

You can set up the unit into an economic power save mode.

In power-on status, press and hold [  $\mbox{\mbox{$\circlearrowleft$}}$  ] for about 3 seconds.

- A Dual Disc is a two-sided disc combining a DVD side according to the DVD standard and a music side. The video content recorded on the DVD side can be played back. As the music side is not compatible with the Compact Disc (CD) standard, playback on this unit is not assured.
- This unit can play back DVD-R and DVD-RW discs recorded in the DVD VIDEO format and DVD+R and DVD+RW discs, but depending on the recording unit, the disc manufacturer, etc., playback sometimes may not be possible.
- This unit may also be incapable of playing certain CD-R/RW discs depending on their properties, recording conditions, etc.
- This player cannot play back discs compatible with CPRM. CPRM is the abbreviation of Content Protection for Recordable Media, and it is a technique for copyright protection for recording media.






#### Attaching the speakers to the unit

#### Connect the wires to the unit.

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminal. The connector will open ready to receive a cable. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.



Connect the red end of each wire to the terminals marked +(plus) and the black end to the terminals marked - (minus).



#### **CAUTION**

Be sure to adhere to the following, or proper ventilation will be blocked causing damage or fire hazard.

- Do not place any objects impairing heat radiation onto the top of the unit.
- Leave some space around the unit (from the largest outside dimension including projection) equal to or greater than, shown below.

#### **Remote control Battery Installation**

Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert two R03 (size AAA) batteries with  $\oplus$  and  $\bigcirc$  aligned correctly. Do not mix old and new batteries. Never mix different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).







[Panscan]: This fills the entire 4:3 screen, cropping the picture as necessary.

**Progressive Scan** – Progressive Scan Video provides the high quality pictures with less flickering. If you are using the Component Video jacks for connection to a TV or monitor that is compatible with a progressive scan signal, set [Progressive Scan] to [On].

Press [SELECT/ENTER] to comfirm your selection.

- If you not press  $\mbox{\bf [ENTER]}$  within 10 seconds it will be [OFF].

- If you have no progressive scan TV, in the state progressive scan [On] will not appear the screen. If you set Progressive Scan to [On] in error, press and hold [II] key for about 3 seconds. Set Progressive Scan to [Off].

**DRC (Dynamic Range Control) DVD** – Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [On] for this effect.

**Vocal** DVD – Select [On] to mix karaoke channels into normal stereo. This function is effective for multi-channel karaoke DVDs only.

#### **LOCK**



To access the lock options, you must enter the 4-digit password. If you have not yet entered a password you are prompted to do so. Enter a 4-digit password.

Enter it again to verify. If you make a mistake while entering number, press **[CLEAR]** to delete numbers then correct it. If you forget your password you can reset it. Press **[SETUP]** and Input "210499".

The password has now been cleared.

Rating DVD – Select a rating level. The lower the level, the stricter the rating. Select [UNLOCK] to deactivate the rating.







#### **Handling precautions**

Hold a disc taking care not to touch the played surface.

#### Notes on CD-R/CD-RW discs

If the CD-R or CD-RW disc in use has a printable label surface, the disc may be unable to be taken out of the system due to sticking of the label surface. To prevent malfunction of the system, do not use such a disc.

#### Cautions on discs

The disc rotates at a high speed during playback. Never use a cracked, chipped or greatly warped disc. Otherwise, damage or malfunction of the player may result.

Also, do not use a disc with a non-circular shape as this may result in malfunction.

#### **Handling of disc**

#### Care and storage of main unit

#### ■ Do not place in the following locations.

- Place exposed to direct sunlight.
- Place subjected to excessive humidity or dirt
- Place exposed to direct heat from heating equipment.

#### ■ Be careful against condensation

When the difference in temperatures between the main unit and the environmental air is large, dew may be condensed inside the main unit and may cause malfunction of the main unit. If this happens, leave the main unit for a few hours until its internal mechanisms are dried up.

Take special care against condensation when the main unit is moved between places with a large temperature difference or into a room with high humidity.

#### ■ When a main unit becomes dirty

When the front panel or case gets dirty, wipe with a soft dry cloth. Do not use lacquer thinner, benzine, alcohol or contact revitalizer for these chemicals will cause discoloration or deformation.

#### Care and storage of disc

#### **Resetting the Microcomputer**

With the unit turned on, press and hold both the [**m** (STOP)] button on the main unit and the "0" button on the remote control unit simultaneously for more than 3 seconds.
