

Irish Mule



Ingredients:

2 ounces irish whiskey 6 ounces ginger beer Juice of half a lime Lime slices Mint sprigs



Just in time for St. Patrick's Day! Forget the *Moscow Mule* and ease into something that oozes a bit more of the luck o' the Irish (and certainly more character than plain ol' vodka)... *The Irish Mule!*

Method: Fill a copper mug (or other glass) with ice. Pour in whiskey and lime juice, top with ginger beer. Stir, then garnish with lime wedges and fresh mint sprigs. Enjoy. Repeat.

LDLP Recipe of the Month

Tina's Famous Slow-Cooked Baby Back Ribs

From LDLP's very own Assistant Manager "Tina"

RUB ingredients: 2 TBSP crushed black pepper

2 TBSP garlic powder

2 TBSP kosher salt

2 TBSP paprika

1 TBSP onion powder

1 TBSP ground coriander

1 TBSP dried dill weed

1 TBSP crushed red pepper flakes

SAUCE ingredients:

1 cup water

5 TBSP brown sugar

1/4 cup soy sauce

1 TBSP garlic powder

1 TSP minced fresh ginger

2 TBSP cornstarch



METHOD:

Combine all ingredients for the SAUCE; whisk over high heat until combined and thickened; put aside for later.

Combine all ingredients for the RUB and rub all of it over the ribs then grill on lowest setting for 90 minutes. At that point, baste the ribs with the SAUCE and continue grilling on lowest setting for another 30 minutes or until absorbed.

Take off heat. Rest for 10 minutes. Eat. Repeat. Repeat. Repeat.

*PRO TIP: Tina suggests a grilling mat, as it allows control of flames and minimizes the risk of burning the rib meat.




Safety Committee Report

This has been a busy month. The Safety Committee is preparing a packet for each residence in Laguna de la Paz which will include a door hanger to inform committee searchers of how you are doing after a quake, instructions on how to assemble an emergency supply kit, what to do before/during/after a major earthquake, a magnetic *File of Life* pouch to attach to your refrigerator with medical and contact information in case you need medical help, and FEMA information. These will be distributed in March.

We now have our primer, paint, and thermal additive ordered for the exterior of the container. After rust abatement, we will start the painting. We will be installing two ventilation turbines, a portable A/C, finish organizing our supplies, and setting up procedures for the operation of LDLP earthquake response. LDLP's **Wine Geek** saw Tina's *Famous Baby Back Ribs* with the dry rub and teriyaki sauce and immediately thought of a Malbec blend. Malbec blends scream out to be drunk with barbecued ribs or any grilled meat. Always a deep violet with red and black fruit on the nose, this Malbec also presents wet earth, mushrooms, and moist forest floor on the nose, with sweet cassis and violet flowers jumping around as well. Palate is the same and treats you with a very long finish. Full of fruit but definitely not sweet. Bonus: the grapes are organically grown.

Meet Your Neighbor, Retired USAF Lt. Colonel and College Professor, Dr. Tony Ortega

A resident of LDLP since 1999, Tony Ortega is just getting started with his adventures in life! In 1952, at 21 years of age, Tony was placed in charge of a nine-megaton bomb aboard a B-47 Stratojet Bomber, and there he served the United States Air Force for over 20 years including a tour in Vietnam and serving at Strategic Air Command aboard the EC-135 "Looking Glass," an airborne command base. After earning a doctorate in philosophy (1976), he worked in Argentina from 1979-1982 helping the government with air defense systems. Then he landed at Rockwell (1982) and helped design, build, and deliver 100 B-1B "Lancers." The Lancer is a supersonic variable-sweep wing heavy bomber used by the USAF, and is commonly known as "The Bone." Tony helped design the avionics of the plane, which lower the "radar cross section" to such a degree that the plane is nearly considered a "stealth" plane. As he explained, "We created a skin of the plane so that it absorbs energy, helping to evade radar detection." After Rockwell, he taught business administration at California State University, Bakersfield, retiring in 1999. Most afternoons, Tony and his wife of 41 years, Janet, can be found sipping wine and watching the sun set over the mountains. PAGE 19

FIVE MORE MINUTES WITH MAX: GUIDE DOG OF THE DESERT PUPPY-IN-TRAINING



Our LDLP *Dog of the Month* (featured on page 2) is a "Guide Dog of the Desert Puppy-in-Training." Guide Dogs of the Desert provides mobility, companionship and independence for the blind with custom-trained guide dogs like Max. Blindness is a disability that can strike anyone at any moment, with devastating results. Blindness can happen at birth, from an accident, complications associated with aging, coronary disease, diabetes, glaucoma, and macular degeneration.

Not all dogs can be Guide Dogs. Currently, only Labrador retrievers and standard poodles are eligible; they are selected between 8-12 weeks of age, placed in their new homes to learn about the world and bond with humans. The whole family commits to the puppy until he/she is 18-24 months of age. The goal is to socialize the puppy into an easy-to-manage dog that can demonstrate excellent behavior in places of public accommodations and in the home. 
Before & After - One Resident's Front Yard Landscape Makeover

We'd thought about updating our front yard for three years. We love the lush greenness and color of LDLP and wanted a "pop" of desert-scape against the house to complement the community's winding lawns and flower beds. We also wanted to add the convenience of a concrete walkway from the driveway to the back patio.

Inspiration for the front yard design was only a few doors away, at the home of Dena Priser. It was featured in last month's *The Breeze*. We relied on LDLP's catalog of approved plants, which features plants that are compatible with LDLP's architecture while also being low maintenance, drought-tolerant hardy. After receiving approvals from the Architecture Committee for the walkway and the Landscape Committee for the plants, work proceeded smoothly. We now have a smooth, firm walkway to the backyard and fresh, bright plantings with lots of room to grow for many years. Onto the next project - updating the showers!




