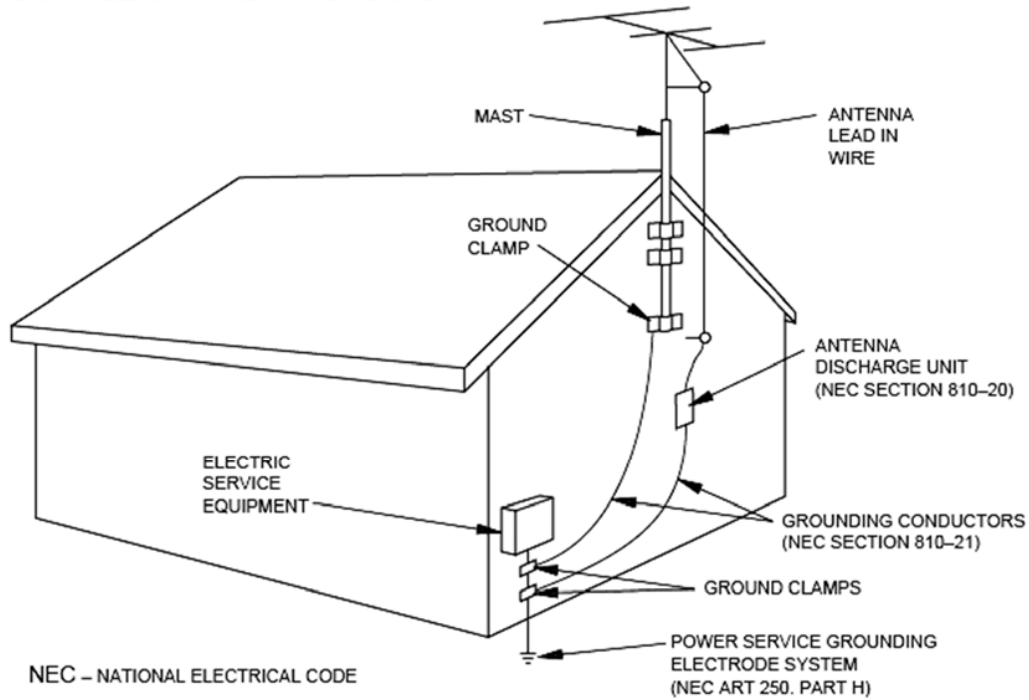

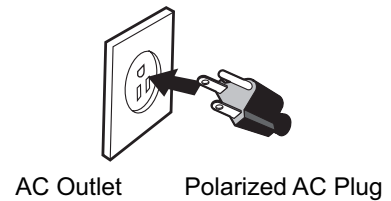

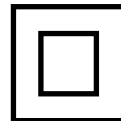
EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the item you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer, the Consumer Electronics Association (CEA) and the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level – a level that lets the sound come through clearly without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without damaging your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time, your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound, so what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Do not use in hot and cold rooms and/or locations.

- When the unit is used in rooms and/or locations with low temperature, the picture may leave trails or appear slightly delayed. This is not a malfunction, and the unit will recover when the temperature returns to normal.
- Do not leave the unit in a hot or cold location. Also, do not leave the unit in a location exposed to direct sunlight or near a heater, as this may cause the cabinet to deform and the TV to malfunction.
- Recommended storage temperature range : 32°F to 122°F.

PANEL PROTECTION

The LCD display panel used in this TV is made of glass.

Therefore, it can break when the product is harshly dropped or impacted upon by other hard objects. Be careful not to be injured by broken glass pieces in case the display panel breaks.

ABOUT AFTER-IMAGE

The extended use of fixed image program material can cause a permanent after-image on the screen.

This background image is viewable on normal programs in the form of a stationary fixed image. This type of irreversible screen deterioration can be limited by observing the following steps:

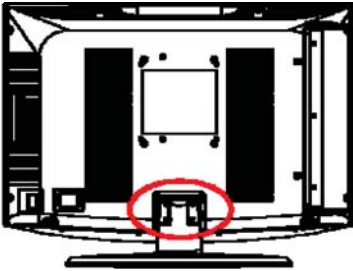

PREPARATIONS

ATTACHING THE BASE STAND

TO ATTACH THE STAND:

- Place the TV set on a stable flat surface covered with a soft mat.
- Insert and tighten the 4 screws (included) with the screwdriver (included) as shown in the circled area to fix the BASE STAND securely.



TO REMOVE THE BASE STAND:

(If you want to repack the TV unit for transit, storage or change to wall mounting)

- Place the TV set on a stable flat surface covered with a soft mat.
- Remove the 4 screws affixed to the neck of the BASE STAND to separate the STAND from the TV body.

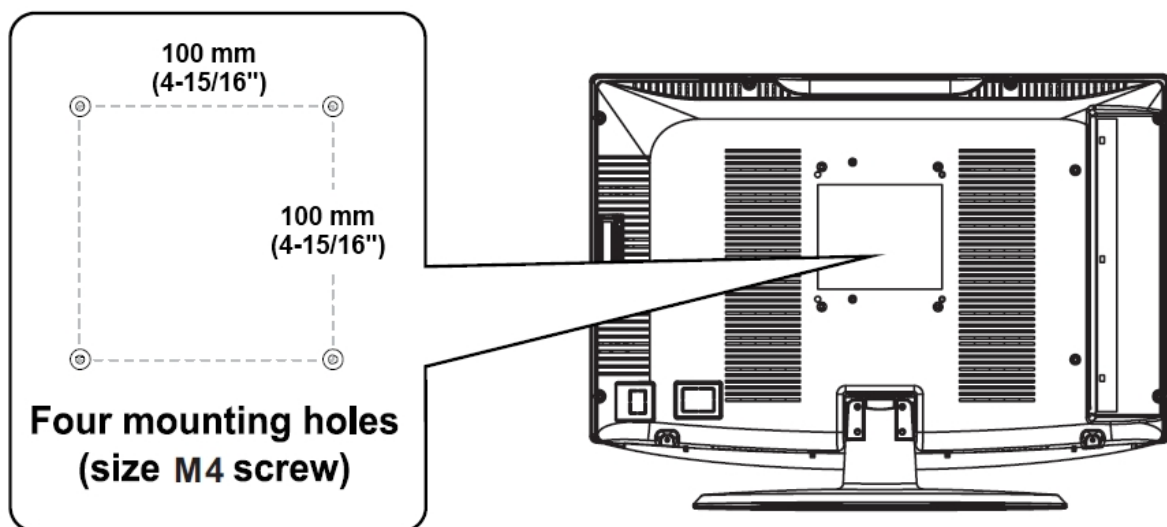
WALL MOUNTING

This unit is VESA-compliant, and is designed to be wall-mounted with a VESA-compliant (100mm x 100mm or 4-15/16" X 4-15/16") mounting kit designed for flat-panel TVs (not included). Mount the TV unit according to the instructions included in the mounting kit.

