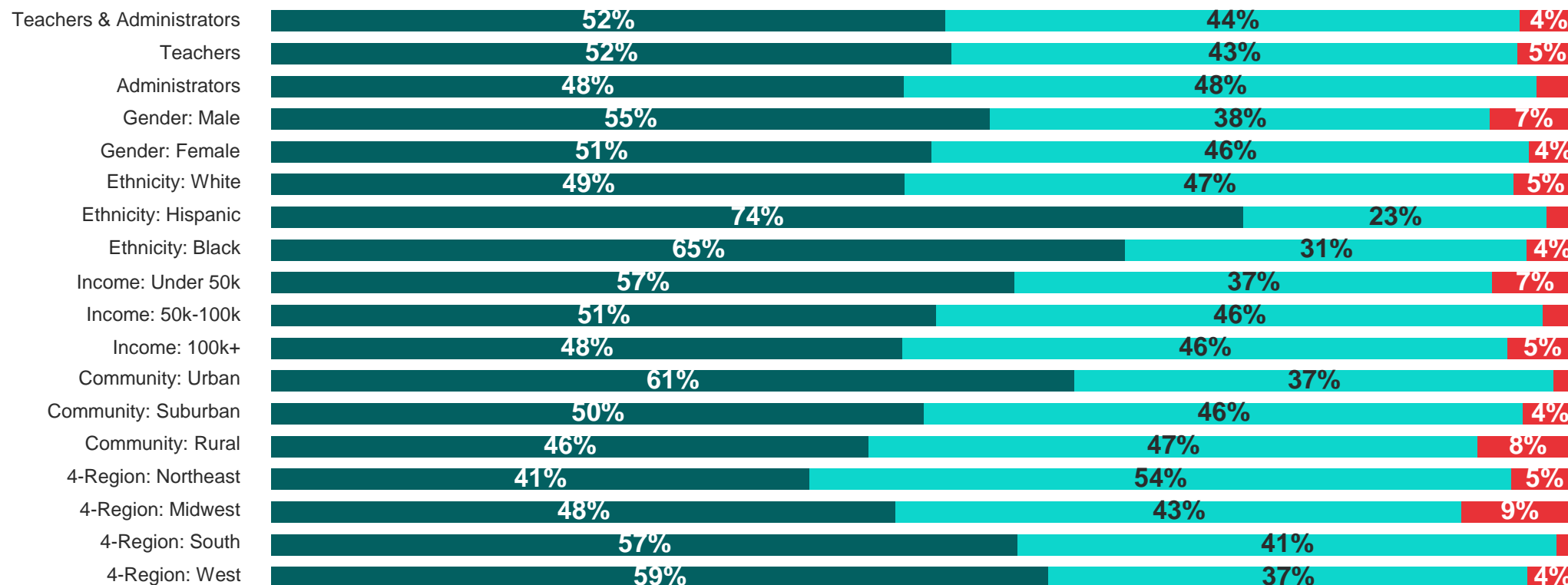


DESIRED TOOLS AND RESOURCES – TEACHERS & ADMINISTRATORS

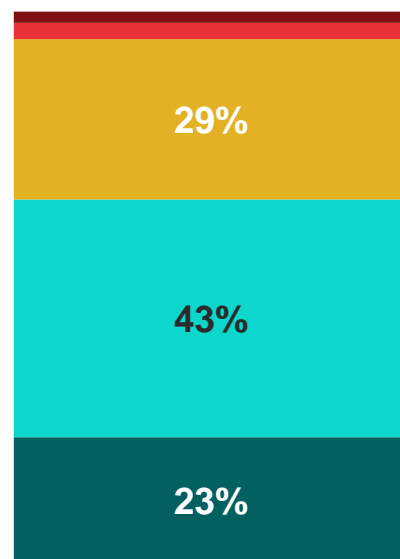

Assuming your children had access to a single portal where they could access high-quality educational content and learning resources, how likely would your children be to use this?

