Water levels are still high, so make sure you are being safe and smart out there.

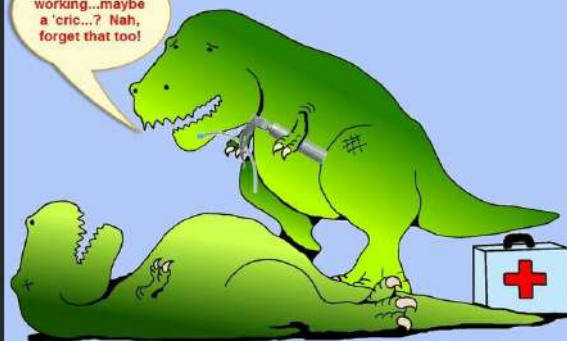
