Your offer

You will receive the result of your interview within 10 working days. If you have been given a full or conditional offer, you have 10 working days to either accept the offer or tell us you wish to withdraw your application. If you don't advise us of your decision within the deadline of 10 working days, your application may be withdrawn.

If your application has been unsuccessful, you will be advised on your next steps. Please remember to book your interview as soon as possible as places fill up fast.

Your student funding

If you are offered a place on a non-advanced course (any course that is not an HNC or HND), you should apply to the College for course funding and any financial assistance. You will be sent a link to apply for student funding from week commencing April 2021.

If you have been offered a place on an advanced course (HNC or HND) you should apply to SAAS (saas.gov.uk) for funding. Usually SAAS open up their applications in April, so please keep an eye on the SAAS website.





Despite leaving school with no qualifications, Tiffany (24) began volunteering with local charities and studied part time care courses at North East Scotland College in order to gain experience and ease herself back into education, before she began studying NC Social Care (Level 5) in 2018.

At the same time as starting her studies, Tiffany found employment with the City Council as a Children's Rights Development Assistant, working with care experienced young people aged 16-26, advocating for them and helping to set up initiatives like a clothing bank and a mobile phone bank.




Jemma Sykes - Construction

Lee Goodwin Entry to Uniformed Services Level 2 Diploma

At just 17 years old NESCol has played a pivotal role for Lee. Growing up he had an interest in the RAF and he held the rank of Corporal in the Air Training Corps.

In the fourth year at School Lee enrolled onto the School Links Uniformed Services course. Here he was introduced to College and he found the environment very different to school. "I was treated like an adult," he said, "and for me, College was a better place to learn. It was more relaxed, calmer which is why I decided to leave school as soon as I could."

Lee left school as an exceptional entrant* at 15 and enrolled onto the Entry to Uniformed Services course. He was surprised how interesting he found the academic side of the course, learning about how all the uniformed services work in unison with each other. During the course Lee improved his physical fitness, losing just over 2 stone in weight which he believes enabled him to pass the fitness test for the RAF. Although he completed his course during lockdown he found the online learning element a positive one and believes this was down to the support from his lecturers and fellow students.



Lee is now looking forward to the next part of his story – his full time job in the RAF as a Logistics Supply specialist. He is heading off for his basic training after which his first posting will be in the Falklands.



Wayne Walker Deck Officer Cadet Programme

Wayne Walker left school and went onto College to study NC electronics. Once he gained this gualification he worked in numerous jobs. His last job was driving a 30 tonne dump truck until he was made redundant due to the impact of coronavirus.

The Merchant Navy was something that he had been considering for many years. Wayne's father is a Captain in the Merchant Navy and he has seen the lifestyle that this career offers, in particular the leave onshore after time at sea.

He said, "Just nine weeks into this three year training programme I have my eye firmly on the end goal. A solid career to support my young family with more time to share life with them because of the potential shift patterns."

Wayne is one of the oldest cadets in his class but he sees this as an advantage as he is used to working long hours away from home. During the first College phase of 16 weeks Wayne is living in Peterhead alongside other cadets Monday to Friday. He then enters his first sea phase (approx.34 weeks) with Clyde Marine Training and his shipping sponsor Solstad Offshore

"My training is likely to be in the North Sea. It will include ship familiarisation, finding out who does what and working alongside the deck crew. I'm looking forward to it" he said.



Once I'm qualified my aim is to be a Captain of a construction vessel in the renewables sector, or Captain of a platform supply vessel. I suppose the dream is to just push myself to be the best I can be



What's Next?

University

Degree Link is the unique partnership between North East Scotland College and Robert Gordon University, which can allow students to enter into year three of a degree from HND level. As the first College in Scotland to be an associate of a university, NESCol has worked closely with RGU to offer students seamless progression from one course to another.

Degree Link is mostly offered on a 2+2 basis – two years at College followed by two years at university, but in some cases where a course is only offered at HNC level, students can progress directly into second year at RGU.

Terms and conditions: In order to articulate, you must be on a specified HNC/HND route and have successfully completed your course. You may have to fulfil certain knowledge requirements or selection criteria. For instance, depending on the individual course requirements, students may be asked to complete particular modules while at College, go through the interview process or submit a portfolio of work.

To find out more about the specific degree course entry requirements, students should speak to their Academic Tutor or their Curriculum Manager, but in the meantime, take a look at the pathways available and start thinking Higher!

Other University Links

What does this mean?

In the majority of cases, students who successfully complete their HND (two years) can go straight into year three of a degree programme with no wasted time! However, universities often apply conditions for entry, depending on the course. For example, you may need to achieve a particular grade in certain units, or in the case of music and drama, you may have to pass an audition. You will have to apply through UCAS before the January deadline, but NESCol will provide support for this. To find out more about specific articulation entry requirements, applicants should contact the university.

Alternatively, students can speak to their Academic Tutor or their Curriculum Manager at College.
