

# AT&T Invests More Than \$825 Million Over Three-Year Period to Keep Oklahoma Connected

OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA, JULY 28, 2020 – AT&T\* is proud to have the nation's best and also fastest wireless network,<sup>1</sup> as well as the largest network in North America.<sup>2</sup> From 2017-2019, we invested more than \$825 million in our wireless and wireline networks in Oklahoma to expand coverage and improve connectivity in more communities.

That investment has increased reliability, coverage and overall performance for residents and businesses, which is essential for connecting our customers with family, friends and colleagues – no matter the distance. It's also improved critical communications services for Oklahoma's first responders using the FirstNet network.

Today, our 4G LTE network covers more than 330 million people.<sup>3</sup> That's more than 2.61 million square miles and over 99% of all Americans.<sup>4</sup>

We also expanded access to high-speed internet in Oklahoma by building more than 240,000 additional fiber connections.

"There is not a single aspect of our economy that does not directly benefit from advanced communications networks," said Chad Warmington, CEO of the State Chamber of Oklahoma. "From family-owned businesses to major corporations, the job creators of Oklahoma depend on the type of advanced networks AT&T is building."

### **FirstNet: Transforming Public Safety Communications**

We're honored to work with the First Responder Network Authority (FirstNet Authority) to build and manage FirstNet – the *only* nationwide, high-speed broadband communications platform dedicated to and purpose-built for America's first responders and the extended public safety community. And we take our responsibility to deliver FirstNet seriously.

Building upon our current and planned investments in Oklahoma, we continue to extend the reach, and increase the coverage, capacity and capabilities of the FirstNet network:

- Purpose-built network enhancements Across Oklahoma, we've boosted the network with high-quality Band 14 spectrum in communities such as Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Grant and Garvin. Band 14 is nationwide, high-quality spectrum set aside by the government specifically for FirstNet. We look at Band 14 as public safety's VIP lane: in an emergency, this band or lane can be cleared and locked just for FirstNet subscribers. In addition, since beginning of the FirstNet network expansion, we've launched new FirstNet cell sites in McIntosh, Tillman and Okmulgee Counties, among others.
- Reaching rural Oklahoma FirstNet is built for every first responder in the country –
  career or volunteer; federal, tribal, state or local; urban, suburban or rural. That's why
  we're collaborating with rural network providers to help connect remote parts of
  America and build out additional FirstNet LTE coverage in Oklahoma.
- Public safety-specific advanced capabilities FirstNet is providing Oklahoma public safety with dedicated access when they need it, as well as an entire communication ecosystem with unique benefits like mission-centric devices, certified applications, always-on priority and preemption and high-quality Band 14 spectrum. These advanced capabilities enable FirstNet to perform faster than any commercial network<sup>5</sup> and bring its subscribers the unthrottled connectivity they need.
- Unparalleled emergency support Oklahoma agencies on FirstNet also have 24/7
  access to a nationwide fleet of 76 deployable network assets. These assets can either be
  deployed for planned events or called upon in emergencies at no additional charge to
  help first responders stay connected and operate faster, safer and more effectively
  when lives are on the line. FirstNet Response Operations led by a group of former first
  responders guides the deployment of the FirstNet deployable assets based on the
  needs of public safety.



Free Smartphones for Life for Public Safety Agencies – We have a responsibility to
public safety unlike any other wireless carrier. That's why Oklahoma agencies spanning
law enforcement, fire, EMS, healthcare, hospital emergency departments, emergency
management and 911 operations on FirstNet can stay up-to-date with smartphones for
life at no additional cost.<sup>6</sup> This means first responders across agencies of all sizes will
have affordable access to their network.

The FirstNet network expansion across Oklahoma is being done with direct feedback from state and public safety officials. This helps ensure FirstNet meets the short- and long-term needs of the public safety community.

In addition to the programs mentioned above, AT&T's commitment to Oklahoma includes programs like:

- IEEW The Institute for Economic Empowerment of Women (IEEW) is an Oklahoma-based nonprofit that empowers women entrepreneurs from around the globe economically, socially, and politically. IEEW's Peace Through Business program, created in 2006, is a business training and mentorship program for women entrepreneurs in Afghanistan and Rwanda that focuses on the education and promotion of business and leadership skills among women to help build stable democracies.
  - AT&T's sponsorship enables the IEEW to take 30 of the top students from each annual in-country business training course to the AT&T University Las Colinas Campus for Leadership Development, an intensive two weeks of additional training that includes one-on-one coaching from volunteers that include AT&T employees and executives, an attendance at tech day at AT&T headquarters and graduation gala.
- Believe AT&T Oklahoma has a legacy of responding to local needs, including its
   "Believe Oklahoma" campaign, in coordination with the Oklahoma Business Roundtable,

  - In the last year, AT&T partnered with ReadOKC, an initiative of the Oklahoma City Public Schools Compact, to develop a culture of reading and promote the love of reading for students and community. Volunteers from AT&T provided thousands of hours as "Reading Buddies" to third graders in Oklahoma City in eight different schools.
