## INDON MONTHLY RESYGLE FACTS



July: Styrofoam has a recycle symbol on it. Why can't I recycle it?

Have you ever wondered why Styrofoam is on the "Do Not Recycle" list when it comes to commingled

recycling? There is a lot of Styrofoam out there after all, and it even has a recycle symbol on the bottom! It takes specialized machinery to heat Styrofoam enough to break it down into a reusable form. It would have to be shipped several states away in order to process it. This is believed to do more harm to the environment than good. Make sure to throw away Styrofoam material and use alternative material when possible!

### **Public Works Pointers**

As a reminder, when fertilizing your lawns, please sweep the excess off the sidewalks and back on to the lawn. Fertilizer and pesticides go down our storm drains and harm the fish and aquatic life. It's easy to over fertilize, so please follow manufacturer's instructions. And please don't dump any landscaping material into the street as it clogs up the storm drains.

Also remember in order to conserve our limited water resources, we do require outdoor watering to take place between the hours of 6 pm and 10 am. Thank you for observing these watering hours, and remember to turn off your sprinklers if it's raining! Also, in order to prevent flooding, please make sure that our storm drains are kept free from debris.

### FIREWORKS DISCHARGE RESTRICTIONS

Because of a result of extreme fire danger along our mountain interface and our west wetland area, Lindon City has a permanent fireworks and open fire restriction in place. These

areas include all land west of Interstate 15 within the Lindon City limits, including the Lindon Marina. This also includes all "Undeveloped Land" within the City Limits as well as all City Parks. Restriction warning signs



will be posted near the border of restricted areas. Please help us all to be safe and to protect our beautiful natural environment and watershed. Please reference the maps below for exact boundaries. Fireworks are not allowed in all Lindon City Parks (signs will be posted)!
