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1 Introduction

2.2 Installation

Open your DVD drive and insert the *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* DVD. Close the drive. If “Autoplay” is activated on your computer, the setup assistant will start automatically. If you haven’t activated “Autoplay”, you can open the content of the DVD by opening “My Computer” or “Windows Explorer” and doubleclicking the DVD icon. Then doubleclick on the file named “SpellForce2SW-Setup.exe” to start the setup assistant.

Now follow the instructions on the screen in order to install *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*.

2.3 Start of Game

After the installation there are the following possibilities to start the game:

- Doubleclick on the “SpellForce 2” shortcut on your desktop.
- Click on the “Start” button, go to the “Programs” folder, “SpellForce” and “SpellForce 2”. Then click on the “SpellForce 2” icon.

- Open “Windows Explorer” or “My Computer” and go to the folder “SpellForce 2”. Then click on the “SpellForce 2” icon.

After a few seconds the game will be loaded. You are then asked to enter your DVD key that you can find either on the backside of this manual or on the DVD package. Entering the key takes you to the main menu.

3 Game Play

Welcome to the world of *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*! You will meet humans, dwarves, elves, orcs, trolls, barbarians, dark elves, gargoyles, shadows and other creatures. You will build and destroy settlements and send troops into the battle against the evil. You will learn to employ magical powers. You will find new friends – and new enemies.

This manual will help you find your ways around *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*. It explains the different actions you can take and how to use them in the game.

In the following we always refer to the left button of your mouse, when we use the terms “click” and “doubleclick”. If the right mouse button is being used, it will be explicitly mentioned in the text.

If during the game you are uncertain which action is triggered by a certain button, just hover over it with the mouse pointer and a text appears explaining the functions of the respective button.

4 First Steps

The quickest way to learn all about *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* is to play it. *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* contains a tutorial with all the necessary information.

To play the tutorial, start *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* as described in section 2.3.

After you have started the game, you get to the main menu. Click on “Single Player” and then on “Campaign”.

Now you can choose which avatar (your representation in the game) you want to play.





Click on “Male” or “Female” in order to set the gender of your avatar. With the help of the little arrows to the left and right of the word “Head” you can choose from the different heads available for your avatar. Now enter a name for your avatar in the field “Name” and then press the “Start Game” button.

Just follow the instructions of the game and you will learn everything you need to know about the navigation of *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*.

5 Game Modes

SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars offers three different game modes: The Single Player Campaign, as well as the Free Game and the Skirmish Mode. These different modes will be explained in more detail in the following chapter.

5.1 The Single Player Campaign

Here you can experience the story of *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* in an epic campaign. You create an avatar (your representation in the game), with whom you will live through many adventures.

5.1.1 Start a New Campaign

To start a single player campaign, first choose the button “Single Player” in the main menu and then the button “Campaign”.

In case you have already started the campaign, click on the “New” button.

Now you can choose which avatar (your representation in the game) you want to play. Click on “Male” or “Female” to set the gender of your avatar. With the help of the arrows to the left and right of the word “Head” you can choose the head of your avatar then enter a name for him / her in the field “Name”.

On the right side of the screen you can set the difficulty level for the campaign as well as the settings for the tutorial.

If you don't need any explanations on how to play *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*, switch the tutorial switch to “Off”. When playing *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* for the first time, we recommend however to have the tutorial switched on, even when you have already played previous versions like *SpellForce – The Order of Dawn*. The tutorial also contains important information about the numerous improvements in *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*.

Press “Start Game”, as soon as you have chosen all the settings.

5.1.2 Continue a Campaign

If you have already started a campaign, you can continue in two different ways.

You can either click on “Continue Campaign” in the main menu directly and the latest savegame of the campaign will automatically be loaded. But you can also load a different savegame instead or change to another avatar. To do that, click on “Single Player” and “Campaign” in the main menu. If you already have savegames for different avatars, you can choose the avatar you want with the help of the arrows underneath the avatar portrait. On the right side of the screen you can then choose the savegame of the respective avatar.





Press “Start Game” to load the selected savegame.

5.2 *Free Game*

In this mode you can either have your avatar experience numerous adventures on your own or join together with up to two other players. Though there is a campaign story in the free game where the main goal is to develop your avatar to become as powerful as possible. Learning new skills and gathering items are vital in this mode.