Length of wall mounting screws affixing the TV set should not exceed 8 mm (0.3").

NOTE

Remove the base stand before mounting the unit on the wall

1	STANDBY	Press this button to turn the unit ON from STANDBY mode. Press it again to turn the set back to STANDBY.
2	SOURCE	To access the INPUT SOURCE menu.
3	MENU	Press this button to access the main menu page.
4	CH+/-	Press these two buttons to directly change the TV channel. In menu operations, these buttons serve as up/down buttons.
5	VOL+/-	Press the VOL+ or VOL - button to directly increase or decrease the sound volume level. In menu operations, these buttons serve as right/left buttons.

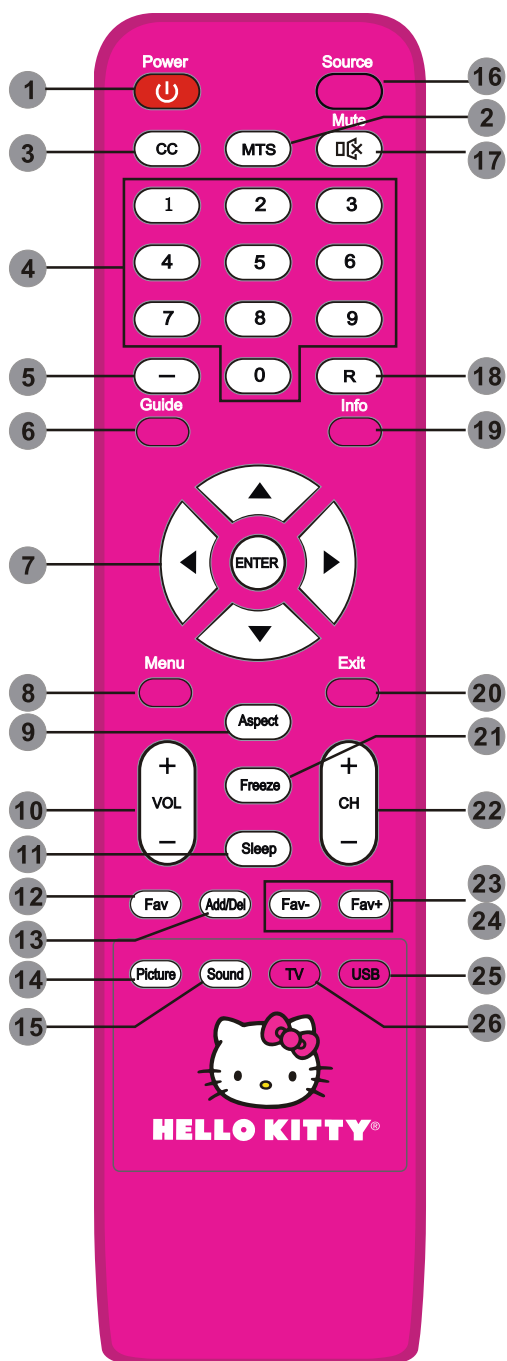

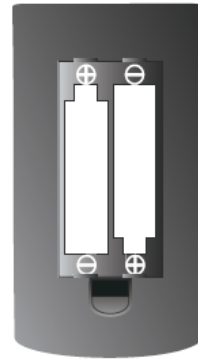

GETTING STARTED

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

TO INSTALL BATTERIES

1. Open the battery door.
2. Insert 2 "AAA" batteries.



BATTERY REPLACEMENT

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.

BATTERY CARE

- Be sure that the batteries are installed correctly. Wrong polarity may damage the unit.
- (a) Do not mix old and new batteries.
- (b) Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- If the unit is not to be used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries. Old or leaking batteries can cause damage to the unit and may void the warranty.
- Never attempt to recharge "Non-rechargeable" batteries.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire, batteries may explode or leak.
- Batteries should be changed by adults.

Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor window of the set. Objects between the remote control and sensor window may prevent proper operation.

CARE OF REMOTE CONTROL

- Do not expose the remote control to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not place the remote control under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the main unit is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such a case, change the angle of the lighting or the TV set, or operate the remote control closer to the remote sensor window.

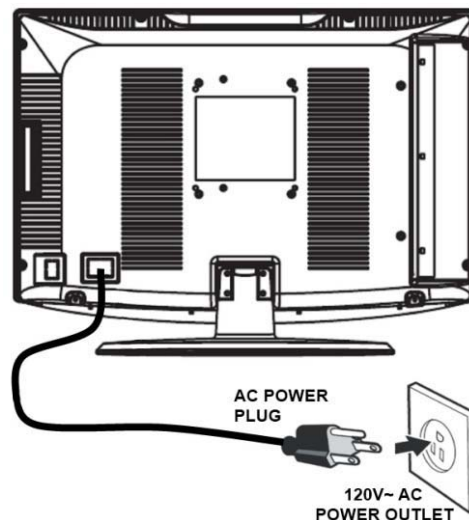


CONNECTING THE TV TO AC POWER

Insert the AC POWER PLUG fully into a household 120V~ 60Hz AC socket outlet. If the power plug is loosened, it could generate electric sparks and cause a fire.

