## Message From The G.M.



We are doing very well through the first six months of 2011. Financially, we are \$150,000 better than budget for the first half of 2011.

Management is considering some capital projects to be presented to our Board of Directors for the second half of 2011. We are considering leveling the driving range tee and installing new four piece rubber frame mats on a concrete base.

The rebuilding of number 3 green has started and is progressing smoothly. If money is available in the Reserve for the remainder of 2011, we intend to start our golf course tee reconstruction in the next three months. This work is scheduled for 2012 in the Reserve. Our Clubhouse construction project is almost complete. We will be installing new post lights in the front of the Clubhouse, and Valley Crest will be doing new "Florida Friendly" landscaping to complete this project.

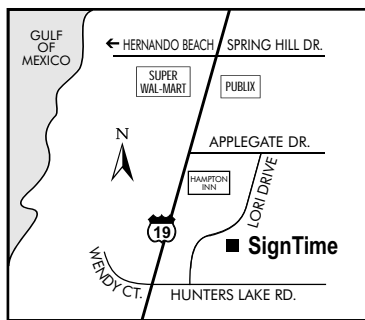

### Architectural Review Committee

*"If everyone is moving forward Together,  
Success Takes Care of itself."*

During the summer months we intend to slow down a little, but not with this new eight member committee. Although we are not doing full inspections yet, the new committee, with supervised training, has been out familiarizing themselves with the Villages, the new form, codes and the policy manual. This is only one part of their training. At each of our meetings we hold a training session, which includes various items, to help them better understand the workings of the committee and especially the processing of the Exterior Change Form. There are some residents reading this who are saying "Why make such a big deal about all this?" For the residents who question, please let me remind you that Heritage Pines is a deed restricted community. One of the ARC's most important responsibilities for the Board of Directors is to see that residents abide by the Heritage Pines Policy Manual. It is felt that the more the committee understands thoroughly every part of our responsibility we can, with your help, keep Heritage Pines, a pristine place to live.

The ARC suggested some changes, approved by the HP Board of Directors that you need to be aware of:

1. If a resident has a violation, they will receive only one (1) letter. This will be the first and FINAL letter that will be sent. You will have thirty-one (31) days to comply. If after the thirty-one (31) days you have not, your letter is given to the General Manager, and a fine will be imposed. You are being given the same amount of time to comply as before, just eliminating the second letter.
2. A new fines Structure has been implemented for the following: A) Modification or work done without submitting an Exterior Change Form. B.) Violation of the ARC Policy (inspections). C) Work completed without ARC approval. D) Work completed before a request is submitted.

These new fines were explained in the July newsletter.

3. The committee decided last year that there will not be any extensions given for violations. This is why it is so important that if you are away for any length of time, you have someone who will take care of your property.

When the Heritage Pines Board of Directors approves the updated policy manual, each month we will explain various items, so you will have a better understanding.

We are very appreciative of the cooperation and the support you have given us in the past and are looking forward to the same in the coming year.

### Can Your Hear Me Now?

As part of a new initiative to provide residents with complimentary services here at HP, management is now working with a local business, Affordable Hearing Solutions, to provide the following complimentary services for residents:



- Video Otoscopy examination to check for Ear Wax
- Ear Wax Removal
- Hearing Screenings
- Clean and Check hearing aids
- One Complimentary Pack of Hearing Aid Batteries
- (In-home Hearing Evaluations available at no-charge by appointment only)*

The first session will be held on Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup> starting at 1:00 p.m., and running until 3:00 p.m. A sign-up sheet will be at the front desk for appointments in 10 minute intervals. We anticipate a great response from this service, and have made preparations to make it a monthly service! Again, if you wish to take advantage of this complimentary service, you must sign up in advance through the front desk.

### Community/Memorial Tree Program

The Community/Memorial Tree Program provides the opportunity for our residents to purchase a tree in memory of a loved one or friend. Trees may also be purchased to honor a person or because you wish to donate one in your name to beautify our community. Prices vary according to the type and size of tree. Residents may choose a general location for a donated tree which can be on the golf course, along the main boulevard or in other areas of the community. The final placement of each tree will be approved by our golf course superintendent, Tommy Land. Trees will be planted during the months of March/April and October/November. Please plan your purchase during the preceding months.

A map showing the location of all donated trees is located in the hallway by the Magnolia Room. The Community/Memorial Tree Program is headed by Linda O'Leary. Please contact Linda at 819-9207 for pricing information.