5.2.1 **Start a Free Game**

If you want to try this mode on your own, click on „Single Player“ in the main menu and then on „Free Game“.

Now choose the gender and the appearance of your avatar for the Free Game and choose a map you want to play. In the field “Faction” you can also set the faction you want to play with on the selected map.

In the Free Game you can play the maps in any order you like. However each map is based on the level range it is designed for. In case your avatar

does not have the right level, this map might be too easy or too difficult for you to play. Your avatar's current level is displayed underneath the avatar portrait.

We recommend to start playing the “Westguard” map first. There you will get loads of information and quests that will come in handy on other maps.

Click on “Start Game” to load the selected map.

5.2.2 Continue a Free Game

Contrary to the single player campaign you cannot save in the Free Game. The avatar will however be automatically saved when you leave the map. How you leave the map does not matter: Be it by victory, defeat or just by quitting the game.

Even if you have been defeated on a map, you won't have any disadvantages. Your avatar is always alive at the end of a map and keeps all the items and experience points gathered in the meantime.

To continue playing with an already existing avatar, click on “Single Player” in the main menu and on “Free Game”. Now pick the avatar you want with the arrow buttons, select a map you want to explore and click on “Start Game”.

5.2.3 Free Game with Several Players

Section 8 “Playing on the Internet” and section 9 “Playing on LAN” explain how to start a game in the internet or LAN, or how to join such a game respectively.

Keep the following special features in mind when you are playing a Free Game with several players:

- When a player picks up an item, the team members will receive the same item too.
- When a quest is completed, **only** the players that have accepted the quest before, will also get the accompanying reward.
- The more team members are on a map, the more numerous and powerful the enemies will be.



5.3 Skirmish Mode

In this mode you can either play against the computer or against your friends on the internet or LAN. The goal is to destroy the opponent's base and units. You can either use the default avatars or avatars you created in the Free Game mode, as long as they have already reached the highest level (level 30).

5.3.1 Special Rules for Skirmishes

Skirmishes greatly differ from the single player campaign and the Free Game:

- A player has lost, when he /she has no buildings, no avatar, no heroes and no titan any more.
- The avatar and the heroes are not on the map right from the start. To call them to your side, an "Altar of Life" has to be built first. Only in this building the heroes and the avatar can be called upon in exchange for resources.
- When an avatar or hero dies, he or she can be brought back to live by other heroes/ avatars, provided there is no enemy in the vicinity. The game is not lost, if the avatar / hero has not been brought back to live in the given time limit. To call upon the hero /avatar again, resources have to be offered at an "Altar of Life" however.

5.3.2 Start a Skirmish against the Computer

To start a skirmish choose the button "Single Player" in the main menu and then click on the button "Skirmish".

To select a default avatar, click on "Templates" and choose the template you want with the arrow buttons underneath the avatar portrait. To select one of your own avatars, click on "Avatars" and use the arrow buttons.

Choose the map you want to play on and click "OK". Note that the different battlemaps allow a different maximum number of opponents.

Next you get to the battle preparation screen.

You can now choose a faction and specifically assign factions to the computer opponent or the factions will be chosen at random.



To reduce the number of computer opponents, you can set the entry for the respective computer opponents in the column “Players” to “Closed”.

Click on “Start Game” to start the skirmish.

5.3.3 Skirmishes with Several Players

Section 8 “Playing on the Internet” and section 9 “Playing on LAN” explain how to start a game on the internet or LAN, or how to join such a game respectively.

6 Game Navigation

This paragraph provides information on the advanced features of *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars*. To get the basic information on the navigation, please play the tutorial first. See also section 4, “First Steps.”



6.1 Main Navigation Elements

Equipment Window

Here you can equip the avatar and heroes with different items, select currently active spells and learn skills.

Quest Book

Contains detailed information on open and completed main and side quests.

Teleporter

Here you can send the avatar from any place to your activated journey stones, even when they're on different maps.

Click&Fight Actions

When a character or building is selected, here you can see the different actions the avatar or the heroes can apply to this object (spells, special skills).

Behaviour of the Units

- Hold position
- Follow
- Patrol (selected units patrol between the marked waypoints)
- Scout
- Storm (attack each opponent on the way)

Detail View

Shows the selected units or objects, allows subselections and gives detailed information.