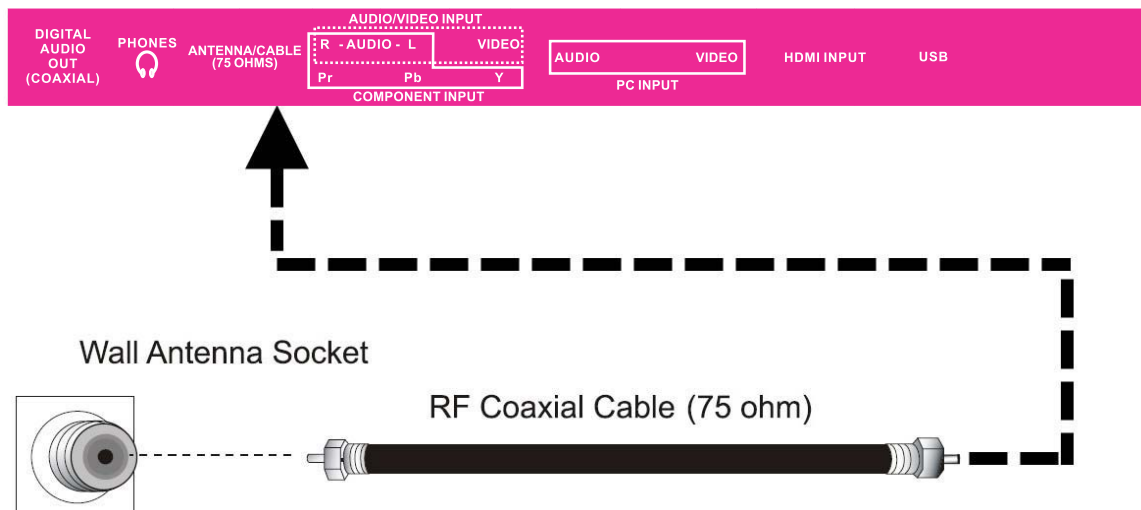
WARNINGS

- Ensure that the AC POWER PLUG is easily accessible.
- Ensure the earth pin on the AC POWER PLUG is securely connected to prevent electric shock.
- Do not touch the AC POWER PLUG with a wet hand to prevent an electric shock.
- Do not change the power cord other than that provided with this TV to prevent fire or electric shock.
- Do not damage the power cord. A damaged cord may cause fire or electric shock.
- Do not move the TV with the cord plugged in the power outlet.
- Do not place a heavy object on the cord or place the cord near a high temperature object.
- Do not twist the cord, bend it excessively or stretch it.
- Do not pull on the cord. Grip the AC POWER PLUG body when disconnecting the power cord.
- Do not use a damaged power plug or AC power outlet.



ANTENNA CONNECTION

INSTALL the unit in a room where direct light will not fall upon the screen. Total darkness or a reflection on the picture screen may cause eyestrain. Soft and indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing.



Optimum reception of color requires a good signal and will generally mean that an outdoor antenna must be used. The exact type and position of the antenna will depend upon your particular area.

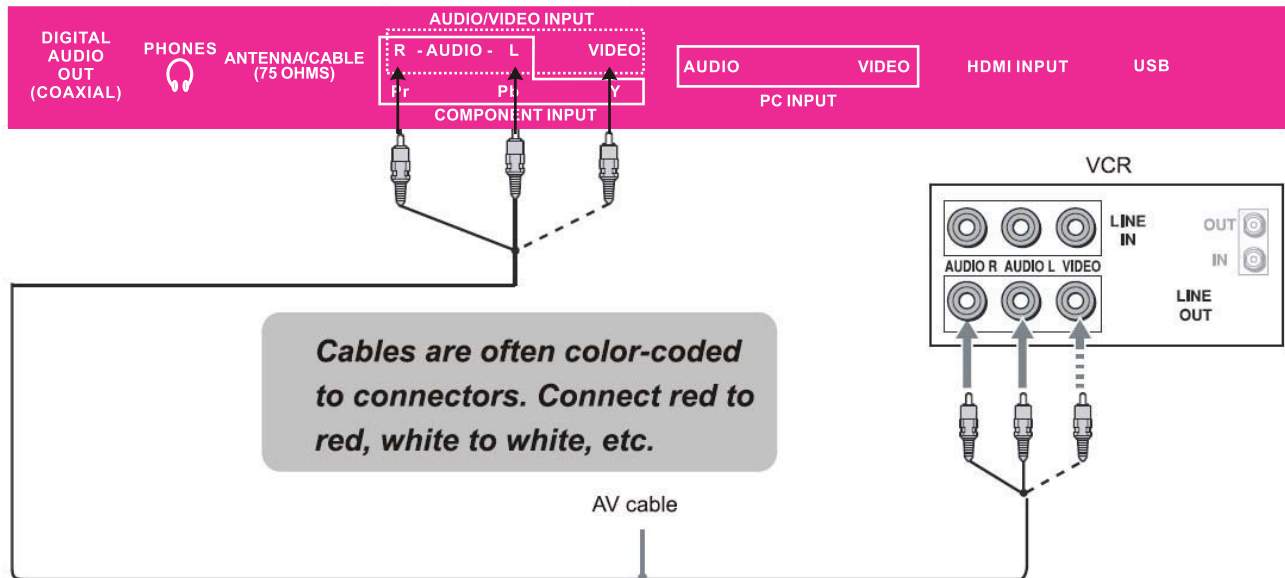
NOTE:

- It is recommended that the 75-ohm coaxial cable be used to eliminate interference and noise which may occur due to radio wave conditions.
- The antenna cable should not be bundled with the power cord and the like.
- If the antenna is not installed properly, contact your dealer for assistance.

CONNECTING TO A DEVICE USING THE COMPOSITE VIDEO AND STEREO AUDIO INPUT TERMINALS

How to connect:

Connect the AUDIO (L/R) and VIDEO jacks on the TV to the corresponding color-coded output jacks on the device, such as a VCR, using a good quality Audio/Video cable (not included) as shown below :



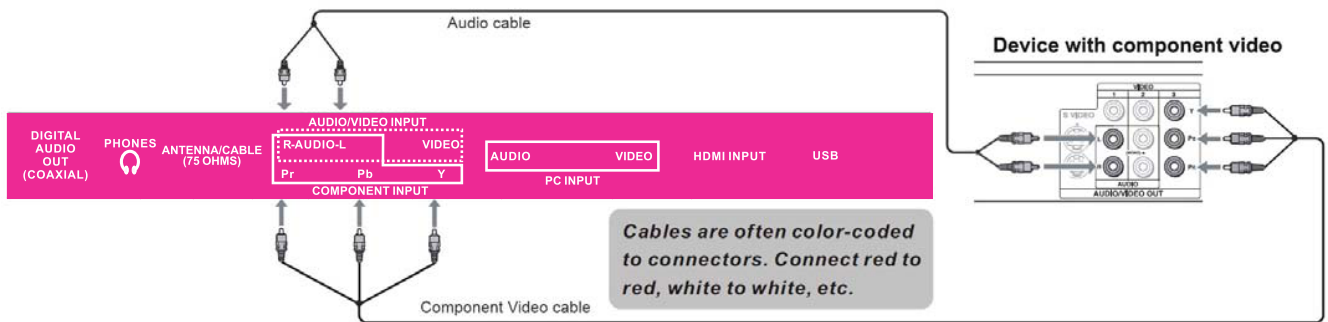
To play the VCR:

1. Turn on your TV, then press SOURCE button. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select AV, then press ENTER to confirm.
3. Turn on your VCR, insert a videotape and press the Play button.

CONNECTING TO A DEVICE USING THE COMPONENT VIDEO AND STEREO AUDIO INPUT TERMINALS

How to connect:

1. Connect the Y, Pb, Pr input jacks on the TV to the corresponding color coded output jacks on the device, such as a DVD player, using a good quality Component Video cable (not included) as shown below.
2. Connect the AUDIO (L/R) input jacks on the TV to the corresponding color coded output jacks on the device using a good quality Audio cable (not included).



