ANZAC Day

Thanks to the wonderfully supportive parents in our community who enabled their children to participate in the ANZAC Day Dawn Service at Cotton Tree and/or the parade at Buderim on Monday. What an honour it was to join together to acknowledge those who have served for the protection and freedom of our wonderful nation. In particular, our senior students proudly held the flag for which our forebearers gallantly fought under.

Australian Government Assistance for National Capital excursion.

As noted in my previous newsletter, our Year 6 students visited Canberra from 17-22 April for an educational tour of the nation's capital. While they were on this tour they participated in a variety of programs focused on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit their National Capital as part of their civics and citizenship education. To assist our parents in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program.

We thank the Australian Government for their support of this program.

Winter Uniform

The higher than average temperatures have finally come to an end and I remind all families that we transitioned to the winter uniform yesterday, Tuesday, 26 April. Secondary School boys will be in ties,

with boys in Years 10-12 in trousers. All students in Years 10-12 are to wear blazers to and from the College and through the day as required (dependent on temperatures.) Students of all year levels are to wear the College jumper as deemed necessary. Girls may wear navy stockings/tights (no other colour is permitted.) Please note that tracksuit tops are not to be mixed with the day uniform. Of course, hats remain a high priority.

Quality Schools Survey

The Quality Schools Survey will be distributed to our staff, parents and students from Years 5-12 from tomorrow (28 April), and will be open until 24 May 2016. The survey is conducted by LEA in partnership with Research Australia Development and Innovation Institute (RADII) and focuses on the ongoing development, support and growth of school communities. The analysis of the data collected through this project will inform the continual improvement of Lutheran schools by:

- assisting each Lutheran school in its understanding of the experience of staff, students and parents in their learning communities
- providing data for schools so that a school improvement plan can be developed and reviewed
- assisting and shaping the future directions of Lutheran education
- ensuring that genuine school improvement strategies address external accountabilities

Please note that this survey is not a comparative tool to be used between and across schools and is not a staff appraisal tool.

NAPLAN Testing

Most people would be aware that students across Australia in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are sitting a series of national tests from Tuesday to Thursday of Week 5 (10-12 May). As an educational leader, I have no difficulty in recognising the validity of using such tools for targeted diagnosis for individual students and, if trends appear over a minimum of three years, an argument for systemic or localised change. However, as a 'National Test', the process remains flawed as there is still no common starting age for Year 1 across Australia, coupled with the highly contestable composition of the actual test instruments, based on a "one size fits all" model.

Assessing student progress is critical in the context of a broad-based curriculum. Equally important though are the 'intangibles' which were in evidence recently in the many students who marched in the Buderim ANZAC Day Parade to support their local community, as well as those who have served, and continue to serve, our country. Our Year 12 students will have an opportunity to demonstrate their social ease when they gather with staff on Friday, 13 May for the annual May Dinner. Such non-academic pursuits are an integral part of the holistic development of our students.

Spirit of Restlessness

“The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.”

John 3, 8

How does wind affect you?

Sometimes I enjoy taking a walk on the beach when it's windy and feel invigorated by the experience, as though all cobwebs have been cleared from my head.

But I must confess that there are other times when windy days make me restless and uncomfortable. Being outside is strenuous rather than refreshing; and I feel myself getting out of sorts.

Today was such a day.

Then the words came to me *“The Holy Spirit goes where it will. It rides the wind like a dove and is invisible like the scent of oil...”*

Of course!

God's Spirit blows us awake, stirs us out of cosiness to (possibly) move us into uncomfortable situations. The Spirit calls us to action, whipping our hair into our eyes, sending wind chimes into a frenzy and leaves onto just cleaned verandas: “Be alert! Rethink! Gain a new perspective!”

If we are to follow Jesus on the way to building God's Kingdom, we need the Spirit of Restlessness to keep us from settling too comfortably into conventional ways.

May the spirited windy days of this week prompt us to find new avenues to further God's radical love in our community.

I recently got lost in the New Zealand bush. Not desperately lost, but certainly enough to become panicked as the light faded, my phone battery waned and I realised that no one knew where I was. Rather than returning the way I had entered, I had followed a hunch that the track made a circle and would come out closer to where I wanted to be.

Many times on my walk (which became a run as the sun began to set) the path tilted steeply down to a creek and stopped. It was only after searching frantically for precious minutes that I was able to find the path again on the other side. I zig zagged my way across the creek multiple times in this fashion until eventually, leg muscles and heart pounding, the bush spat me out onto a road.

Much later, I consulted a map (yes, I do realise this is not the smartest order of things). My initial hunch had been correct - the path did make a circle. In my panic I had missed the exit and taken the scenic route (note to self: 'scenic' mostly applies to daylight hours) an extra couple

of kilometres, over steep ground, and in and out of the creek.

I had started my journey calmly, content to trust my 'gut'. As I became panicked, I crashed about with decreasingly effective outcome. Loops of anxiety caused me to lose touch with my intuition. Had I stayed connected with my hunch, I may have held a steadier course.

Our gut feelings remain our first, and often clearest guides to life. Maintaining an ability to read these visceral responses can see us spending less time feeling lost.