Select idle workers

Produce military units

Produce workers

Produce titans

Produce workers for certain raw materials.
When produced these workers look for the raw materials on their own and start gathering



Resources

Stone, Silver, Lenya

Groups

Here groups defined by the player are displayed. Click&Fight also works here.

Current number of military units and current unit limit.

Current number of workers

Time of Day

Menu

Save, Load, Options...

Level-up

When the avatar or the heroes have risen in level, new skills to be learned are shown here.

Log

Shows all previous messages and dialogues

Toggle Production Buildings

Selects the different buildings where units are produced.

Overview Map

Shows friendly and enemy buildings, quest-relevant locations, merchants, journey stones and signals for different events

Position camera on place of latest signal.

Upgrade building

Destroy own unit or own building.



6.2 The Inventory

Avatar portrait

Shows player's character, the most powerful game character

Choose party member that is to be equipped

Equipment Slots

Open inventory

Open spellbook

Open skill trees

Health points, Mana, and Armor class

Efficiency of the unit in melee combat

Efficiency of the unit in ranged combat (without spells)

Health points and mana of the selected unit

In case the avatar is selected:

Gathered experience relative to the rise into the next level

Heroes

A little weaker than the avatar. Player can also equip and influence them in their development.



Spells of the selected hero or avatar

Companions

Can be called upon and be brought back to life, but they cannot be equipped or influenced in their development.



Currently active spells of the selected character

All spells available for the selected character



Sort Inventory

Sorts the inventory according to item type and stacks identical items in stacks of 5.

Drop Item

Drag the item to this button and click to drop it from your inventory.
ATTENTION: Once dropped the items are permanently gone from the game.

6.3 The „Click & Fight“-System

In *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* you can of course move into battle in the classical way. Choose your own units first, then select the kind of attack and rightclick the opponent.

But you can also make use of the “Click & Fight” system. Just click on an opponent and action symbols will appear underneath the portrait buttons of avatar, heroes and created groups that you just have to click on in order to assign the kind of attack to the according portrait. A sword symbols the fight with the currently equipped weapon, other icons signify spells or special abilities. So during a battle you can change tactics with just a few clicks and without having to select the friendly units first.

The “Click & Fight” system also offers you the actions that are appropriate for the current selection. This is why, when you select a friendly unit, only support or healing actions and spells are shown underneath your avatar or hero.

To quickly select an opponent in the vicinity and effectively fight him/her with the “Click & Fight” system, press the “Tab” button on your keyboard. Now you can trigger whole attack waves with just a few clicks. Press the “Tab” button several times to toggle the visible enemies.

6.4 Merchants

In the world of *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* you will meet merchants that very often have interesting pieces of equipment to offer. Here you can also sell items you no longer need.

Merchants are marked by a shield and weapon symbol above their heads. To speak to a merchant, select your avatar and rightclick on the merchant. Now your inventory as well as the inventory of the merchant opens up.

To buy an item, just click on the desired object in the inventory of the merchant on the right side of the screen and then put it in your own inventory.

To sell an item, just click on the object in your inventory and then click into the inventory of the merchant.



Please note that the merchant will offer you less money for an object than he would charge you. However, as long as you don't close the merchant window, you can rebuy items you sold before for the same price. Just click on the "Rebuy" button in the upper right corner of the merchant window to do that.

Also note that there are items that are important for the course of a campaign. These items cannot be sold and thus not be put in the merchant's inventory.

7 Options

You can get to the options screen via the main menu or via the “Menu” button during the ongoing game. Please note that certain settings influence the speed of performance. Learn more about that in the following paragraphs.

7.1 Game

Border Scrolling

Move the viewing area by placing the mouse at the edge of the screen.

Hidden Units

When this option is activated, units covered by objects are shown with unicoloured plains.

Display Damage

When this option is activated, the damage done to a unit on the screen is shown by a hovering number.

7.2 Graphics

Quality of Shadow

Of all the parameters, the shadow quality has the highest influence on the graphics performance.

- **Off:** Only shadows from landscape on landscape are shown.
- **Low:** Additionally, objects, characters and plants throw a shadow on the landscape and on grass.
- **Medium:** Additionally, shadows are cast on characters and objects.
- **High:** Additionally, shadows fall on trees.
- **Very High:** Additionally, the shadow is smoothed at the edges and thus seems softer.