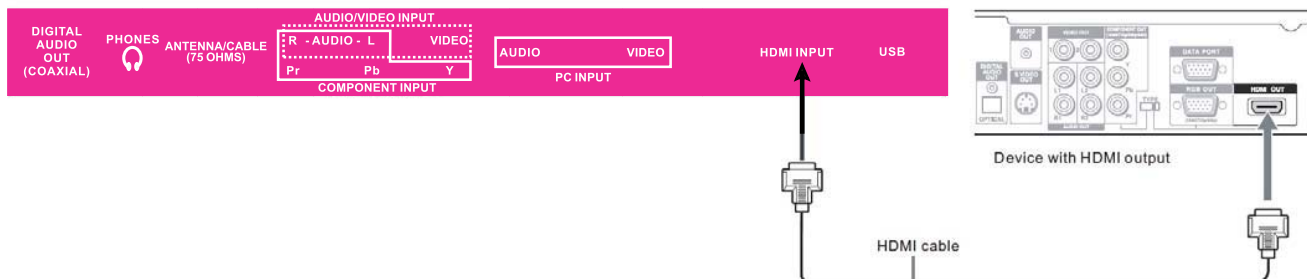
To play component video from a DVD player:

1. Turn on your TV, then press SOURCE button. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Component, then press ENTER to confirm.
3. Turn on your DVD player and set it to the correct video output mode. See the device's user guide for more information.

CONNECTING TO A DEVICE USING THE HDMI INPUT TERMINAL

How to connect:

Connect the HDMI connector on the TV to the HDMI connector on the device, such as a Blu-ray disc player, using a good quality HDMI cable (not included) as shown below :



To play a Bu-ray disc player:

1. Turn on your TV, then press SOURCE button. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select HDMI, then press ENTER to confirm.
3. Turn on your Blu-ray disc player and set it to the correct video output mode. See the device's user guide for more information.

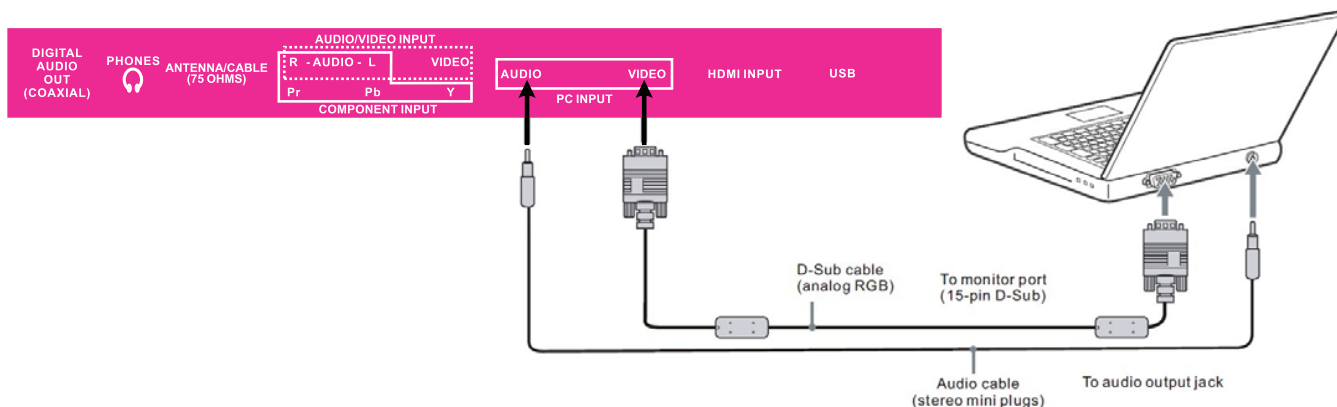
NOTE:

If the external device has DVI output only, use a DVI to HDMI adapter cable (not included) to connect to the HDMI terminal. Connect the audio cable to the PC AUDIO INPUT jack on the TV.

CONNECTING TO A PC USING THE PC VIDEO (VGA) AND PC AUDIO INPUT TERMINALS

How to connect:

1. Connect the PC VIDEO (VGA) connector on the TV to the corresponding VGA connector on the PC using a good quality VGA cable (not included) as shown below.
2. Connect the PC AUDIO input jack on the TV to the corresponding output jack on the PC using a good quality Audio cable with 3.5mm stereo plugs (not included).



To play video from a PC:

1. Turn on your TV, then press SOURCE button. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select VGA, then press ENTER to confirm.
3. Turn on your PC and adjust the display properties as required. Please also see the PC Video Format Table under the DISPLAY MODES section for more information.

CONNECTION TO A HOME THEATER AUDIO SYSTEM

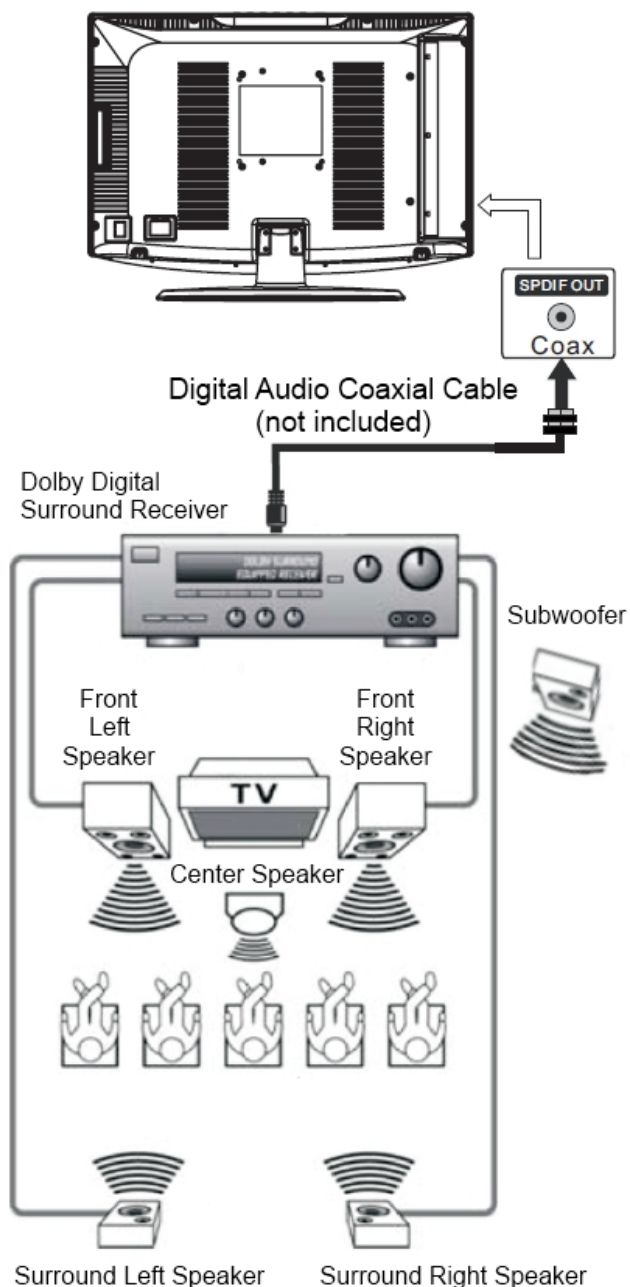

Connecting to a Home Theater System:

Dolby Digital can deliver optimal 2 channel stereo or surround sound with five discrete full range channels plus a sixth channel for a subwoofer.