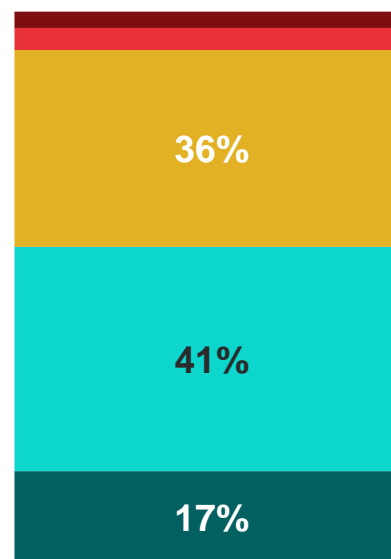

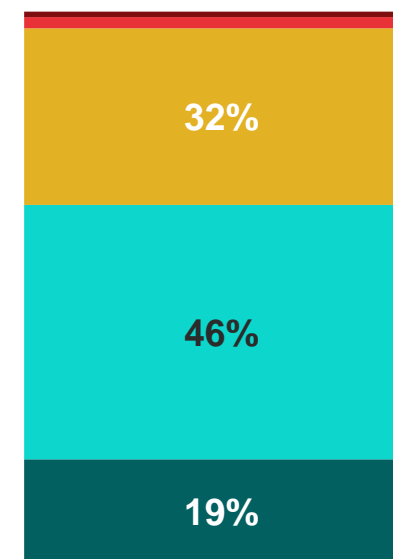

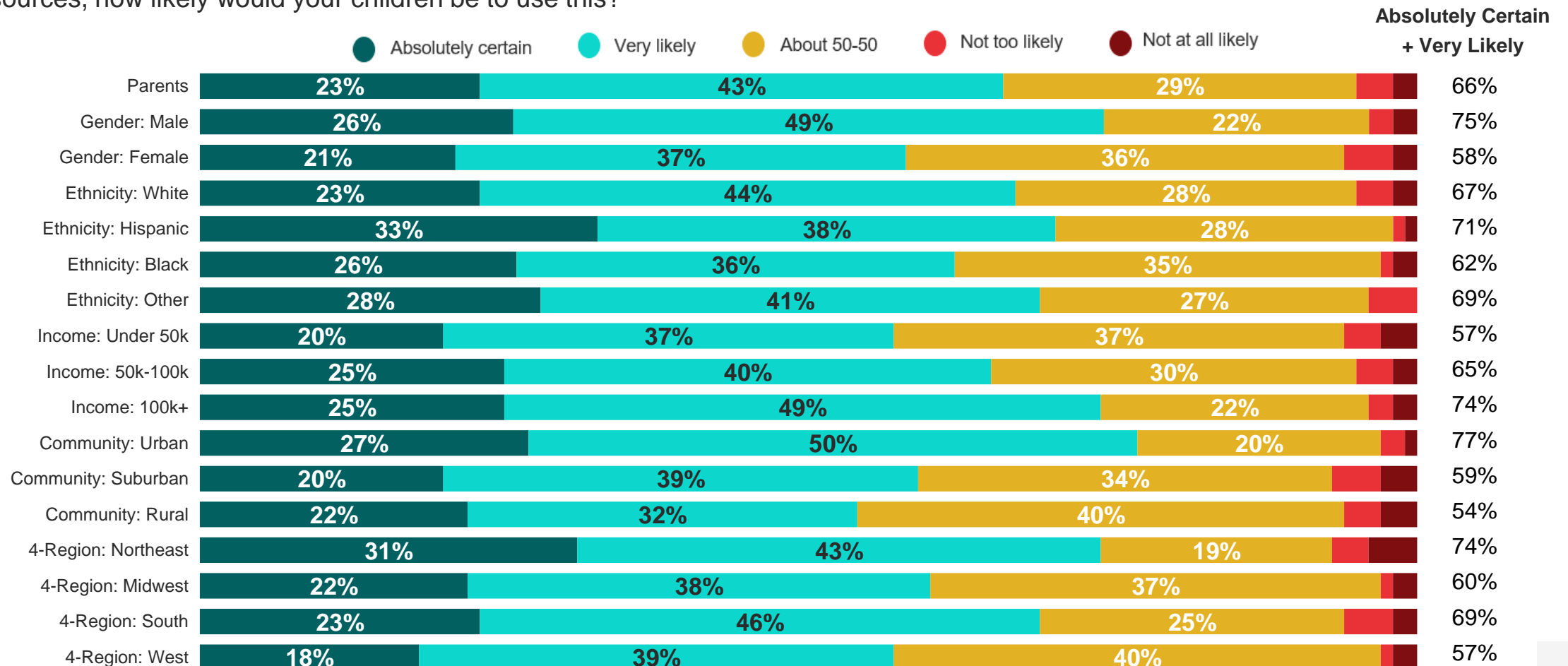

Majorities across parental demographics believe their children would be likely to use a single online portal for accessing high-quality educational content and resources.