Quality of Texture

Generally, a higher texture quality means that the surface of all objects in the game seems sharper and shows more details. A lower quality means shorter loading times and higher graphics performance on quick view changes.

For graphics cards with 128MB you should choose the setting “High” at the most. The setting “Very High” is only suitable for graphics cards with at least 256 MB.

Range of Vision

The visibility indicates up to what distance to the camera objects are shown in the chase view. The game is optimized for a visibility of 100m, which corresponds to the setting "Normal". A higher visibility lowers the graphics performance, especially with quick view changes and high texture quality.

Shader-Model

With some older graphics cards a limitation of the pixelshader model to version 1.1 can remarkably speed up the performance. With pixelshader 1.1, however only the lowest quality settings for shadow and water are chooseable.

Clouds

Activates or deactivates the depiction of clouds.

Auto Adjust Brightness

If the automatic brightness adjustment is activated, the game simulates an opening and closing of the lens, depending on the incoming light. Thus the picture always attains the optimal brightness, no matter if you are looking into the sun or into the shadow of a mountain. This way light refractions are especially well displayed.

On some systems this feature however leads to a reduction in graphics performance, even when a powerful graphics card is installed.

Grass

On middle class graphics cards the depiction of grass has a strong influence on the graphics performance, especially when in chase view and with high shadow quality.

Anisotropic Filtering

Activate this feature to improve the display quality of textures. On older graphics cards this can lead to a speed reduction.

Resolution

The screen resolution has a high impact on the performance. In case you are using a flat screen, we recommend using the native resolution of your screen for highest display quality. Otherwise the resolution 1024x768 offers the ideal compromise between graphics quality and performance.

Water Quality

Depending on the quality settings, the depiction of water can have an influence on the performance.



- **Normal:** The water shows fine surface structures and light reflections.
- **High:** The water mirrors. As the calculation of the mirroring is very complex, it can lead to a loss in performance speed. Please note that not all the water in the game is clear enough to mirror. So even when this feature is activated you will not see mirroring in all the water in the game.

Glow

When this feature is activated, extremely bright screen areas will also reflect on the surrounding areas. Thus strong light reflections appear even brighter or a glow becomes more realistic. The whole picture becomes smoother with the activation of this feature.

This feature can generally be activated with middle class graphics cards without a dramatic loss in performance.

7.3 Sound

Music Volume

Adjusts the music volume.

Effect Volume

Adjusts the volume of spells, walking and fighting sounds as well as environmental sounds.

Voice Volume

Adjusts the volume of the voice overs.

Message Volume

Adjusts the volume of signals such as alarms, warnings, as well as all clicking sounds triggered by pressing buttons.

8 Playing on the Internet

8.1 Requirements for Playing on the Internet

To play *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* on the internet, you need an internet connection and at least a 56kbits/s modem. The internet connection can cause additional fees.

Your operation system, i.e. your firewall has to allow *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* to use the internet. Depending on the configuration of your computer that either happens automatically or it has to be set manually. You will find more information on that in section 8.6. "Handling of Connection Problems"

8.2 Creating an Account

To play *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* on the internet, you have to create an account. Click on "Internet" in the main menu in order to do so.

Now enter a name under which you want to play on the internet. Then you have to enter a password and your email –address. You are allowed to create several accounts with just one address.

8.3 The Internet Lobby

After logging into your account, you get to the internet lobby. Here you can take part in games, host your own games or chat with other players.

The following information on the ongoing games is displayed in the upper left corner:

- **Host:** Here the name of the games appears.
- **Map:** The name of the map that is to be played.
- **Type of Game:** Shows whether it's a Free Game or a Skirmish.





- **Player:** Shows how many players can take part in the game and how many have already joined in. If the maximum number of players has been reached already, you cannot join the game any more.
- **Status:** Shows whether you can still join the game.

In the lower left window you can select a chat channel. On the lower right you can see all the players that are currently in the chat. The lower middle window shows the messages in this chat channel. Here you can also send your own messages.

8.4 *Joining an Internet Game*

To join an internet game, click on one of the games that are marked with the status “Open” in the internet lobby.

Now on the upper right of the lobby screen choose the avatar who is supposed to represent you in this game.

If you have chosen a Free Game, you can choose between the avatars you already created in the Free Game mode or create a new avatar.