Enjoy optimal sound reproduction from your system with a Dolby Digital amplifier that incorporates a digital coaxial input. Connect an optional digital cable directly to the television's Coax audio output to listen through all inputs except VGA.

NOTE: The VGA does not support digital audio.

How to Setup Digital Output

Press the MENU button on the remote control.

Press the right ► arrow button to select SOUND.

Press the down ▼ arrow button to highlight SPDIF type right ► Raw or PCM.

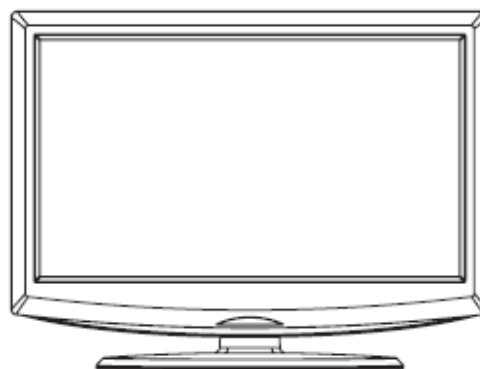


PUTTING THE UNIT ON A PROPER SURFACE

When you turn on your television set for the first time, be sure to place it on a solid stable, surface.

To avoid danger, do not expose the TV to water, or a heat source (i.e. lamp, candle, radiator).

Do not obstruct the ventilation grid at the rear and be sure to leave sufficient gaps around the unit.



TURNING THE TV ON FOR THE FIRST TIME

After you have initially connected your TV antenna or cable, press POWER button to turn the television ON.

A screen will display asking you to run a Channel Auto Scan to search and receive available local digital channels.

It is here where you will select antenna options and run Channel Auto Scan.

Channels will then be stored in the TV tuner.

Press the MENU button on the remote control.
Using the ◀ / ▶ buttons, scroll to highlight channel mode.
Press the ▼ button to highlight AIR/CABLE.



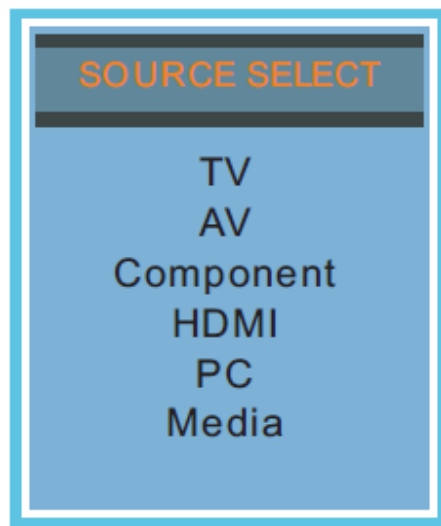
SOURCE SELECT

1. Press the SOURCE button on the remote control.
2. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options: TV, AV, Component, HDMI, PC and Media.
3. Select any of them using the ENTER button and the screen will change to your desired source.

NOTE:

Before attempting to watch TV, please make sure all necessary cables and devices are connected.

If the unit cannot detect a valid video signal on the selected input source, it will return to standby mode automatically in 15 minutes for energy saving.



CHANNEL MENU

Press MENU button to display the main menu.

Press ◀ / ▶ button to select CHANNEL in the main menu. It will highlight the first option.



AIR / CABLE

This feature allows you to switch between air (such as using antenna) and cable.

AUTO SCAN

This feature searches channels automatically for you.

FAVORITES

This feature gives the favorite list of channels added by you.

CHANNEL LIST

This feature shows the list of stored channels.

SHOW / HIDE

This feature tells you if you have chosen for channel to be skipped.

CHANNEL NUMBER

This feature tells you what channel you are currently on.

CHANNEL LABEL

This feature changes the name of the channel.

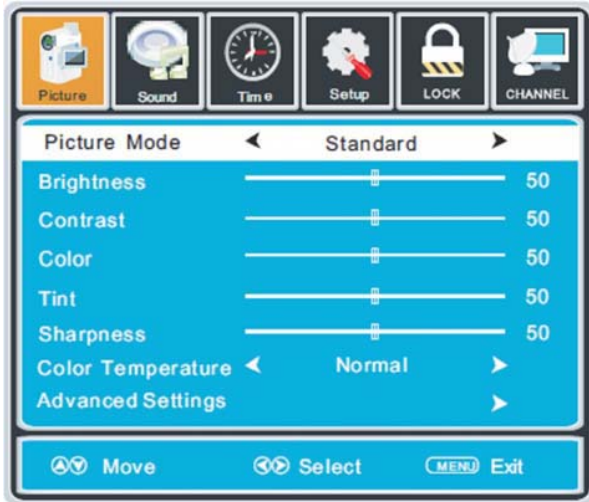
NOTE:

The channel options are only available when you select TV as your SOURCE. When you open the OSD menu on other sources (HDMI, AV, Component, PC, Media) these options will be grayed out.

PICTURE MENU

Press MENU button to display the main menu.

Press ◀ / ▶ button to select PICTURE in the main menu. It will highlight the first option.



PICTURE MODE

This feature changes various color modes for the TV

BRIGHTNESS

This feature changes the picture's detail in dark colors.

CONTRAST

This feature changes the difference between dark and bright objects.

COLOR

This feature changes the amount of color in the picture.

TINT

This feature changes the white balance of the color.

SHARPNESS

This feature changes the picture quality.

COLOR TEMPERATURE

This feature adjusts the color temperature of the TV, giving Warm, Normal, and Cool options.

ADVANCED SETTINGS

(a) ASPECT RATIO

This feature changes the various aspects of the TV's video, giving Wide, Zoom, Cinema and Normal options.

(b) NOISE REDUCTION

This feature reduces general pixilation by blurring them, giving Medium, High, Off and Low options.

(c) DYNAMIC CONTRAST

This feature allows the TV to automatically adjust the contrast of the TV depending on the picture you are viewing.