## Environmental Issues Committee

### How Does Your Garden Grow?

It's summer in Heritage Pines, flowers are blooming and even the grass looks good. If you're still in the mood to add some color, shape, or texture to your yard, here is some information to help with your plant selections. As we all know, just because plants are sold locally does not ensure that they will do well in this climate and with the soil conditions that exist in our yards. In order for your plants to be successful it is important to consider several factors such as: range of light, soil moisture requirements, drought tolerance, and cold hardiness zone. We live in USDA cold hardiness zone 9B. This may sound like a daunting task, but there are several excellent sources you can use to help you make choices that will bring beautiful, long-lasting landscaping to your yard.

One of the best sources to use is the following site – [www.floridayards.org](http://www.floridayards.org). It is sponsored by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, Cooperative Extension Service, Florida Yards and Neighborhoods Program, and Southwest Florida Water Management District. When you enter the site you will find Florida-friendly landscaping tips, an interactive yard for planning, and the Florida-friendly plant database. Click on the database, select your region (Central) and the plant type you are looking for and hit “submit”. You will then be asked to select criteria for your plant search. Here's an example – choose “Flowers” for your plant type, and then the following criteria: Native plants – no; Flower type – perennial; light range – full sun; soil moisture – light; soil texture – sandy; salt tolerance – not applicable. This search will give you 51 plants to choose from. You can click on “view detailed description” for each plant and get a printable page complete with photo, detailed description, and additional data. You will be amazed at the variety of plants, shrubs, and trees that are quite suitable for our area. Of course, not all of these plants are available from the obvious places such as Lowes or Home Depot, but if you find some plants you want you can search local nurseries to see what's available and what can be ordered.

So, if you're tired of replacing robellinis and other expensive plants, try this search method to find the “right plant, right place.” Happy gardening!

## Resident Lifestyle Committee

The Lifestyle Committee was recently contacted by The Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services of Florida regarding free programs which their organization has available for Florida residents. They will distribute special phones to any Heritage Pines resident who is hard of hearing, deaf, blind or speech impaired. The equipment is provided by the Florida Telecommunications Relay, Inc. and is **FREE** of charge to Florida residents. If you have a hearing loss these “Clarity” phones will amplify sounds and adjust tones enabling an individual to hear total conversations without having to ask caller to repeat what they are saying. There are many other services available, the “Clarity” phone is only one example.

## Why is there so much blood needed?

Here are the different amounts of blood that can be used in various procedures.

Organ Transplant	40 units of blood 30 units of platelets 25 units of fresh frozen plasma 20 bags of cryoprecipitate
Bone Marrow Transplant	20 units of blood 120 units platelets
Heart Surgery	6 units of blood
Burn	20 units of platelets
Automobile Accident	50 units or more of blood

## Ask The Techie



**Q:** I recently replaced my old desktop computer with a Windows 7 laptop. The laptop has a touchpad that I am learning to use. However, while in Internet Explorer the computer seems to randomly open links without my clicking on them. Is my laptop possessed?

**A:** No your new computer is not possessed. You are experiencing a touchpad feature called **TAP TO CLICK**. When this feature is enabled a double tap on the touchpad surface is the same as a **Double-Click** of the left button. The touchpad on many laptops is sensitive to the small electric charge in our bodies and will sometimes inadvertently sense our finger movement as a **Double-Click**.

Personally, I find this “feature” a nuisance and prefer it disabled. To disable the **TAP TO CLICK** do the following:

1. Locate the Pointing Device icon on the Task Bar (lower right portion of your screen)
2. **Left-Click** on it and. Uncheck the TAP TO CLICK menu selection.

The **TAP TO CLICK** feature is not exclusive to Windows 7. It is typically enabled on most Windows XP and Vista laptops that have touchpads.

**Q:** I am considering replacing my DVD player with a Blu-ray player to connect to my new HD TV. However, I have an extensive collection of DVD movies and don't want to have to repurchase. Will a new Blu-Ray player be able to play my old movies?

**A:** Yes, you should not have any problems playing commercially purchased DVD movies or CD music on your new Blu-ray player. In fact, you may notice that the picture quality of your DVD movies is improved when playing them on your new player. The Blu-ray player does an up-conversion of the DVD video that will appear somewhat crisper when viewed on a HD TV.

When connecting your Blu-ray player to a HD TV or home theater receiver use HDMI or component cables. The single RCA cable will not provide a true HD quality picture. If you are connecting to a surround sound system use a HDMI or optical cable for optimum quality audio.