If you have picked a Skirmish, there are several template avatars at your disposal. Alternatively, you can also use your own avatars from the Free Game mode, as long as they have already reached level 30.

Once you have chosen a game and an avatar, click on „Join Game“.

Now you get to the game preparation screen.

In a Free Game you have to choose the faction you want to play. If you picked a Skirmish, you can also choose the team you want to play with besides the faction. The team then decides which other team members you play with.

When you have chosen all your settings, you only have to switch your status in the last column to “Ready”. The game begins, as soon as the host (the player opening the game) starts it.

8.5 *Hosting an Internet Game*

To host a game, click on “Host Game” in the lower right corner of the internet lobby.

You will then get to the setup screen.



First choose the type of game and then pick a map.

Then in the upper right corner of the setup screen select an avatar who is supposed to represent you in this game.

Follow the steps described above under "Join an internet game".

Click on „OK“ to confirm your selection and to offer your game in the lobby.

Now you get to the game preparation screen.

Now choose the faction you want to play. If you selected a Skirmish, you can also choose the team you want to play with besides the faction.

To start the game, all the slots in the column „Player“ have to be taken. In case there aren't enough team-mates, you can set these slots to "Closed" or let the computer take over this slot.

As soon as all players have set their status to „Ready“, you can start the game by clicking on „Start Game“.

8.6 Handling of Connection Problems

In case you encounter problems joining a game or you find out that other players have difficulties joining a game you are hosting, please check whether the following ports are enabled and if so, enable them manually.

SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars establishes connections to the following ports: 30140, 2802, and 2803. In case you want to host games, the port 2802 must be accessible from outside.

However, the enabling of ports poses a security risk. For details see the instructions of your router, respectively your firewall.

Please keep in mind that each of the players needs to have his own copy of *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* installed.

9 Playing on LAN

To play in a local area network, click on “LAN” in the main menu and enter the name you want to use in the local network.

The hosting and joining of games works just like when playing on the internet. See description in section 8 “Playing on the Internet”.

10 The Factions

In *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* the units and buildings of three different factions are at your disposal. Each of these factions has its individual strengths and weaknesses.

You can also see the data of the units and buildings in the game. Just select the desired object and hover with the mouse over the info window at the bottom left of the screen to see a tool tip with all the important information.

The values in the following text apply to units of the level 1. The health points, Mana, armor and damage values of a unit with a five times higher level are accordingly multiplied with the same factor.

The damage a unit effectively causes is calculated by the damage it would cause on an unprotected unit minus the armor value of the target unit. With units causing direct damage, the armor value of the target unit is ignored.

10.1 *The Realm*

After the end of the Rune Wars, that led to the final destruction of the Circle, for the first time order seemed to return to the old kingdoms. While in Nortander the five royal lines are still fighting for power, the human kingdom of Highmark in the South already has a new sovereign. Despite of the harsh conditions after the Convocation, the new kingdom is thriving, but at the same time it has to defend its wealth against the Iron Storm Clans and the Dark Elves from Lar. But even with their proud castles and well-armed knights, the Highmark has to remind itself of the old bond of the Peoples of the Light, if it wants to stand fast against these enemies.

Since the Convocation the elves of the white tree of Finonmir have cut off all contact to other nations. But their banned sisters, the fighting Morhir living on the remains of the sunken elven fortress of Dun Mora, still recognize the old bond. Strengthened by the everlasting fight against the swamp and its demons, the Morhir fight for the Light in a wild but determined way.

Far away from their brothers in Windholme and constantly threatened by mountain orcs and demons from the depths the dwarves of the Middle Mountains add more than just their craftsmanship to the Realm. Not only heavily armed axefighters and famous blacksmiths are coming from the mines of Underhall and the Fireforge, but also the sieging machines of the Realm.