SOUND MENU

Press MENU button to display the main menu.

Press ◀ / ▶ button to select SOUND in the main menu. It will highlight the first option.



EQUALIZER SETTINGS

This feature enables the internal equalizer of the speakers.

You can adjust the settings individually or use the presets (Standard, Music, Movie, Sports and User).

MTS

This feature adjusts the second audio programming in analog channels, giving Mono, Stereo and SAP options.

AUDIO LANGUAGE

This feature adjusts the digital second audio programming in digital channels.

DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT

This feature adjusts the digital audio output, giving PCM, Raw and Off options.

SURROUND SOUND

This feature adjusts the dimensional surround effect On or Off (for built-in speakers only).

AVL

This feature adjusts the auto volume leveler enabling volume protection from excessively loud commercials.

NOTE:

AUDIO LANGUAGE and MTS are dependent on the broadcasting station's support and are only available under the source TV.

TIME MENU

Press MENU button to display the main menu.

Press ◀ / ▶ button to select TIME in the main menu. It will highlight the first option.



SLEEP TIMER

This timer automatically turns off the TV at the designated time. Options are Off, 5, 10, 15, 30, 60, 90, 120, 180 and 240 minutes.

TIME ZONE

This option adjusts the global time zone for the TV, giving Pacific, Alaska, Hawaii, Samoa, Newfoundland, Atlantic, Eastern, Central and Mountain options.

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

This option toggles the daylight saving time feature On or Off.

TIME FORMAT

This option adjusts the display format for the time. (i.e. Under 24 hour format 1:00PM would display as 13:00).

AUTO CLOCK

This option enables the TV to sync time with the antenna.

(Put it on AUTO if you have an antenna attached to the TV. If you have CABLE or SATELLITE or anything else please make sure AUTO CLOCK is turned off)

CLOCK

This option allows you to adjust the date and time of the TV manually. You need to disable AUTO CLOCK in order to use this function.

NOTE:

The TIME function will keep accurate time only if the TV remained plugged into a live AC power source. If the TV is unplugged or the power strip is turned off, the TV's time may not be accurate. Please set up the correct date and time manually if necessary.

SETUP MENU

Press MENU button to display the main menu. Press ◀ / ▶ button to select SETUP in the main menu, it will highlight the first option.



MENU LANGUAGE

This feature changes the language of the TV's OSD menu, giving English, Français and Español options.

TRANSPARENT

This feature changes the transparency of the menu allowing background TV images to show through, giving 0, 25%, 50%, 75% and 100% options.

OSD TIMEOUT

This feature changes the time which the TV's OSD menu automatically goes off, giving 5, 15, 30, 45 and 60 seconds.

CLOSED CAPTION

This option displays words on the TV, giving optional settings for CC mode, Analog CC and Digital CC.

INPUT LABEL

This option changes the source names to your personal preference.

OTHER SETTINGS

It provides the AUDIO ONLY option which turns off the screen while the audio is still playing.

RESTORE DEFAULT

This option restores all the personal settings in the OSD menu back to the default factory settings.

SETUP WIZARD

This option enables the TV to show you the setup wizard of the TV again.

NOTE:

Closed captioning is only available under AV and TV ports.

Closed captioning depends on your TV program's support. Sometimes due to the TV channel or the signal, closed captioning will not be available.

In the United States, closed captioning under analog signals is CC1 and digital signal is Service1.

LOCK MENU

Press MENU button to display the main menu.

Press ◀ / ▶ button to select LOCK in the main menu. It will highlight the first option.

Press "0000" for the default unlock password.

The Input Block down to Reset RRT options will appear only after the System Lock option is set to On.



CHANGE PASSWORD

This option allows you to change the LOCK menu password.

SYSTEM LOCK

This option enables parental locking and filtering for the TV.

INPUT BLOCK

This option disables the connection ports of your choice, i.e. If the DVD player is connected to HDMI and you use INPUT BLOCK to block HDMI, you will not be able to see anything from HDMI.

US RATING

This option filters US TV programming and movies.

CANADA RATING

This option filters CANADA TV ratings.

RRT SETTING

This feature is a downloadable rating filter based on TV broadcasts. With the transition of TV broadcasts to digital, future changes, and enhancements in how TV shows are rated for content are possible.

RESET RRT

This option resets the RRT5 settings.

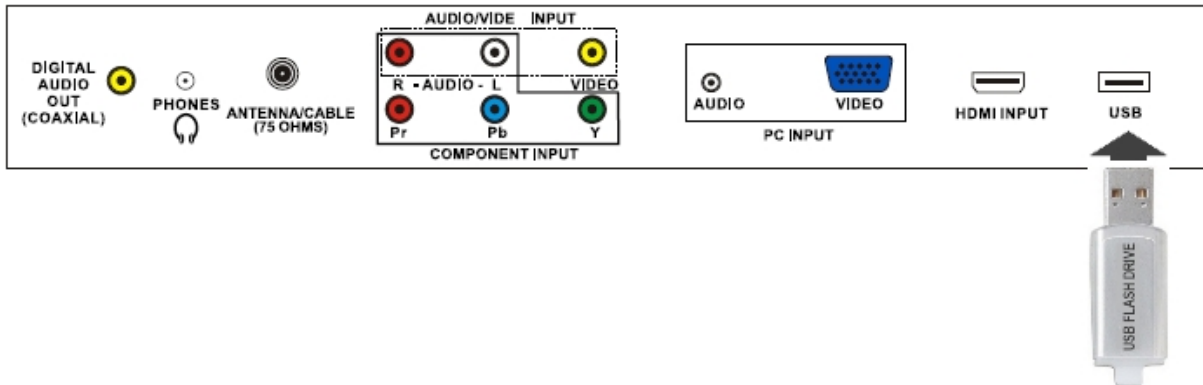

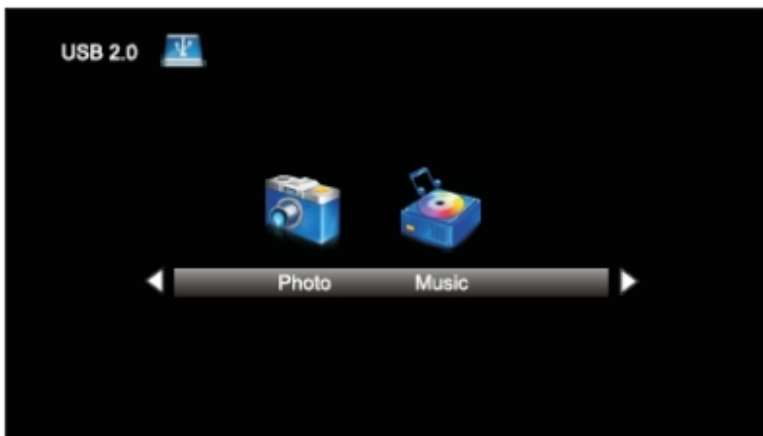
The TV has a USB port on its side panel as shown below.