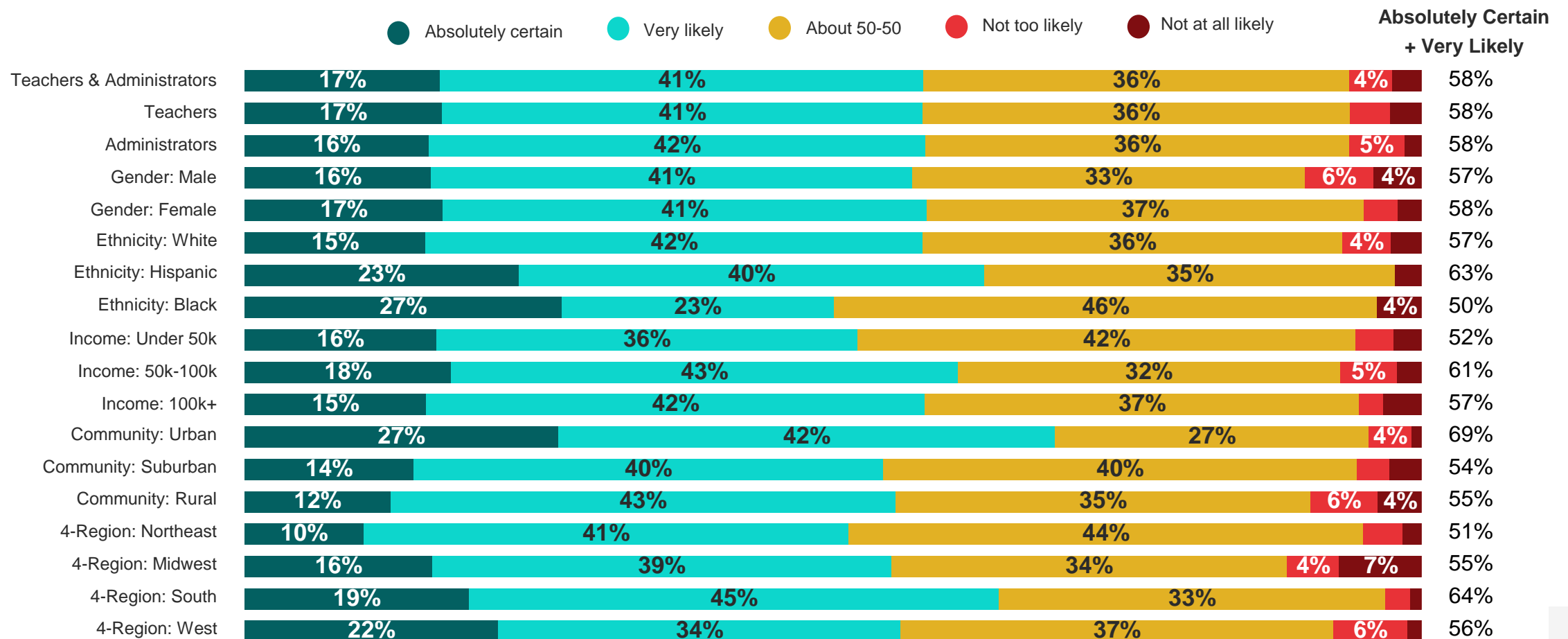
Assuming your children had access to a single portal where they could access high-quality educational content and learning resources, how likely would your children be to use this?