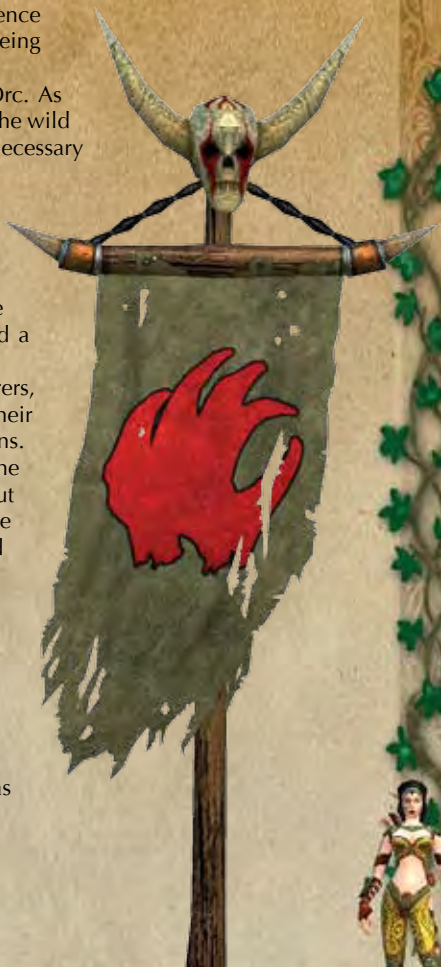
10.2 The Clans

After the Dark Ones were defeated in the War of the Six Nations, their armies scattered and the survivors founded enclaves all over Fiara. While the Dark Elves founded a new empire called Lar and the Sharok orcs occupied the large glacier in the North, the orcs and trolls in the East and South of Fiara were less lucky. They eked out a meagre existence as small, marauding gangs, always fleeing from the Army of Light.

But then the Iron Lord appears, an Orc. As the first one ever he managed to unite the wild southern clans under his command, if necessary with the help of a few axe blows. In a long march he leads them along the Black Coast and through the grasslands of the Green Sea up to the Gate of Swords. Between the ruins of former strongholds of the High Elves he and his followers found a shelter.

That's where they met other wanderers, Barbarian tribes that had to flee from their old homelands, the Middle Mountains. Now they were meandering among the elf ruins without a leader and without a goal. The Iron Lord brought them the faith in Zarach, the blood drinker, and gave them a new banner and a new task.

Thus the Iron Lord created a new empire for all the tribes descending from Zarach and looking for new homelands. Some of the tribes kept their own names and their leaders, but from then on the banner of the Iron Storm, the largest clan of the South, was attached to their battle sign.

10.3 The Pact

The heart of the Pact are the Dark Elves, the people of the nightgod Nor, calling themselves the Norcaine. The culture of the Norcaine has always been shaped by the fight between the two largest castes, the warriors of the Dracon and the sorcerers of the Archons. While the warriors are striving for an honourable life in the fight against the Light, the Archons show a ruthless greed for power. With the ambition of his mother Sorvina, Toth Lar was made High Archon and as such forged a bond with the Shadows. He gave a part of his people's power of life to the Shadows and in return got the invisible assassins who killed his antagonists in the warrior caste in only a very short time. The honour of the Norcaine died along with these warriors.

But the Dark Elves have been dragged out of their paralysis that was caused by this inner conflict and now they are ready for new campaigns.

The new allies of the Norcaine, the Shadows, are invisible in their normal form and only become visible when they want to or when their lethal blow hits its target. It is known that they came to Eo from another world, but nobody really knows their goals and plans.

The gargoyles are no real members of the Pact. They are bloodthirsty demons from the inner centre of the world that have been given a form by magic. Grateful for their new bodies and happy to quench their blood thirst at last they throw themselves into battles for their masters. Sorvina's knowledge as an alchemist of the Silver Hand enabled her to join these creatures into the army of the Pact.

Additional Features and Options in the Game

There are a number of buttons that have been integrated just before printing in order to improve playability.

New ingame buttons:

Follow Avatar: (next to “Journey Stone” button). By activating the  -button or by pressing the “G” button, you can easily make your heroes and companions automatically follow the avatar. This feature is especially useful in 3rd person view.

Note that your heroes and companions will still follow your orders. As soon as they have accomplished their given tasks, they will come back to you even over long distances. This is different from the normal “Follow” command that you give units with the [Follow] button however, as the latter will be interrupted as soon as another “Go to” order is given.

Next Opponent: (Above the “Idle Worker” –button) With a leftclick on the  -button or the **Tab button**, you can automatically select an enemy target. In isometric view the most powerful visible enemy is selected, whereas in 3rd Person view the nearest enemy in the line of sight is selected. Every additional click moves you on to the next enemy. This feature is especially helpful to quickly pick enemy targets for Click & Fight actions.

