In June 2018, Co-op shoppers collectively donated \$6,502.74 to the Monadnock Center for Violence Prevention (MCVP) based in Keene. The Monadnock Food Co-op collected these donations during their month-long "Round It Up" donation drive. Customers rounded up their purchases to donate their change to MCVP.

In August 2018, the Co-op gained access to twenty-four new parking spaces for their customers.

The Monadnock Food Co-op closed its fiscal year on July 1, 2018. Notable achievements for the year include:

- Serving over 470k customers and achieving 11% growth;
- Reaching close to \$5 million in local sales, supporting more local farms and farm families;
- Distributing almost \$15,000 through Farm Fund grants to improve infrastructure at four local farms;
- Installing a Freeaire energy conservation system and LED lighting, reducing the energy consumption and carbon footprint of the store;
- Increasing the base wage for staff to \$11/ hour;
- Adding a new staff parental leave benefit and contributing towards a staff dental insurance plan;
- Completing the feasibility stage of their expansion project, receiving a CDBG grant towards it and entering the planning phase