It can access USB flash drive and display pictures or playback MP3 songs contained in it. Simply connect a USB flash drive to the USB port and press the USB button to start browsing for music and pictures.

Browsing Music and Photo:

In the USB function, select Music or Photo. Use the ▲/▼/◀/▶ button to select the folder or file you want and press the ENTER button to play the file. Use the EXIT button to exit a folder and return to the previous menu.



Technical Limitations:

- The USB port also supports a USB 2.0 SD card reader but does not support a USB hub.
- The USB flash drive supports FAT32 and FAT16 file systems only.
- The biggest file size is 4 GB in FAT32 file system.
- The Photo function only supports JPEG files (baseline only, progressive is not supported).
- The Music function only supports MP3 files having a sampling rate of 32 - 48kHz and data rate of 32 - 320 kbps.
- All USB functions are operated by the remote control. None of the buttons physically located on the TV will respond to USB functions.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Distorted picture when first turning on the power	- May be caused by very short interval of time between the TV being powered OFF. and then ON again. Unplug the power to the TV and then plug in again.
Bad TV Picture (snow, multiple images, distortion, blurry) (For analog TV reception only)	- Check the location of the antenna and adjust if necessary. - Make sure the antenna cable is firmly connected. - Make sure all input cables from all devices are firmly connected.
Only getting black and white picture on the screen	- Check the PICTURE setting within the PICTURE menu. - Make sure the program you are watching is indeed being broadcast in color.
TV is ON and has picture but no sound	- Check to see the volume is not set to "0" and increase the volume to desired level. - Check whether the mute function has been activated. - Check to see that all cables are properly connected.
TV is ON and has picture but sound quality is poor	- Check that all sounds settings are done correctly. - If sound is coming from just one speaker, adjust sound balance control to the center.

V-CHIP TV RATING EXPLANATIONS

US V-Chip TV Rating System:

TV-MA (Mature Audience Only) - Specifically designed to be viewed by adults and may be unsuitable for children under 17. It contains one or more of the following content themes: crude indecent language (L), explicit sexual activity (S), or graphic violence (V).

TV-14 (Parents Strongly Cautioned) - Contains some material that many parents would find unsuitable for children under 14. Parents are strongly urged to exercise greater care in monitoring this program and are cautioned against letting children under the age of 14 watch unattended. This program contains one or more of the following content themes: intensely suggestive dialogue (D), strong coarse language (L), intense sexual situations (S), or intense violence (V).

TV-PG (Parental Guidance Suggested) - Contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. Many parents may want to watch it with their younger children. The program contains one or more of the following content themes: some suggestive dialogue (D), infrequent coarse language (L), some sexual situations (S), or moderate violence (V).

TV-G (General Audience) - Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages. It contains little or no sexual dialogue (D) or situations (S), no strong language (L), and little or no violence (V).

TV-Y7 (Directed to Children 7 years and older) - Designed for children ages 7 and above. It may be more appropriate for children who have acquired the developmental skills needed to distinguish between make believe and reality. Themes and elements in this program may include mild fantasy violence (FV) or comedic violence, or may frighten children under the age of 7.

TV-Y (All Children) - Themes and elements in this program are designed for a young audience, including children ages 2-6. It is not expected to frighten younger children.

Canadian English V-Chip TV Rating System:

18+ (Adult) - Programming intended for adults 18 and older. It may contain elements of violence, language, and sexual content which could make it unsuitable for viewers under 18. Violence Guidelines: May contain violence integral to the development of the plot, character or theme, intended for adult audiences. Other Content Guidelines: May contain graphic language and explicit portrayals of nudity and/or sex.

14+ (Viewer 14 and over) - Programming contains themes or content which may not be suitable for viewers under the age of 14. Parents are strongly cautioned to exercise discretion in permitting viewing by pre-teens and early teens. Violence Guidelines: May contain intense scenes of violence. Could deal with mature themes and societal issues in a realistic fashion. Other Content Guidelines: May contain scenes of nudity and/or sexual activity. There could be frequent use of profanity.

PG (Parental Guidance) - Programming intended for a general audience but which may not be suitable for younger children (under the age of 8). Parents may consider some content inappropriate for unsupervised viewing by children aged 8-13. Violence Guidelines: Depictions of conflict and/or aggression will be limited and moderate; may include physical, fantasy, or supernatural violence. Other Content Guidelines: May contain infrequent mild profanity, or mildly suggestive language. Could also contain brief scenes of nudity.

G (General Audience) - Programming considered acceptable for all ages groups. While not designed specifically for children, it is understood younger viewers may be part of the audience. Violence Guidelines: Will contain very little violence, either physical or verbal or emotional. Will be sensitive to themes which could frighten a younger child, will not depict realistic scenes of violence which minimize or gloss over the effects of violent acts. Other Content Guidelines: There may be some inoffensive slang, no profanity and no nudity.

C8+ (Children 8 and older) - Programming generally considered acceptable for children 8 years and over to watch on their own. Violence Guidelines: Violence will not be portrayed as the preferred, acceptable, or only way to resolve conflict or encourage children to imitate dangerous acts which they may see on television. Any realistic depictions of violence will be infrequent, discreet, of low intensity and will show the consequences of the acts. Other Content Guidelines: There will be no profanity, nudity or sexual content.

C (Children) - Programming intended for children under age 8. Violence Guidelines: Careful attention is paid to themes which could threaten children's sense of security and well being. There will be no realistic scenes of violence. Depictions of aggressive behavior will be infrequent and limited to portrayals that are clearly imaginary, comedic or unrealistic in nature. Other Content Guidelines: There will be no offensive language, nudity or sexual content.

Canadian French V-Chip TV Rating System:

18+ (Adult) - Programming is for adults only. This program contains sustained violence or extremely violent scenes.

16+ (Viewer 16 and over) - Programming is not suitable for those under age 16. This program contains frequent scenes of violence or intensely violent scenes.

13+ (Viewer 13 and over) - Programming may not be suitable for children under the age of 13. This program either contains several violent scenes or one or more scenes that are violent enough to affect them. Viewing in the company of an adult is therefore strongly recommended for children under the age of 13.

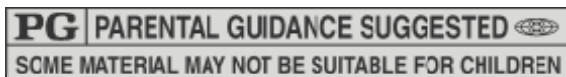
8+ (Viewer 8 and over) - Not recommended for young children. This program is suitable for most audiences, but it contains mild or occasional violence that could upset young children. Viewing in the company of an adult is therefore recommended for young children (under the age of 8) who do not distinguish between reality and imagination.

