## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
WOF = Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric
Fabric A (3850P-98 24" Panel with Winter Animals-Gray/Red):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 " x $41 \underline{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ panel

Fabric B (1351-Onyx Just Color!-Onyx), cut:
-(2) 2 " x $411 / 2$ " strips

- (2) $21 / 2 "$ x 25 " strips
- (7) $211 / 2$ " x WOF strips for the binding

Fabric C (3858-88 Snowflakes-Red). cut:

- (3) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with a diagonal seam and cut (2) $11 / 2$ " x $441 / 2 "$ strips.
- (2) $21 / 2 "$ x $361 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric D (3857-90 Winter Owls in Trees-Gray), cut:

- (2) $5 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from the LOF.

Fabric E 3851-98 Winter Woodland Animals-Black/Red), cut:

- (2) $6 ½ "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (8) $61 / 2 "$ squares.

Fabric F (3856-8 Tossed Owls-Red/White), cut:

- (1) $31 / 2 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) $31 / 2 "$ squares.

Fabric G (1351-Burgundy Just Color!-Burgundy), cut:

- (7) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (128) 2" squares.

Fabric H (3858-90 Snowflakes-Gray), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (64) 2" squares.
- (4) $3 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (64) 2" x $3112 "$ rectangles.

Fabric I (3855-99 Reindeer in Sweaters-Black), cut:

- (2) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut into (8) $61 / 2 \prime$ " squares.

Fabric J (3852-8 Pinecones \& Berries-Red/White), cut:

- (1) $311 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut into (8) $31 / 2 \prime$ " squares.

Fabric K (1351-Pigment White Just Color!-Pigment White), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with a diagonal seam and cut (2) 2 " x $601 / 2$ " strips.
- (3) 2 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with a diagonal seam and cut (2) 2 " x $51 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric L (3854-98 Fair Isle Stripe-Gray/Red), cut:

- (2) $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 79$ " strips from the LOF.
- (2) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 " strips from the LOF.

Backing (3853-93 Woodland Animal Patchwork-Gray/Tan), cut:

- (2) 71 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 71 " x 83 " back.


## Sewing

Sew using a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $22^{\prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 25^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A panel to make (1) Center Block. Trim to measure $241 / 2 " \times 441 / 2 "$ (Fig. 1).
2. Place (1) 2" Fabric G square on the left side of (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 3 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.
3. Place another 2" Fabric G square on the right side of the 2 " $\times 31 / 2$ " Fabric $H$ strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 5). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip. Repeat to make (64) Unit 1 strips.

4. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $31 / 2$ " Fabric F square to make the middle row. Sew (1) $2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $H$ square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew the three rows together to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make eight Block One squares total.
5. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $31 / 2$ " Fabric J square to make the middle row. Sew (1) 2" Fabric H square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew the three rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make eight Block Two squares total.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)
6. Sew (1) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 441 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to each side of the center block to make the quilt top.
7. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 44 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 36 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
8. Sew together (2) Block One squares, (2) Block Two squares, (2) $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric E squares and (2) $6 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I squares to make the left side border. Repeat to make the Right Side border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
9. Sew together (2) Block One squares, (2) Block Two squares, (2) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E squares and (2) $61 / 2$ " Fabric I squares to make the Top border. Repeat to make the Bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
10. Sew (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2 "$ Fabric K strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 2 " x $511 / 2 "$ Fabric K strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
11. Center one $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 79^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric L strip on one side of the quilt top and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4 "$ from the top edge of the quilt top and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
12. Repeat Step 11 to sew one $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 67$ " Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the quilt top. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 8).
13. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 8), draw a $45-$ degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

13. Press the quilt top and $71 " \times 83 "$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

14. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
15. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