With a rightclick on the  -button or the spacebar the avatar attacks the currently selected enemy at once. If currently no enemy is selected, one is automatically selected if there is one visible. This feature is especially useful in chase view.

Military Units: (below “Idle Worker” –button) With a leftclick on the  -button you can select all your own military units on the screen. A rightclick on the same button selects all your military units on the whole map.

Offensive /Defensive (in the inventory, underneath the 3D depiction of the avatars and heroes) With the  -button in the inventory, you can determine the combat behavior of your avatar and your heroes. As *SpellForce 2 – Shadow Wars* allows a free character development, there is no clear separation between a mage and a fighter. The options depend on the current equipment of the avatar /hero:

a) Melee combat weapon(s) equipped

Here offensive behavior is the default. If you change to defensive behavior, the avatar /hero only moves close to the enemy, but does actively not enter melee combat. This is especially useful, if you want to use the avatar /hero for spell casting primarily and the equipped melee combat weapon is mainly intended for defense.



b) Wand equipped

Here defensive behavior is the default. If you change to offensive behavior and the wand does not allow direct aggressive actions against the enemy (for example a healing wand), then the avatar /hero enters melee combat.

c) Ranged combat weapon

A ranged combat fighter usually always tries to attack the enemy from a certain range with the ranged combat weapon, so there are no other options here.

BTW: With a “Force Attack” Order (double rightclick on the target) even a defensive unit can be ordered into an immediate direct attack.

Worldmap:

You get to the worldmap by clicking the -button or pressing the “M” on the keyboard. All the areas where you know at least one journey stone, will be shown with their name and can be selected. To travel to a certain place, doubleclick the according journey stone on the right side. If the name of a journey stone appears in red, then because of your current task you cannot travel to that particular island.

Automatic distribution of Skill Points:

This feature allows you to activate /deactivate the automatic distribution of your heroes' skill points. When the skill point distribution is activated, the heroes automatically distribute the skill points by themselves.

Heroes with a calling

Many heroes follow a calling and thus can only be freely developed in certain intervals, even when the skill point distribution is deactivated:

- In the campaign the heroes Bor, Lya, Shae and Mordecay follow a calling and thus choose 12 skills automatically, as soon as they are available.
- In the “Free Game” mode all heroes of the “experienced and balanced hero” group follow a calling.

Heroes without a calling

- In the campaign Jared can be freely developed.
- In the “Free Game” mode the “group of inexperienced adventurers” has to be developed by the player. The automatic skill point distribution is not available here.

Automatically select abilities and spells:



abilities and spells for his spell memory. If you'd prefer to choose them yourself, deactivate this function.

If this function is activated, after each rise in levels the hero automatically chooses up to three

Inventory:

Comparison of items:

If you hover with the mouse pointer over an item in the inventory, the tooltip also shows you a direct comparison to the item the avatar /hero depicted on the left is currently equipped with. The item being compared is highlighted with a golden frame. So you can easily toggle the heroes with the mouse wheel to also compare the selected item with the items they wear.

Fast Equip:

If you rightclick on an item in the inventory, then the currently shown hero /avatar on the left will be equipped with it immediately, if possible.

Auto Equip:

If in the inventory you drag & drop an item on the large picture of the hero /avatar or if you click the picture with an item attached to the mouse, then the hero will be equipped with this item if possible.

If you have an item attached to the mouse and rightclick on one of the small portraits in the inventory, then the hero /avatar will be equipped with this item if possible.

Additional Options:

3rd person view auto attack:

With this option you can set the automatic behavior of the avatar in 3rd person view.

- a) **Do not move:** The avatar only acts from the current position, but never performs any movement commands without player intervention.
- b) **Short Distance:** If the avatar is equipped with a melee combat weapon, he/she automatically chooses melee combat targets in a range of up to five meters and moves to attack them.
- c) **Long Distance:** The avatar moves automatically even over distances of 20 meters. This corresponds to the behavior in isometric view.

Damage Values:

With activated damage values you can see how much damage your avatar, the heroes and the companions take and cause. Red numbers stand for the damage received. Green numbers stand for the damage inflicted.

Change of perspective:

Here you can choose between the new SpellForce 2 controls (change of perspective by click on mouse wheel or « Ins » button) or the classical SpellForce 1 Controls (change of view by zooming).