G (General Audience) - This program is suitable for audiences of all ages. It contains no violence, or any violence that it does contain is either minimal or is presented in a humorous manner, as a caricature, or in an unrealistic way.

MPAA US MOVIE RATING EXPLANATIONS



G — General Audiences. All Ages Admitted. A G-rated motion picture contains nothing in theme, language, nudity, sex, violence or other matters that, in the view of the Rating Board, would offend parents whose younger children view the motion picture. The G rating is not a "certificate of approval," nor does it signify a "children's" motion picture. Some snippets of language may go beyond polite conversation but they are common everyday expressions. No stronger words are present in G-rated motion pictures. Depictions of violence are minimal. No nudity, sex scenes or drug use are present in the motion picture.



PG — Parental Guidance Suggested. Some Material May Not Be Suitable For Children. A PG-rated motion picture should be investigated by parents before they let their younger children attend. The PG rating indicates, in the view of the Rating Board, that parents may consider some material unsuitable for their children, and parents should make that decision. The more mature themes in some PG-rated motion pictures may call for parental guidance. There may be some profanity and some depictions of violence or brief nudity. But these elements are not deemed so intense as to require that parents be strongly cautioned beyond the suggestion of parental guidance. There is no drug use content in a PG-rated motion picture.



PG-13 — Parents Strongly Cautioned. Some Material May Be Inappropriate For Children Under 13. A PG-13 rating is a sterner warning by the Rating Board to parents to determine whether their children under age 13 should view the motion picture, as some material might not be suited for them. A PG-13 motion picture may go beyond the PG rating in theme, violence, nudity, sensuality, language, adult activities or other elements, but does not reach the restricted R category. The theme of the motion picture by itself will not result in a rating greater than PG-13, although depictions of activities related to a mature theme may result in a restricted rating for the motion picture. Any drug use will initially require at least a PG-13 rating. More than brief nudity will require at least a PG-13 rating, but such nudity in a PG-13 rated motion picture generally will not be sexually oriented. There may be depictions of violence in a PG-13 movie, but generally not both realistic and extreme or persistent violence. A motion picture's single use of one of the harsher sexually-derived words, though only as an expletive, initially requires at least a PG-13 rating. More than one such expletive requires an R rating, as must even one of those words used in a sexual context. The Rating Board nevertheless may rate such a motion picture PG-13 if, based on a special vote by a two-thirds majority, the Raters feel that most American parents would believe that a PG-13 rating is appropriate because of the context or manner in which the words are used or because the use of those words in the motion picture is inconspicuous.



R — Restricted. Children Under 17 Require Accompanying Parent or Adult Guardian. An R-rated motion picture, in the view of the Rating Board, contains

some adult material. An R-rated motion picture may include adult themes, adult activity, hard language, intense or persistent violence, sexually-oriented nudity, drug abuse or other elements, so that parents are counseled to take this rating very seriously. Children under 17 are not allowed to attend R-rated motion pictures unaccompanied by a parent or adult guardian. Parents are strongly urged to find out more about R-rated motion pictures in determining their suitability for their children. Generally, it is not appropriate for parents to bring their young children with them to R-rated motion pictures.



■ **NC-17 — No One 17 and Under Admitted.** An NC-17 rated motion picture is one that, in the view of the Rating Board, most parents would consider patently too adult for their children 17 and under. No children will be admitted. NC-17 does not mean "obscene" or "pornographic" in the common or legal meaning of those words, and should not be construed as a negative judgment in any sense. The rating simply signals that the content is appropriate only for an adult audience. An NC-17 rating can be based on violence, sex, aberrational behavior, drug abuse or any other element that most parents would consider too strong and therefore off-limits for viewing by their children

X – Matured Audience Only. (non MPAA rating) Only adults are allowed to watch these motion pictures.

GLOSSARY

Aspect Ratio

The ratio between the width and height of the TV picture on the screen. In a normal TV set, the aspect ratio is 4 to 3 (4:3). The new aspect ratio in HDTV is 16:9 which resembles the aspect ratio in a movie theatre (Widescreen). New TV systems support both 4:3 and 16:9 aspect ratio and can automatically switch between them.

ATSC (Advanced Television Systems Committee)

Formed to establish technical standards for advanced television systems, including digital high definition television (HDTV).

Audio/Video (A/V)

A term often used when discussing a channel on a TV receiver or on video equipment, which has been especially designed to accept audio-video signals. This channel automatically activates special circuitry within the TV set to prevent picture distortion and skewing. It is also used for audio-video processors, which handle both types of signals.

Component Video Input (Y Pb Pr)

Component Video Input is a type of connection that uses a cinch-type connector to allow set top boxes or analog DVD players to connect a signal to the TV. By offering the cinch-type input (Y Pb Pr) the primary colors, red, green and blue are connected from a cable box directly into the TV allowing for the signal to display on the screen.

CVBS (Composite Video Baseband Signal)

In broadcast television this refers to the video signal, including the color information and syncs.

Digital Tuner

A digital tuner serves as the decoder required to receive and display digital broadcasts. It can be included inside TV sets or via a cable box.

DOLBY Digital

The system developed by Dolby Laboratories to compress digital sound. It offers stereo sound (2 channel) or multi-channel audio (the six-channel digital audio standard that is part of the U.S. digital television standard; also called AC-3 or Digital 5.1). The channels consist of front left, front right, front center, surround or rear left, surround or rear right, and a separate subwoofer.

DTV (Digital television)

Generic term that refers to all digital television formats, including high-definition television (HDTV) and standard-definition television (SDTV).

HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface)

Interface that supports all uncompressed, digital audio / video formats including a cable box, Blu-ray / DVD recorder or digital television, over a single cable.

HDTV

The generally agreed upon definition of HDTV is approximately twice the vertical and horizontal picture resolution of today's NTSC TV, which essentially makes the picture twice as sharp. NTSC (National Television System Committee)

The organization that developed the analog television standard currently in use in the U.S., Canada, and Japan. Now generally used to refer to that standard. The NTSC standard combines blue, red, and green signals modulated as an AM signal with an FM signal for audio.

Progressive Scan

In Progressive Scanning all the horizontal scan lines are scanned on to the screen at one time. The Digital TV and HDTV Standards accept both Interlaced Scan and Progressive Scan broadcast and display methods.

Resolution

A measurement of the finest (smallest) detail that is visible in a video image. TV resolution may be expressed as number of pixels in an image, or more commonly, as total number of horizontally scanned lines used to create the image.