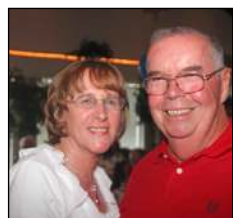

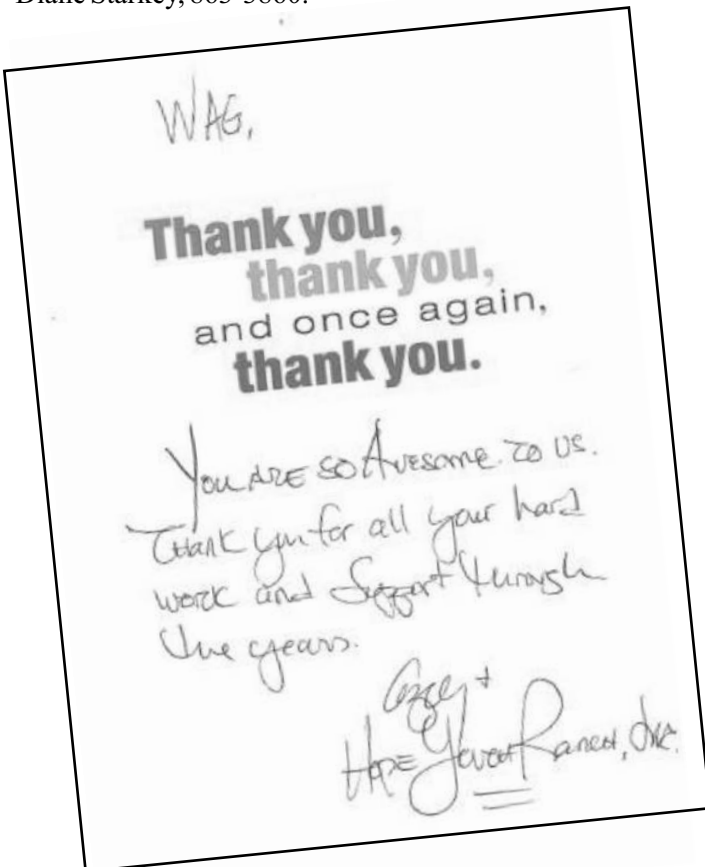

## Tai Chi Class

**Tai Chi – Thursday Advanced at 8:30 a.m., Beginner at 9:00 a.m.  
Chi Kung (Qigong) – Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Magnolia Room**

**What is Tai Chi?** Tai Chi has evolved over hundreds of years from a Chinese martial art into a simple and gentle exercise that has many health benefits for all ages. Tai Chi practice raises *chi*, or life energy, which strengthens the immune system, improves health, and whole body energy (or jin), also called intrinsic energy, which improves coordination. As practice evolves, feet, legs and pelvis, spine, arms, and hands feel more connected, and the movements of head and body begin to feel coordinated. There comes a time when breathing and movements of all parts of the body follow one rhythm (jin).

Tai chi movements build energy gradually; generate warmth; and a sense of completeness. After a half hour of practice, you can feel this energy as heat in certain parts of the body (especially the hands). Each posture cultivates a different kind of energy flow. The role of the individual student, in the process, is to try, through tai chi, to create the conditions in which energy can flow and to give the body time to heal itself.

Tai Chi teaches people to become alert to intelligence from within while learning to listen to what is happening outside and to respond to others. It teaches patience, the ability to wait, poised and quiet, for the moment to move or act. When Tai Chi movements are performed correctly, they work to calm and focus the mind, so that mind, energy, and body work in harmony.

**Tai chi is quality movement.** It is physically demanding, yet it works with the body to encourage the gradual developing of strength and reviving of natural openness and coordination. The movements of Tai Chi continually turn the spine, an action that gradually repositions misplaced organs, stimulating them at the same time through an internal form of massage. These same movements also dissipate excess nervous tension held in the body and help balance the nervous system. Practicing tai chi encourages the joints to open, that is, to relax completely, thus increasing the mobility in all joints of the body; maintaining an especially strong focus on the ankles, knees, hips, shoulders, elbows, wrists, and spine.

To learn what you have been missing; stop by any Thursday or Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m. (free).

There will be no classes from Aug. 1 until Sept. 15. New classes for beginners will begin on October 6<sup>th</sup>.

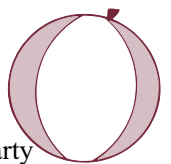

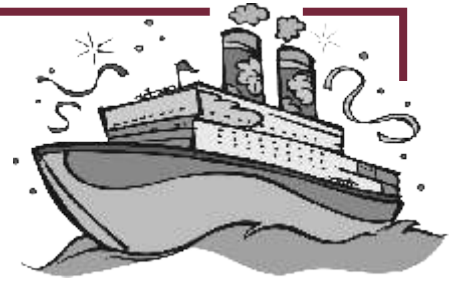
