1. Make sure you are signed up with the Lindon City alert communication system called "Everbridge". The recent Boil Order event over the holiday reminds us of the importance to receive critical information and this is what Everbridge is designed to do. This alert system can deliver messages to you any way you want—on your home phone, cell phone, email, and more so the City may reach you in any emergency (or sometimes non-emergency situations) to let you know about important City-related events. 2. Are you recycling yet? Did you know that blue can is able take up to 70% of your garbage and you don't even have to wash items or sort them! It's easy and only \$3.25 per month, which is cheaper than a regular 2nd black trash can. It can save money for you, the cost and sourcing of raw materials for future manufacturing, and helps eliminate waste from taking space at the landfill.

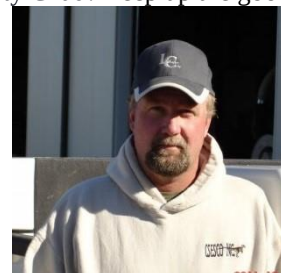
SENIOR MOVIE DAY!

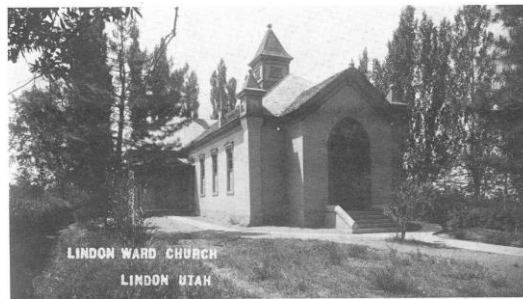
Make Commingled Recycling a New Year's Resolution!
